MVC Player of the Week

Brice Calip, Sr., G, Missouri State

Missouri State's Brice Calip averaged 12.5 points, 4.5 rebounds, 5.5 assists and 4.0 steals in Missouri State's home sweep of Drake, helping the Lady Bears to a 4-0 start in league play for the third consecutive season. Friday, the senior tallied 13 of her 15 points in the second half, adding five boards, five assists and four steals while matching a career high with a trio of three-pointers. Saturday, she scored five of her 10 points over a 16-second span of the third quarter, sparking a decisive 17-2 run after Drake closed

within three points. Calip finished with 10 points and four boards, tying season highs with six assists and four more steals.

MVC Newcomer of the Week

Maya McDermott, Fr., G, UNI

UNI's Maya McDermott scored a career-high 20 points in Friday's win over Indiana State without missing a field goal, going 6-for-6 from the field, 3-for-3 from deep and 5-for-5 from the line in a 95-69 win over the Sycamores. The freshman also added a pair of assists and a block in just 15 minutes on the court. McDermott followed up that performance with nine points, on 4-for-6 shooting, and seven assists to lead the Panthers to an 88-53 win over Indiana State on Saturday. For the

weekend, McDermott averaged 14.5 points and shot 75% (9-for-12) from the field, 66.7% (4-for-6) from three and 7-for-7 at the free-throw line, while playing only 15.5 minutes per contest.

NOTEWORTHY

In addition to the league's Player and Newcomer of the Week selections, several conference players had notable performances, including:

Gabi Haack (BRAD) - Haack averaged team highs of 16.0 points and 8.0 rebounds per game in the weekend series against Loyola, shooting 50 percent from the field against the Ramblers. Haack opened the series by tying for game-high honors with 22 points on 9-of-14 shooting to go with seven rebounds, one assist and three steals. She came back the next night and finished one rebound short of a double-double, collecting 10 points, nine boards, one assist and two blocks in a two-point victory. Haack, who has now hit a three-pointer in 19 consecutive games, scored her 1,400th career point in Saturday's win and moved into a tie for 15th in career three-pointers (249) in MVC history.

Grace Berg (DU) - Grace Berg averaged 17.0 points, 3.0 assists, 2.5 rebounds and 2.5 steals per game while shooting a blistering 75.0 percent from the floor in Drake's pair of road games versus No. 25 Missouri State. In the first game, Berg poured in a game-high 25 points on 12-of-14 shooting, and added five rebounds and three assists, as Drake lost by one-point, 73-72. She followed that with nine points, four assists and three steals in the series finale. In her first season, Berg is second in the MVC in scoring at 16.4 points per game while shooting a league-leading 53.6 percent from the floor and is second in free throw percentage at 84.0 percent.

Abby Feit (UE) - For the 32nd time in her career, Sophomore Abby Feit reached double-figures in scoring, this time in a Thursday matchup with Illinois State. Feit recorded a team-high 10 points, while grabbing six boards in the 73-48 loss.

Maya Chandler (LUC) - Loyola freshman guard Maya Chandler averaged 11.6 points and 2.7 rebounds as the Ramblers picked up victories in two of their three games last week. After chipping in five points (2-5 FGs, 1-2 FTs) and five rebounds in a 53-36 win at Valparaiso this past Tuesday, the Martinsville, Ind. product turned in a pair of strong performances as Lovola split two matchups with Bradley over the weekend. In Friday's series-opening 71-66 triumph, Chandler was one of three Ramblers to score in double figures, closing the night with 14 points (5-9 FGs, 1-2 3FGs, 3-4 FTs). She saved her best for Saturday's finale, pouring in a career-high 16 points (6-14 FGs, 3-5 3FGs, 1-2 FTs) to pace the Rambler attack in a hard-fought 57-55 defeat. Chandler, who has started in all nine games for Maroon & Gold, is averaging 10.0 points this season, a mark that leads all Valley freshmen and ranks 19th overall in the conference.

Sydney Thurwalker (UE) - In the Thursday game against Illinois State, sophomore Sydney Thurwalker continued to be an impact player for the Aces. Thurwalker scored nine points and gathered six boards against the Redbirds on Thursday. Over the last six games, Thurwalker is averaging 8.2 points, 6.2 boards, and 25.0 minutes per contest. In the four previous games she appeared in, Thurwalker averaged just 1.8 points, 2.3 rebounds, and 11.3 minutes per game.

DeAnna Wilson (ILS) - Sophomore DeAnna Wilson posted her first career double-double, netting 12 points and 13 boards in just 17 minutes of action in Thursday's 73-48 win over Evansville. The St. Louis native was also an impressive 6-of-6 at the charity stripe and now leads the Redbirds in rebounding, averaging 6.1 boards per game on the season.

League Leaders

Preseason favorite Missouri State completed its season series against Drake and UNI with a 4-0 record for the second consecutive season and has now swept the lowa schools eight times in school history, with the previous seven occurrences leading to regular season conference titles. The last time MSU swept UNI and Drake in back-to-back years was 1993 and 1994.

Bradley occupies the second spot in the standings at 6-2, following a split with Loyola over the weekend. UNI, Drake and Illinois State all sit in a three-way tie for third in the standings entering this week at 5-3.

