FCS PLAYOFFS/OVC TIEBREAKER

The participants in the 2009 NCAA Football Championship Subdivision (formerly I-AA) Playoffs will be announced on Sunday, Nov. 22. In the event of a tie for the OVC Championship, the following procedures will be used to break all ties and to determine the league's NCAA playoff representative.

TWO-WAY TIES

1.) A two-way tie shall exist only if the tied teams have the same number of losses.

2.) Should two teams have the same number of losses, and the two teams played each other during the regular season, the winner of the head-to-head contest shall be the league's postseason representative.

3.) If the two tied teams have the same number of losses, but did not play each other during the regular season, the following procedure shall be utilized to break the tie:

a.) A comparison of each team's head-to-head record against the team occupying the highest position in the regular-season standings that each team has played. If one team won its game against that team, the winning team shall be declared the representative.

b.) Should the procedure outlined in Item a. fail to break the tie, the process will continue to the next-place team and beyond until the tie is broken.

c.) When arriving at another group of tied teams, composite records between the tying teams shall be utilized to determine if one of the tied teams has won more games against the group of tied teams.

4.) If the procedures described previously fail to break the tie, the representative shall be determined by a coin flip.

MULTIPLE TIES

1.) A multiple tie (three or more teams) shall exist only if the tied teams have the same number of losses.

2.) If all of the teams involved in the multiple tie played each other during the regular season, then the composite records among the tied teams shall be compared to break the tie.

3.) If the process outlined in Step 2 reduces the tie to a tie among two teams, the two-team tiebreaker formula shall then be utilized.

4.) If not all of the tied teams played each other during the regular season, or if step 2 does not break or reduce the tie, the following procedure shall be utilized:

a.) A comparison of each of the tied teams' head-to-head record against the team occupying the highest position in the regular-season standings that each team has played. If one team won its game against that team, the winning team shall be declared the representative.

b.) Should the procedure outlined in Item a. fail to break the tie, the process will continue to the next-place team and beyond until the tie is broken.

c.) When arriving at another group of tied teams, composite records between the tying teams shall be utilized to determine if one of the tied teams has won more games against the group of tied teams.

5.) If the procedures described previously fail to break the tie, the representative shall be determined by a blind drawing.

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Entering its 62nd year, the Ohio Valley Conference continues to build on the success that has made it the nation's eighth-oldest NCAA Division I conference. For only the second time in a decade, the Conference expanded by adding Southern Illinois University Edwardsville as the league's 11th member in 2008. The move expanded the OVC's geographical footprint to the St. Louis market and marked the first change in membership since expanding to the state of Alabama (Jacksonville State, Samford) in 2003.

The 2009-10 school year saw a change in leadership as Beth DeBauche was named the seventh full-time Commissioner in league history on July 28. She is currently one of just five females to be the head of a Division I conference, and one of just eight to lead a Division I conference all-time. The last three commissioners of the OVC have moved onto jobs as the commissioner of the Big Ten, Big 12 and the Mid-American Conferences.

The OVC's proud past dates back to 1948, but seeds for the new league were actually planted in 1941. It was then that Roy Stewart, the athletics director at Murray State, Charles (Turkey) Hughes, the athletics director at Eastern Kentucky, and Kelly Thompson, the public relations director at Western Kentucky, first broached the idea of forming a new conference. Discussions were put on hold by World War II, but reemerged Feb. 27-28, 1948 at the Kentucky Hotel in Louisville as the three original institutions combined with Morehead State, Louisville and Evansville to form the OVC.

In the 1950s, the OVC became a pioneer on a much more significant scale socially. During times of racial segregation, league member Morehead State became one of the first non-traditionally black mid-southern institutions to accept a black student. In 1958, Marshall Banks earned athletically-related aid at Morehead, which signed a second black athlete, Howard Murphy, a year later. In 1961, Murphy earned all-conference recognition as a halfback in football. With racial barriers broken, the rest of the institutions in the league began to provide educational and athletic opportunities to African-Americans.

Through the past 61 years, 14 teams have won or shared the league's football title. The list is led by Eastern Kentucky, winner of 20 outright or shared football crowns, including both the 2007 and 2008 championships, as they compiled a 15-1 league record over that time period. Only one other Football Championship Subdivision school (UMass) has won more Conference titles than the Colonels. Among OVC teams, former member Middle Tennessee is next with 11 titles, followed by Tennessee Tech with nine, and Murray State and former member Western Kentucky with eight apiece. Eastern Illinois has claimed four football crowns (including winning the title outright in 2005 and sharing the crown with UT Martin in 2006) while Jacksonville State, Morehead State, Tennessee State and former members Evansville and East Tennessee State have captured two apiece. Austin Peay, UT Martin (which captured its first crown in 2006) and former member Youngstown State have one title apiece.

Murray State and Evansville tied for the initial football championship, and the Racers participated in the first-ever bowl game by an OVC team, tying Sul Ross State 21-21 in the 1948 Tangerine Bowl. From 1948 to 1975, OVC teams played in 15 bowl games, winning eight of them. Eastern Kentucky and Western Kentucky were also participants in the NCAA Division II playoffs in the early and mid-1970s prior to the NCAA's reclassification of football programs into Division I-AA. The term "I-AA" lasted until the end of the 2006 season when it was changed to Division I Football Championship Subdivision (FCS).

The first Division I-AA/FCS football playoff was held in 1978 with only four teams, which is the only year through present day that the OVC did not field a playoff representative. In 1979, four of the nation's top teams were invited to the playoffs, and two of them - Eastern Kentucky and Murray State - were from the OVC. Murray dropped its semifinal game to Lehigh, but the Colonels nipped Nevada-Reno in double overtime and claimed the national championship a week later with a 30-7 victory over Lehigh. ECU was coached by former all-America quarterback Roy Kidd, who was in his 16th year at the helm of his alma mater and who skipped the Colonels to a second national title three years later. Following the 2002 season, Kidd retired after 39 years at ECU, a one-school tenure unmatched in all of Division I. Upon retirement, he ranked sixth all-time among Division

I coaches with 315 victories, earning him a spot in the College Football Hall of Fame. ECU's 19 FCS playoff appearances are tied for the most all-time.

In addition to Kidd, other coaching legends in the OVC include Charles (Bubber) Murphy, who coached at Middle Tennessee from 1947-1968, Western Kentucky's Jimmy Feix (1968-83), Wilburn Tucker (1954-67) and Don Wade (1968-82) of Tennessee Tech, Bill Ferguson (1967-77) of Murray State, Guy Penny (1959-67) of Morehead State and Boots Donnelly (1977-78 at Austin Peay; 1979-1998 at Middle Tennessee). Current Eastern Illinois head coach Bob Spoo has compiled 78 wins while his program has been a member of the OVC; that currently ranks sixth all-time in league history.

A sampling of former OVC football stars, some of whom were All-Americans during their collegiate careers before achieving stardom at the professional ranks, include Jim Youngblood and Larry Schreiber (Tennessee Tech), Phil Simms (Morehead State), Virgil Livers and Dale Lindsey (Western Kentucky), Myron Guyton and Chad Bratzke (Eastern Kentucky), Cortland Finnegan (Samford) and Tony Romo (Eastern Illinois). In 2008, former Tennessee State standout Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie became just the fourth NFL First Round draft pick in OVC history when he was selected 16th overall by the Arizona Cardinals. He would break into the starting lineup halfway through his rookie season and started at cornerback for the Cardinals in Super Bowl XLIII.

The 2007 season marked a return to scholarship football and the Ohio Valley Conference for the Austin Peay State Governors. Following the 1996 season, the Governors dropped scholarship football and competed as both an independent (1997-00, 2006) and as a member of the Pioneer Football League (2001-05). Austin Peay returned to full OVC status in 2007 under the watch of first-year head coach Rick Christophel, who quarterbacked the Gobs from 1971-75.

The 2007 season also brought new vernacular to the Ohio Valley Conference and the division of football formerly known as I-AA. Beginning with the 2006 National Championship game the term I-AA was changed to NCAA Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) in a decision by the Division I Board of Directors. The new label was chosen to communicate in a positive and clear manner the unique differences between the Division I football categories (chiefly, the post-season opportunity) while still defining them within the Division I experience. The FCS includes programs that compete in an effort to participate in the NCAA championship postseason structure (one of 88 NCAA national championships) as opposed to the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) which competes in an effort to participate in the postseason bowl system (the 32 NCAA-licensed events which includes the Bowl Championship Series).

Football wasn't the only sport in which the OVC was quickly gaining respect. In 1955, the OVC became only the second six-member league nationally to earn an automatic bid to the prestigious NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament, which, at that time, was limited to only 24 participants. The Conference quickly proved worthy of that bid, as Morehead State defeated Marshall (107-92) and Wayne State (95-84) in the 1956 tournament. Fifteen years later, former OVC member Western Kentucky became the first and only Conference team to reach the Final Four. The Hilltoppers defeated Jacksonville, Kentucky and Ohio State before losing to Villanova in double overtime. WKU went on to finish in third place after beating Kansas 77-75 in the consolation game.

In the late 1970s, women's athletics began somewhat of a rebirth on the national scene as the NCAA began sponsoring and marketing women's sports. Recognizing the need to provide increased opportunities for female athletes, the OVC established women's championships in the sports of basketball, tennis and track in 1977, with cross country and volleyball added over the next four years. Those sports were initially governed by the Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women (IAIW), but the overall strength of women's programs in the league was demonstrated by the automatic bids the OVC instantly received when the NCAA became the governing body in 1982.

Over its 61 years, OVC teams have garnered national championships and bowl games in football, along with national team or individual titles in the sports of rifle, cross country, track and golf.

