MVC Offensive Player of the Week

Josh Dolling, Jr., F, Missouri State

Josh Dolling continues his hot start to the 2019 campaign for the Bears, scoring the game-winning goals in both matches last week to keep Missouri State undefeated on the season. The junior forward fired the game-winner in the final minute of regulation to secure the Bears' 1-0 win over Central Arkansas on Tuesday, Sept. 10. He turned right around and provided late-game heroics once again in the next match, scoring the golden goal for MSU in its 2-1 overtime thriller against Tulsa

on Saturday night. Dolling leads the nation with four game-winning goals, recording the go-ahead goal in each of the Bears' four straight wins to open the season.

MVC Defensive Player of the Week

Kyle Hiebert, Jr., D, Missouri State

Kyle Hiebert played in 183 minutes in two matches for Missouri State this past week as the Bears stayed undefeated with wins over Central Arkansas and Tulsa. A junior from Canada, Hiebert helped the Bears' defense secure its third straight shutout in a 1-0 win against UCA. A mainstay at center back for MSU, Hiebert anchors a Bears' backline that has surrendered only one goal on the season, holding opponents to just four shots on goal through the first four games.

NOTEWORTHY

In addition to the league's player of the week selections, several conference players had notable performances, and they include:

Leroy Enzugusi (DU) - Enzugusi enjoyed a career night in Drake's 1-0 win over Kansas City on Saturday, unleashing eight shots and putting four on goal, both of which are personal bests. The junior scored the game-winner via free kick in the 57th minute after drawing a foul to earn the attempt. Four of Enzugusi's shot attempts were on frame, a major reason the Bulldogs recorded a season-best six shots on goal against the Roos. Enzugusi ranks third in the MVC in shots per game (3.6) and tied for fifth in goals (two).

Jesse Stafford-Lacey (UE) - Helping Evansville to an unbeaten record this week, Jesse Stafford-Lacey had a hand in both of the Aces' goals. Against Lipscomb on Tuesday night, Stafford-Lacey tied the match in the 83rd minute on a stunning goal that soared over the keeper's head from 35 yards out. Coming back home on Saturday evening, Stafford-Lacey assisted on the game-winning goal against UNC Asheville as the Kerry, Ireland native received a pass from freshman Nkosi Graham and slipped it through to sophomore Ryan Harris who found the back of the net. Stafford-Lacey leads Evansville in goals (three), points (seven), shots (11), and shots on-goal (five), and is tied for the team-lead in assists with one.

Billy Hency (LUC) - Hency notched two goals and one assist to secure Loyola's 4-2 win over DePaul on Friday. His second goal of the night in the 86th minute was also the game-winner. Hency's standout night is already a career-best, having tallied just one goal and one assist last season as a freshman. The Fenton, Mo. native also added four shots in the game, three of which were on goal, to aid the Ramblers in out-shooting the Blue Demons, 12-7.

Ryan Madondo (VALPO) - The East Tennessee State transfer picked a good time for his first goal in a Valpo kit, providing an 89th-minute equalizer on Sunday night at Oral Roberts. He converted a 1-vs.-1 with the goalkeeper to send the match into overtime. It was the latest Valpo goal in regulation since Alex Brown scored at the 89:02 mark to lift the team to a 1-0 win over Milwaukee on Sept. 7 of last season.

Luke Anderson (DU) - Drake's defense recorded season-bests against Kansas City in multiple categories, including shots allowed (four), shots on goal (two), and goals (zero). Anderson recorded two saves en route to earning the Bulldogs' first shutout of the season. Anderson added two saves against Big East foe DePaul and ranks third in the MVC in saves per game (2.00).

Hunter DeWeese (UE)-In a week that saw Evansville's opponents score just once, redshirt-senior Hunter DeWeese was a solid force along the backline for the Aces. Against Lipscomb, DeWeese played 98 of a possible 110 minutes, allowing one goal and also recording a shot. DeWeese helped the Aces record a shutout win over UNC Asheville, playing all 90 minutes and not allowing a shot on-frame from the Bulldogs. DeWeese leads all field players for Evansville in minutes played this season, seeing 415 minutes of action in five matches.

