THIS WEEK'S OVC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

PLAYER

Wesley Channels, G • Sr., 6-2, 210 • Memphis, Tenn. • Austin Peay

Channels led Austin Peay in scoring in a pair of wins last week as the Governors beat two teams directly above them in the OVC standings (Eastern Kentucky and Morehead State). Channels scored a season-high 24 points and dished out five assists on 6-of-9 shooting (4-of-5 from 3-point range) in the team's four-point win over EKU. In the first half against Morehead State (a team that entered the game with the nation's second-longest winning streak of 11 games), Channels had only three points and five turnovers, but turned it around in the second half to finish with 17 points, including hitting 5-of-7 shots in the game's second 20 minutes, as APSU won by one point. For the week Channels averaged 20.5 points, 2.0 rebounds, 2.5 assists and 1.0 steals/game while hitting 63.2 percent (12-of-19) from the field and 85.7 percent (6-of-7) from 3-point range.

NEWCOMER

Trenton Marshall, G/F • Jr., 6-5, 225 • Garyville, La. • Jacksonville State

Marshall won his sixth OVC Newcomer of the Week award of the season and third in four weeks after leading Jacksonville State to a pair of victories last week. Marshall averaged 19.5 points, 7.0 rebounds and 1.5 steals/game and hit 46.2 percent (12-of-26) from the field and 47.1 percent (8-of-17) from 3-point range. He opened the week with a 14-point, 8-rebound performance in a three-point win over Southeast Missouri State. Marshall capped the week by scoring 25 points in a win over Eastern Illinois. In that game the junior scored 16 of his 25 points in the second half to help break open a close game. Marshall added six rebounds, two steals, a block and an assist in the EIU contest.

FRESHMAN

Justin Blake, G • R-Fr., 6-3, 170 • Dyersburg, Tenn. • Austin Peay

Blake averaged 13.5 points, 3.0 rebounds, 2.0 assists and 2.0 steals/game in two Austin Peay wins last week but more importantly hit a 3-pointer with 10.9 seconds left to lift the Governors to a one-point win over Morehead State on Sunday. That win snapped the Eagles 11-game winning streak, which had been the second-longest streak nationally. With his team trailing by 10 points with five minutes to play against MSU, Blake hit a 3-pointer to spark his team's comeback. Overall he scored seven of the Gobs final 14 points, including the game-winning trifecta. He finished the contest with 14 points. Blake added 13 points against Eastern Kentucky, and now has five-straight double-figure scoring games since being inserted into the APSU starting lineup. For the week Blake hit 56.3 percent (9-of-16) from the field and 45.5 percent (5-of-11) from 3-point range.

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NOTES FROM AROUND THE LEAGUE

OVC Overview/This Week's Highlights: Monday marked the announcement of the pairings for this year's BracketBusters series, which is now in its eighth year...For the fifth-straight season every OVC school is participating in the event...Murray State was picked for one of the 11 televised games, marking the first time an OVC team has been in a TV BracketBusters game since 2007; OVC teams are 1-3 all-time in TV matchups, with the lone win coming from Murray State, who topped Rice in 2005...The BracketBusters games will occur on Feb. 19-20...Murray State continues to be hot, winning its 11th-straight game overall, which is now the second-longest winning streak in the nation (behind only Siena)...The Racers also reached the 20-win plateau on Saturday, becoming the third quickest Division I team to the mark this season...Morehead State saw its 11-game winning streak come to an end on Sunday at Austin Peay, falling to the Governors by one point...The Eagles Kenneth Faried recorded a 20/20 game last week (23 points, 21 rebounds), just the sixth Division I player to do so this season...Faried leads all Division I players with 13.7 rebounds/game and is second nationally with 16 double-doubles...One matchup of note this week is on Saturday night when Austin Peay plays at Murray State...Entering this week the OVC had a conference RPI of 20, up from 27th just two years ago.

Pairings Announced for ESPN BracketBusters Series: All 11 OVC schools will participate in the ESPN BracketBusters series for the fifth straight season in 2009-10. The 2010 matchups were announced on Feb. 1 and can be found below. Murray State was picked for a TV game with Morgan State, the fourth time an OVC school has been picked for a TV game, and first since 2007. Now it's eighth year, ESPN BracketBusters is an ESPN television property that was tremendously successful with its first seven events. The event has allowed Division I conferences to participate in a cutting-edge format that involves "wild card" pairings from the pool of participating teams, with half of the ESPN BracketBusters teams pre-designated as "home" and the remaining half as "road" teams. OVC schools are 16-29 all-time in the event, including a 3-7 mark a season ago. The games will be played on Feb. 19-20 this year.

