#### Big Sky-MVFC Challenge Series



Last year, the MVFC captured the second annual Big Sky-MVFC Challenge Series, 5-3. (The MVFC also won the 2017 series, also by a 5-3 edge.) The home team won all eight games last year. Seven of

the eight games in 2018 featured at least one ranked team (in two of the games, both teams were ranked.) The MVFC conducted one previous challenge series (with the OVC) and the MVFC won all three season series against the OVC (2003, 2004, 2005) with a combined record of 20-2 in those games. The two playoff matchups last year did not count toward the series.

Ten MVFC-Big Sky matchups are on the slate this year, including one this week. The Big Sky leads this year's series (2-0).

#### MVFC-FBS: Down to the Wire

Three MVFC-FBS games in Week 1 went down to the closing minutes. South Dakota State led Minnesota, 21-20, before the Gophers scored with 5:39 left for an eventual 28-21 victory. With 2:20 remaining, Indiana State led Kansas, 17-16, before the Jayhawks scored to win 24-17. Notably, UNI led No. 21 lowa State with a minute remaining in the fourth quarter before eventually falling, 29-26, in three overtimes. The overtime loss at lowa State marked the second time in league history that an MVFC team had lost to an FBS team in overtime (Missouri State lost to Oklahoma State in 1996).

#### Offense & Newcomer

QB Trey Lance, North Dakota State
6-3, 221, RFr., Marshall, Minn. (Marshall HS)
Lance became the first NDSU freshman
quarterback to start a season opener and
accounted for 301 yards and six touchdowns
in the 57-10 win over Butler. Lance had five
carries for 116 yards with touchdown runs of
33 and 61 yards, and went 10 of 11 passing
for 185 yards and four TDs in three quarters of
action. The Bison rolled up 388 yards rushing
and 605 yards of total offense.

#### Defense

DL Kaleb Brewer, Indiana State 6-5, 260, R-Jr., Bloomington, Ind. (Bloomington North HS)

The Indiana State defense forced three turnovers during its season opener at FBS Kansas Saturday. Redshirt junior Kaleb Brewer forced what might have been the most important turnover late in the fourth quarter on a strip sack in the endzone. Teammate Inoke Moala was able to fall on for a touchdown to put the Sycamores ahead 17-16 with under three minutes to play. In all, Brewer finished his day with five solo tackles, including three tackles-forloss for 15 yards, a sack for seven yards and a forced fumble.

#### Special Teams

PK Matthew Cook, UNI 5-11, 175, Fr., Cedar Falls, Iowa (Cedar Falls HS)

In the first game of his career, Matthew Cook hit four field goals, including the first 50-yard field goal for UNI since the 2015 season. He hit from 50, 31, 49, 28. His last two field goals came in overtimes of the 30T loss.

#### Offensive Line

RT Aron Johnson, South Dakota State So., 6-6, 295, Chisago City, Minn. (Chisago Lakes HS)

Johnson graded out at 93 percent and was credited with six finish blocks in South Dakota State's Aug. 29 season opener at Minnesota. He did not give up a sack and allowed only one quarterback pressure despite being matched up against all-Big Ten defensive end Carter Coughlin much of the night. As a team, the Jackrabbits averaged 5.1 yards per rushing attempt.

#### Against Ranked FCS Teams

The MVFC opened the 2019 season against two Top-25 opponents last week, falling to #25 Montana (South Dakota) and #17 Southeast Missouri State (Southern Illinois). Last year, in non-league play, the league was 2-2 during the regular season against ranked FCS teams, marking the 16th time in the league's 34-year history with multiple regular-season top-25 non-conference wins. Since 2014, league schools have combined for a 43-21 record against non-conference top-25 teams (counting the playoffs).

### **Home Sweet Home**

The Redbirds have played well at home under the leadership of head coach Brock Spack, including in their home openers the last 10 seasons. ISU is a perfect 10-0 in home openers in the past decade, and the Redbirds hope to extend that streak to 11 against Morehead State this season. In 2018, the 'Birds made an early statement on the year with a 46-0 shutout win over Saint Xavier to open the season.

## **Grimes Shines**

Sophomore Taylor Grimes played a lot of football in 2018, but did not feature heavily in to the receiving action with only two catches for 19. However, he earned a starting spot on the receiving corps for 2019 and he made the most of it for the Redbirds in the season opener at Northern Illinois. The Godley, Texas, native led the team in receiving and set new career highs with six receptions for 109 with his first career touchdown reception. Grimes snagged a 42-yard touchdown pass from Brady Davis in the third quarter to knot the game at 10-10 at the time for ISU.

## **Protecting the Nest**

Opposing teams coming to Hancock Stadium have not felt very welcome in the past 10 seasons, as Redbird teams led by Spack have not been very accommodating in the win column to visitors. ISU is a combined 48-12 at home during Spack's tenure and have gone 31-6 at Hancock Stadium since the renovation of the facility in 2013.

