MVC Player of the Week

Bre Gunnels, Sr., F, UNI

UNI senior Bre Gunnels scored 33 points and grabbed 23 rebounds in two games as the Panthers swept Illinois State over the weekend. Friday, she matched her careerhigh with 18 points and also grabbed nine rebounds, going 7-for-10 from the field, while also recording a pair of blocks in the 82-71 win. She had a heads up play at the end of the third quarter when teammate Kam Finley launched a half-court shot and missed, but she gathered the rebound and made a runner at the buzzer to extend the

Panther's lead. Saturday, she went 8-for-8 from the free-throw line while scoring 15 points and grabbing 14 rebounds to lead the Panthers to a 72-67 win. She also added two steals. She committed just four fouls in two games while carrying big defensive responsibilities.

MVC Newcomer of the Week

Adrianna Katcher, Fr., F, Southern Illinois

Adrianna Katcher averaged 8.5 points, 10.5 rebounds, 3.0 assists and 2.0 steals in a pair of Missouri Valley Conference wins over the weekend. Katcher scored six points and grabbed a career-high 14 boards, of which eight came on the offensive glass in SIU's 59-41 win on Friday. The freshman from Urbana, Iowa also held 2020 MVC Freshman of the Year Abby Feit to a career-low four points on 2-of-8 shooting and tallied the most rebounds in a game by a Saluki freshman since 2017. Katcher

followed with a career-high 11 points to go along with seven rebounds, three steals and three assists in Southern's 69-51 win over Evansville on Saturday. Katcher leads all Valley freshmen, and is tied for sixth nationally among freshmen, with her 8.3 rebounds per game average.

NOTEWORTHY

In addition to the league's Player and Newcomer of the Week selections, several conference players had notable performances, including:

Lasha Petree (BRAD) - Petree averaged 21.0 points, 3.0 rebounds, 1.5 assists, 2.0 Oblocks and 3.5 steals per game, helping Bradley split a pair of games at Drake to start MVC play. With All-MVC guard Gabi Haack limited to just five points in the series opener, Petree scored a game-high 14 points and also had five boards, four steals and four blocks as she helped keep Bradley in the game until a fourth-quarter run by Drake put the contest out of reach. She returned the next day to score 15 of her game-high 28 points in the first half. Petree was 8-for-9 from the free throw line, making a pair at the line with 17 seconds left to give the Braves a five-point cushion as Bradley won at the Knapp Center for the first time since 2010 and snapped a 23-game losing skid in games played in the state of lowa. Petree also had three assists and three steals in Saturday's win. She climbed four spots on Bradley's all-time scoring list over the weekend, moving up to 15th.

Monica Burich (DU) - Monica Burich averaged 10.5 points, 10.5 rebounds, 3.0 assists and 2.0 blocks per game in Drake's opening weekend of Valley play against Bradley. Burich started with her second double-double of the season with 1.1 points and a career-high 14 rebounds along with three assists, two steals and two blocks in a 71-56 win. She followed with 10 points and seven rebounds for nearly another double-double and added three assists and two blocks in the series finale.

Abby Feit (UE) - In the MVC-opening weekend, Abby Feit put together a strong performance on the boards. Feit tallied eight rebounds to go along with four points on Friday. Returning to double-figures in scoring on Saturday, recording a team-high 15 points and tallying nine rebounds. On the season, Feit is averaging over 17 points and 9 rebounds.

JuJu Redmond (ILS) - Senior JuJu Redmond averaged 17.0 points, 7.5 points and 2.0 steals in the opening weekend of Missouri Valley Conference play that saw Illinois State making the trip to UNI two weeks earlier than planned. The Chicago native led all scorers on Friday with 21 points, also grabbing a team-high eight rebounds. She led the 'Birds again in points and rebounds on Saturday, recording 13 points and seven boards on the day. Redmond, who is shooting 46.3% (25-of-54) on the year, is currently ranked fifth in the conference in the same category.

Adrian Folks (INS) - Adrian Folks was the leader for the Sycamore offense in Chicago, helping the Trees to a series split with Loyola over the weekend. In a Valley-opening victory, Folks recorded 14 points and pulled down five rebounds while going 4-of-5 from the charity stripe. Then on Saturday, the sophomore ended a perfect 5-for-5 from the field for 11 points and six rebounds. Overall, she averaged 12.5 points and 5.5 rebounds during the duration of the series.

