Week 2 Notables:

With starting QB Ethan Greenwood going down in the first half with an injury at Eastern Michigan on Saturday, Stanzani answered the call and piloted LIU to the program's first-ever win over an FBS squad. Entering the game with a 14-10 lead at the 7:19 mark of the second quarter thanks to a pair of rushing scores from Greenwood, the Floridian followed in the footsteps of his fellow signal caller and ran for two touchdowns in the fourth quarter to secure the win. His first score came after LIU's defense forced a turnover on downs on a 4th-and-1 on the Eagles' 14-yard line. On the first play of the ensuing drive, Stanzani ran into the end zone untouched to extend the lead to 21-10 with 12:12 to go. Later in the stanza, he capped a 75-yard, 16-play drive that chewed up 9:44 of game time with a two-yard rushing touchdown. In the Sharks' 28-23 win, Stanzani showed off his versatility by going 12-of-18 for 143 passing yards while adding 69 rushing yards on 10 carries and a 74-yard reception.

Week 2 Notables:

Fasolino balled out on defense at Eastern Michigan on Saturday, and thanks to his clutch performance, LIU made history by scoring the program's first-ever victory over a FBS squad. In addition, the 28-23 defeat of the Eagles marked the fourth FCS-over-FBS win of the 2025 campaign, and the third in NEC history. Fasolino registered eight total tackles, including five solo stops, and added one pass breakup for the Sharks. Six of the Montrose, NY native's tackles came in a second half that saw LIU preserve its 14-10 halftime lead and hold on for the wire-to-wire win. Highlighting that stretch was a huge tackle on an Eagles' 4th-and-1 that forced a turnover on downs deep in Eastern Michigan territory in the final quarter. That stop resulted in a 14-yard rushing touchdown run by Sharks' signal caller Luca Stanzani on the first play of the ensuing drive that extended the visiting team's lead to 21-10 with 12:11 remaining on the clock.

Week 2 Notables:

Jenkins ran it back as the NEC/Atlantic Tomorrow's Office Special Teams Player of the Week after a busy — and impressive — Saturday at Youngstown State. The versatile left-footed kicker/punter averaged 42.2 yards per punt and 64.8 yards per kickoff after launching the ball 253 and 259 yards, respectively. Registering a 52-yard long punt while placing one inside the 20-yard marker, Jenkins was perfect in his lone field goal attempt, a 46-yarder that went down as a career-best boot for the graduate student. A local product of Monroeville, PA, he became the first NEC player to repeat as the league's Special Teams Player of the Week since LIU's Will Lynch closed out the 2022 campaign with back-to-back honors. In addition, Jenkins is the first Robert Morris special teams' member to turn the weekly award trick in consecutive weeks since Dante Satcher accomplished the feat in 2015.

Week 2 Notables:

Gamble made program history by becoming Mercyhurst's first-ever NEC/Atlantic Tomorrow's Office Rookie of the Week honoree. The rookie running back netted 67 all-purpose yards on Saturday to help propel the Lakers past NEC newcomer New Haven by a commanding 48-14 final. A native of Canton, OH, Gamble was Mercyhurst's second leading rusher on the afternoon with 53 yards on 10 carries. He contributed 23 yards on the ground — including a big 15-yard gain on the opening play of a third-quarter 54-yard drive that resulted in the Lakers' sixth touchdown of the day. Later in the quarter, Gamble strung together back-to-back 10-yard rushes to fuel another scoring drive — an 11-play series — that began on Mercyhurst's own 22-yard line. He added 14 receiving yards on one catch in the win.

#NECFB PRIME PERFORMERS (WEEK 2)

Brady Olson, CCSU (QB, Sr)

Completing 15-of-21 passes, Olson racked up 247 passing yards and a pair of touchdowns — including a season-long 54-yard touchdown throw to sophomore running back Donny Marcus — with zero interceptions in Central Connecticut's home-opening win over AIC on Saturday. The senior reached his second-highest yardage total as a Blue Devil after he hit 10 different receivers in the 27-point triumph.

Malachi Wright, CCSU (LB, Sr)

Wright anchored a CCSU defensive performance that did not allow an offensive touchdown for the third-straight home opener on Saturday. Finishing as the leading tackler of the game with nine stops (3 solo), the veteran linebacker forced a fumble while recording 3.0 tackles-for-loss and a career-high 2.5 sacks in the 34-7 triumph over AIC.

