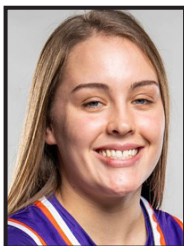

MVC Player of the Week

Abby Feit, So., G/F, Evansville

Helping lead Evansville to its best start in more than a decade, sophomore Abby Feit posted a pair of impressive performances last week. Against Oakland City on Wednesday, Feit became the first player in NCAA DI to produce a game with 28 points (a career high), 14 rebounds, six steals and four blocks, tallying her second double-double of the season in the 84-52 win. On Saturday in a 66-60 win over Miami (Ohio), Feit again reached the 20-point mark, scoring a game-high 24 points, while adding eight rebounds and four steals. On the season, Feit leads The Valley in rebounds per game (9.5) and steals per game (3.3), sits tied for first in blocks (2.3), second in points per game (20.5) and three-point percentage (60.0%), and third in field-goal percentage (59.6%).

MVC Newcomer of the Week

Grace Berg, RSo., F, Drake

Drake redshirt sophomore Grace Berg continues her strong play in her first season as a Bulldog. Berg scored a game-high 23 points against South Dakota State and just missed her first career double-double with nine rebounds to go with three steals and four assists. She made a career-high seven free throws in the loss to the Jackrabbits. Despite battling foul trouble, Berg had eight points, against No. 22 Texas. Berg averages 17.2 points per game, which ranks fourth in The Valley.

NOTEWORTHY

In addition to the league's Player and Newcomer of the Week selections, several conference players had notable performances, including:

Gabi Haack (BRAD) - Haack averaged 18.0 points and a team-best 6.0 rebounds per outing, while shooting 63.2 percent from the field and 57.1 percent (8-for-14) from beyond the arc in a pair of home contests. She opened the week by connecting on a season-high seven three-pointers (7-for-10) and finishing with team highs of 24 points and seven rebounds against Summit League preseason favorite South Dakota. Playing just 13 minutes in a route of Quincy the very next day, Haack finished with 12 points on 4-for-7 shooting and also had five boards, two assists and a block. Haack moved into the top 25 in MVC history in career three-pointers in the game against South Dakota and climbed into 10th in career scoring at Bradley in the game against Quincy.

Maddie Monahan (DU) - Senior Maddie Monahan has been a consistent standout for Drake this season through its challenging non-conference slate. Monahan, who is averaging a career-best 18.7 points per game (3rd in MVC), recorded her first-ever back-to-back 20-plus games last week against two tough opponents in South Dakota State and No. 22 Texas with both on the road. She started the week with 20 points on 8-of-13 shooting against the Jackrabbits and added three rebounds, two assists and two steals. Monahan followed that with a career-high 28 points against the Longhorns behind a career-best shooting performance making 11-of-15 shots, including a career-high four three-pointers. She has scored 10 or more points in 10-straight games dating back to the end of the 2019-20 season.

Terrion Moore (ILS) - Junior guard Terrion Moore put together an all-around performance in Thursday's win over Omaha, posting a team-high 11 points, shooting 3-of-4 (75.0%) from behind the arc, and adding a team-high five rebounds, a game-high four steals and three assists. Moore is currently third in the Valley, averaging 3.0 steals per game.

Jamyra McChristine (INS) - Jamyra McChristine posted a strong performance for the Sycamores at Xavier on Monday evening, recording her first double-double of the year with 18 points and 12 rebounds. In addition to her double-double, the senior tallied three steals and a career-high three blocks. McChristine finished 7-of-14 from the floor and a perfect 4-of-4 from the charity stripe.

Allison Day (LUC) - Loyola junior forward Allison Day turned in one of the most efficient efforts of her career in the Ramblers' 80-61 win over Purdue Northwest on Friday night. Day finished a perfect 6-of-6 from the field and knocked down all six of her free throw attempts as part of an 18-point effort, just two points shy of her career high. The Russellville, Ohio native narrowly missed out on a double-double, collecting nine rebounds in addition to dishing out a pair of assists in the victory.

Brice Calip (MSU) - Brice Calip averaged 15 points, six rebounds, two assists and two steals last week as the Lady Bears split a pair of games. Monday at Missouri, the senior scored 17 points with a career-high 12 free throws made in 13 attempts, adding two assists and a steal to help the Lady Bears top their in-state rival for the second consecutive season. Saturday, Calip scored a team-high 13 points against South Dakota State to go with seven rebounds, two assists and three steals.

Bre Gunnels (UNI) - Bre scored 11 points, grabbed a block and a steal for a solid offensive performance against Iowa State, but her real contribution came on the defensive end where she was the primary defender on All-American Ashley Joens. Joens scored just six points, including 2-10 from the field. It was the first time that she had been held under double figures since the 2018-19 season. She has scored at least 24 points in her other seven games this year and at least 32 in four of those games.

