THIS WEEK'S OVC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

Drake Reed, F • Sr., 6-5, 225 • Clarksville, Tenn. • Austin Peay

Reed earned his fourth OVC Player of the Week award of the season after averaging 30.5 points and 9.0 rebounds in a pair of Austin Peay wins last week. Reed had his seventh 30point outing of the season on Saturday, hitting 14-of-23 shots on his way to 33 points in a Senior Night victory over Southeast Missouri. He also grabbed 12 rebounds in the game, marking his seventh double-double of the season. Against Eastern Illinois he scored 28 points (20 in the first half) on 11-of-18 shooting in a Govs win. For the week Reed hit 61 percent (25-of-41) from the field. During the week he became the first Austin Peay player to score 1,900 or more points and grab 750 or more rebounds in a career.

Miles earned his second straight Newcomer of the Week award (and third of the season) after leading Murray State to three wins last week. Included in that was a triple-double against UT Martin, as Miles became the first Racer (and ninth player in OVC history) to record that feat. Miles had 13 points, 10 rebounds and 11 assists in the win over the Skyhawks. He followed that with 13 points, four rebounds and six assists against Morehead State and 18 points and six assists in an overtime victory over Eastern Kentucky. For the week Miles averaged 14.7 points, 4.7 rebounds, 7.7 assists and 2.0 steals per game.

CO-FRESHMAN

Ivan Aska, F • Fr., 6-8, 230 • Ft. Lauderdale, Fla. • Murray State

Aska earned his second straight Freshman of the Week honor (and third of the season) after averaging 15.0 points and 6.7 rebounds per game in three Murray State victories last week. He opened the week with a 23-point, 11-rebound performance in a win over UT Martin, hitting 9-of-14 (64.3%) from the field. Aska had six points and three rebounds against Morehead State and capped the week with 16 points in the Racers overtime victory over Eastern Kentucky.

Murphy scored 21 points on 7-of-12 (58.3%) shooting as Tennessee Tech topped Jacksonville State 91-74 in the regular season finale to secure the No. 8 seed in the OVC Tournament. Murphy also pulled down six rebounds, had two assists and a steal. He was 6-of-6 from the free throw line and is 12-of-14 from the charity stripe over the past three games. 



NOTES FROM AROUND THE LEAGUE

Morehead State Nets First NCAA Tournament Win for OVC in 20 Years: With its 58-43 win over Alabama State in the Opening Round game in Dayton, Morehead State snapped a 19-year losing streak in the NCAA Tournament for teams from the Ohio Valley Conference. It marked the first NCAA Tournament victory since Middle Tennessee State beat Florida State 97-83 in Nashville in 1989. The Eagles were then defeated by No. 1 overall seed Louisville in the first round. OVC teams are now 21-61 all-time in the NCAA Tournament.

Opening Round Game Draws Record Crowd: Morehead State's Opening Round victory over Alabama State was witnessed by 11,346 fans (many wearing MSU blue and gold) at the University of Dayton Arena, a record for the game that has been played at that site since its inception nine years

Three Teams in Postseason: Three OVC team played in the postseason this year, as Morehead State earned the automatic bid into the NCAA Tournament, UT Martin was selected to the NIT after winning the OVC Regular Season Championship and Austin Peay was tabbed for the inaugural CollegeInsider.com tournament. It marks the first time since 1987 that three OVC schools have competed in the postseason. That year Austin Peay and Middle Tennessee played in the NCAA Tournament and Akron was in the NIT.

The OVC All-Time in the NIT: UT Martin played in this year's National Invitational Tournament, putting an OVC team back in the event after having no representation in 2008. The Skyhawks lost 87-82 at No. 1 seed Auburn in the first round of this year's event. OVC teams are now 12-22 all-time in the NIT. The most recent success was Tennessee Tech in 2002; the Golden Eagles (coach then by Jeff Lebo) beat Georgia State, Dayton and Yale before falling to Memphis in the quarterfinals (one game short of playing in Madison Square Garden).

Morehead State Claims First OVC Tournament Title in 25 Years: It took two overtimes but Morehead State topped Austin Peay 67-65 in the OVC Tournament Championship game to win its first title since 1983. The year the Eagles beat Youngstown State 81-65 on its home court to advance to the NCAA Tournament. The team's only other OVC Tournament title came the year prior in 1983 when MSU beat Akron 81-65. Overall Morehead State is now 5-7 in six NCAA Tournament appearances (1956, 1957, 1961, 1983, 1984, 2009). In its last appearance prior to this year (1984), Morehead State topped North Carolina A&T 70-69 before falling to Louisville 72-59.

UT Martin Wins First OVC Regular Season Championship: With wins in its final two games of the regular season, UT Martin (14-4 in OVC play) won its first OVC Championship since joining the league (and Division I) in 1992-93. The team's best prior finish had been fourth place, something they did a season ago as well as in 1995-96. Those prior two seasons marked the only ones in which the Skyhawks had a winning Conference record. UTM has also reached the 20-win plateau this year, the first time they did that since moving to Division I. The team's only winning records overall had been in 2001-02 (15-14) and 2007-08 (17-16).

