#### **MVC Player of the Week**

#### Madison Bartley, Jr., F, Belmont

Junior forward Madison Bartley was once again a force to be reckoned with last week, leading the Bruins to another pair of dominant victories. She led all scorers in both of Belmont's wins over Murray State and Bradley, averaging 20.5 points, 8.5 rebounds and 1.5 blocks while shooting 51.4 percent (18-of-35) from the field. In the Bruins' 64-54 home triumph over the Racers last Thursday, Bartley scored 19 points on 8-for-15 shooting and grabbed five rebounds. Of Bartley's 19 points, 11 came in the third guarter as she distributed three

assists and came up with a pair of blocks and a steal. In Belmont's dominant 68-54 road victory at Bradley Sunday afternoon, Bartley recorded her second double-double of the season and third of her career with 22 points and a game-high 12 boards. Going 10-for-20 from the floor, Bartley scored 13 of her 22 points in the first half and added a block and an assist. Of Bartley's 17 rebounds on the week, 10 were earned on the offensive glass.

#### **MVC Newcomer of the Week**

#### Kennedy Taylor, So., F, Missouri State

Transfer Kennedy Taylor led the way for Missouri State as the Lady Bears picked up two wins last week against SIU and UIC to extend their win streak to five. Taylor averaged 15.5 points and 9.5 rebounds in the two victories, while dishing out seven total assists and shooting 56 percent (14-for-25) from the field. In Wednesday night's win at SIU, Taylor scored six points, grabbed four rebounds and collected an assist and steal in 18 minutes of

work against the Salukis. On Saturday afternoon against UIC, Taylor exploded for a career-high 25 points, six assists and 12 field goals, while tying her career mark of 15 rebounds. With her performance, she becomes the only player in Division I to reach all three of those marks in a game this season. She took over in the second half as Missouri State mounted a come-frombehind win, scoring 15 points on 7-for-9 shooting from the field and grabbing eight rebounds in the final 20 minutes. With eight offensive boards against the Flames and 10 on the week, Taylor continues to lead the Valley and ranks 18th nationally with 3.9 offensive rebounds per game.

#### **NOTEWORTHY**

In addition to the league's Player and Newcomer of the Week selections, several conference players had notable performances, including:

Maggie Bair (DU) - Senior forward Maggie Bair was lights out for Drake in two Missouri Valley Conference games last week. Bair put up back-to-back double-doubles in as many games, reaching seven for the season and 15 for her career. She averaged 17.5 points and 10 rebounds in games at UNI (2/1) and against Evansville (2/4). The Glen Ellyn, III. native started the week with a 12-point, 10-rebound performance in the Bulldogs' loss at UNI. She followed that excellent showing with 23 points on 10-of-12 shooting, her second-highest scoring output of the year, and another 10 rebounds in a get-right win over Evansville in the Knapp Center. Bair nowleads the Bulldogs in both categories with 16.1 ppg and 8.2 rpg, both in the top five of the MVC. She also leads The Valley and ranks seventh nationally with a .618 field goal percentage.

**Abby Feit (UE)** - In another split of MVC contests, senior guard/forward Abby Feit turned in a pair of consistent performances to help power the Aces. On the week, Feit averaged 15.5 points and eight boards. The highlight of the week came in Evansville's 68-66 win over Indiana State on Wednesday as Feit notched her fourth double-double of the season with 18 points and 10 boards.

Jaida McCloud (UIC) - As the Flames spilt their road-trip between a win at Valparaiso (55-53) and in defeat against Missouri State (68-57), McCloud hit her offensive stride. The junior averaged 18 points and six and a half rebounds over the past week. In their game against the Bears, McCloud scored 16 of her 17 points all in the first half.