Tyler Riddell, DUQ (QB, Gr)

Riddell, a graduate transfer from Gardner-Webb, accounted for 239 passing yards and a whopping five touchdowns in Duquesne's home-opening 55-14 win over visiting Lincoln (PA) on Saturday. He completed 15-of-20 passes (75.0 completion percentage), tied his career-best effort in touchdown passes and led the Dukes to scores on each of their six first-half drives in his first home start.

Rafael Fasolino, LIU (LB, Gr)

Fasolino anchored an impressive LIU defensive performance at Eastern Michigan that led to the program's first-ever win over an FBS squad on Saturday. The graduate linebacker registered one pass breakup and eight tackles, including a key stop on a 4th-and-1 deep in Eagles' territory that resulted in a pivotal Sharks' touchdown on the first play of the ensuing drive.

Ethan Greenwood, LIU (QB, R-Jr)

Greenwood was stellar prior to being sidelined with an injury in the first half in LIU's first-ever win against an FBS opponent on Saturday. Rushing for 91 yards and a pair of touchdowns — a 65-yard run that opened the scoring on the evening and a 2-yard scamper that made it a 14-3 LIU lead — on seven carries, the dynamic quarterback also shredded Eastern Michigan's defense by going 3-of-5 for 105 yards through the air.

Luca Stanzani, LIU (QB, R-Jr)

Replacing fellow signal caller Ethan Greenwood, who suffered an injury in the second quarter at Eastern Michigan, Stanzani rushed for a pair of clutch touchdowns in the fourth stanza to lead LIU to the program's first-ever win over an FBS squad on Saturday. The redshirt junior went 12-of-18 for 143 passing yards while adding 69 rushing yards and a 74-yard reception in the 28-23 victory.

Dylan Evans, MU (WR, R-So)

Evans racked up a game-high 257 receiving yards on seven catches and ran for an eight-yard touchdown in Mercyhurst's 48-14 win over NEC newcomer New Haven on Saturday. The redshirt sophomore wideout has compiled 252 yards on 14 receptions for 126.0 receiving yards per game this season, all of which are league-leading marks.

Brian Trobel, MU (RB, Sr)

In Mercyhurst's 48-14 home-opening win over New Haven, the newest member of the NEC, Trobel ran for three touchdowns, including consecutive scores within a 3:12 stretch in the third quarter. Finishing the afternoon with a game-high 114 yards on the ground, the senior running back is ranked first in the conference in rushing yards (154), rushing yards per game (77.0) and rushing touchdowns (3).

Adam Urena, MU (QB, Gr)

For the second time in as many weeks, Urena threw for 300-or-more passing yards in Saturday's 48-14 home win against New Haven on Saturday. Completing 78.6 percent of his passes after going 22-of-28, the graduate quarterback, who tops the NEC charts in completion percentage (71.7 percent), passing yards (658), passing yards per game (329.0) and efficiency (155.9), compiled 347 yards through the air with a pair of touchdowns and zero interceptions in the victory.

Geno Calgaro, SFU (LB, So)

For the second time this season, Calgaro finished in double figures in tackles after he paced the Saint Francis defense with a career-best 15 — including seven solo stops — against FBS opponent Buffalo on Saturday. Adding two tackles-for-loss, the sophomore linebacker has put up twin figures in tackles in four of his past five outings, including each of his last three dating back to last season's finale.

Tyler Bannon, STO (LB, Sr)

Bannon stuffed the stat sheet with eight tackles (4 solo) and 2.0 tackles-for-loss in Stonehill's non-conference tilt at Lafayette on Saturday. The senior linebacker also forced a fumble that led to teammates Richard Mosley III's 90-yard fumble return for a touchdown, which marked the Skyhawks' first 70-plus-yard fumble return for a score since 2009.

#NECFB SLANT ROUTES

**CENTRAL CONNECTICUT BLUE DEVILS**

The Blue Devils have scored 111 points in home openers under third-year head coach Adam Lechtenberg and are 3-0 in those games after outscoring the opposition by a 111-10 margin.