Hudson Sets OVC Single-Season Scoring Record: By scoring 33 points in his final game of the season (a loss to No. 1 seed Auburn in the NIT), UT Martin senior guard Lester Hudson broke the OVC single-season scoring record, a mark that had stood for 38 years. Hudson finished the season with 880 points, eclipsing the 878 points scored by Western Kentucky's Jim McDaniels in the 1970-71 season.

Hudson Named All-American by CollegeInsider.com: The University of Tennessee at Martin senior guard Lester Hudson was one of 16 players named to the 2009 CollegeInsider.com All-American team, as the Memphis native continues to rack up the postseason hardware. Of the 16 All-Americans, Hudson is one of only two players who isn't from a team featured in a BCS conference. Davidson's Stephen Curry is the other. Hudson was an integral part of the Skyhawks' first-ever Ohio Valley Conference championship this season, leading the team in 20 statistical categories, including scoring, rebounding, steals and blocks. The other players named as CollegeInsider.com All-Americans include: Pittsburgh's DeJuan Blair; Arizona's Chase Budinger; Curry; Memphis' Tyreke Evans; Oklahoma's Blake Griffin; North Carolina's Tyler Hansbrough; Notre Dame's Luke Harangody; Arizona State's James Harden; Duke's Gerald Henderson; North Carolina's Ty Lawson: Marquette's Jerel McNeal; Wake Forest's Jeff Teague; Connecticut's Hasheem Thabeet; Louisville's Terrence Williams; and Pittsburgh's Sam Young.

Hudson Named AP Honorable Mention All-American: University of Tennessee at Martin's Lester Hudson was named honorable mention on the Associated Press' All-American Team for 2008-09. This is the second consecutive year that Hudson has been named on the AP All-American team, making him the only men's basketball player in program history to accomplish that feat. Hudson, who was also the Ohio Valley Conference Player of the Year for a second consecutive season, became the first-ever AP All-American Team member at UT Martin last season. After one of the best all-around seasons in league history a year ago, Hudson, the OVC preseason Player of the Year this season, put together another season to remember this year. Hudson averaged 27.5 points a contest, which was second nationally (trailing only Davidson's Stephen Curry). He scored 20 or more points in the first 26 games of the season, becoming the only player in Division I to accomplish that feat. He has scored 30 or more points in 11 games this season, including a careerhigh 42 points against Tennessee Tech in the first round of the OVC Tournament. But Hudson did more than just score, as he had 11 double-doubles this season, and was one of just 13 players nationally who average 5-plus point, 4-plus rebounds, 4-plus assists and 2-plus steals per game (teammate Delrico Lane is another one of the 13 players). Hudson also led the UT Martin team (and ranked third in the OVC) in rebounding (7.9 rebounds/game), his 2.3 steals per game ranks 21st nationally, his 3.3 3-pointers made/game was 12th and his 88.1 percent free throw percentage was the 12th-best nationally. The Memphis native was named OVC Player of the Week seven times this season (including five weeks in a row at one point) and 11 times in his two-year career; both are OVC records. Hudson has also been named to the FoxSports.com Mid-Major All-American Team, United States Basketball Writers Association Division I All-District (IV) Team, National Association of Basketball Coaches Division I All-District Team, while also earning spots on the All-OVC

The 2009 Ohio Valley Conference Men's & Women's Tournaments will be held March 3, 6-7. The first round games will be held at campus sites (top four seeds on each side) on Tuesday, March 3. Those games can be seen live on OVCSports.TV.

This marks the 15th time in 16 years that the tournament has been held in Nashville and 10th time the event has been held at the Sommet Center (and first since the 2007 tournament).