The OVC has also produced several Olympic athletes, including Murray State's Morgan Hicks, who was a member of the 2004 United States

Olympic Rifle Team. In addition, some of the greatest players in professional sports were educated at OVC institutions. The list includes former greats such as football's Phil Simms (Morehead State), basketball's Clem Haskins (Western Kentucky) and Bubba Wells (Austin Peay) and two-sport star Steve Hamilton (Morehead State) to present-day standouts like basketball player Trenton Hassell (Austin Peay), football player Tony Romo (Eastern Illinois), baseball players Jamie Walker (Austin Peay) and George Sherrill (Austin Peay) and professional golfer Jeff Sluman (Tennessee Tech). Hamilton is the only athlete to ever play in the NCAA Basketball Championship, a Major League Baseball World Series (New York Yankees) and a NBA Championship Series (Los Angeles Lakers).

A first in the OVC also occurred in 2008, when the league had a first round draft pick in both the NFL (Tennessee State's Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie) and Major League Baseball (Eastern Kentucky's Christian Friedrich) Drafts in the same school year. A year later (2009) the league had a Major League Baseball First Round Compensation Round pick (Eastern Illinois' Tyler Kehr who was No. 48 overall) and NBA Second Round pick (UT Martin's Lester Hudson) in the same season. In 2009 OVC softball that accomplished several firsts as UT Martin (tournament champion) and Jacksonville State (at-large) were each selected for the NCAA Championship. Jacksonville State would take it a step farther by winning the Knoxville Regional to become the first OVC softball program to advance to a Super Regional.

The playing field is not the only place where OVC athletes are working hard. The league also recognizes excellence in the classroom. Six Scholar-Athlete Awards are presented yearly to male and female athletes, while others are commended for their academic success by being Medal of Honor recipients or earning a spot on the Commissioner's Honor Roll. Additionally, the league annually presents one institutional Academic Achievement Award, as well as separate team awards in each Conference-sponsored sport. Since the College Sports Information Directors of American (CoSIDA) Academic All-America program began, the Ohio Valley Conference has had 179 student-athletes honored with the award, including 25 over the last three years (2006-07 to the present).

Through the early years of the league, administrators wrestled with fan behavior due to the close proximity of the Conference members and the intense rivalries which developed. Just as it did decades ago, the OVC

took the leadership role on what has become a national issue. In 1995, the OVC implemented a first-of-its-kind "Sportsmanship Statement," a policy which promotes principles of fair play, ethical conduct and respect for one's opponent. The statement has become a model for others to follow across the nation, and has answered the challenge of the NCAA Presidents Commission to improve sportsmanship in collegiate athletics.

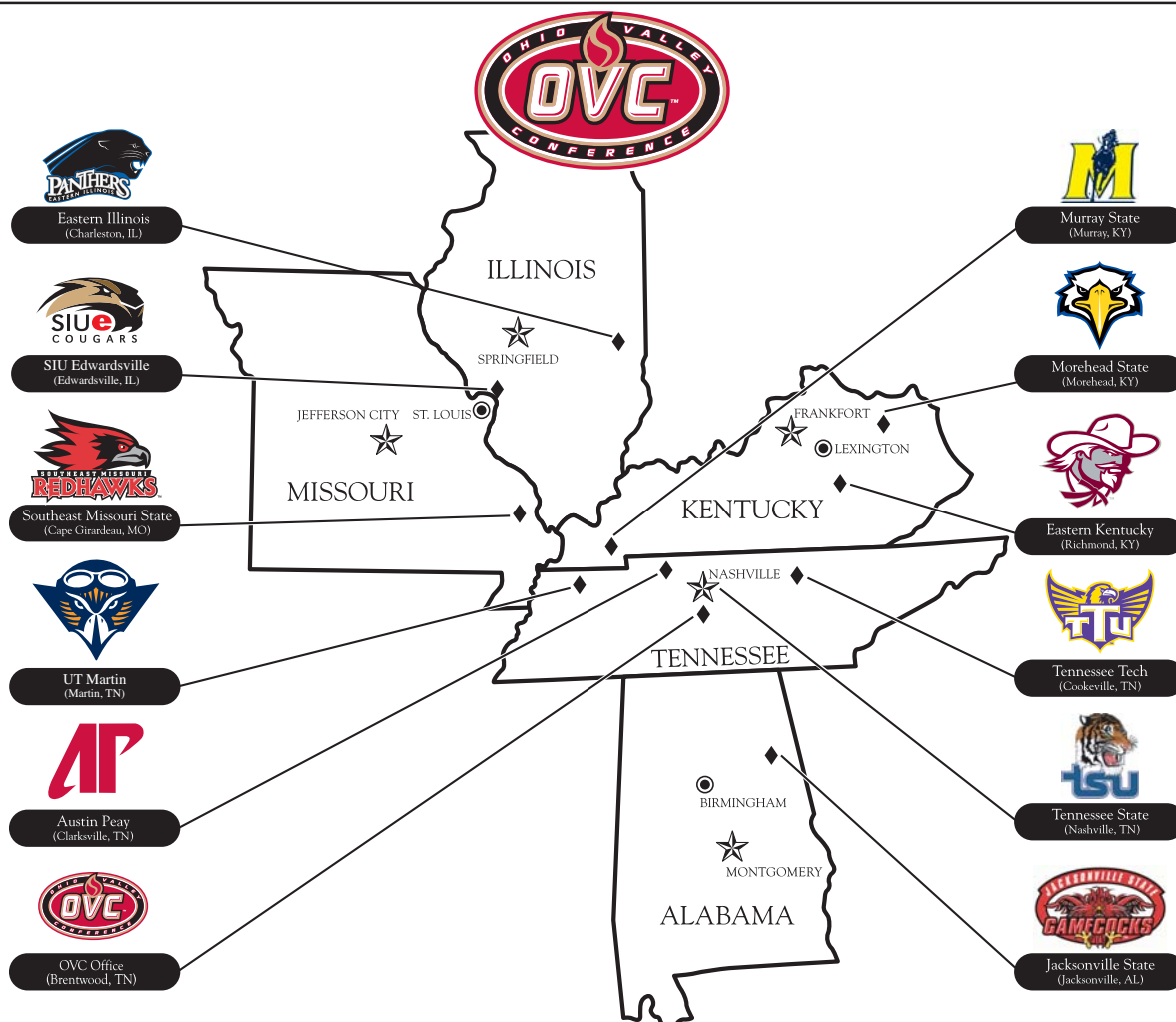
Additionally, the OVC annually presents the Steve Hamilton Sportsmanship Award, in honor of the former Morehead State student-athlete, coach and athletics director, to a junior or senior student-athlete with significant athletic contributions who best exemplifies the characteristics of sportsmanship and citizenship. Most recently, the Conference has also implemented the OVC Institutional and Team Sportsmanship Awards, which are presented to one institution and 18 sport-specific teams voted by their peers to have best exhibited the standards of sportsmanship and ethical conduct as outlined by the OVC and NCAA.

The vision of leadership demonstrated by the Founding Fathers in 1948 remains alive today as the Ohio Valley Conference prepares for the future. One example is in regard to the current trend in collegiate athletics administration for increased involvement of university presidents in setting policies and making rules. The presidents of OVC institutions, however, have always governed the Conference, long before presidential governance became a national theme.

The Ohio Valley Conference sponsors the following sports: baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, tennis and track for men, and basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, softball, tennis, track and volleyball for women. In addition, the OVC also sponsors the combined men's and women's sport of rifle.

Now in its seventh decade of competition, the Ohio Valley Conference has grown significantly from its humble beginnings while increasing the number of athletics opportunities it provides for students. Current league representatives include charter members Eastern Kentucky University, Morehead State University and Murray State University, along with Austin Peay State University, Eastern Illinois University, Jacksonville State University, Southeast Missouri State University, Southern Illinois University Edwardsville, Tennessee State University, Tennessee Technological University and the University of Tennessee at Martin.

OVC HONORS AND AWARDS

The Ohio Valley Conference implemented a first-of-its-kind "Sportsmanship Statement," a policy promoting fair play, ethical conduct and respect for one's opponent in 1995. The statement answered a challenge of the NCAA Presidents Commission to improve sportsmanship in college athletics, and has become a model for others to follow across the nation.

The development of the OVC sportsmanship statement began in June 1993 at the direction of the league's presidents. A committee made up of athletics directors and faculty representatives drafted the initial statement, and all coaches and other administrators had the opportunity for input. The statement sets forth expectations for spirit groups, officials and fans, as well as the student-athletes and coaches. Here is a brief synopsis of each group's expectations within the sportsmanship statement.

Administrators: Institutional administrators will create an environment of hospitality for visiting teams, particularly for those individuals at Conference institutions. Administrators will treat the visiting teams and its fans in the same manner that they would want their teams to be treated.

Coaches: Coaches have the greatest amount of influence over whether young people in their programs are taught and follow the high principles of sportsmanship. The OVC has been benefited by coaches who have risked losing a contest by removing student-athletes who have demonstrated disrespect for their opponents. This discipline measure educates that individual about the importance of sportsmanship over participation and winning, and helps counteract the constant messages received from many professional athletes who demonstrate a lack of respect for opponents.

Student-Athletes: Student-athletes at OVC institutions will be expected to treat opponents with sportsmanship, and there will be no tolerance for taunting and baiting of opponents. OVC student-athletes must understand that they are perhaps the most visible representatives of their institutions and their behavior is observed and emulated by many who are younger. OVC student-athletes must honor the responsibilities that accompany the privilege of representing our schools by behaving with dignity and class on and off the field.

Spirit Groups: Like our student-athletes, spirit groups are visible representatives of our universities, and they are expected to show decent behavior. Cheerleaders, bands and other spirit groups are admitted to contests to support their teams and assist in creating a fun atmosphere, but they will not be allowed to disrupt or confront opposing teams.

Officials: Officials will enforce the rules regarding sportsmanship without tolerance for abuse. Players and coaches will receive their only warning prior to the contest, and once the contest begins, penalties will be assessed for violations of unsportsmanlike conduct.

Fans: We know all fans are embarrassed by the inappropriate behavior of a few who may engage in confrontational and threatening actions towards officials, visiting fans, players or coaches. Those individuals may be dismissed to provide a better environment for others.

