MVC Player of the Week

Stef Jankiewicz, Jr., S. Illinois State

Stef Jankiewicz turned in a team-best .375 hitting percentage this weekend, as ISU went 2-1 at the Redbird Classic and took down nationally-ranked and in-state rival Illinois. In the Redbirds' four-set win over No. 14 Illinois. Jankiewicz posted her fourth double-double of the season with 42 assists and 14 digs, while also contributing seven kills and a .600 average against the Illini. She returned to the court on Saturday and dished out 52 more assists and collected 17 digs for another double-double in the Redbirds' victory over UCF. On Sunday, Jankiewicz continued to set up ISU's offense, while creating her own, finishing with 46 assists, 13 digs and matched

a career high with five blocks. The Redbird Classic All-Tournament Team selection finished the weekend with 140 assists to average 10.00 per set, and 44 digs to average 3.14 digs per set - the second-best average of any Redbird.

MVC Defensive Player of the Week

Gabriela Macedo, Sr., DS, Evansville

In a perfect 4-0 week for Evansville, senior Gabriela Macedo had a record-setting performance. She accumulated a total of 90 digs over 16 sets, an average of 5.62. She notched 14 assists and seven service aces. Macedo started the week with 15 digs in a three-set win at Tennessee Tech. In Friday's home opener against Purdue Fort Wayne, Macedo added 15 more digs, three aces and seven assists. She followed that up with 19 digs, four assists and two aces against Middle Tennessee before posting a record-setting effort against Eastern Illinois. Macedo tallied a UE record 41 digs in the victory, besting Kim Deprez's record of 40. It marked the 6th-highest total in MVC history; she is one of just 16 players in conference history to record 41 or more

digs in a match. Macedo was named to the Dunn Hospitality Tournament All-Tournament Team.

MVC Freshman of the Week

Melanie Feliciano, Fr., OH, Evansville

Melanie Feliciano posted an average of 6.69 kills, a total of 107 on the week, which saw her team go 4-0. She made 262 attempts and hit an extremely efficient .309. She also added 11 block assists (0.69 per set) and 50 digs. In the opener for the week, Feliciano posted 15 kills and five digs at Tennessee State. She opened the Dunn Hospitality Tournament with an impressive 29 kills in 59 attempts against Purdue Fort Wayne, hitting an efficient .424. She added 16 digs. Game two of the home event saw her add 27 kills against Middle Tennessee State while hitting an efficient .371. Feliciano saved her best for last against Eastern Illinois as she notched 36 kills in 95 attempts while posting 20 digs and six block assists. Her kill total

set the Evansville program record, besting the previous mark by four. It was also tied for the second-most in MVC history. Her 95 attempts set the program and conference marks. Feliciano was the MVP in the Dunn Hospitality Tournament.

NOTEWORTHY

In addition to the league's player and freshman of the week selections, several conference players had notable performances, including:

Hannah Thompson (BRAD) - Thompson averaged team highs of 3.00 kills and 4.92 digs per set, while also collecting 0.54 blocks per set in three matches at the UIC Invitational in Chicago. Thompson turned in double-doubles in all three contests, pushing her streak of consecutive matches with double-doubles to seven. She had 14 kills, 41 digs and had a season-best three blocks in Friday's four-set match vs. tournament-host Illinois-Chicago. Thompson collected 10 kills, a then season-best 24 digs and three blocks to help highlight a four-set victory over Sacramento State Saturday morning before closing out the tournament with 15 kills and season-high 26 digs in a five-set outing against Murray State. Thompson leads the Braves in both kills (3.18) and digs (4.59) per set on the young season

Haley Bush (DU) - Led Drake with 43 kills on the weekend at the Bluejay Invitational that featured two matches against top-20 opponents ... opened the weekend with a match-high 18 kills on 38 attempts against No. 12 Washington ... her kills are the fourth most by a player against the Huskies this season and most in a three-set match ... followed that with 14 kills and 11 digs against No. 17 Creighton and completed the weekend with 11 kills and 10 digs in three sets against Omaha.