Reed, Faried and Aska Earn CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major Honors: Austin Peay's Drake Reed, Morehead State's Kenneth Faried and Murray State's Ivan Aska have been honored for their outstanding basketball seasons by CollegeInsider.com. Reed was selected a Mid-Major All-American, Faried was tabbed to the Mid-Major Defensive All-American Team and Aska a Mid-Major Freshman All-American. All of the awards were selected by a panel of NCAA D-I coaches, National Basketball Association scouts, and CollegeInsider.com staff. Reed, one of 21 players selected to the team, finished his senior season averaging a career-best 21.9 ppg and 7.5 rpg in leading the Govs to the Ohio Valley Conference tourney championship game and a berth in the inaugural CollegeInsider.com Post-Season Tournament. Along the way Reed earned his third straight first-team All-OVC selection. As a senior, Reed has fashioned seven 30-point outings along with eight double doubles. He finished third among the nation's forwards in scoring. Reed was particularly spectacular in February in leading the Govs to the OVC tourney's No. 2 seed. He reached 30 or more points in five of eight contests. During the month, Reed averaged 29.3 ppg, shooting 58.9 percent (86 of 146) from the floor and 80.3 percent (53 of 66) from the freethrow line. He averaged 8.9 rpg in the month. As a result, Reed became the first Austin Peay player in history to score more than 1,900 points and grab at least 750 rebounds. In fact, Reed finished his career just nine points shy of 2,000. Faried was one of 11 honorable mention selections to the Mid-Major All-American Team and one of 21 players selected to the Mid-Major Defensive All-American Team. Faried, who was also named the OVC Defensive Player of the Year, led the league in rebounding with 13.0 caroms a contest in 2008-09. That figure ranked him third nationally. His 24 double-doubles also ranked among the nation's leaders in 2008-09. Faried also ranked among the league leaders in steals and field goal percentage. His performance helped Morehead State to its first OVC Tournament Championship in 25 years and a berth in the NCAA Tournament. The Eagles topped Alabama State in the Opening Round game, marking the OVC's first NCAA Tournament victory since 1989. Aska, one of 21 players selected to the All-Freshman squad, had an outstanding freshman season that led to being named the Ohio Valley Conference Freshman of the Year. He was MSU's third-leading scorer at 10.3 points per game and first in rebounding with 5.8 per game. Aska earned OVC Freshman of the Week honors three times. In just his third college game Nov. 22, he scored 20 points and grabbed six rebounds in MSU's win over WKU. Aska had 16 games of double-figure scoring in his first season and had two games of double-figure rebounding including 11 against UTM in the same Feb. 23 game when he scored his season-high of 23 points. He was second on the team with 125 field goals and managed a .527 clip in field goal percentage.

Hudson Finishes Season Second Nationally in Scoring: OVC Preseason Player of the Year Lester Hudson finished the season ranked second nationally in scoring (27.5) trailing only Davidson's Stephen Curry. For the first 26 games of the season Hudson scored 20 or more points in each, making him the only player nationally to do so. He failed to score 20 or more points against each Murray State (Feb. 23) and Eastern Kentucky (Feb. 26) but has scored 20-plus in his last three games. He has scored 20 or more points in 30 of 32 games this season. His season-high is 42 points against Tennessee Tech in the first round of the OVC Tournament; Hudson scored 41 in a game at Čentral Arkansas earlier in the season. Last season Hudson was the first men's player in Division I history to record a quadruple-double.

Morehead State's Faried Has Third-Best Rebounding Game of the Season Nationally; Ranks Third Nationally in Rebounding: Morehead State's Kenneth Faried grabbed a careerhigh 24 rebounds against Florida A&M on Nov. 23. For the season that performance ranks as the third most rebounds by one player in a game at the Division I level. It trailed only a 27-rebound performance by Santa Clara's John Bryant and a 25-rebound performance by Chris Gadley of Canisius. Faried has also had a 21-rebound game, a 20-rebound game, a 19-rebound game, an 18rebound outing, five 17-rebound performances and two 16-rebound games in 2008-09. Faried averaged 13.0 rebounds per game this season, which ranked third nationally (he averaged 13.5 rebounds per game in 20 OVC contests this season).

Rose Leads Nation in 3-Point Percentage: Eastern Kentucky senior Mike Rose was the most accurate 3-point shooter in the nation in 2008-09, connecting on 48.1 percent of his attempts. Rose hit 99-of-206 3-point attempts during the year. As a team, Eastern Kentucky was second nationally in 3-pointers made per game (10.3) and ninth nationally in 3-point percentage (40.1%).

Faried Ranks Among Nation's Leaders on Double-Doubles: Morehead State sophomore center Kenneth Faried finished the season with 25 double-doubles in 2008-09. That was the second-highest total nationally, behind Oklahoma's Blake Griffin who had 29 double-doubles dur-

Moving up the Coaching Victory Chart: Austin Peay head coach Dave Loos now has 314 career victories while in the OVC, a mark that ranks second in league history. He is just five (5) wins shy of Cal Luther (319 wins at Murray State and UT Martin) for the all-time mark. He is by far the active leader in the category as well, as only two other current OVC coaches - UT Martin's Bret Campbell and Tennessee Tech's Mike Sutton have reached the 100-win plateau at their respective OVC schools.

Double Overtime Times Two a First: Fans who attended the 2009 OVC Tournament sure got their money's worth. Not only did the women's championship game (Austin Peay vs. Eastern Illinois) go into overtime but so did the men's title game (Morehead State vs. Austin Peay). It marked the first time in NCAA history that a conference had both its men's and women's tournament title game go into double overtime in the same season. In fact on the men's side, it marked only the sixth double overtime tournament championship in conference history, joining the 1965 and 1984 Southern Conference games, the 1970 ACC title game, the 2004 Mountain West game and the 2006 Pac-10 title game.

OVC Tournament Held at Sommet Center for 10th Time: The 2009 OVC Basketball Tournament marked the 10th time the event has been held at the Sommet Center in downtown Nashville.

