MVC Player of the Week

Becca Hittner, Jr., G, Drake

Junior Becca Hittner averaged 20.0 points, 6.0 rebounds, 4.0 assists and 3.0 steals per game while shooting 45.1 percent from the floor (14-of-31) and 90 percent (9-of-10) from the free throw line in Drake's home wins over Evansville and Indiana State. Hittner bounced back from just her third single-digit scoring performance in the win over the Aces with her league-leading fourth 30-plus performance in the big win over the Sycamores. In the

Indiana State win, she poured in a game-high 33 points on 12-of-19 shooting to go along with six rebounds, three assists and two steals in just 28 minutes. Despite a tough-shooting night that led to just seven points, Hittner, helped the Bulldogs in other ways in the Evansville win. She pulled down six rebounds, handed out five assists and nabbed four steals in 24 minutes.

MVC Newcomer of the Week

Jasmine Franklin, Fr., F. Missouri State

Missouri State's Jasmine Franklin averaged 14 points, 6.5 rebounds, 2.5 steals and 2.0 blocks while shooting 62.5 percent from the floor in a pair of road wins. Franklin tallied a career-high 18 points on 7-of-10 shooting Sunday at Loyola, adding five boards, three blocks and three steals against the Ramblers. Friday at Valpo, the rookie had 10 points and eight rebounds, shooting 50 percent with two steals and a block.

NOTEWORTHY

In addition to the league's Player and Newcomer of the Week selections, several conference players had notable performances, including:

Chelsea Brackmann (BRAD) - Brackmann turned in her 13th double-double of the season to help lead Bradley to a 75-65 victory over I-74 rival Illinois State Friday. She also had one assist and four steals as she helped the Braves complete the regular-season sweep of the Redbirds and move into a tie with Illinois State for fourth in the MVC standings. Brackmann had 14 points and 15 rebounds, collecting seven points and 10 boards in the second half to help Bradley pull away down the stretch. Her 13 double-doubles are tied for the second-best season total in school history and her 276 rebounds on the year rank as the fifth-best season total in Bradley history. Brackmann also broke into Bradley's career top 10 in rebounding and ranks ninth all-time with 672 career boards.

Ty Battle (INS) - Ty Battle averaged a double-double over the weekend, averaging 15.0 points and 11.5 rebounds per game while also grabbing a team-high six steals. She grabbed a career-high 14 rebounds at UNI in a 15-point, 14-board performance as she led the Trees back from a 25-point deficit, cutting margin to only six.

Abby O'Connor (LUC) - Loyola sophomore forward Abby O'Connor continued to make her case for All-MVC honors this past weekend, averaging 16.5 points, 6.0 rebounds and 2.5 blocks over a pair of games. O'Connor opened Lovola's final homestand of the season by scoring 17 points (7-18 FGs, 3-6 3FGs) against Southern Illinois in addition to seven rebounds, two blocks and two steals. Two days later, the South Bend, Ind. native paced a quartet of Ramblers in double figures against Missouri State with 16 points (6-14 FGs, 3-7 3FGs, 1-1 FTs), five rebounds, a careerhigh tying three blocks and a steal. O'Connor, who is averaging 16.0 points and 8.8 rebounds during the month of February, enters the penultimate week of the regular season ranked in the top 10 in the league in scoring (9th; 14.0 ppg) and rebounding (7th; 7.2 rpg). The sophomore forward leads The Valley in both free throw percentage (89.2%) and blocked shots (1.4 bpg), while sitting second in three-point field goal percentage (42.5%).

Nicole Kroeger (UNI) - Nicole Kroeger went 11-21 (.524) from the field and averaged 13.5 points per game to lead UNI to a pair of home wins. She scored a career-high 22 points in the win over Evansville, including four three-pointers. She also added three rebound and a pair of assists. Friday, she scored five points, added two assists and grabbed two steals in the win over Indiana State.

Addison Stoller (VALPO) - After matching a career high with 22 points on Friday against first-place Missouri State, Stoller shattered that personal best with a 24-point outpouring on Sunday against Southern Illinois. In the game against the Salukis, Stoller accomplished the rare feat of scoring over half of her team's points. She led the team in scoring in both games this weekend and has reached double figures in six straight and nine of the last 10.