The Conference believes that the effort to meet the expectations outlined in the sportsmanship statement will increase the attractiveness at our athletics events by creating a healthy environment for competition. The OVC has a variety of awards to recognize sportsmanship by its student-athletes, coaches, administrators and teams. In 1998, the OVC established the Steve Hamilton Sportsmanship Award, presented annually to a male or female junior or senior student-athlete who best exemplifies the characteristics of the former Morehead State student-athlete, coach and administrator. Hamilton is the only individual to have ever played in a NCAA Basketball Championship, a Major League Baseball World Series (New York Yankees) and a National Basketball Association Championship Series (Minnesota Lakers).

In 2003-04 the League began awarding the Institutional Sportsmanship Award, given to the OVC member institution selected by its peers to have best exhibited the standards of sportsmanship and ethical conduct as outlined by the OVC and NCAA. In 2005-06 the League expanded the sportsmanship award program by adding the Team Sportsmanship Award. An award is given to each sport sponsored by the OVC and is voted on by the student-athletes and coaches of the respective sports.

Beth DeBauche - Commissioner



Elizabeth (Beth) DeBauche was named Commissioner of the Ohio Valley Conference on July 29, 2009. She had previously served as the Director of Division I at the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) since 2002. She will begin her duties at the OVC in mid-September.

DeBauche (pronounced De-BUSH) becomes the seventh full-time Commissioner in the 61-year history of the OVC. She follows Art Guepe (1963-75), Paul Dietzel (1975-76), Bob Vanatta (1976-79), Jim Delany (1979-89), Dan Beebe (1989-2003) and Dr. Jon A. Steinbrecher (2003-09), who left to become Commissioner of the Mid-American Conference in May.

DeBauche will be one of just five females to be the head of a Division I Conference in 2009-10, and one of just eight to lead a Division I Conference all-time.

"I am both humbled and delighted to have been selected by the presidents as the commissioner of the Ohio Valley Conference, given its history of academic and athletic excellence," said DeBauche. "I am excited to have the opportunity to serve the presidents, administrators, faculty and student-athletes of the OVC and I am looking forward to a bright future for the conference."

Since August 2002 DeBauche, along with the vice-president of Division I, has been responsible for coordinating Division I initiatives through the NCAA governance structure, as well as helping to manage the Division I agenda. Her duties included developing agendas and providing leadership for the Division I Board of Directors, Presidential Advisory Group and the Leadership Council. DeBauche has overseen the entire Division I governance structure and worked directly with the Legislative Council, the six cabinets and the supporting communications and coordination committee.

She has also been a liaison to governance representatives, external constituent groups and NCAA staff regarding legislative and governance activities. That role required DeBauche to have regular interaction with the Collegiate Commissioner's Association (CCA), the CCA Compliance Coordinators, the Division I-A Athletics Directors Association, the National Association of Collegiate Women Athletics Administrators (NACWAA) and the Faculty Athletics Representatives Association (FARA). DeBauche has also served as a liaison to the Women's Basketball Issues Committee, the Presidential Oversight and Monitoring Group, the Men's Basketball Academic Enhancement Group, the Presidential Task Force on Commercial Activity in Intercollegiate Athletics and the Two-Year College Relations Panel.

In 2008, DeBauche was named the NACWAA Conference/Organization Administrator of the Year.

Prior to her work at the NCAA, DeBauche worked at the Southeastern Conference (SEC) from November 1996 through August 2002. As an assistant and later associate commissioner, she managed all aspects of the SEC's rules compliance program. DeBauche provided NCAA and SEC rules interpretations, developing rules education materials and programming, conducting compliance reviews and assisting member institutions with the NCAA certification program. At times during her tenure, she also served as the league's liaison to the faculty athletics representatives, the compliance coordinators, directors of academic support and Student-Athletes Advisory Committee (SAAC) as well as the sports liaison to the leagues women's golf, women's tennis and women's volleyball coaches.

From 1996 to 1998 DeBauche was the Director of the National Letter of Intent (NLI) Program for the Collegiate Commissioners Association (CCA). In that role she was the administrator in charge of issuing all NLI rules interpretations, creating rules education materials and providing NLI rules education presentations as well as being the primary information resource for parents, student-athletes and the media.

DeBauche got her start in collegiate athletics at Vanderbilt University where she was the Assistant Athletic Director for Compliance from August 1994 to November 1996.

DeBauche received her Bachelor of Arts degree in history and government from Saint Mary's College (Ind.) in May 1983 and earned her Master's Degree in communications from Notre Dame in 1985. After completing the Concannon Program of International Law in London, England, DeBauche received her Juris Doctorate from the Notre Dame School of Law in 1988.

A member of the Illinois, Wisconsin and Georgia Bar, following law school graduation, DeBauche worked as an attorney in each Green Bay, Atlanta and Marietta, as well as serving as a Judicial Clerk to P. Harris Hines, who is currently serving on the Georgia Superior Court.

DeBauche has been a member of the Notre Dame Club of Indianapolis Board of Directors, as well as a graduate of the Sports Management Institute and a participant in the Division I-A Athletic Directors Institute.

Brad Walker - Associate Commissioner/Operations



Brad Walker was named Associate Commissioner for Operations/Chief Operating Officer at the Ohio Valley Conference on Oct. 19, 2007 and began his duties at the OVC in Nov. 2007.

Entering his third year at the OVC in 2009-10, Walker served as the League's Interim Commissioner from May until mid-September 2009. He is also a member of the Division I Championships/Sports Management Cabinet.

Walker's responsibilities at the OVC include the day-to-day operations of the Conference office, including financial operations, as well as developing schedules and providing oversight for select

One Division I

As most football fans know, three classifications – Division I-A, I-AA and I-AAA – were used to differentiate the administration of a school's football program. As of December 15, 2006, those three classifications were declared out of bounds and new designations were kicked off.

The Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) will be used to describe football programs that compete to participate in the postseason bowl system that includes the 32 NCAA-licensed bowls that make up the Bowl Championship Series.

The NCAA Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) now will be used to describe schools that participate in the NCAA championship postseason structure (one of 88 NCAA national championships that formerly was described as the I-AA football championship).

The Reason for the Change

The I-A, I-AA and I-AAA designations were confusing and as result, misapplied by college football fans and the media when referring not only to football programs (e.g., I-AA basketball). And because of greater awareness of specific conferences and schools, the I-A label was rarely emphasized by the I-A membership, which only caused greater confusion about the I-AA classification.

This initiative, voted into effect by the presidents and chancellors who comprise the NCAA Division I Board of Directors last August, is not intended to confuse or devalue the importance of the BCS format.

Why These Titles Were Chosen

These labels communicate in a positive and clear way about the differences between the Division I football classifications, chiefly the postseason opportunity, while still defining them within the Division I experience.

The name change also clearly defines the student-athlete experience. Rather than being incorrectly referred to by a football classification, they'll simply be a Division I student-athlete.

Spreading the Word

The use of the new football labels was rolled out at the 2006 NCAA Division I Football Championship game. During the course of the 2007 season, expect these new football designations to be used by members of the college football community, which includes student-athletes, corporate supporters, university/college officials, community leaders and media partners.

Coaches, administrators and staff have been asked to use the new classifications in media guides, game programs, Web sites, tickets and promotional materials.

Get to know the new names for the teams in your favorite game – the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS).

In a balanced vote that saw five of the eight eligible teams receive at least one first-place vote, two-time defending champion Eastern Kentucky has been picked as the 2009 preseason favorite in a vote of league head coaches and sports information directors. The Colonels received 10 first-place votes to take home the preseason honor for the third time in the last five years. UT Martin, 2006 co-champions, were picked to finish second and received four first-place votes. Eastern Illinois was third with two first-place votes followed by Tennessee State and Murray State who each received one first-place vote. The preseason poll was rounded out by Tennessee Tech being picked sixth and Austin Peay and Southeast Missouri tying for seventh place.

Murray State had six selections to the 2009 Preseason All-OVC team, the most of any OVC school. The Racers were followed by UT Martin who had five selections and Jacksonville State who had four picks. All nine teams had at least one player appear on the squad.

UT Martin senior quarterback Cade Thompson, the 2008 OVC Offensive Player, was tabbed the Preseason Player of the Year this season after throwing for 2,680 yards and 24 touchdowns as a junior. Murray State senior defensive end Austen Lane was picked as the Preseason Defensive Player of the Year after ranking fourth nationally in both sacks (1.0) and tackles-for-loss (1.83) per game last season.

2009 OVC SEASON NOTES/PREVIEW

Let's Get It Started: The 62nd season of Ohio Valley Conference football will get underway on Thursday, Sept. 3 when five OVC schools take to the field. Three other OVC schools will play its first game of the season two days later while Tennessee Tech has a bye the opening weekend and will not play its first contest until Thursday, Sept. 10. The OVC is made up of nine football-playing schools in 2009. Since its beginning, 14 of the 18 total schools that have played football in the OVC have claimed at least one championship.

Jacksonville State Ineligible for OVC Championship/Postseason Play: In May the NCAA announced the Jacksonville State University received a postseason ban due to an occasion three historic penalty of the APR (Academic Progress Rate). In accordance with OVC by-laws, since Jax State is not eligible for the NCAA postseason, they are also not eligible for the OVC Championship. Jacksonville State will still play a full Conference schedule in 2009 with wins and losses counting for both teams. They will just not be eligible for the title and will be listed at the bottom of the standings with an asterisk.

Preseason Forecasts: In what was one of the most balanced votes in the history of preseason OVC balloting (five different teams got at least one first-place votes), defending champion Eastern Kentucky was tabbed the preseason favorite by the league head coaches and sports information directors. ECU received 10 of the 18 first-place votes followed by UT Martin (4 first-place votes), Eastern Illinois (2), Tennessee State (1) and Murray State (1). It marks the 17th time that the Colonels have been picked to win the OVC Championship in the preseason poll. But is being picked first in the preseason poll necessarily a good thing? In the past 30 years of preseason polls (all that were available), the preseason predicted champion has only gone on to win the OVC Championship 12 times (40.0%). In each of the last six years, the predicted champion has failed to claim the regular season title. The last time the preseason predicted champion went on to win the title was in 2002 when Eastern Illinois accomplished the feat (EIU also did that same thing in 2001).

