MVC Offensive Player of the Week

Cole Rainwater, Fr., F, Valparaiso

Rainwater turned in a hat trick in the first home fixture of his collegiate career, scoring in the 23rd, 53rd and 86th minutes of an 8-2 victory over IU Northwest on Monday. His final goal came on a penalty kick to complete the feat. It was the 10th hat trick in program history and the third in the last four years. Rainwater added an assist to his three-goal effort, making it a seven-point night for the rookie. He matched a program record for points in a single match, becoming just the fifth player in Valpo history to accrue seven. He was the first player to do so since Paul Leitelt on Aug. 27, 2006 vs. Evansville. Rainwater struck seven shots in Monday's match, placing six on goal.

MVC Defensive Player of the Week

Jacob McKee, Sr., D, Bradley

A senior defender, McKee appeared in a season-opener for the first time in his career, playing the entire 110 minutes in Bradley's 0-0 draw against Belmont Friday night at Shea Stadium. Anchoring one of Bradley's two central defender slots, McKee not only helped the Braves to a shutout performance, but keyed a defensive effort that did not allow a single shot on goal for the first time in at least five years. Bradley's defensive effort strengthened throughout the opener and Belmont managed just one shot in the 20 minutes of extra time.

NOTEWORTHY

In addition to the league's player of the week selections, several conference players had notable performances, and they include:

Leroy Enzugusi (DU) - Enzugusi scored Drake's first goal of the season in the 79th minute against Oral Roberts. The junior also generated another shot against the Golden Eagles. Enzugusi notched two more shots and another shot on goal against Milwaukee, helping the Bulldogs to outshoot the Panthers 14-6 overall and 5-3 in shots on goal.

Matic Pavlic (UE) - In his first collegiate regular season action, freshman Matic Pavlic impressed early in his Aces' career. Earning a 3-1 victory over EIU on Friday evening, Pavlic scored the first goal of the match, cheating down a pass from Hunter DeWeese and scoring past the keeper. Against Butler on Monday, Pavlic added to his stat sheet, recording a pair of shots and putting one on goal. Through two matches, Pavlic has played 127 minutes and started both contests.

Aidan Megally (LUC) - Loyola senior Aidan Megally guided the Ramblers through two wins this weekend which gave Loyola the Hampton Inn at Loyola Chicago Classic title. The Park Ridge, Ill. native scored the game winner off a free kick against Northern Illinois on Sunday afternoon. Megally's lone goal in the 76th minute was the 11th of his career. The midfielder also notched two shots on goal during the weekend and was also named to the Hampton Inn at Loyola Chicago Classic All-Tournament team.

Josh Dolling (MSU) - The 2018 MVC goal leader picked up where he left off from last season, scoring the lone goal in Missouri State's 1-0 win over Santa Clara on Monday (Sept. 2) night. Following a Bears' free kick, Dolling collected a deflected shot from Stuart Wilkin and fired it into the net for his first goal of the season. The junior forward notched his fourth career goal against the Broncos, following up his hat-trick performance from last year's match.

Marcel Kampman (LUC) - Loyola graduate student Marcel Kampman had a breakout weekend in his debut as a Rambler. Leading Loyola's defensive efforts, Kampman recorded four saves and only allowed one goal against Vermont on Friday. On Sunday, the Wellington, New Zealand native registered five saves.

Edvin Holst (VALPO) - Holst helped Valpo to a 1-1 draw on Friday night at Green Bay by grabbing eight saves in his collegiate debut. He played all 110 minutes in goal and tied the most saves by any Valpo goalkeeper since Nico Campbell had nine on Sept. 9, 2014 vs. Butler. Holst's save total was the highest by a Valpo goalkeeper in his first career start since Marc Cilfone had 10 at Bradley in 2001.

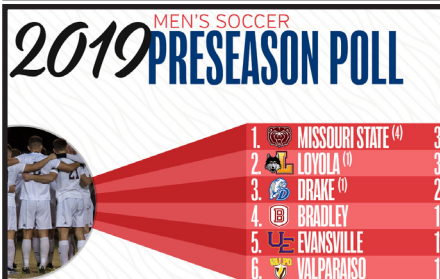

Poll Position

Loyola is receiving votes in this week's United Soccer Coaches Top 25 poll, following a pair of wins over the weekend. The Ramblers are receiving 11 votes.

MVC in Regional Rankings

The MVC has three teams currently ranked in the latest United Soccer Coaches West Regional rankings released on Tuesday (Sept. 3). Loyola sits No. 5 in the region, while Evansville (9th) and Bradley (10th) also appear in the poll.

