MVC Player of the Week

Sara Rhine, R-Sr., F, Drake

Redshirt senior Sara Rhine helped Drake go 2-0 with wins over Bradley and Illinois State in her final homestand at the Knapp Center. Rhine recorded double-doubles in each victory averaging 22.5 points, 11.0 rebounds, 1.5 assists and 1.0 block per game while shooting a blistering 66.7 percent (14-of-21) from the floor, 66.7 from three (2-of-3) and 83.3 percent (15-of-18) from the free throw line. Rhine started the week with 17 points, 12 rebounds, two assists and one block in the

Bradley win. She followed that with a game-high 28 points and 10 rebounds in the Illinois State victory. Rhine leads the MVC in field goal percentage at 66.3 percent, is No. 2 in scoring at 18.0 points behind teammate Becca Hittner and ranks fifth in rebounding at 7.8.

MVC Newcomer of the Week

Kierra Collier, R-So., G, Drake

Redshirt sophomore Kierra Collier averaged 16.0 points, 3.0 assists, 2.0 steals and 1.5 rebounds while shooting 46.2 percent (12-of-26) from the floor and making all 7-of-7 from the free throw line in the Bulldogs' pair of home wins. Collier scored 22 points in the Bradley win, including a dominating stretch where she scored sevenstraight points late in the fourth quarter to help the Bulldogs secure the victory. She added four rebounds, two assists and one steal in 24 minutes. In the Illinois State

win, she scored 10 points, handed out four assists and nabbed three steals, including a critical one late in the game that helped lead Drake to a big basket. In her first season as Bulldog, Collier averages 9.0 points per game and 2.9 assists per game.

NOTEWORTHY

In addition to the league's Player and Newcomer of the Week selections, several conference players had notable performances, including:

TeTe Maggett (ILS) - Senior TeTe Maggett helped the Redbirds go 1-1 over the weekend on the lowa road swing, nearly averaging a double-double with 12.5 points and 9.0 rebounds per game. Maggett had 14 points and nine rebounds in Thursday's win at UNI, draining the contested three-pointer to tie it up and force an overtime with only four seconds left. She also tallied 11 points in Saturday's game at Drake, grabbing nine boards and four assists. The senior is averaging 15.5 points, 6.3 rebounds and 4.0 steals on the year.

Jala Johnson (LUC) - Loyola freshman guard Jala Johnson finished with a team-best 10 points (4-5 FGs, 2-3 3FGs) and grabbed five rebounds in the Ramblers' 70-57 setback to Valparaiso on Saturday afternoon inside Gentile Arena. It marked the sixth time this season that the Toledo, Ohio native has reached double figures in scoring. On the year, Johnson is averaging 6.3 points and 2.3 rebounds across 22 appearances, the last six of which have all come in a starting role.

Abby Hipp (MSU) - Abby Hipp shot 75 percent from the field and averaged 11.5 points and a team-high 9.0 rebounds in a pair of Missouri State wins. Hipp collected her second career double-double with 11 points and 12 rebounds Friday against Evansville, adding a block and a steal while shooting 4-for-7. Sunday, Hipp made all five of her field goal attempts – her second perfect game of the year shooting 5-for-5 or better – to finish with 12 points and six rebounds against Indiana State. She also had two blocks and a steal against the Sycamores.

Nicole Martin (SIU) - Nicole Martin averaged 18.0 points on 66.7-percent (12-of-18) shooting in SIU's two win over the weekend. The two-time All-MVC first team selection also averaged 8.0 rebounds, a block and a steal in each of Southern's victories. Martin finished a rebound shy of a double-double in SIU's win over Indiana State, as she poured in 17 points and added nine boards. In Southern's win over Evansville, the senior forward scored 19 points in 18 minutes. She was a near perfect 7-for-8 from the field and added seven rebounds in Southern's largest victory over a conference foe since 1991.

Carie Weinman (VALPO) - Weinman led the way for Valpo as it enjoyed its second double-digit comeback win over Loyola this season. The sophomore helped the Crusaders outscore the Ramblers 43-25 in the second half as she poured in 17 of her game-high 21 points after the halftime break. The 21 points were a season high, while Weinman also recorded six steals to match her season best. Weinman is now leading the MVC with 2.2 steals/game this year, a mark she has pushed to 2.9 steals/game in Valley conference games.