OVC Seeks Multiple Teams in the Playoffs: The OVC will be looking to get multiple teams into the FCS Playoffs for the third time in four years this season. Last year marked the first time since 2005 that just one OVC team (league champion Eastern Kentucky) made the 16-team playoff field. Two other teams (Jacksonville State and Tennessee State) finished with eight Division I victories but did not receive an at-large bid. It marked the first time since the playoffs expanded to 16 teams in 1986 that an OVC team with eight Division I teams did not receive an at-large bid. ECU lost to eventual national champion Richmond in the first round last season.

NFL Connections: As of the start of training camps, 16 former Ohio Valley Conference football players are on NFL rosters for the 2009 season. Those players include former Eastern Illinois standout Tony Romo, who is the starting quarterback of the Dallas Cowboys and two-time Pro Bowl pick, defensive back Cortland Finnegan (Samford) who was a Pro Bowl selection with the Tennessee Titans last year and Tennessee State's Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie, who was a starter with the Arizona Cardinals in Super Bowl XLIII in February. There are four players on NFL rosters who played in the OVC last season, including Cornelius Lewis (Tennessee State) of the Indianapolis Colts, Cecil Newton (Tennessee State) of the Jacksonville Jaguars and Pierre Walters (Eastern Illinois) and Javarri Williams (Tennessee State) both of the Kansas City Chiefs. Six of the nine current OVC football schools have at least one player playing in the NFL with Tennessee State leading the way with five players. Several NFL coaches also have connections to OVC schools, including two current ones who played at Eastern Illinois - Brad Childress (Minnesota) and Sean Payton (New Orleans). Another EIU alumni - Mike Shanahan - is out of coaching this year but should be back with a team in 2010. The Steelers Mike Tomlin was a former assistant coach at UT Martin and is now in his third season with Pittsburgh; he led the Steelers to the Super Bowl title last season. UT Martin graduate and

former assistant coach Jerry Reese made waves in 2007 when he led the New York Giants to the Super Bowl XLII Championship in his first season as General Manager with the franchise.

Head Coaches All Return: For the first time since the 2004 season, every head coach in the OVC returns to coach the same team they did last season. All nine coaches are back including the Dean of OVC Coaches, Bob Spoo of Eastern Illinois. Spoo is beginning his 22nd season with the Panthers in 2009.

FCS Playoff Expansion: In April 2008 the NCAA Board of Directors approved a new budget for the Division I Football Championships, which allowed the postseason bracket to expand from 16 to 20 teams beginning in the 2010 season. It marks the first expansion since the playoff field grew from 12 to 16 in 1997. In 2010, the field will be comprised of 10 automatic bids (up from 8 now) and 10 at-large berths (up from 8 now).

OVC and SportsUnlimited Announce Launch of OVC Football Magazine: The Ohio Valley Conference has announced the launch and production of "Ohio Valley Conference Football 2009" a full-color, limited edition football magazine that previews the 2009 football season. The venture with SportsUnlimited will be available in late August but is now available for pre-order. Detailed feature articles on all nine OVC teams will be included in the publication. For the first time, OVC football will be featured in a full-color magazine dedicated to its nine schools and suitable for display on your coffee table year round. To order your copy log onto www.collegesportsmags.com. The cost of the publication is \$4.99 plus tax and shipping.

OVCsports.TV: For the fourth consecutive year, fans can watch every Conference matchup and all non-conference home contests at OVCsports.TV. The venture with JumpTV Sports allows fans to access live and on-demand streaming video and audio of all conference matchups on their home computer. The premium Web site was launched in July 2006 and streamed over a thousand events in its first three seasons, including all Conference matchups in football and men's and women's basketball as well as select baseball, soccer, softball and volleyball games and OVC Championship events. Packages are available on a yearly, seasonally, monthly or per-event basis.



Murray State senior defensive lineman Austen Lane was named the OVC Preseason Defensive Player of the Year. As a junior he recorded 22.0 tackles for loss and 12.0 sacks in 12 games for the Racers. This summer Lane was named the FCS Preseason Defensive Player of the Year by Consensus Draft Services (CDS), making him the top defensive player at the FCS level.

TEAM NOTES

• Austin Peay will play its third consecutive season of Ohio Valley Conference football after spending 10 seasons away from the league (1997-06). The Governors left the Conference following the 1996 season and played five years as an independent and five years in the Pioneer Football League.

• Austin Peay's first recruiting class since returning to scholarship football will be seniors in 2009. Of the 24 signed in the Winter of 2006, 15 remain as active players.

• Eight times during the 2009 season the Governors entered the fourth quarter with a chance to win, either leading or trailing by no fewer than seven points. They won just two of those games. The year prior (2007) APSU encountered the same situation the same amount of times and came away with six victories.

• All-OVC cornerback Kevis Buckley intercepted six passes in 2008. That mark tied him with eight former Govs as the second-highest single-season total in program history. He enters his final year of play with 12 career interceptions, just four off the all-time record (held by Kirk Pointer).

• The Governors finished the 2008 campaign with a +5 turnover margin. That number included 17 interceptions as a defense a year ago.

• The team ranked seventh nationally a year ago in kickoff returns (23.17 yards/return). For the second consecutive season Terrence Holt broke the OVC record for kick return yards in a season. He totalled 1,285 yards as a sophomore after netting 1,104 yards as a freshman.

Rick Christophel was named the 17th head coach in Austin Peay history on March 23, 2007. The former Govs quarterback returned to his alma mater and led the team to a 7-4 record (5-3 in the OVC) in his first season. He became the first APSU coach since 1979 to win seven games in his initial season with the team.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- Christophel became the first APSU graduate to head the Governors program since 1973-76 when he took over the program in 2007. In his first season in Clarksville, Christophel led the team to a 7-4 overall record and third-place finish in the OVC (5-3). He was the first head coach since 1979 (Watson Brown) to win as many as seven games in his initial season. Only one coach ("Boots" Donnelly) won more games (8 in 1977) in his inaugural season with the program. The seven wins was the most for APSU as a scholarship program since 1984.

- Was the Austin Peay State starter from 1971-74, playing safety his freshman season before moving to quarterback for his final three years. A two-time team captain, Christophel completed 175-of-384 passes for 2,073 yards and 14 touchdowns in his three seasons. He also did some punting, averaging 35.1 yards per punt for his career. He finished his career ranked second in both passing and punting yards.

- It is a family affair for the Christophel family at Austin Peay ... Rick's brothers Randy (1975-78) and Rob (1981-83) also both quarterbacked Austin Peay.

- Christophel served as a graduate assistant at APSU from 1975-76 and as a full-time assistant coach from 1979-81.

- Christophel has also been an assistant coach at Southern Arkansas (1982), Cincinnati (1983), Rice (1984-85), Vanderbilt (1986-90), Mississippi State (1991-94) and UAB (1995-07). He was the defensive coordinator at Vandy (1989) and UAB (2001, 2006-07).

- Christophel is very familiar with the head coach at Tennessee Tech, Watson Brown. The duo have coached together in 22 of Christophel's 31 years in the profession, including most recently at UAB in 2006.

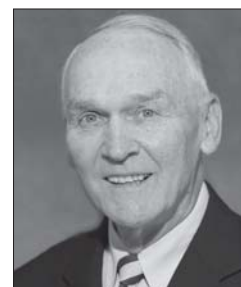

• EIU head coach Bob Spoo enters his 23rd season as the Panthers head coach. He is currently tied with Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer as the fifth longest active tenure as head coach at the same Division I school. Both coaches have been with their respective programs since 1987. Penn State's Joe Paterno heads the list with his time at Penn State starting in 1966.

• This season Eastern Illinois will make its first football appearance on ESPNU when the Panthers host Tennessee State on Nov. 19 at O'Brien Field.

• EIU will be looking to send a running back over the 1,000 yard mark for the sixth straight season this year as the Panthers line-up several new faces in the backfield. EIU returns Florida transfer Chevon Walker as the top running back and added another Florida transfer Mon Williams to compete for time.

• EIU will have to replace several players on its defensive line after losing three All-OVC performers including Kansas City Chiefs free agent signee Pierre Walters. Top candidates this season are seniors Andre Lima and Trevor Frericks.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

• Spoo begins his 22nd season as Eastern Illinois' coach in 2009; he is the longest tenured coach in the Ohio Valley Conference. The second longest tenured coach on that list is Jacksonville State's Jack Crowe at 10 years.

• Spoo sat out the 2006 campaign after undergoing a medical procedure the week of the season opener. What was originally to be a four to six week absence lingered throughout the season and he did not return fulltime until after the playoffs. The Panthers 8-5 overall record (and 7-1 OVC mark) was attributed to acting head coach Mark Hutson. Spoo returned to the sidelines in 2007 and led the Panthers to their 12th FCS Playoff berth.

• Spoo is first among among active OVC coaches with 132 victories and that total is second all-time in OVC history behind ECU Hall of Famer Roy Kidd (315).

• Spoo's tenure at EIU (since 1987) is the fifth longest among active Division I coaches. That list is headed by Joe Paterno (at Penn State since 1966); the two will square off on Oct. 10.

• Spoo was a three-year letterwinner and two-year starting quarterback at Purdue University (1956-58), a school that is on the Panthers schedule this season. He was the co-captain of the Blue Squad in the 1958 Blue-Gray All-Star Game.

• Spoo was named National Coach of the Year at Wilmette Loyola Academy High School (1970 by National High School Coaches Association) and Eastern Illinois (1995 by the Football Gazette). He was the runner-up for the Eddie Robinson National Coach of the Year Award in 2000. Spoo has earned OVC Coach of the Year honors twice (2001, 2005) and Gateway Coach of the Year once (1995).

