MVC Player of the Week

Becca Hittner, Sr., G. Drake

Senior Becca Hittner posted impressive numbers this past weekend in helping Drake split pair of home games. Hittner averaged 27.0 points, 8.5 rebounds, 4.0 assists and 1.0 block per game while shooting blistering 58.3 percent (14-of-24), 69.2 percent (9-of-13) from beyond the arc and made 17-of-18 (94.4 percent) at the free throw line. In the win over Southern Illinois, she poured in a game-high 31 points, including making a career-high seven three pointers and just missed a

double-double with nine rebounds to go with five assists. Hittner followed in the loss to No. 24/19 Missouri State with 23 points, eight rebounds and three assists. Her nine three-pointers on the weekend helped her move all the way to No. 2 all-time in school history with 241 career threes.

MVC Newcomer of the Week

Juliunn Redmond, Jr., G, Illinois State

Junior Juliunn Redmond collected her second double-double of the season in Illinois State's lone game versus Bradley over the weekend, posting a team-high 18 points while also matching her career-high of 11 rebounds and adding two assists and two steals. Redmond is averaging 13.2 points per game in MVC play and has scored in double figures in eight of the last nine games.

NOTEWORTHY

In addition to the league's Player and Newcomer of the Week selections, several conference players had notable performances, including:

Lasha Petree (BRAD) - Petree broke out of an offensive slump in a big way, knocking down four three-pointers and finishing with a game-high 22 points to go with four rebounds, three blocks and one steal in a 66-62 victory at I-74 rival Illinois State. Bradley completed the regular-season series sweep of the Redbirds with their third consecutive road victory in the series. Collecting a combined of eight field goals in the four previous games, Petree hit two of her four threepointers on the night in the second quarter to help Bradley build a 34-25 halftime lead. She finished 8-of-17 from the field as the Braves took over sole possession of second place in the standings by the end of the weekend. Petree moved into a tie for 10th in career three-pointers at Bradley, knocking down the 110th of her career.

Tiara Wallace (LUC) - Loyola senior guard Tiara Wallace turned in a pair of impressive efforts as the Ramblers picked up two wins last week, averaging a team-best 19.5 points, 9.5 rebounds, and 6.0 assists. Following a 13-point (3-6 FGs, 1-2 3FGs, 6-7 FTs), seven-rebound, six-assist effort in Thursday's 65-55 win over Indiana State, Wallace turned in one of the most complete performances by a Rambler in recent memory as part of Saturday's 77-47 victory against Evansville, scoring a career-high 26 points (10-13 FGs, 1-2 3FGs, 5-5 FTs) in addition to a career-best 13 rebounds, six assists, and three steals. Wallace's scoring output from Saturday is the second highest by a Rambler in a game this season, ranking behind only Janae Gonzales' 29-point showing against Detroit Mercy back on Nov. 5, 2019.

Brice Calip (MSU) - Brice Calip averaged 18 points on 58 percent shooting and dished out 12 total assists without a turnover to lead the Lady Bears to wins at UNI and Drake. Calip had a career-high 23 points Sunday at Drake and eight assists without a turnover for the second time in three games after that feat had not been accomplished at MSU since 2010. Friday at UNI, the junior tallied 13 points, four assists and two steals, and has now handed out 24 assists since her last turnover to raise her ratio to an MVC-leading 2.43, which ranks 19th nationally. Calipshot 11-for-19 from the floor, 2-for-5 from 3-point range and 12-for-15 at the foul line.

Megan Maahs (UNI) - Megan Maahs scored a careerhigh 22 points and added 12 rebounds and a pair of blocks to lead UNI to an overtime win over Southern Illinois. She tallied her first double-double since Nov. 20, 2018. She missed most of last season with an injury and again went down in the first game of conference play. She scored eight points in overtime and went 13-14 from the free-throw line in the win. Friday, she had five points, four rebounds and a block in UNI's loss to Missouri State.

Makenzie Silvey (SIU) - Makenzie Silvey averaged 16.5 points on 50-percent shooting to go along with 3.5 assists and 3.5 steals per game in SIU's two road contests this past weekend. The Glen Carbon, Ill. native tallied 17 points, five assists and a season-high five steals against the Drake Bulldogs on Friday and followed with 16 points and two steals against the UNI Panthers on Saturday. The junior guard has scored in double figures in 20 of SIU's 22 games this season.

