CO-PLAYER

Isaiah Canaan, G • Sr., 6-1, 195 • Biloxi, Miss. • Murray State

Canaan hit 7-of-16 (43.8%) shots, 4-of-8 (50%) 3-pointers and 3-of-4 free throws on his way to 21 points in a 75-70 victory over Western Kentucky on Sunday. Canaan also dished out five assists and committed only two turnovers in 38 minutes of action at the point. During the back-and-forth affair in the second half, Canaan nailed a 3-pointer with 6:55 to play to put the Racers on top for good. Canaan currently leads the OVC in scoring (21.3 points/game) and ranks sixth in assists (4.0/game).

CO-PLAYER

Robert Covington, F • Sr., 6-9, 215 • Bellwood, Ill. • Tennessee State

In his lone game of the week, Covington hit 9-of-17 (52.9%) shots, 3-of-5 (60%) 3-pointers and 10-of-11 free throws (90.9%) on his way to a career-high 31 points in a 79-39 victory over LeMoyne-Owen. He also pulled down 11 rebounds to net his third double-double of the season. Covington also added a pair of blocks in 27 minutes of action. He currently ranks fourth in the OVC in scoring (17.5 points/game) and rebounding (7.5/game).

NEWCOMER

Corey Walden, G • R-So., 6-2, 206 • Daytona Beach, Fla. • Eastern Kentucky

Walden hit 9-of-13 shots (69.2%) on his way to a game-high 21 points in a loss to No. 10 Illinois on Sunday. The transfer from Brevard Community College was 8-of-9 on field goal attempts from inside the 3-point line and hit 2-of-3 free throws. His free throw with 9:48 to play capped a 16-6 Colonel run to pull the team to within four points (42-38). Walden also added two rebounds, two steals and an assist.

CO-FRESHMAN

Chris Horton, C • Fr., 6-8, 205 • Decatur, Ga. • Austin Peay

Horton recorded his third double-double of the season on Sunday, scoring 10 points and grabbing a season-high 13 rebounds in a road loss at Arkansas State. The freshman also had four blocks, three steals and two assists in 34 minutes of action. It marked the ninth time in 10 games this season that Horton had at least three blocks in a game; he currently leads the OVC in blocked shots (3.0/game).

CO-FRESHMAN

Lanerryl Johnson, G • Fr., 6-1, 170 • Atlanta, Ga. • Tennessee Tech

Johnson came off the bench to score 15 points, grab four rebounds, dish out three assists and net three steals as Tennessee Tech went on the road to defeat Milwaukee 69-58 on Saturday. Johnson scored eight of his 15 points after halftime as TTU built a four-point halftime lead back up to double digits. Johnson currently ranks third on the Golden Eagle team in scoring (10.3 points/game).

NOTES FROM AROUND THE LEAGUE

OVC Overview/This Week's Highlights: Entering this week the OVC is rated the 12th-best conference in the RPI according to RPI Ratings.com; the OVC trails just the Big Ten, Big East, Pac-12, ACC, Mountain West, Atlantic 10, Big 12, SEC, Missouri Valley, WCC and Conference USA...Murray State is the top-ranked OVC team in the RPI (20), followed closely by Belmont (25); Eastern Kentucky (86) and Jacksonville State (89) are both under 100 in the RPI as well...EKU suffered its first loss of the season on Sunday, falling at No. 10 Illinois after starting the season 9-0; EKU was one of just 10 undefeated teams at the time of its loss...Murray State, who is still receiving votes in both national Top 25 polls, improved to 8-1 on the season with a win over rival Western Kentucky on Sunday; the Racers, who have the nation's longest road winning streak at 15 games, has road contests at Arkansas State and Dayton this week (the team has not lost on the road since the end of the 2010-11 season)...Murray State was the only Division I team to be undefeated in true road games last season...Murray State's Isaiah Canaan currently ranks seventh nationally in scoring (21.3 points/game) while teammate Ed Daniel is fifth in rebounding (11.7/game)...Belmont guard Ian Clark is fourth nationally in 3-point percentage (52.0%) and fifth in 3-pointers made/game (3.9)...OVC teams on the whole are defending the 3-point shot well this season, as eight of the 12 OVC schools rank in the Top 75 nationally in 3-point percentage...After a slow week of games last week due to final exams (five OVC schools did not play a game last week), there are 21 games on the slate this week...Due to the holiday, the OVC will announce its next set of Players of the Week next Sunday (Dec. 23).

