MVC Player of the Week

Grace White, Sr., G/F, Valparaiso

White was named College Sports Madness National High-Major Player of the Week after leading Valpo to a historic week, pacing the Crusaders in a pair of wins on the road at Big Ten programs. White tallied a game-high 17 points and nine rebounds in the win at Illinois, scoring a basket with 1:39 to play to bring Valpo within one and then assisting on the go-ahead basket with 42.8 seconds to play. Then, in the win at Purdue, White matched her career best and led all scorers with 20 points while adding eight rebounds as well. White scored baskets on back-to-back possessions in the final 75 seconds to push a one-point lead out to five points. White has now led Valpo in scoring in five straight games dating back to last year. The win over Illinois was the first in program history, while the win over Purdue was just the second in program history, as Valpo had entered the week winless against Big Ten teams since 2012.

MVC Newcomer of the Week

Grace Berg, R-So., F, Drake

Drake redshirt sophomore Grace Berg continues to make an immediate impact for Drake with two more great games last week. Against Iowa, Berg, who was named the MVC's first newcomer of the week last week, had career-highs in points with 26, rebounds with nine and assists with four. She followed that effort with 12 points and four rebounds in the big win over Minnesota. Berg led the MVC in scoring per game (20.0 ppg) going into the Minnesota game and has scored in double figures in all four games in her first season as a Bulldog.

NOTEWORTHY

In addition to the league's Player and Newcomer of the Week selections, several conference players had notable performances, including:

Gabi Haack (BRAD) - Haack averaged 17.0 points, 7.0 rebounds and 1.5 steals per game in a pair of road contests last week. In Wednesday's road win at Wright State, she tied for team-high honors with 16 points, knocking down 3-of-7 three-pointers and also grabbed seven boards and two steals as she played all 40 minutes. Haack tied for team-high scoring honors again Sunday at Saint Louis, finishing with 18 points, seven rebounds, one assist and a steal against the Billikens. She has hit three or more three pointers in three of four games and grabbed seven or more boards in all four outings.

Kierra Collier (DU) - Redshirt junior Kierra Collier had two outstanding games this past week against a pair of Big Ten opponents, averaging 24.5 points and 8.0 assists per game while shooting a blistering 71.4 percent (10-of-14) from three and 53.3 percent (16-of-30) from the floor. Collier started the week with 25 points against Iowa and added a career-high 10 assists for her first career double-double, with 22 of those points coming in the second half. She connected on seven of her nine attempts to tie for the third-most three-pointers in a game in school history. Collier then scored a game-high 24 points to go with six assists and she made 7-of-8 free throws in the big win over Minnesota. She went into the Minnesota game ranked third in the nation in assists at 7.0 per game. Overall, Collier is averaging 17.8 points and 6.8 assists per game.

Abby Feit (UE) - The 2020 MVC Freshman of the Year started her sophomore campaign off without a hitch, scoring double-digits in both contests and recording a double-double. Against Murray State, Feit finished second on the team in scoring with 12 points, adding five rebounds and three blocks in the loss. In a 70-60 win over Purdue Fort Wayne on Saturday, Feit poured in 20 points, while pulling down 11 rebounds for her 24th career double-double. Feit also continued to be the rim protector for Evansville with a pair of blocks.

Mary Crompton (ILS) - Redshirt sophomore Mary Crompton exploded for a career and game-high 20 points in ISU's season opener versus Saint Xavier on Sunday, shooting 70% (7-of-10) from the floor and going an impressive 6-of-7 (85.7%) from behind the three-point line. The six triples also match Crompton's career-high of three-pointers made in a game, which she reached on two occasions last season (2/02/20 at Missouri State and 2/22/20 at Drake). Crompton added six rebounds in her 24 minutes on the court.

Caitlin Anderson (INS) - Caitlin Anderson used another strong offensive performance to help the Sycamores earn their second-consecutive win for the first time since the 2018-19 season. In the 84-80 victory over Murray State on Saturday, Anderson put up 18 points on 7-of-15 shooting (46.6%) to go along with four steals, three rebounds, an assist and block. She currently is second in the Valley in total assists and assists per game with nine and 3.3, respectively.