Grace Hales (VALPO) - Hales led all players in scoring in both of Valpo's victories last weekend. The senior kicked off the weekend by connecting on a career-best six 3-pointers in the win over Evansville, going 6-of-9 from deep, and finishing with a game-high 20 points. She then tallied 14 points to pace all players in the win over Indiana State as well. The senior went 8-for-14 from 3-point range last weekend and is hitting at a 52.8% clip from downtown within Valley play, while she also went a perfect 8-of-8 from the free throw line to push her season FT percentage to 93.1%.

Abby Feit (UE) - On the road for a pair of Valley matchups, freshman Abby Feit nearly recorded two double-doubles in two strong performances. Against Valparaiso on Thursday, Feit scored eight points, while recording a game-high 10 rebounds. Facing Loyola on Saturday, Feit came just one point and one rebound away from a double-double, tallying nine points and nine boards.

Jamyra McChristine (INS) - Jamyra McChristine was the leader on the floor for Indiana State over the weekend, averaging 10.5 points and five rebounds against Loyola and Valparaiso. On Friday against the Ramblers the junior recorded nine points while pulling down seven rebounds and she then led the Trees in scoring against Valparaiso on Saturday, ending with 12 points and three rebounds. McChristine is ninth in the Valley with 6.2 rebounds per game.

Jala Johnson (LUC) - Loyola freshman guard Jala Johnson averaged 7.5 points, 2.5 rebounds, and 1.5 assists in the Ramblers' two victories last week. In Thursday's 65-55 win over Indiana State, Johnson, making her second start in as many contests, finished with seven points (3-7 FGs, 1-2 FTs), four rebounds, and two assists, as Loyola snapped a three-gameskid. The Toledo, Ohio native was again in the starting five in Saturday's matchup with Evansville, adding eight points (3-8 FGs, 2-2 FTs), a rebound, and an assist in a dominant 77-47 triumph.

Carie Weinman (VALPO) - Weinman averaged 9.5 points per game last week in a pair of Valpo wins and extended her MVC-leading steal total to 45. She opened the week with 15 points and three steals in Valpo's win over Evansville, and then tied for game-high honors with four steals in the win over Indiana State while also posting four assists. The only player in the MVC averaging better than two steals per game overall, Weinman has pushed her average to 2.7 steals/game within Valley play.

Best MVC Records

Since the Gateway became the Missouri Valley Conference in the 1992-93 season, two league teams have gone through MVC play unscathed (Drake in 2016-17 and 2017-18). Four teams (Drake in 2018-19, Wichita State in 2014-15, UNI in 2010-11 and Drake in 1997-98) finished Valley play at 17-1, while another four teams had their best conference finish at 16-2. Missouri State accomplished this feat four times (1995-96, 2000-01, 2003-04 and 2018-19), while Illinois State (2009-10), Indiana State (2005-06) and Southern Illinois (2006-07) also completed a Valley season at 16-2.

The Valley currently has eight teams at 13 wins or more on the season. The Valley joins the Big Ten, SEC and ACC as the only conferences with 8 or more teams sitting with 13 or more wins.

The last time The Valley had 8 teams reach at least 14 wins on the season was the 2011-12 season when the MVC sent seven teams to the postseason (1 NCAA, 4 WNIT, 2 WBI).

Impressive Resume

Missouri State enters the week as one of only six teams with 7 or more Top 50 RPI wins this season. The Lady Bears join #1 South Carolina, #2 Baylor, #3 Oregon, #10 Maryland and #17 love on the list. lowa on the list.

The Lady Bears are 7-2 (78%) vs. the RPI Top 50 and join South Carolina, Baylor, Iowa and Oregon as the only teams with at least 7 Top 50 wins and a win percentage of 70%+ vs. the Top 50.