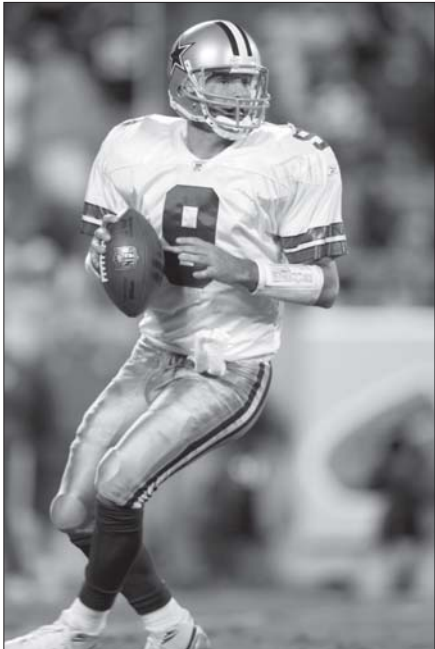

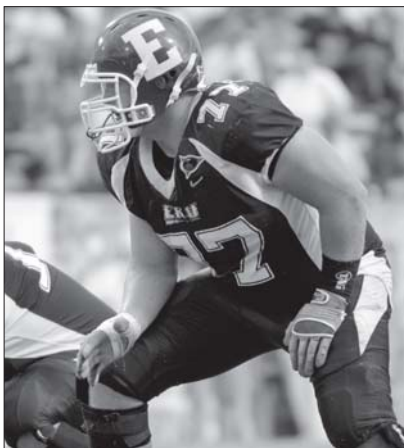

TEAM NOTES

• A model of excellence and consistency on the football field, Eastern Kentucky is in search of its 32nd consecutive winning season in 2009. The last time the Colonels did not have a winning season was 1977 when they finished 5-5 overall. The team has not had a losing season since 1972 (5-6), the program's only losing season in the last 42 years. The only other Division I program with a longer active winning season streak is Florida State (who last had a non-winning season in 1976, one year before ECU's streak began). The program's 36 consecutive non-losing seasons is the longest streak in Division I.

• Eastern installed a new synthetic surface at Roy Kidd Stadium this past spring. This will be the first year in program history that the Colonels will not play their home games on natural grass. ECU also has brand new uniforms this season. The Colonels will go back to wearing maroon tops and white pants for home games for the first time since 2002. Eastern's helmets will feature an 'E' instead of the traditional 'EKU' that has been on the helmets since 1971.

• Eastern Kentucky claimed its record 20th OVC Championship last year and appeared in its 19th NCAA FCS Playoff. The 19 FCS Playoff berths are tied (with Montana) for the most all-time by a Football Championship Subdivision (formerly I-AA) team.

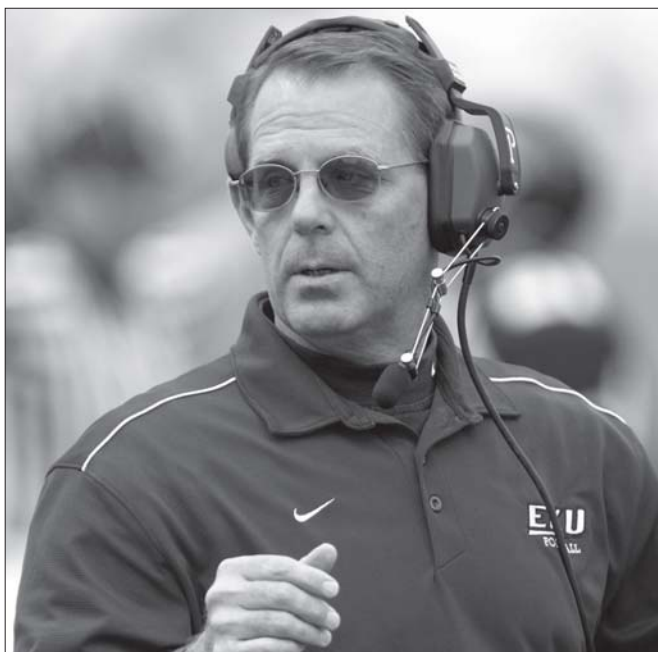
• This is the second straight year ECU will challenge two Division I FBS teams. The Colonels will square off against Indiana for the first time ever in the season opener before facing in-state rival Kentucky in November. Eastern and UK also played each other in 2007 and 1998.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

• In his first season as EKU head coach, Hood led the Colonels to its 20th OVC Championship and a berth in the FCS Playoffs. For that he was named Roy Kidd OVC Coach of the Year, marking the 12th time an EKU coach has won the award (10 times by Kidd for who the award is named).

• Hood was a three-time All-North Coast Athletic Conference selection at Ohio Wesleyan University, where he played defensive back. He was named a first-team All-American his senior season and served as team captain in each of his final two seasons. Hood was inducted into the OWU Athletic Hall of Fame in 2001.

• Hood got his coaching start at Fairmont (W.Va.) State College (1987-88) before moving on to Colgate in 1989. From 1990-93 he served as an assistant coach at Glenville (W.Va.) State, helping the program to the NAIA National Championship game in 1993. After serving as an assistant coach at Eastern Kentucky from 1994-98, Hood was at Ohio University for two years before moving onto Wake Forest.

• As defensive coordinator at Wake Forest, Hood's teams were known for creating turnovers and scoring touchdowns. The Demon Deacons forced 186 turnovers from 2001-07, which translated to more than two per game. In 2006, Wake won the ACC Championship for the first time since 1970 and competed in the BCS FedEx Orange Bowl. In 2007, Wake Forest led the ACC with 35 forced turnovers as the team finished the season 9-4 and captured the Meineke Car Care Bowl championship.

• While serving as an assistant coach at Eastern Kentucky, Hood's teams combined for a 32-6 OVC record, a pair of Conference championships (1994, 1997) and three FCS Playoff appearances (1994, 1995, 1997).

- In May the NCAA announced the Jacksonville State received a postseason ban due to an occasion three historic penalty of the APR (Academic Progress Rate). In accordance with OVC by-laws, since Jax State is not eligible for the NCAA postseason, they are also not eligible for the OVC Championship.

- Jacksonville State has scored in 97 consecutive games, dating back to a 28-0 shut-out by Troy in Jacksonville in 2000. It is the longest active streak among OVC teams, 31 games ahead of second place Eastern Illinois. The NCAA Football Championship Subdivision record for consecutive games scoring is 280 held by Hampton. That streak is active entering the 2009 season.

- Jax State finished last season 8-3 overall but was left out of the FCS Playoff field. It marked the first time an OVC team with eight (8) Division I wins was left out of the field since it expanded to 16 teams. JSU lost two OVC games by a combined four points during the year. The Gamecocks did finish the year ranked 22nd in the FCS Coaches Poll and 23rd in The Sports Network poll.

- Since Paul Snow Stadium opened in 1946, Jacksonville State has posted an incredible 230-92-8 record at home. Under Crowe, the Gamecocks are 31-15 all-time at home. The stadium underwent renovations in 1976 with the addition of the east end zone and south sideline seats. The fieldhouse also also constructed at the west end zone to enclose the stadium and then in the summer of 2005, the natural playing surface was replaced with Pro-Grass synthetic surface.

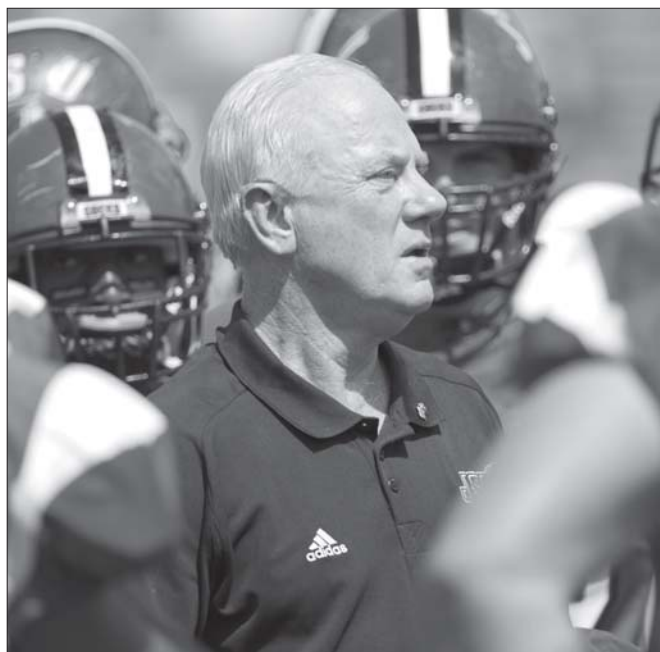
- Jacksonville State is the only school in the history of NCAA competition - on any level - to have won National Championships in football (1992), basketball (1985) and baseball (1990, 1991). Only six other NCAA schools have ever won a national championship in basketball and football (Florida, Michigan, Michigan State, Ohio State, North Alabama and Wittenberg).

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- Crowe took over the reins of the Gamecocks program in 2000 when the program was competing in the Southland Football Conference. The program became a member of the OVC in all sports in 2003 and Crowe led JSU to a 7-1 League record and OVC Championship. He repeated the feat the next season, once again amassing a 7-1 OVC mark and capturing the OVC Championship.

- Crowe did not play college football, instead he concentrated on baseball at Jefferson State Junior College and later UAB after playing both sports in high school. After graduation, he was the offensive coordinator at Oxford High School, helping the program to a 21-1-1 mark and a 1972 conference title.

- Crowe later moved onto the offensive coordinator job at Livingston University, where he later became the head coach. That was followed by offensive coordinator jobs at North Alabama, Wyoming, Auburn, Clemson and Arkansas, before he took over the head coaching job for the Razorbacks in 1991. Between his time at Arkansas and Jacksonville State, Crowe was the offensive coordinator at Baylor (1993-95). Crowe's teams won a SEC Championship (1983), three Atlantic Coast titles (1986-88) and a Southwest Conference Championship (1994).

- In his time at Auburn he helped coach Bo Jackson, who went on to win the Heisman Trophy and became one of the most famous two-sport stars in professional sports.