Lasha Petree (BRAD) - Petree scored a team-high 16 points off the bench to help Bradley to a 75-65 victory over I-74 rival Illinois State as the Braves completed the regular-season sweep of the Redbirds. She was 10-for-14 from the free throw line in the win and also had two rebounds, one block and one steal to help Bradley move into a tie for fourth in the MVC standings. Petree's 10 made free throws were the most by a Brave since Leti Lerma was 11-of-14 against Missouri State on Feb. 17, 2017 and she had the most attempts by a Bradley player dating back to Michelle Young making 20 trips to the line at Southern Illinois on Jan. 2, 2014. Petree has scored 330 points on the year, which is the highest season point total for a Bradley freshman since Heather Best had 340 points in 1995-96.

Lexy Koudelka (ILS) - The freshman forward added her first career double-double notching 20 points and grabbing 10 rebounds, while shooting 67 percent from the floor (8-of-12). She topped her personal best in both statistical categories this weekend and led all scores in the contest.

Tamara Lee (INS) - Shooting an impressive 44.8% from the field and scoring 18.5 points per game, Tamara Lee led the Sycamores over the weekend. She shot 37.5% from long range, tying a career-high five 3-pointers in Sunday's game at No. 24 Drake and was perfect from the free throw line. She also grabbed three steals and dished out three assists on the week, averaging 32.0 minutes per game.

Cynthia Wolf (UNI) - Cynthia Wolff averaged 8.5 points and 6.5 rebounds in a pair of home wins for UNI. She had 11 points and nine rebounds in the Panther's big win over Evansville, the largest margin of victory ever for the Panthers in an MVC game. She scored six points and four rebounds against Indiana State Fridav.

Caitlin Wolf (SIU) - Caitlin Link averaged 6.0 points, a rebound and an assist in a pair of Saluki victories over the weekend. Link tied her career-best for points in the first half against Loyola-she scored eight points on 3-of-5 shooting to go along with a steal, a rebound and an assist in 18 minutes off the bench. She followed with two field goals and an assists in 19 minutes in SIU's win over Valparaiso on Sunday.

Elite This Late...

On only two occasions have two teams been 13-1 or better at this point in the MVC league season. The only other occasion occurred in 1984-85 when both Illinois State and Drake were 13-1 when they met on Feb. 27 in Des Moines. The Redbirds pulled out a 79-74 win on the way to the regular season title. Drake and Missouri State can better that mark with wins on Friday with both teams set to meet in Springfield on Sunday.

20 Wins Streak

Drake claimed its fifth-consecutive 20-win season over the weekend and sits with an overall record of 21-5. The impressive streak began in 2014-15. The league record for consecutive 20-win seasons is held by Drake and Missouri State, with each holding a streak of six-straight.

Since the start of the 1992-93 season only two 20win MVC teams have been left out of the postseason. In that time, all but two (55 of 57) 20-win Valley teams have advanced to the postseason. Last season Drake and Missouri State each earned postseason bids after winning at least 20 games

Leading the Pack

Drake's Sara Rhine and Becca Hittner currently rank as the top two scorers in The Valley, ranking No. 1 and No. 2 respectively. Hittner is averaging 19.8 points per game, while Rhine is averaging 19.3 a contest. Only one time in the league's history has a teammate tandem finished the season ranking No. 1 and 2 as Drake's Wanda Ford (24.2 ppg) and Julie Fitzpatrick (23.1 ppg) led the way during the 1984-85 season.

It would also mark the sixth-straight season a Bulldog has led the MVC in scoring (Kyndal Clark in 2014, Lizzy Wendell from 2015-17 and Becca Hittner in 2018), which is the longest stretch a school has led that statistic in league history. Twice has a school led for four-straight seasons (Drake from 1983-86 with Lorri Bauman and Wanda Ford; Missouri State from 1998-01 with Jackie Stiles). UNI's Jacqui Kalin is the last non-Bulldog to lead the MVC in scoring back in the 2013 season.

In Valley men's hoops, an individual from the same school has led the league in scoring five-straight seasons on two occasions. Evansville is riding a current five-year stretch, while Bradley also accomplished the feat from 1987-91.

.700 Club

Drake's Jennie Baranczyk sits third in Valley history in career winning percentage in league games. Baranczyk sits with a career record of 92-30 (.754) in league contests and can tie MSU's Cheryl Burnett for second on the list with a win at Southern Illinois Friday. Missouri State's Kellie Harper sits fifth on the chart with a career mark of 75-29 (.721).

