THIS WEEK'S OVC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

PLAYER

Wes Channels, G • Jr., 6-3, 210 • Memphis, Tenn. • Austin Peay

Channels was named OVC Player of the Week for the second time this season after averaging 25.0 points, 5.0 rebounds and 3.5 assists per game in two Austin Peay wins last week. Against Tennessee Tech, Channels scored 28 points on 9-of-15 shooting, including hitting a pair of 3-pointers. He was also 8-of-9 from the free throw line and had seven rebounds and three assists. Two nights later he scored 22 points on 7-of-11 shooting in a win over Jacksonville State. In that game Channels hit 3-of-5 3-pointers and 5-of-6 free throws while dishing out four assists and grabbing three rebounds. Channels is now hitting 44.9 percent from 3-point range on the season, a mark that ranks 16th nationally.

CO-NEWCOMER

Gershom Jordan, C • So., 6-6, 309 • Nashville, Tenn. • Tennessee State

Jordan posted career-highs of 21 points and eight rebounds in Tennessee State's 59-57 victory over Jacksonville State last week. He hit 10-of-11 (90.1%) shots from the field and had two blocks and two assists in only 25 minutes of play. Two nights later he did not attempt a field goal but did hit 4-of-4 free throws in 10 minutes of action against Tennessee Tech.

CO-NEWCOMER

Alex Davis, F • So., 6-7, 205 • Milwaukee, Wis. • Tennessee Tech

Davis averaged 15.5 points and 6.0 rebounds in two games last week as Tennessee Tech split a pair of road games. In the Golden Eagles' road win over Tennessee State, Davis hit 7-of-18 shots, including 5-of-7 from 3-point range, to lead his team with 21 points. He also added five rebounds, a block and a steal in the victory. Against league-leading Austin Peay, Davis had 10 points and pulled down seven boards in 17 minutes off the bench.

FRESHMAN

Jorge Camacho, F • Fr., 6-7, 215 • Hermosillo, Mexico • Eastern Kentucky

Camacho, the third different Eastern Kentucky player to win the Freshman of the Week award this season, averaged 14.5 points and 7.0 rebounds in two games off the bench last week. He hit 63.2 percent (12-of-19) from the floor and 5-of-7 (71.4%) from the free throw line. Camacho had a season-high 14 points in a win at Chicago State and increased that by one (15) at Morehead State on Saturday. He also led the Colonels in rebounding with seven boards in each contest.

NOTES FROM AROUND THE LEAGUE

OVC Overview/This Week's Highlights: At the halfway point of the Conference season, Austin Peay finds itself in a familiar position, atop the OVC standings; the Governors are 8-1 this season and now 40-9 in OVC games over the past three seasons...The Govs lone loss in OVC play this year was at home to Morehead State; the Eagles are just one game behind the Governors in the standings (7-2) entering this week...Those two teams will meet on Saturday night in Morehead in a game that could go a long way in determining this year's OVC regular season champion...The team sitting in third place (7-3) is UT Martin, who was won six in a row and 12 of its last 13 dating back to mid-December...UT Martin senior guard Lester Hudson continues to rank second nationally in scoring, averaging 27.3 points a contest...Another OVC player who ranks high in national statistical rankings is Eastern Kentucky's Mike Rose, who is hitting 46.8 percent from 3-point range this year, sixth-best among all Division I players...As a team EKV is second nationally in 3-pointers made/game (10.6) while Austin Peay is third nationally in 3-point percentage (41.1%)...As a Conference the OVC enters the week ranked 20th in the Sagarin Power Ratings and 23rd in the latest edition of the RPI...OVC teams will have one more week of games before the ESPNU BracketBusters matchups are set; pairings will be finalized on Sunday and announced early next week.

