NEC/Atlantic TOMORROW'S OFFICE OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

AJ DUFFY, NEW HAVEN

Week 3 Notables:

Duffy became the first player this season to take home multiple NEC/Atlantic Tomorrow's Office Offensive Player of the Week awards as the junior previously earned the distinction following New Haven's first-ever game as a Division I program last month. The Floridian piloted the Chargers to a 24-17 win — their first as a Division I member — at CAA opponent UAlbany on Saturday after he threw for 180 yards, three touchdowns and zero interceptions. Following a field goal on New Haven's first possession, Duffy went to work and led his team to touchdowns on their next three drives, including a 12-yard pass to Matt Chandler, a three-yard dish to Evan Chieca and a 21-yarder to Nikkem Reynolds. Those scores put New Haven up by a comfortable 24-0 cushion with 5:01 left in the first half. Duffy, who leads the league with 125 pass attempts, is tied for first in the conference stats with six touchdowns.

Jean, a sophomore, helped backstop a defense that limited Saint Francis to just one score and negative yardage in the second half in both teams' NEC opener. He stuffed the stat sheet with five tackles and two pass breakups in the 31-7 win, while each of the two turnovers he forced (fumble recovery, interception) led to Blue Devils' scores in his team's fifth-straight win over an NEC opponent.

Godwin's efforts on defense helped New Haven make program history on Saturday. The Garden State product posted 11 tackles, including eight solo stops, to lead the Chargers past UAlbany by a 24-17 final for their first-ever win as a Division I member. In addition, Godwin added one forced fumble and an interception to his stat line. His first pick of the season late in the first quarter, led to a 14-play, 53-yard Chargers' drive in the second quarter that was capped by an Evan Chieca touchdown.

Week 3 Notables:

Hall averaged 15.4 yards per punt return after finishing with 77 on five attempts in Central Connecticut's league-opening win over Saint Francis on Saturday. The only NEC returner to have 100-plus punt return yards to his name with 104 this season, Hall ranks first in the conference in punt returns (7) and average punt return yards (14.9). The defensive back also contributed two tackles to a Blue Devils' defense that held the Red Flash to seven points and negative yardage in the second half. This is his first-ever NEC/Atlantic Tomorrow's Office Special Teams Player of the Week award.

Week 3 Notables:

Johnson was all over the field in LIU's home opener, a heartbreaking 24-21 defeat to Sacred Heart that was decided on a field goal as time expired. The first-year defensive lineman racked up eight tackles, including six solo stops, while adding 4.0 tackles-for-loss, 2.0 sacks and a forced fumble. A native of Wilkes-Barre, PA, Johnson pushed Sacred Heart's offense back 29 yards with his 4.0 tackles-for-loss, which are the most by an NEC player this season and the second-most by a defensive player in the nation this season. He is the first Shark to garner NEC/Atlantic Tomorrow's Office Rookie of the Week distinction this season.

#NECFB PRIME PERFORMERS (WEEK 3)

Elijah Howard, CCSU (RB, Sr)

Howard helped Central Connecticut extend its win streak against NEC opponents to four on Saturday. Totalling 81 all-purpose yards with 52 receiving yards on five catches and 29 rushing yards, the senior running back led the Blue Devils to a 31-7 win over Saint Francis with a pair of touchdown catches.

Christopher Jean, CCSU (DB, So)

Jean was a force to be reckoned with in Central Connecticut's NEC-opening win over Saint Francis on Saturday. The sophomore defensive back anchored a defense that held the Red Flash to negative yardage in the second half after he recorded five tackles, one pick, two pass breakups, a forced fumble and one fumble recovery. Jean also took home NEC/Atlantic Tomorrow's Office Co-Defensive Player of the Week recognition.

Joey Isabella, DUQ (WR, Gr)

For the second time this season, Isabella caught for more than 100 yards in Duquesne's hard-fought defeat to No. 10 Lehigh on Saturday. The graduate wide receiver hauled in eight balls for a career-high 153 yards and a 66-yard touchdown catch, the longest of the season for Duquesne.