**DUQUESNE DUKES**

Duquesne scored a win in its home opener for the 18th-straight season on Saturday when the Dukes handed Lincoln (PA) a 55-14 defeat at Rooney Field.

**LIU SHARKS**

LIU quarterbacks Ethan Greenwood and Luca Stanzani rushed for two touchdowns apiece to lead the Sharks to the program's first-ever win vs. an FBS squad on Saturday at Eastern Michigan.

**MERCYHURST LAKERS**

Grad student Adam Urena threw for 300-plus yards vs. a Division I opponent for the third time in his career, and the second time this season, after recording 344 yards against New Haven.

**NEW HAVEN CHARGERS**

Joshua Tracey scored on a 16-yard catch in New Haven's first game against an NEC opponent on Saturday (Mercyhurst) to make it back-to-back contests with at least one touchdown reception.

**ROBERT MORRIS COLONIALS**

Registering two touchdown passes vs. Youngstown State, Zach Tanner has thrown for multiple scores in two of last three games, dating back to last year's regular-season finale against Stonehill.

**SAINT FRANCIS RED FLASH**

For the first time in program history, Saint Francis has opened a season with consecutive FBS opponents in Louisiana-Monroe and Buffalo.

**STONEHILL SKYHAWKS**

Junior defensive back Richard Mosley III became the first Stonehill player since 2009 to return a fumble 70-or-more yards for a touchdown (90 yards) Saturday against Lafayette.

**WAGNER SEAHAWKS**

Wagner, which faced a two-plus hour weather delay in Washington, D.C. on Saturday, did not trail at Georgetown until the 3:28 mark of the third quarter.

#NECFB TWO-SENTENCE GAME SUMMARIES

LIU 28, Eastern Michigan 24

LIU pulled off the fourth FCS-over-FBS win of the season — and the third in NEC history — on Saturday night with a stifling 28-23 win at Eastern Michigan. The Sharks, who never trailed in the contest, secured the program's first-ever win against an FBS squad after receiving two rushing scores from starting quarterback Ethan Greenwood and a pair of rushing touchdowns from backup signal caller junior Luca Stanzani.

MERCYHURST 48, NEW HAVEN 14

Senior Brian Trobel's first of three touchdown rushes with 5:16 left in the quarter sparked a 41-0 run that propelled Mercyhurst to a 38-14 win over New Haven, the newest member of the NEC, on Saturday in Erie. Senior quarterback Adam Urena surpassed the 300-yard plateau for the second straight game (344 yards) as the Lakers held a commanding 647-230 advantage in total yardage.

Georgetown 31, WAGNER 20

Wagner led for the entire first half and then some but was unable to hold on at Georgetown as the Seahawks dropped a 31-20 decision on Saturday. The Hoyas took their first lead of the game on a 55-yard punt return touchdown in the third quarter, but after Wagner responded and tied up the game with a 75-yard drive capped by a 1-yard score by graduate student Andre Hines, the home team broke the deadlock and took the lead for good on the ensuing drive.

DUQUESNE 55, Lincoln (PA) 14

An all-around team effort featuring seven different touchdown scores led Duquesne to a 55-14 win over Lincoln (PA) on Saturday in the Dukes' first home contest of the 2025 campaign. Preseason All-NEC selection grad student Joey Isabella led the way with a pair touchdown catches from grad student Tyler Riddell, who completed 15-of-20 passes for 239 yards and five touchdowns.

CENTRAL CONNECTICUT 34, AIC 7

Central Connecticut took down visiting AIC by a 34-17 final on Saturday, marking the third time in as many seasons that the Blue Devils scored a victory in their home opener. The Blue Devils answered a Yellow Jackets score with 10:28 left in the second half with four-straight touchdowns, including consecutive rushing scores from sophomore Donny Marcus, and a field goal to lock up the win.

Lafayette 42, STONEHILL 26

The Skyhawks mounted a comeback against Lafayette at W.B. Mason Stadium, closing out the game with three-straight scores, but it wasn't enough to overcome a 42-6 third-quarter deficit on Saturday. Junior defensive back Richard Mosley III highlighted the afternoon when he recovered a fumble and returned it 90 yards to the house for the final score of the game with 6:41 left to play.