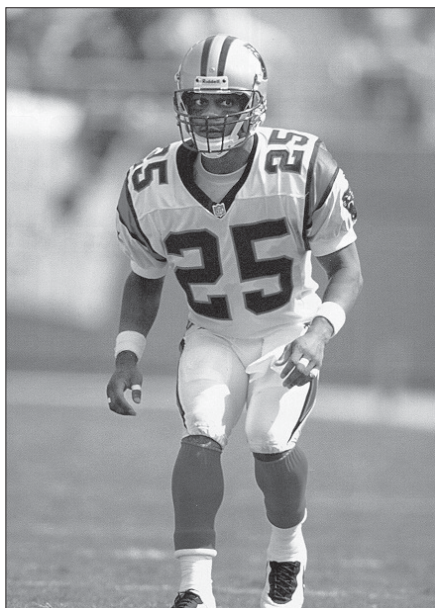

TEAM NOTES

• Senior defensive end Austen Lane has garnered several preseason national honors after a breakout junior season in 2008. That includes being one of 20 players named to the Sports Network's Buck Buchanan Award Watch List (National Defensive Player of the Year). He is the second straight Murray State player named to the list, as last season linebacker Nathan Williams finished fifth in the voting. Williams, who signed a contract with the New York Franchise of the United Football League (UFL), was a consensus All-American in 2008 after leading all of college football with 179 tackles.

• Murray State head coach Matt Griffin has improved the Racers program in each of his first three years with the team. After a 1-10 (0-8) record in 2006, MSU improved to 2-9 (0-8) in 2007 and 5-7 (4-4) a year ago. At his last head coaching stint, Griffin improved UT Martin in three straight seasons and the program then went on to win a OVC Championship in the fourth season.

• Expectations are high for the Racers this season as six players were selected to the All-OVC preseason team (the most among all OVC squads). MSU was picked to finish fifth overall, including receiving one first-place vote.

• Head coach Matt Griffin is following in a long line of successful coaches who have patrolled the sidelines at Roy Stewart Stadium. Among that include former Racers head coaches Mike Gottfried (later head coach at Kansas and Pitt), Frank Beamer (the current head coach at perennial power Virginia Tech) and Houston Nutt (now head coach at Mississippi). Two other notable names - Ralph Friedgen (Maryland) and Ron Zook (Illinois) were assistant coaches at Murray State at one point of their careers.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

• Matt Griffin became the 16th head coach in the storied history of Murray State football on Dec. 12, 2005.

• Griffin spent his first three years as a coach at UT Martin. When he took over the Skyhawk program the team had not won an OVC football game in six years. He led UTM to a single Conference victory in each 2003 and 2004 and then led the squad to a 4-4 record and fourth place finish in 2005. That performance in 2005 earned him a place among the 16 finalists for The Sports Network's Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year award.

• In his three years at UTM, Griffin produced 10 All-OVC selections, which was more than the previous seven years combined for the program. The six overall wins he led the 'Hawks to in 2005 were tied for the most since the program made the move to I-AA.

• Griffin got his coaching start at Plymouth State College in New Hampshire. After three seasons with that program (1992-94), he was the wide receivers coach at Richmond (1994) for a year before becoming the quarterbacks coach at Northeastern. There he helped recruit future NFL quarterback Jim Murphy. A year later he was the offensive coordinator at UTM, before four years at the University of Maine. He helped the Black Bears to an Atlantic-10 Championship and two playoff appearances (2001, 2002).

• As a player at the University of New Hampshire, Griffin was a team captain and led the conference in passing as a senior. He set several Wildcat passing records and now ranks third in UNH history in career passing yards (5,245) while his 2,734 passing yards in 1991 was the third most in school history.

TEAM NOTES

- Senior P/K Doug Spada earned two All-American honors this preseason. A native of Shelby, N.C., Spada was named to both the Sports Network (First-Team) and Consensus Draft Services Preseason FCS All-American Teams. He led the OVC and ranked third in the nation with a 44.7 yards per punt average a year ago. Spada also became only the third player in Southeast Missouri State University football history to garner All-American accolades in consecutive seasons, joining P David Simonhoff (2004-06) and TE Ray Goodson (2003-04).

- Preseason All-Ohio Valley Conference senior WR Walter Peoples is closing in on 1,000 receiving yards in his Southeast Missouri State University career. Peoples, who hails from Glendale, Ariz., caught 65 passes for a league-high 903 yards last season. He has 70 catches for 972 yards and seven touchdowns (six in 2008) in three years for the Redhawks. Peoples enters the year on a streak of 14-consecutive games with a catch.

- Nine of Southeast Missouri State's 13 interceptions came against OVC opponents last season. The Redhawks, who tied for fourth in interceptions in league play, finished with 228 INT return yards (17.5 ypr). Southeast's defense also recovered 10 fumbles on the year.

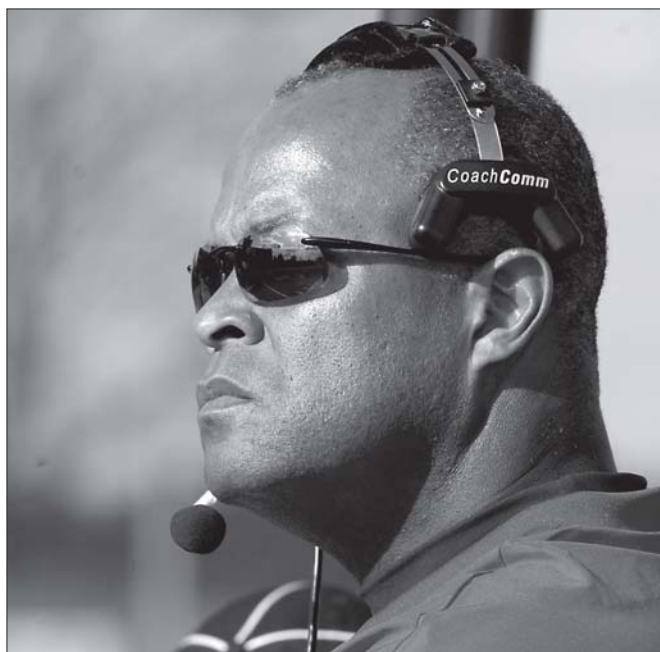

TEAM NOTES

• Tennessee State has claimed the Sgt. York Trophy in each of its first two years of existence (2007 and 2008). The trophy is contested between the four OVC schools from the state of Tennessee and named for Sgt. Alvin C. York, a war hero and native Tennessean. In 2007 the Tigers finished Sgt. York competition with a 2-1 record (losing its final game against UT Martin) and finished in a tie with Austin Peay (but took home the trophy due to a head-to-head win). Last season the Tigers were 3-0 in Sgt. York games.

• The Tigers are fielding their 94th varsity football team this season and are playing in the Ohio Valley Conference for the 22nd season. The Tigers have won 14 Black College National Championships over the years - 1946, 1947, 1954, 1956, 1965, 1966, 1970, 1971, 1973, 1979, 1982.

• Tennessee State plays its home games in one of the finest facilities in all the country - LP Field, home of the NFL's Tennessee Titans. With a capacity of 67,500, it is the largest home facility used by a Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) team. The 2009 season marks the 11th year of play at LP Field (formerly The Coliseum) for TSU. The program was winless there in 2005, but posted a 4-1 mark at home in 2006 and 5-0 mark there a season ago; TSU is 30-17 all-time in the facility.

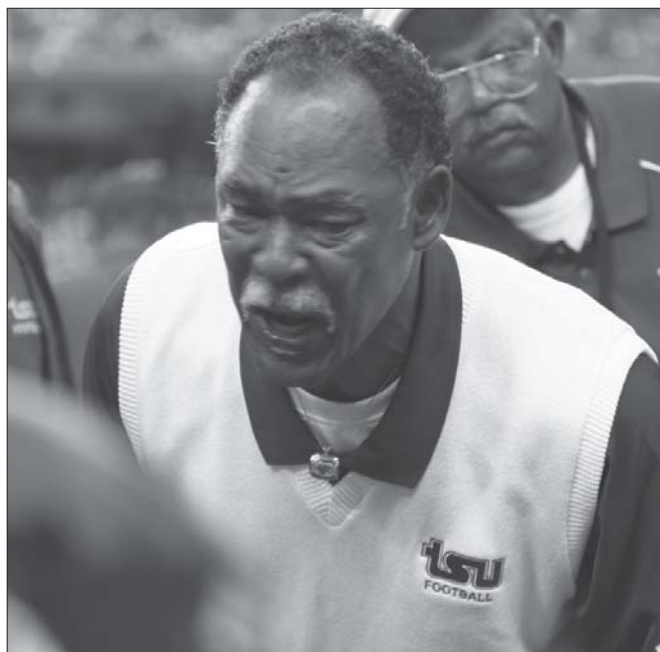
• Tennessee State has a long history of producing NFL talent, including former All-Pro players Richard Dent (Chicago Bears) and Ed "Too Tall" Jones (Dallas Cowboys). More recent NFL players include Randy Fuller - who played in Super Bowl XXX with Pittsburgh and Super Bowl XXXII with Atlanta - and Anthony Pleasant, who played with New England in both Super Bowl XXXV and XXXVII. In 2008, Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie was taken by Arizona with the 16th pick of the first round and went on to be a starter at cornerback in Super Bowl XLIII.

