THIS WEEK'S OVC HIGHLIGHTS/STORYLINES

The 60th season of OVC football gets underway this week, as all 10 teams are in action...Five teams open the campaign on Thursday night, including a Conference contest between Tennessee Tech and Eastern Illinois...The Conference matchup in Week No. 1 of the season is occurring for the first time since the 1999 season, when UT Martin hosted Western Kentucky...The remaining six teams play on Saturday night...The OVC welcomes back Austin Peay this season, putting the OVC at 10 teams, the largest the Conference has ever been in football...Austin Peay had previously played non-scholarship football after leaving the OVC following the 1996 season...Eastern Illinois - who has won or shared the past two OVC Championships - was picked as the preseason favorite this season, although five different teams received at least one first-place vote in the preseason balloting...The other teams to receive first-place votes were Jacksonville State, Tennessee-Martin, Eastern Kentucky and Tennessee State...Tennessee-Martin shared the OVC Championship with Eastern Illinois last season, as both teams advanced to the FCS Playoffs; the OVC is looking to have two teams advance to the NCAA Playoffs in back-to-back years for the first time since the 1999-2000 seasons...The championship for Tennessee-Martin was its first since joining the OVC and the Division I ranks in the early 1990s...Both Eastern Illinois and UT Martin are ranked in the three major Top 25 polls; EIU is 17th in the Sports Network and FCS Coaches and 19th in the Sports Media Entertainment (SME) poll while UTM is 16th in the SME poll, 18th in the FCS Coaches Poll and 22nd in the Sports Network poll...The 2007 season marks the second for OVCSports.TV, a venture with XOS Technologies that webstreams every OVC football and men's and women's basketball contest (and home non-conference games) along with various other events and OVC Championships.

NOTES FROM AROUND THE GRIDIRON

Let's Get It Started: The 60th season of Ohio Valley Conference football will officially get underway on Thursday, Aug. 30 when five teams take to the field to kick off the 2007 season, including a League matchup between defending co-champion Eastern Illinois and Tennessee Tech that will be televised nationally on CSTV. Also on Thursday, Samford hosts West Alabama, Southeast Missouri plays at Cincinnati and Murray State plays at Louisville. On Saturday, Austin Peay will host Bethel, Eastern Kentucky will play at Kentucky, Jacksonville State plays at Alabama State, UT Martin challenges Southern Miss and Tennessee State hosts Alabama A&M in the John Merritt Classic.

An Early Conference Matchup: The regular season begins this week and during the week we'll see the first OVC matchup of the season, as Tennessee Tech plays at Eastern Illinois on Thursday, Aug. 30. It marks the first time since the 1999 season (when Western Kentucky played at UT Martin) that an OVC matchup has occurred in the first week of the season. The feat has only happened one other time since 1990, that year Middle Tennessee opened the year at Tennessee State on Sept. 1.

I-AA No More: Although some people may accidentally still refer to it as I-AA football, the term that represents the level of Division I football in which the Ohio Valley Conference competes has been retired. Beginning with last year's national championship game, the term Football Championship Subdivision (or FCS) is to be used. FCS is the only Division I football rank to host a NCAA-sponsored national championship (one of 88 championships the NCAA sponsors). The division formerly known as I-A was changed to Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and those teams compete for the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) national championship. Teams who play at the FCS level can offer a maximum of 63 scholarships (FBS teams can offer 85) and compete in a 16-team playoff at the end of the season to determine the national champion.

OVCsports.TV: For the second consecutive year, fans can watch EVERY Conference matchup and all non-conference home contests this season at OVCsports.TV. The venture with XOS Technologies allows fans to access live and on-demand streaming video and audio of all conference matchups on their home computer. The premium Web site was launched in July 2006 and streamed hundreds of events in its first season, including all Conference matchups in football and men's and women's basketball as well as select baseball, soccer, softball and volleyball games and OVC Championship events. Last season the OVC was one of just two Conferences nationally streaming every football and men's and women's basketball game on the Internet. Packages are available on a yearly, seasonally, monthly or per-event basis. This week's games include:

Eastern Illinois Preseason Favorite Among Coaches/SID's: In a preseason league vote, Eastern Illinois was the favorite among head coaches and sports information directors to three-peat as OVC Champions. The Panthers, who have won or shared the last two titles, received eight of the 20 first-place votes to finish first. It marked the fourth time in the team's tenure with the League that they were the preseason favorites (EKU has been picked first the most, 16 times). Jacksonville State received six first-place votes and narrowly finished second behind EIU. Defending co-champion Tennessee-Martin was picked third, garnering four first-place votes, while Eastern Kentucky and Tennessee State each got one first-place vote and were slotted to finish fourth and fifth respectively. Tennessee Tech was picked sixth, followed by Murray State (7th), Southeast Missouri State (8th), Samford (9th) and Austin Peay (10th).

