THIS WEEK'S OVC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

PLAYER

Josh Taylor, F • Sr., 6-6, 245 • Pittsburgh, Pa. • Eastern Kentucky

Taylor averaged 20.5 points, 5.0 rebounds, 2.0 assists and 2.5 steals/game last week while hitting 52 percent (13-of-25) from the field and 60 percent (9-of-15) from 3-point range. He tallied a season-high 21 points in the team's road loss at Morehead State to begin the week. In that game Taylor hit 4-of-7 from 3-point range, pulled down four rebounds and had two steals. In the team's ESPN BracketBusters victory over Winthrop on Saturday, Taylor became the 29th Colonel to reach the 1,000-Point plateau, as the senior netted 20 points on 6-of-10 shooting. He also had six rebounds, three assists and three steals in that win.

Curry McKinney, G • Jr., 6-4, 210 • Simi Valley, Calif. • Eastern Illinois

McKinney averaged 9.5 points, 2.0 rebounds and 1.5 steals/game off the bench last week as Eastern Illinois won two games and extended its winning streak to five games overall. In the Panthers win over Northern Illinois in Saturday's ESPN BracketBusters contest, the junior scored 11 points in just 14 minutes of play, including four free throws in the final 36 seconds to help ice the victory. In EIU's road win over UT Martin to begin the week, McKinney scored eight points, pulled down six rebounds and dished out four assists.

Marland Smith, G • Fr., 6-2, 155 • Little Rock, Ark. • Southeast Missouri

Smith averaged 23.5 points and 3.5 rebounds/game last week while hitting 53.3 percent (16-of-30) from the field and 47.6 percent (10-of-21) from 3-point range in two games. Coming off the bench at Murray State, Smith hit 7-of-12 from the field and 4-of-8 from 3-point range on his way to 19 points on Tuesday night. In the team's ESPN BracketBusters contest at Miami (Ohio), Smith hit 9-of-18 shots and 6-of-13 3-pointers on the way to a career-high 28 points. It was the most points by a Redhawk in a game this season.

NOTES FROM AROUND THE LEAGUE

OVC Overview/This Week's Highlights: The final week of regular season play features several key games, as teams fight for seeding...Seven teams have locked up spots in the eight-team field, while Tennessee State and Southeast Missouri fight for the final spot (those two teams play Thursday night in Cape Girardeau)...Murray State has claimed the 2010 OVC Championship (its 21st) while Morehead State will be the No. 2 seed; those two teams play each on Thursday night in Morehead...Austin Peay, Eastern Illinois and Eastern Kentucky will play for the No. 3, 4 and 5 seeds this week...Jacksonville State and Tennessee Tech, who play Saturday in Cookeville, will battle for the No. 6 and 7 seeds...Murray State won two games last week and now has won 17 games in a row, tied for the longest winning streak in the nation (with Butler)... The Racers are finally receiving votes in the two major college basketball polls, receiving two votes in the AP poll to rank 38th and one vote in the ESPN/USA Today poll to rank 36th...Murray State is also No. 4 in this week's CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major poll...Joe Lunardi projects Murray State as a No. 13 seed (playing BYU) in the NCAA Tournament if the Racers were to win the OVC's automatic bid...The OVC announced on Monday that starting with next year's OVC Tournament, all eight men's and all eight women's teams will play at a neutral site in Nashville (Municipal Auditorium); currently first round games are played on campus sites at higher seeds.

OVC Announces Changes to Future OVC Basketball Tournaments: Ohio Valley Conference Commissioner **Beth DeBauche** has announced a change in format and a new venue for its men's and women's basketball championships beginning in 2011. Starting next season all eight men's and all eight women's teams that qualify for the tournament field will gather at a single site for the entire tournament. Previously first round games were played on campus sites with the semifinals and finals being held in Nashville. The bracket will also shift from a traditional 1 vs. 8, 2 vs. 7, etc. format to a merit-based format that rewards the top teams during the regular season with byes into the quarterfinals and semifinals. Starting in 2011, the first round of each the men's and women's tournament will feature the No. 5 seed against the No. 8 seed and the No. 6 seed against the No. 7 seed. The winners of those games will advance to the quarterfinals to face the No. 3 and No. 4 seeds (who received a bye). The winners of those quarterfinal matchups will advance to the semifinals to face the No. 1 and No. 2 seeds (who received a pair of byes). Along with the change in format, comes a relocation of the tournament to historic Nashville Municipal Auditorium in downtown Nashville, Tenn. The venue will host the championship, which will now be a four-day event. Municipal Auditorium has been the site of the OVC Basketball Championship in 1989 (men only), 1994, 1995, 1996, 2004 and most recently in 2008. The move to Municipal Auditorium will keep the championships in Nashville, a place where they have been held 16 times in the last 17 years (including this year's championship which will be held March 5-6 at the Sommet Center). The only year the tournaments have not been held in Nashville during that stretch was 2002. The 2011 OVC Men's and Women's Basketball Championship dates are March 2-5.