OVC Tournament All-Session Tickets Now on Sale: All-Session tickets for the 2009 Ohio Valley Conference Men's and Women's Basketball Tournament are now on sale through the Sommet Center ticket office and Ticketmaster. The semifinals and finals will be held March 6-7 at the Sommet Center in downtown Nashville. The event includes four sessions (6 games); the price for an All-Session ticket is \$48. The women's semifinals will begin at 12 p.m. on Friday, March 6 with the men's semifinals following at 6 p.m. that evening. The women's championship game will be held at 3 p.m. on Saturday, March 7 with the men's championship game beginning at 7 p.m. that evening. ESPN Radio 1370 in Chattanooga to Air OVC Men's Basketball Game of the Week: In January the OVC announced a partnership with ESPN Radio 1370 WDEF in Chattanooga to broadcast an OVC Men's Basketball Game of the Week. Coaches to Participate in American Cancer Society's Suits and Sneakers Weekend on Jan. 30-Feb. 1: Coaches vs. Cancer "Suits and Sneakers Awareness Weekend," a collaborative initiative of the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) and the American Cancer Society (the Society), is slated for the weekend of Jan. 30 – Feb. 1, 2009. Participating NABC-member coaches will wear sneakers instead of dress shoes with their usual game attire during weekend games to demonstrate their support for the Society and the fight against cancer. As well, fans are encouraged to wear sneakers to games to demonstrate their support. By lacing up sneakers with their suits, participating coaches nationwide will spotlight the fact that while cancer remains a major health concern, everyone can take daily steps to reduce their risk of the disease. Thanks to the dedicated efforts of college and high school coaches across the country, Coaches vs. Cancer participants have raised nearly \$45 million since 1993 to help the Society fund groundbreaking cancer research, provide up-to-date cancer information and education, advocate for public health policies that benefit communities, and deliver services that improve the quality of life for patients and their families.

Hudson Only Player to Score 20 or More Points in Every Game This Season; Ranks Second Nationally in Scoring: OVC Preseason Player of the Year **Lester Hudson** is the only player nationally to score 20 or more points in every game this season. Hudson has reached that plateau in all 20 UTM games. His season high is 41 points at Central Arkansas and his season-low is 20 points against Tennessee and USC. Hudson enters this week ranked second nationally in scoring (27.3 points/game). That trails only Davidson's Stephen Curry, who is averaging 29.3 points a contest.

Morehead State's Faried Has Second Best Rebounding Game of the Season Nationally: Morehead State's **Kenneth Faried** grabbed a career-high 24 rebounds against Florida A&M on Nov. 23. So far this season that performance ranks as the second most rebounds by one player in a game at the Division I level. It trails only a 25-rebound performance by Chris Gadley of Canisius. Faried has also had two 17-rebound performances and two 16-rebound games in 2008-09. Faried is averaging 12.1 rebounds per game this season, which ranks fifth nationally (he is averaging 13.1 rebounds per game in nine OVC

2009 OVC TOURNAMENT

The 2009 Ohio Valley Conference Men's & Women's Tournaments will be held March 3, 6-7. The first round games will be held at campus sites (top four seeds on each side) on Tuesday, March 3. Those games can be seen live on OVCSports.TV.

The winners of those games will shift to the Sommet Center in downtown Nashville, Tenn. for the semifinals and finals. The men's semifinals will be held on Friday, March 6 at 6 and 8 p.m. and televised on ESPNU with the championship game on Saturday, March 7 at 7 p.m. and televised live on ESPN2. The women's semifinals are set for 12 and 2 p.m. on March 6th (televised on OVCSports.TV) and the women's championship game is set for March 7 at a time to be announced.

This marks the 15th time in 16 years that the tournament has been held in Nashville and 10th time the event has been held at the Sommet Center (and first since the 2007 tournament).

Faried Ranks Among Nation's Leaders on Double-Doubles: Morehead State sophomore center **Kenneth Faried** has 12 double-doubles through 21 games this season. That currently ranks as the sixth-most nationally as of Jan. 25. The nation's leader is Oklahoma's Blake Griffin (16) and he is followed by Santa Clara's John Bryant (15), Notre Dame's Luke Harangody (13), Arizona's Jordan Hill (13) and Pitt's DeJuan Blair (13). Faried is one of two players (Georgia Tech's Gani Lawal being the other) with 12 double-doubles at this point of the season.

Moving up the Coaching Victory Chart: Austin Peay head coach **Dave Loos** now has 307 career victories while in the OVC, a mark that ranks second in league history. He is just 12 wins shy of Cal Luther (319 wins at Murray State and UT Martin) for the all-time mark. He is by far the active leader in the category as well, as only two other current OVC coaches - UT Martin's **Bret Campbell** and Tennessee Tech's **Mike Sutton** have reached the 100-win plateau at their respective OVC schools.