Road Streak Continues...

Drake's MVC-record regular season road winning streak sits at 27-straight entering play Friday in Carbondale. The Bulldogs last suffered a road loss on Feb. 19, 2016 at UNI. Drake also has a Valley-best 10 road wins overall this season. As of Feb. 25, the Bulldogs are one of just of 21 teams that currently have double digit win totals in away contests.

Poll Position

Drake remained in the Associated Press' women's Top 25 poll this week, moving up to No. 23 in the poll. This is the fourth time this season Drake has been ranked in the AP weekly poll, also appearing No. 24 in Week 3 and No. 21 in Week 4 and No. 24 last week. The Bulldogs have been ranked in the AP poll 20 times in program history, which ranks second in MVC history behind Missouri State's 52 appearances in the poll.

30-Point Effort

Drake's Becca Hittner earned her fourth 30+ point game this season, scoring 33 points in the win over Indiana State Sunday. The junior also hit the milestone against Southern Illinois (30), Missouri State (37) and Iowa (32) this season. In the MVC era (beginning in 1992-93), only on 10 occasions has a player had four or more 30+ point outings in a season.

Chasing History

Currently, Drake is averaging 81.1 points per game, ranking 10th nationally. The all-time Valley record for scoring was set in 1995 as Drake averaged 83.5 The Bulldogs have led The Valley in scoring each of the past four seasons. No team has ever led the league in scoring five-straight years (Drake also led from 1995-1998), including on the men's side where only Bradley (1986-89) and Southern IIlinois (1990-93) have led for four-straight seasons.

The Bulldogs are also shooting 47.7% from the field this season, ranking 11th nationally. Drake has led The Valley in shooting percentage each of the past four seasons. Only once in league history has a team led the conference five-straight years (Missouri State from 1990-94).

Strength of Schedule

Drake, Missouri State and UNI tested themselves with a difficult non-conference schedule this season. According to the latest NCAA RPI report, the Bulldogs played the sixth toughest non-conference strength of schedule this season, while the Lady Bears' non-league schedule ranks 81st and Panthers 69th nationally.



Updated RPI Ratings

The latest installment of the NCAA RPI Report (Feb. 25) has six Valley teams that rank in the top-160, led by Drake at No. 24, followed by Missouri State (69), UNI (91), Southern Illinois (151), Bradley (156) and Illinois State (160). The MVC ranks 13th among 32 conferences. The league ranking is the highest for the league since the 2013 season (finished 10th).

Drake junior Becca Hittner currently leads the nation in career three-point field goal percentage. The junior standout boasts a career mark of 45.7% from behind the arc, leading Oregon's Sabrina Ionescu.

Power Five Ahead

Drake finished the non-conference schedule with three Power Five wins on its resume as the Bulldogs beat South Carolina, Rutgers and Nebraska. The conference finished 3-13 against Power Five opponents with all but one of the games taking place on the road or a neutral court.

Vs. Top 25

Last season, the MVC went 0-9 against Top 25 opponents, breaking a streak of three-straight years with at least one win over a Top 25 team. Drake earned a 90-85 overtime win over No. 12/13 South Carolina in Vancouver in November. It was the highest ranked win over an opponent in the regular season by a Valley team since Missouri State beat No. 10 LSU on November 24, 2000. The league finished 1-8 vs. the Top 25 this year.

Against the Field

The MVC held a winning record against 10 leagues in non-conference play, including the America East (1-0), Big West (2-1), Colonial (2-0), Conference USA (4-3), Horizon (9-5), NEC (1-0), Ohio Valley (11-8), Summit (9-5), Sun Belt (1-0) and WAC (6-1). The MVC holds at least a .500 mark against the Atlantic 10 (2-2) and the SEC (1-1). The league finished above .500 in non-conference play for the first time since 2012-13 (59-55) and registered 60 non-league wins for the first time since 2010-11 (62-49).

What's the Difference?

Over the past 20 seasons (since 1999-2000), 11 MVC teams have registered a scoring margin of +12 or better for a season. Drake currently has a +14.4 scoring margin, which is the 6th best among any team in that span. Last year the Bulldogs finished with a +15.0 ppg margin. This would be the fourth-straight season with a scoring margin of +12 for the Bulldogs.

