Playoff Bids - MVFC History

The MVFC has had a league-record five teams selected to the playoffs three times (2014, 2015, 2017). In the past four seasons, the MVFC has had a total of 19 bids. Only CAA Football has had as many as 5 bids in the same season (also three times).

The Power 5

In the past seven+ playoffs (2010-17), five leagues (Big Sky, CAA Football, MVFC, Southern and Southland) have combined to win 132 of 157 total games. The MVFC has 46 of those wins (35 percent).

Dominance By Decade

The Missouri Valley Football Conference has recorded a 46-20 record since 2010 in the playoffs – better than any other league. Over the last three-plus years the MVFC has a 27-13 record in the playoffs, which includes six intraconference games, meaning the league is 21-7 vs. the rest.

How Seed It Is

For the sixth time in league history, two MVFC teams are seeded in the Top 8. North Dakota State (2) and South Dakota State (5) are the league's seeded teams this year. The last time the league had those two positions (2/5) – the teams met one another in the title game (2014).

With South Dakota's first-ever trip to the FCS playoffs, every Missouri Valley Football team (past and current member) has qualified for the FCS playoffs.

Against the FCS

The MVFC is 20-6 against FCS schools this year, which includes three road losses to ranked FCS teams, one of which (Liberty) is transitioning to FBS. The MVFC is 4-3 against non-league FCS ranked teams.

OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR QB Chris Streveler, South Dakota, Sr.

Team captain ... finalist for National Player of the Year ... broke USD single-season records for total offense (4,283 yds) and passing yards (3,614) ... accounted for 37 touchdowns against six turnovers in 11 games ... stands with a league-record 4,283 yards of offense this season, 33 yards more than Illinois State's Tre Roberson had in 15 games in 2014 .. is also the 10th-leading rusher in the league (yards per game) with the third-most rushing TDs ... attempted 195 passes before throwing an interception ... twice passed for more than 400 yards ... passed for 306, ran for 119, and had four touchdowns in a win vs. Bowling Green



DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEARLB Brett Taylor. Western Illinois. Sr.

Team captain ... Leads FCS with 162 tackles, 13.5 per game and 96 assisted stops... also had 13.0 TFLs, 1.5 sacks, four breakups, two FF and a QB hurry... MVFC Defensive Player of the Week after matching program-record with 28 tackles (fifth in MVFC history) vs. USD. His 18 assisted stops were the second-most in a single game in program history... Recorded double-digit tackles in all but three games in 2017 ... Has led Western Illinois in stops in 16 of the last 17 games, including all but one contest this year... Has made 39 straight starts ... Finished his four-year career with 469 total tackles in 48 career games ... He ranks third all-time in school history in total tackles, third in solo tackles (266) and fourth in assisted tackles (203).



NEWCOMER OF THE YEAR FRESHMAN OF THE YEAR LB Jabril Cox, North Dakota State

Jerry Rice Award finalist...Two-time MVFC Newcomer of the Week...Leads NDSU with 52 tackles and 9.0 tackles for loss...Also has 4.0 sacks, one interception, two breakups, three QB hurries, one forced fumble and one recovery...NDSU's leading tackler on special teams...Played all 11 games and made four of the last five starts after being thrust into the lineup for the second half at Youngstown State...STATS FCS National Freshman of the Week after making a season-high eight tackles including two sacks and a key TFL in overtime of the win at YSU...His 32-yard INT return at Illinois State set up a four-play scoring drive.



'BRUCE CRADDOCK' COACH OF THE YEARChris Klieman, North Dakota State

Klieman, who won his 50th game as NDSU head coach last week at Illinois State, is just the fifth Bison coach to reach that mark and the second fastest to 50 wins behind Ron Erhardt. He has a 50-6 record at NDSU and has guided the Bison to their seventh straight Missouri Valley Football Conference championship. Klieman has been a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award in 2014, 2016 and this year. The Bison are 28-4 in the Missouri Valley Football Conference the past four seasons, have gone 30-5 against FCS Top 25 teams, and have an FBS Top 25 win over No. 11 lowa. North Dakota State is 10-1 this season and has an FCS-best six Top 25 victories.

Missouri Valley Football Conference All-Newcomer Team; NDSU's Jabril Cox Sweeps Top Honors

ST. LOUIS — LB Jabril Cox of North Dakota State has been named the Missouri Valley Football Conference Newcomer and MVFC Freshman of the Year. He heads a list of 22 student-athletes named to the 2017 Missouri Valley Football Conference All-Newcomer Team. League coaches, sports information directors and a media panel selected the team.

Cox is the first North Dakota State student-athlete to win the league's Newcomer of the Year award and also the Bison's first Freshman of the Year winner. Cox is the third in league history to sweep both honors, joining QB Sawyer Kollmorgen of UNI (2012) and RB Martin Ruiz of Youngstown State (2013). It marks the first time since 2009 that a league Newcomer is a defensive player, while it's the second-straight year that a linebacker has been voted as the league's top freshman.

Cox, from Kansas City, Mo., is a finalist for the STATS FCS Jerry Rice Award presented to the FCS Freshman of the Year, and he is a two-time MVFC Newcomer of the Week. Cox leads NDSU with 52 tackles and 9.0 tackles for loss and has 4.0 sacks, one interception, two breakups, three QB hurries, one forced fumble and one recovery. He is NDSU's leading tackler on special teams. Cox played all 11 games and made four of the last five starts after being thrust into the lineup for the second half at Youngstown State. He was named STATS FCS National Freshman of the Week after making a season-high eight tackles including two sacks and a key TFL in overtime of the win at YSU. His 32-yard interception return at Illinois State set up a four-play scoring drive.