Murray State Receiving Votes in Top 25: Murray State (8-1) continues to receive votes in both national Top 25 polls. The Racers picked up three (3) points in the USA Today Coaches Poll and four (4) points in the Associated Press Top 25. Belmont received votes in the coaches poll on Nov. 19 following its win at Stanford but is no longer receiving votes in that poll.

Murray State, Belmont, Eastern Kentucky Ranked in CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major Poll: In last week's CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major poll (the Dec. 17 poll was not out at release time), Murray State was No. 4, Belmont was No. 8 and Eastern Kentucky was No. 18 while Jacksonville State was among the other schools receiving votes. Murray State was ranked fourth for the fourth-straight week, Belmont moved up one spot while EKU jumped from 23rd to 18th in its second week in the poll. Wichita State was ranked first and received 24 first-place votes while Creighton was second and received a first-place vote and Gonzaga was third and received the other six first-place votes. Murray State finished the 2011-12 season ranked No. 1 in the poll, holding that spot for the final 12 weeks of the season; MSU was the first OVC team to ever be ranked No. 1 in the poll. Now in its 14th season, the Mid-Major poll is made up of team's from the following conferences: America East, Atlantic Sun, Big Sky, Big South, Big West, Colonial, Great West, Horizon, Independents, Ivy, Metro Atlantic, Mid-American, Mid-Eastern, Missouri Valley, Northeast, Ohio Valley, Patriot, Southern, Southland, Southwestern, Summit, Sun Belt, WAC and West Coast. It is voted upon by coaches from those conferences, with one coach per conference casting a vote (Eastern Kentucky's Jeff Neubauer is the OVC representative).

NCAA Statistical Leaders: In the latest set of NCAA statistical leaders released on Dec. 17, Eastern Kentucky ranks second nationally in turnover margin (+7.9/game) while Belmont ranks sixth nationally in 3-pointers made/game (9.0). Austin Peay is 11th in fewest personal fouls/game (13.5) and 13th in 3-point percentage (40.3%) while Morehead State is 10th in steals (10.5/game). Murray State is 25th in scoring offense (79.2 points/game) and 21st in field goal percentage (48.2%). Southeast Missouri State ranks 15th in field goal percentage defense (36.2%) and 19th in 3-point percentage defense (25.2%). Jacksonville State ranks 15th in 3-point percentage defense (25.2%). Individually Murray State's **Isaiah Canaan** ranks seventh nationally in scoring (21.3 points/game) and 10th in 3-pointers made/game (3.4). Belmont's **Ian Clark** is fourth nationally in both 3-point percentage (52.0%) and fifth in 3-pointers made/game (3.9). Murray State's **Ed Daniel** is fifth in rebounding (11.7/game) and fifth in double-doubles (6). Austin Peay's **Chris Horton** is 11th in blocks (3.0/game) while Southeast Missouri's **Nino Johnson** is 14th (2.9/game). APSU's **Travis Betran** is eighth in 3-point percentage (50.9%) while Tennessee State's **Patrick Miller** is 14th in assists (6.5/game).

OVC One of Just 9 Conferences (3 Non-BCS) to Win NCAA Tournament Games in Each of Past Four Seasons: The OVC is one of just nine (9) Division I conferences to win a NCAA Tournament game in each of the past four years and one of just three non-BCS conferences to achieve the feat. The other non-BCS leagues to win a game in each of the last three years are the Atlantic 10 and West Coast Conferences. The ACC, Big 12, Big East, Big Ten, Pac-10/12 and SEC are the BCS-level conferences that have won at least one game in each of the past three years.