20/20 Vision

Bradley's Chelsea Brackmann scored a career-best 24 points and the leading rebounder in the MVC added 20 boards at Loyola as she notched her second 20-20 performance of the year. Prior to this season there had been just two 20-20 outings in the MVC (2015-16 & 2014-15) over the previous seven years and Brackmann is the first Valley player to have two 20-20 games in the same season since at least the 1994-95 season. Brackmann is one of five players in the nation with multiple 20-20 games this season through contests of Feb. 25.

UNI's Tanya Warren is the only active women's basketball coach in the Valley to have over 200-career wins. Overall, Warren's 222 victories rank fifth in the Valley, behind SIU's Cindy Scott (353), MSU's Cheryl Burnett (319), Illinois State's Jill Hutchison (277) and Eastern Illinois' Barbara Hilke (231). The five coaches are the only women's basketball coaches to achieve the 200-win feat in Valley history.

The league has had nine different regular-season champions in the past 12 seasons (SIU-2007, DU/UE/ILS-2008, ILS-2009, ILS-2010, UNI-2011; MSU-2012; WSU/CU-2013; INS/WSU-2014; WSU-2015; UNI-2016; DU-2017; DU-2018). Bradley, Loyola and Valparaiso are the only league teams not to have won a regular-season MVC championship.

Pounding the Glass

Bradley's Chelsea Brackmann tied the Bradley single-game record with 24 rebounds on Jan. 6 vs. UNI. Brackmann's 24 boards are the second most in the country this season and tied for the fifth most in MVC history. No MVC player has collected 24 rebounds in a game since 2009.

Rhine on McClain Watch List

The Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame and the WBCA announced Thursday that Drake junior Sara Rhine is one of 10 watch list candidates for the 2019 Katrina McClain Award. Named after the two-time All-American and 1987 National Player of the Year, the annual award in its second year recognizes the top power forwards in women's NCAA Division I college basketball. A committee will narrow the list to five finalists in early March, and the winner will be determined by Ms. McClain-Pittman and the Hall of Fame committee to be revealed as part of the WBCA Convention at the 2019 Women's Basketball Final Four.

CoSIDA Academic All-District

Drake's Becca Hittner and Sara Rhine were named to the 2018-19 Google Cloud CoSIDA Academic All-District 6 First Team team last week. Hittner, who holds a 3.96 cumulative grade point average in marketing, is leading the MVC in scoring at 19.8 points per game. Rhine, who owns a 4.00 GPA in elementary education, is a CoSIDA Academic All-District selection for the second-straight season. The Bulldogs were one of just five Division I programs to have two all-district first-team selections, joining Central Michigan, High Point, South Dakota and Fresno State.

Senior CLASS Award Candidate

Drake's Sammie Bachrodt has been named a candidate for the 2018-19 Senior CLASS Award. Bachrodt is among 30 NCAA Division I candidates in women's basketball for the award which recognizes notable achievements in four areas of excellence – community, classroom, character and competition.

"So You Want to Be A Coach"

Valparaiso senior Meredith Hamlet and Drake senior Becca Jonas were named participants in the 2019 "So You Want to be a Coach" program, hosted by the WBCA. This marks the 17th annual "So You Want to be a Coach" program as each member will participate in a three-day workshop with speakers provided by the WeCOACH on April 3-5 in conjunction with the WBCA Convention in Tampa, Florida.

Postseason League

The MVC has seen an average of four league teams participate in postseason play in the last 20 seasons, including three teams reaching postseason play in 2017-18. Drake fell at Texas A&M in the NCAA Tournament, while Missouri State and UNI each received bids into the WNIT. The Valley has earned multiple NCAA Tournament bids in 11 different seasons, including a pair of bids in the 2017 NCAA Tournament (Drake and UNI).

Hoops In the Heartland

The 2019 MVC Women's Basketball Tournament will return to the TaxSlayer Center in Moline, Ill., for the 4th-straight season. Affectionately coined "Hoops in the Heartland," the four-day event (Mar. 14-17) will showcase all 10 Missouri Valley Conference schools as they compete for the Valley's automatic berth into the NCAA Tournament.

The 2019 tournament will mark the 12th-consecutive season in its 37-year history that the event will take place at a neutral site.

The MVC extended an agreement with the Quad Cities Convention & Visitors Bureau to conduct the MVC Women's Basketball Championship in TaxSlayer Center through at least 2021.