All-Time Preseason Predicted Order of Finish: Is being picked first in the Conference a good thing for Eastern Illinois? If history holds true, then maybe not. In each of the past four seasons, the preseason favorite has not gone on to win the OVC crown. The last team picked to win it all in the preseason and actually accomplish the feat was Eastern Illinois, who did it in back-to-back years (2001 and 2002). In 28 years of preseason polls, the preseason favorite has gone on to win the championship only 12 times (42.9%).

Chapman and Thomas Headline Preseason All-OVC Team: The 2007 preseason All-OVC team was highlighted by a pair of players who won Player of the Year honors in 2006. Tennessee-Martin running back **Don Chapman** (the co-Offensive Player of the Year last season) and Eastern Illinois linebacker **Donald Thomas** (the Defensive Player of the Year last season) were two of the 26 selections to the team. In total, Eastern Illinois had six players selected to the team, closely followed by Tennessee-Martin who had five selections. Eastern Kentucky, Jacksonville State, Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech each had three selections, while Murray State and Southeast Missouri had one apiece (Samford and Austin Peay were not represented). Overall, 13 players who were first-team selections a year ago made the preseason first-team this season.

Sgt. York Trophy: On July 24, the Nashville Sports Council and the Ohio Valley Conference announced the creation of the **Sergeant York Trophy**, a challenge trophy which will go to the annual winner of the quadrangular season series between the four OVC institutions in the state of Tennessee (Austin Peay, Tennessee-Martin, Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech). The team will the best record against the other schools will take home the trophy each year, and in case of a tie there will be co-champions and the actual trophy will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy. The award is only the second traveling trophy involving more than two schools (the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy). It is named after Sgt. Alvin C. York, a native of Pall Mall, Tenn. and a Soldier who was one of the most honored of World War I. He received the Congressional Medal of

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Honor after the war and returned to his home state to dedicate his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee.

FCS Playoffs: For the 11th straight season, the FCS Championship game will be held in Chattanooga, Tenn., this year on Saturday, Dec. 14 at Finley Stadium/Davenport Field. The playoffs will begin on Saturday, Nov. 24 and continue with second round games on Dec. 1 and semifinal contests on Dec. 7/Dec. 8 before the title game. Last season the OVC had two teams (Tennessee-Martin and Eastern Illinois) make the playoffs and this season will look to put two teams in the playoffs in back-to-back years for the first time since the 1999 and 2000 seasons.

Welcome Back: The 2007 season brings a familiar face back to the Ohio Valley Conference as Austin Peay will once again be sponsoring scholarship football and compete in the Conference. The Governors dropped scholarship football following the 1996 season and competed for a time in the Pioneer Football League. Last season the program played as an independent with some scholarships and will be back in full this year. The team also welcomes a new coach in former APSU quarterback **Rick Christophel**.

Add One, Lose One: The re-addition of Austin Peay to the Ohio Valley Conference brings the number of football playing institutions to 10, the largest number that has ever played football at one time in the OVC. That number will decrease to nine after this season, as Samford will exit to join the Southern Conference in all sports in 2008-09.

New Faces: **Rick Christophel** at Austin Peay is not the only new coach in the OVC this season. He is joined by **Watson Brown** at Tennessee Tech and **Pat Sullivan** at Samford. Uniquely all three have connections to each other, as all three were at UAB last season. Brown, who was the head coach at Austin Peay to begin his career (1979-80), had served as head coach at UAB from 1995 through last season before taking over the program at Tech, which is located in his hometown of Cookeville, Tenn. Sullivan, who won the 1971 Heisman Trophy as a quarterback at Auburn, was the offensive coordinator at UAB from 1999-05 and was the running backs coach last season; he was previously a head coach at Texas Christian (1992-97). Christophel had been at UAB from 1995 through 2007, serving as the defensive coordinator each of the past two seasons.

Another Coach Returns: One OVC head coach is not new to the League this year but does return after a one-year absence due to medical issues. Eastern Illinois' **Bob Spoo** took last season off following a medical procedure the week of the season-opener. In his place acting head coach Mark Hutson led the Panthers to the program's fourth OVC championship and a playoff appearance. But Spoo is healthy this year and returns to the sidelines for his 20th season in 2007.

Coaches At Their Alma Maters: Two of the current 10 OVC head football coaches are currently guiding their alma maters. Austin Peay's Rick Christophel is in his first season in Clarksville after previously serving as defensive coordinator at UAB. Christophel was a Gobs quarterback in the 1970s. Danny Hope of Eastern Kentucky is in his fifth year with the Colonels and has guided the team to four winning seasons in four years. He was a lineman at ECU and was part of the team's 1979 national championship squad. Two others coaches in the OVC will get to square off against their alma maters in 2007. Tennessee-Martin's Jason Simpson will take him Skyhawks to face Southern Miss in week No. 1 while Eastern Illinois' Bob Spoo will challenge his alma mater, Purdue, in week No. 2.

