## **MVC Player of the Week**

#### Brice Calip, Sr., G, Missouri State

Missouri State's Brice Calip averaged 17 points, 4.7 rebounds and 2.7 assists per game while earning all-tournament honors at the Gulf Coast Showcase. The senior scored a career-high 26 points in Saturday's victory against No. 12/11 Maryland, guiding the Lady Bears to an 81-72 victory after trailing by 16 late in the first half. Maryland is the highest-ranked team MSU has defeated since No. 5 Duke in the 2001 Sweet 16. Calip began the year with an efficient 10 points and five rebounds in 21

minutes in MSU's victory at Atlantic Sun favorite Florida Gulf Coast, surpassing 1,000 career points in the process. On Sunday versus Wake Forest, Calip tallied 15 points, four assists and three boards.

Drake redshirt sophomore Grace Berg poured in a career-high 24 points in her debut in the win over Creighton. Berg followed that with 10 points and three rebounds in the Bulldogs' loss

## **NOTEWORTHY**

In addition to the league's Player and Newcomer of the Week selections, several conference players had notable performances, including:

Lasha Petree (BRAD) - Petree averaged 22.5 points per game in a pair of contests, shooting 93.8 percent from the free throw line (15-16) and also collecting 2.0 rebounds, 2.0 blocks and one steal per outing. In fact, for the fifth time in her career she turned in consecutive 20-point scoring efforts. Petree scored 22 points in the first half of the season-opening victory over Kansas City before leaving the contest early in the second half with an injury. She also had three rebounds, one assist and one block in 24 minutes of action. She returned to the court Saturday to score a game-high 23 points against Milwaukee as she matched a career high with 10 made free throws. Petree also had three blocks and two steals to help lead a defensive effort that held Milwaukee to just 31.5 percent shooting. Petree's 22-point first half against Kansas Citytied her highest scoring half of her career and she now has 18 career 20-point scoring efforts.

**Maddie Monahan (DU)** - Senior point guard Maddie Monahan, who made her 100th career appearance and 98th consecutive start against Green Bay, averaged 14.5 points, 4.0 assists, 2.5 rebounds and 1.0 steal per game last week. Monahan had 13 points, three rebounds, three assists and one steal in the win over Creighton. She followed that a team-high 16 points along with a team-high five assists and two rebounds against Green Bay.

Jamyra McChristine (INS) - After being shutout in the first half against Detroit Mercy, Jamyra McChristine turned her game up in the second half to help the Sycamores earn their first victory. The senior tallied 13 second half points, including five straight to end the third quarter and give the Trees a crucial lead. She also tallied 8 rebounds, two steals and one assist. During the season-opener at Illinois, McChristine finished with just six points, but 13 rebounds, one short of her career-best. During the opening week, she finished with 9.5 points and 10.5 rebounds per game.

Ellie Rice (LUC) - Loyola senior guard Ellie Rice recorded her first career double-double in Saturday's season-opening 70-57 road win over Chicago State. Rice finished 6-of-10 from the field and knocked down a pair of attempts from beyond the three-point arc to finish with 14 points (6-10 FGs, 2-3 3FGs), reaching double figures in scoring for the 37th time in her career. The Austin, Texas native also grabbed a game-high 10 rebounds, just two caroms off her career high, in addition a game-best five assists and two steals.

**Kam Finley (UNI)** - Scored a team-high 22 points against lowa... added nine points against Creighton... shot 42.3% from the field and 38.8% from the three-point line... Averaged 5.0 rebounds per game.

Rachel Pudlowski (SIU) - Rachel Pudlowski made just her sixth career start in SIU's season opener against Eastern Michigan on Nov. 25 and finished with 10 points on 4-of-5 shooting. The senior forward from O'Fallon, Mo. added three rebounds and a pair of assists in a career-high 25 minutes of action. It marked just the second time in Pudlowski's career, and the first time since Dec. 2, 2017, that she has scored in double figures.

**Grace White (VALPO) -** White paced Valpo in its season opener at Bowling Green, finishing with 15 points. She added six rebounds, tied for team-high honors with four steals and recorded a team-high four blocks, setting a career high.

**Tete Danso (BRAD)** - Danso came off the bench in Bradley's first two games to average 4.0 points and a team-high 9.0 rebounds per game. She was impressive in the opener, pulling down a game-high 11 rebounds to go with six points on 3-of-3 shooting and also tallying one block and three steals in 20 minutes of action. Her 11 rebounds were the most by a Bradley freshman in their debut dating back to the 1987-88 season opener. Danso had two points, one assist and seven rebounds Saturday against Milwaukee.

Essy Latu (INS) - Sycamore junior Essy Latu led the offensive attack in a victory over Detroit Mercy on Sunday. The Brisbane, Australia native recorded 21 points, including 6-for-12 from three-point range and 7-of-13 from the field. In addition to her 21 points, she tallied four rebounds, two assists and two steals. Her six triples from Sunday are tied for the fifth-best number in the NCAA through the opening week.