Ramblin' Out of the Gate

Loyola improved to 2-0 on the season following Sunday's 1-0 win over Northern Illinois, claiming the Hampton Inn at Loyola Chicago Classic title. It's the Ramblers' first 2-0 start since the 2016 season when Loyola opened the campaign 7-0 on the way to an at-large berth into the NCAA Tournament.

Record Setting Win

Valpo debuted its new Brown Field turf by equaling a program record for goals in a game on Monday night, downing IU Northwest 8-2 in the home opener. Valpo matched a program record of eight goals in a match that was established on Aug. 26, 2011 against Calumet and had stood alone ever since. Monday was the sixth time in program history Valpo prevailed by six goals or more and the first time the team had a margin of victory that large since the aforementioned 2011 game against Calumet.

Bradley Extends Non-Con Streak

Bradley was 6-0-4 in its 10 games outside conference play last season. The Braves are unbeaten (7-0-7) in their last 14 non-conference games, which sits as the second-longest streak in program history, trailing only the record 18-game (15-0-3) run from Sept. 7, 1997 to Nov. 13, 1998.

More Preseason Accolades

Bradley senior forward Gerit Wintermeyer earned preseason honors from Top Drawer Soccer. The Braves senior earned a spot on the publication's National Top 100 list appearing at #99.

Wisbey Benefits with Shutout

A fifth-year senior, goalkeeper Nathan Wisbey (Rockford, IL/Boylan HS) was the beneficiary of Bradley's defensive effort Friday, a scoreless draw against Belmont. Wisbey was did not have to make a save en route to his second shutout in his third career start for the Braves. Wisbey allowed one goal in his two early-season starts last season, before a broken arm suffered in practice ended his season. Although he allowed two goals in 44 reserve minutes in 2016, Wisbey has allowed only one goal in his three career collegiate starts, good for a 0.31 goals against average as a starter.



Dahlquist Memorial Game

Bradley will host IUPUI Friday night at Shea Stadium in the annual Danny Dahlquist Memorial Game. The Jaguars make for a special opponent for the annual tribute to Dahlquist, a Peoria Notre Dame High School graduate who died days before the start of his redshirt freshman season at Bradley in 2007. IUPUI is coached by Brian Barnett, a Peoria Notre Dame graduate who served as an assistant on the Bradley coaching staff for seven years from 2009-15. Barnett is assisted by Ronnie Bouemboue, who also worked as a Bradley assistant for two years (2013-14).

Pavlic's goal is the first season-opening goal by a freshman since at least 2005.



Beginning Like the Ending

Much like he ended last season, senior Jesse Stafford-Lacey started his 2019 campaign. After scoring the game-winner for the Aces on a penalty kick in the 90th minute at Bradley on Nov. 3 to send the Aces to the MVC Championship, Stafford-Lacey began this season with a goal from the spot. In the 77th minute, Stafford-Lacey stepped to the spot and scored, tallying what would be the game-winning goal for the Aces.

Creating Opportunities

Through two matches, the Aces have done a good job of earning set pieces. Evansville sits inside the top 35 in the nation in corner kicks per match with 6.5 per game, earning seven against EIU on Friday and six on the road at Butler on Monday.

VALPARAISO (1-0-1)

Strong Beginnings

Valpo debuted its new Brown Field turf by equaling a program record for goals in a game on Monday night, downing IU Northwest 8-2 in the home opener. Valpo matched a program record of eight goals in a match that was established on Aug. 26, 2011 against Calumet and had stood alone ever since. Monday was the sixth time in program history Valpo prevailed by six goals or more and the first time the team had a margin of victory that large since the aforementioned 2011 game against Calumet.



Immediate Overtime

In Friday's 1-1 draw at Green Bay, Valpo went to overtime in the season opener for the fourth year in a row and the seventh time in the last eight years. It marked the fourth time in that span and the first since 2014 that the team started the season with a draw.

Making it Rain

Cole Rainwater had seven points in Monday's 8-2 victory over IU Northwest, becoming the first player in Mike Avery's 13-year coaching tenure to turn in seven points in a match for Valpo. The last player to do so was Paul Leitelt on Aug. 27, 2006 vs. Evansville. Rainwater was the fifth player in program history with a seven-point performance and the 10th to turn a hat trick. Valpo's last seven hat tricks have all been scored by players in their first or second year in the program. His hat trick was Valpo's third in the last four years (Kendan Anderson and Adan Garcia) after the team had gone a decade between hat tricks prior to Anderson's in 2016.