Youngstown State 56, ROBERT MORRIS 17

Youngstown State dominated the scoreboard through the first three quarters to coast to a 56-17 win over visiting Robert Morris on Saturday. Redshirt junior Zach Turner helped put the Colonials on the board in the final quarter with a 34-yard touchdown throw to senior Thomas Lee and a 16-yarder to redshirt senior Kai Holloway.

Buffalo 45, SAINT FRANCIS 6

Buffalo's rushers racked up 370 yards and five touchdowns to score a 45-6 win over Saint Francis on Saturday afternoon. Redshirt sophomore Jordan Theodore led the Red Flash against the FBS foe with his first career touchdown in the final quarter.

- The Blue Devils have gone 3-0 in home openers under head coach Adam Lechtenberg and have outscored the opposition by a 111-10 margin in those contests.
- Averaging 1.25 sacks per game after delivering a career-high 2.5 in Central Connecticut's win over AIC on Saturday, senior Malachi Wright is seventh in the nation in the category.

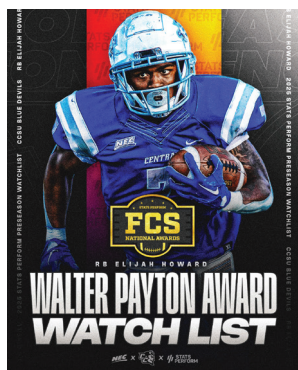
WALTER PAYTON AWARD WATCH LIST

Elijah Howard who became the first Blue Devil in five years to pocket the NEC Offensive Player of the Year honor in 2024, rushed for five touchdowns in the final four games of the regular season to elevate his season total to eight and lead the Blue Devils to the NEC title. On the year, Howard was the NEC's second leading rusher after he covered 934 yards on 228 carries to average of 84.9 yards per game.

Throwing for 921 yards and six touchdowns with just two picks, 2024 All-NEC second teamer **Ethan Greenwood** was a dynamic jack-of-all-trades and offensive triple threat as he added five rushing scores and a pair of touchdown receptions. With 913 yards on the ground for 76.1 rushing yards per game, Greenwood led all NEC quarterbacks in both categories while his running game, which had him ranked among the nation's top 50 at season's end, was third-best among all FCS quarterbacks in 2024.

BUCK BUCHANAN AWARD WATCH LIST

Duquesne defensive lineman **Jack Dunkley** is coming off a breakout sophomore campaign that culminated in the Keystone State product earning a spot on the All-NEC First Team. He racked up 27.0 tackles, including 12.5 for a loss of 76 yards, while adding 9.5 sacks, eight quarterback hurries and a league-leading three forced fumbles in 11 appearances. Dunkley's TFL and sacks marks were both tied for tops in the NEC, while his 0.86 sacks per game ranked him 11th among all FCS ballers last year.

2024- NEC FOOTBALL MAKES THE NATION TAKE NOTICE

From wins over nationally-ranked programs and FBS squads, to viral moments that caught the country by storm, Northeast Conference (NEC) football without a doubt expanded its outreach in 2024. The bar has been set for NEC football, and it will only continue to go up from here.

DANCING WITH THE DEVILS

The 2024 campaign made for a comeback story unlike any other.

Dropping six-of-seven games against league foes, Central Connecticut found itself at the bottom of the NEC standings at season's end in 2023.

Expectations for the Blue Devils weren't exactly high either, as they were selected to finish last in the preseason coaches poll, a position that left plenty of room to prove all the doubters wrong.

Fast forward to November 23 — three-hundred and seventy-one days after the conclusion of last season to be exact — and Central Connecticut did just that. This time, when the final horn of the regular season sounded at Arute Field, the Blue Devils were hoisting the NEC trophy in celebration of their first title since 2019.

The road to the Blue Devils' seventh banner-raising season was not an easy one, though.

Keeping its title hopes alive with a thrilling Week 12 double-overtime win over Robert Morris, Central Connecticut forced a winner-take-all championship game in the regular season finale with then-undefeated and nationally-ranked Duquesne.

Behind a defensive effort unlike any other that featured seven picks, the Blue Devils took care of business against the Dukes and secured the NEC's AQ to the NCAA FCS Playoffs with a 21-14 victory.