NFL Connections: As of August 27, 14 former Ohio Valley Conference football players are on NFL rosters for the 2007 season. That includes former EIU standout Tony Romo, who is the starting signal caller for the Dallas Cowboys. Among those 14 are three players who competed in the OVC last season, Edgar Jones (Southeast Missouri) of the Baltimore Ravens, Kyle Hunt (Southeast Missouri) of the Philadelphia Eagles and Mike Mason (Tennessee State) of the Cleveland Browns. Several NFL head coaches have connections to OVC schools including three current ones who played at Eastern Illinois - Brad Childress (Minnesota), Sean Payton (New Orleans) and Mike Shanahan (Denver). EIU is one of only two schools to have three alums with current head coaching gigs (San Diego State

with Joe Gibbs, John Fox and Herm Edwards and USC with Mike Holmgren, Jeff Fisher and Jack Del Rio are the other two). One of the NFL's newest coaches - Pittsburgh's Mike Tomlin - was a former assistant coach at Tennessee-Martin. UTM also got national recognition when a former player and coach, Jerry Reese, was named the general manager of the New York Giants during the off-season.

A Look Back at 2006: The 2006 season marked a first for the League, as Tennessee-Martin captured its first OVC Championship (sharing the title with Eastern Illinois). The Skyhawks, who joined the Conference in 1992, finished the year with a 9-3 overall record and 6-1 OVC mark. Prior to the season the program had recorded just one above .500 Conference mark (a 5-3 record in 1993). Over the last two seasons UTM is 10-5 in the Conference after compiling just an 11-89 (11%) mark over the previous nine seasons. Tennessee-Martin was rewarded with the League's automatic bid to the NCAA Playoffs, where it competed in its first postseason game as an I-AA (now FCS) school. Eastern Illinois, who finished the year 8-5 overall and 7-1 in the OVC, received an at-large bid to the NCAA Championship, the program's fifth bid in the last seven years. It marked the first time since the 2000 season that the OVC had two teams in the playoffs in the same season. UTM won its regular season meeting with EIU, 15-9, marking only its second win over the Panthers in 12 tries. UTM running back **Don Chapman** and Eastern Illinois running back **Vincent Webb** were named Co-Offensive Players of the Year while EIU's **Donald Thomas** earned Defensive Player of the Year honors. UTM's **Jason Simpson** picked up the Roy Kidd Coach of the Year award while Tennessee Tech freshman quarterback **Lee Sweeney** grabbed the Newcomer of the Year award.

Tiebreaker Procedures: The participants in the 2007 NCAA Football Championship Subdivision Playoffs will be announced on Sunday, Nov. 18. In the event of a tie for the OVC Championship, the following procedures will be used to break all ties and to determine the league's NCAA playoff representative.

TWO-WAY TIES

- 1.) A two-way tie shall exist only if the tied teams have the same number of losses.
- 2.) Should two teams have the same number of losses, and the two teams played each other during the regular season, the winner of the head-to-head contest shall be the league's postseason representative.
- 3.) If the two tied teams have the same number of losses, but did not play each other during the regular season, the following procedure shall be utilized to break the tie:
 - 3a.) A comparison of each team's head-to-head record against the team occupying the highest position in the regular-season standings that each team has played. If one team won its game against that team, the winning team shall be declared the representative.
 - 3b.) Should the procedure outlined in Item a. fail to break the tie, the process will continue to the next-place team and beyond until the tie is broken.
 - 3c.) When arriving at another group of tied teams, composite records between the tying teams shall be utilized to determine if one of the tied teams has won more games against the group of tied teams.
 - 4.) If the procedures described previously fail to break the tie, the representative shall be determined by a coin flip.

MULTIPLE TIES

- 1.) A multiple tie (three or more teams) shall exist only if the tied teams have the same number of losses.
- 2.) If all of the teams involved in the multiple tie played each other during the regular season, then the composite records among the tied teams shall be compared to break the tie.
- 3.) If the process outlined in Step 2 reduces the tie to a tie among two teams, the two-team tiebreaker formula shall then be utilized.
- 4.) If not all of the tied teams played each other during the regular season, or if step 2 does not break or reduce the tie, the following procedure shall be utilized:
 - 4a.) A comparison of each of the tied teams' head-to-head record against the team occupying the highest position in the regular-season standings that each team has played. If one team won its game against that team, the winning team shall be declared the representative.
 - 4b.) Should the procedure outlined in Item a. fail to break the tie, the process will continue to the next-place team and beyond until the tie is broken.
 - 4c.) When arriving at another group of tied teams, composite records between the tying teams shall be utilized to determine if one of the tied teams has won more games against the group of tied teams.
 - 5.) If the procedures described previously fail to break the tie, the representative shall be determined by a blind drawing.

