Players of the Week

Offense

QB Matt DeSomer, Southern Illinois Sr., 6-0, 215, Lowell, Ind. (Andrean) DeSomer rallied Southern Illinois with four-unanswered touchdowns in a 49-35 win over Missouri State. He completed 19-of-24 passes for 206 yards, 3 touchdowns and no interceptions. He also ran the ball 14 times for 92 yards. The rally started with a game-

The rally started with a gametying score at the end of the first half, when DeSomer engineered an 11-play 75-yard TD drive, culminating in a 4-yard touchdown pass to TE Nigel Kilby with 11 seconds left. SIU had no timeouts remaining on the game-tying drive.

Defense

LB Jonas Griffith, Indiana State

Jr., 6-4, 244, Louisville, Ky. (Acad. of Shawnee)
Griffith recorded a game high 14 tackles,
including 11 solo stops Saturday against
Youngstown State. No matter if the Penguins
ran or passed, Griffith seemed to be in the play
defensively. He picked up an important sack in
the fourth quarter when the Penguins went for
it on fourth down to put the ball back in ISU's
hands. Griffith iced the game late in the fourth
with an 80-yard fumble recovery for a touchdown – the first defensive score in his career.

Newcomer

QB Ryan Boyle, Indiana State Jr., 6-2, 215, Urbandale, Iowa (Iowa)

Boyle racked up 419 yards of total offense in the Sycamore win while throwing for 325 yards and a trio of touchdowns on 17-of-28 through the air. He also added 68 yards on the ground while catching a pass for 26 yards from Jalil Kilpatrick in the second quarter. In total, Boyle finished with seven pass completions over 20 yards in the win, including a 60-yard bomb to Hendrix in the second quarter.

Special Teams

K Jerry Nunez, Indiana State

Jr., 5-11, 185, Naples, Fla. (Naples HS)

Nunez hit 3-of-4 field goals in the victory at Youngstown State. Trailing 7-0 to the Penguins, Nunez nailed a 41-yard field goal to put the Sycamores on the board, before adding a 30-yard field goal in the second. The Naples, Florida native pushed the Sycamore lead to 16-10 at halftime after splitting the uprights on a game-long 45-yard field goal with 48 second left in the first half. Nunez was also a perfect 4-for-4 on PAT attempts for the Trees.

Offensive Lineman

C Tanner Volson, North Dakota State 6-4, 306, Sr., Balfour, N.D. (Drake-Anamoose)

Volson had four knockdowns and did not allow a hurry or sack. He earned coaching grades of 100 percent on assignment and 83 percent technique as NDSU put up a seasonhigh 560 yards of total offense. The Bison rushed for 384 yards and five touchdowns averaging 8.0 yards per carry, and the offensive line provided protection for quarterback Easton Stick's 176 yards passing and three TDs. The Bison held the ball for more than 13 minutes in the third quarter and had nearly 37 minutes in time of possession.

Magic Number = 1

North Dakota State can earn at least a share of the 2018 MVFC title and the league's automatic berth into the NCAA playoffs with a win this weekend against Youngstown State. The Bison hold a two-game advantage over three teams in the standings (UNI, SDSU and Western Illinois). NDSU would win the tiebreaker in the event it ties any of those three teams.

Title Town

Should North Dakota State earn this year's MVFC crown, it would mark a league-record eighth-straight Conference title (shared or outright), and that would be second-only to UNI's 16. The Panthers had a streak of seven-straight titles from 1990-96.

5-0 League Start for NDSU

North Dakota State became the 25th team in league history to start an MVFC season with a 5-0 mark after the Bison defeated South Dakota on Oct. 27. Twenty-two of the previous 24 earned a playoff berth, and 21 of those teams won the league crown. A league team has started 5-0 in back-to-back seasons six times: Western Illinois (87-88), UNI (94-95-96), Western Illinois (97-98), Southern Illinois (03-04), North Dakota State (13-14) and North Dakota State (17-18). Twelve previous league teams have started MVFC play 6-0, and all of those teams won the title and qualified for the NCAA playoffs.