Jabari Odoemenem, DUQ (LB, Jr)

Odoemenem posted a game- and career-high 12 tackles to lead Duquesne against No. 10 Lehigh on Saturday. With the performance, the junior linebacker became the first Duke to compile double-digit stops in a game this season.

Naquan Johnson, LIU (DL, Fr)

Johnson had a monstrous game in LIU's home opener against Sacred Heart on Saturday. The rookie defensive lineman registered eight total tackles, including six solo stops, and added 4.0 tackles-for-loss, 2.0 sacks and a forced fumble. Johnson was also pegged the NEC/Atlantic Tomorrow's Office Rookie of the Week.

Adam Urena, MU (QB, Gr)

Urena completed 23-of-44 passes for 280 yards and two touchdowns for Mercyhurst, which held a lead for most of the first half at No. 21 Sacramento State on Saturday. The graduate quarterback has thrown for 200-or-more yards in 15-straight games dating back to the 2023 campaign.

AJ Duffy, NHVN (QB, Jr)

Duffy helped propel New Haven past UAlbany for the program's first-ever victory as a Division I member on Saturday. The junior quarterback threw for three touchdowns and had 180 yards through the air in the 24-17 triumph. Duffy was also named the NEC/Atlantic Tomorrow's Office Offensive Player of the Week.

Liam Godwin, NHVN (DB, Jr)

Godwin had a big outing in New Haven's first win as a Division I program, a 24-17 decision at UAlbany on Saturday. Racking up 11 tackles, the junior defensive back added an interception and one forced fumble in the triumph. Godwin also earned NEC/Atlantic Tomorrow's Office Co-Defensive Player of the Week distinction.

Ethan Shine, RMU (RB, Jr)

Shine ran for a career-high 133 yards on 20 carries and averaged 6.6 yards per rush for Robert Morris, which defeated West Liberty by a 28-14 final on Saturday. The junior running back rounded out the Colonials' scoring with a one-yard run four seconds into the final quarter.

Richard Mosley III, STO (DB, Jr)

In a defensive slugfest at Maine that resulted in a 14-10 Stonehill win, Mosley led the way with eight tackles, including one sack for a loss of 10 yards and 1.5 tackles-for-loss. The junior defensive back helped the Skyhawks limit the Black Bears to just 95 passing yards on the evening.

Jack O'Connell, STO (QB, Sr)

On a 4th-and-21 with 1:45 left to play, O'Connell uncorked a 34-yard pass into the end zone to Brigham Dunphy to erase Stonehill's 10-7 deficit and lead the Skyhawks to the eventual 14-10 win at Maine on Saturday. It marked Stonehill's first-ever win over a CAA squad.

Andre Hines Jr., WC (RB, Gr)

Hines racked up 106 yards on 22 carries to lead Wagner in its home opener against Marist on Saturday. The graduate running back accounted for the Seahawks' lone touchdown of the game and eclipsed the 100-yard rushing yard plateau for the first time this season.

Graduate wide receiver Joey Isabella is the lone NEC wide out to have multiple 100-plus receiving yard games to his name (120 at Pitt; 153 vs. Lehigh).

**LIU SHARKS**

LIU saw its three-game winning streak against Sacred Heart — a rally that dated back to the 2022 campaign — come to an end with Saturday's heartbreaking 24-21 defeat

**MERCYHURST LAKERS**

The lone NEC quarterback to register multiple touchdown throws in each of his three games this season, graduate student Adam Urena ranks second in the FCS with 940 passing yards.

**NEW HAVEN CHARGERS**

New Haven took down CAA opponent UAlbany on the road on Saturday for the program's first-ever victory as a Division I program.

**ROBERT MORRIS COLONIALS**

Head coach Bernard Clark registered his 25th career win at the helm of Robert Morris with the Colonials' 28-14 home-opening win over West Liberty.

