NEC Men's Tennis Co-Player of the Month

Arvis Berzins, Fairleigh Dickinson

Jr., Adazi, Latvia/Riga Centre Language School

Berzins, the two-time NEC Player of the Year, won his first collegiate tournament on September 23, capturing the "A" flight at the USTA BJK NTC Men's College Invitational. Seeded third, he knocked off Marist's Joe Dube (6-3, 6-3) in the round of 16, then defeated Youngstown State's Silvi Mistreanu (7-6, 2-1, ret.) to reach the semis. Berzins needed three sets to oust NJIT's Andres Alban (6-1, 5-7, 10-4) and advance to the championship match where he knocked off #4 seed Nick Bybel of Bucknell in straight sets (7-5, 6-0). Competing against a loaded field, the junior also reached the quarterfinals of the Princeton/Farnsworth Invite earlier in the month. Teaming with freshman Arnaud Valentin, Berzins advanced to the semifinals at the USTA event and the quarterinals at Princeton.

NEC Men's Tennis Co-Player of the Month

Dana Parziale, Bryant

Sr., Pinehurst, NC/Pinecrest

A three-time All-NEC performer, Parziale comes off a tremendous September that saw him capture singles gold at the Brown Invitational and team up with Ernesto Arquello to win the #1 flight doubles title at the USTA BJK NTC Men's College Invitational. At Brown, Parziale beat Boston U's Jesse Frieder (6-3, 6-3) in the quarterfinals before downing regionally ranked William Spector of Brown (7-6, 0-6, 6-2) in three sets. In the finals, the Pinehurst, NC product defeated reigning MAAC Player of the Year Dalen Klassen of Marist by a 6-3, 6-3 count. Parziale and Arguello won four straight matches en-route to the USTA crown, defeating teams from Marist. Boston College and FDU prior to dropping the Fairfield duo of Cameron Amyot and Ian Tesmond by an 8-6 margin in the finals. On the month, Parziale won seven-of-eight singles matches and went unbeaten in doubles.

NEC Men's Tennis Co-Rookie of the Month

Plamen Avuski, Saint Francis U Fr., Ploydiy, Bulgaria/Math

Avuski advanced to the "F" flight singles final at the USTA BJK NTC Men's College Invitational in Flushing Meadows, NY. He rolled to easy straight set wins over opponents from Monmouth and Bucknell, then ousted third-seeded Scott Bernstein of Bucknell in the semis. In the title match, Avuski took Jordan Lieb of Bucknell to three sets before falling, 3-6, 7-6 (5), 6-4. The Bulgarian native posted a 4-2 singles record in his first month of collegiate competition.

NEC Men's Tennis Co-Rookie of the Month

Jacob Whalley, Fairleigh Dickinson

Fr., Wirral, England

Whalley made his first month of collegiate play a memorable one by advancing to the "B" flight singles final at the USTA BJK NTC Men's College Invitational at the National Tennis Center. Right off the bat he eliminated top-seeded Christian Vieira of Monmouth, 6-1, 6-3, then rolled into the semis with a 6-1, 6-0 win over St. Francis Brooklyn's Francesc Terns-Campius. Whalley then defeated NJIT's Holger Norregaad, 6-1, 6-1, in the semifinals before coming up short, 6-3, 6-1, in the final against third-seeded Sebastian Hagn of Youngstown State.

NEC Women's Tennis Player & Rookie of the Month

Ksenija Tihomirova, Fairleigh Dickinson

Fr., Riga, Latvia

Playing in only her second collegiate tournament, Tihomirova won the "A" flight singles championship at the Bill & Sandra Moore Classic hosted by Navy. She needed to rally for a 4-6, 7-6 (7), 10-5 victory over Navy's Dairen Sears just to reach the quarterfinals, where she had little trouble in a 6-1, 6-2 triumph over Towson's Ayana Dow. Tihomirova advanced to the title match in another three-setter, a 3-6, 6-4, 10-6 win over Air Force's Tiffany Tran. She took care of business in the final, downing Towson's Belen Lizana, 6-2, 6-3. The freshman from Riga, Latvia also reached the guarterfinals of the Stony Brook Classic where she fell to All-NEC honoree Sanne Louwers of LIU Brooklyn in three sets. In doubles, Tihomirova paired up with Mariya Krachok

to advance to the "A" flight doubles quarterfinals at the West Point Invitational, upsetting top-seeded Alexis Casati and Audrey O'Connor of Illinois in the round of 16.

IMPRESSIVE SHOWINGS, TOURNAMENT VICTORIES HIGHLIGHT FIRST MONTH OF NEC TENNIS SEASON

Talk about getting off to a flying start. In a month filled with individual tournament play, NEC tennis competitors won four singles crowns and two doubles titles taking on top regional - and in some cases national - competition.

It should come as no surprise that FDU junior Arvis Berzins (Adazi, Latvia/Riga Centre Language School) walked away with the "A" flight title at the USTA Invitational on September 23. Berzins is coming off two dominant years for the two-time defending NEC champion Knights, winning NEC Player of the Year honors as both a freshman and sophomore. He also took a set from Virginia's Jarmere Jenkins - the nation's #3 ranked player - in the 2013 NCAA Tournament. At the USTA event, he defeated Bucknell's Nick Bybel, 7-5, 6-0, to take the championship and earn NEC Co-Player of the Month honors along with Bryant senior Dana Parziale (Pinehurst, NC/Pinecrest). Parziale, himself a three-time All-NEC honoree, won the singles title at the Brown Invitational, beating 2012-13 MAAC Player of the Year Dalen Klassen (Marist) in the finals, 6-3, 6-3.

Parziale wasn't done there. He teamed with junior Ernesto Arguello (Managua, Nicaragua/American Nicaraguan School) to capture the #1 flight doubles championship at the USTA Invitational. The duo knocked off four teams, including Fairfield's Cameron Amyot and las Tesmond in the finals (8-6) to take the crown.

The Mount St. Mary's pairing of sophomore Peter Salomon (Haymarket, VA/Seton School) and freshman Louis Tonon (Charlotte, NC/Charlotte Latin School) won the "A" doubles flight at the Mount St. Mary's Invitational. Salomon is the brother of former All-NEC standout and current assistant coach Mike Salomon.



On the women's side, Fairleigh Dickinson freshman **Ksenija Tihomirova** (**Riga, Latvia**) appears to be the latest in a long line of top-flight singles players to produce as freshman for the Knights, who have won back-to-back NEC titles. Tihomirova took the "A" flight singles championship at the Bill & Sandra Moore Classic hosted by Navy. She bested Towson's Belen Lizana, 6-2, 6-3, in the finals. For her performance, she was tabbed NEC Player and Rookie of the Month.

Saint Francis U freshman **Taya Zou-bareva** (Lake Bluff, IL/Lake Forest) also made an impressive debut, winning the #4 singles title at the Saint Joseph's Invitational last weekend. She outlasted Drexel's Alex Bell, 6-2, 4-6, 10-7, for the championship.

- New Blood: Both Saint Francis U (men and women) and Wagner (men) enter the 2013-14 campaign under new leadership. Rob Castille recently took over for the reigns for the Red Flash after seven seasons as men's head coach at Duguesne. The Dukes won 71 matches over his final five seasons at the helm. Wagner turned over the keys to former Wake Forest standout Danny Kreyman. Kreyman racked up 105 singles wins (fourth in school history) and 77 doubles victories (tied for tenth) for the Demon Deacons from 2009-13. The All-ACC performer ranked as high as 90th in singles and 53rd in doubles as a senior a year ago.