Sweeps Week

Bradley topped I-74 rival Illinois State 75-65 Friday to complete the regular-sweep of the Redbirds. In fact, the Bradley men's basketball and women's basketball teams won all four regular-season matchups with Illinois State as the Braves completed their first combined



sweep of the I-74 rivalry since 1986-87. Bradley already boasts three regular-season sweeps this season to mark the first time the Braves swept three league foes since 2009-10 (4) with a chance for a fourth Saturday against Loyola.

Marked Improvment

Friday's win against Illinois State gave Bradley 18 victories and improved the Braves to 8-6 in league play. The last time Bradley won 18 games was 2011-12 as the Braves enter the final two home games of the season looking for its highest overall win total since closing the 2008-09 season with a 21-10 mark. In addition, Bradley has won eight Valley games for the first time since 2012-13 (8-10) and can win nine or more league contests for the first time since 2009-10 (12-6). The five-win improvement from last year is the largest one-year improvement for the Braves since following up a 12-18 campaign in 2007-08 with a school season-record 21 wins in 2008-09.

Dishing It Out

Sophomore Gabi Haack's scoring has dropped off a bit, with the guard averaging just 8.8 points per game over the last four contests, but she dished out a career-high eight assists in Friday's win against Illinois State and she is averaging 3.9 assists per outing over the last seven. In fact, her eight assists against Illinois State last week without a turnover was the first such outing by a Brave since Rachel Merriman at Indiana State on Jan. 10, 2008 and just the seventh on record at Bradley. Haack is the first BU player with 380 points and 60 or more assists in a season since Raisa Taylor in 2010-11. The last Bradley player to score 400 points and have 60 or more assists in a season was Heather Best in 1998-99.

Drake came out of the halftime break against Evansville with tremendous defensive intensity, holding the Purple Aces scoreless for the first six minutes of the third quarter and they scored just three points on eight shots in the period. The three points are the



fewest Drake has allowed in a quarter since the NCAA made the switch to quarters in 2015-16. The 39 points are the fewest scored by a Drake opponent this season.

30 is Great

Becca Hittner bounced back from just her third single-digit scoring performance this year in the blowout win over Evansville with a huge day in the blowout over Indiana State. Hittner poured in 33 points on 12-of-19 shooting for her league-leading fourth 30-plus performance this season. She has the most 30-plus scoring games for a Drake player since her former teammate Lizzy Wendell had four during the 2016-17 season.

Sharp Shooter for Three

Maddy Dean made four three-pointers in Drake's two blowout wins this past weekend to move into fifth all-time at Drake in career three-pointers with 225. Next on the list is Wendell, who made 230 from 2013-17. In front of Wendell is Kiersten Miller (1994-98) and Julie Rittgers (1991-95) who made 235 and 236, respectively. Lindsay Whorton (2004-08) is the school's all-time leader with 266

Fab Freshman

Lexy Koudelka and Kayel Newland both surpassed their personal bests in points in rebounds in ISU's narrow loss to Bradley on Friday. Koudelka led all scorers and notched her first career double-double, adding 20 points and 10 rebounds, while Newland contributed 12



points, eight rebounds and dished out four assists. Together, the two freshman were responsible for 49 percent of ISU's scoring in Friday's game.

Goods the Great

Senior forward Simone Goods continues to prove to be an offensive powerhouse, ranking 35th nationally and second in the league, shooting 54.5 percent from the floor this season. Goods averages 17.5 points per game, which is third most in the league and 73rd nationally, and has added a career high this season of 30 points. The Omaha, Nebraska, native has secured double figures in all but two contests this season, and has tallied six double-doubles.

The Gillespie Era

The Redbirds have had notable moments the last two seasons under the direction of Head Coach Kristen Gillespie. ISU improved its win record last season to 14, which was the winningest since 2012-13. The Redbirds have tallied 15 this year in the win column, making the 2018-19 the most successful year the program has seen in five years. ISU captured a MVC road sweep, taking down Missouri State and Southern Illinois, which was the first time the team has done so since 2014. The Redbirds have posted a five-game win streak twice this season, for the first time since 2010-11, when ISU finished 24-11 and made the WNIT semifinals.

March Off

"March On" may be the official hashtag and battle cry for Sycamore Athletics (and common phrase used in the school's fight song) but for Indiana State Women's Basketball, it's been more like March Off for the past five years. That is because it has been nearly five



years and 14 games since ISU has won a game in the month of March – a streak that dates back to March 14, 2014. That was the last time the Blue and White claimed a March win with a 62-51 victory over Loyola in the MVC Tournament in St. Charles, Missouri.