Gretchen Kuckkan (INS) - Freshman Gretchen Kuckkan had an impressive weekend at the Wright State Invitational, recording her third and fourth double-doubles of the season. On Friday, Kuckkan recorded 13 kills and a career-high 24 digs, followed by a 10 kill-10 dig performance on Saturday against Western Illinois. She was named to the Wright State Invite All-Tournament team for her performance and ended the tourney with 33 kills, 41 digs, four assists, three aces and three blocks.

Taylor Venuto (LUC) - Venuto was named to the all-tournament team at the Amy Svoboda Memorial Classic hosted by Air Force last weekend after averaging 3.40 kills and 1.60 blocks per set, while hitting a robust .526 (34-4-57). The freshman middle hitter started the weekend with a season-high 17 kills and four blocks, hitting .536 (17-2-28) in the process, against Virginia Tech September 13. She came back the following day and delivered nine kills and six blocks in a win over UC Irvine and eight kills (.727; 8-0-11) and six rejections in a victory versus Air Force. For the season, Venuto has made a huge impact and is putting up 3.11 kills and 1.29 blocks per set and is hitting at a .362 (109-25-232) efficiency rate.

Sarabi Worsley-Gilbert (MSU) - Sarabi Worsley-Gilbert earned all-tournament honors at the MSU Fall Invitational, hitting .256 with averages of 3.12 kills and 3.38 points per set. She had at least nine kills in all four matches, beginning with 15 on .324 hitting in Thursday's win against Kansas State. She hit .545 with 13 kills in three sets versus SMU on Friday, had nine kills against Dayton, and concluded the weekend with 13 kills and a career-high six blocks versus Weber State.

Rachel Koop (UNI) - Rachel Koop set the Panther offense to a 2-3 record last week, defeating UMKC and Austin Peay at the Mizzou Invitational. In five matches the senior setter averaged 10.2 assists per set, recorded 18 kills and 5 blocks while also adding 18 kills on 36 total attacks for a .417 attack percentage. Koop opened the week with 50 assists and 13 digs against the Cyclones of lowa State. Koop then backed it up with three straight matches with 30 or more assists at the Mizzou Invitational. She ended the week with 46 assists and 12 digs in a four-set victory over Austin Peay. Koop enters the UNI record book, now at 1,951 assists, Koop ranks #10 in UNI career assist.

Lindsey Paulsen (SIU) - Lindsey Paulsen was named to the All-Tournament Team at the Saluki Invitational after she hit a teamhigh .304 and averaged 2.15 kills and .85 blocks per set in SIU's four matches last week. The Frankfurt, III. native put down 10-plus kills in back-to-back matches, including a career-high 15 kills against IUPUI. The redshirt junior also recorded three aces last week, which were the first of her collegiate career.

Jaclyn Bulmahn (VALPO) - Bulmahn was named to the All-Tournament Team at the DePaul Invitational after leading Valpo in kills and hitting percentage over the course of the weekend, averaging 3.00 kills/set on .258 hitting, Bulmahn reached double figures in kills in all three matches, including a career-high tying 11 against Central Michigan and then setting a new career best with 12 kills on .480 hitting against DePaul.

Kylee Macke (DU) - Led Drake again with 44 digs in three matches, including two against top-20 opponents in No. 12 Washington and No. 17 Creighton ... also belted a team-high three aces on the weekend ... had 11 digs and five assists in three sets against Washington and 19 digs in four sets against Creighton ... closed the weekend with 14 digs in three sets ... averaged 4.40 digs per set on the weekend

Kendal Meier (ILS) - Kendal Meier guided Illinois State's defense in a pair of wins this weekend, including a victory over in-state rival and nationally-ranked Illinois. Meier's anchor in the back row helped ISU keep its opponents to a .183 hitting percentage on the weekend, including a weekend-low of .155 by No. 14 Illinois. The junior libero played all 14 sets for the Redbirds, averaging 4.36 digs per set with a team-high 61 total digs in ISU's three matches.