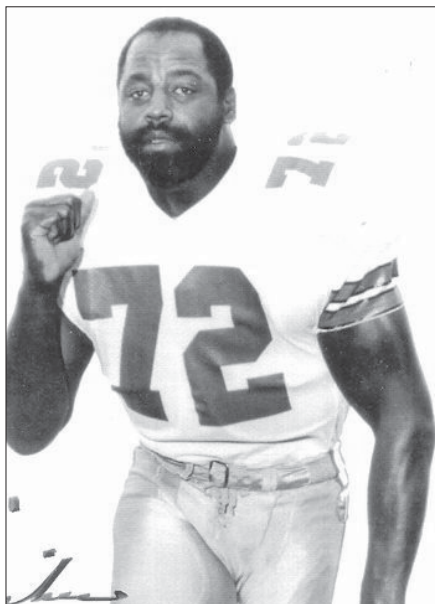

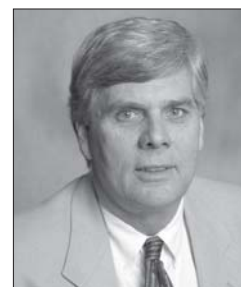

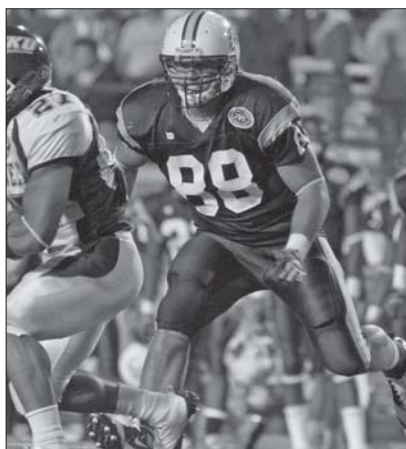

2009 Preseason All-OVC Team selection...After playing tight end in 2007, moved to the defensive side of the ball in 2008...Ranked fourth on his team in tackles (65) while ranking first on his team and sixth in the league in quarterback sacks (5.0)...Against Eastern Kentucky had a career-high 12 tackles including 2.5 tackles-for-loss...Had eight tackles against Tennessee State and seven against each Austin Peay and Jacksonville State.

TEAM NOTES

- Junior running back/kicker returner Henry Sailes was tabbed a third-team preseason All-American by the Sports Network prior to the 2009 season. As a return man in 2008, Sailes handled 16 kickoffs for 449 yards (28.1 yards/return) including an 87-yard touchdown. Sailes has explosive speed and sees action as a running back, including catching a lot of passes out of the backfield. A year ago he had 47 catches (second-most on the team) for 344 yards and two touchdowns. He carried the ball 72 times for a team-high 433 yards and four scores as well.

- Now in his third season with the program, head coach Watson Brown has his most experienced team. The Golden Eagles return 46 lettermen from last year, including nine starters on both offense and defense.

- Two years ago the Golden Eagles played in front of 85,754 fans at Auburn, the largest crowd to ever see an OVC football team play. Tennessee Tech may break that record this season as they will play at national power Georgia on Nov. 7. Last season the Bulldogs averaged 92,746 fans at six home games.

- Tennessee Tech also holds the OVC record for most fans to see a Conference game. On November 6, 1999 there were 41,132 fans at Tennessee State to see the Golden Eagles and Tigers play. Last season that game drew 24,361 fans to LP Field in Nashville in what was the sixth-largest crowd for a Conference game.

- Senior quarterback Lee Sweeney enters his final year of college football chasing several records. He needs just two completions to break the Tech mark of 832 and two touchdowns to break the Golden Eagle career mark of 38. Sweeney is also just 572 yards of total offense away from the top mark in TTU history.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

• Brown was named the 10th head coach in Tennessee Tech football history on Dec. 9, 2006. Brown returned to his hometown of Cookeville to take over the Golden Eagles program. Brown was a standout athlete at Cookeville High School.

• Prior to coaching at Tennessee Tech Brown spent 12 years as head coach at UAB (1995-06). From 2002 he also served as the schools Director of Athletics, making him only the third A.D. in school history. After guiding UAB through I-AA to I-A independent status, Brown helped the Blazers into Conference USA in 1999. Brown-coached teams finished tied for second in C-USA in each 1999, 2001 and 2004. His 2004 squad was 7-5 overall, 5-3 in C-USA and participated in the Sheraton Hawaii Bowl.

• Brown got his start in coaching as an assistant coach at his alma mater, Vanderbilt, and later at East Carolina, Jacksonville State and Texas Tech. His break as a head coach came in 1979 at another OVC school - Austin Peay - at the age of 29. He led the Governors to back-to-back 7-4 seasons

• His success in Clarksville led to jobs at Cincinnati, Rice and later as head coach at Vanderbilt for five seasons. Following his stint at Vandy, he was the offensive coordinator at Oklahoma.

• As a player at Vanderbilt, Brown was a standout quarterback and helped lead the Commodores to a 14-10 upset victory over Alabama in 1969. He was named *Sports Illustrated's* National Back of the Week for his performance.

• Brown comes from a line of successful coaches. His grandfather, Eddie "Jelly" Watson, was a legendary coach at Cookeville High School and his brother, Mack Brown, is currently the head coach at Texas, where he led the Longhorns to the 2005 BCS National Championship.

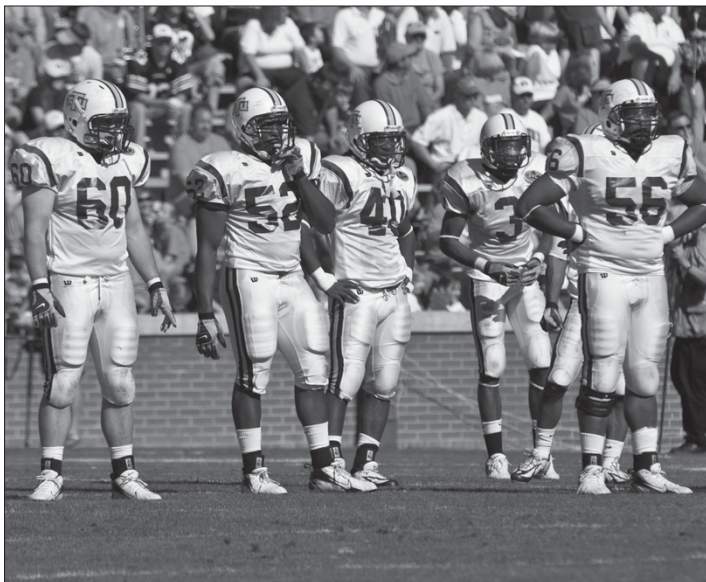

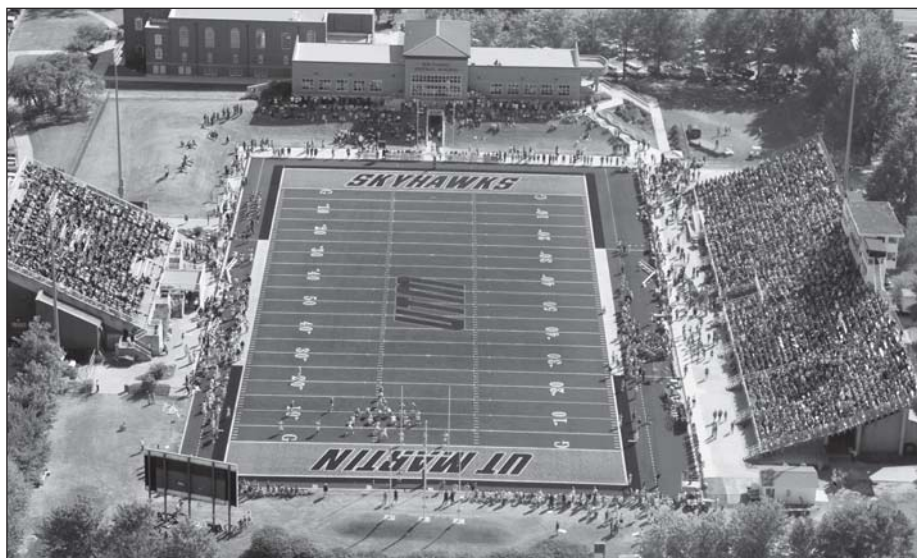

TEAM NOTES

- UT Martin will renew its in-state rivalry with Memphis this season for the first time since the 1932 season. The two teams will play Sept. 19 at the Liberty Bowl. UT Martin (formerly known as Hall-Moody) won the initial two meetings (1924 and 1925) before Memphis (formerly known as West Tennessee State Teachers College) won four games between the years of 1928 and 1932.

- Memphis will be the lone Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponent for UT Martin this season. In 2010 the Skyhawks will travel to Neyland Stadium in Knoxville, Tenn. to match up with Southeastern Conference foe Tennessee for the first-time in program history. The game is set for Sept. 4, 2010. Last season the team battled a pair of FBS foes including nationally-ranked South Florida and Auburn.

- Senior offensive lineman Joe Gibbs was named a second-team preseason All-American by Consensus Draft Services (CDS). Gibbs, a 6-4, 280-pound tackle, was a 2008 All-OVC selection after grading out at 87 percent during the season and not allowing a sack.

- Last season ended with UT Martin coming up just two points shy against Eastern Kentucky, as a last second desperation field goal attempt fell short, giving ECU the OVC Championship and keeping the Skyhawks winless all-time against the Colonels. Although the Skyhawks missed out on an at-large playoff berth, they did finish the year 8-4 overall, 6-2 in the OVC (tied for second). UTM ranked 44th in the College Sporting News final Gridiron Power Index (GPI).

- UT Martin ranked fourth nationally a season ago in scoring offense (37.33 points/game). The team also ranked 16th nationally in total offense (405.58 yards/game).

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

• In his first three years at UT Martin Simpson has won 21 games, the highest three-year win total in school history.

• In his first season as a head coach (2006), Simpson led UT Martin to its best season of football at the FCS level and was named OVC Coach of the Year for his efforts. The Skyhawks won nine games overall (the most since winning 11 in 1988 when the team competed at the Division II level), shared its first Ohio Valley Conference Championship and advanced to the FCS Playoffs for the first time in school history. It was only the team's third .500 or better record since the move up from Division II.

• Simpson came to UTM after three seasons at Chattanooga as that program's offensive coordinator. At UTC, he helped the Mocs to a 6-5 record in 2006, the program's first winning season since 1997. There he coached quarterback Cedric Stevens, who threw for more than 3,100 yards and had a 66 percent completion percentage. He also coached Alonzo Nix, who set the Southern Conference record for receptions (90) on his way to All-America honors.

• Simpson got his start at Delta State (1994-95) serving as the defensive backs coach for two years before moving onto Jacksonville State (1997-99). At JSU he was a member of the staff that was responsible for the third best turnaround in Division I football for the 1997 and 1998 seasons. That was followed by one year at Blinn Junior College (2000) and four seasons as quarterbacks coach and recruiting coordinator at Texas State (2000-03).

