Another FBS Win for the MVFC

Thanks to Illinois State's 35-19 win at Colorado State on Sept. 22, the Conference has had at least one FBS win in each of the last nine seasons. The MVFC recorded a 1-7 mark vs. the FBS this year. Dakota Marker Set for Saturday

NDSU and SDSU meet Saturday in the 15th annual Dakota Marker game, which was established in 2004 when the Bison and Jackrabbits began Division I competition.

NDSU leads the series 8-6 but SDSU has won the last two meetings 19-17 two years ago in Fargo and 33-21 last year in Brookings. Post-season games are not included in the Dakota Marker series. The trophy is a 75-pound model replica of the original quartzite monuments that were 7 feet long and 10 inches square and placed at half-mile intervals along the border in the summers of 1891 and 1892.

Players of the Week

Offense

QB Easton Stick, North Dakota State
6-2, 221, Sr., Omaha, Neb. (Creighton Prep)
Stick accounted for 321 yards of total offense and four touchdowns in North Dakota
State's 38-10 homecoming win over Delaware.
He went 17 of 26 passing for 280 yards and
rushed five times for 41 yards and two TDs.
The Bison put up 527 yards of offense against
a Delaware team that came in ranked ninth
nationally in total defense. Stick has been
responsible for 91 career TDs at NDSU, and
passed College Football Hall of Fame QB Jeff
Bentrim for second place on that list.

Defense

DB Devin Taylor, Illinois State

6-1, 200, So., Lansing, Michigan (Sexton HS)
Taylor and the Redbird secondary handled one of the most explosive passing offenses in the FBS, as the Redbirds came away with a 35-19 win over Colorado State Saturday. The Lansing, Michigan, native finished the day with eight tackles, six of which were solo stops, two pass break ups and the second interception of his career. Taylor intercepted a pass deep in ISU territory as CSU quarterback K.J. Carta-Samuels was attempting to find his receiver in the end zone to take points off the board. The interception was one of two for the Redbird secondary on the day, which held the Rams to just 257 yards in the air.

Special Teams

P JT Bohlken, Illinois State

6-0, 210, So., Jefferson City, Mo. (Jeff City HS)
Bohlken kept the Rams at bay in a hardfought 35-19 win. He averaged 51.4 yards per
punt on 7 attempts, with a long of 60 yards on
the day. On three different occasions, Bohlken
pinned the Rams inside their own 20 yard line
and had three touchbacks to flip the field in
favor of the Redbirds in the victory.

Newcomer

WR Deion McShane, UNI

5-9, 155, Fr., Freeport, Illinois (Freeport HS) McShane had a breakout game from the slot receiver position. He had seven receptions for 117 yards and a touchdown in the win against Hampton. His long was a 36-yard reception in the first half. His 12-yard touchdown reception was a highlight-reel grab that he made between two defenders. The touchdown with 4:10 left in the third quarter, put UNI up 41-0 and was the last reception of the day for the Freshman. Deion's brother Steve won MVFC Special Teams Player of the Week last week.

Offensive Lineman

LT Dillon Radunz, North Dakota State
6-6, 299, So., Becker, Minn. (Becker HS)
Radunz led a Bison offensive line that
helped produce a season-high 527 yards of

total offense in North Dakota State's 38-10 win over Delaware. He allowed zero sacks and was credited with two explosive blocks by the coaching staff with grades of 97 percent on assignment and 82 percent technique. NDSU rushed for 240 yards and provided protection for QB Easton Stick, who was 17-for-26 for 280 yards and two touchdowns.

Open Season

All 10 league teams open MVFC action this week, in what is the 34th season of the Conference's existence. Youngstown State (9) and North Dakota State (7) have the longest active win streaks in MVFC season-opening games. YSU, in fact, is 18-3 all-time in its first league game each season after beating South Dakota State last year. Southern Illinois and Missouri State played in the league's first conference game on 9/7/85.

The MVFC captured the second annual Big Sky-MVFC Challenge Series, 5-3. The MVFC won last year's series, also 5-3. The home team won all eight games this year. Seven of the eight games in 2018 featured at least one ranked team (in two of the games, both teams were ranked.) The MVFC conducted one previous challenge series (with the OVC) and the MVFC won all three season series against the OVC (2003, 2004, 2005) with a combined record of 20-2 in those games.


Heading into Saturday's game at Colorado State, six other FCS teams had picked up wins over FBS opponents so far in 2018. With the hashtag #FearTheFCS at the ready, Illinois State improved that number to seven with a big 35-19 win over the Rams at Canvas Stadium. The victory was the second-straight for the Redbirds against a FBS foe, following a 9-7 win at Northwestern in 2016, and the third for the Redbirds since a 2012 win at Eastern Michigan. Overall, the victory was the sixth over a FBS for the Redbirds in program history, as ISU improved to 3-0.