**DeAnna Wilson (ILS)** - Wilson averaged 14.5 points per game for Illinois State as the Redbirds went 2-0 with a pair of home wins over rival Bradley on Thursday before taking the lone regular season meeting with MVC newcomer, Murray State, on Sunday... She made 14-of-27 shots for the week (51.9%), while averaging 10.5 rebounds on the week with two blocks to gather her 6th and 7th double double performances in 2022-23 for the Redbirds... Against the Braves she scored 13 points on 6-of-17 shooting from the field, 1-of-1 from the charity stripe, one block, one steal, and 10 rebounds over 22 minutes on the court ... In the finale of the week against Murray State, Wilson went for 16 points off 8-of-10 shooting from the field, adding a block and 11 rebounds over her 29 minutes of action in ISU's win over the Racers.

Maya McDermott (UNI) - It was another stellar week for McDermott as she made the winning shot against Drake and helped the Panthers in a dominating 91-51 win over Indiana State. It was almost like deja vu for McDermott in Wednesday night's game against the Bulldogs. She put up a long-range teardrop floater from the right side of the lane as time was expiring with the game tied. McDermott's shot was right on target, keeping UNI from going to overtime and sealing the Panthers first series sweep of Drake since 2016. The shot also got national media attention appearing on SportsCenter's Top 10 and Scott Van Pelt's "Best Thing I Saw Today" segment. For the week, McDermott averaged 12 points, 3 assists, 2.5 rebounds, and 0.5 steals.

Paige Robinson (ILS) - Robinson averaged 18.5 points per game for Illinois State as the Redbirds went 2-0 with wins over rival Bradley Thursday before taking their lone regular season meeting with Murray State on Sunday from Normal... She made 16-of-34 shots for the week (47.1%), and was 4-of-8 (50.0%) from long range ... She averaged six and a half rebounds on the week with six assists and four blocks ... Against the Braves she scored 13 points on 6-of-12 shooting from the field while grabbing eight rebounds, dishing out three assists, and collecting two blocks while playing 25 minutes ... In the finale of the week against Murray State, she scored a game-high 24 points, converting on 10-of-22 shots from the field, 3-of-4 from long range and 1-of-2 from the free throw stripe ... She also had three assists, two blocks, and five rebounds in ISU's win over Murray State.

Rachael Heittola (UNI) - Heittola had her best game in a Panther uniform this past weekend against Indiana State. The junior transfer put up a season-high 14 points against the Sycamores and tied her career-high in three pointers made with 3 treys on the afternoon. Heittola also added five rebounds and one assist in UNI's blowout win of Indiana State. In two games this week Heittola averaged 13 minutes, 7 points, and 2.5 rebounds.

**Promise Taylor (SIU)** - Mississippi State transfer Promise Taylor had a Valley season-high 19 points versus Valparaiso on Saturday, plus seven rebounds and five blocked shots. For the week, she averaged 12.0 points, 5.5 rebounds and 5.5 blocks in a loss to to Missouri State and win over Valpo. She converted 10-of-13 shots from the field.

#### Tight at the Top

The top four teams in The Valley standings entering this week are separated by only two games. Illinois State holds a game lead over UNI entering this week's action, while Belmont and Missouri State sit two games back of the Redbirds.

#### Streaks-a-Plenty

Illinois State, Belmont and Missouri State each enter the week riding winning streaks of five or better. The first place Redbirds have won 10-straight and is one of 12 teams nationally riding a win streak of 10+ games. Belmont has won six straight games, while Missouri State has won five in a row.

The Redbirds have had six previous instances of winning at least 10 straight games in a season since 1981-82 (1983-84; 1984-85; 1988-89; 2007-08; 2008-09; 2009-10).

The Valley is one of just three leagues nationally to have three teams riding winning streaks of 5+ entering this week, joining the Atlantic 10 (Rhode Island 10, UMass 8, George Washington 5) and Mid-American Conference (Bowling Green 9, Ball State 7, Toledo 5).

#### **Nothing But NET**

The NCAA NET Report (Feb. 7) has four Valley teams that rank in the top-100, including six of the 12 sitting in the top 130. Drake leads the way at No. 53 with UNI (62), Illinois State (85) and Belmont (92), rounding out the schools in the Top 100. Missouri State (103) and Murray State (126) rank in the top 130.