Home Sweet Home

After a season dominated by travel, Indiana State is finally heading home. The Sycamores will end the regular season with a three-game homestand, the longest such home streak on the schedule. The Trees have only played nine home games to date, compared to 16 road contests, did not have a home game in November and only two in February.

Going to Battle

Ty Battle is seemingly coming into her own late in the season. Since hosting Drake on Jan. 25, Battle is averaging 14.0 points per game, is shooting 50.5 percent from the field and is bringing down an average of 8.1 rebounds per game, leading the team in all three categories. Valley Streaks Continue

Missouri State added to its recent MVC success with two weekend wins, securing a top-three league finish, 12 MVC wins and six road conference victories for the fifth consecutive season. MSU also joined the 1992, 1996 and 2004 teams as the only in school history to begin a Gateway/MVC season with 13 wins in the first 14 games.



Pefect on the Road

The Lady Bears improved to 7-0 in Valley road games with a Sunday win at Loyola, becoming the first squad in program history to reach that mark. The 1995-96 club held the previous mark with a 6-0 start. MSU has won seven conference road games on nine separate occasions, and went 8-1 in 1992. The Lady Bears have won nine straight MVC road games dating to last season, one shy of the school record set from 1999-00 and again from 2015-16.

Ball Security

MSU leads the Valley with a plus-5.21 turnover margin in league games this year, thanks in large part to veteran ball handlers Danielle Gitzen and Brice Calip. Gitzen ranks 13th in school history with a career 1.20 assist-to-turnover ratio, while Calip became eligible for that list with her 150th career assist on Sunday, and now ranks fifth all-time at MSU with a 1.38 mark.

Nicole Martin recorded her sixth double-double of the season, and eighth of her career, in the win at Loyola in a game in which she set new career-highs with 16 rebounds and 12 defensive boards. Martin inched closer to becoming the seventh-active Missouri Valley



Conference player to join the 1,000 career points club. She sits at 958 career points and would become the 26th Saluki to reach 1,000 career points and just the ninth to do so during their junior season.

Shooters Gonna Shoot

Makenzie Silvey scored a team-high 16 points to reach double figures for the fifth-straight game in the win over Valparaiso. It marked the 22nd time this season, and 38th time in her career, that she has reached double figures. Her three three-pointers in the win moved her seventh on SIU's all-time list and she needs just 15 points to reach 700 for her career. Silvey's 60 three-pointers this season are the fourth-most in a season by a sophomore in program history and needs just two more treys to move into the top-3.

Second Quarter Defense

Southern held Valparaiso to just five second quarter points and 7% (1-for-14) shooting in SIU's 58-47 win on Sunday. It marked the second-straight game in which Southern has held its opponent to just five points in the second quarter and the seventh time this season that the Salukis have held an opponent to five points or less in a quarter.

Record Setters

Valpo entered the program record book in the first quarter of Sunday's game vs. Southern Illinois, shattering single-season program records for 3-pointers made and 3-pointers attempted. In both categories, Valpo set the previous record in 1991-92 when the team attempted



676 triples and made 224. The made 3s mark was matched in 2007-08. The new records were solidified with three regular season games and at least one MVC Tournament game to spare. Entering Thursday's game at Bradley, Valpo has 230 made 3s and 696 attempts this season.

High Five

Meredith Hamlet hit yet another milestone on Sunday vs. Southern Illinois as she advanced into the Top 5 on Valpo's all-time scoring list. She is up to 1,277 points, passing Amber Schober (1988-2002) and Betsy Rietema (2003-2007) in the game against the Salukis. She joins Debbie Bolen (1989-93), Dani Franklin (2014-18), Sarrah Stricklett (1996-2000) and Jeanette Gray (1999-2003) in the program's all-time Top 5.

Minutes on the Uptick

Valpo is battling through tired legs at this stage of the season as numerous players are seeing considerable more run than they did a year ago, in part due to the team's five season-ending injuries. Meredith Hamlet's playing time is up only slight from last season, but the other six players that comprise the core rotation are playing significantly more than they did in 2018-19. Allison Schofield, Ella Ellenson and Addison Stoller are all playing at least 12 more minutes per game than they did last season.