Abby Feit (UE) - Freshman Abby Feit continued her spectacular freshman campaign on the road in two Valley games. On Friday, Feit finished with a game-high 17 points and added nine rebounds against No. 18 Missouri State. Feit again finished in double-figures on Sunday, scoring 16 points and recording five rebounds and three assists.

Juliunn Redmond (ILS) - Junior Juliunn Redmond put together another pair of impressive performances, averaging 12.5 points, 8.0 rebounds, 7.5 assists and 4.5 steals in a weekend that saw ISU win in overtime at UNI on Thursday before falling at Drake on Saturday. The junior was just two assists shy of a triple-double in Thursday's win, recording 13 points, 13 rebounds, eight assists and a career-high five steals. It was her fourth-straight double-double and the fifth of Valley play. Redmond also added 12 points, seven assists, four steals and three rebounds at Drake on Sunday. The Chicago, Illinois, native is ranked second in steals (2.1 per game), fifth in rebounds (7.7 per game) and seventh in scoring (14.0 per game) in conference games.

Caitlin Anderson (INS) - Freshman Caitlin Anderson stepped-up and played well for the Sycamores against #18 Missouri State when ISU leader Jamyra McChristine was out. The guard put up a team-high 15 points to go along with two rebounds and two assists to lead the Blue & White. On Friday against Southern Illinois, Anderson tallied five points and one rebound.

Valley Runnin' Deep
The Valley currently has eight teams at 15 wins or more on the season. The Valley joins the Big Ten, SEC and ACC as the only conferences with 8 or more teams sitting with 15 or more wins.

The Valley also has eight teams with a .600 or better win percentage, joining only the Big Ten in

The last time The Valley had 8 teams reach at least 15 wins on the season was the 2011-12 season when the MVC sent seven teams to the postseason (1 NCAA, 4 WNIT, 2 WBI). It also happened in 2010-11 and 2009-10. The Valley has never had 8 teams reach 16 wins.

RPI Update

The latest installment of the NCAA RPI Report (Feb. 25) has six Valley teams that rank in the top-100, including three in the top 40. Missouri State sits No. 10 in the RPI, Drake comes in at No. 28 and Bradley No. 36. UNI (75), Illinois State (86) and Southern Illinois (99) also appear in the Top 100.

The Valley joins the Power Five leagues and the Big East as the only leagues to have six or more Top

20 Wins Again

Drake registered its sixth-consecutive 20-win season with Saturday's win over Illinois State. The impressive streak began in 2014-15. The streak ties the league record for consecutive 20-win seasons with Drake and Missouri State.

Speaking of 20 WinsSince the start of the 1992-93 season only three 20-win MVC teams have been left out of the post-season. In that time, all but two (58 of 61) 20-win Valley teams have advanced to the postseason. Last season, Drake, Missouri State and UNI each earned postseason bids after winning at least 20 games, while Bradley became the third team to reach 20 wins and not participate in postseason play.

What's the Difference?

Over the past 20 seasons (since 1999-2000), 12 MVC teams have registered a scoring margin of +12 or better for a season. Currently, two Valley teams have a scoring margin over 12 points. Missouri State leads with a +14.0 margin, followed by Drake (+13.9). Last year Drake finished with a +13.9 ppg margin. This would be the fifth-straight season with a scoring margin of +12 for the Bulldogs.

Home Sweet Home

Two MVC teams continue to remain unbeaten at home entering the week as Missouri State (13-0) and Bradley (11-0) are still perfect.

Bradley is riding a school record 17-game streak which ranks 4th nationally, trailing Baylor (54), lowa (35) and Belmont (19). Missouri State is riding a JQH Arena record 13-game win streak (11th nationally).

Collectively, the league has won 62.5 percent of the time at home during league play this year (after winning 81.3 percent of its home games in non-league play). Notably, the top five teams in the league standings have combined for a fullseason 57-6 record at home.