SGT. YORK TROPHY

The 2007 season marks the first of competition for the Sergeant York Trophy, an award created by the Nashville Sports Council and the Ohio Valley Conference. The trophy will be contested between the four OVC schools in the state of Tennessee - Austin Peay, Tennessee State, Tennessee Tech and UT Martin - and go to the team with the best combined record versus those schools in a given year.

In the event of a tie, the award will be shared; however, the previous winner will retain the trophy if they are part of the tie. If the tie is between two other institutions, the trophy will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy.

The award is only the second traveling trophy that involves more than two teams in college sports; the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy which has been contested between Air Force, Army and Navy annually since 1972.

The award is named in honor of Alvin C. York, the most noted Soldier of World War I. Upon his return to the United States in 1919, he was bestowed the Congressional Medal of Honor. Following the war York returned his home in Pall Mall, Tenn. where he dedicated his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee.

The award will be presented annually at the Nashville Sports Council's O'Charley's Dinner of Champions.

FOOTBALL

One Division I

As most football fans know, three classifications – Division I-A, I-AA and I-AAA – were used to differentiate the administration of a school's football program. As of December 15, 2006, those three classifications were declared out of bounds and new designations were kicked off.

The Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) will be used to describe football programs that compete to participate in the postseason bowl system that includes the 32 NCAA-licensed bowls that make up the Bowl Championship Series.

The NCAA Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) now will be used to describe schools that participate in the NCAA championship postseason structure (one of 88 NCAA national championships that formerly was described as the I-AA football championship).

The Reason for the Change

The I-A, I-AA and I-AAA designations were confusing and as result, misapplied by college football fans and the media when referring not only to football programs (e.g., I-AA basketball). And because of greater awareness of specific conferences and schools, the I-A label was rarely emphasized by the I-A membership, which only caused greater confusion about the I-AA classification.

This initiative, voted into effect by the presidents and chancellors who comprise the NCAA Division I Board of Directors last August, is not intended to confuse or devalue the importance of the BCS format.

Why These Titles Were Chosen

These labels communicate in a positive and clear way about the differences between the Division I football classifications, chiefly the postseason opportunity, while still defining them within the Division I experience.

The name change also clearly defines the student-athlete experience. Rather than being incorrectly referred to by a football classification, they'll simply be a Division I student-athlete.

Spreading the Word

The use of the new football labels was rolled out at the 2006 NCAA Division I Football Championship game. During the course of the 2007 season, expect these new football designations to be used by members of the college football community, which includes student-athletes, corporate supporters, university/college officials, community leaders and media partners.

Coaches, administrators and staff have been asked to use the new classifications in media guides, game programs, Web sites, tickets and promotional materials.

Get to know the new names for the teams in your favorite game – the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS).

GAME NOTES: Tennessee Tech and Eastern Illinois not only begin the season this week but begin the Conference season. It marks the first time since the 1999 season that an OVC matchup has occurred in the first week of the regular season. Eastern Illinois will not play another Conference matchup until traveling to Southeast Missouri on Sept. 29, while Tennessee Tech plays its second OVC game on Sept. 22 when it hosts Murray State. Eastern Illinois leads the series 9-4 overall and has won six of the last seven overall in the series. Last year the Panthers spoiled the Eagles Homecoming with a 38-14 victory in what was a rain-soaked contest. EIU has won eight straight home conference games dating back to 2004, and nine of its last 10 regular season games at home.

SCOUTING TENNESSEE TECH: The Watson Brown Era at Tennessee Tech officially gets underway this week. The Cookeville native comes to Tech after 12 years as head coach at UAB. This season marks his 23rd overall as a head coach, as he has also had stops at Austin Peay, Cincinnati, Rice and Vanderbilt. Brown has some good talent to work with including sophomore quarterback Lee Sweeney and senior wide receiver Larry Shipp. As a redshirt freshman last season, Sweeney passed for 2,292 yards and 17 touchdowns, earning him second-team All-OVC honors as well as the league's Freshman of the Year honor. Shipp enters his final year just outside the OVC's career top 10 in receptions, and six catches away from the TTU career mark. The man he is chasing in both of those categories is Walter Hill, who caught 148 balls from 1996-99. His 2,050 career receiving yards are also just outside the top 10 in OVC history.