Another 8-0 Start for NDSU

North Dakota State is the only in Missouri Valley Football Conference history to win its first eight games in back-to-back seasons, and the Bison have done it twice. NDSU was 15-0 in 2013 and started 2014 with nine-straight wins. The Bison started 8-0 last year and are now 8-0 this season. Only nine teams in MVFC history have started a season 8-0 or better.

Winning in Conference

North Dakota State has won sevenstraight league games, and that streak is the third-best active streak in the FCS. The seven-game streak is tied for 11th-best in MVFC history. NDSU established a league record with 18-straight MVFC wins (2012-14).

Just Stop It

Three league players average better than 10.0 tackles per game this year, including Indiana State's Jonas Griffith (12.1), UNI's Chris Kolarevic (10.8) and Indiana State's Katrell Moss (10.1). The trio rank among the Top 14 in the FCS. Two MVFC players, meanwhile, rank among the Top 7 among active players in the FCS with 300+ career tackles. With 306 career stops, SDSU's Christian Rozeboom is the active leader among juniors. He ranks 5th-highest overall.

Ranked vs. Ranked

Prior to games of Nov. 3, there have been 172 games in which two league teams ranked in the top 25 played one another. Of those 172 games, 43 times the meeting involved teams that were both ranked in the Top 10 at the same time. Nine meetings have occurred in the playoffs. The SDSU-NDSU matchup on 9/29/18 marked just the third time in league history that two teams ranked in the Top 3 played one another.

Winning Against No. 1

When North Dakota State knocked off top-ranked and previously unbeaten James Madison in last year's FCS title game, It marked the 17th time an MVFC member had recorded a win vs. the nation's top-rated team (9 of those 17 wins were against a fellow league member). As an MVFC member (since 1997), Youngstown State is 2-5 against No. 1 teams. The Penguins beat NDSU in 2011 when the Bison were No. 1. That game (27-24) was in Fargo (Nov. 12).

Sticking It To 'Em

QB Easton Stick has surpassed 2,000 career rushing yards (2,191), which is second among active quarterbacks. SDSU's Taryn Christion has 1,319 rushing yards, which is seventh best. Stick is one of just three MVFC QBs to reach 2,000 career yards. He needs 86 yards to overtake record-holder DeAndre Smith of Missouri State (1987-90).

Edgar Makes it Look Easy


Redshirt freshman Andrew Edgar has made the game look easy in his first season on the field for the Redbirds. Last week against No. 7 South Dakota State, the Chicago native set career highs in receptions (9), yards (202) and touchdowns (2) against the Jackrabbits. He caught a career-long 81 yard touchdown pass from Brady Davis on the first play from scrimmage and added his second touchdown late in the fourth quarter. The 200-plus yard receiving performance was the first for the Redbirds since 2015 and Edgar went over 100 yards for the second time this season. Through eight games, Edgar has caught 29 passes for 561 yards and four touchdowns for the Redbirds.

Flipping the Field

Special teams play is vital to a team's success, and thanks to some strong punting by JT Bohlken, the Redbirds have been successful in the punting game. The Jefferson City, Missouri, native has been impressive in his first full season as the team's primary punter, averaging 44.0 yards per punt. That mark leads Valley Football and is No. 8 in the FCS, and Bohlken also leads the league in punts over 50 yards (17) and punts downed inside the 20 yard line (16).

The Captain Takes Charge

An injury to starting quarterback Brady Davis just before halftime pushed senior captain Jake Kolbe into action to start the second half against South Dakota State. No stranger to playing in tough situations in his career, Kolbe inherited a 21-point deficit and did everything he could to get his team back into the game. The Naperville, Illinois, native completed 65 percent of his passes and threw for 183 yards and three touchdowns against the Jackrabbits in his most extensive action of the season.