Allison Day (LUC) - Loyola junior forward Allison Day continued her sparkling play this past weekend, averaging 13.0 points, 8.5 rebounds, and 2.0 steals as Loyola split a pair of matchups with Indiana State to open Missouri Valley Conference play. In Friday's meeting, Day notched her fourth career double-double, finishing with 14 points (4-9 FGs, 6-8 FTs), 11 rebounds, and a career-high three steals. The Russellville, Ohio native again reached double figures in scoring in Saturday's 59-52 victory over the Sycamores, adding 12 points (4-7 FGs, 4-6 FTs), six rebounds, an assist, and a steal. Day, who currently ranks in the top 10 in the MVC in both scoring (10th; 13.0 ppg) and rebounding (5th; 7.5 rpg), is operating at a league-best 60.9 percent clip (28-for-46) from the field.

Payton McCallister (SIU) - Payton McCallister averaged 16.5 points, 3.0 steals, 2.0 assists and 2.0 rebounds in leading SIU to a 2-0 start in Missouri Valley Conference play. Playing without their top two scorers due COVID-19 protocols, McCallister stepped up and set a new career-high in points in each of SIU's two wins over Evansville. She opened the weekend with 16 points and five steals in SIU's 59-41 win over the Aces on Friday and followed with a career-best 17 points in 19 minutes of work in Southern's 69-51 win over Evansville on Saturday. It marked just the third time in her career that the junior from Columbia, Mo. has reached double figures in back-to-back games.

Grace Berg (DU) - Grace Berg averaged 9.5 points and 6.5 rebounds per game against Bradley. Berg just missed her first career double-double with 12 points and a career-tying nine rebounds along with three steals and two blocks in the victory. She followed that with seven points, four rebounds and a career-tying four assists in the finale.

Sydney Thurwalker (UE) - Playing in her first MVC series, sophomore Sydney Thurwalker turned in a strong performance on Saturday. Thurwalker recorded a career-high as an Ace with 11 points, grabbing five rebounds.

Terrion Moore (ILS) - Junior Terrion Moore reached double figures in scoring in each of ISU's games on MVC opening weekend, averaging 11.0 points per game. The Kansas City, Kan. native has reached double digit scoring in four of five games this year now after putting up 12 points in an impressive 39 minutes of action in Friday afternoon's contest, adding 10 points on Saturday. The junior shot 50% (9-of-18) from the floor on the weekend and is currently fourth in the Valley with 2.0 steals per game so far in her debut season as a Redbird.

Bre Hampton-Bey (LUC) - Fresh off being named the MVC Newcomer of the Week, Loyola guard Bre Hampton-Bey averaged 8.0 points, 6.0 rebounds, 3.0 assists, and 2.5 steals in the Ramblers' two-game set with Indiana State this past weekend. Hampton-Bey made her first start as a Rambler in Friday's opener with the Sycamores, finishing with 12 points (2-8 FGs, 8-11 FTs), six rebounds, two assists, and three steals. The Toledo, Ohio native closed the weekend by dishing out a team-high four assists in addition to four points (1-10 FGs, 2-4 FTs), six rebounds, and two steals in Saturday's 59-52 triumph. In four appearances this season, Hampton-Bey has averaged 8.5 points, 4.8 rebounds, 2.8 assists, and 2.0 steals.

Emerson Green (UNI) - Emerson Green scored eight points over the weekend as UNI swept Illinois State. She scored three points Friday and five points Saturday.

The first installment of the NCAA NET Report (Jan. 4) has four Valley teams that rank in the top-100, including nine of the 10 sitting in the top 200. Missouri State leads the way at No. 27 with Illinois State (51), UNI (72) and Drake (84), rounding out the schools in the Top 100.

Strength of Schedule

Two Valley teams have a SOS ranking in the Top 50 according to the NCAA (Jan. 4). Missouri State leads The Valley with a SOS of No. 4. Drake comes in this week ranked No. 43.

Two Valley teams rank in the Top 10 of "Average Opponent NET Rank" as well. Missouri State sits No. 2 nationally with an average opponent NET ranking of 43, while UNI sits No. 8 (72).

Quick Starts Crucial

Since 1982-83, just three teams (Missouri State, champions in 1998-99, 1994-95 and 1990-91; Drake, champions in 1996-97 and co-champions in 1987-88; and Evansville, a 2007-08 co-champion) have won at least a share of the regular-season title without winning its regular-season opener. In fact, 15 of the last 20 regular-season champs (or co-champs) have opened 2-0 or better in MVC play, with Evansville in 2007-08, Missouri State in 2004-05, UNI in 2010-11, Missouri State in 2011-12 and UNI in 2015-16 serving as the only five exceptions.

