Craig Bagnell carried the University of Mary to a 31-25 win over Augustana, throwing for a career-high 407 yards and four scores. The junior signal caller completed 30-of-49 pass attempts and threw just one pick. The total attempts and completions are career highs for Bagnell and the touchdown passes equals his best figure. The U-Mary team captain completed passes to eight different receivers and his touch-

down tosses were spread among three different players. Bagnell became just the third Marauders quarterback to pass for more than 5,000 yards in his career.... Tyler Steffan (WR, 6-4, 210, Sr., Dickinson, ND / Dickinson) caught 10 passes for 154 yards and two scores. This is the second straight week he had reached triple digits in receiving yardage.