Turning the Corner

Coming off an 0-11 season a year ago, the Sycamores were picked to finish last in the Missouri Valley Football Conference with just one vote not assuming the worst in 2018. The Sycamores are now 4-4 on the season and have won a pair of MVFC games. The win at Youngstown State Saturday marked the first time that ISU has won two consecutive road Valley games since 2014 and the first time since 2016 that the Sycamores have won consecutive games.

Red Zone Success

One of the keys this season for the Sycamores has been their success when entering the red zone. ISU ranks 12th nationally and has scored in the red zone 29-of-32 times for a 91 percent average. Last season, ISU entered the red zone just 19 times over 11 games with only nine touchdowns. This season, the Sycamores have 20 touchdowns and seven made field goals through seven games.

Right Place - Right Time

For the third time this season, safety Jamal Jones recovered a fumble on defense. The Carrolton, Texas, product ranks second in the nation and tops in the Missouri Valley Football Conference in fumble recoveries after scooping and running into Youngstown State territory during a win against the Penguins. Jones also recorded five solo stops and a pass breakup against the Penguins.

Huslig Makes His Mark

Peyton Huslig accounted for 419 yards of total offense, including a career-high 404 passing yards, in last week's game against Southern Illinois. Both efforts rank No. 3 all-time in Bears' single-game history and were the best numbers by a Bears QB since A.J. Porter's 460 passing yards and 426 total offensive yards against Illinois State in 2003. Likewise, his four TD passes against the Salukis tie for the fifth-most ever in a game by a Bears' signal caller, and most since Brodie Lambert's five touchdown tosses against WIU in 2015. His 27 completions and 46 pass attempts in the SIU game also rank seventh and fifth, respectively, all-time on the MSU single-game list. The game was Huslig's fifth 200-yard passing game of the season and eighth of his 19-game career.

Zo on the Go

Sophomore wide receiver Lorenzo Thomas gathered in eight passes for 173 yards against Southern Illinois on Saturday – both career highs – and extended his streak of double-figure reception games to seven straight. Seven of his receptions against the Salukis went for first downs with catches of 44, 39, 32 and 17 yards among his many highlights on the day, averaging 21.6 yards per reception.

Drive for Five

The Bears, now 4-4 overall, head into the month of November looking for their fifth win of the season, a milestone that would be a first under fourth-year head coach Dave Steckel and MSU's first five-win season since 2013. Missouri State has three ranked foes on its November slate, including this week's game at South Dakota State and a date with top-ranked North Dakota state on Nov. 10 in the home finale.

Bison Strike Quick in win at USD

North Dakota State needed just 21 offensive plays to open a 28-0 lead early in the second quarter and the Bison scored on 9 of 13 drives in last week's 59-14 win at South Dakota. Easton Stick passed for three first-half touchdowns and finished 12 of 19 for 176 yards while rushing seven times for 79 yards and two TDs in three quarters of play. Five of NDSU's scoring drives took four plays or less as the Bison ran eight offensive plays of 20-plus yards and put up a season-high 560 yards of total offense. Lance Dunn notched his ninth career 100-yard game and second of the season with 12 carries for 114 yards. Jabril Cox had five tackles, a sack, two tackles for loss and a 34-yard interception return all in the first quarter before finishing with a team-high nine tackles.

Stick Sets NDSU Passing Record

Easton Stick's three first-half touchdown passes at South Dakota set a new NDSU career record with 73 touchdown passes, topping the mark of 72 set by Brock Jensen from 2010-13. Stick moved into fifth place in MVFC history, immediately behind Youngstown State's Kurt Hess (4th at 75, 2010-13). With another five total touchdowns at USD, Stick has been responsible for 106 career TDs and is one shy of Jensen's NDSU-record 107 career TDs responsible for.

