### **MVC Player of the Week**

### Becca Hittner, Jr., G. Drake

In two road wins, Becca Hittner, the reigning MVC Player of the Week, averaged 21.0 points, 6.5 rebounds, 4.5 assists while shooting a blistering 56.7 percent (17-of-30) from the floor and 53.8 percent (7-of-13) from the three-point line while averaging just 25.0 minutes. In the win over Valpo, Hittner scored a game-high 23 points on just 15 shots, including making 4-of-6 from three-point line, to go along with seven rebounds and

two assists in 24 minutes. She followed that with another great performance in the win over Loyola with 19 points, a career-best seven assists, six rebounds and one steal in 26 minutes. Hittner leads the MVC in scoring at 19.8 points per game while shooting a league-high 44.3 percent from the three-point line.

### **MVC Newcomer of the Week**

### Lasha Petree, Fr., G, Bradley

Petree helped lead Bradley to a pair of victories, averaging a team-high 16.0 points per game on 53% shooting and was 8-for-12 from three-point range (67%). In Friday's 81-80 comeback victory over Indiana State, Petree took over the game down the stretch by scoring 13 points in a 46-second span. She hit four three-pointers during the spurt and also had three steals as she helped Bradley rally from 15 points down with 2:30 to go for

the one-point win, knocking down the game-winning free throw with 7.2 seconds remaining as she scored 14 points in the final 2:30 and 16 points in the second half. Petree finished with 18 points, three rebounds, one assist, two blocks and three steals in just 18 minutes off the bench. Petree followed that up with 14 points on 5-of-9 shooting in Sunday's win over Evansville. She made 4-of-6 three-pointers and tallied one rebound, one assist and a block in the victory to help Bradley match its MVC win total from 2017-18.

## **NOTEWORTHY**

In addition to the league's Player and Newcomer of the Week selections, several conference players had notable performances, including:

Marley Miller (UE) - On the road in central Illinois, senior Marley Miller put together one of the best weeks of her collegiate career. Facing Illinois State on Friday night, Miller scored a team-high 17 points, including 12 in the fourth quarter, hitting five three-pointers in Evansville's loss. On Sunday afternoon against Bradley, Miller tied a career-high with 21 points, again recording an impressive fourth quarter, tallying 10 points in the fourth period. This season, Miller has scored in double-figures 11 times with six double-digit scoring performances in MVC play.

Simone Goods (ILS) - Simone Goods added a game-high of 22 points in just 19 minutes of playing time, shooting 53 percent from the floor, and was perfect at the line (6-6). The senior forward fell shy of a double-double grabbing nine boards in win over Evansville Friday night. Goods proved her versatility Sunday afternoon, tying her personal best, dishing out four assists. She also shot 50 percent from the floor, adding 13 points for the 'Birds while also grabbing six rebounds and denied three shots.

Abby O'Connor (LUC) - Loyola sophomore Abby O'Connor averaged a double-double over the Ramblers' two games this past weekend, chipping in 12.5 points, 10.0 rebounds, 2.0 assists and 1.0 blocks. In Friday's matchup with UNI, O'Connor became the first Rambler to post back-to-back double-double efforts since 2016-17, finishing with 15 points, 11 rebounds and three assists against the Panthers. The South Bend, Ind. native fell just a carom short of notching a third straight double-double against Drake on Sunday afternoon, adding 10 points and nine rebounds, in addition to a season-high two steals. O'Connor currently ranks 10th in the MVC in scoring (13.3 ppg), seventh in rebounding (7.0 rpg) and leads the league in both blocked shots (1.4 bpg) and free throw percentage (91.7%).

**Danielle Gitzen (MSU)** - Danielle Gitzen scored a gamehigh 19 points on 6-of-11 shooting, adding three rebounds, three assists and a steal in Friday's win at Southern Illinois. The senior hit her only 3-point attempt and went 6-for-6 at the foul line. Gitzen scored 13 of her 19 points in the second half, propelling the Lady Bears from a one-point halftime lead to a 12-point victory.

