

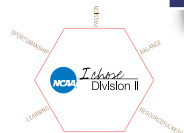

## NSIC OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK



### **#4 Craig Bagnell (QB, 5-10, 185, Jr., Polson, Mont. / Polson HS) University of Mary**

Craig Bagnell carried the University of Mary to a 31-25 win over Augustana, throwing for a career-high 407 yards and four scores. The junior signal caller completed 30-of-49 pass attempts and threw just one pick. The total attempts and completions are career highs for Bagnell and the touchdown passes equals his best figure. The U-Mary team captain completed passes to eight different receivers and his touchdown tosses were spread among three different players. Bagnell became just the third Marauders quarterback to pass for more than 5,000 yards in his career.... Tyler Steffan (WR, 6-4, 210, Sr., Dickinson, ND / Dickinson) caught 10 passes for 154 yards and two scores. This is the second straight week he had reached triple digits in receiving yardage.

Zach Pulkinen (P/K, 5-11, 205, Jr., Minot, N.D. / College of Idaho) totaled four points, averaged 61.3 kickoff yards and 32.2 punting yards in the 38-10 loss at Minnesota State Sept. 8. He posted 184 yards on three kicks off the tee with two traveling out of the end zone for touchbacks. He punted four times to total 129 yards and placed one punt inside the 20-yard line. Pulkinen hit on his only field goal attempt of the game from 27 yards and was 1-for-1 on point after attempts.

Bemidji State fumbled six times (five lost) in the 38-10 loss at Minnesota State Saturday, handing the Mavericks 24 points off turnovers - 17 of which put the Beavers in a 17-0 first quarter hole. The loss moved BSU to 1-1 overall and 1-1 in NSIC play. The Beavers are home Sept. 15, as they host Wayne State College at 1 p.m. in the annual Shrine Game. The Wildcats are 2-0 in 2012 after a 20-6 home victory against Minot State University Saturday and a 49-6 win at Minnesota State University Moorhead Sept. 1. BSU and WSC have met 16 times, dating back to 1990, with Wayne State holding a 7-9 edge in the all-time series. The Beavers stunned the then-No. 14 Wildcats in the last meeting, downing WSC in Bemidji 21-10, Oct. 10, 2009. BSU is 3-3 at The Chet against the Wildcats.

#2 Tre Spears (RB, 5-10, 225, So., Chicago / Morgan Park HS) had a huge impact in week two, producing 187 rushing yards on 25 carries with the game's go-ahead touchdown in the fourth quarter from 31-yards out. In addition, Spears had a key 44-yard run in earlier in the fourth quarter to the UMC 7-yard line which led to a touchdown on the next play to give Concordia an 8-point lead at the time. Spears has opened up the 2012 season with back-to-back 100-yard games in his first two career starts and first game action since the 2010 season after sitting out 2011 due to injury. He has a 43-yard lead for among the NSIC leaders with 304 rushing yards in two games.



#10 Denzell Blackmon (DB, 5-10, 190, Chicago / Morgan Park HS) finished with five tackles, a pass breakup, a fumble recovery and an interception with 50-combined return yards. Austin Sikorski (RB, 5-10, 200, So., Plover, Wis.) rushed for a game-high 118 yards on just 16 carries (a 7.1 yards per run average) and a pair of touchdowns in UMD's 38-16 victory over visiting Winona State University Saturday night. His first touchdown run, from six-yards out with 7:20 to go in the second quarter put the No. 2-ranked Bulldogs up for good at 14-7 Sikorski, who missed the final six games of the 2011 season with a knee injury, added another score with late in the third quarter while registering the third 100-yard rushing outing of his young career.



Aaron Roth (KR/PR/WR, 5-9, 185, So., Plymouth, Minn.) provided a key spark for the Bulldogs five minutes into the second quarter when, immediately after Winona State had gone up 7-0, took the ensuing kickoff 89 yards for a touchdown. The Bulldogs never trailed after that en route to a 38-16 win over the Warriors at Malosky Stadium. Roth, a true sophomore, finished with a pair of kick returns for 98 yards and a punt return for two yards in addition to racking up a team-leading five pass receptions for 67 yards.

UMD will pay a visit to Concordia-St. Paul -- its first since 2008 -- this Saturday night ... the four-time defending NSIC champion Bulldogs kicked off the home portion of its 2012 schedule last Saturday night by toppling Winona State University 38-16 before an overflow crowd of 5,055 at James S. Malosky Stadium ... UMD, which has now won 13 straight home openers, trailed 7-0 early in the second quarter before scoring three times before halftime in Saturday's victory over its long-time rivals ... UMD is 28-2 in their last 30 games away from Malosky Stadium with the lone two setbacks coming one year ago to Wayne State (7-0 on Sept. 17) and St. Cloud State (35-7 on Oct. 29) ... junior cornerback Kenny Chow's third-quarter interception last Saturday against Winona State was the first pass theft by a Bulldog in seven games going back to last year (vs. Minnesota Crookston)

Wolf, who rushed 23 times for 129 yards scored on touchdown runs of four, one and 47 yards. He also completed 5-of-11 passes for 84 yards, including a 25-yard touchdown strike to senior wide receiver Adam Thielen.



Kris Fleigle (LB, 6-2, 215, So., Blaine, Minn./Moundsview) tallied a team-high ten tackles (four solo, six assisted) and forced and recovered a fumble as he paced the Minnesota State defense to a 38-10 win over Bemidji State Saturday evening. BURNSVILLE, Minn. - The University of Minnesota Duluth Bulldogs were selected by the league coaches as the overall and north division preseason favorite in the NSIC in 2012. The Bulldogs received nine first place votes and amassed 217 points, six more than St. Cloud State (211), who garnered six other first place votes.