Robinson at the Ready

Heading into 2018, James Robinson was on many pre-season lists and was expected to be one of the better backs in the FCS. Through three games, he is proving he is just that as his dominant effort helped the Redbirds pick up a big win over Colorado State. The junior from Rockford, Illinois, averaged 8.4 yards per carry and totaled 184 on the ground with a pair of touchdowns. Also adding a first-down grab for 11 yards to show his versatility, Robinson finished the day with 195 all-purpose yards. The 100-plus yard effort was the second in a row for Robinson, who now has 382 yards rushing (8.3 per carry) and five touchdowns through three games for the Redbirds.

Edgar Breaks Out

For the past two weeks, redshirt freshman Andrew Edgar has shown that he is someone to keep an eye on in the potent Redbird offense. The Chicago native recorded his first touchdown in a Redbird uniform and finished with 82 yards in a win over Eastern Illinois. He followed that up with his first career 100-plus yard receiving effort with 111 yards on five receptions in the 35-19 win over Colorado State. Through three games, Edgar is averaging 19.5 yards per catch and is second on the team with 215 receiving yards.

Coming Off the Bye Week

Indiana State opens Missouri Valley Football Conference action Thursday night at home following a bye week. The Sycamores welcome Northern Iowa to Memorial Stadium as Thursday's contest will serve as the MVFC Game of the Week. The Panthers have won three straight in the series and hold a 27-5 lead all-time.

Ground and Pound

Indiana State made it clear from the start that running the football would be a major focus of the offense in 2018. So far this season the Sycamores have outgained its opponents 839 to 326 on the ground. Leading the charge in the backfield is senior running back Ja'Quan Keys with 414 yards on a 6.2 yards per carry average. The Perry Meridian High School product has six rushing touchdowns, including a four score, 232-yard performance at Eastern Illinois to cap off week three for the Sycamores. Freshman Christian Covington has added four rushing touchdowns and 138 yards on the ground while sophomore Titus McCoy has gone for 119 yards and a pair of scores in three games.

In Good Company

Ja'Quan Keys finished off Indiana State's victory at Eastern Illinois with a career-high 234 yards rushing on 34 attempts, including four trips to the end zone. It was the sixth-highest single-game rushing total in program history. He has now eclipsed the 100-yard rushing mark in two of the last three games this season. Keys became the first Sycamore to eclipse the 200-yard rushing mark since Shakir Bell tallied 201 at Tennessee Tech in 2013. He is the first Sycamore to score three touchdowns in one half of football since LeMonte Booker did it in the first half of ISU's 2015 season opening victory over Butler. Keys is the first Sycamore to score four touchdowns in a game since Booker did it against Butler in 2015 and the first Sycamore to record four rushing touchdowns since Bell did it (in the first half) against Youngstown State in 2011.

Punting With a Purpose

Missouri State enters the week ranked fourth nationally in net punting (43.43) and third in punt return defense (-0.83). Only Kennesaw State (45.6), Harvard (45.3) and Southeastern Louisiana (44.7) rank ahead of the Bears in net punting on the season, while Missouri State's standout punter Brendan Withrow ranks ninth nationally in punting average with 44.5 yards per attempt, including six of his 14 attempts downed inside the 20.

1978 Championship Team Honored

Noteworthy for Saturday's MSU home game against Illinois State is a reunion and recognition of the 1978 Bears football team. Coach Rich Johanningmeier's squad finished the 1978 season with an 8-3 record and MIAA conference title after a 6-0 run through the league. The Bears, who rushed for more than 3,000 yards on the season, clinched the conference title on the road with a 38-6 win at SEMO in the season finale.

Limited Laundry

After ranking in the top 10 nationally last season in fewest penalties (7th) and fewest penalty yards (9th), the Bears have continued that trend into the 2018 campaign. Coach Dave Steckel's troops have committed just 5.0 penalties per game this year which ranks 18th nationally, while the Bears' 38.7 penalty yards per game ranks 16th.

Balanced Attack Overwhelms Delaware

North Dakota State scored 28 first-quarter points and put up a season-high 527 yards of total offense in a 38-10 homecoming victory over Delaware last week. Ten different Bison players caught passes led by Desmond Cain's four receptions for 89 yards and Darrius Shepherd's four catches for 77 yards. NDSU's defense recorded three interceptions and three sacks while limiting Delaware to just 152 yards of offense and one field goal.

Bison Capitalizing on Turnovers

Sophomore linebacker Jabril Cox last week became the first NDSU player since Del Gehrett in 1967 to record an interception return for TD in back-to-back games. Cox went 43 yards for a score against North Alabama two weeks ago and last week went 36 yards on Delaware's first offensive play of the game to help lift the Bison to a 14-0 lead. NDSU is plus-4 in turnover margin and the Bison have scored 35 points off turnovers through three games.