**Karli Rucker (UNI)** - Karli Rucker notched a double-double and averaged 12 points, 8.5 rebounds and 3.5 assists in a road sweep of Loyola and Valparaiso. She tallied 10 points and 10 rebounds in the Panthers' 71-65 road win at Loyola. She then tallied 14 points, including 10 in the second half, to lead UNI to a 64-56 win over Valparaiso. She has now scored in double figures in each of the last 10 games and 18 of the last 19. She is now eighth in the MVC in scoring and second in the league in assists.

**Nicole Martin (SIU)** - Southern Illinois junior Nicole Martin scored 14 points and grabbed eight rebounds in SIU's long game last weekend. Martin also added two assists, a block and a steal in 33 minutes of action. It marked the 15th time this season that the Jefferson City, Mo. native has scored in double figures this season.

**Grace Hales (VALPO)** - Hales hit five 3-pointers in a single game for the fourth time in her career and second time this season on the way to scoring a team-high 17 points on Friday against Drake. She had eight points in the third quarter alone and also led the team in rebounds with eight. That was the first time in her collegiate career she has led the team in both scoring and rebounding in the same game. Hales followed up that performance by reaching double figures for the sixth time in the last seven games on Sunday against UNI. Hales averaged 14.0 points and 7.0 rebounds over two games this week against the teams picked to finish first and second in The Valley.

Anna Newman (UE) - In a pair of road conference contests, freshman Anna Newman recorded a career-high to conclude the road trip. Against Illinois State on Friday night, Newman scored four points, while recording two rebounds and two assists. Taking on Bradley on Sunday afternoon, Newman set a new career-high with 14 points, besting her previous career-high of 13 points set against Bradley on Jan. 11, while adding four assists off the bench. Sunday's performance at Bradley marked the second time this season that Newman scored in double-figures.

**TeTe Maggett (ILS)** - Maggett led all scorers and guided ISU to its 78-70 victory over Indiana State Sunday contributing 26 points, while also grabbing seven boards. ISU went 2-0 this weekend, downing Evansville 82-59. Maggett surpassed he personal best, dishing out eight assists and added five points, six rebounds and one steal as in the Friday night contest.

Janae Gonzales (LUC) - Loyola freshman Janae Gonzales continued her impressive rookie campaign, averaging a teambest 19.0 points over a pair of games. The Tolleson, Ariz. native opened her weekend with a team-best 20-point effort against UNI on Friday night, her third game of at least 20 or more points this season. She followed that up by again leading the Ramblers on Sunday against Drake, adding 18 points. Gonzales, who knocked down four triples in each contest, is tied for 15th in The Valley in scoring at 11.7 points per game and leads all MVC freshmen in three-point field goals made per game (2.5), a mark that puts her second overall in the conference.

Jasmine Franklin (MSU) - Jasmine Franklin posted her second 4-for-4 shooting performance of the season Friday at Southern Illinois, finishing with eight points, four rebounds and a career-high four steals in 17 minutes of action. Her shooting performance moved her back to second in the MVC with a .557 field goal percentage on the year.

**Cynthia Wolf (UNI)** - Cynthia Wolf tallied a career-high 13 points in just 11 minutes on the court against Loyola. She was 4-7 from the field and 3-6 from the three-point line. She grabbed four boards. Sunday, she only saw nine minutes, but grabbed seven rebounds, scored two points and tallied a pair of blocks.

## Lady Bears Maintain Lead

Missouri State won their 17th consecutive league contest, tying for the second-best streak at MSU and fifth-longest in league history. It's also the fourth time Missouri State has started 10-0 or better in Valley play. The Lady Bears hold a half game lead over second place Drake (10-1) in the MVC standings.

### **Best MVC Records**

Since the Gateway became the Missouri Valley Conference in the 1992-93 season, two league teams have gone through MVC play unscathed (Drake last two seasons). Three teams (Wichita State in 2014-15, UNI in 2010-11 and Drake in 1997-98) finished Valley play at 17-1, while another four teams had their best conference finish at 16-2. Missouri State accomplished this feat three times (1995-96, 2000-01 and 2003-04), while Illinois State (2009-10), Indiana State (2005-06) and Southern Illinois (2006-07) also completed a Valley season at 16-2.