Morehead State's Faried is Nation's Leading Returning Rebounder; Currently Ranks 1st This Season: Morehead State junior **Kenneth Faried** entered the 2009-10 season as Division I's leading returning rebounder. Faried is now first nationally in rebounding (13.7 rebounds/game). That number is 15.5 rebounds per game in 11 Conference games this season. He also has 16 double-doubles in 22 total games this season (which ranks second nationally). Faried had a season-high 21 rebounds in a road win over Tennessee State on Jan. 28. He has also had a 19-rebound game, an 18-rebound game, four 16-rebound games and four 15-rebound games in 2009-10. Faried has 12-straight games with at least 12 rebounds and recently had a four-game stretch with 20 or more points and 15 or more rebounds (that streak ended on Sunday). He is also one of six Division I players to have a 20/20 game this season (23 points, 21 rebounds against Tennessee State). Last season Faried, the OVC Defensive Player of the Year and OVC Tournament MVP, ranked third nationally in rebounds per game, pulling down 13.0 a contest (that number increased to 13.5 boards per game in OVC games). That trailed only National Player of the Year Blake Griffin (14.4 rebounds/game) and Santa Clara's John Bryant (14.2/game) in the national standings and both of those players have left the college game. Faried had a career-high 24 rebounds in a game against Florida A&M, which was the third most rebounds in a game in Division I last season.

Murray State Conference Winning Streak Ranks Fourth in OVC History: With an OVC win last week, Murray State increased its OVC winning streak to 18 games dating back to last season. The Racers have won 11 OVC games this season, and last lost to an OVC foe in the regular season on Feb. 7, 2009 (83-80 at Austin Peay). The 18-game OVC winning streak is tied for the fourth longest in league history.

Murray State Reaches 20 Victories Third Quickest Nationally: With its win over UT Martin on Saturday, Murray State became just the third team nationally to reach 20 wins, trailing only BYU and Syracuse. Currently there are only six total teams with 20 wins, as Kentucky, Kansas and New Mexico joined the group later in the weekend. The 20-win season is the 23rd for Murray State all-

Murray State Ranked in CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major Poll: After its quick start Murray State entered CollegeInsider.com's Mid-Major Poll at No. 23 on Nov. 23. The Racers are now eighth nationally, the highest they have been this season. This week's poll was not available at press time. Morehead State and Eastern Kentucky are currently among the other teams receiving votes in the poll. Now in its 11th season, the Mid-Major poll is made up of team's from the following conferences: America East, Atlantic Sun, Big Sky, Big South, Big West, Colonial, Great West, Horizon, Independents, Ivy, Metro Atlantic, Mid-American, Mid-Eastern, Missouri Valley, Northeast, Ohio Valley, Patriot, Southern, Southland, Southwestern, Summit, Sun Belt, West Coast. It is voted upon by coaches from those conferences, with one coach per conference casting a vote (Murray State's Billy Kennedy is the OVC representative).

Home Court Winning Streaks: Eastern Kentucky saw its school-record 19-game home winning streak come to an end on Jan. 23 with a loss to Morehead State. It was the first at home for the Colonels since December 4, 2008 (58-50 to Murray State). The streak was the sixth-longest nationally when it came to an end. Murray State now has the longest home court winning streak in the OVC at 14 games. That streak currently ranks 15th nationally. Kansas has the nation's longest home court winning streak (54).

The OVC Among the NCAA Statistical Leaders: In the latest set of NCAA statistical leaders, Murray State ranks second nationally in field goal percentage (51.5%), fourth in scoring margin (+19.0) and fourth in steals/game (11.0). Eastern Kentucky is second nationally in 3-pointers made/game (10.3), second in assist-to-turnover ratio (+1.60) and third in fewest turnovers/game (10.0). Morehead State ranks fourth in rebound margin (+9.0) while Tennessee Tech is 10th in 3-point percentage (41.0%). Individually, Morehead State's **Kenneth Faried** is first nationally in rebounding (13.7/game) and second in double-doubles (16) while Tennessee Tech's **Frank Davis** is seventh in 3-point percentage (46.7%).