ESPNU BracketBusters Pairings to Be Announced Next Monday (Feb. 2): In its seventh year, ESPNU BracketBusters is an ESPN television property that was tremendously successful with its first six events in February of 2003, 2004, 2005, 2006, 2007 and 2008. The event has allowed Division I conferences to participate in a cutting-edge format that involves "wild card" pairings from the pool of participating teams, with half of the ESPNU BracketBusters teams pre-designated as "home" and the remaining half as "road" teams. For the fourth straight year, all 10 Ohio Valley Conference schools will participate in the ESPNU BracketBusters series. Five schools will host games this season while the other five will go on the road. Austin Peay has competed in the most BracketBusters games (5) while UT Martin is the only team with a perfect record in the event (3-0). The pairings will officially be announced next Monday (Feb. 2).

UT Martin's Hudson Candidate for Lowe's Senior CLASS Award: **Lester Hudson**, a 6-2, 190-pound guard at The University of Tennessee at Martin was one of 30 senior male NCAA college basketball players announced as a candidate for the 2008-09 Lowe's Senior CLASS Award, presented annually to an NCAA Division I student-athlete. Based on criteria focusing on the "Four C's" of classroom, character, community and competition, the award winners will be selected by national balloting of head basketball coaches, national media and college basketball fans. Lowe's, an official corporate partner of the NCAA, will present the winners with trophies during the weekends of the respective NCAA Men's and Women's Final Four. An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School, the award was launched during the 2001-02 season to honor the attributes of college basketball seniors who remain committed to their university and pursue the many rewards that a senior season and complete college education brings. The list of 2008-09 basketball candidates includes a range of universities and conferences across the country. From each of the two lists of 30 nominees, a national media committee will select 10 finalists for the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award in February 2009. Those 10 names will be placed on the official ballot for a nationwide vote.

TSU's Robinson a Candidate for Bob Cousy Award: Tennessee State sophomore guard **Gerald Robinson, Jr.** has been named a candidate for the Bob Cousy Award, presented by The Hartford; the award is given to the top collegiate point guard annually spanning all divisions. The selection criteria emphasize leadership, team work, success and fundamentals as being critical parts for the games of basketball as a point guard. Nominations are solicited from head coaches across the country and the winner is selected by a Blue Ribbon Selection Committee. Other nominees include UNC's Ty Lawson, Davidson's Stephen Curry and UCLA's Darren Collison.

Loos Named to Division I Men's Basketball Issues Committee: **Dave Loos**, Austin Peay State University's athletics director and head men's basketball coach, has been appointed to the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Issues Committee. Loos will fill the unexpired term of Delaware State's Rick Costello. His appointment begins immediately and runs through Sept. 1, 2012. Loos currently is in his 19th season as Austin Peay head coach and is the only Division I basketball coach serving as the university's athletics director—Loos is in his 12th as APSU's athletics director. The NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Issues Committee is charged with oversight of all issues pertaining to NCAA Division I men's basketball. The committee works closely with the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) on legislation and other issues, as well as the National Basketball Association and USA Basketball. The committee's primary duties are to ensure the appropriate oversight of the sport, with an emphasis on recruiting activities and to enhance the development and public perception of the sport. The committee also makes policy recommendations per topics unrelated to legislative and playing rules issues.

Hudson Named to Early Season Naismith Watch List: UT Martin senior guard **Lester Hudson** was one of 50 players on the Naismith Trophy Early Season Watch List as announced by the Atlanta Tipoff Club. The Naismith Trophy presented by AT&T will be awarded at the 2009 NCAA Men's Final Four in Detroit, Mich. In February, the Naismith Trophy voting academy, comprised of leading basketball journalists, coaches and administrators from around the country, will narrow its early season list to the Top 30 players in the nation. Those players, and others who distinguish themselves throughout the season, will be eligible for the final ballot in March.

Former TTU Point Guard Named Head Coach of NBA's Philadelphia 76ers: Tony DiLeo, the starting point guard for the Tennessee Tech Golden Eagles during two years in the mid 70s, has been named head coach of the NBA's Philadelphia 76ers. DiLeo played at Tech as a freshman in the 1973-74 season, and as a sophomore in 1974-75, both under head coach Connie Inman. He transferred to LaSalle in his hometown of Philadelphia for his final two seasons. Playing in 50 games for the Golden Eagles, DiLeo dished out 272 assists, which ranked as the second-most in school history, only eight behind Wayne Pack's school record. More than 30 years later, DiLeo's total still ranks 14th in the career record book. DiLeo, currently the team's Senior Vice President and Assistant General Manager, will remain in the position through the end of the 2008-09 season. DiLeo is in his 19th season with the Sixers organization and his fifth as the team's Senior Vice President and Assistant General Manager.