The event was first held there in 1997 (marking the first basketball event in the venue) and has been held there every year since with the exceptions of 2002, 2004 and 2008. The last time the event was held there Eastern Kentucky hit a last second shot to top Austin Peay in the championship game. This time the men's final went two overtimes with Morehead State finally topping Austin Peay when Steve Peterson hit his only bucket of the game with 1.4 seconds left in the second overtime. Overall this year marked the 15th time in the last 16 years the tournament has been held in Nashville (with 2002 being the only year in that stretch the event was not in Music City).

Hudson Named to USBWA All-District Team: Lester Hudson, a senior guard at The University of Tennessee at Martin, has been named to the U.S. Basketball Writers Association 2008-09 men's all-district team. Other members of the District IV team include Florida's Nick Calathes, Florida State's Toney Douglas, Memphis' Tyreke Evans, Miami's Jack McClinton, Kentucky's Jodie Meeks, Tennessee's Tyler Smith, Central Florida's Jermaine Taylor, Mississippi State's Jarvis Varnado and Louisville's Terrence Williams. Meeks was named the District IV Player of the Year, while Memphis' John Calipari was named the Coach of the Year. District IV includes teams from the state of Kentucky, Tennessee, Mississippi, Alabama, Georgia and Florida.

A Familiar Matchup - Peay and Murray Meet in OVC Semifinals: Austin Peay and Murray State met in the OVC Tournament semifinals this year, marking the 23rd straight season that at least one of those teams has appeared in the semifinals and later the finals (Austin Peay won this year's matchup). The last time one of these two titans was not in the semifinals was in 1985 when Middle Tennessee, Tennessee Tech, Youngstown State and Eastern Kentucky played. Including this year, one of the two teams have played in the championship game in 23 straight years dating back to 1986 when Akron beat Middle Tennessee.

Cooper Named Head Coach at Tennessee State: John A. Cooper was named head coach for Tigers Men's basketball program at Tennessee State University on March 27. Cooper comes to Tennessee State from Auburn University where he served as Associate Head Men's Basketball coach with Jeff Lebo. Cooper has over fifteen years of basketball coaching experience having coached at Oregon, South Carolina and Fayetteville State. This will be Cooper's first post as a head coach. Cooper is a native of Kansas City, Missouri and played collegiately at Wichita State, under Eddie Folger, where he led the Shockers in scoring and rebounding during both his junior and senior seasons. He was a team captain his final two seasons and a Rhodes Scholar candidate in his senior year. Cooper spent five years at Auburn (2004-2009) and played a vital role in the revitalization of the Auburn basketball program, as the Tigers recorded their first winning season in four years (2003). This season, Auburn posted a 24-12 record, and advanced to the quarterfinals of the NIT Tournament. Prior to his arrival at Auburn, Cooper spent two seasons at Oregon where he helped the Ducks to a 41-23 mark. Oregon went 23-10 with an NCAA Tournament appearance in 2002-03 and had an 18-13 record in 2003-04, losing in the NIT semifinals. He coached a pair of All-Americans in PAC-10 Player of the Year Luke Ridnour of the NBA's Seattle Supersonics and Luke Jackson, formerly of the Cleveland Cavaliers. He spent six years as an assistant at South Carolina under his former college coach Eddie Folger, from 1995-2001 helping lead the Gamecocks to the SEC Championship with a 24-8 record in 1996-97. Prior to South Carolina, Cooper spent two seasons as an assistant to Rick Duckett at Division II Fayetteville (NC) State in the Central Intercollegiate Athletic Association, where the Broncos went 18-10 in 1993-94 and 15-10 in 1994-95.

Nutt Named Southeast Missouri Head Coach: Dickey Nutt, former head men's basketball coach at Arkansas State University (ASU), has been named the new men's head basketball coach at Southeast Missouri State University. Nutt coached 13 seasons at Arkansas State with an overall record of 189-186 and coached ASU to the Sun Belt Conference West Division title in 2007. During his years at ASU, he planned, directed and administered all areas of the basketball program, including budgeting, recruiting, team travel, scholarships and equipment. He is the second winningest coach in Arkansas State history. He is also the second winningest coach in the Sun Belt Conference, second only to legendary University of Alabama at Birmingham Coach Gene Bartow. Nutt led Arkansas State to their first-ever trip to the NCAA Tournament in 1999 after leading ASU to the Sun Belt Tournament championship in the same season. ASU also won the Sun Belt Tournament championship in 1997-1998, when Nutt was named National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) District 9 Coach of the Year, an honor he repeated again in the following season, 1998-1999. Nutt also led ASU to the Sun Belt Conference Championship in 1997-1998. Nutt has coached 11 All-Sun Belt Conference players and five Sun Belt Conference All-Tournament players. He coached the Sun Belt Conference Player of the Year in 1998 and 1999, the conference's Defensive Player of the Year in 1999 and its Newcomer of the Year in 2007. He was honored by the Sun Belt Conference in 2005 for surpassing 150 career wins. Nutt was selected to serve on the Congress of the NABC in 2004. He led ASU to the 25th ranking in 2003 by CollegeInsider.com as a Mid-Major Top 25 after a 3-0 start. He served as ASU's assistant men's basketball coach from 1987-1995, assistant men's basketball coach at Oklahoma State University from 1985-1987 and assistant boys' basketball coach at Stillwater (Okla.) High School from 1982-1985. Nutt was a four-year letterman in basketball at Oklahoma State University where he played guard from 1977 to 1981. He was an all-state guard in basketball and an allstate quarterback in football from 1974-1977 at Central High School in Little Rock, Ark.