## **Lasha's Reggie Miller Moment**

Bradley trailed Indiana State by 17 points closing in on four minutes to play, when Lasha Petree scored 13 points and came away with three steals in a 46-second span to highlight a 21-3 closing spurt which gave the Braves an 81-80 victory. Petree hit four three-pointers and added a free throw for a personal 13-0 run during a closing stretch in which Bradley erased a 17-point deficit. The Braves swept the regular-season series from Indiana State for the first time since 1995-96.

## **Leading the Pack**

Drake's Sara Rhine and Becca Hittner currently rank as the top two scorers in The Valley, ranking No. 1 and No. 2 respectively. Hittner is averaging 19.8 points per game, while Rhine is averaging 19.6 a contest. Only one time in the league's history has a teammate tandem finished the season ranking No. 1 and 2 as Drake's Wanda Ford (24.2 ppg) and Julie Fitzpatrick (23.1 ppg) led the way during the 1984-85 season.

It would also mark the sixth-straight season a Bulldog has led the MVC in scoring (Kyndal Clark in 2014, Lizzy Wendell from 2015-17 and Becca Hittner in 2018), which is the longest stretch a school has led that statistic in league history. Twice has a school led for four-straight seasons (Drake from 1983-86 with Lorri Bauman and Wanda Ford; Missouri State from 1998-01 with Jackie Stiles). UNI's Jacqui Kalin is the last non-Bulldog to lead the MVC in scoring back in the 2013 season.

In Valley men's hoops, an individual from the same school has led the league in scoring five-straight seasons on two occasions. Evansville is riding a current five-year stretch, while Bradley also accomplished the feat from 1987-91.

### Road Streak Continues...

Drake's MVC-record regular season road winning streak continued with wins at Valpo and Loyola over the weekend. The Bulldogs have won 27-straight on the road in league play with their last road loss occurring at UNI on Feb. 19, 2016. Drake also has a Valley-best 10 road wins overall this season.

### Chasing History

Currently, Drake is averaging 81.3 points per game, ranking 12th nationally. The all-time Valley record for scoring was set in 1995 as Drake averaged 83.5 ppg. The Bulldogs have led The Valley in scoring each of the past four seasons. No team has ever led the league in scoring five-straight years (Drake also led from 1995-1998), including on the men's side where only Bradley (1986-89) and Southern IIlinois (1990-93) have led for four-straight seasons.

## Strength of Schedule

Drake, Missouri State and UNI tested themselves with a difficult non-conference schedule this season. According to WarrenNolan.com, the Bulldogs played the third toughest non-conference strength of schedule this season, while the Lady Bears' non-league schedule ranks 48th and Panthers 57th nationally.

## **The RPI Ratings Game**

The latest installment of the NCAA RPI Report (Feb. 11) has six Valley teams that rank in the top-175, led by Drake at No. 21, followed by Missouri State (63), UNI (83), Bradley (155), Southern Illinois (160) and Indiana State (174). The MVC ranks 13th among 32 conferences. The league ranking is the highest for the league since the 2013 season (finished 10th).

### **Power Five Ahead**

Drake finished the non-conference schedule with three Power Five wins on its resume as the Bulldogs beat South Carolina, Rutgers and Nebraska. The conference finished 3-13 against Power Five opponents with all but one of the games taking place on the road or a neutral court.

## Vs. Top 25

Last season, the MVC went 0-9 against Top 25 opponents, breaking a streak of three-straight years with at least one win over a Top 25 team. Drake earned a 90-85 overtime win over No. 12/13 South Carolina in Vancouver in November. It was the highest ranked win over an opponent in the regular season by a Valley team since Missouri State beat No. 10 LSU on November 24, 2000. The league finished 1-8 vs. the Top 25 this year.

## **Against the Field**

The MVC held a winning record against 10 leagues in non-conference play, including the America East (1-0), Big West (2-1), Colonial (2-0), Conference USA (4-3), Horizon (9-5), NEC (1-0), Ohio Valley (11-8), Summit (9-5), Sun Belt (1-0) and WAC (6-1). The MVC holds at least a .500 mark against the Atlantic 10 (2-2) and the SEC (1-1). The league finished above .500 in non-conference play for the first time since 2012-13 (59-55) and registered 60 non-league wins for the first time since 2010-11 (62-49).