**SAINT FRANCIS RED FLASH**

Redshirt sophomore Jahmil Perryman recorded his first career touchdown against Central Connecticut after capping a three-play, 98-yard drive with an eight-yard run into the end zone.

**STONEHILL SKYHAWKS**

Stonehill earned the program's first-ever win over a team from the CAA with Saturday's 13-10 win over Maine at Morse Field at Alford Stadium.

**WAGNER SEAHAWKS**

Wagner boasts the league's top rushing game as the Seahawks are averaging 154.7 yards on the ground per game to rank first in the NEC.

#NECFB TWO-SENTENCE GAME SUMMARIES

CENTRAL CONNECTICUT 31, SAINT FRANCIS 7

Junior running back Donny Marcus ran for two touchdowns and fellow line-mate Elijah Howard, a senior, caught two more to propel Central Connecticut past visiting Saint Francis by a 31-7 final in the first NEC game of 2025. Senior quarterback Brady Olson turned in an impressive performance in the Blue Devils' second-straight win with 193 passing yards, two touchdowns and zero picks.

NEW HAVEN 24, UAlbany 17

Junior quarterback AJ Duffy hit three different receivers with touchdown passes in the first half to help New Haven jump out to a 24-0 lead and pull off the wire-to-wire win at UAlbany, a squad that was a semifinalist in the FCS Playoffs back in 2023. The victory marked the Chargers' first as a Division I program, and the first for first-year head coach Mark Powell.

STONEHILL 13, Maine 10

Senior Jack O'Connell threw a 34-yard bomb to senior wide out Brigham Dunphy with 1:45 remaining in the fourth quarter as Stonehill stunned Maine by a 13-10 final for the program's first-ever win over a CAA squad on Saturday. Sophomore Domenic Scalese notched seven key points for the Skyhawks with a PAT and a pair of field goals from 34 and 25 yards out.

ROBERT MORRIS 28, West Liberty 14

Robert Morris jumped out to a 21-0 lead and never looked back, as the Colonials scored a 28-14 win over West Liberty in their home opener on Saturday. Ethan Shine racked up 133 yards on the ground — the most for an NEC rusher this season — and added a touchdown in the final quarter to pace his team in their first victory of the year.

Sacred Heart 24, LIU 21

LIU's home opener was spoiled by a Sacred Heart field goal that split the uprights and broke a 21-21 deadlock as time expired on Saturday. Receiving another standout performance from two-way quarterback Luca Stanzani, who opened the scoring with a 75-yard touchdown run, the Sharks led by as many as 14 early in the third thanks to a recovery on a fumbled punt in the end zone by rookie defensive back Jaylin Lewis.

#21 Sacramento State 49, MERCYHURST 28

Mercyhurst held the lead for nearly the entire first half at No. 21 Sacramento State but was unable to hold on at the Big Sky power on Saturday evening. Graduate quarterback Adam Urena threw for 280 yards and had multiple touchdown passes (2) for the third time in as many games to pace the Lakers in the 49-28 defeat.

#10 Lehigh 35, DUQUESNE 21

Graduate wide receiver Joey Isabella eclipsed the 100-yard plateau in receiving yards for the second time this season after he hauled in eight balls for 153 yards and a touchdown in Duquesne's 35-21 defeat to Lehigh on Saturday. The Dukes hung around with the 10th-ranked squad in the nation and trailed by just one possession with 12:37 left to play until the Mountain Hawks put the game away with a touchdown at the 7:29 mark of the fourth.

Marist 21, WAGNER 10

Wagner opened its 2025 home slate with a 21-10 defeat to Marist on Saturday. Graduate student Andre Hines Jr. was a bright spot for the Seahawks' offense with his first 100-rushing yard game of the season (106 yards) and his second rushing score in as many games.