Flexing Muscle in Punting Game

North Dakota State's punt teams have been flipping the field in recent weeks. Return specialist Darrius Shepherd is the second-ranked punt returner in FCS with an average of 19.2 yards per return including a 38-yarder at South Dakota that would have been a 75-yard TD before a penalty. Shepherd had two returns for 103 yards two weeks ago against Illinois State. Meanwhile, punter Garret Wegner took advantage of all four opportunities last week at South Dakota averaging 50.2 yards per punt including 53- and 58-yard boots on his first two attempts. Wegner ranks 10th in FCS and is second in the league with a 43.7 punting average. He's averaged 44.3 yards over the past three weeks and NDSU has allowed zero punt return yards in that span.

Simmons is Yotes' First 100-Yard Rusher

In addition to leading the Valley in passing this season, quarterback Austin Simmons became the Coyotes' first 100-yard rusher. Running mainly quarterback draws and bolstered by a 62-yard touchdown run, Simmons ran for a game-high 115 yards against North Dakota State last weekend. He is the third player and first quarterback to rush for 100 yards against the Bison this season. Four of the Coyotes' seven longest runs in 2018 are from Simmons.

Cochrane, Reed Emerging on Defense

All-Valley performers Darin Greenfield and Andrew Gray have stolen most of the headlines defensively this season, but sophomore line-backer Jack Cochrane and sophomore safety Elijah Reed have stood out of late. Cochrane has compiled 23 tackles in his last two games and is tied for the team lead with Gray with 64. Reed, starting in place of an injured Phillip Powell, has posted double-digit tackles in back-to-back games, and is now fourth on the team in tackles.

Hot Indiana State Team Next

South Dakota looks to snap a three-game skid Saturday in Terre Haute, Indiana, against a team the Coyotes downed 56-6 last season. Indiana State is coming off its best win of the season, a 43-17 road win at Youngstown State, and is 4-4 on the year. USD beat Indiana State 33-30 in double overtime two years ago in Indiana and has won three in a row in the series.

Second-Half Surges

SDSU has a long history of peaking in the second half of the league season since joining the Missouri Valley Football Conference in 2008. With their 38-28 victory Oct. 27 at Illinois State, the Jackrabbits have compiled a 32-9 record in the second half of the league schedule over the past 10-plus seasons, running the table with four wins in both 2013 and 2017 en route to Football Championship Subdivision playoff berths. SDSU has posted a 3-1 record in the second half seven other times, with its worst showing a 2-2 mark in 2010.

Johnson Hits Century Mark Again

Jackrabbit wide receiver Cade Johnson topped the 100-yard mark for receiving yards for the fourth time this season by catching eight passes for 131 yards and a touchdown in SDSU's 38-28 road win at Illinois State on Oct. 27. Johnson's touchdown covered 81 yards late in the second quarter, capping a 21-point outburst in a span of 3 minutes and 12 seconds that gave the Jackrabbits a 28-7 halftime lead. Johnson's touchdown was his MVFC-leading ninth of the season.

Defending the Run

The SDSU defense held an opponent to less than 100 rushing yards for the second time this season, limiting Illinois State to 81 yards on 29 carries (2.8 ypc) in their Oct. 27 matchup. The Jackrabbits shut down the Redbirds' running back tandem of James Robinson and Markel Smith, who managed only a combined 15 yards on 18 carries. SDSU held Montana State to 29 net yards on the ground on 23 attempts (1.3 ypc) in the Jackrabbits' Sept. 8 season opener.

Salukis on Record Pace

SIU's offense averages 25.6 first downs per game, which is on pace to break the school record of 24.8 first downs (2015). Southern recorded 70 first downs in Weeks 3-4. The 37 versus SEMO was a school record and the 33 versus South Dakota ranked fourth all-time.