Only eight leagues have six or more teams in the Top 130 of the NET (ACC, American, Big 12, Big East, Big Ten, MVC, Pac-12 and SEC).

#### **Sharing the Rock**

Drake enters the week currently ranking second in the nation in assists per game, averaging 20.8 per game.

#### **BEL: Six Game Streak**

Belmont's current six-game winning streak is its longest of the season. The Bruins have held their last six opponents to 35 percent shooting or below and their last five opponents under 60 points. Belmont's average margin of victory over its last six outings is 20.2. Madison Bartley has led Belmont in scoring for six-straight games. She has tallied six 20-point performances this season, four of which have taken place over the last six games.

#### **BU: First Meeting**

The Braves and Bruins met for the first time in school history at the Renaissance Coliseum on Sunday. Bradley finished the first guarter up 20-17. The Braves were outscored in the second and third quarters and made a final push in the fourth, but it wasn't enough to get the team its first conference win. Caroline Waite was the top scorer for the Braves with 15 points, two assists and one steal.

#### **DU: Keeping Pace**

Drake earned a split last week to stay within striking distance of the MVC's top spot. The Bulldogs started the week with another nail-biting loss to UNI (2/1). Drake fell to UNI by a 49-47 margin in the McLeod Center as a heroic floater by the Panthers' Maya McDermott proved to be the difference. The Bulldogs bounced back in a major way with an 87-48 blowout over Evansville in Des Moines. Drake's win over the Purple Aces included several individual and team landmarks including a 17-rebound performance from sophomore forward Anna Miller, Maggie Bair's second-straight double-double, a season-high 14 team assists, and the team's second-most rebounds in a game with 61. The Bulldogs are 13-7 overall and 8-4 in conference play.

#### **UE: Feit Reaches 1,500 Points**

Senior Abby Feit became the fourth player in program history to reach 1,500 points in Evansville's Monday night non-conference contest with UT-Martin. Feit finished tied for the game-high with freshman guard Kynidi Mason Striverson as both recorded 12 points.

#### **UIC: Approaching 1,000**

UIC's Josie Filer is on pace for the career milestone of scoring 1,000 total points in her collegiate career. Leading the Flames in both scoring (12.7 PPG) and rebounds (6.6 RPG) in her lone season with the team, Filer is only 70 points away from the milestone.

#### **ILS: Single Digit Quarters**

For the 35th time, and 22nd time against an MVC foe under Kristen Gillespie, the Redbirds held an opponent to score single digits in the first quarter. As they held Bradley to four first-quarter points last Thursday, the Redbirds move to 28-7 all-time when allowing single digits in the first 10 minutes. The four points allowed match the lowest first-quarter points allowed under Kristen Gillespie for ISU (Jan. 15 at Belmont; 2022 Hoops in the Heartland Quarterfinals v. Loyola).

#### **INS: Road Warrior**

Indiana State forward Chelsea Cain has seen success away from the friendly confines of Hulman Center, posting a double-double in each of the Sycamores' last three road games. Cain had 16 points and 11 rebounds at Illinois State, 11 points and 10 rebounds at Bradley and 14 points and 10 rebounds at Northern Iowa. Over the three-game stretch, she is averaging 13.7 points and 10.3 rebounds per game.

#### MOST: Fresh Performance

According to HerHoopStats.com, Jade Masogayo is currently the only freshman in NCAA Division I averaging at least 7.0 points per game, 4.5 rebounds per game, 1.5 blocks per game and 1.5 assists per game this season. Masogayo ranks 50th nationally in blocks per game and 54th in the country in total blocks, while also leading the Lady Bears with a .537 field goal percentage on the year.

#### **MUR: 20 Wasn't Enough**

Despite scoring 20-plus points in the three of four quarters Sunday at Illinois State, it was the eightpoint third quarter that proved to be the difference in the game. Murray State shot just 17.6-percent in the stanza, while Illinois State shot 70.6-percent in addition to outscoring the Racers by 19.