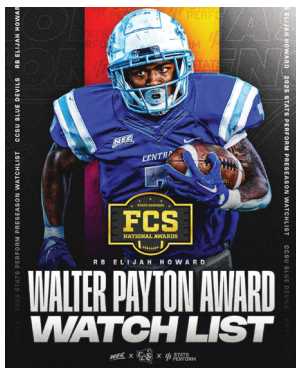
WALTER PAYTON AWARD WATCH LIST

Elijah Howard who became the first Blue Devil in five years to pocket the NEC Offensive Player of the Year honor in 2024, rushed for five touchdowns in the final four games of the regular season to elevate his season total to eight and lead the Blue Devils to the NEC title. On the year, Howard was the NEC's second leading rusher after he covered 934 yards on 228 carries to average of 84.9 yards per game.

Throwing for 921 yards and six touchdowns with just two picks, 2024 All-NEC second teamer **Ethan Greenwood** was a dynamic jack-of-all-trades and offensive triple threat as he added five rushing scores and a pair of touchdown receptions. With 913 yards on the ground for 76.1 rushing yards per game, Greenwood led all NEC quarterbacks in both categories while his running game, which had him ranked among the nation's top 50 at season's end, was third-best among all FCS quarterbacks in 2024.

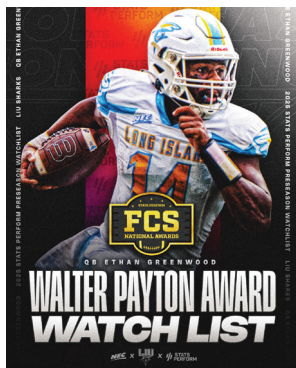
BUCK BUCHANAN AWARD WATCH LIST

Duquesne defensive lineman **Jack Dunkley** is coming off a breakout sophomore campaign that culminated in the Keystone State product earning a spot on the All-NEC First Team. He racked up 27.0 tackles, including 12.5 for a loss of 76 yards, while adding 9.5 sacks, eight quarterback hurries and a league-leading three forced fumbles in 11 appearances. Dunkley's TFL and sacks marks were both tied for tops in the NEC, while his 0.86 sacks per game ranked him 11th among all FCS ballers last year.

2024: NEC FOOTBALL MAKES THE NATION TAKE NOTICE

From wins over nationally-ranked programs and FBS squads, to viral moments that caught the country by storm, Northeast Conference (NEC) football without a doubt expanded its outreach in 2024. The bar has been set for NEC football, and it will only continue to go up from here.

DANCING WITH THE DEVILS

The 2024 campaign made for a comeback story unlike any other.

Dropping six-of-seven games against league foes, Central Connecticut found itself at the bottom of the NEC standings at season's end in 2023.

Expectations for the Blue Devils weren't exactly high either, as they were selected to finish last in the preseason coaches poll, a position that left plenty of room to prove all the doubters wrong.

Fast forward to November 23 — three-hundred and seventy-one days after the conclusion of last season to be exact — and Central Connecticut did just that. This time, when the final horn of the regular season sounded at Arute Field, the Blue Devils were hoisting the NEC trophy in celebration of their first title since 2019.

The road to the Blue Devils' seventh banner-raising season was not an easy one, though.

Keeping its title hopes alive with a thrilling Week 12 double-overtime win over Robert Morris, Central Connecticut forced a winner-take-all championship game in the regular season finale with then-undefeated and nationally-ranked Duquesne.

Behind a defensive effort unlike any other that featured seven picks, the Blue Devils took care of business against the Dukes and secured the NEC's AQ to the NCAA FCS Playoffs with a 21-14 victory.

A SALUTE TO THE ALL-AMERICANS

Three NEC all-stars added All-America distinction from Stats Perform to their already impressive résumés.

Central Connecticut senior defensive back Kimal Clark and LIU redshirt sophomore quarterback Ethan Greenwood each earned spots on the organization's All-America Third Team. The 2024 NEC co-champion Blue Devils doubled their All-America honorees when first-year defensive back Christopher Jean was named to the Freshman All-America Team.

Clark became the first Blue Devil baller to take home All-America distinction since 2018, while with Greenwood's selection, LIU has landed three honorees in the past two years.



