* Jacksonville State is not eligible for the OVC or NCAA Tournaments due to a NCAA APR penalty, therefore they were not ranked in the preseason poll.

In a vote of OVC head men's basketball coaches and sports information directors defending champion **Murray State** was picked the favorite in the West Division while newcomer **Belmont** was picked as the East Division favorite in the OVC for 2012-13. This year marks the first for divisional play in the OVC, which now includes 12 teams for the first time in Conference history.

Murray State led the West Division voting, picking up 22 of a possible 24 first-place votes (schools were not allowed to vote for themselves) and 132 total points. **Southeast Missouri State** was picked second and picked up the remaining two first-place votes and 108 points. The West was rounded out by **Austin Peay** (92), **SIUE** (73), **Eastern Illinois** (49) and **UT Martin** (49).

Belmont picked up 21 of the 24 first-place votes and 131 points to be picked the East Division favorites. **Tennessee State** was tabbed second and received the other three first-place votes and 109 points. The East was rounded out by **Tennessee Tech** (87), **Morehead State** (77) and **Eastern Kentucky** (56). Due to a NCAA APR penalty, **Jacksonville State** is ineligible for the OVC and NCAA Tournaments this season and was not included in the preseason voting.

Preseason Player of the Year

Isaiah Canaan, Murray State

The 2012-13 All-OVC Preseason Men's Basketball team is headlined by Murray State senior Isaiah Canaan, who is the defending OVC Player of the Year and a preseason All-American selection by several different outlets. Overall six different schools were represented on the team with Belmont, Murray State, Southeast Missouri and Tennessee State having two selections apiece while SIUE and Tennessee Tech each had one selection to round out the team. The squad features three players who were All-OVC first-team selections last season, two players who were second-team selections and one player who was selected to the All-Newcomer squad. The team is comprised of eight seniors and two juniors.

Last season Canaan was named the 2012 OVC Player of the Year and 2011-12 OVC Male Athlete of the Year after ranking 24th nationally in scoring (19.0), sixth in 3-point percentage (45.6%) and 13th in 3-pointers made/game (2.97). He was the leader of the Murray State men's basketball team that completed a 31-2 season (tying the most wins in OVC history), won both the OVC regular season and tournament championships, advanced to the third round of the NCAA Tournament, was ranked as high as No. 7 nationally (the highest-ranking in school history and first OVC team to be ranked in the Top 10 since the 1970-71 season), was the last undefeated team in Division I at 23-0 and the only team to be undefeated in road games (13-0). Following last season he was named an All-American by seven different outlets.

In addition to Canaan, Tennessee State senior forward Robert Covington (17.8 points, 7.9 rebounds, 1.5 steals, 1.4 blocks, 1.3 assists/game while making 52.6% from the field and 44.8% from 3-point range) and Tennessee Tech senior guard Jud Dillard (17.3 points and an OVC-best 8.5 rebounds/game) were each first-team selections last year and are on the preseason team this year.

The second-team selections from last year appearing on the preseason team this year are Southeast Missouri junior forward Tyler Stone (14.7 points, 7.3 rebounds and 1.1 blocks/game while hitting 53.0% from the field) and SIUE senior forward Mark Yelovich (15.1 points, 6.2 rebounds/game). The Preseason All-OVC team is rounded out by the Belmont senior backcourt duo of Kerron Johnson (13.8 points, 5.2 assists, 3.1 rebounds/game and 51.8% from the field) and Ian Clark (12.7 points, 2.6 rebounds and 2.4 assists/game to go along with 92 made 3-pointers), Murray State senior forward Ed Daniel (6.8 points, 5.5 rebounds and 1.5 blocks/game while hitting 57.8 percent from the field), Tennessee State junior guard Patrick Miller (10.8 points, 3.6 rebounds and 3.6 assists/game) and Southeast Missouri senior guard Marland Smith (12.3 points, 3.0 rebounds, 2.5 assists/game and 63 made 3-pointers).

2012-13 OVC MEN'S NOTES/PREVIEW

The Season is Here: The 2012-13 season marks the 65th of competition for the Ohio Valley Conference. Over the previous 64 years, 12 different teams have claimed an OVC regular season championship. Last season Murray State won its record 23rd OVC regular season and 15th OVC Tournament Championship.