Melina Tedrow (INS) - Melina Tedrow was strong for the Sycamores defensively at the Wright State Invitational. The sophomore libero tallied a season-best 24 digs against Wright State on Friday evening and ended the invite with a total of 56 digs and 13 assists.

Maddy Moser (LUC) - The libero totaled 20 digs, her fifth match this season with 20 or more, in a three-set victory over UC Irvine, and added eight in a sweep of Air Force. For the season, Moser, who missed all of 2018 with a knee injury, is contributing 5.41 digs, 1.15 assist and 0.32 aces per set.

Azyah Green (MSU) - Azyah Green averaged a team-high 1.31 blocks per set for the Bears, pilling up 21 total stuffs in four matches. She collected 10 blocks on Saturday against Weber State, the most for an MSU freshman since 2006, and had five blocks with two solo efforts in Thursday's victory over Kansas State. Green added four blocks in three sets versus SMU, and two stuffs against Dayton. The rookie also had nine kills on the weekend, with a high of four versus K-State.

Rachel Maguire (SIU) - Maguire did a little bit of everything in SIU's four matches last week. The junior setter/hitter averaged 2.10 kills, 2.10 digs and 4.30 assists per set, which included three-traight triple-doubles. The Bloomington, III. native also did her part at the net, as she tallied multiple block assists in all four matches and averaged .4 blocks per set. Through 10 matches, Maguire has tallied five triple-doubles-which is one off SIU's school record for the most in a single-season.

Rylee Cookerly (VALPO) - Cookerly led the Crusaders in digs last weekend, averaging 5.55 digs/set over the course of the three matches. The junior tallied 20 digs against Holy Cross and set a season high with 25 digs against Central Michigan. She also totaled 54 serve receptions on the weekend without committing a serve reception error.

Sarah Kushner (ILS) - Sarah Kushner turned in the second-most kills for the Redbirds this weekend, as ISU went 2-1 at the Redbird Classic and captured a top-25 win over No. 14 Illinois. The rookie tabulated her second-career double-double in Sunday's 3-2 setback to No. 7 Marquette, collecting 10 digs to go with 15 kills. For the weekend, Kushner averaged 2.14 kills per set and 2.64 digs per set. Her 16 digs in ISU's win over UCF marked a career high, while her 15 kills against the Golden Eagles marked a five-set career best.

Kaylissa Arndorfer (UNI) - Kaylissa Arndorfer finished last week with 35 kills on 76 total attacks for a .303 attack percentage. The freshman outside hitter was a critical piece of the Panthers two wins, recording 7 kills against UMKC and a season-high 12 kills against Austin Peay. Arndorfer finished the week with a team-high 5 service aces while also adding 9 total blocks, the second-highest block total of the week.

Alex Washington (SIU) - Washington continues to put down kills in bunches in her young Saluki career. The freshman outside hitter averaged 2.15 kills and 2.05 digs per set in SIU's four matches last week. She put down 10-plus kills in three of those matches, which included her fourth career kill-dig double-double. The Henderson, Nev. native put down 12 kills to go along with a career-high 22 digs in the win over SEMO.



B1G Win in Normal

Illinois State claimed the MVC's first Top 25 win of the 2019 season with a 3-1 win over #14 Illinois. The last time Illinois State stunned an opponent ranked this high was in 1996, when the Redbirds upset then-No. 8 Notre Dame in five sets. Additionally, Friday's win marked Illinois State's first win over Illinois since Aug. 31, 2006, to level the series at 30 games apiece.

Hot Start

For the third time in five seasons, and secondstraight year under the direction of head coach Leah Johnson, Illinois State is off to a 7-2 start. The best start in program history was a 9-1 start to the 1992 season, going 14-2 in the first 16 matches, and finishing the year 30-4 overall.