Illinois State's TeTe Maggett enters the week averaging 16.1 points, 6.1 rebounds and 4.1 assists per game. Maggett is one of eight players in the nation averaging 16 points, six rebounds and four assists per game. Also joining her on that list is DJ Williams (Coastal Carolina), Haley Gorecki (Duke), Ciara Duffy (South Dakota), Sabrina Ionescu (Oregon), Haylee Andrews (Portland), Rachel Thompson (Colgate) and Erica Johnson (Ohio).

Since 1992-93, only two Valley players have ended a season averaging 16.0 ppg, 6.0 rpg and 4.0 apg. Missouri State's Jenni Lingor did during the 2005 season (won Jackie Stiles Player of the Year) and MSU's Casey Garrison did during the 2010 season (won Jackie Stiles Player of the Year).

What's the Difference?

Over the past 20 seasons (since 1999-2000), 12 MVC teams have registered a scoring margin of +12 or better for a season. Currently, two Valley teams have a scoring margin over 12 points. Drake leads with a +13.9 margin, followed by Missouri State (+12.8). Last year Drake finished with a +13.9 ppg margin. This would be the fifth-straight season with a scoring margin of +12 for the Bulldogs.

Home Sweet Home

Two MVC teams continue to remain unbeaten at home entering the week: Bradley (9-0) and Missouri State (10-0) are still perfect.

Bradley is riding a school record 15-game streak which ranks 7th nationally.

Collectively, the league has won 61.1 percent of the time at home during league play this year (after winning 81.3 percent of its home games in non-league play). Notably, the top six teams in the league standings have combined for a full-season 55-8 record at home.

Historic Conference RPI

The Valley ranks seventh nationally in the NCAA's conference RPI report (Feb. 10). The Valley sits behind the Pac-12, Big Ten, Big 12, SEC, ACC and Big East entering this week.

The Valley record for RPI in a season is 8th (2011).

RPI Update

The latest installment of the NCAA RPI Report (Feb. 11) has six Valley teams that rank in the top-100, including four in the top 50. Missouri State sits No. 4 in the RPI, Drake comes in at No. 29, Bradley No. 43 and UNI No. 46. Illinois State (78) and Southern Illinois (85) also appear in the Top 100.

The Valley joins the Power Five leagues and the Big East as the only leagues to have six or more Top 100 teams.

First Year Success

Missouri State first-year head coach Amaka Agugua-Hamilton has moved into a tie for fourth place on The Valley coaching list for most wins in a first year. Coach Mox's 20 wins is tied for fourth with Creighton's Connie Yori during the 1992-93 season.

Creighton's Jim Flanery (2002-03) and Drake's Lisa Stone (2000-01) each won a share of the regular season MVC title during their first year at the helm.

The Valley now has nine active players in the 1,000 point club. Bradley's Chelsea Brackmann became the 20th player in program history to score 1,000 career points, scoring 12 points in Friday's win at Illinois State.

Sara Rhine sits fourth on the NCAA career scoring chart, while Hittner sits seventh. Rhine and Hittner are the second highest teammate career scoring tandem in the country behind Oregon's Sabrina Ionescu and Ruthy Hebard.

Bradley's Chelsea Brackmann has been named one of 10 finalists for the Senior CLASS Award. To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence: community, classroom, character and competition. Brackmann is the fourth Bradley Women's Basketball player selected as a Senior CLASS Award candidate, joining Michelle Young (2013-14), Jenny Van Kirk (2009-10) and Kelly Krumwiede (2008-09) and is the lone candidate from the MVC this season.

Nationwide fan voting begins immediately to help select the winner, and fans are encouraged to submit votes online at the Senior CLASS Award website through March 23. Fan votes will be combined with those of the media and Division I head coaches to determine the winners. The Senior CLASS Award recipients will be announced during the 2020 NCAA Women's Final

Rhine on McClain Watch List

The Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame and the WBCA announced that Drake senior Sara Rhine is one of 20 watch list candidates for the 2020 Katrina McClain Award. Named after the two-time All-American and 1987 National Player of the Year, the annual award in its third year recognizes the top power forwards in women's NCAA Division I college basketball. By mid-February, the watch list of 20 players for the 2020 award will be narrowed to just 10.