In addition, Clark and Central Connecticut senior offensive lineman Alec Ambrosia each garnered FCS Associated Press All-America Honorable Mention honors from the organization.

NATIONAL WEEKLY RECOGNITION

The NEC was well-represented on the Stats Perform weekly award front in 2024.

Saint Francis U place kicker Mac Plummer became the first NEC player to garner national recognition when he was named the FedEx Ground FCS National Special Teams Player of the Week on Sept. 9. The redshirt junior kicked the go-ahead 50-yard field goal in a win at FBS opponent Kent State as part of an 11-point effort.

One week later, Central Connecticut punter Aidan Clark made it back-to-back FedEx Ground FCS National Special Teams Player of the Week honors for the NEC. The senior averaged 51.7 yards per boot in a win over Saint Francis U that featured an NEC-record-tying 84-yard punt.



Robert Morris rounded out the NEC's national weekly awards at the conclusion of Week 10. The Colonials earned FedEx FCS National Team of the Week distinction from Stats Perform after they defeated Merrimack by a 6-0 final to become the first FCS team since 2022 to win a game with fewer than 10 points. It marked Robert Morris' NEC-leading third shutout of the season.

NEC SQUADS LAND NOTEWORTHY WINS

Two Keystone State teams inked their names in the NEC recordbooks with milestone wins in 2024.

Saint Francis U made Kent State see Red (Flash) on Week 2 with a 23-17 road triumph on Sept. 7. It marked the Red Flash's first-ever victory over an FBS opponent in program history, and the second win against the upper tier of Division I in NEC history.



One week later, it was Duquesne's time to turn the trick. The Dukes went into Arnold D. Stambaugh Stadium and upended No. 20/21 Youngstown State by a 28-25 final for the NEC's first win over a nationally-ranked opponent since 2021. It marked the first time ever that Duquesne knocked off a Top-25 foe.

SIX NATIONAL FINALISTS

The Northeast Conference was home to six national finalists in the Stats Perform FCS Legacy Awards Program. Central Connecticut stole the show with five honorees.



WALTER PAYTON AWARD

(Top Offensive Player)

Elijah Howard, Central Connecticut
Junior, Running Back

Howard was second in the NEC in rushing with 84.9 yards per game. In his final four regular season games — all of which were wins — he rushed for five touchdowns to bring his season total to eight.

BUCK BUCHANAN AWARD

(Top Defensive Player)

Kimal Clark, Central Connecticut
Junior, Defensive Back

Clark posted a career-best 117 tackles and finished 26th in the FCS with 9.0 stops per contest. The junior registered five games with 10-or-more tackles, including 18 at FBS opponent UMass.

JERRY RICE AWARD

(Top Freshman Player)

Charles Battaglia, Stonehill
Sophomore, Linebacker

Battaglia finished second among fellow Skyhawks with 70 tackles, a number that led all NEC rookies and was eighth overall. He added 31 solo tackles, 3.0 TFL, one interception and a forced fumble.

Christopher Jean, Central Connecticut
Redshirt Freshman, Defensive Back

Jean registered three picks — the most by an FCS player in 2024-25 — in a key win vs. Robert Morris. He led the NEC in fumble recoveries and interceptions while ranking second in forced fumbles.

Dan Toatley, Central Connecticut
Senior, Defensive Lineman

Graduating with a 3.56 GPA and a degree in Criminology, Toatley selflessly donated bone marrow to a patient in need as part of a bone marrow drive sponsored by the Blue Devils' football team.

EDDIE ROBINSON AWARD

(Top Coach)

Adam Lechtenberg, Central Connecticut

In his second year at the helm, Lechtenberg piloted the Blue Devils to their first NEC title — and the program's first winning season — since 2019. It marked Central Connecticut's seventh league crown.

DUKES' RUN IN THE RANKINGS!

Duquesne became a regular in both the Stats Perform and the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Top-25 Polls in 2024.