A SALUTE TO THE ALL-AMERICANS

Three NEC all-stars added All-America distinction from Stats Perform to their already impressive résumés.

Central Connecticut senior defensive back Kimal Clark and LIU redshirt sophomore quarterback Ethan Greenwood each earned spots on the organization's All-America Third Team. The 2024 NEC co-champion Blue Devils doubled their All-America honorees when first-year defensive back Christopher Jean was named to the Freshman All-America Team.

Clark became the first Blue Devil baller to take home All-America distinction since 2018, while with Greenwood's selection, LIU has landed three honorees in the past two years.



In addition, Clark and Central Connecticut senior offensive lineman Alec Ambrosia each garnered FCS Associated Press All-America Honorable Mention honors from the organization.

NATIONAL WEEKLY RECOGNITION

The NEC was well-represented on the Stats Perform weekly award front in 2024.

Saint Francis U place kicker Mac Plummer became the first NEC player to garner national recognition when he was named the FedEx Ground FCS National Special Teams Player of the Week on Sept. 9. The redshirt junior kicked the go-ahead 50-yard field goal in a win at FBS opponent Kent State as part of an 11-point effort.

One week later, Central Connecticut punter Aidan Clark made it back-to-back FedEx Ground FCS National Special Teams Player of the Week honors for the NEC. The senior averaged 51.7 yards per boot in a win over Saint Francis U that featured an NEC-record-tying 84-yard punt.



Robert Morris rounded out the NEC's national weekly awards at the conclusion of Week 10. The Colonials earned FedEx FCS National Team of the Week distinction from Stats Perform after they defeated Merrimack by a 6-0 final to become the first FCS team since 2022 to win a game with fewer than 10 points. It marked Robert Morris' NEC-leading third shutout of the season.

NEC SQUADS LAND NOTEWORTHY WINS

Two Keystone State teams inked their names in the NEC recordbooks with milestone wins in 2024.

Saint Francis U made Kent State see Red (Flash) on Week 2 with a 23-17 road triumph on Sept. 7. It marked the Red Flash's first-ever victory over an FBS opponent in program history, and the second win against the upper tier of Division I in NEC history.



One week later, it was Duquesne's time to turn the trick. The Dukes went into Arnold D. Stambaugh Stadium and upended No. 20/21 Youngstown State by a 28-25 final for the NEC's first win over a nationally-ranked opponent since 2021. It marked the first time ever that Duquesne knocked off a Top-25 foe.

SIX NATIONAL FINALISTS

The Northeast Conference was home to six national finalists in the Stats Perform FCS Legacy Awards Program. Central Connecticut stole the show with five honorees.



WALTER PAYTON AWARD

(Top Offensive Player)

Elijah Howard, Central Connecticut

Howard was second in the NEC in rushing with 84.9 yards per game. In his final four regular season games — all of which were wins — he rushed for five touchdowns to bring his season total to eight.

BUCK BUCHANAN AWARD

Kimal Clark, Central Connecticut
Junior, Defensive Back

Clark posted a career-best 117 tackles and finished 26th in the FCS with 9.0 stops per contest. The junior registered five games with 10-or-more tackles, including 18 at FBS opponent UMass.

JERRY RICE AWARD

Charles Battaglia, Stonehill
Sophomore, Linebacker

Battaglia finished second among fellow Skyhawks with 70 tackles, a number that led all NEC rookies and was eighth overall. He added 31 solo tackles, 3.0 TFL, one interception and a forced fumble.

Christopher Jean, Central Connecticut
Redshirt Freshman, Defensive Back

Jean registered three picks — the most by an FCS player in 2024-25 — in a key win vs. Robert Morris. He led the NEC in fumble recoveries and interceptions while ranking second in forced fumbles.

Graduating with a 3.56 GPA and a degree in Criminology, Toatley selflessly donated bone marrow to a patient in need as part of a bone marrow drive sponsored by the Blue Devils' football team.

EDDIE ROBINSON AWARD

(Top Coach)

Adam Lechtenberg, Central Connecticut

In his second year at the helm, Lechtenberg piloted the Blue Devils to their first NEC title — and the program's first winning season — since 2019. It marked Central Connecticut's seventh league crown.