Hittner on Drysdale Watch List

The Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame and the WBCA announced that Drake senior Becca Hittner is one of 20 watch list candidates for the 2020 Ann Meyers Drysdale Award. Named after the first player, male or female, selected to the All-America Team in four-straight college seasons, the annual Drysdale award is in its third year and recognizes the top shooting guard in NCAA Division I women's college basketball. By mid-February, the watch list of 20 players for the 2020 award will be narrowed to just 10.

Hoops In the Heartland

The 2020 Missouri Valley Conference Women's Basketball Tournament will return to the TaxS-layer Center in Moline, III., for the fifth-straight season.

Affectionately coined "Hoops in the Heartland," the four-day event (Mar. 12-15) will showcase all 10 Missouri Valley Conference schools as they compete for the Valley's automatic berth into the NCAA Tournament.

The MVC's agreement with Visit Quad Cities will keep the MVC Women's Basketball Championship in TaxSlayer Center through at least 2021.

The 2020 tournament will mark the 13th-consecutive season in its 38-year history that the event will take place at a neutral site.

The Missouri Valley Conference is one of only seven conferences (out of 32 nationally) where the women's basketball tournament is played at a neutral site, separate from the men's championship (AAC, ACC, Big Ten, Big 12, MVC, Pac-12 and SEC are the others).

Starters Returning

The Missouri Valley Conference will see 30 of 50 starters return (60%) for the 2019-20 season. The league will return nine of its top 10 in scoring, seven of its top 10 in rebounding and four of its top five in assists. The Valley will also have eight of its 11 All-MVC players return and five of its six honorable mention selections.

Postseason League

The MVC has seen an average of four league teams participate in postseason play in the last 21 seasons, including three teams reaching postseason play in 2018-19. Missouri State reached the Sweet Sixteen for the fourth time in program history, while Drake fell to Missouri in the First Round of the NCAA Tournament. UNI received a bid to the WNIT for the second-straight season. The Valley has earned multiple NCAA Tournament bids in 12 different seasons, including two out of the last three seasons.



Sweeping the Redbirds

Bradley picked up its third consecutive road win in the series with I-74 rival Illinois State, topping the Redbirds 66-62 last Friday to sweep the regular-season series. The Braves swept the regular-season series for Illinois State for the second consecutive year (first time since 2013-14 & 2014-15) and Bradley has won three con-



secutive road games against the Redbirds for the first time dating back to winning four consecutive games at Redbird Arena between the 1991-92 and 1994-95 campaigns.

Welcome to the Club

Senior Chelsea Brackmann became the latest member of Bradley's 1,000-point club, topping the mark during BU's 66-62 win at Illinois State last week. Brackmann is the 20th player in program history to score 1,000 career points and needs two points to pass former teammate Anneke Schlueter for 19th on Bradley's all-time scoring chart. In fact, Brackmann is just 27 points from climbing four spots into 16th. With junior Gabi Haack scoring her 1,000th-career point last month, the Braves have two active players with 1,000 career points or more on the same roster for the first time since Genny Mueller (1,269 points - 10th) and Dena Williams (1,030 points - 17th) wrapped up their careers in 2004-05.

Starting FiveBradley has used the same starting five for 12 consecutive games and the combination of senior Chelsea Brackmann, juniors Gabi Haack & Nyjah White along with sophomore Tatum Koenig & Lasha Petree have started 19 of 21 games for the Braves in 2019-20. Bradley had not used the same starting five for at least 19 games of a season since the 2007-08 campaign when the Braves had the same starting five for 20 games.

points and three boards at Valparaiso. McChristine also leads the Trees in both categories on the season with 9.8 points per game and 6.2 rebounds per game which is ninth in the Valley.

Tough Slate Ahead

Indiana State will have another tough weekend coming up, as Northern lowa and Drake head to the Hulman Center. When the Sycamores met both teams in January, they were defeated by 70 points (40 at Drake; 30 at UNI) between the two games, the biggest deficit in a two-game stretch since an 86-point difference from Nov. 13-18, 2011 when ISU fell to #2 Notre Dame and Chattanooga. The Sycamores have shown improvement in the Valley since then, however, as they picked up their first conference win against Evansville on Jan. 31.