Channels An All-Around Consistent Performer: Looking at the list of OVC active leaders in five of the major statistical categories, the name of Austin Peay senior guard **Wesley Channels** keeps popping up. In his solid four-year career Channels has been one of the top all-around performers in the league. The Memphis, Tenn. native currently ranks first among active players in scoring (1,537), first in assists (290), second in steals (155), fourth in 3-pointers made (202) and ninth in rebounds (397).

Loos Becomes All-Time Winningest Coach in OVC History: With a 68-66 victory at Ohio on Dec. 9, Austin Peay head coach **Dave Loos** recorded his 320th career victory while in the OVC, a mark that ranks first all-time. Loos passed Cal Luther (319 wins at Murray State and UT Martin) for the all-time mark. Loos, the Dean of OVC coaches, is in his 20th year at Austin Peay where he also serves as the Athletics Director, making him the only Division I head men's basketball coach to hold that distinction. Loos now has 327 victories in his tenure at Austin Peay and 409 for his career.

Faried Named Midseason Mid-Major All-American by Sporting News: Sporting News writer Mike DeCourcy named Morehead State's **Kenneth Faried** as one of his five mid-season mid-major All-Americans. DeCourcy called Faried the "nation's best rebounder" and that he "chases rebounds with an attitude." Faried was joined by Butler's Gordon Hayward, Saint Mary's Omar Samhan, Radford's Artsiom Parakhouski and Cornell's Ryan Wittman on the team.

Fox Sports Radio 1370 WDEF-AM in Chattanooga to Broadcast OVC Men's Basketball Game of the Week: For the second straight season Fox Sports Radio 1370 WDEF-AM out of Chattanooga will broadcast an OVC Men's Basketball Game of the Week in 2009-10. This season the station will broadcast a seven-game schedule, including broadcasting the OVC Tournament semifinals for the first time. OVC Tournament to Be Held at Sommet Center for 11th Time and in Nashville For 16th Time in 17 Years: The 2010 OVC Basketball Tournament will be held at the Sommet Center in downtown Nashville for the 11th time this season. The event was first held there in 1997 (marking the first basketball event in the venue) and has been held there every year since with the exceptions of 2002, 2004 and 2008. Last year the men's final went two overtimes with Morehead State finally topping Austin Peay when Steve Peterson hit his only bucket of the game with 1.4 seconds left in the second overtime. Overall this year will mark the 16th time in the last 17 years the tournament has been held in Nashville (with 2002 being the only year in that stretch the event was not in Music City).

Westwood One to Broadcast OVC Championship Game: For the first time this season, the 2010 Men's Basketball Championship game will be broadcast by the Westwood One radio network, the largest provider of audio content in America. Westwood One is one of the nation's largest providers of network radio programming and one of the largest domestic providers of traffic information in the U.S. Westwood One serves more than 5,000 radio and 170 TV stations in the U.S. Westwood One provides over 150 news, sports, music, talk and entertainment programs, features and live events to numerous media partners. Westwood One is home of the most prestigious sports broadcasts on radio. Westwood One's lineup includes regular season NFL football, the Playoffs and the Super Bowl; NCAA Football and Basketball including the Final Four; College World Series; Frozen Four; the Olympics; the Masters and more. Through its Metro Traffic division, Westwood One provides traffic reporting and local news, sports and weather to approximately 2,300 radio and TV stations. Westwood One also provides digital and other cross-platform delivery of its network and Metro content.

Hudson and Domercant Named to CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major All-Decade Team: Two Ohio Valley Conference players were among the 26 players selected to the CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major All-Decade Team. Former UT Martin guard **Lester Hudson** and former Eastern Illinois forward **Henry Domercant** were on the squad released on Jan. 3. Hudson (2007-09) was a two-time All-American and OVC Player of the Year at UT Martin and became the first Division I men's player to record a quadruple-double in a game. He was drafted by the Boston Celtics in the second round of the 2009 NBA Draft. Domercant's 2,602 career points are the most in OVC history (and No. 26 all-time in NCAA history) and he finished in the top five in the nation in scoring three times. Division I coaches and NBA scouts were part of the selection process but the final decision was made by the CollegeInsider.com staff.