More on NCAA Success: The four-year winning streak in NCAA Tournament play is unprecedented in OVC history. After winning NCAA Tournament games in each 1987, 1988 and 1989, the OVC went 20 years without a NCAA victory. That changed in 2009 when Morehead State topped Alabama State 58-43 in front of a record crowd at the Opening Round game in Dayton, Ohio. A year later it was No. 13 seed Murray State who won, topping No. 4 seed Vanderbilt 66-65 when Danero Thomas nailed a buzzer-beater in San Jose. In 2011 it was Morehead State's turn again, as the Eagles were seeded 13th and sent to Denver to battle No. 4-seed Louisville. MSU got off to a 15-2 lead nearly eight minutes into the game but trailed 61-59 with 31 seconds to play. On its final possession senior Demonte Harper nailed a 3-pointer from the top of the key with 4.3 seconds remaining to give Morehead State the lead and Kenneth Faried blocked Louisville's last shot attempt to seal the victory. Last season it was Murray State who once again won, knocking off Colorado State 58-41 in the second round in a game played in Louisville. The Racers earned a No. 6 seed in that event, the highest seed ever for an OVC team since the tournament seeding began in 1979.

Canaan Named Preseason All-American by Associated Press: Murray State senior guard **Isaiah Canaan** was one of six players named to the Associated Press Preseason All-American team this season. Canaan was joined on the team by Indiana sophomore Cody Zeller, Creighton junior Doug McDermott, Lehigh senior C.J. McCollum, Ohio State junior Deshaun Thomas and Michigan sophomore Trey Burke. Canaan was named on 43 of the 65 media ballots, second only to McDermott (who

2013 OVC TOURNAMENT

The 2013 Ohio Valley Conference Men's & Women's Tournaments will be held March 6-9 at Municipal Auditorium in Nashville, Tenn. The tournament features eight men's and eight women's teams in a merit-based format with the No. 1 and 2 seeds getting double byes into the semifinals and the No. 3 and 4 seeds getting a bye into the quarterfinals.

The first round and quarterfinal games (which start at 12 and 2 p.m. for the women, and 6 and 8 p.m. for the men) can be seen on the OVC Digital Network. The men's semifinals will be held on Friday, March 8 at 6 and 8 p.m. and televised on ESPNU and ESPN3. The championship game on Saturday, March 9 is at 6 p.m. and televised live on ESPN2. The women's semifinals are set for 12 and 2 p.m. on March 8 (TV TBA) and the women's championship game is on March 9 at a TBD time.

This marks the 19th time in 20 years that the tournament has been held in Nashville.

CREDENTIALS. For the fourth year in a row, credentials will be requested through an online system. That information will be available in January. **The deadline to request credentials is MONDAY, MARCH 6 at 1 p.m.** No credentials will be mailed; they can be picked up at Media Will-Call, located at the back entrance of the arena (at the intersection of 5th Ave. North and Gay Street).

Canaan Named to Wooden Award Preseason Watch List: Murray State senior guard **Isaiah Canaan** is one of 50 players named to the John Wooden Award Preseason Watch List. Canaan and Creighton's Doug McDermott are the only two players who made the 10-player Wooden All-American Team last year to return to the preseason list this season. Transfers, freshmen and medical redshirts are not eligible for the Preseason Top 50. The players on the list are considered strong candidates for the midseason list and the official voting ballot, both of which are open to freshman and transfer students. The National Ballot consists of approximately 20 top players who have proven to their universities that they are also making progress toward graduation and maintaining at least a cumulative 2.0 GPA. The Wooden Award All American Team, consisting of the nation's top 10 players, will be announced the week of the "Elite Eight" round of the NCAA Tournament. The 37th annual Wooden Award ceremony will honor the Men's and Women's Wooden Award winners, and will include the presentation of the Wooden Award All American Teams and the Legends of Coaching Award. The event will take place the weekend of April 12-13, 2013.

Canaan Named to Naismith Award Early Season Watch List: Murray State senior guard **Isaiah Canaan** is one of 50 players nationally named to the Naismith Award early season watch list and announced by the Atlanta Tipoff Club. The 50-player watch list was compiled by the Atlanta Tipoff Club's Board of Selectors, which based its criteria on player performances from the previous year and expectations for the 2012-13 college basketball season. The Naismith Men's College Player of the Year presented by AT&T will be awarded on April 7, 2013 in Atlanta. In late February, the Atlanta Tipoff Club's Board of Selectors will compile a mid-season team of the top 30 players in the nation. Then in March, the Naismith Trophy voting academy will narrow the list to the four finalists.