DUKES' RUN IN THE RANKINGS!

Duquesne became a regular in both the Stats Perform and the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Top-25 Polls in 2024.

With a résumé that included a win at No. 20/21 Youngstown State and a perfect record against FCS competitors, Duquesne turned heads midway through the year and were consistently receiving votes in both national top-25 polls for seven-straight weeks.

The Dukes' win over Mercyhurst on November 2 — their sixth-straight against an FCS opponent — is what vaulted the program into the national rankings for the first time since April 5, 2021.

It marked the second time that the Dukes were ranked in both polls at the same time since joining the NEC. In addition, Duquesne became the first NEC squad to appear in the rankings since Sacred Heart landed a spot in the final poll of the Spring 2021 campaign.

In their season debut in the national rankings, the Dukes checked in at No. 24 in the AFCA Coaches Poll presented by Hudl and No. 25 in the Stats Perform Poll.

Things only went up from there, though.



Duquesne, which established a long-term residency in both national polls, continued to climb the rankings.

Moving up to No. 21 and No. 22, respectively, in the AFCA and Stats Perform polls the following week, the Dukes rose to the program's highest ranking ever (No. 19) in both Week 12 polls after they scored their eighth-straight win and clinched a share of the NEC regular season title for the second straight year.

At season's end, Duquesne made it four-straight appearances in both national polls from Week 9 to Week 12, which tied the second-longest rally in league history.

MetLife Stadium in East Rutherford, NJ was home to the Northeast Conference's annual Football Social Media Day once again in 2024.

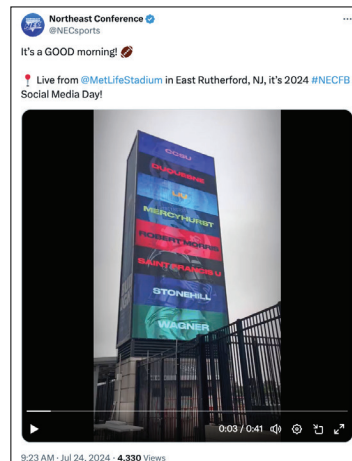
For a second consecutive year, the residence of the NFL's Giants and Jets was the backdrop for the event, which serves as the conference's unofficial kickoff to the brand new season.



The red carpet was rolled out, and all eyes were on the league's top returning ballers and head coaches.

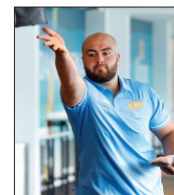

#NECFB VIRAL MOMENTS LEAD TO NATIONAL EXPOSURE

Northeast Conference ballers produced some incredibly impressive plays on the gridiron that not only dazzled the conference's loyal fan base; they also caught the eye of several nationally-known media outlets.

Robert Morris defensive back Rob Carter Jr. wasted no time in taking over the national spotlight. The Colonials' senior orchestrated what was appropriately pegged the "Interception of the Year" — in Week 1 — when he made an acrobatic, one-handed pick at Utah State. The unbelievable play, which immediately went viral on social media and landed the No. 1 spot on ESPN's SportsCenter's Top-10 Countdown, was the talk of the town days later. Earning airtime on ESPN's Pat McAfee Show and ABC's Good Morning America with Michael Strahan, Carter's interception also earned the best play on ESPN's Sunday NFL Countdown "You Got Mossed" segment, which resulted in the Bobby Mo veteran defender earning a pair of signed custom gloves from NFL Hall of Famer Randy Moss.

LIU got in on the action as well when the Sharks perfectly executed the "tush push" in a non-conference tilt against Sacred Heart. Ethan Greenwood used a little help from his friends on fourth-and-inches to break through the pile and score a 55-yard rushing touchdown. Featured on USA Today's website, Greenwood's untraditional score was the No. 1 play on SportsCenter's Top-10 that night.

Graduate wide receiver John Erby and senior quarterback Darius Perrantes teamed up to deliver a touchdown against Wagner that turned heads and earned national recognition as well. With two defenders in the end zone, Erby made a spectacular one-handed catch for a score in the Duquesne win. In addition to taking the No. 3 slot on the SportsCenter Top-10 countdown, Perrantes earned a coveted "helmet sticker" on ESPN College Football Final.