### What's the Difference?

Over the past 20 seasons (since 1999-2000), 11 MVC teams have registered a scoring margin of +12 or better for a season. Drake currently has a +13.6 scoring margin, which is the 8th best among any team in that span. Last year the Bulldogs finished with a +15.0 ppg margin. This would be the fourth-straight season with a scoring margin of +12 for the Bulldogs.

### **Looking to End It**

Evansville has dropped 29-straight MVC regular season contests, setting the MVC record. The Aces last MVC win was a 52-44 at Indiana State on Mar. 4, 2017.

## **20/20 Vision**

Bradley's Chelsea Brackmann scored a career-best 24 points and the leading rebounder in the MVC added 20 boards at Loyola as she notched her second 20-20 performance of the year. Prior to this season there had been just two 20-20 outings in the MVC (2015-16 & 2014-15) over the previous seven years and Brackmann is the first Valley player to have two 20-20 games in the same season since at least the 1994-95 season. Brackmann is one of four players in the nation with multiple 20-20 games this season through contests of Feb. 11.

## **Sharing the Rock**

A year after seeing Evansville lead the nation in free-throw percentage (82.0%), The Valley has three of the nation's top 25 teams in the category so far this season. Evansville currently leads the league and sits 10th nationally, while Loyola sits 13th and UNI 22nd.

Loyola's Abby O'Connor leads The Valley and ranks No. 7 nationally hitting 91.7% of her attempts. In 2012-13, UNI's Jacqui Kalin set the MVC record with a percentage of 95.5% for a season.

With its first conference loss to Missouri State, Drake had the longest win streak in the history of the Gateway/MVC for regular season contests end at 47-straight games. ### **Rhine on McClain Watch List**

The Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame and the WBCA announced that Drake junior Sara Rhine is one of 20 watch list candidates for the 2019 Katrina McClain Award. Named after the two-time All-American and 1987 National Player of the Year, the annual award in its second year recognizes the top power forwards in women's NCAA Division I college basketball. By mid-February, the watch list of 20 players for the 2019 Katrina McClain Award will be narrowed to just 10.

### **Senior CLASS Award Candidate**

Drake's Sammie Bachrodt has been named a candidate for the 2018-19 Senior CLASS Award. Bachrodt is among 30 NCAA Division I candidates in women's basketball for the award which recognizes notable achievements in four areas of excellence - community, classroom, character and competition.

### "So You Want to Be A Coach"

Valparaiso senior Meredith Hamlet and Drake senior Becca Jonas were named participants in the 2019 "So You Want to be a Coach" program, hosted by the WBCA. This marks the 17th annual "So You Want to be a Coach" program as each member will participate in a three-day workshop with speakers provided by the WeCOACH on April 3-5 in conjunction with the WBCA Convention in Tampa, Florida.

### **Title Town**

The league has had nine different regular-season champions in the past 12 seasons (SIU-2007, DU/ UE/ILS-2008, ILS-2009, ILS-2010, UNI-2011; MSU-2012; WSU/CU-2013; INS/WSU-2014; WSU-2015; UNI-2016; DU-2017; DU-2018). Bradley, Loyola and Valparaiso are the only league teams not to have won a regular-season MVC championship.

### Two Sport Athlete

Lexi Wallen joined the team following a four-year volleyball career at Illinois State. The senior forward has made an immediate impact on the team, averaging 6.5 points and 3.5 rebounds per game during conference play. She is one of five reported athletes to be currently competing in both volleyball and basketball at the division 1 level. Two of the five are Valley athletes. Katherine Carlson of Valparaiso also recently joined the basketball team after a volleyball career.

## **Hoops In the Heartland**

The 2019 Missouri Valley Conference Women's Basketball Tournament will return to the TaxSlayer Center in Moline, III., for the fourth-straight season.

Affectionately coined "Hoops in the Heartland," the four-day event (Mar. 14-17) will showcase all 10 Missouri Valley Conference schools as they compete for the Valley's automatic berth into the NCAA Tournament.

The MVC extended an agreement with the Quad Cities Convention & Visitors Bureau to conduct the MVC Women's Basketball Championship in TaxSlayer Center through at least 2021.

The 2019 tournament will mark the 12th-consecutive season in its 37-year history that the event will take place at a neutral site.