The 2009-10 Season: The 2009-10 season marks the 62nd of competition in the OVC. Over the previous 61 years, 12 different teams have claimed an OVC regular season championship, including four different schools in the past five years. UT Martin won its first OVC Regular Season Championship in 2008-09.

OVC Players in the Pros: There are three former OVC players on NBA rosters. Those three players are Austin Peay's **Trenton Hassell** (New Jersey Nets), Murray State's **James Singleton** (Dallas Mavericks) and UT Martin's **Lester Hudson** (Memphis Grizzlies). Hassell is in his ninth season in the NBA and third with the Nets. He also played with the Chicago Bulls (who drafted him 30th overall in the 2001 Draft and where he played two seasons), Minnesota Timberwolves (four seasons) and Dallas Mavericks (37 games in 2007-08). During his 592-game career he has averaged 5.9 points, 2.8 rebounds and 1.8 assists per game while hitting 44.7 percent of his field goal attempts. After being undrafted out of college (2003), Singleton played overseas before being signed by the Los Angeles Clippers before the 2005-06 season and played two seasons there before signing with Dallas in 2008-09. In his 174-game career, Singleton has averaged 3.5 points and 3.2 rebounds per game while hitting 49.3 percent of his shots. Hudson won the last two OVC Player of the Year awards before being drafted by the Boston Celtics in the second round (pick No. 58) of the 2009 NBA Draft. Hudson signed a one-year unguaranteed contract after his play in the NBA Summer League with the team. He appeared in 16 games with the Celtics until being waived in January; that same week he was signed by his hometown Memphis Grizzlies. Another UT Martin product, **Jared Newson**, is currently in the NBDL, playing for the Bakersfield Jam.

Morehead State and Murray State Picked as Preseason Co-Favorites: In a vote of Ohio Valley Conference head men's basketball coaches and sports information directors, **Morehead State** and **Murray State** each received 10 first-place votes and were picked as co-favorites for the 2009-10 season. Morehead State finished last season 12-6 in league play (4th place) and went on to win the OVC Tournament Championship. Murray State was tied for second overall last season with a 13-5 record and lost in the OVC Tournament semifinals. It marks the 13th time in the last 21 years that Murray State has been picked the preseason favorite and second year in a row. Morehead State is tabbed first for the first time since the 1983-84 season (when they went 25-6 and won the OVC regular season and tournament championships). It marks just the third time since 1980-81 (when preseason polls were first available) that co-favorites have been picked in the preseason poll (it also happened in 1991-92 and 1994-95). Morehead State and Murray State each received 154 points and were followed next by **Austin Peay** who had 114 total points. **Eastern Illinois** was picked fourth (105 points) and followed by **Eastern Kentucky** (93), **Jacksonville State** (86), **Tennessee Tech** (76), **UT Martin** (55), **Tennessee State** (44) and **Southeast Missouri State** (19).

Preseason Predictions: Is being picked the preseason favorite, always a good thing? Over the past 30 years of preseason polls that were available, the league's head coaches and sports information directors correctly pick the eventual OVC regular season champion 60 percent of the time, picking the correct winner 18 times over the last 30 years. Over the past 10 years, the preseason poll has correctly picked the winner every other year. Last season the poll tabbed Murray State the favorite, although the Racers finished second to UT Martin, who won its first-ever OVC Championship a year ago.

Morehead State's Faried Tabbed as Preseason Player of the Year: The 2009-10 All-OVC Preseason Men's Basketball team was headlined by Morehead State junior center **Kenneth Faried**. Faried is coming off a season where he was named OVC Defensive Player of the Year and OVC Tournament MVP. Overall six different schools were represented on the team with Murray State's three selections leading the way. Eastern Illinois and Morehead State each had two selections while Austin Peay, Eastern Kentucky and Tennessee State had one player apiece on the squad. The team features just one player (Faried) who was a first-team All-OVC selection last season. The team does have three second-team All-OVC picks from 2008-09 and two players who were on last season's All-Newcomer Team. Faried made a splash last season being named the Conference's first OVC Defensive Player of the Year after ranking third nationally in rebounding (13.0/game), 52nd nationally in blocked shots (1.9/game) and 69th nationally in steals (1.9/game). Faried also added 13.9 points per game and connected on 55.6 percent of his field goal attempts (36th nationally). The 6-8 native of Newark, N.J. also tallied 25 double-doubles, which was the second most nationally, trailing only National Player of the Year Blake Griffin (29). Austin Peay's **Wesley Channels**, Eastern Illinois' **Romain Martin** and Murray State's **Danero Thomas** were each second-team All-OVC picks last season and are each on the preseason team this year. Murray State's **Ivan Aska** and **Isacc Miles** were two of the five All-OVC Newcomer selections in 2008-09 who are also on this year's All-OVC preseason squad. The Preseason All-OVC team is rounded out by Tennessee State's **Darius Cox**, Eastern Illinois' **Tyler Laser**, Morehead State's **Maze Stallworth** and Eastern Kentucky's **Justin Stommes**.