Abby Brockmeyer (SIU) - Abby Brockmeyer averaged 15.5 points, 7.5 rebounds and 3 assists per contest as SIU split a pair last weekend. The Raymond, Ill. native tallied 23 points on an efficient 9-of-13 shooting to go along with seven rebounds and five assists in Southern's win over Kansas City on Dec. 17. It marked just the fifth 20-plus points scoring output for Brockmeyer in her career and her first since 12/21/18 against IUPUI. She followed with eight points and eight rebounds against Mizzou on Sunday and is now 16 points shy of 1,000 for her career.

Shay Frederick (VALPO) - Frederick enjoyed a career game in her first collegiate game in her home state, going off for a game-high and career-best 27 points at Wisconsin. Frederick connected on seven 3-pointers against the Badgers, tied for fourth-most in a single game in program history, and sent the game to overtime with a driving basket with 1.3 seconds to play in regulation. She also finished just one board shy of her career best, grabbing eight rebounds. Frederick started the week with a 7-point, 7-assist effort in Valpo's win over Xavier and averaged 17.0 points, 4.5 rebounds and 6.0 assists over the two games on 56.5% shooting from the field.

Rylie Stephens (UE) - Continuing to produce for the Aces, freshman Rylie Stephens put together another strong week of games. On Wednesday in a win over Oakland City, Stephens scored six points and recorded three rebounds. Helping the Aces move to 3-1 on the year in a 66-60 victory over Miami (Ohio) on Saturday, Stephens narrowly missed double-figures with nine points, adding five rebounds. On the season, Stephens sits fourth on the team in scoring (8.3 points per game) and second in rebounding (5.0 rebounds per game).

Sitori Tanin (LUC) - Loyola freshman forward Sitori Tanin reached double figures in scoring for the second time in three outings as part of an 80-61 Rambler win on Friday over Purdue Northwest. The Middleton, Wis. product finished as one of four Ramblers to score in double figures in the win, adding 13 points (4-8 FGs, 5-5 FTs). Tanin, who also grabbed six rebounds and handed out two assists, made her presence felt on the defensive end of the floor, swatting a pair of shots.

Sara McCullough (UNI) - Redshirt freshman Sara McCullough saw just 11 minutes on the court, but she went 2-2 from the field, including a three-pointer, grabbed a pair of rebounds and added an assist a block.

Adrianna Katcher (SIU) - Adrianna Katcher averaged 5.5 points and 6.5 rebounds as SIU split a pair last weekend. The Urbana, Iowa native finished with four points and six rebounds in Southern's win over Kansas City and followed with seven points and seven rebounds at Missouri on Sunday. Katcher leads all Valley freshmen in rebounds per game (7.2) and ranks 21st nationally amongst freshmen in the category.

Leah Earnest (VALPO) - Earnest helped Valpo to a 1-1 week, averaging 9.0 points and 4.0 rebounds while shooting 66.7% from the field. The rookie contributed seven points and four rebounds in just nine minutes in Valpo's first-ever win over Xavier and followed with a season-high 11 points to go with four rebounds in her return to her home state Sunday at Wisconsin. Earnest averaged 4.9 rebounds/game through Valpo's non-conference slate, second-best on the team.

MVC Players and Newcomers of the Week are selected each week during the women's basketball season. The players are announced on Monday afternoon and appear in a weekly press release. Nominees are provided by each school's sports information contact and voted on by a panel appointed by the league office.

Closing Out Non-Con

The Valley will close out the brief non-conference slate over the next eight days with five more games currently scheduled.

The Valley sits 31-21 (.596) during non-conference play so far this season.

Heading Toward League Play

The league's 90-game conference slate begins on Friday, Jan. 1. In the new format, most MVC teams will face one another in a two-game series on back-to-back days at the same site. Each institution will play four road series and four home series and will also face their designated 'travel partner' in a single-game, home-and-home series.

Incredible Two-Year Run

Missouri State completed an exceptional two-year run from Dec. 20, 2018-Dec. 19, 2020 with a 54-9 record, a win total that ranks fifth nationally behind only Baylor, Oregon, UConn and Stanford over those dates. Each of those teams has spent time at No. 1 in the AP poll during that span.

Top 25 Success

The Valley is 2-2 vs. AP Top 25 Teams this season, with Missouri State's win over #12 Maryland and UNI's over #22 South Dakota State.

The last time The Valley had a pair of AP Top 25 wins during the non-conference portion of the season was back in 2002 when Drake beat No. 18 Iowa State and UNI beat No. 24 Iowa State.

Power Five Wins

The MVC has secured five wins over Power Five programs during the shortened non-conference schedule. The Valley has gone 5-8 vs. Power Five teams after going 9-12 in 2019-20. The Valley sits 4-4 vs. the Big Ten, 1-1 vs. the SEC, 0-2 vs. the Big 12 and 0-1 vs. the ACC. Missouri State and Valpo each have two wins, while Drake owns the other.