The Missouri Valley Conference is one of only seven conferences (out of 32 nationally) where the women's basketball tournament is played at a neutral site, separate from the men's championship (AAC, ACC, Big Ten, Big 12, MVC, Pac-12 and SEC are the others).


## **Starters Returning**

The Missouri Valley Conference will see 37 of 50 starters return (74%) for the 2018-19 season. Defending champion Drake returns all five starters next season, while Illinois State, Indiana State, UNI, Southern Illinois and Valparaiso will see four starters return. Bradley, Evansville, Loyola and Missouri State will each see three starters return to the court.



## **Postseason League**

The MVC has seen an average of four league teams participate in postseason play in the last 20 seasons, including three teams reaching postseason play in 2017-18. Drake fell at Texas A&M in the NCAA Tournament, while Missouri State and UNI each received bids into the WNIT. The Valley has earned multiple NCAA Tournament bids in 11 different seasons, including a pair of bids in the 2017 NCAA Tournament (Drake and UNI).

### **Balanced Effort**

Bradley currently has three players averaging 12.9 points per game or more, with sophomore Gabi Haack pacing the group at 16.2 points per contest. The only team in the MVC to have three players scoring at least 11.5 points per outing, Bradley has not had three indi-



vidual score at least 12.0 points per game in the same season since 1994-95. Haack already has the most points by a Bradley player (356) since Michelle Young averaged 14.3 points per game as a junior in 2013-14.

## Taking Over

Freshman Lasha Petree was named MVC Newcomer of the Week for the fourth time this season Monday after her big performance against Indiana State helped Bradley rally for a one-point win. The first four-time MVC Newcomer of the Week selection in program history, Petree scored 13 points and had three steals during a 46-second span. Bradley trailed 78-63 with 2:30 to play when Petree took over the contest. She hit the first of four consecutive three-pointers with 2:27 to play, stole the inbounds pass and hit another three-pointer just six seconds later. Petree had another steal on the next Indiana State possession and followed it up by splitting a pair of free throws with 2:12 on the clock. After a Sycamores missed shot, Petree hit her third three-pointer in a 37-second stretch (1:50) before collecting another steal and three-pointer just nine seconds later (1:41) to pull Bradley within two points at 78-76. She later hit the game-winning free throw with 7.2 seconds left, scoring 14 points in final 2:30 of the game.

Loyola freshman guard Janae Gonzales continued her fantastic debut campaign with the Maroon & Gold this past weekend, averaging 19.0 points against UNI and Drake. Gonzales poured in 20 points in last Friday's tilt with the Panthers, marking the third time this season



she has reached or exceeded the 20-point plateau. The Tolleson, Ariz. native currently ranks second in the MVC in three-point field goals made per game, hitting on 2.5 attempts from distance, a mark that leads all Valley freshmen.

### **Hitting the Free Ones**

With the second half of Missouri Valley Conference play now in full swing, the Ramblers still find themselves rated highly on the NCAA leaderboard in team free throw percentage. Loyola has operated at a 76.4 percent (253-of-331) clip from the charity stripe this season, good enough for 13th overall nationally. The Maroon & Gold are within striking distance of the single-season school record in the category of 76.6 percent, set back in 2006-07.

### **Hoosier State Hysteria**

Loyola opens up a grueling stretch that sees is play five of its final seven games away from Gentile Arena this coming weekend as it visits Indiana State and Evansville, a pair of teams the Ramblers swept earlier this season in Rogers Park. The Ramblers have struggled historically against their two Hoosier State foes on the road since joining the MVC, going 2-8 (.200) in 10 matchups.

### A Steady Starter

Senior Meredith Hamlet has started 112 of her 114 career games. By the end of this weekend, she is in position to move into a tie for 10th in program history for career games played. If she plays in every game the rest of the season, Hamlet will finish at least tied for second in program history in career games played. She will finish in sole possession of second place if Valpo wins at least one game in Moline and would need Valpo to reach the tournament championship in order to match the program record.

### Record Book Watch

To the surprise of no one, Valpo is already seventh in program history for team 3-point attempts in a single season with 598. The program record is 676, set in 1991-1992. Valpo has made 200 3s this season, already the sixth-most in the history of Valpo women's basketball. The program record is 224, a mark that was set in 1991-92 and matched in 2007-08.