Stick Moves Up NDSU Career Chart

Senior QB Easton Stick, who had two rushing and two passing touchdowns last week against Delaware, passed College Football Hall of Fame quarterback Jeff Bentrim for second place all-time at NDSU with 91 career touchdowns responsible for. Stick has 28 career rushing TDs and ranks second at NDSU with 63 touchdown passes.

NDSU, SDSU Longtime Rivals

This week is the 108th meeting between North Dakota State and South Dakota State dating back to 1903. It is the 14th most-played rivalry among the current Football Championship Subdivision membership. NDSU leads the series 60-42-5 including a 14-2 advantage in the Fargodome since 1993. The teams have met three times in the FCS playoffs, all in Fargo, with NDSU winning second round games in 2012 and 2014 and a quarterfinal game in 2016. SDSU is looking to win back-to-back games in the series for the first time since winning three straight from 2007 to 2009.

The 49-yard touchdown run by Trevor Allen against Hampton was the longest UNI touchdown run since Dec. 5, 2015, when the Panthers Tyvis Smith ran for a 59-yard score to cap off a 29-17 win over Portland State in the FCS Playoffs in Portland. Aaron Bailey also had a pair of touchdown runs over 60 yards in that game.

Success Against the Trees

The Panthers travel to Indiana State Thursday to open up the MVFC season. UNI is 27-5 all-time against the Sycamores and won last year's contest 41-3 in Cedar Falls. ISU is 2-1 on the year and will be coming off of a bye week.

Blankity Blank

The 44-0 result against Hampton marked the first UNI shutout since Nov. 14, 2015, at Missouri State. (41-0). It was the largest margin of victory since Nov. 7, 2015, vs. Indiana State (59-13). UNI notched 414 yards of total offense. The last time UNI tallied 400+ yards of offense was against Monmouth on Nov. 25, 2017 (520).

McShane Stars in Hampton

Freshman Deion McShane notched $11\overline{7}$ yards receiving and a touchdown and earned the league's Newcomer of the Week honor (He's the younger brother of Western's Steve McShane.) The last Panther to tally 100 yards receiving and a touchdown was Daurice Fountain against Monmouth on Nov. 25, 2017 (139 yds, 2 TDs).

Valley Play Begins vs. Southern Illinois

South Dakota opens Valley play against Southern Illinois Saturday in Carbondale. The two teams have met every year for the last four years and the home team has held serve. The Coyotes and Salukis have combined to pass for 1,800 yards and 14 touchdowns this season.

Five 100-Yard Receivers

South Dakota is one of seven FCS teams with five 100-yard receivers, though the other six have all played in at least four games. Sophomore Levi Falck leads the team with 18 catches for 194 yards. Dakarai Allen (12-136), Randy Baker (10-105), Shamar Jackson (8-153) and Trystn Ducker (6-143) have also eclipsed 100 yards. The Coyotes also welcomed back sophomore Kody Case, who had six catches for 57 yards in his 2018 debut which came against Weber State.

Defensively

The Coyotes racked up 11 sacks and 29 tackles-for-loss thru their first three games. All-American defensive end Darin Greenfield leads the team in both categories with three sacks and 5.5 TFL. Linebacker Alex Gray has two sacks and 4.5 TFL to go with a team-leading 25 tackles. He also has an interception and a fumble recovery.

Nielson Stands 1 Win Shy of 200

South Dakota head coach Bob Nielson earned his 199th collegiate head coaching win against Northern Colorado and will get his second crack at No. 200 against Southern Illinois. When he reaches 200, Nielson will be the 17th active NCAA head coach at any level to reach the milestone. Nielson has 13 wins in two-plus seasons at South Dakota.

Christion Eyes Another Record

South Dakota State quarterback Taryn Christion will look to add another school record to his collection Saturday as he is within reach of the Jackrabbits' career passing yardage mark. A senior, Christion enters Saturday's game at North Dakota State with 9,166 career passing yards, 293 yards away from passing Austin Sumner (9,458 passing yards from 2011-14) for the all-time Jackrabbit lead. Christion also holds SDSU career marks for total offense (10,347 yards) and passing touchdowns (81). His passing touchdowns total also is a Missouri Valley Football Conference record.

Takeaways Streak

The Jackrabbit defense has forced six turnovers (four interceptions, two fumble recoveries) through its first two games — two against Montana State and four versus Arkansas-Pine Bluff. That has extended SDSU's streak of recording at least one takeaway to 17 consecutive games, dating back to late in the 2016 season. In those 17 games, the Jackrabbits have come out on the plus side of turnover margin eight times and have been even with their opponent on four other occasions. The most turnovers SDSU has forced during its current streak is five, which came in their 33-21 victory over North Dakota State last season. SDSU has yet to turn the ball over this season in 128 offensive plays.