Laser Falls One Short of OVC Consecutive Made Free Throws Record; Streak is 16th Longest in NCAA History: Eastern Illinois sophomore guard Tyler Laser came up just one free throw short of tying a nearly 30-year old OVC record for consecutive made free throws. Laser had made 45 straight free throws dating back to a December 4 game with Tennessee State before missing his only attempt against Austin Peay on Feb. 26. Laser missed just breaking Glen Napier's (Morehead State) record of 46 straight during the 1981-82 season. Laser's streak did rank as the 16th best streak in NCAA Division I history for a single-season. For the season Laser is 50-of-52 (96.2%) from the charity stripe.

Miles Records Ninth Triple-Double in OVC History: Murray State sophomore guard Isacc Miles recorded the ninth triple-double in OVC history on Feb. 23 when he had 13 points, 10 rebounds and 11 assists in a win over UT Martin. It was the first triple-double since UT Martin's Lester Hudson had two (including a quadruple-double) last season. Austin Peay's Trenton

Finalists for the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award were selected from a list of 30 candidates, based on personal qualities that define a complete student-athlete. Each finalist displays numerous accomplishments across four award pillars: classroom, community, character, and competition.

TTU's Davis Named to ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District Squad: Tennessee Tech junior guard Frank Davis has been named to the ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District IV First-Team as selected by CoSIDA. Davis was the only men's basketball player in the OVC selected to one of the eight All-District squads. Davis carries a 3.42 grade point average in exercise science. For making the first-team Davis will now advance to the national ballot for consideration of Academic All-American. To be eligible for nomination, a student-athlete must have reached sophomore academic standing and have at least a 3.30 cumulative grade point average. District IV selections come from schools located within the states of Alabama, Kentucky, Michigan, Ohio and Tennessee.

Alexander Dismissed as TSU Coach; Pittman Named Interim Coach: Tennessee State University director of athletics, Teresa Phillips announced the dismissal of head basketball coach Cy Alexander on Feb. 6. Alexander was in his sixth season at Tennessee State posting a record of 67-107 and 48-56 in the Ohio Valley Conference. Overall, in 24 years, Alexander has posted a record of 344-306. Last season, TSU finished 15-17, 10-10 in the OVC, after reaching the championship game of the Ohio Valley Conference. **Mark Pittman** will serve as interim head coach. Pittman joined the Tennessee State basketball program in 2003, reuniting him with Alexander. Pittman served previously as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator under Alexander at South Carolina State from 1989-92. A 1977 graduate of Illinois, Pittman is a veteran of both the collegiate and high school coaching ranks. Along with his tenure at South Carolina State, he was an assistant and recruiting coordinator at Cincinnati from 1983-89. He was an administrative assistant at Jacksonville University (1998-2001) and worked as an assistant coach at Florida Community College (1996-98). He also served as both a graduate assistant and student assistant basketball coach at Illinois.

TSU's Robinson a Candidate for Bob Cousy Award: Tennessee State sophomore guard Gerald Robinson, Jr. has been named a candidate for the Bob Cousy Award, presented by The Hartford; the award is given to the top collegiate point guard annually spanning all divisions. The selection criteria emphasize leadership, team work, success and fundamentals as being critical parts for the games of basketball as a point guard. Nominations are solicited from head coaches across the country and the winner is selected by a Blue Ribbon Selection Committee. Other nominees include UNC's Ty Lawson, Davidson's Stephen Curry and UCLA's Darren Collison.

Loos Named to Division I Men's Basketball Issues Committee: Dave Loos, Austin Peay State University's athletics director and head men's basketball coach, has been appointed to the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Issues Committee. Loos will fill the unexpired term of Delaware State's Rick Costello. His appointment begins immediately and runs through Sept. 1, 2012. Loos currently is in his 19th season as Austin Peay head coach and is the only Division I basketball coach serving as the university's athletics director—Loos is in his 12th as APSU's athletics director. The NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Issues Committee is charged with oversight of all issues pertaining to NCAA Division I men's basketball. The committee works closely with the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) on legislation and other issues, as well as the National Basketball Association and USA Basketball. The committee's primary duties are to ensure the appropriate oversight of the sport, with an emphasis on recruiting activities and to enhance the development and public perception of the sport. The committee also makes policy recommendations per topics unrelated to legislative and playing rules issues.

has been named head coach of the NBA's Philadelphia 76ers. DiLeo played at Tech as a freshman in the 1973-74 season, and as a sophomore in 1974-75, both under head coach Connie Inman. He transferred to LaSalle in his hometown of Philadelphia for his final two seasons. Playing in 50 games for the Golden Eagles, DiLeo dished out 272 assists, which ranked as the second-most in school history, only eight behind Wayne Pack's school record. More than 30 years later, DiLeo's total still ranks 14th in the career record book. DiLeo, currently the team's Senior Vice President and Assistant General Manager, will remain in the position through the end of the 2008-09 season. DiLeo is in his 19th season with the Sixers organization and his fifth as the team's Senior Vice President and Assistant General Manager.