Megan Maahs (UNI) - Megan Maahs scored 26 points in two games, including the double-overtime game-winner with 2.2 seconds remaining to lift UNI over former MVC foe Wichita State. The senior scored six points in the two overtime periods and hit the last two shots for UNI in its 93-91 win over the Shockers. She had 17 points, 3 rebounds, two assists and two blocks in the win. She was 8-9 from the field on the day. Against NDSU, she scored nine points and grabbed five rebounds.

Rylie Stephens (UE) - In her first collegiate week, Stephens impressed with her ability to score. On Tuesday against Murray State, Stephens finished with a team-high 14 points and seven rebounds, shooting 6-of-9 from the field in her debut. In a win over Purdue Fort Wayne on Sunday, Stephens finished with four points and seven rebounds. After two games, Stephens sits fourth on the team in scoring and second in rebounding.

Terrior Moore (ILS) - Junior guard Terrior Moore went a perfect 5-of-5 in the fourth quarter of ISU's season opener versus Saint Xavier, including 2-of-2 from beyond the arc to tally 14 points in that span. The Kansas City, Kansas native finished the day with 16 points, six rebounds, two steals and an assist in her debut as a Redbird.

Essy Latu (INS) - Sycamore junior Essy Latu once again helped the ISU offensively in an 84-80 victory over Murray State on Saturday. The Brisbane, Australia native put up 10 points to go along with two rebounds and an assist, but she added a trio of three-pointers to her season total during the outing. She is sitting at third in the Valley with nine triples made through three games and fourth in three-pointers per game at three.

Maya McDermott (UNI) - Maya McDermott made her Panther debut against Wichita State and made a huge impression. She was 6-7 from the field and 3-4 from the three-point line. She went 3-3 from the arc in the third quarter to lead UNI to a 31-point third quarter. She also had an assist and a pair of rebounds.

MVC Players and Newcomers of the Week are selected each week during the women's basketball season. The players are announced on Monday afternoon and appear in a weekly press release. Nominees are provided by each school's sports information contact and voted on by a panel appointed by the league office.

High Level Success

The MVC tallied three more road wins over Power Five schools this past week as Valpo beat Illinois and Purdue and Drake routed Minnesota. The Valley currently sits 4-3 vs. the Big Ten this season and 0-1 vs. the ACC entering this week's schedule.

The Valley also is 2-0 vs. the Big East so far this year, with Drake and UNI holding wins over Creighton. In fact, 40% (6 of 15) of the MVC's non-conference wins so far are vs. the Big Ten and Big East in 2020-21.

This week, the MVC has a couple opportunities to add to the list as Missouri State travels to Missouri and Loyola faces DePaul on Sunday. The Lady Bears are already responsible for one of the league's four wins over the Big Ten with a win over previously No. 11 Maryland.

Last season, the MVC earned nine wins over members of Power Five conferences during the regular season.

Pair of B1G Wins

Before earning wins last week at Illinois and at Purdue, Valpo had just one road win against a Big Ten team in program history - over Michigan in the 2002 WNIT. Valpo also beat multiple Big Ten teams in the same season for the first time in program history, beat Illinois for the first time and Purdue for the second time, and earned its ninth and 10th victories over power-conference teams all time.

Big Games vs. the B1G

Drake, which split last week against Iowa and Minnesota, played back-to-back Big Ten opponents for the first time since 2002. The Bulldogs dropped a heartbreaker to the Hawkeyes after leading by double digits twice in the home opener, but they bounced back with a big win over the Gophers. Drake scored 97 points against the Hawkeyes and followed that with 99 points against Minnesota. It was the most points ever scored in the series with Minnesota that was last played in 2004 and helped the Bulldogs earn their first win over the Gophers since 1988.

Home Cooking

During the first two weeks of the non-conference schedule, MVC programs only played eight of the 26 games at home. The league still holds a winning record at 15-11 overall despite playing 18 games away from campus with 9 of the 10 programs sitting at .500 or better.

This week, 8 of the 12 scheduled games will be played at home. Currently MVC teams are 5-3 at home this season. Last year, The Valley posted an impressive 39-9 (.813) record at home during non-conference play.