OVC Tournament Field Takes Shape: With one week of play left in the regular season, the field for the 2010 OVC Tournament field is taking shape. Eight teams will make the field and as of now seven squads (Murray State, Morehead State, Eastern Kentucky, Austin Peay, Eastern Illinois, Tennessee Tech and Jacksonville State) have locked themselves into the field. The final spot in the field is being contested between Tennessee State and Southeast Missouri. Tennessee State has a two-game lead over the Redhawks with two Conference games to play; TSU can lock up the final spot with one win or one Redhawk loss (the two teams play on Thursday in Cape Girardeau). The first round games will be held on campus sites on March 2, and Murray State and Morehead State have clinched the right to host a home game, as they will be the top two seeds. Eastern Kentucky, Austin Peay and Eastern Illinois will battle for the No. 3 and No. 4 seeds and the right to host home games.

Murray State Claims 2010 OVC Regular Season Championship: With a home win over Southeast Missouri on Tuesday, Murray State claimed the 2010 OVC Regular Season Championship. Overall it is the team's 21st OVC title and first since the 2006 season. MSU has also won OVC Regular Season titles in 1951, 1954, 1968, 1969, 1980, 1982, 1983, 1988, 1989, 1990, 1991, 1992, 1994, 1995, 1996, 1997, 1988, 1999, 2000 and 2006. The 21 titles are the most in OVC history; former member Western Kentucky has the second-most titles (19), while Morehead State's nine titles are the next most among active members. Murray State will be the No. 1 overall seed in the OVC Tournament and host a first round OVC Tournament game on March 2.

Murray State Conference Winning Streak Ranks Second in OVC History: With a OVC win last Tuesday night, Murray State increased its OVC winning streak to 23 games dating back to last season. The Racers have won 16 OVC games this season, and last lost to an OVC foe in the regular season on Feb. 7, 2009 (83-80 at Austin Peay). The 23-game OVC winning streak is the second longest streak in league history, just two wins away from the all-time record.

Murray State Looking For Longest Single-Season Conference Win Streak As Well: Murray State is currently 16-0 in OVC play. In the 62-year history of the OVC, only four teams have gone undefeated in a season: Western Kentucky (8-0 in 1949-50, 14-0 in 1965-66 and 14-0 in 1969-70) and Austin Peay (16-0 in 2003-04). Murray State is now tied with Austin Peay's for the

2010 OVC TOURNAMENT

The 2010 Ohio Valley Conference Men's & Women's Tournaments will be held March 2, 5-6. The first round games will be held at campus sites (top four seeds on each side) on Tuesday, March 2. Those games can be seen live on OVCSports.TV.

The winners of those games will shift to the Sommet Center in downtown Nashville, Tenn. for the semifinals and finals. The men's semifinals will be held on Friday, March 5 at 6 and 8 p.m. and televised on ESPN2 with the championship game on Saturday, March 6 at 7 p.m. and televised live on ESPN2. The women's semifinals are set for 12 and 2 p.m. on March 5 (televised on OVCSports.TV) and the women's championship game is set for March 6 at a time to be announced.

This marks the 16th time in 17 years that the tournament has been held in Nashville and 11th time the event has been held at the Sommet Center.

longest single-season OVC winning streak (16 games). With an 18-game conference schedule this season, the Racers could become the first OVC team to win more than 16-straight games in one season as well as become just the fifth OVC team to go through the league season undefeated.

Murray State Has Nation's Longest Winning Streak: Murray State currently has the longest winning streak nationally (17 games), tied with Butler. Murray State plays at Morehead State on Thursday night while Butler plays at Valpo on Friday (its final regular season game of the season).