Hudson Named to John R. Wooden Award Watch List: Lester Hudson, a senior guard at The University of Tennessee at Martin, is one of 50 preseason candidates for the 2008-09 John R. Wooden Award All-American Team and Player of the Year trophy. The list of candidates for the Wooden Award is composed of 50 student-athletes who, based on last year's individual performance and team records, are the early frontrunners for college basketball's most prestigious honor. Among the other candidates for the Wood Award are Tyler Hansbrough of North Carolina, last year's Wooden Award winner; Notre Dame forward Luke Harangody; and Davidson guard Stephen Curry. In all, 42 schools and 13 conferences are represented on the Wooden Award Pre-Season list. Leading the way is the Big East with 12 candidates. Hudson is the only candidate for the award from the Ohio Valley Conference. In mid-January, the Wooden Award Committee will release the Midseason Top 30 list, followed in March by the national ballot, consisting of approximately 20 top players who have proven to their universities that they are also making progress toward graduation and maintaining a cumulative 2.0 GPA. The Wooden Award All-American Team will be announced the week of the "Elite Eight" round during the NCAA Tournament. Created in 1976, the John R. Wooden Award is the most prestigious individual honor in college basketball. It is bestowed upon the nation's best player at an institution of higher education who has proven to his university that he is making progress toward graduation and maintaining a cumulative 2.0 GPA. Previous winners include such notables as Larry Bird (1979), Michael Jordan (1984), Tim Duncan (1997) and 2007 recipient Kevin Durant of Texas.

Hudson and Robinson Earn Preseason Recognition From CollegeInsider.com: UT Martin senior guard Lester Hudson and Tennessee State sophomore guard Gerald Robinson earned preseason All-American honors from CollegeInsider.com. Hudson was named to the 16-player All-American team while Robinson was one of 25 players named to the Mid-Major All-American squad. Both Division I coaches and NBA scouts were part of the selection process along with the CollegeInsider.com staff. Hudson was one of just 16 selections to the All-America team, which included the likes of North Carolina's Tyler Hansbrough, Davidson's Stephen Curry and Kentucky's Patrick Patterson. Robinson was one of 25 selections to the Mid-Major All-American Team.

Hudson Named to CollegeHoops.net Preseason Mid-Major All-America Team: UT Martin senior guard Lester Hudson was named to CollegeHoops.net First-Team Mid-Major All-America squad. Hudson joins Davidson's Stephen Curry; Saint Mary's Patrick Mills; Butler's Matt Howard and Saint Mary's Diamon Simpson on the first-team.

OVC Teams Go 3-7 in ESPNU BracketBusters Games: OVC schools compiled a 3-7 overall record in this year's 2009 ESPNU BracketBusters series. Eastern Illinois (at Western Michigan), Eastern Kentucky (vs. Ohio) and Tennessee State (vs. Detroit) were the three schools who picked up victories. This year mocked the fourth straight year that every Ohio Valley Conference school participated in the event. Five schools hosted games while the other five went on the road. Austin Peay has competed in the most BracketBusters games, competing in each of the last five years. UT Martin had been the only OVC school to go undefeated in BracketBusters games, winning their first three games in the series before falling to Missouri State this season. The team's 3-1 BracketBusters record is the best among OVC schools. Now it its seventh year, ESPNU BracketBusters is an ESPN television property that was tremendously successful with its first six events in February of 2003, 2004, 2005, 2006, 2007 and 2008. The event has allowed Division I conferences to participate in a cutting-edge format that involves "wild card" pairings from the pool of participating teams, with half of the ESPNU BracketBusters teams pre-designated as "home" and the remaining half as "road" teams.

Murray State Picked as Preseason Favorite: In a vote of Ohio Valley Conference head men's basketball coaches and sports information directors, Murray State was picked as the 2008-09 preseason favorite in the 10-team league. The Racers, who received 11 of 20 first-place votes, finished second in the OVC last season (13-7) and return nine players and four starters from the team. It marks the 12th time in the last 20 years that Murray State has been picked the preseason favorite and the first time since the 2005-06 season. Murray State totaled 149 points and was closely followed by UT Martin who received six first-place votes (142 points). It marks the highest preseason ranking the Skyhawks have received since joining the OVC in 1992. Previously UTM had been picked no higher than sixth in the preseason predictions (four different times). Defending champion Austin Peay received two first-place votes and was tabbed third (129 points) while Morehead State received one first-place vote and was picked fourth (118), its highest preseason selection since 2003-04. Tennessee State was picked fifth (108), followed by Tennessee Tech (77), Eastern Kentucky (59), Southeast Missouri State (57), Eastern Illinois (35) and Jacksonville State (26).