Hitting the Boards

ISU can boast themselves as one of the best offensive rebounding teams in the Missouri Valley Conference. The Trees have pulled down 284 offensive boards in 23 games, giving them an average of 12.3 per-game which is the third-best number in the Valley. Jamyra McChristine leads the blue and white with 6.2 rebounds per game, ninth in the Valley.

T Time

Senior guard Tiara Wallace turned in one of the top individual performances by a Rambler in recent memory in last Saturday's aforementioned win over Evansville. The Berkeley, Ill. native posted career-high marks in both points (26) and rebounds (13) in addition to six assists, a block, and three steals. Wallace's scoring output is the second highest by a Rambler this season, trailing only Janae Gonzales' 29-point showing back on Nov. 5, 2019 at Detroit Mercy.

50 Game Sample

After sweeping the MVC's lowa road swing for a second consecutive season, the Lady Bears are now 44-6 in their last 50 games, dating to Dec. 20, 2018. Those 44 wins trail only Baylor, UConn, Oregon State and Mississippi State nationally over that time frame, and is the



second-best 50-game stretch in school history. Missouri State went 46-4 from Jan. 12, 1991-March 28, 1992 before losing in the 1992 Final Four.

Home Win Streak

Missouri State's 10-game home win streak is one shy of the JQH Arena record set during the 2011-12 season, and the 11th time in program history that the Lady Bears have won at least 10 consecutive home games. This season, MSU is averaging 81.7 points at The Q, allowing 60.2, and owns a plus-11.4 rebound margin.

Winning Milestones

Missouri State reached 20 wins on Sunday at Drake, hitting that milestone for the third year in a row and 19th time in the last 30 seasons. MSU also improved 6-1 in Valley road games this year, the Lady Bears' sixth consecutive year with six or more Valley road victories.

Two with 5-Plus Steals

Brittney Patrick and Makenzie Silvey each recorded five steals against the Drake Bulldogs on Feb. 7. In doing so, the duo became the first Saluki teammates to nab five steals in the same game in over 10 years - Stephany Neptune (6) and Teri Oliver (5) last accom-



plished the feat on Jan. 1, 2010 in a 79-68 win over Evansville.

Turning the Bulldogs Over

In SIU's first meeting with Drake, Southern turned the Bulldogs over 27 times and came away with 16 steals. In the second meeting at Drake, the Salukis forced 24 turnovers and finished with a season-high 19 steals. Seven different Salukis recorded a steal, six of which tallied multiple takeaways. Southern's 19 steals were its most in a game since Nov. 12, 2007 in a 71-55 win over Christian Brothers and are also the third-most by a MVC team this season.

15-Plus Assists

Southern dished out 18 assists against Drake and 16 versus Northern lowa. The Salukis have finished with 15 or more assists in five-straight games and have now done so in 13 games this season. SIU ranks second in the Valley, and 38th nationally, with a 15.8 assists per game average.

Doing It with Defense

Valpo's pair of wins last weekend were both sparked by its defensive effort. The Crusaders forced 20 turnovers in a 72-54 win over Evansville, at that point their fewest points allowed in MVC play. Then on Saturday, Valpo limited Indiana State to just 45 points for the



game in a 61-45 win. The 45 points were the second-fewest by a Valpo opponent this year (UIC, 37) and were the fewest points allowed by Valpo in an MVC game since joining the conference. Valpo forced 31 turnovers by the Sycamores, the most by any Valpo opponent since January 2009. The win was highlighted by a scoreless second quarter, as Valpo held Indiana State to 0-of-12 shooting - including 0-of-6 from 3-point range - and forced eight turnovers. It was the first scoreless quarter for Valpo defensively since the 2015-16 switch to quarters.

Taking the State of Indiana

Last weekend completed a clean sweep of the state of Indiana this season for Valpo, as the Crusaders swept the season series from both Evansville and Indiana State. The last time Valpo posted a perfect record against fellow Indiana schools was 2011-12, when Valpo beat IU Northwest, IPFW and Ball State in non-league play, and the Butler twice in Horizon League action for a 5-0 record.


A Helping Hand

Frederick is second in the MVC with 4.6 assists/game and leads the conference in MVC-only play at 5.3 assists/ game. She owns an assist rate of 34.5%, good for 30th nationally.