With a résumé that included a win at No. 20/21 Youngstown State and a perfect record against FCS competitors, Duquesne turned heads midway through the year and were consistently receiving votes in both national top-25 polls for seven-straight weeks.

The Dukes' win over Mercyhurst on November 2 — their sixth-straight against an FCS opponent — is what vaulted the program into the national rankings for the first time since April 5, 2021.

It marked the second time that the Dukes were ranked in both polls at the same time since joining the NEC. In addition, Duquesne became the first NEC squad to appear in the rankings since Sacred Heart landed a spot in the final poll of the Spring 2021 campaign.

In their season debut in the national rankings, the Dukes checked in at No. 24 in the AFCA Coaches Poll presented by Hudl and No. 25 in the Stats Perform Poll.

Things only went up from there, though.



Duquesne, which established a long-term residency in both national polls, continued to climb the rankings.

Moving up to No. 21 and No. 22, respectively, in the AFCA and Stats Perform polls the following week, the Dukes rose to the program's highest ranking ever (No. 19) in both Week 12 polls after they scored their eighth-straight win and clinched a share of the NEC regular season title for the second straight year.

At season's end, Duquesne made it four-straight appearances in both national polls from Week 9 to Week 12, which tied the second-longest rally in league history.

MetLife Stadium in East Rutherford, NJ was home to the Northeast Conference's annual Football Social Media Day once again in 2024.

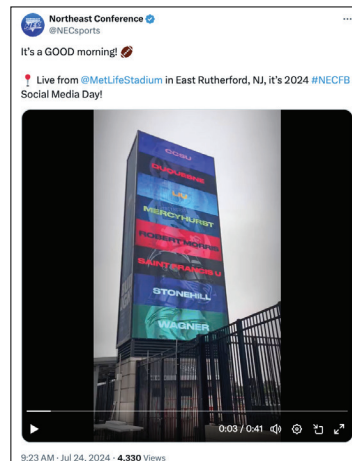
For a second consecutive year, the residence of the NFL's Giants and Jets was the backdrop for the event, which serves as the conference's unofficial kickoff to the brand new season.



The red carpet was rolled out, and all eyes were on the league's top returning ballers and head coaches.

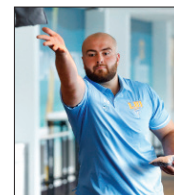

#NECFB VIRAL MOMENTS LEAD TO NATIONAL EXPOSURE

Northeast Conference ballers produced some incredibly impressive plays on the gridiron that not only dazzled the conference's loyal fan base; they also caught the eye of several nationally-known media outlets.

Robert Morris defensive back Rob Carter Jr. wasted no time in taking over the national spotlight. The Colonials' senior orchestrated what was appropriately pegged the "Interception of the Year" — in Week 1 — when he made an acrobatic, one-handed pick at Utah State. The unbelievable play, which immediately went viral on social media and landed the No. 1 spot on ESPN's SportsCenter's Top-10 Countdown, was the talk of the town days later. Earning airtime on ESPN's Pat McAfee Show and ABC's Good Morning America with Michael Strahan, Carter's interception also earned the best play on ESPN's Sunday NFL Countdown "You Got Mossed" segment, which resulted in the Bobby Mo veteran defender earning a pair of signed custom gloves from NFL Hall of Famer Randy Moss.

LIU got in on the action as well when the Sharks perfectly executed the "tush push" in a non-conference tilt against Sacred Heart. Ethan Greenwood used a little help from his friends on fourth-and-inches to break through the pile and score a 55-yard rushing touchdown. Featured on USA Today's website, Greenwood's untraditional score was the No. 1 play on SportsCenter's Top-10 that night.

Graduate wide receiver John Erby and senior quarterback Darius Perrantes teamed up to deliver a touchdown against Wagner that turned heads and earned national recognition as well. With two defenders in the end zone, Erby made a spectacular one-handed catch for a score in the Duquesne win. In addition to taking the No. 3 slot on the SportsCenter Top-10 countdown, Perrantes earned a coveted "helmet sticker" on ESPN College Football Final.
