7 MVFC Teams in Top 25

Seven teams from the Missouri Valley Football Conference are ranked in this week's Stats Perform Top 25 poll, with five teams appearing in the Top 10. Seven league teams have been ranked in the same week 18 times in our history, including twice this year, and the league record is eight (Sept. 29, 2014).

The league matched a record with five top-10 teams, which had been achieved three times previously – most recently on Oct. 2, 2017.

The first AFCA coaches poll of the season will be published on Monday, March 15.

The MVFC also holds five of the Top 8 spots in the Massey Ratings (and six of the Top 10 positions in that metric).

Players of the Week

Offense

QB Mark Gronowski, South Dakota State 6-3, 200, Fr., Naperville (III.) Neuqua Valley HS Gronowski accounted for four first-half touchdowns, running for two and passing for two, in South Dakota's State 45-10 home win over Western Illinois on March 6. He opened the scoring with a 22-yard touchdown run. In the second quarter, he sandwiched an 80-yard touchdown run around TD passes of 44 and 12 yards to Jadon Janke and Mason Leighton, respectively. For the game, Gronowski was 12-of-19 passing for 178 yards and carried four times for 120 yards.

Defense

LB Spencer Cuvelier, UNI 6-3, 245, Jr., Cresco (Iowa) Crestwood High / Iowa Central CC

Cuvelier notched 11 tackles, two tackles for loss and a strip-sack to help lead the UNI defense in a stifling defensive performance in the 20-10 win over No. 15 Illinois State. The Redbirds racked up 447 yards of offense a week ago, but the Panthers held ISU to just 185 yards, including just 69 yards through the air. Cuvelier forced a fumble late in the fourth which led to a turnover and a touchdown to clinch the 20-10 win.

Newcomer

TB Jaleel McLaughlin, Youngstown State 5-9, 175, Jr., Marshville (N.C.) Notre Dame Coll. McLaughlin rushed for 124 yards and 26 carries and scored two touchdowns in YSU's loss to Southern Illinois. A transfer from Notre Dame (Ohio) College, McLaughlin had his best performance by far for the Penguins in his third game. He had rushing scores of 10 and oneyard in the first half of the game. They were his first YSU touchdowns.

Special Teams

P Garret Wegner, North Dakota State 6-0, 197, Sr., Lodi (Wis.) High

Wegner averaged 52.2 yards on five punts including a career-long of 67 yards that ranks fourth longest in the FCS this season. Wegner also had punts of 54 and 59 yards and placed two inside the 20-yard line while limiting Missouri State to 10 return yards. Wegner also ran a fake punt 23 yards for a first down to set up NDSU's first touchdown in a 25-0 victory.

Offensive Line

RT Garret Greenfield, South Dakota State 6-6, 295, So., Rock Valley (Iowa) High

Greenfield graded at 95 percent with eight knockdown blocks in South Dakota State's 45-10 win over Western Illinois on March 6. He did not allow any sacks or quarterback pressures as the Jackrabbits totaled 531 yards of total offense, including 347 yards on the ground.

UND -- Another Top 25 Win

North Dakota continues to keep it rolling against teams inside the top-25, notching its 14th win as a Division I program against a ranked foe and its sixth-straight victory at home. The Fighting Hawks have now started 3-0 on the season for the first time since 2008, but this marks the first time in program history that it has knocked off a trio of ranked opponents to start the season.

Wegner Honored by Stats Perform

Punter Garret Wegner of North Dakota State was named the Stats Perform National Special Teams Player of the Week after averaging 52.2 yards on five punts in North Dakota State's 25-0 win at Missouri State.

Ranked vs. Ranked

A pair of games this past week featured two ranked MVFC teams. The league has now had 188 meetings all-time that featured two ranked MVFC teams. Of those 188 games, 51 times the meeting involved teams that were both ranked in the Top 10 at the same time. Twelve meetings have occurred in the playoffs. The home team is 108-79, while the higher-ranked team is 119-69.

One game (between Illinois State and North Dakota State in Frisco, Texas, on Jan. 10, 2015) was played at a neutral site. On Oct. 26, #1 North Dakota State beat #3 South Dakota State in what was just the fourth meeting between two MVFC schools ranked in the Top 3.

North Dakota State has been tabbed as the Missouri Valley Football Conference preseason favorite in a poll conducted by league coaches. NDSU has been picked first in the pre-season poll for nine-straight seasons.

North Dakota State has earned the league title for nine-straight years, four times sharing it with another league school. This year, NDSU received 101 points in the coaches vote to edge UNI (92) and SDSU (91).

Milestone Win

South Dakota State's 45-10 victory over Western Illinois on March 6 marked the Jackrabbits' 100th victory since joining the Missouri Valley Football Conference in 2008. Overall, the Jackrabbits have posted a 100-55 record (.645 winning record) in that span, including a 68-31 mark in league games. SDSU has not finished below .500 in league play in any of its 12 full seasons as an MVFC member, making it the only current member (outside of newcomer UND) since 2008 to be able to make that claim.