Title Town

The league has had nine different regular-season champions in the past 14 seasons (SIU-2007, DU/UE/ILS-2008, ILS-2009, ILS-2010, UNI-2011; MSU-2012; WSU/CU-2013; INS/WSU-2014; WSU2015; UNI-2016; DU-2017; DU-2018; DU-2019; MSU-2020). Bradley, Loyola and Valparaiso are the only league teams not to have won a regular-season MVC championship.

Top 25 Success

The Valley finished non-conference play 2-2 vs. AP Top 25 Teams this season, with Missouri State beating #12 Maryland in the season opener and UNI besting #22 South Dakota State.

The last time The Valley had a pair of AP Top 25 wins during the non-conference portion of the season was back in 2002 when Drake beat No. 18 lowa State and UNI beat No. 24 lowa State.

Power Five Wins

The MVC secured five wins over Power Five programs during the shortened non-conference schedule. The Valley registered a 5-9 vs. Power Five teams after going 9-12 in 2019-20. The Valley went 4-4 vs. the Big Ten, 1-1 vs. the SEC, 0-3 vs. the Big 12 and 0-1 vs. the ACC. Missouri State and Valpo each had two wins, while Drake had the other.

BU: Rare Iowa Win

Bradley's victory at Drake to close out the opening weekend of MVC play was the first win for the Braves at the Knapp Center since a 61-58 victory on Jan. 24, 2010. In fact, Bradley snapped a 23-game losing streak in the state of lowa dating back to that contest.

DU: Another Valley Opener

Drake won its fifth-straight Valley opener with its 71-56 victory over Bradley on New Year's Day. The Bulldogs' impressive streak in Valley openers started with a win over former MVC member Wichita State on Dec. 30, 2016. The victory over the Braves also snapped a three-game losing streak for the Bulldogs.

UE: Defense Strong Again

Evansville's defense continued to be strong in Friday's game at SIU, holding its fourth opponent of the season to 60 points or less and limiting the Salukis to 33.3% shooting from the field.

ILS: Crompton for Three!

Redshirt sophomore Mary Crompton continues to be deadly from long range, ranking fifth nationally and first in The Valley shooting 60% (15-of-25) from behind the three-point line. The lowa City, lowa native is also ranked 29th in all of NCAA DI in triples per game, averaging 3.0 three-pointers per contest on the season.

INS: Ending the Drought

With a 63-48 victory over Loyola on Friday afternoon, Indiana State earned its first MVC-opening win since the 2015-16 season when they defeated Wichita State, 59-33. It was their first conference-opening victory on the road since defeating Evansville, 75-67 on Jan. 27, 2011.

LUC: Finding A Way

After dropping a 63-48 decision to Indiana State to open MVC play on Friday, Loyola bounced back to pick up a 59-52 victory over the Sycamores on Saturday. Much like in the series opener, offense proved tough to come by, with Loyola shooting 33.9 percent (19-for-56), compared to 37.5 percent (18-for-48) for Indiana State. The Ramblers were able to take advantage of 20 Sycamores turnovers, cashing in for 16 points off of them. Saturday marked just the fourth time in head coach Kate Achter's tenure that Loyola has won a game in which it shot lower than its opponent from the field.

MSU: Lady Bears MVC History

This season is Missouri State's 29th in the Missouri Valley Conference. The Lady Bears have finished third or better in the final league standings 21 times in 28 seasons, including each of the last six years, winning 12 or more games each time. MSU is 47-7 in Valley play the last three seasons and 81-17 in the last 98 league contests.

UNI: Call It A Comeback

UNI trailed by as many as 13 points Saturday before rallying for a 72-67 win and a two-game sweep of Illinois State. The Panthers had previously lost its last 34 games with a double-digit deficit since a 61-59 overtime triumph February 19, 2017 at Indiana State (down 15).

SIU: Early Success Continues

The Salukis were one of two MVC teams to sweep the opening weekend of conference play, as they defeated Evansville, 59-41, on Friday and followed with a 69-51 victory over the Aces on Saturday. SIU's win Friday improved the Salukis to 8-0 in conference openers under eighth-year head coach Cindy Stein, while the Salukis win Saturday clinched SIU its first 2-0 start to Valley play since 2018. The Salukis held Evansville, the nation's fourth-best hree-point shooting team coming into the weekend, to a season-low 16.7-percent (2-of-12) shooting from behind the arc on Saturday, and to just four three-pointers on 17.3-percent shooting for the weekend.