Last Second Win

Megan Maahs hit a contested layup with 2.2 seconds remaining to give UNI a 93-91 lead and a double-overtime road win over Wichita State Sunday. UNI has now won six straight against Wichita State and has not lost to WSU since the Shockers left the MVC.

Home Streak on the Line

Missouri State looks to extend its 15-game home win streak Monday night against Lincoln. Already the longest winning streak since the Lady Bears moved to JQH Arena, a win would tie for the sixth-best overall home streak in school history. MSU won its 15 home games last season by an average score of 81.3-60.7.

Nine Months Later

Illinois State finally took the court on Sunday, almost nine months to the day since their last game, to open the 2020-21 season with a 98-53 win over NAIA opponent Saint Xavier at Redbird Arena. Four different Redbirds reached double-digit scoring in the victory and ISU has now won their home opener every year in head coach Kristen Gillespie's tenure.

SIU COVID Update

The Salukis did not play this past week due to a positive COVID test within the program. Southern recently added a contest to its schedule, as it will take on Saint Louis University in a non-conference clash inside Banterra Center on Friday, Dec. 11 at 1 p.m.

Offense Engage

With their 84-80 victory over Murray State on Saturday, Indiana State has now scored 80 points in back-to-back games for the first time since March 10-11, 2011. It is the Sycamores' first time scoring 80 points in consecutive games in the regular season since accomplishing the feat three times from Dec. 29, 2006-Jan. 4, 2007 against Drake, Creighton and Evansville.

Efficient Shooting

The Aces shot 55.8% from the field in the win over Purdue Fort Wayne, hitting 24 of their 43 attempts from the field. The shooting performance was the Aces fourth-best shooting performance from the field under head coach Matt Ruffing and best since shooting 63.8% against Austin Peay last season.

Home Front

Bradley is 12-1 in its last 13 non-conference home contests and 15-2 at home against non-conference foes since the last time Northern Illinois visited Renaissance Coliseum on Dec. 2, 2016. Bradley opens a two-game home stand Sunday against the Huskies before hosting Summit League preseason favorite South Dakota Dec. 17. The Braves own a 17-5 home mark at home in non-conference contests under fifth-year head coach Andrea Gorski.

Moving Up

Owning 219 career three-pointers, Bradley's Gabi Haack currently sits two three-pointers from catching Jackie Stiles for 25th in MVC history in three-point makes.

Red Line Rivalry

After opening its season with a 70-57 win over Chicago State on November 28, Loyola returns to action this Sunday when it makes the short trip south to battle DePaul. The Blue Demons, who opened the season ranked in both the AP Top 25 and USA Today Coaches Poll, have had the upper hand in the series of late, winning 25 of the last 26 meetings. Head coach Kate Achter's team gave DePaul all it could handle last season, erasing a 14-point first-half deficit before dropping an 83-76 decision.

Polling

Missouri State remains at No. 21 in Monday's AP Top 25 poll after enjoying a week off last week. The Lady Bears will face Lincoln and Missouri this week.

MSU appeared No. 25 in the preseason USA Today/WBCA Coaches Poll. With their inclusion in the preseason poll, the Lady Bears have appeared in 19 consecutive releases of the coaches' rankings, tying a school record set by the 2000-01 team. The next Coaches Poll will be released on Dec. 8.

Upcoming Top 25 Matchups

MVC teams have a pair of opportunities to claim an AP Top 25 win this week. UNI will play host to No. 22 South Dakota State on Saturday, while Loyola will travel to No. 24 DePaul.

Missouri State won the league's only other Top 25 matchup this season, beating Maryland when they were No. 12 in the AP poll.

The MVC finished 1-4 vs. AP Top 25 teams last season. UNI's last win over an AP Top 25 team was on Dec. 22, 2016 vs. No. 24 Kansas State. Loyola's last Top 25 win was on Dec. 21, 2015 at No. 16 DePaul.

Mid-Major Top-25 Poll

Missouri State, Drake and Bradley appear in the latest (Dec. 1) CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major Top 25. The Lady Bears sit atop the poll at No. 1, while Drake sits 12th and Bradley 18th. UNI is also receiving votes and sits 27th on the list.

1,000-Point Club

The Valley has four active players in the 1,000-point club. Brice Calip became the 29th member of Missouri State's 1,000-point club in the season opener against Florida Gulf Coast.