The remaining non-conference schedule has two more games vs. Power Five opponents as Southern Illinois will face Illinois and Drake will travel to Iowa State Tuesday.

Impressive vs. B1G

Big Ten women's basketball teams have lost only four home non-conference games this year. Three of those losses have come via Valley women's basketball programs. Valpo claimed wins at Illinois and Purdue, while Drake won at Minnesota. The Big Ten has lost only 8 non-conference games overall with four of those coming to Valley teams.

Home Cooking

Currently MVC teams are 19-6 (.760) at home this season. Last year, The Valley posted an impressive 39-9 (.813) record at home during non-conference play.

Five MVC teams are unbeaten at home: Evansville (3-0), Illinois State (2-0), Indiana State (2-0), Valparaiso (2-0) and Loyola (1-0) have unblemished records on their home courts this season.

1,000-Point Club

The Valley has five active players in the 1,000-point club. Bradley's Lasha Petree became the 21st player in program history to reach 1,000 career points in Thursday's loss to South Dakota, scoring 23 points. She is just the fourth Brave in program history to reach the mark in fewer than 70 games, topping the mark in her 65th career contest.

UE: Aces' Hot Start

Moving to 3-1 on the season, the Aces accomplished something they had not achieved in over a decade. Evansville's 3-1 start is its best since the Aces opened the season 4-1 during the 2008-09 campaign in which UE went on to capture the 2009 MVC Tournament Championship. The Aces are also on a three-game winning streak, their best since the 2016-17 season when Evansville recorded six-straight victories.

ILS: COVID Strikes Again

Illinois State had to cancel its non-conference finale versus Green Bay on Saturday following positive COVID-19 tests within the Omaha program and subsequent contact tracing. The Mavericks had played the Redbirds in Redbird Arena the night prior. A decision on safely resuming team activities will be made in the days to come following additional discussions and medical testing. Five of ISU's eight scheduled games this season have been canceled due to COVID-19 concerns.

SIU: Taking Care of the Ball

The Salukis turned the ball over a season-low six times in the win over Kansas City. It was the fewest turnovers for SIU since its 66-41 win over Evansville on March 3, 2018 in which SIU turned the ball over just four times. Southern has committed the fewest turnovers per game (12.5) in the Valley. SIU's win over Kansas City marked the 19th time during Coach Stein's tenure that the Salukis have finished with single-digit turnovers.

INS: Dominating the Boards

The Sycamores continue to put pressure on opposing teams on the boards, most recently outrebounding Xavier 45-34. ISU is 56th nationally and fourth in the Valley in rebounding margin at +7.8 while averaging 42.4 rebounds-per-game. A big part of that comes from the presence of senior forward Jamyra McChristine, who is averaging 8.8 rebounds per game (third in the MVC) and a league-leading 4.6 offensive rebounds-per-game, the 15th-best number in the nation.

DU: Road Trippin'

Drake, which scheduled the game at No. 22 Texas just days before the matchup, has played five of its six games this season away from the Knapp Center. Drake will close its non-conference slate with another tough opponent on the road Tuesday when it makes the trip to Iowa State. The Bulldogs' challenging non-conference schedule has logged the team roughly 2,550 miles on the road so far.

VALPO: Add Another

With two wins over Big Ten teams already under its belt, Valpo added a Big East victory to its slate this week with a home win over Xavier. Valpo had been 0-8 versus Xavier before Wednesday's win, with seven of those games decided by double figures. Xavier is just the second current Big East program Valpo has ever beaten, joining Butler.

UNI: Here Come the Jackrabbits

The Panthers meet South Dakota State again, this time on the road in Brookings. The Jackrabbits are 6-2 so far this season with three wins over ranked opponents, including Missouri State. They are averaging 66.4 points per game, but the Panthers held them to just 48 points in UNI's win.

BU: On the Mark

Senior Gabi Haack knocked down 7-of-10 three-pointers last week against South Dakota, finishing with a season-best 24 points against the Coyotes. Haack, who ranks 11th nationally in made three-pointers (22) through games of Dec. 20, now has three career outings with at least seven made three-pointers and is 24th in MVC history with 228 career triples. Haack has scored in double figures 70 times, which is tied for the eighth most double-digit scoring efforts in program history, and her 228-career three's is currently 15th nationally among active players.

LUC: Day Digs the Home Opener

Loyola junior forward Allison Day paced the attack in Friday night's 80-61 win over Purdue Northwest. Day poured in a game-high 19 points, finishing with perfect marks from the field (6-6 FGs) and the free throw line (6-6 FTs). The 6-foot-1 forward has made a habit out of dominating in Loyola's home openers during her first three seasons in Rogers Park, averaging an impressive 17.0 points and 6.7 rebounds across the trio of contests.