**Sitori Tanin (LUC)** - Loyola freshman forward Sitori Tanin impressed in her collegiate debut this past Saturday at Chicago State, scoring a team-high 16 points (5-7 FGs, 6-9 FTs) in the Maroon & Gold's season-opening 70-57 win over the Cougars. Out of Middleton, Wis., Tanin, who was one of two freshmen in head coach Kate Achter's starting lineup, stuffed the statsheet on the afternoon, adding six rebounds, two assists, a block, and three steals.

Abi Jackson (MSU) - Abi Jackson made her Missouri State debut with 12 points against Florida Gulf Coast on Friday and averaged 5.7 points and 2.0 rebounds in Missouri State's three games. Jackson added five points and three rebounds in the Lady Bears' Saturday victory against No. 12/11 Maryland.

Emerson Green (UNI) - Averaged 9.5 points per game... Averaged 27.5 minutes... shot 50% from the field and 55.6% from the three-point limeade five three pointers and seven total shots... Averaged 3.0 assists per game... tallied a team-high four assists against Creighton... Averaged 1.5 steals.

**Quierra Love (SIU)** - Quierra Love played 16 minutes off the bench in SIU's season opener against Eastern Michigan on Nov. 25. The Glen Carbon, III. native scored six points and added two assists.

**Leah Earnest (VALPO)** - Earnest had a strong effort on the glass in her Valpo debut, pulling down 10 rebounds to tie for game-high honors. She is one of just two Valpo freshmen in the last quarter-century to reach double figures on the glass in their collegiate debut and the only one to do so against a D-lopponent.

## **Power Five Up Ahead**

This week, the MVC schedule features four more games against Power Five schools, including lowa at Drake, Drake at Minnesota, Valpo at Illinois and Valpo at Purdue. The conference sits 1-3 against Power Five opponents after the first week of play as Missouri State beat #12/11 Maryland. Last season, the MVC earned nine wins over members of Power Five conferences during the regular season.

#### **Statement Win**

No. 24/25 Missouri State out-scored No. 11/12 Maryland by 25 points over the game's final 21 minutes Saturday, overcoming a 43-27 deficit late in the first half for an 81-72 victory over the Terrapins at the Gulf Coast Showcase. The 9-point margin of victory is the largest by a Valley team in the regular season over a Top 15 AP team since the Lady Bears beat No. 10 LSU 85-75 on Nov. 24, 2000. The win was also MSU's fifth top-25 victory since March 2019 and marks the eighth consecutive season that Missouri State has defeated a Power Five program.

## **Another Season Opening Win**

With the win over its former MVC rival, Creighton, on Nov. 25, Drake has won its past six season openers. The impressive season opening-game streak started for the Bulldogs on Nov. 15, 2015 when they beat lowa State, 74-70. The victory over the Bluejays was third-straight for the Bulldogs in the series. It was also the second time the former league rivals started a season against each other with the previous meeting coming on Nov. 8, 2013 with Drake winning 62-55. That 2013 game was the first year Creighton joined the BIG EAST Conference.

#### Win Over Old Rival

Karli Rucker led the way with 12 points, but for the second-straight game, every Panther that played scored as UNI held off Creighton for the 55-52 home win Saturday. The Panthers have won three of the last five meetings with Creighton in the series.

## **Off and Running**

Loyola opened the season with a 70-57 road win over Chicago State. Sitori Tanin led a quartet of Ramblers to reach double figures in scoring with a game-high 16 points in her collegiate debut, while Ellie Rice recorded her first career double-double, finishing with 14 points and 10 rebounds. After defeating Detroit Mercy to begin the 2019-20 campaign, Loyola has now won its regular-season opener in consecutive seasons for the first time since the 1985-86 and 1986-87 seasons.

#### Redbirds Pause Team Activities

The first three games of the regular season for Illinois State were canceled due to limited roster numbers in conjunction with COVID-19 testing protocols. Games affected included road games at Northern Illinois (11/25) and Tulsa (11/28) and a home game versus Dayton (12/2). A decision on safely resuming team activities will be made in the days to come following additional discussions and medical testing.

## SIU COVID Shutdown

Southern Illinois women's basketball coach Cindy Stein announced on Friday that the team had one player test positive for COVID-19, and due to contract tracing and subsequent quarantines, the Salukis did not have the minimum eight players required for Sunday's previously scheduled game at Memphis. SIU began a 7-day pause until re-testing could take place and canceled their appearance at next weekend's Compass Challenge hosted by Eastern Illinois.

## **Elite Shooting**

In just her second game of her Sycamore career, Essy Latu put on an offensive show to help lead the Sycamores to victory over Detroit Mercy. Latu connected on 6-of-12 triples, including 7-of-13 from the field overall, to lead ISU with 21 points. Her six threes are the fifth-best mark in the NCAA through opening week and the best outing since Del'Janae Williams connected on five from deep at Illinois Chicago on Nov. 19, 2019.

## **Looking to Reverse Course**

Evansville played a couple of close contests last season with its two season-opening opponents this week. Last season, the Aces fell to Murray State and Purdue Fort Wayne by a combined five points with both games being one on a shot in the final 30 seconds.