VALPO: White Does It All

Valpo senior Grace White has filled up the stat sheet all season long, and currently ranks among the top-7 in the MVC in scoring, rebounds, assists, steals and blocks. The last MVC player to finish a season in the top-10 in all 5 categories was Missouri State's Tyonna Snow, the 2016 Jackie Styles Player of the Year.



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Climbing the Chart

Bradley senior Gabi Haack moved into 21st position in MVC history with 233 career triples after hitting five during the series with Drake. Haack passed Illinois State's Kristi Cirone and UNI's Amber Sorenson and Drake's Lizzy Wendell.

Polling

Missouri State sits No. 25 in this week's AP Top 25 Poll after missing last week due to COVID protocol. MSU sits No. 24 in the USA Today Coaches Top 25 poll (Dec. 29). This marks the first time in program history the Lady Bears finished the nonconference schedule ranked in the AP Top 25 for two consecutive seasons

Mid-Major Top-25 Poll

The December 29th edition of the CollegeInsider. com Mid-Major Top 25 has Missouri State No. 3 behind Gonzaga and South Dakota State. Drake sits No. 15 this week, while UNI is 24th. Bradley is receiving votes in the poll this week.

Rise of The Valley

The 2019-20 season tied the highest RPI ranking the Missouri Valley Conference has recorded in its history showcasing how The Valley is becoming one of the best mid-major leagues in the country. The league posted a top-15 RPI for the first time since 2012-13 during the 2018-19 season and increased to 8th last year, including five teams in the Top 100 of the RPI for the first time since the 1998-99 season.



Naismith Award Watch List

Bradley junior guard Lasha Petree has been named to the 2021 Women's Jersey Mike's Naismith Trophy Watch List according to an announcement by the Atlanta Tipoff Club. The preseason Watch List included 50 individuals from 11 conferences with Petree the lone representative from the MVC. The midseason 30 team will be announced in early February. The competition will be narrowed down to 10 national semifinalists on March 2, 2021, and four finalists will be named on March 19, 2021. The winner of the 2021 Jersey Mike's Naismith Trophy for Women's Player of the Year will be announced on April 3, 2021.

Hammond Award Watch List

Missouri State junior forward Jasmine Franklin was named to the preseason watch list for the 2021 Becky Hammon Mid-Major Player of the Year Award presented by Her Hoop Stats. The second player in school history to reach 500 career rebounds as a sophomore, the Favetteville, Ark., native had the 11th-highest defensive rebounding rate in the nation last season and ranked in the top 10% nationally in steals and blocks according to advanced metrics provided by Her Hoop Stats. In January, 15 players will be named to the midseason watch list.

Lady Bears Favored

Missouri State was tabbed as the preseason favorite in the MVC Women's Basketball race in the annual survey of the league's coaches, SIDs and media.

New Schedule Format

The Missouri Valley Conference has adopted a new scheduling format for men's and women's basketball Conference games (the women's schedule is attached in multiple formats.) The Conference will continue to play an 18-game format in which most MVC teams will face one another in a two-game series on back-to-back days at the same site. Each institution will play four road series and four home series and will also face their designated 'travel partner' in a singlegame, home-and-home series.

Starters Returning

The Missouri Valley Conference will see 34 of 50 starters return (68%) for the 2020-21 season. The league will return five of its top 10 in scoring, five of its top 10 in rebounding and two of its top five in assists. The Valley will also have five of its first-team All-MVC players return and three honorable mention selections.

Postseason League

The MVC has seen an average of four league teams participate in postseason play in the last 21 seasons where postseason action took place, including three teams reaching postseason play in 2018-19. Before the 2019-20 season was cut short due to COVID-19, the MVC was in position to send 5 or 6 teams to postseason play. The Valley has earned multiple NCAA Tournament bids in 12 different seasons, including two out of the last three seasons (not counting 2019-20).

Hoops In the Heartland

The 2021 Missouri Valley Conference Women's Basketball Tournament will return to the TaxSlayer Center in Moline, III., for the sixth-straight year.

Affectionately coined "Hoops in the Heartland," the four-day event (Mar. 11-14) will showcase all 10 Missouri Valley Conference schools as they compete for the Valley's automatic berth into the NCAA Tournament.

The 2021 tournament will mark the 14thconsecutive season in its 39-year history that the event will take place at a neutral site. However last year's event was cancelled due to COVID-19.
