Winning Against No. 1

When Southern Illinois knocked off topranked and previously unbeaten North Dakota State this past Saturday, it marked the 18th time an MVFC member had recorded a win vs. the nation's top-rated team (10 of those 18 wins were against a fellow league member). As an MVFC member, Southern Illinois is now 2-5 vs. No. 1-ranked teams. Before knocking off the Bison, the Salukis beat top-ranked Western Kentucky in a league game in 2005.

The last time NDSU was ranked No. 1 and lost to an unranked team was on Oct. 13, 2012, when it fell to Indiana State, 17-14.

Streak Snapped

North Dakota State's 39-game winning streak was snapped by Southern Illinois. The streak is the third longest in Division I history and the longest in FCS history surpassing the record 33-game Bison winning streak from 2012-14.

Players of the Week

Offense

QB Nic Baker, Southern Illinois 5-9, 194, So., Rochester (III.) High

Baker, making his first-career start, completed 17-of-23 passes for 254 yards, 1 TD and no interceptions. Baker guided a Saluki offense that generated five touchdowns and 443 yards of offense against the No. 1 ranked Bison. The Salukis were 11-of-16 in 3rd down conversions and had a 41:26 to 18:34 advantage in Time of Possession. The SIU win ended NDSU's 39-game winning streak, the longest in FCS history and third-longest in Division I history.

Defense

DE Kevin Ellis, Missouri State

6-4, 241, Jr., Fort Worth (Texas) North Crowley Ellis was everywhere for an MSU defense that allowed just 48 rushing yards on 30 carries at Western Illinois on Saturday. In the final five minutes of the game, Ellis was responsible for two forced turnovers on WIU's last two possessions, snagging a one-handed interception to halt a Leatherneck rally before forcing a fumble and turnover on WIU's final play of the game to secure MSU's victory. Ellis also had a possession-ending sack in the first half and finished the contest with 6 total stops, 5 solo tackles, 2.0 sacks, 2.0 tackles for loss, an interception and a forced fumble in MSU's first win of the Petrino era.

He had three punts of 50 yards or more including his final one, which pinned the Redbirds on their 15 with 1:34 to go and needing a touchdown

Offensive Line

OC Chase Arends, UNI

6-1, 300, So., Cedar Falls (lowa) Dike-New
Three Panther starters for week one were
unavailable for week two because of COVID
protocols and contact tracing. Chase Arends
stepped into the lineup for the Panthers at
Center and had an outstanding performance.
He anchored a line that racked up 191 yards
rushing and didn't give up a single sack. The
Panthers were dominant throughout, converting nine of 14 first downs and scoring every
time that UNI entered the red zone.

Open Season

This year marks the 36th season for the league. North Dakota State extended its active winning streak in MVFC season-opening games to 10 games with a 25-7 victory vs. Youngstown State on Feb. 21. Notably, Southern Illinois and Missouri State played in the league's first conference game on Sept. 7, 1985.

7 MVFC Teams in Top 25

Seven teams from the Missouri Valley Football Conference are ranked in this week's Stats Perform Top 25 poll, with all seven in the Top 20, and six teams in the Top 15. Ranked vs. Ranked

When No. 14 North Dakota knocked off No. 3 South Dakota State on Feb. 27, it marked the 186th game in which two MVFC teams ranked in the top 25 played one another. Of those 186 games, 51 times the meeting involved teams that were both ranked in the Top 10 at the same time. Twelve meetings have occurred in the playoffs. The home team is now 106-79, while the higher-ranked team is 117-69. One game (between Illinois State and North Dakota State in Frisco, Texas, on Jan. 10, 2015) was played at a neutral site. On Oct. 26, #1 North Dakota State beat #3 South Dakota State in what was just the fourth meeting between two MVFC schools ranked in the Top 3.

MVFC Preseason Poll

Only three Missouri Valley football teams participated in non-conference action this past fall, with Missouri State (0-3), North Dakota State (1-0) and Southern Illinois (1-0) playing a slate of games that featured five ranked opponents. Indiana State opted out of the spring schedule (which features 40 conference games).

SIU - National Team of the Week

SIU has been named the Stats Perform National Team of the Week. The Salukis earned their second all-time win over a top-ranked opponent, handing three-time defending FCS champion NDSU the secondlargest loss of its Division I era (since 2004).