#### **UNI: .500 Once Again**

Northern Iowa secured its 15th consecutive year at .500 or better in Missouri Valley Conference action. UNI's current run of 15 seasons in a row is already the league's longest active streak among all women's and men's basketball programs.

#### SIU: Wide Margin

The Salukis bounced back in a big way on Saturday, putting together a well-rounded effort against the Beacons at home in their 77-47 victory. The 30-point differential was the second largest in a win this season for SIU, only being topped by its 58-point win against Chicago State on Dec. 1. This was the 11th time the Salukis have reached 70 points, and the 47 points were the fewest Southern has given up in a game this season.

#### VU: Connecting from Deep

Senior Olivia Brown continued to connect from deep last week, going 5-for-11 from 3-point range over Valpo's two games. Brown currently paces all MVC players in Valley-only play with a 3-point percentage of .500. Overall this year, Brown is hitting at a .449 clip from deep - a mark which would rank third in a single season in program history.





#### HerHoopStatsStat of the Week

Missouri State's Kennedy Taylor had 25 points. 15 rebounds, and 6 assists against UIC on Saturday. She's the only player in Division I to reach all three of those marks in a game this season. This was the first 25/15/6 game by an MVC player since Stephany Neptune of SIU on March 4th, 2010.

Illinois State, UNI and Drake appear in this week's CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major Top 25 (Jan. 31). Illinois State is at No. 9 in the poll, while UNI comes in at No. 12 and Drake at No. 22. Missouri State and Belmont are receiving votes this week.

#### **Non-Con Recap**

The Valley finished the non-conference portion of the schedule 58-55 (.513) this season.

The MVC secured five wins over Power Five programs during the non-conference schedule. The Valley registered a 5-21 record vs. Power Five teams. The Valley went 2-3 vs. the SEC, 2-13 vs. the Big Ten, 1-2 vs. the Big 12 and 0-3 vs. the ACC. Five different Valley teams registered a Power Five win as Drake beat Nebraska, Illinois State beat Wisconsin, Missouri State won at TCU, UNI beat Vanderbilt and Murray State won at Kentucky.





#### **Rise of The Valley**



#### Postseason League

Valley women's basketball sent a total of five teams to the postseason in 2022 as Drake, UNI and Southern Illinois participated in the WNIT, joining Illinois State and Missouri State who earned bids to the NCAA tourney. The MVC has seen an average of four league teams participate in postseason play in the last 23 seasons. The Valley has earned multiple NCAA Tournament bids in 14 different seasons, including four out of the last five seasons.

Valley newcomers Belmont and Murray State also appeared in the postseason last year. Belmont narrowly missed a trip to the Sweet 16, falling to Tennessee in the round of 32, while Murray State made an appearance in the WNIT.

#### **50 Years of Title IX**

The Missouri Valley Conference will be celebrating the 50th anniversary of the passage of Title IX legislation (June 1972) throughout the 2022-23 season as it honors pioneers from league institutions who paved the way for current and future women's student-athletes.



#### **Hoops In the Heartland**

The 2023 Missouri Valley Conference Women's Basketball Tournament will return to Vibrant Arena in Moline, Ill., for the eighth-straight year. The Valley becomes the only Division I stand-alone women's basketball event to be held in the same city eight or more consecutive years.

In fact, Hoops in the Heartland 2023 will match the ACC, SEC, Big Ten and Big 12 Conference Tournaments, as the only Division I stand-alone women's basketball championships to be held at a neutral site for more than 15 consecutive years.

Affectionately coined "Hoops in the Heartland," the four-day event (Mar. 9-12) will showcase all 12 Missouri Valley Conference schools as they compete for the Valley's automatic berth into the NCAA Tournament.

The 2023 MVC Women's Basketball Tournament title game on Sunday, March 12, will be aired on ESPNU at 1PM CT for the second consecutive season. The first 10 tournament contests will be shown exclusively on ESPN+.
