NSIC Announces 2014 Britton and Kelly Award Recipients

Burnsville, Minn. — The Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference (NSIC) has announced the University of Sioux Falls' William Brockmueller as the 2014 Dr. William Britton Scholar-Athlete Award winner and Southwest Minnesota State University's Rachel Patnoe as the 2014 Willis R. Kelly Scholar-Athlete Award recipient. The Britton Scholar-Athlete Award for Academic Excellence, in its 30th year, recognizes the NSIC's top male student-athlete, while the Kelly Scholar-Athlete Award, in its 29th year, is presented to the NSIC's top female student-athlete.

The Britton Award was created in 1985 in honor of Dr. William Britton, a longtime faculty representative at Bemidji State University. The Kelly Award is named in honor of Willis R. Kelly, an associate professor of physical education at the University of Minnesota, Morris. A member of the NSIC Hall of Fame, Kelly also coordinated the Minnesota-Morris Physical Education Department from 1970-87. She became the first director of women's intercollegiate athletics at Minnesota-Morris in 1976 and was later promoted to athletic director for the whole department. Kelly passed away in 1988.

The member institutions of the NSIC nominate one male and one female student-athlete for the Britton and Kelly Awards. The nominees must meet the following criteria: a grade point average of 3.5 or better (on a 4.0 scale); evidence of academic excellence beyond the minimum grade point average (scholarship prizes and other academic recognition), evidence of participation in the life of the institution, and evidence of participation in at least two-thirds of the varsity events of the individual's primary sport. The award is voted on by the NSIC Faculty Athletic Representatives.

The 30 student-athletes nominated for the NSIC's two most prestigious awards will also be honored as NSIC Male and Female Honor Student-Athletes of the Year at their respective institutions. Brockmueller and Patnoe will be recognized Wednesday, July 9 at the 2014 NSIC Hall of Fame Banquet at the Best Western Kelly Inn and Convention Center in St. Cloud, Minn. Brockmueller and Patnoe will each receive a \$2,500 post-graduate scholarship.



2014 Dr. William Britton Scholar-Athlete Award for Academic Excellence William Brockmueller, University of Sioux Falls - Track & Field / Cross Country

William Brockmueller, a native of Brandon, S.D.., is a junior majoring in applied mathematics and computer science while minoring in accounting and theology at the University of Sioux Falls. The Brandon Valley High School graduate holds a 4.00 GPA while excelling in cross country and track & field for the Cougars. Brockmueller is the first student-athlete from the University of Sioux Falls to earn the Britton Award.

Brockmueller boasts the honor of earning the NCAA Elite 89 Award on two separate occasions. He first earned the award at the 2012 NCAA Cross Country National Championships and again at the 2014 NCAA Indoor Track & Field Championships. The Elite 89 Award is given to the student-athlete with the highest GPA competing at each of the 89 championships. Brockmueller also earned multiple regional and national awards, including being named to the NSIC All-Academic team and earning the NSIC Myles Brand Award. He was also selected as an Undergraduate

Fellow in the South Dakota Bio-medical Research Infrastructure Network (SDBRIN) Undergraduate program in summer 2012. His research project explored the possibility of quantum tunneling of electrons in the human brain.

On campus Brockmueller was involved in the student senate, was president of the Math and Computer Science Club, tutored physics and computer science and was a member of the USF Honor Program.

Brockmueller was a 2013 NCAA Cross Country All-American, All-Region and All-Conference performer. He also earned NSIC All-Conference and All-Region honors in indoor and outdoor track & field. He holds the USF record in the indoor mile an the outdoor 10000m run and is part of a record holding indoor distance medley relay team.

In his spare time, Brockmueller has assisted with the Volunteer Income Tax Assistance Program, providing a free service support to low-income individuals and families with the filing of their taxes. He has also volunteered at the Sioux Falls Furniture Mission, Food Pantry, the Ronald McDonald House and with Feed my Starving Children throughout his college career. He also volunteered at Swan Lake Christian Camp as a worship leader and support staff, leading music and activities for children in 3rd grade to high school.



2014 Willis R. Kelly Scholar-Athlete Award for Academic Excellence Rachel Patnoe, Southwest Minnesota State University - Golf

Rachel Patnoe, a native of Milbank, S.D., is a senior majoring in biology and minoring in psychology at Southwest Minnesota State University. The Milbank High School graduate holds a 3.98 grade point average while playing golf for the Mustangs. She joins Christy Kubat (2002), Janelle Gibbs (1999), Paige Karno (1996), Katy Pivec (1995) and Shauna Wendland (1989) as the only Mustangs to earn the Kelly Award.

Patnoe has made the Dean's List every semester and has been named an SMSU Scholar Athlete the last three years. She was a four-time National Golf Coaches Association (NGCA) All-American Scholar Athlete and a Capital One Academic All-District VII At-Large team member in 2013. She also received the NSIC Myles Brand Award this past spring and has been named to the NSIC All-Academic team three times. Patnoe is the recipient of over a dozen scholarships at SMSU.

Patnoe is involved in many clubs and organizations at SMSU. She is part of the National Society of Leadership and Success, the Environmental Awareness Club and is involved in the Biology and Chemistry Clubs, just to name a few.

Patnoe has been involved in the Marshall Community. She was part of the Mustang Pen Pal program; Adopt-a-Highway; Rake-a-Thon; Marshall Food Pantry Collection and Youth Science Day. She donated her hair for cancer patients and has given youth golf lessons in her hometown.

On the golf course, Patnoe has played in every round of golf for the Mustangs since her freshman year including two NCAA regional teams in 2011 and 2012. She has been consistent on the course and holds an 86.3 stroke average this season, second best on the team. She sits in 20th place in the NSIC Championship individual standings following the first two rounds of play.

The NSIC is a 16-team, 18-sport, NCAA Division II Conference with teams located in Iowa, Minnesota, Nebraska, North Dakota and South Dakota.