Canaan is Candidate for Senior CLASS Award: Murray State senior guard **Isaiah Canaan** is one of 30 men's basketball student-athletes who are candidates for the Senior CLASS Award. To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence – community, classroom, character and competition. The complete list of candidates follows this release. An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School®, the Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities. The candidate classes will be narrowed to 10 men's and 10 women's finalists midway through the regular season, and those names will be placed on the official ballot. Ballots will be distributed through a nationwide voting system to media, coaches and fans, who will select one men's finalist and one women's finalist who best exemplifies excellence in the four Cs of community, classroom, character and competition.

No Freshmen: The SIUE men's basketball team is one of six Division I teams this season to not feature a freshman (either true or redshirt) on its roster. The other teams without a freshman include Ohio, Portland State, Savannah State, UAB and Valparaiso.

Canaan Named to All-Tournament Team at Charleston Classic: Murray State senior **Isaiah Canaan** was named to the Charleston Classic All-Tournament team after leading his team to a runner-up finish at the event. Canaan averaged 20.7 points, 3.7 assists and 3.0 rebounds/game as the Racers topped Auburn and St. John's before falling to Colorado.

Belmont's Clark and Noack Named to All-Tournament Team at Great Alaska Shootout: Belmont senior guard **Ian Clark** and senior forward **Trevor Noack** were named to the Great Alaska Shootout All-Tournament Team after leading his team to a third-place finish in the event. In the three games Clark averaged 16.3 points, 3.7 assists, 3.0 rebounds and 1.3 steals/game while hitting 51.6 percent (16-of-31) from the field and 59.1 percent (13-of-22) from 3-point range. In the Bruins win over host Alaska Anchorage he scored 14 points, dished out five assists and held UAA's leading scorer to just two field goals in 40 minutes. In the semifinal loss to Northeastern, Clark set a record in the 35-year old history of the Great Alaska Shootout by connecting on 9-of-11 (81.8) 3-pointers on his way to a game-high 29 points. In a third-place victory over Oral Roberts, Clark struggled offensively but limited ORU's top player (who entered the game averaged 24.0 points/game) to a season-low three points in 30 minutes of play. Noack averaged 13.7 points and 5.3 rebounds/game in scoring double figures in each game. He had 15 against each Alaska Anchorage and Oral Roberts and 11 against Northeastern. It marks the second-straight year an OVC player has been named to the event's All-Tournament Team (Murray State's Isaiah Canaan earned the honors last year).

OVC Tournament Once Again at Municipal Auditorium: The 2013 OVC Tournament will once again be played at Municipal Auditorium in Nashville, Tenn. (March 6-9). It marks the third-straight year the tournament has been at the venue and the eighth time the combined men's and women's tournaments have been held at the venue (1994, 1995, 1996, 2004, 2008, 2011, 2012); the men's tournament was also held there in 1967. Beginning in 2011 the Championship switched to a format where the top eight men's and women's teams play in the merit-based format. The No. 1 and 2 seeds received two byes to the semifinals while the No. 3 and 4 seeds received one bye into the quarterfinals. The first round included the No. 5 seed against the No. 8 seed and the No. 6 seed against the No. 7 seed. As part of the deal to host the tournament at Municipal Auditorium, the Nashville City Council and Municipal Auditorium committed \$200,000 to improvements at the venue, which opened in 1962. Among the major improvements included upgrades to the dressing rooms, two new scoreboards and the new OVC-branded playing surface. The floor was built by Horner Sports Flooring, whose corporate headquarters are in Dollar Bay, Mich. The company has made floors for many collegiate and National Basketball Association (NBA) teams, including building the floor for the 2010 NBA All-Star Game which was held at Texas Stadium. Last year's event (2012) saw the largest neutral site crowds ever in Nashville and the second-largest championship game attendance ever at a neutral site. For the semifinal games last year 5,142 fans attended the Murray State/Tennessee Tech and Tennessee State/Morehead State games. A day later 6,454 fans attended the Murray State/Tennessee State

Championship game. That crowd was the largest ever for a neutral site OVC Tournament game in Nashville and the second-largest neutral site championship crowd ever (trailing only the 8,145 fans who saw the 1993 Championship in Rupp Arena in Lexington, Ky.).

OVC Teams to Compete Once Again in ESPN Sears BracketBusters Series: OVC teams will once again compete in the Sears BracketBusters series this season. This marks the eighth-straight season the every OVC teams has competed in the event. Now it's its 11th year, BracketBusters is an ESPN television property that has been tremendously successful with its nine events. The event has allowed Division I conferences to participate in a cutting-edge format that involves "wild card" pairings from the pool of participating teams, with half of the ESPN BracketBusters teams pre-designated as "home" and the remaining half as "road" teams. This year there are 122 teams from 15 conferences in the pool of teams that will be selected for one of 13 nationally-televised games (5 on ESPN2, 4 on ESPNU and 4 on ESPN3).