Hudson Named to John R. Wooden Award Watch List: Lester Hudson, a senior guard at The University of Tennessee at Martin, is one of 50 preseason candidates for the 2008-09 John R. Wooden Award All-American Team and Player of the Year trophy. The list of candidates for the Wooden Award is composed of 50 student-athletes who, based on last year's individual performance and team records, are the early frontrunners for college basketball's most prestigious honor. Among the other candidates for the Wood Award are Tyler Hansbrough of North Carolina, last year's Wooden Award winner; Notre Dame forward Luke Harangody; and Davidson guard Stephen Curry. In all, 42 schools and 13 conferences are represented on the Wooden Award Pre-Season list. Leading the way is the Big East with 12 candidates. Hudson is the only candidate for the award from the Ohio Valley Conference. In mid-January, the Wooden Award Committee will release the Midseason Top 30 list, followed in March by the national ballot, consisting of approximately 20 top players who have proven to their universities that they are also making progress toward graduation and maintaining a cumulative 2.0 GPA. The Wooden Award All-American Team will be announced the week of the "Elite Eight" round during the NCAA Tournament. Created in 1976, the John R. Wooden Award is the most prestigious individual honor in college basketball. It is bestowed upon the nation's best player at an institution of higher education who has proven to his university that he is making progress toward graduation and maintaining a cumulative 2.0 GPA. Previous winners include such notables as Larry Bird (1979), Michael Jordan (1984), Tim Duncan (1997) and 2007 recipient Kevin Durant of Texas.

Hudson and Robinson Earn Preseason Recognition From CollegeInsider.com: UT Martin senior guard **Lester Hudson** and Tennessee State sophomore guard **Gerald Robinson** earned preseason All-American honors from CollegeInsider.com. Hudson was named to the 16-player All-American team while Robinson was one of 25 players named to the Mid-Major All-American squad. Both Division I coaches and NBA scouts were part of the selection process along with the CollegeInsider.com staff. Hudson was one of just 16 selections to the All-America team, which included the likes of North Carolina's Tyler Hansbrough, Davidson's Stephen Curry and Kentucky's Patrick Patterson. Robinson was one of 25 selections to the Mid-Major All-American Team.

Hudson Named to CollegeHoops.net Preseason Mid-Major All-America Team: UT Martin senior guard **Lester Hudson** was named to CollegeHoops.net First-Team Mid-Major All-America squad. Hudson joins Davidson's Stephen Curry; Saint Mary's Patrick Mills; Butler's Matt Howard and Saint Mary's Diamon Simpson on the first-team.

The 2008-09 Season: The 2008-09 season marks the 61st of competition for the Ohio Valley Conference. Over the previous 60 years, 11 different teams have claimed an OVC regular season championship, including three different schools in the past four years.

Murray State Picked as Preseason Favorite: In a vote of Ohio Valley Conference head men's basketball coaches and sports information directors, Murray State was picked as the 2008-09 preseason favorite in the 10-team league. The Racers, who received 11 of 20 first-place votes, finished second in the OVC last season (13-7) and return nine players and four starters from the team. It marks the 12th time in the last 20 years that Murray State has been picked the preseason favorite and the first time since the 2005-06 season. Murray State totaled 149 points and was closely followed by UT Martin who received six first-place votes (142 points). It marks the highest preseason ranking the Skyhawks have received since joining the OVC in 1992. Previously UTM had been picked no higher than sixth in the preseason predictions (four different times). Defending champion Austin Peay received two first-place votes and was tabbed third (129 points) while Morehead State received one first-place vote and was picked fourth (118), its highest preseason selection since 2003-04. Tennessee State was picked fifth (108), followed by Tennessee Tech (77), Eastern Kentucky (59), Southeast Missouri State