Just Three Teams Nationally Undefeated in Conference Play: Murray State is one of just three teams nationally to be undefeated in their conferences at this point of the season (16-0). Butler is 17-0 while Kansas is now 12-0.

OVC Teams Go 3-8 in 2010 ESPN BracketBusters Series: All 11 OVC schools participated in the ESPN BracketBusters series for the fifth straight season in 2009-10. The OVC compiled just a 3-8 record in the event this season. The highlight of the series was a Murray State victory over Morgan State in a game that was selected for television (ESPNU). It was the first OVC team selected for a BracketBusters TV games since the 2007 season. Now it's eighth year, ESPN BracketBusters is an ESPN television property that was tremendously successful with its first seven events. The event has allowed Division I conferences to participate in a cutting-edge format that involves "wild card" pairings from the pool of participating teams, with half of the ESPN BracketBusters teams pre-designated as "home" and the remaining half as "road" teams. OVC schools are 19-37 all-time in the event.

Morehead State's Faried Ranks 1st Nationally in Rebounding: Morehead State junior **Kenneth Faried** entered the 2009-10 season as Division I's leading returning rebounder and is first nationally in rebounding (13.3 rebounds/game) this year. That number is 14.6 rebounds per game in 16 Conference games this season. He also has 20 double-doubles in 28 total games this season (which ranks second nationally behind Radford's Artsiom Parakhouski who has 22). Faried had a season-high 21 rebounds in a road win over Tennessee State on Jan. 28. He has also had a 19-rebound game, an 18-rebound game, a 17-rebound game, five 16-rebound games and four 15-rebound games in 2009-10. He is also one of seven Division I players to have a 20/20 game this season (23 points, 21 rebounds against Tennessee State). Last season Faried, the OVC Defensive Player of the Year and OVC Tournament MVP, ranked third nationally in rebounds per game, pulling down 13.0 a contest (that number increased to 13.5 boards per game in OVC games). That trailed only National Player of the Year Blake Griffin (14.4 rebounds/game) and Santa Clara's John Bryant (14.2/game) in the national standings and both of those players have left the college game. Faried had a career-high 24 rebounds in a game against Florida A&M, which was the third most rebounds in a game in Division I last season.

20/20: Morehead State's Kenneth Faried is in rare company after a 23-point, 21-rebound performance at Tennessee State on Jan. 28. That was one of just seven 20/20 efforts in Division I basketball this season.

Murray State Ranked in CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major Poll: After its quick start Murray State entered CollegeInsider.com's Mid-Major Poll at No. 23 on Nov. 23. As of Feb. 22, the Racers are a season-best fourth nationally, the second week in a row they have been at that spot. Morehead State is currently among the other teams receiving votes in the poll. Now in its 11th season, the Mid-Major poll is made up of team's from the following conferences: America East, Atlantic Sun, Big Sky, Big South, Big West, Colonial, Great West, Horizon, Independents, Ivy, Metro Atlantic, Mid-American, Mid-Eastern, Missouri Valley, Northeast, Ohio Valley, Patriot, Southern, Southland, Southwestern, Summit, Sun Belt, West Coast. It is voted upon by coaches from those conferences, with one coach per conference casting a vote (Murray State's Billy Kennedy is the OVC representative).

Home Court Winning Streaks: Murray State currently has the longest home court winning streak among OVC teams at 18 games. That streak currently ranks sixth nationally. The Racers will next play at home on Tuesday, March 2 when they host the first round of the OVC Tournament. Earlier this season Eastern Kentucky saw its school-record 19-game home winning streak come to an end on Jan. 23 with a loss to Morehead State. It was the first at home for the Colonels since December 4, 2008 and was the sixth-longest nationally when it came to an end. Kansas

OVC Tournament to Be Held at Sommet Center for 11th Time and in Nashville For 16th Time in 17 Years: The 2010 OVC Basketball Tournament will be held at the Sommet Center in downtown Nashville for the 11th (and final) time this season. The event was first held there in 1997 (marking the first basketball event in the venue) and has been held there every year since with the exceptions of 2002, 2004 and 2008. Starting in 2011 the event will move to Nashville Municipal Auditorium on an annual basis (when it switches to a four-day event). Last year the men's final went two overtimes with Morehead State finally topping Austin Peay when Steve Peterson hit his only bucket of the game with 1.4 seconds left in the second overtime. Overall this year will mark the 16th time in the last 17 years the tournament has been held in Nashville (with 2002 being the only year in that stretch the event was not in Music City).