SCOUTING EASTERN ILLINOIS: Eastern Illinois enters the season ranked in all three major FCS polls, including 17th in the Sports Network and FCS Coaches Polls. The Panthers have won or shared the last two OVC Championship and made two straight NCAA Playoff appearances. The program is looking to become the first OVC school since 1986-88 to win three straight championships. In 27 years of Division I football action, this year marks only the eighth time the Panthers will have opened the season in the friendly confines of O'Brien Stadium. The last time EIU opened the season at home was in 2004, when they suffered a 33-30 overtime loss to Indiana State. Eastern Illinois returns the 2006 OVC Defensive Player of the Year in linebacker Donald Thomas. Thomas had 127 total tackles (49 solo) last year to go along with 12 tackles for loss, a sack, two interceptions, three pass breakups, seven quarterback hurries, two forced fumbles and four fumble recoveries. His presence in the middle of the Panther defense should once again make EIU one of the top defensive teams in the Conference as well as nationally. Although the team did lose OVC Co-Offensive Player of the Year Vincent Webb (RB), the Panthers do return quarterback Cole Stinson and his favorite target, wide receiver Micah Rucker. Stinson completed 54.5 percent of his passes last season for 1,349 yards and 12 touchdowns. Rucker was on the receiving end of 13 total touchdown passes from Stinson and two other EIU QB's, as he totaled 966 yards on 49 total receptions.

GAME NOTES: The Redhawks kick off season No. 2 under Tony Samuel by facing a good Cincinnati team that finished last season 8-5 overall, 4-3 in the Big East and was victorious in the International Bowl. Since moving to Division I status in 1992, Southeast Missouri is 1-11 all-time against Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS, formerly I-A) teams. That lone victory came in 2002, when the Redhawks topped Middle Tennessee 24-14. Last season Southeast Missouri lost 63-7 at FBS opponent Arkansas. Following this Thursday night road contest the team will return home for back-to-back home games over the next two weekends. SEMO will entertain Southwest Baptist (Sept. 8) and Indiana State (Feb. 15) at Houck Stadium.

SCOUTING SOUTHEAST MISSOURI: Southeast Missouri will have a lot of new personnel this year, after losing some talented players to graduation and the NFL. That included All-American punter David Simonhoff and a pair of players - Edgar Jones and Kyle Hunt - who are currently on NFL rosters. Jones is a DE for the Baltimore Ravens while Kyle Hunt is playing TE for the Philadelphia Eagles. One position that is open this year is quarterback. Entering the first week of the season it is a dead heat between junior college transfers Vincent Anderson and Houston Lillard as to who will start against the Bearcats. Whoever wins the battle will have some tall wideouts to throw to this season, as the team has four newcomers who are 6-3 or taller, including 6-6 Chante Ahamefule, 6-5 Daryl Gist, 6-4 TE Ben Gugler and 6-3 Miles Edwards.

SCOUTING CINCINNATI: Last season Cincinnati opened the season by taking on another OVC team - Eastern Kentucky; the Bearcats won that game 31-0. The 'Cats were picked to finish fifth in the eight-team Big East Conference this season. Head coach Brian Kelly spent 13 years at Grand Valley State and three at Central Michigan (including most of last year) before taking over the Cincinnati program prior to the International Bowl victory over Western Michigan (27-24). The team returns 15 starts (7 on offense, 8 on defense) from last year's team. The team will have a new starting quarterback, as former Wake Forest signal caller Ben Mauk has been named the starter. Mauk played in Wake's season-opener last season before suffering an injury and missing the rest of the season. The senior played in 18 total games, starting 10. Three other quarterbacks may also see action at some point of Thursday's game.

GAME NOTES: Although the two teams have played 16 times dating back to 1927, this will be the first meeting since the 1990 season when UofL topped the Racers 68-0. This year's meeting is the earliest the two teams have ever played and it will be shown to a national audience on ESPN. The Racers play three of its first four games on the road this season, hosting only Lambuth (Sept. 15) between now and Sept. 29. Murray State is matching up with a Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) team for the 10th time since 2000; the team has also played the likes of Minnesota, Ole Miss, Kentucky, Connecticut and Missouri.

SCOUTING MURRAY STATE: Murray State enters year No. 2 of a rebuilding effort for head coach Matt Griffin. After six winning seasons in a row in the mid-to-late '90s, including an 11-1 and 11-2 campaign in Houston Nutt's final two years with the program (1995, 1996), Murray State has only two winning seasons over the past six years. Griffin is building with youth, as last season he utilized 19 true freshmen and three redshirt freshmen. At the end of last season nine true freshmen were listed as No. 1 on the depth chart. This season the roster includes 72 freshmen and sophomores and only 14 juniors and seniors on the roster. Among those returning from last year's squad are sophomore linebacker Tamar Butler, senior linebacker Nathan Williams and sophomore safety Taylor Lanigan. Butler had 69 tackles (9.5 for loss) last season while Williams added 100 (5.0 for loss) and 3.0 sacks a season ago. Lanigan made 73 stops and intercepted a pair of passes for Murray State as a freshman in 2006. Running backs Charlie Jordan and Josh Jones also return (712 combined yards) as does quarterback Zach Barnard (1,583 yards, 11 touchdowns). Barnard was not named the starter for the UofL game, however, as redshirt freshman Jeff Ehrhardt won the battle out of camp and will start under center on Thursday night.