OVC Wins NCAA Tournament Game for Fourth-Year in a Row: For the fourth year in a row the OVC won an NCAA Tournament game last season, as No. 6 seed Murray State topped No. 11 seed Colorado State by a 58-41 margin. The victories in four-straight NCAA Tournaments is a first in OVC history (which dates back to 1948) and follows wins by Morehead State (2009), Murray State (2010) and Morehead State (2011).

OVC One of Just 9 Conferences (3 Non-BCS) to Win NCAA Tournament Games in Each of Past Four Seasons: The OVC is one of just nine (9) Division I conferences to win a NCAA Tournament game in each of the past four years and one of just three non-BCS conferences to achieve the feat. The other non-BCS leagues to win a game in each of the last three years are the Atlantic 10 and West Coast Conferences (WCC). The ACC, Big 12, Big East, Big Ten, Pac-10/12 and SEC are the BCS-level conferences that have won at least one game in each of the past three years.

Postseason Success: The four-year winning streak in NCAA Tournament play is unprecedented in OVC history. After winning NCAA Tournament games in each 1987, 1988 and 1989, the OVC went 20 years without a NCAA victory. That changed in 2009 when Morehead State topped Alabama State 58-43 in front of a record crowd at the Opening Round game in Dayton, Ohio. A year later it was No. 13 seed Murray State who won, topping No. 4 seed Vanderbilt 66-65 when Danero Thomas nailed a buzzer-beater in San Jose. In 2011 it was Morehead State's turn again, as the Eagles were seeded 13th and sent to Denver to battle No. 4-seed Louisville. MSU got off to a 15-2 lead nearly eight minutes into the game but trailed 61-59 with 31 seconds to play. On its final possession senior Demonte Harper nailed a 3-pointer from the top of the key with 4.3 seconds remaining to give Morehead State the lead and Kenneth Faried blocked Louisville's last shot attempt to seal the victory. Last season it was Murray State, who once again won, knocking off Colorado State 58-41 in the second round in a game played in Louisville.

With Record 12 Schools, OVC To Use Divisional Play for 2012-13: For the first time this year the OVC will use divisional play for men's and women's basketball. The addition of Belmont University on July 1, 2012 gave the OVC 12 member institutions, the largest the Conference has been since it was formed in 1948 (the OVC is currently the nation's eighth-oldest Division I conference). The East Division includes Belmont, Eastern Kentucky, Jacksonville State, Morehead State, Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech. The West Division includes Austin Peay, Eastern Illinois, Murray State, Southeast Missouri State, SIUE and UT Martin. Some of the factors in determining the divisions included geography and balance while also being mindful of matchups and rivalries (both current and future).

Belmont Joins OVC; SIUE Eligible for Postseason Play: After previously being a member of the Atlantic Sun Conference, Belmont University officially joined the OVC as the league's 12th member of July 1, 2012. The Bruins men's basketball team has made five NCAA Tournament appearances in the past seven seasons.

SIUE Ready for Postseason Play: On July 1, 2008 Southern Illinois University Edwardsville (SIUE) became a member of the Ohio Valley Conference. Last season marked the first for the Cougars playing a full OVC schedule. After completing its reclassification process to Division I following last year, SIUE is now eligible for both the OVC and NCAA Tournaments this season.

OVC Tournament Format and Home Enters Year No. 3: After debuting a new format and home for the OVC Tournament in 2011, the tournament will once again return to Municipal Auditorium in Nashville this year. Once again the top eight men's and women's teams will qualify for the tournament and advance to play in Nashville (as opposed to playing first round games in campus sites) under a merit-based format. The No. 1 and 2 seeds will receive two byes to the semifinals while the No. 3 and 4 seeds will receive one bye into the quarterfinals. The first round will include the No. 5 seed against the No. 8 seed and the No. 6 seed against the No. 7 seed. With divisional play being used for the first time this year, the winner of each division is guaranteed one of the top two seeds while seeds 3-8 will be based on overall conference record regardless of division.

OVC Digital Network: The OVC launched the OVC Digital Network (OVCDN) in August 2012. The OVCDN is the exclusive home for live web streamed athletic contests involving OVC schools. This marks the seventh year the OVC has streamed live events, but first time the events will be offered free of charge and in an HD format and will feature improved quality thanks to an investment in new equipment conference-wide. Fans will also find it easier to log onto OVCDigitalNetwork.com and access the streams and can do so without any registration. The events will be available on any computer, tablet or smart phone without needing any special downloads or apps thanks new streaming technology.