Preseason Predictions: Is being picked the preseason favorite, always a good thing? Over the past 30 years of preseason polls that were available, the league's head coaches and sports information directors correctly pick the eventual OVC regular season champion 60 percent of the time, picking the correct winner 18 times over the last 30 years. Over the past 10 years, the preseason poll has correctly picked the winner every other year. Last season the poll correctly picked Austin Peay to claim the championship; this season the poll picked Murray State, who finished tied for second behind UT Martin.

UT Martin's Hudson Tabbed as Preseason Player of the Year: The 2008-09 All-OVC Preseason Men's Basketball team was headlined by UT Martin senior guard **Lester Hudson**, the 2007-08 OVC Player of the Year. Hudson was tabbed a nearly unanimous Preseason Player of the Year after earning the award at the end of last season. Overall seven different schools were represented on the team with Morehead State, Tennessee State and UT Martin each placing two individuals on the team. The team included six seniors, a junior and three sophomores while featuring three repeat selections from last year's All-OVC squads. Hudson finished last year ranked in the Top 10 nationally in each points per game (25.7 - 4th), steals (2.8 - 4th) and 3-pointers made per game (3.8 - 10th). He also became the first Division I men's basketball player to record a quadruple-double in a game. Hudson was joined by two other players who were selections on the 2007-08 All-OVC team - Austin Peay forward **Drake Reed** (the 2006-07 OVC Player of the Year and last year's preseason Player of the Year) and Eastern Kentucky guard **Mike Rose**. Reed averaged 14.4 points and 5.6 rebounds per game last season while leading APSU to the OVC regular season and tournament championships. Rose led EKU with 15.3 points per game while also adding 4.4 rebounds, 2.2 assists and 1.8 steals per game. All five individuals who were named to the OVC All-Newcomer Team last season made this year's preseason team. That includes Hudson, his UT Martin teammate **Marquis Weddle** (17.1 ppg, 99 made 3-pointers), Morehead State's **Leon Buchanan** (13.2 ppg, 6.1 rpg, 53.5 FG%) and **Kenneth Faried** (10.5 ppg, 8.0 rpg, 51.6 FG%) and Tennessee State's **Gerald Robinson** (15.2 ppg, 60 made 3-pointers). Rounding out the Preseason All-OVC team was Tennessee State's **Jerrell Houston** (11.6 ppg, 6.1 rpg), Tennessee Tech's **Daniel Northern** (12.8 ppg, OVC-best 9.3 rebounds per game and OVC-best 2.8 blocks per game) and Murray State's **Danero Thomas** (12.3 ppg, 4.9 rpg).

SIU Edwardsville Joins the OVC: On July 1 Southern Illinois University Edwardsville became the 11th member of the Ohio Valley Conference. SIU Edwardsville, who is in the reclassification process to Division I, will begin regular season competition in the OVC during the 2011-12 academic year and will be eligible for postseason competition in 2012-13. The exception is the SIUE softball program, which will be eligible for both regular season and tournament competition in 2010-11; the softball program was the department's women's sport designee to be fast-tracked to Division I, making it eligible to compete at Division I prior to other SIUE sports. SIUE is located in Edwardsville, Ill., which is just northeast of St. Louis (the 18th largest media market in the United States

Replay Systems for OVC Basketball Venues Enter Year Two: On Dec. 21, 2007, the Ohio Valley Conference mandated the use of courtside replay systems at all OVC basketball venues. The systems were put into place in January and used through the remainder of the 2007-08 season. They are in effect once again in 2008-09. The systems are used in situations that are outlined by NCAA rules.

OVC Players in the Pros: As of January 2009, there was two former Ohio Valley Conference players on an NBA roster - Austin Peay's **Trenton Hassell** and Murray State's **James Singleton**. Hassell is in his eighth season in the NBA and second with the New Jersey Nets. He also played with the Chicago Bulls (who drafted him 30th overall in the 2001 Draft and where he played two seasons), Minnesota Timberwolves (four seasons) and Dallas Mavericks (37 games in 2007-08). During his 539-game career he has averaged 6.2 points, 2.8 rebounds and 1.9 assists per game while hitting 44.7 percent of his field goal attempts. Singleton is playing in his first season with the Dallas Mavericks after playing two years with the Los Angeles Clippers. He has seen action in 112 games prior to the 2008-09 season. After finishing his two-year career at Murray State in 2002-03, Singleton played in Italy before making it to the NBA.