UT Martin's Hudson Tabbed as Preseason Player of the Year: The 2008-09 All-OVC Preseason Men's Basketball team was headlined by UT Martin senior guard **Lester Hudson**, the 2007-08 OVC Player of the Year. Hudson was tabbed a nearly unanimous Preseason Player of the Year after earning the award at the end of last season. Overall seven different schools were represented on the team with Morehead State, Tennessee State and UT Martin each placing two individuals on the team. The team included six seniors, a junior and three sophomores while featuring three repeat selections from last year's All-OVC squads. Hudson finished last year ranked in the Top 10 nationally in each points per game (25.7 - 4th), steals (2.8 - 4th) and 3-pointers made per game (3.8 - 10th). He also became the first Division I men's basketball player to record a quadruple-double in a game. Hudson was joined by two other players who were selections on the 2007-08 All-OVC team - Austin Peay forward **Drake Reed** (the 2006-07 OVC Player of the Year and last year's preseason Player of the Year) and Eastern Kentucky guard **Mike Rose**. Reed averaged 14.4 points and 5.6 rebounds per game last season while leading APSU to the OVC regular season and tournament championships. Rose led EKV with 15.3 points per game while also adding 4.4 rebounds, 2.2 assists and 1.8 steals per game. All five individuals who were named to the OVC All-Newcomer Team last season made this year's preseason team. That includes Hudson, his UT Martin teammate **Marquis Weddle** (17.1 ppg, 99 made 3-pointers), Morehead State's **Leon Buchanan** (13.2 ppg, 6.1 rpg, 53.5 FG%) and **Kenneth Faried** (10.5 ppg, 8.0 rpg, 51.6 FG%) and Tennessee State's **Gerald Robinson** (15.2 ppg, 60 made 3-pointers). Rounding out the Preseason All-OVC team was Tennessee State's **Jerrell Houston** (11.6 ppg, 6.1 rpg), Tennessee Tech's **Daniel Northern** (12.8 ppg, OVC-best 9.3 rebounds per game and OVC-best 2.8 blocks per game) and Murray State's **Danero Thomas** (12.3 ppg, 4.9 rpg).

Preseason Predictions: Is being picked the preseason favorite, always a good thing? Over the past 29 years of preseason polls that were available, the league's head coaches and sports information directors correctly pick the eventual OVC regular season champion 62 percent of the time, picking the correct winner 18 times over the last 29 years. Over the past nine years, the preseason poll has correctly picked the winner every other year. Last season the poll correctly picked Austin Peay to claim the championship.

SIU Edwardsville Joins the OVC: On July 1 Southern Illinois University Edwardsville became the 11th member of the Ohio Valley Conference. SIU Edwardsville, who is in the reclassification process to Division I, will begin regular season competition in the OVC during the 2011-12 academic year and will be eligible for postseason competition in 2012-13. The exception is the SIUE softball program, which will be eligible for both regular season and tournament competition in 2010-11; the softball program was the department's women's sport designee to be fast-tracked to Division I, making it eligible to compete at Division I prior to other SIUE sports. SIUE is located in Edwardsville, Ill., which is just northeast of St. Louis (the 18th largest media market in the United States).

Replay Systems for OVC Basketball Venues Enter Year Two: On Dec. 21, 2007, the Ohio Valley Conference mandated the use of courtside replay systems at all OVC basketball venues. The systems were put into place in January and used through the remainder of the 2007-08 season. They are in effect once again in 2008-09. The systems are used in situations that are outlined by NCAA rules.

OVC Players in the Pros: As of January 2009, there was two former Ohio Valley Conference players on an NBA roster - Austin Peay's **Trenton Hassell** and Murray State's **James Singleton**. Hassell is in his eighth season in the NBA and second with the New Jersey Nets. He also played with the Chicago Bulls (who drafted him 30th overall in the 2001 Draft and where he played two seasons), Minnesota Timberwolves (four seasons) and Dallas Mavericks (37 games in 2007-08). During his 539-game career he has averaged 6.2 points, 2.8 rebounds and 1.9 assists per game while hitting 44.7 percent of his field goal attempts. Singleton is playing in his first season with the Dallas Mavericks after playing two years with the Los Angeles Clippers. He has seen action in 112 games prior to the 2008-09 season. After finishing his two-year career at Murray State in 2002-03, Singleton played in Italy before making it to the NBA.