Davis Leads MVFC in All-Purpose Yards

RB D.J. Davis is a prolific rusher, receiver and return man, who leads the league in All-Purpose yardage per game (149.6). He is fifth all-time at SIU with 3,798 career all-purpose yards (1,401 rushing, 697 receiving, 1,683 return). He opened the season with four-straight 100-yard rushing games and has five on the season. The last Saluki with five 100-yard games in a season was Malcolm Agnew in 2014.

S Jeremy Chinn Fills at CB

S Jeremy Chinn (6-2, 211, Jr.) has started 25-straight games for the SIU — the longest active starting streak on the team. Last Saturday, he made his first-career start at cornerback, as the Salukis played the game without their top four corners. In the last 20 games, Chinn has six interceptions and six forced fumbles. A preseason All-MVFC pick, he is tied for second all-time at Southern in forced fumbles (6), trailing only Tyler Williamson (8, 2012-14).

Dawg Bites

- QB Matt DeSomer needs 123 yards to become just the second QB in school history to rush for 1,000 yards in his career. Joel Sambursky (2001-05) rushed for 1,100 yards. He has rushed for 100 yards three times in his career, tying the school record for career 100-yard rushing games by a quarterback, set by Fred Gibson in 1987-88.
- LB Bryce Notree (6-2, 235, So.) leads the team with 65 tackles, including 56 stops in the last six games. He had 11 as a freshman last year. Notree also has 5.0 TFL, 2.0 sacks, and two interceptions.
- With 848 rushing yards this year, D.J. Davis has more yards on the ground than any SIU running back since Jewel Hampton had 1,121 yards in 2011.

Key to Success

All four Leatherneck victories this season have one common theme – they committed fewer turnovers than the opposition. Western is 4-0 when it takes care of the ball, highlighted by a 45-38 victory over Youngstown State, where it didn't commit a single turnover while recording three.

Holding Firm

Western lays claim to one of the best defenses in the MVFC, currently ranking third in the Valley, 20th in the nation, in total defense with 323.9 yards allowed per game. In its first road victory, the team allowed 283 yards of total offense while holding Missouri State to a season-low 14 points. Western held nearly a 21-minute edge in time of possession (38:13 vs. 21:47).

Swenson Stops

Pete Swenson leads the Missouri Valley Football Conference and ranks second in the nation with 16.0 tackles for loss. He notched a season-high 3.5 TFL at Illinois State and ranks eighth all-time in program history with 41 in his career. Swenson also ranks fifth in the Leathernecks' history books with 22.5 career sacks. He's gotten his hands on the opposing quarterback in all but one game this season.

McCaster Likes Home Cooking

Senior TB Tevin McCaster picked up his fifth 100-yard rushing performance of the season with a 165-yard effort against Indiana State. McCaster has rushed for more than 100 yards in each of the Penguins' five home games this season. He had 166 against Butler, 141 vs. Valparaiso, 116 vs. Southern Illinois and 176 vs. South Dakota besides his 165-yard performance last Saturday vs. Indiana State. In YSU's five home games, he has 764 yards on 140 carries and has scored five touchdowns.

Dellovade Reaches 300 Career Tackles

Senior LB Armand Dellovade recorded the 300th tackle of his career in the third quarter against Indiana State. Dellovade entered the game against Indiana State just eight tackles shy of 300 before finishing with nine stops against the Sycamores. He is just the 13th player to be credited with 300 tackles as a Penguin and the first since Jeremiah Wright finished with 308 from 2003-07. Dellovade is just seven tackles back of Wright for 12th place in YSU history.

Savon Applying Pressure

Senior DT Savon Smith has been playing some of the best football of his career as of late. In the past three games, he has 14 tackles, 6.5 TFLs and four sacks. He had the best game of his YSU career in the Penguins' 29-17 win over South Dakota. Smith was credited with a career-high seven total tackles and had a career-best six solo stops. He had a career-best three tackles for losses, two sacks and a pair of quarterback hurries against the Coyotes. This past week, he had two sacks against Indiana State.