A Look Back to 2007-08: For the second consecutive year the Austin Peay Governors claimed the OVC Regular Season Championship but this time around the team completed the sweep and also claimed the tournament crown. After losing in the Tournament Championship Game on a last-second shot in 2007, Austin Peay finished the job and topped Tennessee State 74-54 to claim their fifth OVC Tournament Championship. APSU would go on to play No. 2 seed Texas in the NCAA Tournament, falling to the Longhorns in the game played in Little Rock, Ark. Over the past two seasons the Govs have compiled a 32-8 OVC record. UT Martin guard Lester Hudson was named an All-American by several outlets after having an outstanding year. Hudson became the first Division I men's player to record a quadruple-double in a game when he had 25 points, 12 rebounds, 10 assists and 10 steals in a win over Central Baptist College. He also broke the OVC single-season record for 3-pointers made (124) in a season and finished in the Top 100 nationally in each points, rebounds, assists, steals and 3-pointers made/game - the only Division I player to accomplish that feat. He declared for the NBA Draft but decided to return to school following pre-draft workouts. Hudson's teammate Marquis Weddle was named to OVC Freshman of the Year while Morehead State's Donnie Tyndall took home Coach of the Year honors.

OVCSports.TV: For the third consecutive year, fans can watch nearly ever Conference matchup and all non-conference home contests this season at OVCSports.TV. The venture with JumpTV Sports allows fans to access live and on-demand streaming video and audio of conference matchups (excluding only national television games which are not available) on their home computer. The premium Web site was launched in July 2006 and has streamed nearly 1,000 events in its first two years, including all Conference matchups in football and men's and women's basketball as well as select baseball, soccer, softball and volleyball games and OVC Championship events. Packages are available on a yearly, seasonal, monthly or per-event basis.

Morehead State led the regular season standings for most of the stretch run but lost its last three OVC games to finish as the No. 4 overall seed...That did not matter to the Eagles who topped No. 5 seed Eastern Kentucky, No. 1 seed UT Martin and No. 2 seed and defending champion Austin Peay on its way to its first OVC Championship since 1984...The NCAA Tournament berth earned for that title was the sixth for the program in its history...Morehead State was assigned to the Opening Round game in Dayton to match up with SWAC Champion Alabama State...The Eagles controlled the game from tip-off to the final horn in winning 58-43 in front of an Opening Round game record 11,346 fans...The Eagles would see its NCAA Tournament run end three days later with a loss to No. 1 overall seed Louisville; ironically it was UofL who eliminated Morehead State from its last appearance in the NCAA Tournament...Kenneth Faried, who was named OVC Defensive Player of the Year, finished the season with 25 doubledoubles, second nationally to only Oklahoma's Blake Griffin...Faried was third nationally in rebounds/game (13.0)...Faried, who was also a first-team All-OVC selection, was joined on the first-team by Leon Buchanan...Buchanan, the only player the Eagles lose from this year's team, led MSU in scoring at 15.1 points per game in 2008-09.



MURRAY STATE RACERS (19-12, 13-5)

Murray State capped the regular season by winning seven straight OVC games and 10 of its last 11 to finish at 13-5 overall, which put them in a tie for second with rival Austin Peay and earned the Racers the No. 3 overall seed...Murray State had been tabbed the preseason favorite by the league's coaches...The Racers have now appeared in 30 straight tournaments, last missing the event in 1979...MSU has won the OVC Tournament a leaguebest 13 times, the last in 2006; the Racers has won more games in the OVC Tournament than any other school going 57-31...The Racers have hosted a quarterfinal game every season (13 straight) since the OVC went to campus sites in 1997...In the first round, the Racers held off No. 6 seed Tennessee State, winning 88-74...That avenged a loss last season to TSU in the OVC Tournament semifinals...Murray State played rival Austin Peay in the semifinals of the tournament, losing 67-50 at the Sommet Center in Nashville...The rivalry between the schools was named one of the top nationally by ESPN The Magazine this season...The two teams last met in the OVC Tournament in 2004 when Murray State won 66-60 in the Championship Game...Danero Thomas led Murray State in scoring (12.5) during the season; Thomas was a second-team All-OVC selection.

Team Notes

For the sixth year in a row Tennessee State secured an OVC Tournament appearance, making it as the No. 6 seed this season...That was the same seed the Tigers were a season ago when they won a first round road game, topped Murray State in the semifinals and lost to Austin Peay in the championship game...The Tigers were unable to duplicate that feat this year, falling at Murray State 88-74 in the first round...Gerald Robinson, Jr. had 26 points to lead TSU in the game...Just four weeks prior TSU was only 4-8 in Conference play after a 88-58 loss to Murray State at home on Feb. 4... Following the game head coach Cy Alexander was dismissed and Mark Pittman took over as the interim coach...The team lost its first game under Pittman (at home to UT Martin) but won five straight OVC games after that (and six games overall) to close the regular season...The six-straight wins for the Tigers was the longest winning streak since 1993-94 when the team won the OVC Championship under head coach Frankie Allen...following the season the Tigers hired Auburn assistant coach John Cooper to take over the program...Robinson finished the year as the Tigers leading scorer (17.8 points/game).



TENNESSEE TECH GOLDEN EAGLES (12-18, 6-12)