• Simpson played two seasons of college football at Mississippi State, where he was also a member of the baseball team. He then transferred to Southern Miss, where he was a two-time all-conference pick on the diamond and a team captain.

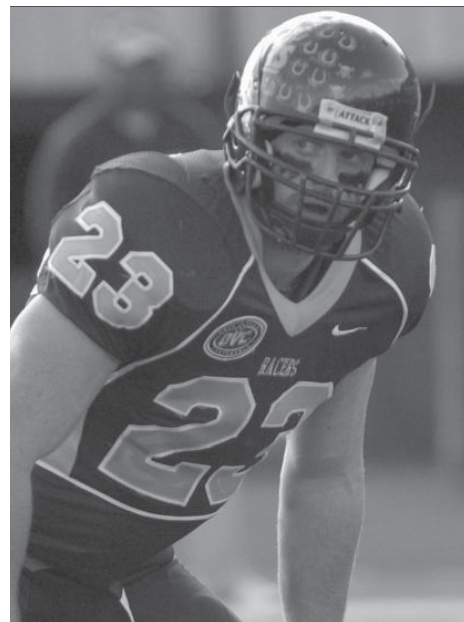

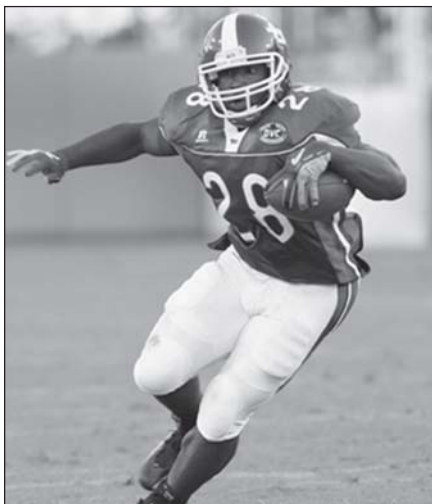

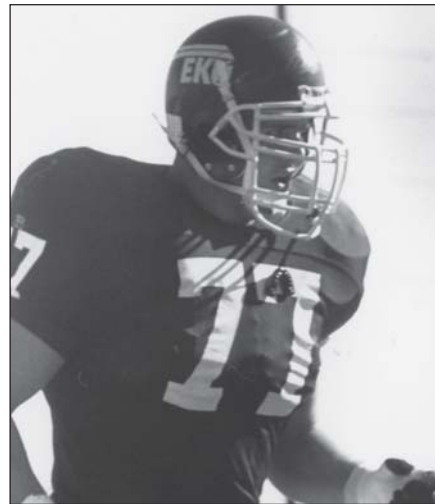

Tennessee State's Javarri Williams capped his outstanding career by capturing 2008 OVC Offensive Player of the Year honors. He rushed for 1,000 or more yards in each of his final three seasons, including 1,037 yards in only 10 games in 2008. He finished his career as the all-time TSU leader in rushing touchdowns (42) and second in rushing yards (4,329). He was drafted by the Kansas City Chiefs in the seventh round of the 2009 NFL Draft.

Eastern Kentucky's Chad Bratzke earned OVC Defensive Player of the Year honors in 1993. That season he had 87 tackles (57 solo) to go along with 11 sacks and two fumble recoveries. For his career Bratzke totalled 253 tackles and 27 sacks. He was drafted in the fifth round of the 1994 NFL Draft by the New York Giants. He would play five seasons with the Giants and five more with the Indianapolis Colts before retiring following the 2003 season.

FCS/I-AA PLAYOFFS HISTORY

The I-AA (re-named the Football Championship Subdivision at the end of the 2006 season) Playoffs began in 1978. FCS schools are the only Division I institutions who compete in a playoff format for a national championship (Football Bowl Subdivision - formerly I-A - compete for the Bowl Championship Series Championship).

Eastern Kentucky, which won the I-AA national championship in 1979 and 1982, has been to the playoffs an unprecedented 19 times in the 30-year history of the event. That is tied for first all-time with Big Sky Conference foe Montana. EKU, along with fellow OVC members Eastern Illinois, Jacksonville State, Murray State and UT Martin have also been in the field during the past seven years. The 2009 playoffs begin on Saturday, Nov. 28 and continue with the second round of games on Saturday, Dec. 5, while the semifinals will be held Friday, Dec. 11 and Saturday, Dec. 12. For the 13th straight year, the Championship Game will be held at Finley Stadium/Davenport Field in Chattanooga, Tenn. This year's game is set for Friday, Dec. 18.

SGT. YORK TROPHY

In July 2007, the Nashville Sports Council and the Ohio Valley Conference announced the creation of the Sergeant York Trophy which goes to the winner of the quadrangular season football series between the four Ohio Valley Conference schools located in the state of Tennessee – Austin Peay State University, University of Tennessee at Martin, Tennessee State University and Tennessee Technological University.

The award is only the second traveling trophy that involves more than two teams in college sports; the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy which has been contested between Air Force, Army and Navy annually since 1972.

In a close race, Tennessee State and Austin Peay shared the inaugural award, finishing with identical 2-1 records in 2007. Tennessee State took the trophy home with it thanks to a one-point victory in overtime over the Governors; that game was decided by a block extra point by NFL First Round Draft Pick Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie. The Tigers repeated as champions in 2008, winning all three of its Sgt. York games.

The award is named in honor of Alvin C. York, the most noted Soldier of World War I. As a corporal in the 2nd battalion, 328th Infantry, in the Battle of the Meuse River-Argonne (Oct. 8, 1918), York and seven other soldiers captured 132 prisoners, was promoted to sergeant and received the Distinguished Service Cross, the French *Croix de Guerre*, the French Legion of Honor, the *Croce di Guerra* of Italy and the War Medal of Montenegro. Upon his return to the United States in 1919, he was bestowed the Congressional Medal of Honor.

Following the war York returned his home in Pall Mall, Tenn. (located in north central Tennessee, 55 miles northeast of Cookeville) where he dedicated his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee. In 1927 he established the Alvin C. York Institute after spending several years raising money for the school which opened as a private institution. That school was established, in part, to provide educational opportunities denied to the boys and girls of Fentress County. In 1937, the Institute became a state special school after an appeal to the Tennessee State Legislature. The school, located in Jamestown, Tenn., is still in operation today.

York died on Sept. 2, 1964 and the foundation which he helped establish in 1920 – The Sergeant York Patriotic Foundation – was dormant for many years. The Foundation was re-established by Lipscomb Davis, Jr. in 1992 and is currently run by Sgt. York's grandson Gerald (U.S. Army Colonel, Retired). York's papers are archived by Michael E. Birdwell, Ph.D., who is an associate professor of history at Tennessee Technological University, one of the four institutions that will compete for the yearly honor.



After the completion of the football season, the Sergeant York Trophy is awarded to the institution with the best head-to-head record in the match-ups with their fellow Tennessee schools. In the event of a tie, the award is shared; however, the previous winner will retain the trophy if they are part of the tie. If the tie is between two other institutions, the trophy will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy.

The award is presented to the winning institution annually at the O'Charley's Dinner of Champions, which is hosted each spring by the Nashville Sports Council. The event was created in 1999 and salutes amateur and professional sports in Tennessee.

OVC/NCAA OVERTIME PROCEDURES

PROCEDURE FOLLOWING REGULATION PLAY:

Immediately following the conclusion of the fourth quarter, officials will instruct both teams to retire to their respective team areas. The officials will escort the captains to the center of the field for the coin toss. The winner of the toss shall be given the option of selecting offense or defense, with the offense at the opponent's 25-yard line to start the series, or which end of the field shall be used for both series of that overtime period. The winner of the toss may not defer his choice. The loser of the toss shall have the first choice of the two options for subsequent even-numbered extra periods.

EXTRA PERIODS:

An extra period shall consist of two series with Team A and Team B each putting the ball in play by snap at the designated 25-yard line, which becomes the opponent's 25-yard line.

TEAM SERIES:

Each team retains the ball during a series until it scores or fails to make a first down. The ball remains alive after a change of team possession until it is declared dead. However, Team A may not have a first and 10 if it again possesses the ball after a change of team possession.

SCORING:

The team scoring the greater number of points during the regulation and extra periods shall be declared the winner. There shall be an equal number of series, as defined, in each extra period, except if Team B scores during a period other than on the try (i.e.: on the first possession of a period, Team A scores a touchdown. On the try, Team B intercepts a pass and returns it for a two-point touchdown. Ruling: Team B is awarded the ball on the 25-yard line to start its series with the overtime score 6-2.). **Beginning with the third extra period, teams scoring a touchdown must attempt a two-point try. A one-point try, although not illegal, will not score a point.**

TIMEOUTS:

Each team shall be allowed one timeout for each extra period. Unused extra-period timeouts may not be carried over to other extra periods.

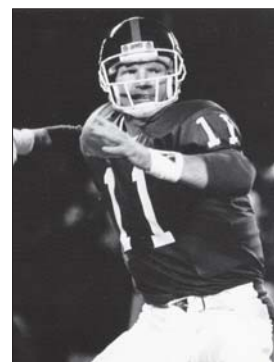
OVC PLAYERS IN THE NFL DRAFT

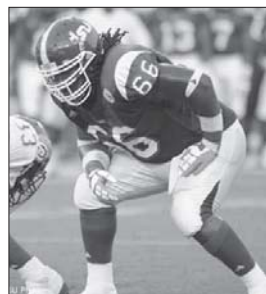

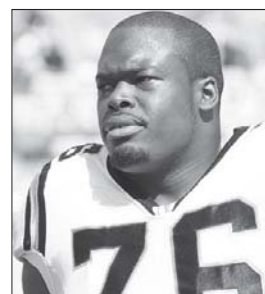

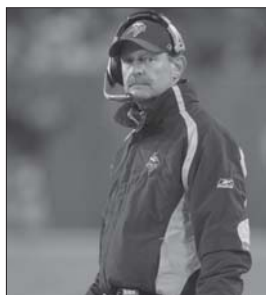