SCOUTING LOUISVILLE: The Cardinals have been on the rise nationally over the past decade, appearing in nine straight bowl games and finishing the year ranked in the top 10 nationally in two of the last three years. Louisville enters the season with an 18-game winning streak at Cardinal Stadium (dating back to a 37-7 loss to Memphis in 2003), the second-longest streak nationally behind USC's 33 wins in a row. The Cards have a 33.6 average margin of victory at home over the past four seasons and have scored 40 or more points in 14 of the 18 games during the winning streak. The team features senior quarterback Brian Brohm, who is a favorite not only for the Heisman Trophy but could possibly be the No. 1 overall NFL Draft Pick next season. He is 18-3 as a starter and has career numbers of 6,751 yards, 472 completions and 41 touchdowns. Louisville is coached by Steve Kragthorpe, who is in his first season after being the head coach at Tulsa the past four seasons.

GAME NOTES: The regular season begins for Samford on Thursday as does the Pat Sullivan Era. Sullivan, a Heisman Trophy winner in college at Auburn, brings a wealth of experience as head coach to the program. He was a head coach at TCU from 1992 through 1997 and most recently was an assistant coach across town at UAB. He is not the first well-known coach to lead the Bulldogs; other Samford coaches through the years have included Bobby Bowden, Terry Bowden and Chan Gailey. The meeting between in-state rivals is the 16th in the series. The two schools are separated by just over 100 miles, as Livingston is an hour and 45 minutes southwest of Birmingham. Four of the last five meetings have taken place in Birmingham and the Bulldogs own an 8-6-1 all-time advantage in the series. The teams last played in 2004 when Samford won 34-20. Current NFL players Efrem Hill (Cleveland Browns) caught nine passes for 209 yards and three scores in that contest.

SCOUTING WEST ALABAMA: The Division II Tigers are a member of the Gulf South Conference and were 6-5 last season and 3-5 in conference action. That marked the program's first winning season in 14 years and they were selected seventh in this year's preseason Gulf South Coaches Poll. Junior place kicker Mitch Warfield was named a preseason All-GSC selection; Warfield was 10-for-14 (71.4%) on field goal attempts last season and connected on all 37 point after attempts. Warfield was also recently named a preseason All-American by *Don Hansen's Football Gazette*.

SCOUTING SAMFORD: Samford begins its 91st season of football on Thursday and is 39-47-4 all-time in season openers, but have won five in a row to open the season, with four of those coming at Seibert Stadium, a venue where the team is 122-60-4 (66.7%) all-time. The Bulldogs were picked up finish ninth in the Conference this season and it is unknown exactly how they will perform under a first-year head coach. Pat Sullivan and his staff do have four Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) transfers on the roster this season, most of which should see significant playing time this season. After sharing time with two other quarterbacks a season, senior Jefferson Adcock should return to the primary signal caller role this season. Two years ago he passed for 2,338 yards in starting all 11 games; in a shared system last year he had only 915 yards and five touchdowns. Adcock currently ranks eighth in total offense in Samford history (3,684 yards and seventh in career passing (3,253 yards). He will be throwing a lot to senior wideout Jeff Moore, who enters the season fourth in Bulldog history in receptions (132).

GAME NOTES: Eastern Kentucky and Kentucky, separated by only about 30 miles, are meeting for the second time in their long and storied histories. The teams last played on Sept. 12, 1998 when Kentucky came away with a 52-7 victory. In that game Tim Couch threw for five touchdowns to lead the Wildcats.

SCOUTING EASTERN KENTUCKY: The Colonels begin year No. 5 under head coach Danny Hope, who played and won a national championship at EKU and is now looking to take his alma mater back to the playoffs. The Colonels were picked to finish fourth in a preseason vote of head coaches and sports information directors. Hope has directed the program to four winning seasons during his tenure and a 7-1 Conference finish in 2005. In fact the team has finished as the league runner-up in three of his four seasons. Overall the program has not had a losing season since 1977 (when they were 5-5), and are looking to increase that streak to 30 years in a row this season. The team returns senior quarterback Josh Greco, who is poised to write his name into the EKU and OVC record books. Greco enters the season eighth in OVC history in career completions (463) and he sits just outside the career top 10 for passing yards (5,743). Greco has been successful in his career thanks to a strong offensive line. The O-Line will once again be a strength for the Colonels as a pair of players, Sean Dumford and Bakahri Thornton, were selected to the pre-season All-OVC squad.