OVC at 12 Schools for First Time With Addition of Belmont; League Begins First Year of Divisional Play: The addition of Belmont University on July 1, 2012 gave the OVC 12 member institutions, the largest the Conference has been since it was formed in 1948 (the OVC is currently the nation's eighth-oldest Division I conference). The 2012-13 also marks the first year that SIUE, who finished its reclassification process to Division I in August, is eligible for the postseason. The East Division includes Belmont, Eastern Kentucky, Jacksonville State, Morehead State, Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech. The West Division includes Austin Peay, Eastern Illinois, Murray State, Southeast Missouri State, SIUE and UT Martin. The team who finishes first in each division will be guaranteed either the No. 1 or No. 2 seed for the OVC Tournament (and get a double bye into the semifinals); Seeds 3-8 in the tournament will be based on best Conference record, regardless of which division the team is from.

Loos is All-Time Winningest Coach in OVC History: With a 68-66 victory at Ohio on Dec. 9, 2009, Austin Peay head coach **Dave Loos** recorded his 320th career victory while in the OVC, a mark that ranks first all-time. Loos passed Cal Luther (319 wins at Murray State and UT Martin) for the all-time mark. Loos, the Dean of OVC coaches, is now in his 23rd year at Austin Peay where he also serves as the Athletics Director, making him the only Division I head men's basketball coach to hold that distinction. Loos is one of just 11 active Division I coaches to have coached at the same school for 20 or more years. Loos now has 367 victories in his tenure at Austin Peay and 449 for his career (which ranks him 27th among Division I head coaches). Although he is in his first year in the OVC, Belmont head coach **Rick Byrd** has 644 career victories, which ranks seventh among active Division I head coaches.

The OVC Welcomes Four New Head Coaches: The OVC has four new head coaches this season. Tennessee State promoted head coach **Travis Williams** to its top spot after former coach John Cooper left for Miami (Ohio). Eastern Illinois is under the direction of **Jay Spoonhour** while Morehead State hired former Mississippi Valley State head coach **Sean Woods**. Although not new to his team, Belmont's **Rick Byrd** is new to the league as the Bruins are playing its first year in the league in 2012-13.

Former OVC Players in the NBA: Entering the 2012-13 season there are two former OVC players on NBA rosters. Former Morehead State All-American **Kenneth Faried** was the No. 22 overall pick in the 2011 NBA Draft and is in his second season with the Denver Nuggets. Faried was a two-time OVC Player of the Year, three-time OVC Defensive Player of the Year and set the NCAA Modern Era (since 1973) Rebounding record during his career. Faried was named to the NBA All-Rookie Team in 2012 after averaging 10.2 points and 7.7 rebounds/game in 46 contests. Former Tennessee Tech star **Kevin Murphy**, who scored 50 points in a game last season, was picked by the Utah Jazz with the 47th overall pick in the 2012 NBA Draft and begins his rookie season with the team. Murphy is currently playing with the Jazz's NBDL affiliate, the Reno BigHorns. Several other former NBA players are in the NBDL including Morehead State's **Demonte Harper** (Erie BayHawks), Tennessee Tech's **Liam McMorrow** (Iowa Energy), Jacksonville State's **Nick Murphy** (Iowa Energy) and Jacksonville State's **Walker Russell** (Fort Wayne Mad Ants).

The 2012-13 Season: The 2012-13 season marks the 65th of competition in the OVC. Over the previous 64 years, 12 different teams have claimed an OVC regular season championship.