Westwood One to Broadcast OVC Championship Game: For the first time this season, the 2010 Men's Basketball Championship game will be broadcast by the Westwood One radio network, the largest provider of audio content in America. Westwood One is one of the nation's largest providers of network radio programming and one of the largest domestic providers of traffic information in the U.S. Westwood One serves more than 5,000 radio and 170 TV stations in the U.S. Westwood One provides over 150 news, sports, music, talk and entertainment programs, features and live events to numerous media partners. Westwood One is home of the most prestigious sports broadcasts on radio. Westwood One's lineup includes regular season NFL football, the Playoffs and the Super Bowl; NCAA Football and Basketball including the Final Four; College World Series; Frozen Four; the Olympics; the Masters and more. Through its Metro Traffic division, Westwood One provides traffic reporting and local news, sports and weather to approximately 2,300 radio and TV stations. Westwood One also provides digital and other cross-platform delivery of its network and Metro content.

Murray State Reaches 20 Victories Third Quickest Nationally: With its win over UT Martin on Jan. 30, Murray State became just the third team nationally to reach 20 wins, trailing only BYU and Syracuse. The 20-win season is the 23rd for Murray State all-time.

The OVC Among the NCAA Statistical Leaders: In the latest set of NCAA statistical leaders, Murray State ranks second nationally in field goal percentage (50.9%), third in scoring margin (+18.0) and fourth in steals/game (10.7). Eastern Kentucky is second nationally in 3-pointers made/game (9.9), 14th in 3-point percentage (39.8%), third in assist-to-turnover ratio (+1.57) and third in fewest turnovers/game (9.9). Morehead State ranks third in rebound margin (+8.8). Individually, Morehead State's **Kenneth Faried** is first nationally in rebounding (13.3/game) and second in double-doubles (20) while Tennessee Tech's **Frank Davis** is fourth in 3-point percentage (46.4%).

Channels An All-Around Consistent Performer: Looking at the list of OVC active leaders in five of the major statistical categories, the name of Austin Peay senior guard **Wesley Channels** keeps popping up. In his solid four-year career Channels has been one of the top all-around performers in the league. The Memphis, Tenn. native currently ranks first among active players in scoring (1,643), first in assists (307), second in steals (159), fourth in 3-pointers made (221) and eighth in rebounds (420).

Loos Becomes All-Time Winningest Coach in OVC History: With a 68-66 victory at Ohio on Dec. 9, Austin Peay head coach **Dave Loos** recorded his 320th career victory while in the OVC, a mark that ranks first all-time. Loos passed Cal Luther (319 wins at Murray State and UT Martin) for the all-time mark. Loos, the Dean of OVC coaches, is in his 20th year at Austin Peay where he also serves as the Athletics Director, making him the only Division I head men's basketball coach to hold that distinction. Loos now has 330 victories in his tenure at Austin Peay and 412 for his career.

Faried Named Midseason Mid-Major All-American by Sporting News: Sporting News writer Mike DeCourcy named Morehead State's **Kenneth Faried** as one of his five mid-season mid-major All-Americans. DeCourcy called Faried the "nation's best rebounder" and that he "chases rebounds with an attitude." Faried was joined by Butler's Gordon Hayward, Saint Mary's Omar Samhan, Radford's Artsiom Parakhouski and Cornell's Ryan Wittman on the team.

Fox Sports Radio 1370 WDEF-AM in Chattanooga to Broadcast OVC Men's Basketball Game of the Week: For the second straight season Fox Sports Radio 1370 WDEF-AM out of Chattanooga will broadcast an OVC Men's Basketball Game of the Week in 2009-10. This season the station will broadcast a seven-game schedule, including broadcasting the OVC Tournament semifinals for the first time. The broadcasts are produced by Broadcaster Marketing Services and feature veteran play-by-play announcer Frank Santore. The schedule is below:

Hudson and Domercant Named to CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major All-Decade Team: Two Ohio Valley Conference players were among the 26 players selected to the CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major All-Decade Team. Former UT Martin guard **Lester Hudson** and former Eastern Illinois forward **Henry Domercant** were on the squad released on Jan. 3. Hudson (2007-09) was a two-time All-American and OVC Player of the Year at UT Martin and became the first Division I men's player to record a quadruple-double in a game. second round of the 2009 NBA Draft. Domercant's 2,602 career points are the most in OVC history (and No. 26 all-time in NCAA history) and he finished in the top five in the nation in scoring three times. Division I coaches and NBA scouts were part of the selection process but the final decision was made by the CollegeInsider.com staff.