Edvin Holst (VALPO) - Valpo goalkeeper Edvin Holst notched eight saves in his lone appearance of the week, a valiant effort in a 2-1 double-overtime loss to Oral Roberts on Sunday. He has recorded eight saves or more in two of his first three collegiate starts. The eight saves in a single match equals the most by a Valpo player since Nico Campbell's nine on Sept. 9, 2014 vs. Butler. Holst put together a strong showing to fend off numerous quality ORU chances. The first goal came on a rebound after he had a diving stop on the initial try.



MVC SOCCER NOTES

No Place Like Home

MVC men's soccer programs have been extremely successful at home this non-conference season, sitting 11-2-2 on their home pitches. The start is the best in MVC men's soccer since the 2009 season when MVC programs went 16-4-2 at home in non-league play.

Home Win Streak

Loyola extended its home win streak to eight-straight on Friday, beating crosstown rival DePaul. The Ramblers last home defeat was a 1-0 overtime loss to Northwestern on Sept. 7, 2018. The streak is tied for the fifth active streak in NCAA Division I trailing Air Force (18), UIC (16), Cal State Fullerton (15) and Indiana (14).

Dolling Strikes Again

Missouri State's Josh Dolling scored his third and fourth consecutive game-winning goal for the Bears with his last minute goal vs. Central Arkansas and overtime goal vs. Tulsa. Dolling is tied for first nationally (Anders Engebretsen of St. Mary's) with four game-winners on the season.

Bears Remain Perfect

Missouri State extended its winning streak to four games with a pair of late-game thrillers as the Bears scored in the 89th minute in a 1-0 win over Central Arkansas, followed by a 2-1 come-from-behind win in overtime against Tulsa on Saturday night. The Bears have opened their season with four straight wins for the first time since 2000.

The Bears are one of 12 teams still sitting perfect in all of NCAA Division I, joining Stanford, SMU, St. John's, Saint Mary's, Clemson, Navy, Wake Forest, Virginia, Georgetown, Cal St. Fullerton and Rutgers. MSU is the only team not ranked in any polls.

Another Shutout

MSU started the season with threestraight shutouts for the first time in program history, before surrendering a goal in the win over Tulsa Saturday. The Bears' defense has held opponents to a total of four shots on goal through the first four matches to open the season.

National Team of the Week

Missouri State's Josh Dolling earned a spot on this week's 11-member Top Drawer Soccer Team of the Week, after scoring a pair of game-winning goals against Central Arkansas and Tulsa.

MVC in Regional Rankings

The MVC has three teams currently ranked in the latest United Soccer Coaches West Regional rankings released on Tuesday (Sept. 17). Missouri State jumped to No. 2 in the region, while Loyola (6th) and Evansville (9th) also appear in the poll.

Streaks End

Bradley carried some lengthy unbeaten streaks into Friday's game against Eastern Illinois, only to see them come to an end in a game the Braves dominated in every category but the final score. The 1-0 loss to the visiting Panthers ended Bradley's program-record-equalling non-conference unbeaten streak at 17 games (9-0-8), dating to



Oct. 17, 2017. The Braves also had been 9-0-0 all-time at Shea Stadium against Eastern Illinois and was unbeaten (7-0-1) in their last seven games versus the Panthers, dating to the 2009 season.

Focus on Valley Opener

Bradley will turn its attention to its Missouri Valley Conference opener, a Saturday trip to Drake. Without a midweek game this week, the Braves will have five days to prepare for their league opener. The game against the Bulldogs will kick off the new, double round-robin MVC schedule format. Bradley will face Drake twice in its next four games with the return matchup set for Oct. 5 at Shea Stadium to cap Bradley University's annual Homecoming week.

The Aces' midfielder scored a game-tying goal in the 83rd minute against Lipscomb, letting loose of a shot from nearly 40 yards out near the touchline that found its way over the keeper and into the net. Stafford-Lacey's goal quickly



began to gain attention on social media with more than 24,000 views and 5,500 likes on the NCAA Soccer account.

Home Sweet Home

Evansville has played just two matches at home this season, but have been successful at Arad McCutchan Stadium. In two matches at McCutchan Stadium, the Aces have recorded four goal on 27 shots with 13 coming on-goal. The Aces are out-scoring their opposition 4-1 at home this season and have not lost at home since Sept. 21, 2018 in a loss to then No. 2 Indiana.

The last time Valpo trailed as late as the 89th minute and got the game to overtime was Sept. 29, 2014, when Nick Suker scored at 89:37 to tie a match with Dayton at two, an eventual 2-2 draw at Brown Field.