Coaches vs. Cancer Suits and Sneakers Awareness Weekend Was Jan. 29-31: Coaches vs. Cancer® Suits and Sneakers awareness weekend, a collaborative initiative of the American Cancer Society and the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC), was held the weekend of Jan. 29-31, 2010. Participating NABC member coaches wore sneakers instead of dress shoes with their suits during weekend games to demonstrate their support for the American Cancer Society and its vision of a world with less cancer and more birthdays. Basketball fans were also encouraged to wear sneakers to games that weekend to show their support. By lacing up sneakers with their suits, college and high school basketball coaches nationwide will spotlight the fact that while cancer remains a major health concern, everyone can take daily steps to reduce their risk of the disease.

New Faces: The OVC welcomes three new head coaches to the league this season, the most new faces since the 1991-92 season (that season the new coaches were David Farrar at Middle Tennessee, Dick Fick at Morehead State, Scott Edgar at Murray State and Frankie Allen and Tennessee State). Former Arkansas State head coach **Dickey Nutt** takes over at Southeast Missouri State, **John Cooper**, lastly the associate head coach at Auburn, is the new man in charge at Tennessee State and **Jason James** is UT Martin's new head coach after previously serving as an assistant coach at the school. James (32) is the third youngest coach at the Division I level, trailing only IPFW's Dane Fife (30 years old) and Fordham interim coach Jared Grasso (29) who took over that program during the season (on Dec. 3).

OVC Scores First NCAA Tournament Win in 20 Years; Places Three Teams in Postseason in 2008-09: With its 58-43 win over Alabama State in the NCAA Tournament Opening Round game in Dayton last March, Morehead State snapped a 19-year losing streak in the NCAA Tournament for teams from the Ohio Valley Conference. It marked the first NCAA Tournament victory since Middle Tennessee State beat Florida State 97-83 in Nashville in 1989. The Eagles were then defeated by No. 1 overall seed Louisville in the first round. The year also marked the first time since 1987 (when Austin Peay and Middle Tennessee were in the NCAA Tournament and Akron was in the NIT) that three OVC schools had participated in the postseason in the same year. In addition to Morehead State playing in the NCAA Tournament, UT Martin was in the NIT and Austin Peay played in the inaugural CollegeInsider.com Tournament.

Replay Systems for OVC Basketball Venues Enter Year Three: On Dec. 21, 2007, the Ohio Valley Conference mandated the use of courtside replay systems at all OVC basketball venues. The systems were put into place in January 2008 and have been used since. The systems are used in situations that are outlined by NCAA rules.

SIU Edwardsville Continues Reclassification Process to Division I: On July 1, 2008 Southern Illinois University Edwardsville became the 11th member of the Ohio Valley Conference. SIU Edwardsville, who is in the reclassification process to Division I, will begin regular season competition in the OVC during the 2011-12 academic year and will be eligible for postseason competition in 2012-13. The exception is the SIUE softball program, which will be eligible for both regular season and tournament competition in 2010-11; the softball program was the department's women's sport designee to be fast-tracked to Division I, making it eligible to compete at Division I prior to other SIUE sports. SIUE is located in Edwardsville, Ill., which is just northeast of St. Louis (the 18th largest media market in the United States).

OVCSports.TV: For the fourth consecutive year, fans can watch nearly every Conference matchup and all non-conference home contests this season at OVCSports.TV. The venture with JumpTV Sports allows fans to access live and on-demand streaming video and audio of conference matchups (excluding only national television games which are not available) on their home computer. The premium Web site was launched in July 2006 and has streamed over 1,000 events in its first three years, including all Conference matchups in football and men's and women's basketball as well as select baseball, soccer, softball and volleyball events and OVC Championship events. Packages are available on a yearly, seasonal, monthly or per-event basis.