A Winning Tradition

Illinois State's 10-5 overall record in 2019 was the 10th season at .500 or better in the last 11 seasons under the leadership of coach Brock Spack, who began his tenure at ISU with 6-5 records in both 2009-10. That consistency of winning has not been seen at ISU since the 1940's, when the Redbirds posted seven winning seasons in eight years from 1943-50 under the guidance of coaches Howard Hancock and Edwin Struck. Overall, the Redbirds have amassed a 84-50 (.627) record under the leadership of Spack, as he sits just two wins away from tying Howard Hancock for the program wins record.

Camp Gets the Start

Carson Camp became the first true freshman quarterback to start a football game for South Dakota since 1999, and the first to start a season opener in recorded history. He passed for 221 yards and accounted for all three touchdowns in South Dakota's 27-20 upset of seventh-ranked Illinois State.

UNI defeated Youngstown State on Saturday, Feb. 27, 21-0, marking the 100th league win for coach Mark Farley, now in his 20th year. He's the winningest coach in MVFC history.

Strong Cracks Top 10

Jackrabbit running back Pierre Strong Jr. moved into 10th place on the SDSU career rushing charts with a 95-yard performance Feb. 27 at North Dakota. A junior from Little Rock, Ark., Strong finished the day with 2,320 yards in 26 career games, taking over the 10th spot from Rick Wegher (2,293 yards from 1981-84). Next on the list is Darwin Gonnerman, who gained 2,598 yards from 1966-68.

Passing Fancy

Three MVFC schools are among the Top 8 in the FCS in passing yards per game, led by Western Illinois at No. 4. The Leathernecks racked up 281 yards through the air in their opener against Missouri State. Illinois State (5th) and South Dakota State (8th) also represent the league among the national leaders.

Bouncing Back vs. the Bears

North Dakota State's streak of five straight years winning back-to-back road games in Missouri Valley Football Conference came to end with last week's 38-14 loss at Southern Illinois. NDSU will hit the road again this week to face Missouri State, the same opponent NDSU faced in 2014 in a second straight MVFC road game after 19th-ranked Northern lowa snapped NDSU's then FCS-record 33-game winning streak. The Bison beat the Bears 45-10 in Springfield that year. NDSU has not lost back-to-back games in conference or non-conference play since 2009 when the Bison lost five straight to open the MVFC schedule.

Leading the Nation

South Dakota's defense intercepted four passes and recovered three fumbles en route to topping Illinois State Saturday in Normal. True freshman cornerback Myles Harden earned the start and came away with two interceptions. His first came with 45 seconds left in the first half and led to a game-tying touchdown. The Yotes are tops in the FCS with a +6 turnover differential.

Nice Debut

Western Illinois' redshirt freshman Greg Benton Jr. returned a 75-yard fumble recovery for a TD in Western's season-opener vs. Missouri State. He finished with seven tackles (six solo), a pass breakup, and two QB hurries in the season opener for WIU.

Stopping the Rush

Led by Illinois State (9th), six MVFC schools rank in the Top 19 in fewest rushing yards allowed per game. The Redbirds yielded just 79 yards to South Dakota in the season-opening game for both schools.

On offense, TE Jake Benio, TB London Pearson, WR Malick Mbodj, WR Natavious Payne, OT Henry Yoboue, C Mike McAllister, OG Aidan Parker and OG Jaison Williams all started. On defense, DT Ty Eddington, FS Quincy Lenton, DB Keyon Martin, LB Grant Dixon and DT Vinny Gentile all made their initial start for YSU.

Vick Keys Petrino's First Win

WR Damoriea Vick of Missouri State helped set up the game-winning TD for the Bears in Saturday's win at Western Illinois with a 74-yard catch-and run late in the fourth quarter. MSU scored on the very next play for Bobby Petrino's first win as Bears head coach. Vick finished with 6 receptions for a career-high 138 receiving yards in the contest. He also set up another MSU score in the third quarter with a 34-yard reception that preceded Jose Pizano's game-tying FG. Vick was starting his 25th straight game.

Jefferson, Sampson Shine

In addition to MVFC Offensive Player of the Week QB Nic Baker of Southern Illinois, two others from the Land of Lincoln had superb performances and find themselves in the national leaders for total offense. Illinois State QB Bryce Jefferson ranks fourth in the FCS with his 345-yard performance, and QB Connor Sampson of Western Illinois is ninth.