## **New Bradley Record**

Senior Gabi Haack broke Bradley's career three-point field goal mark in Wednesday's season-opening victory against Kansas City. Haack, who topped Katie Yohn's (2009-13) previous school mark of 210 career triples, broke the mark with her fifth and final trey of the contest late in the third quarter vs. the Roos. She hit four second-half three-pointers, scoring 16 of her 19 points in the final 20 minutes. Haack now has 11 career outings in which she has made at least five three-pointers. Owning 213 career three-pointers, Haack currently sits eight three-pointers from catching Jackie Stiles for 25th in MVC history in three-point makes.

## **Tough Tests**

Valpo's challenging nonconference slate features back-to-back road games at Big Ten foes this week, as the Crusaders travel to Illinois on Wednesday and Purdue on Sunday. This marks the first time that Valpo has played consecutive games against Big Ten opponents since opening the 2006-07 campaign with games at Northwestern and at Indiana.

## **Polling**

Missouri State moved up three spots to No. 21 in Monday's AP Top 25 poll after earning a win over No. 12 Maryland Saturday.

MSU appeared No. 25 in the USA Today/WBCA Coaches Poll last week. The updated rankings will be released Tuesday. With their inclusion in the preseason poll, the Lady Bears have appeared in 19 consecutive releases of the coaches' rankings, tying a school record set by the 2000-01 team. It's also Missouri State's first preseason ranking by the coaches since 2000, when they began the year rated 21st.

## **Mid-Major Top-25 Poll**

Missouri State, Drake and Bradley appear in the preseason (Nov. 25) CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major Top 25. The Lady Bears sit atop the poll at No. 1, while Drake sits 13th and Bradley 14th. UNI is also receiving votes.

#### 1.000 Point Club

The Valley has four active players in the 1,000 point club. Brice Calip became the 29th member of Missouri State's 1,000-point club on Friday against Florida Gulf Coast. The senior guard ended the weekend tied for 26th on the scoring list with 1,045 career points..

## **Rise of The Valley**

The 2019-20 season tied the highest RPI ranking the Missouri Valley Conference has recorded in its history showcasing how The Valley is becoming one of the best mid-major leagues in the country. The league posted a top-15 RPI for the first time since 2012-13 during the 2018-19 season and increased to 8th last year, including five teams in the Top 100 of the RPI for the first time since the 1998-99 season.

## **Naismith Award Watch List**

Bradley junior guard Lasha Petree has been named to the 2021 Women's Jersey Mike's Naismith Trophy Watch List according to an announcement by the Atlanta Tipoff Club. The preseason Watch List included 50 individuals from 11 conferences with Petree the lone representative from the MVC. The midseason 30 team will be announced in early February. The competition will be narrowed down to 10 national semifinalists on March 2, 2021, and four finalists will be named on March 19, 2021. The winner of the 2021 Jersey Mike's Naismith Trophy for Women's Player of the Year will be announced on April 3, 2021.

### **Hammond Award Watch List**

Missouri State junior forward Jasmine Franklin was named to the preseason watch list for the 2021 Becky Hammon Mid-Major Player of the Year Award presented by Her Hoop Stats. The second player in school history to reach 500 career rebounds as a sophomore, the Fayetteville, Ark., native had the 11th-highest defensive rebounding rate in the nation last season and ranked in the top 10% nationally in steals and blocks according to advanced metrics provided by Her Hoop Stats. In January, 15 players will be named to the midseason watch list.

## **Starters Returning**

The Missouri Valley Conference will see 34 of 50 starters return (68%) for the 2020-21 season. The league will return five of its top 10 in scoring, five of its top 10 in rebounding and two of its top five in assists. The Valley will also have five of its first-team All-MVC players return and three honorable mention selections.

## **Lady Bears Favored**


Missouri State was tabbed as the preseason favorite in the MVC Women's Basketball race in the annual survey of the league's coaches, SIDs and media.

## **Postseason League**

The MVC has seen an average of four league teams participate in postseason play in the last 21 seasons where postseason action took place, including three teams reaching postseason play in 2018-19. Before the 2019-20 season was cut short due to COVID-19, the MVC was in position to send 5 or 6 teams to postseason play. The Valley has earned multiple NCAA Tournament bids in 12 different seasons, including two out of the last three seasons (not counting 2019-20).

## **Hoops In the Heartland**

The 2021 Missouri Valley Conference Women's Basketball Tournament will return to the TaxSlayer Center in Moline, Ill., for the sixth-straight year.

Affectionately coined "Hoops in the Heartland," the four-day event (Mar. 11-14) will showcase all 10 Missouri Valley Conference schools as they compete for the Valley's automatic berth into the NCAA Tournament.

The 2021 tournament will mark the 14th-consecutive season in its 39-year history that the event will take place at a neutral site. However last year's event was cancelled due to COVID-19.

The Missouri Valley Conference is one of only seven conferences (out of 32 nationally) where the women's basketball tournament is played at a neutral site, separate from the men's championship (AAC, ACC, Big Ten, Big 12, MVC, Pac-12 and SEC are the others).





To be ranked, a player must appear in at least 75.0% of their team's games.