Renovated DakotaDome

South Dakota hosts Missouri State Saturday in what will be the first game to take place in the DakotaDome following a \$26 million renovation to the west side of the facility. The Coyotes had won 16 consecutive home openers before falling to Montana 31-17 at the start of last season.

Home Streak at 30 Games

North Dakota State is on a school-record 30-game home winning streak, which is tied for fifth longest in FCS history behind Georgia Southern (39, 38), Eastern Kentucky (34), Middle Tennessee State (31) and Montana (30). It is the longest active home winning streak in Division I and a new Missouri Valley Football Conference record, topping NDSU's 26-game home winning streak from 2012-15.

Pick Six

Illinois State LB Kenton Wilhoit jumped in front of McElvain's pass and returned the interception 29 yards for the touchdowns to make it 10-10 with 2:22 left before halftime. His interception was the first of his career and the pick six now gives the Redbirds at least one defensive TD in each of coach Brock Spack's seasons.

What's the Catch?

Missouri State's Jordan Murray has now recorded a pass reception in 25-consecutive games, the fifth-longest streak in program history. In 2018, Murray broke the Bears freshman receiving record with 33 catches for 378 yards while earning FCS Freshman All-America honors.

Clean Slates

Four MVFC schools rank among the nation's Top 12 teams for fewest penalties per game. North Dakota, which averages just two penalties per game, is tied for the FCS lead through three games. North Dakota State (3rd), South Dakota (7th) and Youngstown State (12th) also represent the Missouri Valley.

Tough Against the Pass

Three league schools rank in the Top 10 of the FCS for fewest passing yards allowed, led by Southern Illinois, which ranks 5th while allowing just 106.0 yards per game in its four contests this season. SIU's figure would be the lowest in the league since 2003 when Missouri State led the Conference by allowing just 101.1 passing yards per game.

Catch Up

The Leathernecks hold three of the top four spots in the MVFC in receptions per game. Dennis Houston leads the Valley, and ranks fourth in the nation, with nine catches, and is followed by teammates Tony Tate and Dallas Daniels. The rankings should come as no surprise, as Connor Sampson is averaging 31.5 completions per (second in the NCAA) and 279.5 passing yards (eighth in the NCAA).

Comeback Kids

Southern Illinois rallied from an early 12-point deficit to beat Youngstown State, 30-22, on Saturday. The Salukis (3-1, 2-1) are off to their best start since opening the 2015 season at 5-1. SIU trailed 12-0 and 19-7 before scoring 23 of the game's final 26 points to move to 3-1 overall.

Second Half Dominance

North Dakota has made it a point to dominate the second halves of games through the opening three contests of the season, outscoring its opponents, 63-17, over that span. UND has scored a touchdown on the opening possession of the second half in every game and struck for 14 points in the third quarter in the 21-10 win over South Dakota last Thursday.

Nine Turnovers

South Dakota has intercepted five passes and recovered four fumbles through its first two games. True freshman cornerback Myles Harden leads the nation in passes defended (2 interceptions, 5 breakups). Linebacker Brock Mogensen got his first collegiate interception against North Dakota. UND, meanwhile, ranks second nationally with its 2.00 turnover margin average.

Stopping the Rush

Youngstown State's Jaleel McLaughlin had his best day as a Penguin with 124 yards and two touchdowns on 26 carries in the loss to No. 11 Southern Illinois. In YSU's two previous games this spring, McLaughlin rushed for a total of 73 yards on 17 carries with no touchdowns. He was named Sunday as the league's Newcomer of the Week.

Kickin' It

Four MVFC punters rank among the nation's Top 11, led by Garret Wegner of North Dakota State who leads the league and ranks second nationally by averaging 45.7 yards per punt. Wegner booted a 67-yarder against Missouri State on Saturday.

Panthers Dominating 'D'

The UNI defense held its second consecutive opponent without an offensive touchdown, shutting out Youngstown State 21-0 and beating Illinois State 20-10 this past weekend. It is the first time since outscoring Hampton and Indiana State by a combined 77-0 in 2019. Notably, Illinois State didn't make it into the red zone against UNI. The Panthers allowed Illinois State just nine first downs, 185 yards of total offense and just three points on the offense in the win.

Panthers Rank 7th Nationally

UNI ranks 7th nationally in total defense, yielding just 206.0 yards per game. It's the lowest league-only figure since 2012, when North Dakota State surrendered just 202.8 yards per game in league play. Five MVFC teams rank in the NCAA's Top 30.

Tough Fall Slate

Every regular-season non-conference game in 2020-21 will be against a ranked opponent. Three of the five games were against #11 UCA; Southern Illinois hosted #25 Southeast Missouri State; and Missouri State tackled fifth-ranked FBS Oklahoma. The MVFC has had at least one win against a non-conference ranked opponent every year since going 0-4 in that space in 2004. Notably, the 2004 season and 1990 season (0-3) are the only years in which the Conference hasn't recorded a top-25 non-league win.

League Supremacy

In 2019, four MVFC teams earned selection to the NCAA Division I Championship, and North Dakota State won its eighth national championship in nine years. Counting last year, an MVFC member has reached the FCS semifinals 24 times in the past 24 seasons (and 27 times overall), and the MVFC has had two semifinal teams in four of the past six seasons.