A Look Back to 2007-08: For the second consecutive year the Austin Peay Governors claimed the OVC Regular Season Championship but this time around the team completed the sweep and also claimed the tournament crown. After losing in the Tournament Championship Game on a last-second shot in 2007, Austin Peay finished the job and topped Tennessee State 74-54 to claim their fifth OVC Tournament Championship. APSU would go on to play No. 2 seed Texas in the NCAA Tournament, falling to the Longhorns in the game played in Little Rock, Ark. Over the past two seasons the Gobs have compiled a 32-8 OVC record. UT Martin guard **Lester Hudson** was named an All-American by several outlets after having an outstanding year. Hudson became the first Division I men's player to record a quadruple-double in a game when he had 25 points, 12 rebounds, 10 assists and 10 steals in a win over Central Baptist College. He also broke the OVC single-season record for 3-pointers made (124) in a season and finished in the Top 100 nationally in each points, rebounds, assists, steals and 3-pointers made/game - the only Division I player to accomplish that feat. He declared for the NBA Draft but decided to return to school following pre-draft workouts. Hudson's teammate **Marquis Weddle** was named to OVC Freshman of the Year while Morehead State's **Donnie Tyndall** took home Coach of the Year honors.

OVCsports.TV: For the third consecutive year, fans can watch nearly every Conference matchup and all non-conference home contests this season at OVCsports.TV. The venture with JumpTV Sports allows fans to access live and on-demand streaming video and audio of conference matchups (excluding only national television games which are not available) on their home computer. The premium Web site was launched in July 2006 and has streamed nearly 1,000 events in its first two years, including all Conference matchups in football and men's and women's basketball as well as select baseball, soccer, softball and volleyball games and OVC Championship events. Packages are available on a yearly, seasonal, monthly or per-event basis.

Team Notes

Eastern Kentucky stepped out of Conference play to begin last week, going on the road to beat Chicago State 71-68...That game was tied in the final seconds before senior guard Mike Rose took the big shot and nailed a 3-pointer with 2.3 seconds left to give his team the victory...It marked the second straight game Rose had hit a 3-pointer in the final five seconds to push his team to the victory...Rose, who is second in the OVC with a 20.0 points/game average, ranks 24th nationally in scoring and sixth nationally in 3-point percentage (46.8%)...The week ended with the Colonels traveling to rival Morehead State, where ECU suffered a 68-64 loss...In that game ECU made just six 3-pointers, one off its season low...As a team, Eastern is averaging 10.6 3-pointers made/game, which is second nationally...ECU also ranks 27th nationally in 3-point percentage (38.7%) and 11th in fewest turnovers (11.5/game)...The Colonels are now 4-5 in OVC play (three-way tie for sixth); at this point of the season ECU's Conference games have been decided by an average of 5.5 points, with the largest spread being just 10 points (loss at EIU)...Jorge Camacho was named OVC Freshman of the Week after averaging 14.5 points and 7.0 rebounds per game and hitting 63.2 percent (12-of-19) from the field; he tallied back-to-back season-high by scoring 14 at Chicago State and 15 at Morehead State...Camacho is the third different ECU player to win the Freshman of the Week award this year...The Colonels will host league-leading Austin Peay on Tuesday and Tennessee State on Saturday.

Tennessee Tech split a pair of games last week, losing at league-leader Austin Peay and winning at Tennessee State...The Golden Eagles are now 4-5 in OVC play, which puts them in a 3-way for sixth place in the OVC standings...In the win over Tennessee State, sophomore Alex Davis scored a season-best 21 points on 7-of-18 shooting, including 5-of-8 from 3-point range...Davis, who was named OVC Co-Newcomer of the Week for his efforts, also had five rebounds, a block and steal in the win, which came two days after scoring 10 points and pulling down seven rebounds...Senior center Daniel Northern averaged 14.0 points and 8.5 rebounds in two games last week while hitting 64.7 percent (11-of-17) from the field...Northern scored 12 points and pulled down 12 rebounds in the loss at Austin Peay and followed that up with 14 points and five rebounds against TSU...Northern now has 48 blocked shots on the season, which ranks 15th nationally (2.7 blocks/game)...As a team Tech ranks 22nd nationally in blocks/game (5.3)...The Golden Eagles are in the midst of a four-game road swing, which will continue with games at Eastern Illinois and Southeast Missouri this week.