Rise of The Valley

The 2019-20 season tied the highest RPI ranking the Missouri Valley Conference has recorded in its history showcasing how The Valley is becoming one of the best mid-major leagues in the country. The league posted a top-15 RPI for the first time since 2012-13 during the 2018-19 season and increased to 8th last year, including five teams in the Top 100 of the RPI for the first time since the 1998-99 season.

Naismith Award Watch List

Bradley junior guard Lasha Petree has been named to the 2021 Women's Jersey Mike's Naismith Trophy Watch List according to an announcement by the Atlanta Tipoff Club. The preseason Watch List included 50 individuals from 11 conferences with Petree the lone representative from the MVC. The midseason 30 team will be announced in early February. The competition will be narrowed down to 10 national semifinalists on March 2, 2021, and four finalists will be named on March 19, 2021. The winner of the 2021 Jersey Mike's Naismith Trophy for Women's Player of the Year will be announced on April 3, 2021.

Hammond Award Watch List

Missouri State junior forward Jasmine Franklin was named to the preseason watch list for the 2021 Becky Hammon Mid-Major Player of the Year Award presented by Her Hoop Stats. The second player in school history to reach 500 career rebounds as a sophomore, the Fayetteville, Ark., native had the 11th-highest defensive rebounding rate in the nation last season and ranked in the top 10% nationally in steals and blocks according to advanced metrics provided by Her Hoop Stats. In January, 15 players will be named to the midseason watch list.

Lady Bears Favored

Missouri State was tabbed as the preseason favorite in the MVC Women's Basketball race in the annual survey of the league's coaches, SIDs and media.

New Schedule Format

The Missouri Valley Conference has adopted a new scheduling format for men's and women's basketball Conference games (the women's schedule is attached in multiple formats.) The Conference will continue to play an 18-game format in which most MVC teams will face one another in a two-game series on back-to-back days at the same site. Each institution will play four road series and four home series and will also face their designated 'travel partner' in a single-game, home-and-home series.

The new format significantly reduces travel and places an emphasis on the health and safety of student-athletes, coaches and staff. Rescheduling windows (Jan 30-31; Feb 27-28), plus reduced risk with less travel and fewer cross-team interactions should provide the league the best chance to play the most games. Additionally, the league's COVID-19 Working Group has worked tirelessly to develop testing and operational standards, and the league has employed KINEXON SafeZone technology to aid in contact tracing.

KINEXON SafeZone technology utilizes lightweight, wearable devices, called SafeTags, which will be used conference-wide by basketball student-athletes, coaches and select staff during practices and games. SafeTags can accurately calculate the proximity between individuals by distance and length of time in order to perform quick and accurate contact tracing. The devices will also be used by officials during all Conference basketball games.

Starters Returning

The Missouri Valley Conference will see 34 of 50 starters return (68%) for the 2020-21 season. The league will return five of its top 10 in scoring, five of its top 10 in rebounding and two of its top five in assists. The Valley will also have five of its first-team All-MVC players return and three honorable mention selections.

Postseason League

The MVC has seen an average of four league teams participate in postseason play in the last 21 seasons where postseason action took place, including three teams reaching postseason play in 2018-19. Before the 2019-20 season was cut short due to COVID-19, the MVC was in position to send 5 or 6 teams to postseason play. The Valley has earned multiple NCAA Tournament bids in 12 different seasons, including two out of the last three seasons (not counting 2019-20).

Hoops In the Heartland

The 2021 Missouri Valley Conference Women's Basketball Tournament will return to the TaxSlayer Center in Moline, Ill., for the sixth-straight year.

Affectionately coined "Hoops in the Heartland," the four-day event (Mar. 11-14) will showcase all 10 Missouri Valley Conference schools as they compete for the Valley's automatic berth into the NCAA Tournament.

The 2021 tournament will mark the 14th-consecutive season in its 39-year history that the event will take place at a neutral site. However last year's event was cancelled due to COVID-19.

The Missouri Valley Conference is one of only seven conferences (out of 32 nationally) where the women's basketball tournament is played at a neutral site, separate from the men's championship (AAC, ACC, Big Ten, Big 12, MVC, Pac-12 and SEC are the others).