The 2009-10 Season: The 2009-10 season marks the 62nd of competition in the OVC. Over the previous 61 years, 12 different teams have claimed an OVC regular season championship, including four different schools in the past five years. UT Martin won its first OVC Regular Season Championship in 2008-09.

OVC Players in the Pros: There are three former OVC players on NBA rosters. Those three players are Austin Peay's **Trenton Hassell** (New Jersey Nets), Murray State's **James Singleton** (Washington Wizards) and UT Martin's **Lester Hudson** (Memphis Grizzlies). Hassell is in his ninth season in the NBA and third with the Nets. He also played with the Chicago Bulls (who drafted him 30th overall in the 2001 Draft and where he played two seasons), Minnesota Timberwolves (four seasons) and Dallas Mavericks (37 games in 2007-08). During his 592-game career he has averaged 5.9 points, 2.8 rebounds and 1.8 assists per game while hitting 44.7 percent of his field goal attempts. After being undrafted out of college (2003), Singleton played overseas before being signed by the Los Angeles Clippers before the 2005-06 season and played two seasons there before signing with Dallas in 2008-09; he was traded to the Wizards in February 2010. In his 174-game career, Singleton has averaged 3.5 points and 3.2 rebounds per game while hitting 49.3 percent of his shots. Hudson won the last two OVC Player of the Year awards before being drafted by the Boston Celtics in the second round (pick No. 58) of the 2009 NBA Draft. Hudson signed a one-year unguaranteed contract after his play in the NBA Summer League with the team. He appeared in 16 games with the Celtics until being waived in January; that same week he was signed by his hometown Memphis Grizzlies. Another UT Martin product, **Jared Newson**, is currently in the NBDL, playing for the Bakersfield Jam.

Morehead State and Murray State Picked as Preseason Co-Favorites: In a vote of Ohio Valley Conference head men's basketball coaches and sports information directors, **Morehead State** and **Murray State** each received 10 first-place votes and were picked as co-favorites for the 2009-10 season. Morehead State finished last season 12-6 in league play (4th place) and went on to win the OVC Tournament Championship. Murray State was tied for second overall last season with a 13-5 record and lost in the OVC Tournament semifinals. It marks the 13th time in the last 21 years that Murray State has been picked the preseason favorite and second year in a row. Morehead State is tabbed first for the first time since the 1983-84 season (when they went 25-6 and won the OVC regular season and tournament championships). It marks just the third time since 1980-81 (when preseason polls were first available) that co-favorites have been picked in the preseason poll (it also happened in 1991-92 and 1994-95). Morehead State and Murray State each received 154 points and were followed next by **Austin Peay** who had 114 total points. **Eastern Illinois** was picked fourth (105 points) and followed by **Eastern Kentucky** (93), **Jacksonville State** (86), **Tennessee Tech** (76), **UT Martin** (55), **Tennessee State** (44) and **Southeast Missouri State** (19).

Preseason Predictions: Is being picked the preseason favorite, always a good thing? Over the past 30 years of preseason polls that were available, the league's head coaches and sports information directors correctly pick the eventual OVC regular season champion 60 percent of the time, picking the correct winner 18 times over the last 30 years. Over the past 10 years, the preseason poll has correctly picked the winner every other year. Last season the poll tabbed Murray State the favorite, although the Racers finished second to UT Martin, who won its first-ever OVC Championship a year ago.