### **Home Sweet Home**

Indiana State will play a program record seven regular season home games at memorial Stadium in 2019. The Sycamores will begin a three-game homestand against Dayton this weekend, before hosting both Eastern Kentucky and Eastern Illinois prior to the teams' bye week. ISU will host Western Illinois, South Dakota State, Southern Illinois and Youngstown State in conference action in Terre Haute.

### **Fumble for a Touchdown**

Indiana State scored a touchdown on a fumble for the first time since 2016 on Saturday at Kansas. Kaleb Brewer recorded a sack and a forced fumble in the endzone before Inoke Moala recovered and scored the touchdown that put the Sycamores ahead 17-16 with under three minutes remaining in the game. Tsali Lough recovered a fumble and scored from 100 yards out against Butler in 2016.

## **Griffith Named to Buchanan Watch List**

Redshirt senior Jonas Griffith was named to the Buck Buchanan Watch List this preseason. Griffith is one of 25 nominees, including four in the MVFC to earn the recognition, presented by STATS to the most outstanding defensive player in the nation. The Louisville, Kentucky native was named a Preseason All-American by HERO Sports and STATS FCS after earning All-American status from three different publications as well as All-MVFC honors following the conclusion of the 2018 campaign. Griffith led the Sycamores and ranked fifth nationally in tackles. Over his career, Griffith has seen action in 33 games, recording 281 tackles. He has made 21.5 tackles-for-loss and recorded 10 sacks, two interceptions and three forced fumbles.

## **Foreign Flags**

After being one of the top 20 fewest penalized teams in the FCS ranks each of the last three seasons, the Bears committed an uncharacteristic 11 times for 96 yards in last week's season opener at Northern Arizona. The flag count was the team's second-highest in the coach Dave Steckel era, second only to 12 penalties at Murray State on Sept. 10, 2016. The Bears' penalty yardage in Flagstaff marked the third-highest since 2015.

## **Currie Picks It Up**

Senior wide receiver Tyler Currie picked up the 2019 season where he left off his junior season. The standout wideout hauled in a gamehigh six receptions for 89 yards and a touchdown in MSU's season opener at Northern Arizona. He averaged 14.8 yards per reception with a long 30-yarder -- his third-quarter touchdown pass from Peyton Huslig. Currie led the Bears with 35 receptions for 548 yards and 5 touchdowns a year ago.

## **Ground Stoppers**

Missouri State's rushing defense held Northern Arizona to just 2.4 yards per carry in last week's season opener. Against 36 NAU rushing plays, the Bears recorded 11 tackles for loss, totaling 31 yards, without the benefit of a sack. For the game, the Bears allowed just 88 yards on 36 carries.

## NDSU-UND 10th Most Played FCS Series

Saturday will be the 112th meeting between North Dakota State and North Dakota, the 10th most played series among current FCS programs. UND has a 62-46-3 lead all-time dating back to 1894, when NDSU won the first two meetings 24-6 in Grand Forks and 20-4 in Fargo. NDSU won the only Division I meeting between the two schools 34-9 in 2015 at the Fargodome, where UND has a 4-2 record.

## **NDSU Draws Largest FCS Crowd**

The crowd of 34,544 for NDSU-Butler last Saturday in the first Division I game at Target Field in Minneapolis was the 10th largest crowd in Bison history and most in the FCS this season. ## **Welcome Back, Kody**

Wide receiver Kody Case competed in just four games last season due to injury. Back and healthy as a redshirt sophomore, he tied a program record by hauling in 11 catches and totaled a career-best 144 yards and two touchdowns in Saturday's game against Montana. Case caught touchdowns of 3 and 9 yards. All 11 catches came in the first three quarters.

## **Solid Start for New O-Line**

South Dakota is breaking in four new starters on its offensive line, including two redshirt freshmen and a redshirt sophomore who has competed at tight end the past two seasons. That said, the unit allowed no sacks and just one hurry against the Griz. The Coyotes rushed for 106 yards and its three running backs averaged nearly four yards per carry.

## Rebound Against ... Oklahoma?

South Dakota heads to Norman, Oklahoma, to face the Sooners and new quarterback Jalen Hurts. The fourth-ranked Sooners opened the season with a 49-31 win against Houston Sunday at home. Hurts passed for 332 yards, ran for 176 and accounted for six touchdowns. He is the first Oklahoma quarterback to pass for 300 yards and rush for 150 in a single game. It is USD's first meeting with Oklahoma.

## Simmons Enters the Top 10

Senior quarterback Austin Simmons passed for 246 yards and two touchdowns in Saturday's opener against Montana. The passing total moved Simmons from 11th to seventh on the Coyotes' career passing list with 3,780 yards. He is 220 yards shy of 4,000, and 581 yards shy of sixth-place Dante Warren, currently the running back coach for the Coyotes.