SCOUTING KENTUCKY: The Wildcats are coming off an 8-5 record and a Music City Bowl Championship last season, the fourth year under head coach Rich Brooks. The momentum off the way last season ended has garnered the Cats votes in some preseason polls. The team has 15 starters returning including preseason All-American quarterback Andre' Woodson, who passed for 3,515 yards and 31 touchdowns (vs. only 7 interceptions) as a junior. He will have some of his favorite targets back this season, including Keenan Burton, who caught 77 passes for 1,036 yards and 12 scores a year ago. Woodson has an active streak of 162 passing attempts without an interceptions, which is a school record.

GAME NOTES: Tennessee State will host Alabama A&M in the 9th Annual John Merritt Classic (JMC) this weekend. The Classic is named after the legendary TSU coach who compiled a 232-6-511 (77.1%) record during his career including a mark of 172-33-7 (82.8%) at Tennessee State from 1963-83. Merritt, a member of the College Football Hall of Fame, helped the Tigers to seven black national championships and five undefeated seasons during his tenure. TSU is 6-2 all-time in JMC contests and is facing Alabama A&M for the fifth time in the event. A&M game away with a 27-14 victory in 2005 and a 27-20 win a year ago. TSU topped the Bulldogs 27-6 in the 2001 Classic and 42-7 in 2004.

SCOUTING ALABAMA A&M: Alabama A&M is coming off a 9-3 season and SWAC Championship a year ago and is receiving votes in several national polls to begin the 2007 season. The Bulldogs and head coach Anthony Jones are preparing for an encore with 15 total starters back from last season's squad. Kelcy Luke returns at quarterback after guiding his team to back-to-back SWAC Championship games. He owns school records at the Division I level for completions (377) and passing yards (4,389) for his career. He has also rushed for 1,227 yards. Defensively, Frank Moore had six interceptions last year for A&M and leads an experienced group of defensive backs.

SCOUTING TENNESSEE STATE: This season the Tigers will look to build on a 6-5 overall and 5-2 Conference mark from a season ago. Going into the last game of the 2006 season, Tennessee State had a chance to grab a share of the OVC Championship, but a 20-3 loss at Eastern Kentucky forced them to finish third overall. Head coach James Webster helped guide his team to that 5-2 OVC mark last year, which was only the team's second plus-.500 conference winning percentage since 2000. This year's team will have plenty of talented returnees to help build on that momentum. Included in that group is junior quarterback Antonio Heffner, a first-team All-OVC preseason selection. In his first year with the squad last season, Heffner passed for 1,668 yards and nine touchdowns while also rushing for 172 yards and five more scores. He ranked among the national leaders in both passing efficiency and total offense during the campaign. TSU also has two very capable running backs, including Javarris Williams, who has been a second-team All-OVC selection at the end of the past two seasons, and Terrence Wright. Defensively, senior Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie has been named a preseason All-American by nearly every media outlet. Rodgers-Cromartie had six interceptions and seven pass breakups last season to go along with 47 tackles on his way to first-team All-OVC honors. Tennessee State will continue its run of Classics next week by taking part in the Southern Heritage Classic in Memphis, Tenn.; the Tigers will battle Jackson State in that contest.

GAME NOTES: Austin Peay begins its first season as a member of the Ohio Valley Conference since 1996. Following the 1996 season, the Governors departed the league to participate in non-scholarship football. Austin Peay has claim to one OVC Championship in its past (1977) and the team was a proud member from 1963 to 1996. Since departing the league, the program has only had one winning season (7-5 in 2002).

SCOUTING BETHEL COLLEGE: Bethel College is located in McKenzie, Tenn., which is about two hours west of Clarksville and the Austin Peay campus. The NAIA Wildcats are members of the Mid-South Conference and were ranked No. 6 nationally in the first NAIA poll of the season. The team opened their season with a 42-21 victory over Webber International University this past weekend. The team trailed 6-0 early but scored 35 unanswered points in cruising to an easy victory. The running game was going for the 'Cats, as Adrain Smith gained 207 yards on the ground (14.8 per carry) and scored four touchdowns while Terrance Bell added 100 yards and a score. Smith is a two-time All-American (including first-team honors by the AFCA a year ago) while Bell was an honorable mention All-American pick in 2005. Head coach Dino Kaklis was the AFCA Regional Coach of the Year at the NAIA level a season ago when his team was 10-3 overall and 7-1 in the Mid-South (6-0 vs. the West Division).

SCOUTING AUSTIN PEAY: The program returns to the OVC under the direction of first-year head coach Rick Christophel, who was a quarterback for the Govs from 1971-74. Christophel was later an assistant coach at his alma mater and later went on to have coaching stints at Southern Arkansas, Cincinnati, Rice, Vanderbilt, Mississippi State and UAB. he was most recently the defensive coordinator at UAB. Although the team's schedule is a little harder than in previous seasons, Austin Peay should have enough firepower to stay competitive in games this season. The program returns a trio of offensive stars who made an impact last season - QB Mark Cunningham, RB Chris Fletcher and WR Lanis Frederick. Cunningham threw for 2,236 yards and 12 touchdowns last season while Fletcher rushed for 1,401 yards and 16 scores and Frederick added 77 catches for 1,101 yards and seven touchdowns.