500 Club

SDSU has topped 500 yards of total offense in each of its first two games, marking the fifth year in a row the Jackrabbits have had back-to-back games with that type of prolific offense. The last time the Jackrabbits put together three consecutive games of 500-plus total yards was in 2016, when SDSU tallied 513 yards at Illinois State (Oct. 29), 548 yards versus Missouri State (Nov. 5) and 630 yards versus South Dakota (Nov. 12). In 2017, SDSU had four games of 500-plus yards, including back-to-back performances of 591 yards at Missouri State (Oct. 21) and 579 yards at Western Illinois (Oct. 28).

The school record for consecutive 40-point games is four (in 1999 and 2002) and has never been done four-straight times to start a season. SIU had 1,176 yards of total offense in the last two games combined. SIU has scored on 11 of its last 14 first-half possessions (8 TDs, 3 FGs), dating back to the Murray State game.

Straub Hits 300 Yards, Again

QB Sam Straub has passed for more than 300 yards twice this season. He now has seven 300-yard passing games in his career — a school record.

Leonard a Favorite Target

WR Raphael Leonard has posted back-to-back career highs in receiving yards with 117 against Ole Miss and 124 versus SEMO. He has four TDs in the last two games.

Spreading the Wealth

Eleven different players have scored touchdowns for SIU this season, including three players on defense.

Montana State – A three-yard rush by Steve McShane on Western's second drive; Illinois – A 20-yard pass from Sean McGuire to George Wahee on the very first drive of the game; Montana – A 71-yard pass from McGuire to John Brunner on the second play of the game

Close Calls

Two of Western's three matchups this season have been decided by less than a TD and both were determined in the fourth quarter. A 35-yard field goal in the final five minutes lifted Montana State to a 26-23 victory in the Leathernecks' season opener, and in the team's home debut versus Montana, Steve McShane scored back-to-back touchdowns in the final six minutes of the 31-27 WIU win. Western is 60-46 all-time in games decided by a touchdown or less.

Momma, There Goes That Man

Running back and return specialist Steve McShane is on the bend of claiming a top 10 spot on the Leathernecks' career rushing yards and all-purpose lists. Brian Knuckles is 10th on the rushing list with 2,158 yards, and Nikko Watson owns the all-purpose spot with 2,954. McShane is currently managing, 1,853 and 2,935, respectively, and in a three-way tie for 10th all-time in career rushing touchdowns (16).

McGuire & Milestones

Sean McGuire is closing in on Western's career marks in passing yards and touchdowns. He currently sits second all-time in the respective categories with 7,725 and 58, behind Paul Singer who played for Western from 1985-88. Singer sits atop WIU's all-time marks in passing yards (8,257), completions (678), attempts (1,231) and touchdowns (62).

MVFC Games in September

This is the 19th conference game the Penguins have played in the month of September since joining the league in 1997. YSU is 14-4 in September MVFC conference tilts and has won seven of its last eight. Impressively, YSU is 10-0 at home in September in MVFC games.

MVFC Opener Success

The Guins are 18-3 in MVFC openers since joining the league in 1997. YSU has won nine consecutive conference openers since a 40-7 loss at South Dakota State in 2008. Of the 21 league openers, the Guins are a perfect 11-0 at home while going 7-3 on the road. In first road games of the MVFC slate, the Guins are 11-10 all-time. In MVFC openers YSU is 2-0 against Western Illinois.

Spreading the Ball Around

The Penguins have had 12 different players catch passes. Leading the way is Zach Farrar, who has 11 catches for 173 yards, highlighted by a six-catch effort at West Virginia. In the opener vs. Butler, Samuel St. Surin caught five passes for 85 yards to lead the way while Kendric Mallory had four for 78 yards. Against Valparaiso, Darius Shackelford had three catches for 69 yards and a touchdown while Natavious Payne had two for 34 yards and a score. Ryan Emans had two catches against Butler while Jake Cummings had two grabs at WVU. Miles Joiner has touchdown receptions in the first two games while running backs Christian Turner and Tevin McCaster each have multiple receptions. Zach Torbert had a single catch against Butler while Jermiah Braswell caught one vs. Valparaiso.

Kennedy Nearing Top Three

Senior PK Zak Kennedy ranks fourth in school history in points by a placekicker. Last season, he had 67 points. As a sophomore he scored 96 points, and as a freshman he had 91. This season, Kennedy could move into second place as he trails Brian Palmer by one for third place and Mark Griffith by 13 for second. He has made 47 FGs in his career and 127 extra points in his four years with the program. He has made his last 62 PAT kicks dating back to December 2016.