Polling

Missouri State fell to No. 24 in this week's AP Top 25 Poll after suffering a home loss to South Dakota State. MSU sits No. 20 in the USA Today Coaches Top 25 poll (Dec. 15).

Mid-Major Top-25 Poll

The December 15th edition of the Collegelinsider.com Mid-Major Top 25 continues to have Missouri State at the top with 29 of the 31 1st place votes, while Drake moves up to No. 9 and UNI enters the poll at No. 17. Bradley is receiving votes in the poll this week.

Rise of The Valley

The 2019-20 season tied the highest RPI ranking the Missouri Valley Conference has recorded in its history showcasing how The Valley is becoming one of the best mid-major leagues in the country. The league posted a top-15 RPI for the first time since 2012-13 during the 2018-19 season and increased to 8th last year, including five teams in the Top 100 of the RPI for the first time since the 1998-99 season.

Naismith Award Watch List

Bradley junior guard Lasha Petree has been named to the 2021 Women's Jersey Mike's Naismith Trophy Watch List according to an announcement by the Atlanta Tipoff Club. The preseason Watch List included 50 individuals from 11 conferences with Petree the lone representative from the MVC. The midseason 30 team will be announced in early February. The competition will be narrowed down to 10 national semifinalists on March 2, 2021, and four finalists will be named on March 19, 2021. The winner of the 2021 Jersey Mike's Naismith Trophy for Women's Player of the Year will be announced on April 3, 2021.

Hammond Award Watch List

Missouri State junior forward Jasmine Franklin was named to the preseason watch list for the 2021 Becky Hammon Mid-Major Player of the Year Award presented by Her Hoop Stats. The second player in school history to reach 500 career rebounds as a sophomore, the Fayetteville, Ark., native had the 11th-highest defensive rebounding rate in the nation last season and ranked in the top 10% nationally in steals and blocks according to advanced metrics provided by Her Hoop Stats. In January, 15 players will be named to the midseason watch list.

Lady Bears Favored

Missouri State was tabbed as the preseason favorite in the MVC Women's Basketball race in the annual survey of the league's coaches, SIDs and media.

New Schedule Format

The Missouri Valley Conference has adopted a new scheduling format for men's and women's basketball Conference games (the women's schedule is attached in multiple formats.) The Conference will continue to play an 18-game format in which most MVC teams will face one another in a two-game series on back-to-back days at the same site. Each institution will play four road series and four home series and will also face their designated 'travel partner' in a single-game, home-and-home series.

The new format significantly reduces travel and places an emphasis on the health and safety of student-athletes, coaches and staff. Rescheduling windows (Jan 30-31; Feb 27-28), plus reduced risk with less travel and fewer cross-team interactions should provide the league the best chance to play the most games. Additionally, the league's COVID-19 Working Group has worked tirelessly to develop testing and operational standards, and the league has employed KINEXON SafeZone technology to aid in contact tracing.

KINEXON SafeZone technology utilizes lightweight, wearable devices, called SafeTags, which will be used conference-wide by basketball student-athletes, coaches and select staff during practices and games. SafeTags can accurately calculate the proximity between individuals by distance and length of time in order to perform quick and accurate contact tracing. The devices will also be used by officials during all Conference basketball games.

Starters Returning

The Missouri Valley Conference will see 34 of 50 starters return (68%) for the 2020-21 season. The league will return five of its top 10 in scoring, five of its top 10 in rebounding and two of its top five in assists. The Valley will also have five of its first-team All-MVC players return and three honorable mention selections.

Postseason League

The MVC has seen an average of four league teams participate in postseason play in the last 21 seasons where postseason action took place, including three teams reaching postseason play in 2018-19. Before the 2019-20 season was cut short due to COVID-19, the MVC was in position to send 5 or 6 teams to postseason play. The Valley has earned multiple NCAA Tournament bids in 12 different seasons, including two out of the last three seasons (not counting 2019-20).

Hoops in the Heartland

The 2021 Missouri Valley Conference Women's Basketball Tournament will return to the TaxSlayer Center in Moline, Ill., for the sixth-straight year.

Affectionately coined "Hoops in the Heartland," the four-day event (Mar. 11-14) will showcase all 10 Missouri Valley Conference schools as they compete for the Valley's automatic berth into the NCAA Tournament.

The 2021 tournament will mark the 14th-consecutive season in its 39-year history that the event will take place at a neutral site. However last year's event was cancelled due to COVID-19.

The Missouri Valley Conference is one of only seven conferences (out of 32 nationally) where the women's basketball tournament is played at a neutral site, separate from the men's championship (AAC, ACC, Big Ten, Big 12, MVC, Pac-12 and SEC are the others).