Wednesday's schedule features Bradley at Illinois State and UNI at Drake as all four teams hit the midway point of the league schedule.

Warren Joins Elite Club

Tanya Warren claimed her 250th career win as UNI's head coach Friday with a win over Indiana State. Warren became the fourth coach in conference women's basketball history to join the league's official 250-Win Club. Warren added to her total with another win over the Sycamores.

Conference NET

The Valley ranks seventh nationally in the NCAA's conference NET report (Jan. 25). The Valley sits behind the SEC, ACC, Big 12, Pac-12, Big Ten, and Big East entering this week.

The Valley finished the 2019-20 season with a league-best conference RPI of 8th.

NET Update

The latest installment of the NCAA NET Report (Jan. 25) has five Valley teams that rank in the top-100, including four in the Top 75. Missouri State leads the way at No. 23 with Drake (56), UNI (67), Illinois State (72) and Bradley (86), rounding out the schools in the Top 100.

The Valley joins the ACC, Big 12, Big East, Big Ten, Pac-12 and SEC as the only leagues nationally with five teams in the NET Top 100.

Rise of The Valley

The 2019-20 season tied the highest RPI ranking the MVC has recorded in its history showcasing how The Valley is becoming one of the best mid-major leagues in the country. The league also saw five teams in the Top 100 of the RPI for the first time since the 1998-99 season. In 2018-19, the league posted a top-15 RPI for the first time since 2012-13 a year after seeing the league's worst RPI in 2017-18 (24). The Valley is looking to match or surpass last year's record numbers in 2020-21.

Power Five Wins

The MVC secured five wins over Power Five programs during the shortened non-conference schedule. The Valley registered a 5-9 vs. Power Five teams after going 9-12 in 2019-20. The Valley went 4-4 vs. the Big Ten, 1-1 vs. the SEC, 0-3 vs. the Big 12 and 0-1 vs. the ACC. Missouri State and Valpo each had two wins, while Drake had the other.

BU: Dynamic Duo

Lasha Petree and Gabi Haack continue to rank one-two in scoring in the MVC and the pair make up one of just six combos in the nation in which both individuals have 30 or more made three-pointers this season. Petree and Haack have combined for more three-pointers this season (73) than 206 other teams in the country through Sunday's games. Haack, who is fifth in the nation in total three-pointers (43), has hit a three-pointer in 19 consecutive contests for the third longest streak in school history and moved into a tie for 15th in MVC history in career three-pointers, while Petree is the only player in the nation to have 30 or more blocks (35) and make at least 10 three-pointers (30).

DU: So Close

Drake came back from double-digit deficits in each game at Missouri State. The Bulldogs erased an 11-point fourth-quarter deficit in the opener and trailed by three with 2.2 seconds left and the basketball. However, Sarah Beth Gueldner's basket at the buzzer was a two-pointer as Missouri State held on for a 73-72 win. Drake was within three points late in third quarter of the finale before Missouri State went on a 15-1 run to help pull away for the series sweep.

UE: Stephens Scoring Streak

In her first collegiate season, freshman Rylie Stephens has already made an impact on the Aces. After starting the conference season with three combined points in two games at SIU. Stephens has scored six-or-more points in five-straight games. averaging 10.8 points per game during that stretch.

ILS: Balanced Birds

Illinois State is currently one of only five teams in the country to have six different players lead them in these six statistics categories: points (Redmond, 14.1), rebounds (Wilson, 6.1), assists (Saylor, 2.8), steals (Moore, 1.9), blocks (Bullman, 1.1) and threes (Crompton, 2.9). Other programs to accomplish this include Arkansas, Butler, Coastal Carolina and Oklahoma.

INS: In-State Rivalry

Indiana State and Evansville meet for the 58th time on Wednesday evening when the Trees hit the road. The Sycamores hold a 39-18 series advantage and earned the season sweep over the Purple Aces last season, including a 70-58 victory in Evansville. Indiana State has won five of the last six meetings over Evansville.

LUC: All Starts on Defense

Across its matchups with Valparaiso and Bradley, the Ramblers limited their opposition to a combined 33.7 percent (55-of-163) clip from the field. On the individual front, Ellie Rice was tasked with defending two of the MVC's top individual scorers in Valparaiso's Shay Frederick and Bradley's Lasha Petree, both of whom entered the week in the top 10 on the league's scoring chart. Rice held Frederick to just four points (2-9 FGs) before limiting Petree to only 6-of-25 (.240) from the field in the Maroon & Gold's two meetings with the Braves.

MSU: Nice Resume

Missouri State is once again putting together a really impressive NCAA Tournament resume. The Lady Bears join Louisville, South Carolina, Texas A&M and West Virginia as the only teams nationally with seven Top 100 NET wins this season. Every single game the Lady Bears have played against a D1 opponent has been a Top 68 NET team and Missouri State sits No. 4 nationally with an average opponent NET ranking of 55.

UNI: Shots Fired

The Panthers shot 62.7% from the field in Friday's 95-69 win. It was the best shooting percentage for UNI since posting a 67.3% clip January 15, 2011 at Drake.