AVCA Top-25

Illinois State is now receiving votes in the latest AVCA Top 25 poll, tallying 49 votes in this week's poll (Sept. 16). The Redbirds sit as the 28th team this week. Illinois State last appeared in the AVCA Top 25 on Oct. 9, 1984, coming in at No. 10. ISU has only been ranked during two seasons, 1983 and 1984.

Top-25 Matchup

The Valley weekend schedule features one match against a school ranked in this week's AVCA poll. UNI will face its sixth ranked opponent on Saturday as the Panthers travel to #8 Marquette.

Record Setter

Evansville freshman Melanie Feliciano had a performance for the ages on Saturday against Eastern Illinois. She set an Evansville program record with 36 kills in 95 attempts. Her 95 attempts also set the MVC record. Her tally of 36 kills was tied for the second-highest total in a single match in league history. The 36 kills are the most in a five-set match in NCAA Division I so far this season (Through Sept. 15).

Feliciano Leading All Rookies

Evansville's Melanie Feliciano jumped up the NCAA leaderboard with her record setting weekend. The freshman ranks fifth nationally in kills per set (5.44) and seventh nationally in points per set (5.81). She is currently leading all freshman nationally in both categories.

Another Record

Evansville senior Gabriela Macedo added a record-setting performance of her own against Eastern Illinois as she totaled 41 digs. It set the Evansville program record while also etching herself in the MVC record book. Her total was the 6th-most in league history. She is one of just 16 players in the history of the MVC to post 41 or more digs in a single match.

Against the Field

The MVC holds a winning record against 10 leagues in non-conference play (Atlantic Sun, Big Sky, Big West, Conference USA, Ohio Valley, Patriot, Summit, Sun Belt, SWAC & WAC), and at least a .500 record against another two (Big Ten & Mountain West) through three weeks of the season.

Non-Conference Success

Since 2010, the Valley has posted a record above .500 in non-conference play every year except 2014 (55-57) and 2017 (61-66). The MVC holds a 42-54 (.438) mark in non-conference in 2019.

Elite Company

Bradley's Hannah Thompson is one of a handful players in the nation to lead their team in both kills and digs. Through matches of Sept. 15, Thompson is the only player in the nation to have 100 or more kills and at least 150 digs. Thompson ranks 70th nationally in digs per set this season. She has posted seven consecutive double-doubles entering the final weekend of non-conference action and is nine kills short of becoming just the eighth player in school history to reach 500 career kills as a sophomore.

Tough Defenses

Bradley and Valparaiso are ranked among the top 10 nationally in digs per set. The Braves sit 4th in digs per set (19.26), while Valpo sits seventh (18.24). Last season, Valpo led the nation in total digs, while the prior year, the Crusaders led the country in digs/set. The Braves have ranked in the top 11 in the country in digs per set each of the last two years.

Going the Distance

Southern Illinois has played in four-straight five-set matches, including a comeback win over Alabama State on Saturday. It ties the school record for the longest streak of five-set matches, which was set in 1988. SIU's victory over Alabama State was its fifth of the season, which matched last season's win total.

Anderson Hits 3,000

Saturday night saw Valpo junior setter Brittany Anderson hit another milestone in her career, as she dished out the 3,000th assist of her career late in the match against DePaul. Anderson is just the sixth player in program history to reach the mark.

Triple Doubles Galore

Southern Illinois' Rachel Maguire tallied three-straight triple-doubles over the weekend. In doing so, she tied Meg Viggars (2015) for the longest stretch of triple-doubles in program history. Through 10 matches, the junior has five triple-doubles- one off Viggars' school record of six triple-doubles, set in 2015. Maguire currently leads the nation in the category.

Rachel Maguire and Alayna Martin both posted triple-doubles against IUPUI Friday. It marked just the second time in school history, and the first time since Nov. 13, 1981, that two Salukis have notched triple-doubles in the same match.