Drake seniors Sara Rhine and Becca Hittner each joined the 2,000 career point club this season. The two standouts are climbing their way up the MVC career scoring list. Rhine has scored 2,139 career points and currently sits tied for 5th on the MVC list with Illinois State's Kristi Cirone. Hittner moved up to 9th this week with 2,060 points.

Rhine and Hittner became the first set of teammates in The Valley's 113-year history (men or women) to eclipse 2,000 career points in the same

Drake enters this week ranking 6th nationally in Field Goal Percentage (48.4%). Drake finished 10th in FG% last year, 5th in 2017-18, and 2nd in 2016-17. UConn is the only other school to finish in the top 10 in the last three seasons. The Huskies currently sit 8th nationally.

Senior CLASS Award

Bradley's Chelsea Brackmann has been named one of 10 finalists for the Senior CLASS Award. To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence: community, classroom, character and competition. Brackmann is the fourth Bradley Women's Basketball player selected as a Senior CLASS Award candidate, joining Michelle Young (2013-14), Jenny Van Kirk (2009-10) and Kelly Krumwiede (2008-09) and is the lone candidate from the MVC this season.

Nationwide fan voting begins immediately to help select the winner, and fans are encouraged to submit votes online at the Senior CLASS Award website through March 23. Fan votes will be combined with those of the media and Division I head coaches to determine the winners. The Senior CLASS Award recipients will be announced during the 2020 NCAA Women's Final Four®.

Rhine Finalist for McClain Award

The Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame and the WBCA announced that Drake senior Sara Rhine is one of 10 finalists for the 2020 Katrina McClain Award. This is the second-straight season, Rhine has been selected a finalist for the award. Named after the two-time All-American and 1987 National Player of the Year, the annual award in its third year recognizes the top power forwards in women's NCAA Division I college basketball. This list will be narrowed down to five finalists sometime in early/mid-March. The winner of the McClain award will be presented at the ESPN College Basketball Awards Show live from The Novo by Microsoft in Los Angeles, Calif. on Friday, April 10th.

Hoops In the Heartland

The 2020 Missouri Valley Conference Women's Basketball Tournament will return to the TaxS-layer Center in Moline, III., for the fifth-straight season.

Affectionately coined "Hoops in the Heartland," the four-day event (Mar. 12-15) will showcase all 10 Missouri Valley Conference schools as they compete for the Valley's automatic berth into the NCAA Tournament.

The MVC's agreement with Visit Quad Cities will keep the MVC Women's Basketball Championship in TaxSlayer Center through at least 2021.

The 2020 tournament will mark the 13th-consecutive season in its 38-year history that the event will take place at a neutral site.

The Missouri Valley Conference is one of only seven conferences (out of 32 nationally) where the women's basketball tournament is played at a neutral site, separate from the men's championship (AAC, ACC, Big Ten, Big 12, MVC, Pac-12 and SEC are the others).

The Missouri Valley Conference will see 30 of 50 starters return (60%) for the 2019-20 season. Postseason League

UNI received a bid to the WNIT for the second-straight season. The Valley has earned multiple NCAA Tournament bids in 12 different seasons, including two out of the last three seasons.



Prairie State Success

Bradley owns a 6-1 record against in-state opponents this season and the Braves are 14-1 in games played in the state of Illinois in 2019-20, thanks in part to a perfect 11-0 home record. In fact, Bradley will be trying to match school season record of 12 home wins this weekend during the final home stand of the year.



The Braves were 12-3 at Renaissance Coliseum last year to match the school record for home wins in a season also reached during the 2008-09 (12-2) and 1981-82 (12-4) campaigns. Since Bradley's last home loss to Missouri State last January, the Braves are 22-2 in regular-season games played in the state of Illinois; with both losses at Southern Illinois.