Morehead State's Faried Tabbed as Preseason Player of the Year: The 2009-10 All-OVC Preseason Men's Basketball team was headlined by Morehead State junior center **Kenneth Faried**. Faried is coming off a season where he was named OVC Defensive Player of the Year and OVC Tournament MVP. Overall six different schools were represented on the team with Murray State's three selections leading the way. Eastern Illinois and Morehead State each had two selections while Austin Peay, Eastern Kentucky and Tennessee State had one player apiece on the squad. The team features just one player (Faried) who was a first-team All-OVC selection last season. The team does have three second-team All-OVC picks from 2008-09 and two players who were on last season's All-Newcomer Team. Faried made a splash last season being named the Conference's first OVC Defensive Player of the Year after ranking third nationally in rebounding (13.0/game), 52nd nationally in blocked shots (1.9/game) and 69th nationally in steals (1.9/game). Faried also added 13.9 points per game and connected on 55.6 percent of his field goal attempts (36th nationally). The 6-8 native of Newark, N.J. also tallied 25 double-doubles, which was the second most nationally, trailing only National Player of the Year Blake Griffin (29). Austin Peay's **Wesley Channels**, Eastern Illinois' **Romain Martin** and Murray State's **Danero Thomas** were each second-team All-OVC picks last season and are each on the preseason team this year. Murray State's **Ivan Aska** and **Isacc Miles** were two of the five All-OVC Newcomer selections in 2008-09 who are also on this year's All-OVC preseason squad. The Preseason All-OVC team is rounded out by Tennessee State's **Darius Cox**, Eastern Illinois' **Tyler Laser**, Morehead State's **Maze Stallworth** and Eastern Kentucky's **Justin Stommes**.

New Faces: The OVC welcomes three new head coaches to the league this season, the most new faces since the 1991-92 season (that season the new coaches were David Farrar at Middle Tennessee, Dick Fick at Morehead State, Scott Edgar at Murray State and Frankie Allen and Tennessee State). Former Arkansas State head coach **Dickey Nutt** takes over at Southeast Missouri State, **John Cooper**, lastly the associate head coach at Auburn, is the new man in charge at Tennessee State and **Jason James** is UT Martin's new head coach after previously serving as an assistant coach at the school. James (32) is the third youngest coach at the Division I level, trailing only IPFW's Dane Fife (30 years old) and Fordham interim coach Jared Grasso (29) who took over that program during the season (on Dec. 3).

OVC Scores First NCAA Tournament Win in 20 Years; Places Three Teams in Postseason in 2008-09: With its 58-43 win over Alabama State in the NCAA Tournament Opening Round game in Dayton last March, Morehead State snapped a 19-year losing streak in the NCAA Tournament for teams from the Ohio Valley Conference. It marked the first NCAA Tournament victory since Middle Tennessee State beat Florida State 97-83 in Nashville in 1989. The Eagles were then defeated by No. 1 overall seed Louisville in the first round. The year also marked the first time since 1987 (when Austin Peay and Middle Tennessee were in the NCAA Tournament and Akron was in the NIT) that three OVC schools had participated in the postseason in

the same year. In addition to Morehead State playing in the NCAA Tournament, UT Martin was in the NIT and Austin Peay played in the inaugural CollegeInsider.com Tournament.

Replay Systems for OVC Basketball Venues Enter Year Three: On Dec. 21, 2007, the Ohio Valley Conference mandated the use of courtside replay systems at all OVC basketball venues. The systems were put into place in January 2008 and have been used since. The systems are used in situations that are outlined by NCAA rules.

SIU Edwardsville Continues Reclassification Process to Division I: On July 1, 2008 Southern Illinois University Edwardsville became the 11th member of the Ohio Valley Conference. SIU Edwardsville, who is in the reclassification process to Division I, will begin regular season competition in the OVC during the 2011-12 academic year and will be eligible for postseason competition in 2012-13. The exception is the SIUE softball program, which will be eligible for both regular season and tournament competition in 2010-11; the softball program was the department's women's sport designee to be fast-tracked to Division I, making it eligible to compete at Division I prior to other SIUE sports. SIUE is located in Edwardsville, Ill., which is just northeast of St. Louis (the 18th largest media market in the United States).

OVCSports.TV: For the fourth consecutive year, fans can watch nearly every Conference matchup and all non-conference home contests this season at OVCSports.TV. The venture with JumpTV Sports allows fans to access live and on-demand streaming video and audio of conference matchups (excluding only national television games which are not available) on their home computer. The premium Web site was launched in July 2006 and has streamed over 1,000 events in its first three years, including all Conference matchups in football and men's and women's basketball as well as select baseball, soccer, softball and volleyball events and OVC Championship events. Packages are available on a yearly, seasonal, monthly or per-event basis.