Murray State's Canaan Tabbed as Preseason Player of the Year: The 2012-13 All-OVC Preseason Men's Basketball team was headlined by Murray State senior **Isaiah Canaan** who is the defending OVC Player of the Year and a preseason All-American selection. Overall six different schools were represented on the team with Belmont, Murray State, Southeast Missouri and Tennessee State having two selections apiece while SIUE and Tennessee Tech each had one selection to round out the team. The squad features three players who were All-OVC first-team selections last season, two players who were second-team selections and one player who was selected to the All-Newcomer squad. The team is comprised of eight seniors and two juniors. Last season Canaan was named the 2012 OVC Player of the Year and 2011-12 OVC Male Athlete of the Year after ranking 24th nationally in scoring (19.0), sixth in 3-point percentage (45.6%) and 13th in 3-pointers made/game (2.97). In addition to Canaan, Tennessee State senior forward **Robert Covington** and Tennessee Tech senior guard **Jud Dillard** were each first-team selections last year and are on the preseason team this year. The second-team selections from last year appearing on the preseason team this year are Southeast Missouri junior forward **Tyler Stone** and SIUE senior forward **Mark Yelovich**. The Preseason All-OVC team was rounded out by the Belmont senior backcourt duo of **Kerron Johnson** and **Ian Clark**, Murray State senior forward **Ed Daniel**, Tennessee State junior guard **Patrick Miller** and Southeast Missouri senior guard **Marland Smith**.

Murray State, Belmont Picked as OVC Preseason Favorites: In a vote of Ohio Valley Conference head men's basketball coaches and sports information directors defending champion Murray State was picked the favorite in the West Division while newcomer Belmont was picked as the East Division

favorite in the OVC for 2012-13. This year marks the first for divisional play in the OVC, which now includes 12 teams for the first time in Conference history. Murray State led the West Division voting, picking up 22 of a possible 24 first-place votes (schools were not allowed to vote for themselves) and 132 total points. Southeast Missouri State was tabbed second and picked up the remaining two first-place votes and 108 points. The West was rounded out by Austin Peay (92), SIUE (73), Eastern Illinois (49) and UT Martin (38). Belmont picked up 21 of the 24 first-place votes and 131 points to be picked the East Division favorites. Tennessee State was tabbed second and received the other three first-place votes and 109 points. The East was rounded out by Tennessee Tech (87), Morehead State (77) and Eastern Kentucky (56). Due to a NCAA APR penalty, Jacksonville State is ineligible for the OVC and NCAA Tournaments this season and was not included in the preseason voting.

Replay Systems for OVC Basketball Venues Enter Year six: On Dec. 21, 2007, the Ohio Valley Conference mandated the use of court-side replay systems at all OVC basketball venues. The systems were put into place in January 2008 and have been used since. The systems are used in situations that are outlined by NCAA rules.

OVC Digital Network: The OVC launched the OVC Digital Network (OVCDN) in August 2012. The OVCDN is the exclusive home for live web streamed athletic contests involving OVC schools. This marks the seventh year the OVC has streamed live events, but first time the events will be offered free of charge and in an HD format and will feature improved quality thanks to an investment in new equipment conference-wide. Fans will also find it easier to log onto OVCDigitalNetwork.com and access the streams and can do so without any registration. The events will be available on any computer, tablet or smart phone without needing any special downloads or apps thanks new streaming technology.

After a week between games to complete final exams for the fall semester, Austin Peay was back on the court on Sunday at Arkansas State...The Governors led by five points at halftime and by as many as eight in the second half before a 16-3 Red Wolves run gave ASU a 53-45 lead with 7:13 to play; Arkansas State would go on to win 69-57...It marked the second-straight game that APSU had shot 50 percent or better from the field and lost; the Govs hit 23-of-46 shots overall and 7-of-12 (58.3%) from 3-point range...Junior newcomer Travis Betran scored 21 points (his second-straight 20-plus point game) as he hit 9-of-16 (56.3%) shots from the field and 3-of-6 (50%) from long range; over the last seven games he is averaging 19.9 points/game...Overall Betran ranks ninth in the OVC in scoring through 10 games (16.9 points/game); Betran currently ranks eighth nationally in 3-point percentage (50.9%)...Freshman Chris Horton had his third double-double of the season as he scored 10 points and grabbed a season-best 13 rebounds; Horton also had three steals, dished out two assists and blocked four shots...It marked the ninth time this season he had three or more blocks in a game; Horton is first in the OVC with 3.0 blocks/game, a mark that ranks 11th nationally...APSU leads the OVC in 3-point percentage (40.3%, a mark that is 13th nationally) and blocks (5.5/game)...This week Austin Peay will host Lipscomb on Tuesday night before playing the first of five games away from home...That road swing starts with a Saturday contest at Illinois State.