Missouri State sophomore Chloe Rear registered her second triple double of the season against Kansas State Thursday.

The Valley has the most triple-doubles nationally (8) and is the only league to have three different players with at least one.

Power Five Streak

Missouri State knocked off Kansas State of the Big 12 in five sets on Thursday, the sixth consecutive season the Bears earned a Power Five victory, with 10 such wins since the beginning of the 2014 campaign.

Approaching 500

UNI head coach Bobbi Petersen enters the week with a career record of 489-158, 11 wins away from 500. Only Missouri State's Melissa Stokes (1996-2018) has reached the 500-win mark in MVC history.


THE VALLEY HAS EARNED MULTIPLE NCAA **VOLLEYBALL** TOURNAMENT BIDS **15 TIMES**

Big Performance

Sophomore outside hitter Rachel Pranger came up with a big performance in Saturday's five-set match against Murray State, finishing with a season-high 18 kills and career-best 30 digs. Pranger, who earned a spot on the UIC Invitational All-Tournament team and has three double-doubles on the year, had the highest dig total for a Bradley player other than a libero since Briony Hammet had a then school-record 38 digs at Evansville on Oct. 22, 2005. In fact, Pranger's 18 kills were the most in a



30-dig performance dating back to 1991 when Blythe Zajakowski had 21 kills and 30 digs against Valparaiso on Sept. 29, 1990. The last MVC player to collect at least 18 kills and 30 or more digs in a match was Missouri State's Lily Johnson at Drake on Oct. 13, 2017. Pranger is averaging 2.72 kills and 3.03 digs per set this fall.

Grinding It Out

Bradley is hitting .173 as a team, but the Braves once again rank among the national leaders (4th nationally), averaging a league-best 19.26 digs per set. Saturday's four-set win against Sacramento State saw Bradley pull out the victory despite hitting .110 in the match. The victory against the Hornets marked the second time this season the Braves won a match hitting .113 or lower and was the team's lowest attack percentage in a win dating back to Sept. 2, 1995 when Bradley hit .108 as a team in a neutral site win against McNeese State.

Elite Company

Outside hitter Hannah Thompson is one of a handful players in the nation to lead their team in both kills and digs, but the sophomore is in even more exclusive company. Through matches of Sept. 15, Thompson is the only player in the nation to have 100 or more kills and at least 150 digs. Thompson ranks 70th nationally in digs per set this season. She has posted seven consecutive double-doubles entering the final weekend of non-conference action and is nine kills short of becoming just the eighth player in school history to reach 500 career kills as a sophomore.

B1G Win

For the first time in 10 years, the Redbirds and the Illini renewed their in-state rivalry on Friday night, as ISU stunned No. 14 Illinois in four sets. The last time Illinois State took down an opponent ranked this high was in 1996, when the Redbirds upset then-No. 8 Notre Dame in five sets. Additionally, Friday night's win marks Illinois State's first



win over Illinois since Aug. 31, 2006, to level the series at 30 games apiece.

Doing Double

Illinois State's starting setter Stef Jankiewicz was all over the court, posting three double-doubles and a .375 hitting percentage in the Redbirds' 2-1 weekend at their home tournament. In the Redbirds' four-set win over No. 14 Illinois, Jankiewicz posted her fourth double-double of the season with 42 assists and 14 digs, while also contributing seven kills and a .600 average against the Illini. The Redbird Classic All-Tournament Team selection finished the weekend with 140 assists to average 10.00 per set, and 44 digs to average 3.14 digs per set – the second-best average of any Redbird.

Hot Start

For the third time in five seasons, and second-straight year under the direction of head coach Leah Johnson, the Redbirds are off to a 7-2 start. The best start in program history was a 9-1 start to the 1992 season, going 14-2 in the first 16 matches, and finishing the year 30-4 overall.