GAME NOTES: Tennessee-Martin will begin the 2007 season with a date at Southern Miss, which is the alma mater of Skyhawk head coach Jason Simpson. Simpson played two seasons of college football and baseball at Mississippi State before transferring to Southern Miss to play his final two seasons.

SCOUTING TENNESSEE-MARTIN: Although it was probably not a surprise to the players, coaches or administration, UT Martin's explosion onto the national scene last year may have taken many by surprise. After holding a 20-84 (19.2%) all-time OVC record, the Skyhawks finished last season 9-3 overall, 6-1 in the OVC, shared the OVC Championship (with Eastern Illinois) and made their first-ever NCAA Division I Playoff appearance. The program lost 36-30 to No. 10 Southern Illinois in the playoffs, losing in the final minute, but finished the season ranked 13th nationally and caused a lot of national media to take a second look at the program. For his efforts, first-year head coach Jason Simpson took home the Roy Kidd OVC Coach of the Year trophy. The team will look to repeat that tremendous season in 2007 and will look to another strong running attack to do so. The focus will be on senior running back Don Chapman who enters the season with 3,892 career rushing yards, which is seventh in OVC history, just 1,257 yards behind the all-time record (held by ECU's Markus Thomas), which has stood for 15 years; he needs just 141 yards to hold the UTM all-time rushing record. Another mark the senior is pursuing is the chance to become the 13th player in Division I football history to rush for more than 1,000 yards in four consecutive seasons. UT Martin begins this season ranked in all three major FCS polls, including 16th in the Sports Media Entertainment poll, 18th in the FCS Coaches Poll and 22nd in the Sports Network poll.

SCOUTING SOUTHERN MISS: The Golden Eagles finished last season 9-5 overall and were 6-2 in Conference USA, which was first place in the East Division. They return 16 starters and 40 total letterwinners from last year's GMAC Bowl squad. In the GMAC Bowl, the Golden Eagles topped Ohio 28-7 to extend its bowl winning streak to three. The offense, which was No. 25 nationally in rushing last season, has six starters back including a pair of talented sophomores. Damion Fletcher finished the season 11th nationally in rushing and led all freshmen, as he finished with 1,388 yards on 52 carries (5.0 yards per carry); he also scored 11 touchdowns. Harrison, also a true freshman last season, carried the ball 52 times for 326 yards (6.3 yards per carry) and scored two touchdowns; he had a season-high 138 yards at Memphis and ran for a touchdown in the GMAC Bowl.

GAME NOTES: Alabama State and Jacksonville State are meetings for the third time overall in 2007. The teams played in 1980 (a 24-14 win by JSU) and in 1981 (ASU won 20-14) but the series has been dormant for the past 15 years. Jacksonville State is 135-84-10 all-time against teams from the state of Alabama, and has won six straight against Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) teams from the state. The only in-state foe to hold a winning series record against the Gamecocks is UAB (3-2). JSU is 45-45-7 all-time in season openers and 15-13-2 all-time in road season openers. The Gamecocks are 21-4-2 all-time against teams from the SWAC.

SCOUTING JACKSONVILLE STATE: Jacksonville State enters its 104th season of football and eighth year under head coach Jack Crowe in 2007. JSU is the winningiest team in the OVC since joining the Conference in 2003 (25-7); the team claimed OVC Championship in each 2003 and 2004, going 7-1 in Conference play in each of those seasons. This season the 90-man JSU roster includes 49 players who have never played a down for the team. Of the portion of the roster that is returning this season, three Gamecocks were named to the preseason All-OVC squad this summer. Those players include offensive lineman Devon May, punter Zach Walden and kicker Gavin Hallford. The team also returns quarterback Matt Hardin (1,728 yards and eight touchdowns) and wideout Taurean Rhetta (30 catches, 568 yards and four touchdowns). Jacksonville State will be looking to continue a streak of 75 consecutive games with at least one score; they have scored in every game since being shutout 28-0 by Troy in 2000.

SCOUTING ALABAMA STATE: Alabama State is under the direction of first-year head coach Reggie Barlow, who is a native of Montgomery, Ala. and played college football at ASU. He was selected in the fourth round of the 1996 NFL Draft by Jacksonville and led the NFL in punt return yardage in 1998. He would later go on to capture a Super Bowl ring in 2002, as a member of the Tampa Bay Buccaneers. He joined the ASU staff in 2005 as a quarterbacks coach. The Hornets were 5-6 overall in 2006 and return 67 lettermen and 15 starters from that squad.