Preseason Predictions: Is being picked the preseason favorite always a good thing? Over the past 33 years of preseason polls that were available, the league's head coaches and sports information directors correctly picked the eventual OVC regular season cham-

pion 60.1 percent of the time, picking the correct winner 20 times over the past 33 years. Over the past 12 years, the preseason poll has correctly picked the winner six times. Last season the poll tabbed Austin Peay to win the regular season championship, although Murray State won the title.

Westwood One to Broadcast OVC Championship Game: For the fourth consecutive season, the 2013 Men's Basketball Championship game will be broadcast by the Westwood One radio network, the largest provider of audio content in America. Westwood One is one of the nation's largest providers of network radio programming and one of the largest domestic providers of traffic information in the U.S. Westwood One serves more than 5,000 radio and 170 TV stations in the U.S. Westwood One provides over 150 news, sports, music, talk and entertainment programs, features and live events to numerous media partners. Westwood One is home of the most prestigious sports broadcasts on radio. Westwood One's lineup includes regular season NFL football, the Playoffs and the Super Bowl; NCAA Football and Basketball including the Final Four; College World Series; Frozen Four; the Olympics; the Masters and more. Through its Metro Traffic division, Westwood One provides traffic reporting and local news, sports and weather to approximately 2,300 radio and TV stations. Westwood One also provides digital and other cross-platform delivery of its network and Metro content.

Replay Systems for OVC Basketball Venues Enter Year Four: On Dec. 21, 2007, the Ohio Valley Conference mandated the use of courtside replay systems at all OVC basketball venues. The systems were put into place in January 2008 and have been used since. The systems are used in situations that are outlined by NCAA rules.



Isaiah Canaan was named the OVC Preseason Player of the Year after earning OVC Player of the Year honors at the end of last season. In 2011-12 Canaan earned All-American honors from seven different outlets including the Wooden Team (one of 10 total players), The Sporting News (first-team), CBSSports.com (first-team), Associated Press (second-team), USBWA (second-team), NABC (third-team) and Lute Olson Team. He helped Murray State to a 31-2 record, Top 10 national ranking and a NCAA Tournament victory over Colorado State during the season.

ESPN SEARS BRACKETBUSTERS

Sears BracketBusters Format: In its 11th year, Sears BracketBusters is an ESPN television property that was tremendously successful with its first 10 events in February of 2003, 2004, 2005, 2006, 2007, 2008, 2009, 2010, 2011 and 2012. The event has allowed Division I conferences to participate in a cutting-edge format that involves "wild card" pairings from the pool of participating teams, with half of the ESPN BracketBusters pairings teams pre-designated as "home" and the remaining half as "road" teams.

OVC Schools in the Event: For the eighth straight year, every Ohio Valley Conference schools will participate in the BracketBusters series. Six schools will host games this season while the other six will go on the road. Austin Peay has competed in the most BracketBusters games (9) while Murray State has the best record in the event (6-2).

What Makes BracketBusters Different From Other Events: What sets Sears BracketBusters apart from the other made-for-television events is that the pairings of teams is not pre-determined. The actual pairings take place three weeks in advance of the event, and those matchups are determined on the basis of regular season play. Another important component for BracketBusters participants is future scheduling. Each team that participates in any given year agrees to enter into a home-and-home series with its to-be-named opponent. The return game of each series is made in November or December in a season following the BracketBusters game. This return game allows for the completion of the two-game series contract and is not part of the BracketBusters event in that second year.

BracketBusters Pool Versus Field: The Sears BracketBusters pool is defined as the original 122 participating teams prior to the pairing of teams for the television package. The Sears BracketBusters field is defined as the 26 teams chosen for the 13 games televised on the ESPN family of networks (ESPN, ESPN2, ESPNU, ESPN3).

2013 Sears BracketBusters Evaluation and Pairings Process: The evaluation and pairings of teams for the ESPN television package will be made by the staff of ESPN, in consultation with the commissioners of participating conferences. Consideration will be given to avoiding matchups of conference teams and matchups of any teams that have already met during the current season. ESPN, in consultation with the conference commissioners, will make pairing decisions in late January.