Home ComingSophomore Tatum Koenig has certainly enjoyed playing schools from her home state, with the West Branch, lowa, following up an 18-point outing at Drake in which she made four three-pointers, by hitting four more trey's in Saturday's game at Northern Iowa in a 14-point effort. In four games this season against Drake & UNI, Koenig has averaged 13.8 points per game on 20-of-31 shooting (64.5 percent), while connecting on 13-of-20 (65 percent) three-pointers. In her career, Koenig has averaged 10.4 points, 2.4 assists and 1.6 steals per game, while owning a 1.90 assist-to-turnover ratio against the MVC lowa schools with four of her eight career double-digit scoring efforts in those outings. She is a combined 30-for-55 (54.5 percent) from the field and 19-of-39 (48.7 percent) from three-point range in her career vs. Drake & Northern Iowa.

Drake tallied its sixth-straight 20-win season with Saturday's win over Illinois State. The impressive streak began in 2014-15. The streak ties the Missouri Valley Conference record for consecutive 20-win seasons with Drake (1996-2001) and Missouri State (1990-



96). Overall in program history, Drake has had 24 20-win seasons with 18 coming during the Gateway/MVC eras.

Board Climber

Sara Rhine recorded a pair of double-doubles in Drake's two wins over the week. Rhine has eight this season, which is the second-most in the league and 32 overall in her career which ranks 22nd among active NCAA Division I players. Rhine has pulled down 965 career rebounds and averages an impressive 7.2 rebounds per game. She is vying to become just the sixth-ever Bulldog to pull down 1,000 career rebounds and would be the first since Jill Martin snagged 1,013 from 2003-08.

Following Drake's win over Illinois State Saturday at the Knapp Center in the home finale, the senior trio of Becca Hittner, Rhine and Brenni Rose, were honored for their outstanding careers. Together the trio have played in three-straight NCAA Tournaments, won five MVC titles and won 124 games. Also impressive is their teams went 62-9 overall at the Knapp Center and 41-4 in MVC home games.

Freshman Three Point Record

With her second three-pointer in Thursday's OT win over UNI, Mary Crompton became the new Illinois State freshman three-point field goal record holder, recording her 53rd of the year. The previous record of 52 had been set by ISU legend Kristi Cirone during the 2005-06 season. Crompton, who added six more triples in Saturday's game at Drake, has now tallied 59 three-pointers on the season and is tied for ninth on the program's single-season three-point field goals record list.

Five in Double Figures

Five different Illinois State players finished in double figures in Thursday's OT win over UNI, a feat that hasn't occurred since the 2015-16 season. $\hbox{TeTe Maggett (14 pts), Lexy Koudelka (14 pts), Lexi Wallen (14 pts), Juliunn}\\$ Redmond (13 pts) and Mary Crompton (11 pts) all tallied in double-digit scoring in the victory for the 'Birds. The last game that saw at least five ISU players in double figures was on Feb. 5, 2016, when Illinois State defeated Indiana State, 73-62, at Redbird Arena

Poll Streak

With a No. 17 ranking in the Feb. 25 USA Today Coaches Poll, the Lady Bears have now been ranked 15 consecutive weeks by those voters, the second-longest poll streak in school history. The 2000-01 team was ranked in all 19 coaches polls that season.



JQH Record

The Lady Bears improved to 13-0 at home with two weekend wins, establishing a new record for consecutive wins at JQH Arena at 13. The previous long streak of 11 wins occurred during the 2011-12 season. This season at The Q, Missouri State is winning by an average score of 81.8-59.9 and owns a plus-13 rebound margin while winning on the glass in all 13 games.

Blocking Bears

Missouri State has blocked 121 shots on the year, already ranking third on the school's single-season list. That success is in large part to three players on the roster who rank among MSU's top 13 career shot blockers, including Jasmine Franklin (6th – 75), Emily Gartner (12th – 65) and Shameka Ealy (13th – 64). The top 10 threshold is 67 stuffs, meaning that MSU could have three of the top-10 shot blockers in school history on the roster by season's end.

Valpo forced 31 Loyola turnovers in Saturday's win, matching the 31 it forced earlier this season in the home win over Indiana State - the 31 miscues match the most by a Valpo opponent since St. Francis (Ind.) committed 33 turnovers in November of 2003. Wright State also committed 31 turnovers in a January 2009 matchup. Valpo notched a season-best 38 points off turnovers and held a whopping 38-4 edge in the category over the Ramblers.


Winning Away from Home