SIU: Set to Return

The Salukis are slated to play their first game in 18 days when they travel to Springfield, Mo. to take on the No. 25 Missouri State Lady Bears on Wednesday. Southern last played on Jan. 8-9 at Bradley. The Salukis split with the Lady Bears a year ago, as Southern upset Missouri State at the buzzer in Carbondale on Jan. 17 for SIU's first win over a ranked opponent since 1991. The Lady Bears, however, got their revenge with an 88-57 win in Springfield on Feb. 15.

VALPO: Facing Ranked Foes

This week marks Valpo's third and fourth straight meetings with Missouri State where the Lady Bears have carried a national ranking into the matchup. It also will mark three straight meetings at the ARC that Missouri State has been nationally ranked, which doubles the number of nationally ranked conference foes which visited Valpo prior to January of last year - Northern IIlinois was ranked in a Mid-Con matchup at the ARC in February 1993, while Green Bay was in the top-25 in consecutive visits to Valpo in 2011 and 2012 during Valpo's time in the Horizon League.

1.000-Point Club

The Valley now has seven active players in the 1,000-point club. UNI's Megan Maahs joined the club Friday night at Indiana State, scoring 11 points in the win. Maahs is the 26th Panther in program history to surpass 1,000 career points.

Mid-Major Top-25 Poll

The January 19th edition of the CollegeInsider. com Mid-Major Top 25 has Missouri State No. 3 behind Gonzaga and South Dakota State. Drake sits No. 18 this week, while Bradley and UNI are receiving votes in the poll.

Top 25 Success

The Valley finished non-conference play 2-2 vs. AP Top 25 Teams this season, with Missouri State beating #12 Maryland in the season opener and UNI besting #22 South Dakota State.

The last time The Valley had a pair of AP Top 25 wins during the non-conference portion of the season was back in 2002 when Drake beat No. 18 Iowa State and UNI beat No. 24 Iowa State.

Naismith Award Watch List

Bradley junior guard Lasha Petree has been named to the 2021 Women's Jersey Mike's Naismith Trophy Watch List according to an announcement by the Atlanta Tipoff Club. The preseason Watch List included 50 individuals from 11 conferences with Petree the lone representative from the MVC. The midseason 30 team will be announced in early February. The competition will be narrowed down to 10 national semifinalists on March 2, 2021, and four finalists will be named on March 19, 2021. The winner of the 2021 Jersey Mike's Naismith Trophy for Women's Player of the Year will be announced on April 3, 2021.

Hammond Award Watch List

Missouri State junior forward Jasmine Franklin was named to the preseason watch list for the 2021 Becky Hammon Mid-Major Player of the Year Award presented by Her Hoop Stats. The second player in school history to reach 500 career rebounds as a sophomore, the Favetteville, Ark., native had the 11th-highest defensive rebounding rate in the nation last season and ranked in the top 10% nationally in steals and blocks according to advanced metrics provided by Her Hoop Stats. In January, 15 players will be named to the midseason watch list.

Lady Bears Favored

Missouri State was tabbed as the preseason favorite in the MVC Women's Basketball race in the annual survey of the league's coaches, SIDs and media.

New Schedule Format

The Missouri Valley Conference has adopted a new scheduling format for men's and women's basketball Conference games (the women's schedule is attached in multiple formats.) The Conference will continue to play an 18-game format in which most MVC teams will face one another in a two-game series on back-to-back days at the same site. Each institution will play four road series and four home series and will also face their designated 'travel partner' in a singlegame, home-and-home series.

Title Town

The league has had nine different regular-season champions in the past 14 seasons (SIU-2007, DU/UE/ILS-2008, ILS-2009, ILS-2010, UNI-2011; MSU-2012; WSU/CU-2013; INS/WSU-2014; WSU2015; UNI-2016; DU-2017; DU-2018; DU-2019; MSU-2020). Bradley, Loyola and Valparaiso are the only league teams not to have won a regular-season MVC championship.

Postseason League

The MVC has seen an average of four league teams participate in postseason play in the last 21 seasons where postseason action took place, including three teams reaching postseason play in 2018-19. Before the 2019-20 season was cut short due to COVID-19, the MVC was in position to send 5 or 6 teams to postseason play. The Valley has earned multiple NCAA Tournament bids in 12 different seasons, including two out of the last three seasons (not counting 2019-20).

Hoops In the Heartland

The 2021 Missouri Valley Conference Women's Basketball Tournament will return to the TaxSlayer Center in Moline, III., for the sixth-straight year.

Affectionately coined "Hoops in the Heartland," the four-day event (Mar. 11-14) will showcase all 10 Missouri Valley Conference schools as they compete for the Valley's automatic berth into the NCAA Tournament.

The 2021 tournament will mark the 14thconsecutive season in its 39-year history that the event will take place at a neutral site. However last year's event was cancelled due to COVID-19.

The Missouri Valley Conference is one of only seven conferences (out of 32 nationally) where the women's basketball tournament is played at a neutral site, separate from the men's championship (AAC, ACC, Big Ten, Big 12, MVC, Pac-12 and SEC are the others).