## **Another Strong Performance**

South Dakota State running back Pierre Strong, Jr., racked up 159 all-purpose yards in the Jackrabbits' season-opening loss Aug. 29 at Minnesota. Strong tallied 53 rushing yards on 12 carries, 59 receiving yards on a pair of receptions and 47 yards on one kickoff return for an average of 10.6 yards per touch. Strong has tallied 100-plus all-purpose yards in six of the last seven games dating back to the 2018 season and seven times in his career. He ranked second on the squad with 1,238 all-purpose yards a season ago.

## **Home Openers**

South Dakota State has fared well in home openers under head coach John Stiegelmeier, who is in his 23rd season at the helm of the Jackrabbit football program. In 22 previous home openers, SDSU has compiled an 18-4 record and has won eight in a row. The Jackrabbits open the home slate Sept. 7 by hosting FCS newcomer Long Island University.

## **Ten Tackles or More**

Senior linebacker Christian Rozeboom notched double digits in tackles for the 20th time in his career by recording 11 stops in the Aug. 29 season opener at Minnesota. Rozeboom increased his career tackles total to 375, which ranks fourth in program history. He has been the team's leading tackler in 24 of the 41 games in which he has played (and started).

### Series Versus UMass

The Salukis and UMass have met once before, with SIU winning in the Elite Eight of the 2007 I-AA Playoffs, 34-27. SIU head coach Nick Hill was the starting quarterback in that game and for passed for 216 yards and three touchdowns to help the No. 4-ranked Salukis improve to 12-1 on the season. The teams combined for 984 yards of total offense. Southern advanced to the Final Four where it lost to the Joe Flacco-led Delaware Blue Hens.

## Davis 100+ Yards in 7 of last 12 Games

Dating back to last season RB D.J. Davis (5-8, 170, Sr.) has recorded seven 100-yard rushing games in the last 12 games. In last week's opener against SEMO, he rushed for 125 yards and two TDs. Davis is one of 40 players on the 2019 preseason watch list for the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) FCS National Performer of the Year trophy. Davis led the Missouri Valley Football Conference last season and ranked 14th in the nation in all-purpose yards per game with 140.3. He rushed for 1,118 yards in 2018 — the most by a Saluki running back since Jewel Hampton in 2011 — and averaged 6.28 yards per carry.

## Chinn a "Top FCS Target" by Senior Bowl

Preseason All-American S Jeremy Chinn (6-3, 212, Sr.) was named the "Top FCS Target" by the Senior Bowl last week. A year ago Delaware's Nasir Adderley earned the Senior Bowl's distinction and ended up as a San Diego Chargers 2nd round pick. Last season, Chinn led the team in interceptions (3) and pass breakups (9) and also forced two fumbles and blocked a field goal. A starter since his freshman season, he ranks among the school's career leaders in three categories — interceptions (13th/9), pass breakups (3rd/24) and forced fumbles (2nd/6).

## **Secondary Has Depth**

The Penguins secondary had a variety of faces see action in the win over Samford. YSU started six defensive backs against the passhappy Bulldogs. Starting were CB Bryce Gibson, CB Dee Ford, FS Kyle Hegedus, SS Zaire Jones, NB DJ Smalls and DB Jaelin Madison. Three of the six - Madison, Jones and Ford - were all making their YSU debuts while Gibson, Smalls and Hegedus have a combined 48 games started. Also seeing action against the Bulldogs were Melvin Jackson and John Harper. Harper intercepted a pass in the third quarter.

## **D-Line Totally New**

The Penguins had four players start the opener on the defensive line that didn't start a year ago - and all four made their starting debuts against Samford. The new group of DEs Justus Reed, Ma'lik Richmond and DTs Antoine Cook and DeMarko Craig were solid up front against Samford. Reed missed the 2018 campaign with an injury, Cook was a reserve defensive end, Craig redshirted and Richmond was a pass-rush specialist who had three sacks. Against Samford, the four players combined for 14 tackles, four TFLs and three sacks. Last year's season opening starting defensive line featured DE Shereif Bynum, DT Wes Thompson, DT Savon Smith and DE Johnson Louigene.

## **Home Opener Success**

The Penguins have won 23 of their last 24 openers dating back to the 1995 campaign. In the 24 games since 1995, YSU has outscored its opponents by an impressive 874-254 margin. Since then the Penguins have posted four shutouts, including 2017 vs. Robert Morris, while the most points allowed was 23 by Duguesne in 2014 and Butler in 2018. On offense, the Guins have scored at least 21 points in each of those games and gone over 30 on 17 occasions, including a high of 77 versus Valparaiso in 2011.
