THIS WEEK'S OVC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

Wesley Channels, G • Sr., 6-2, 210 • Memphis, Tenn. • Austin Peay

Channels picked up his fourth OVC Player of the Week honor of the season after averaging 22.0 points, 5.5 rebounds, 2.0 assists and 1.5 steals/game in a pair of games. The senior scored 23 points in a road loss at Eastern Illinois and 21 points in an overtime road win over Southeast Missouri, making it four straight games with 20 or more points for the Memphis native. Channels played all 45 minutes in the win over SEMO, helping the Govs rally from an 11-point second half deficit. Channels made the key play in the game, driving the lane and scoring the go-ahead basket with 19 seconds to play in overtime. He then hit two free throws with 14 seconds to play to put his team ahead three points. On the final play of the game Channels forced Southeast's Marland Smith into a fall-away 3-pointer that came up short. To begin the week Channels hit four 3-pointers on his way to a game-high 23 points. For the week Channels hit 46.9 percent (15-of-32) from the field and 71.4 percent (10-of-14) from the free throw line.

B.J. Jenkins, G • Jr., 6-0, 205 • Virginia Beach, Va. • Murray State

Jenkins won his fifth OVC Newcomer of the Week award of the season after averaging 14.0 points, 4.0 rebounds, 3.0 assists and 1.0 steals/game in two Racer games. In the regular season finale, Jenkins scored 22 points on 5-of-5 shooting from 3-point range. He was 6-of-6 from the field in that game and 5-of-7 from the free throw line while also adding seven rebounds and five assists as Murray State capped the season with a 17-1 OVC mark.

FRESHMAN

Robert Covington, F • Fr., 6-8, 190 • Bellwood, III. • Tennessee State

Covington put a bookend on the regular season for Freshman of the Week awards (he also won the award the first week of the season) after averaging 22.5 points and 12.0 rebounds/ game in a pair of contests as Tennessee State played its way into the OVC Tournament field. In the team's 74-67 win over Southeast Missouri on Thursday, Covington set career highs with 27 points and 16 rebounds to go along with two blocks and a steal. In that contest he hit 13of-13 from the free throw line and was 2-of-2 from 3-point range. The freshman finished the week by scoring 18 points and pulling down eight rebounds at Eastern Illinois. For the week he hit 48 percent (12-of-25) from the field, 94.1 percent (16-of-17) from the free throw line and 62.5 percent (5-of-8) from 3-point range.







NOTES FROM AROUND THE LEAGUE

Murray State Makes It Two Wins In As Many Years for OVC in the NCAA Tournament: When Danero Thomas nailed a jumper at the buzzer and No. 13 Murray State had topped No. 4 seed Vanderbilt 66-65 in the First Round of the 2010 NCAA Tournament, it marked the second year in a row an OVC team had won a game in the NCAA Tournament (last year Morehead State won the Opening Round game in Dayton). That is something that had not happened since 1988 and 1989. It was the first time an OVC team had won a first round contest since 1989 when Middle Tennessee State topped Florida State. In the second round of the NCAA Tournament the Racers lost 54-52 to No. 5 seed Butler. Murray State was trying to become the first OVC team to reach the Sweet 16 since Western Kentucky's Final Four run in 1971. With the win Murray State won its second NCAA Tournament game all-time and first since topping North Carolina State in 1988.

Morehead State Wins One in the CBI; First Time Since 1988 That Two Different OVC Teams Have Won in Same Postseason: Two OVC teams competed in the College Basketball Invitational (CBI), with Eastern Kentucky losing to College of Charleston in the first round and Morehead State topping Colorado State in the first round before falling to Boston University in the quarterfinals. With the NCAA Tournament win for Murray State and CBI victory for Morehead State, it marked the first time since the 1988 season that two different OVC schools had won a postseason contest in the same year. In 1988 Murray State won a NCAA Tournament game (over N.C. State) and Middle Tennessee won two games in the NIT.

Three Teams in the Postseason: For the second straight season three Ohio Valley Conference teams played in the postseason. Murray State earned the league's NCAA automatic bid by winning the OVC Tournament while Eastern Kentucky and Morehead State were the first two OVC teams to play in the three-year old College Basketball Invitational (CBI). The OVC also sent three teams to the postseason last season (one NCAA, one NIT, one CollegeInsider.com) which marked the first time since 1987 that the league had done that. Including the OVC's women's teams, six squads played in postseason (Austin Peay was in the women's NCAA Tournament, Eastern Illinois was in the WNIT and Morehead State was in the WBI).

The OVC All-Time in the NCAA Tournament: Following Murray State's win over Vanderbilt in the NCAA Tournament, the OVC recorded wins in the NCAA Tournament in back-to-back seasons. OVC teams are now 22-62 all-time in the NCAA Tournament. Only five times in the OVC history has the league had teams win games in back-to-back years (1960-61, 1961-62, 1987-88, 1988-89 and 2009-10).

The OVC All-Time in the CBI: This season marked the first time an OVC team has competed in the College Basketball Invitational (CBI). The CBI, which was in its third year of competition, features 16 teams in a postseason tournament that were not selected to the NCAA tournament. Teams are invited based upon their performance during their conference and non-conference schedule, as well as how well the team played at the end of the regular season. The event features eight first-round games, four second-round games, a semifinal round and then a best-of-three championship series. Bracketing is done geographically into four regions of the country (East, West, South, Midwest) to minimize missed class time. Brackets are balanced competitively within each region. Morehead State won a first round game before losing in the quarterfinals while Eastern Kentucky lost in the first round of the event.

Murray State Wins an OVC Record 31 Games: Murray State finished the 2009-10 season with 31 victories, the most ever by an OVC school. The previous record was 29 victories held by the 1953-54 Western Kentucky team and the 1997-98 Murray State squad.

EKU Sets OVC Record for 3-Pointers Made in a Season: For the second straight year Eastern Kentucky set the OVC record for 3-pointers made in a season. This year the Colonels made 327, which broke their mark of 320 set last season.

Murray State's Win Over Vanderbilt First for OVC Team Since 2000-01: When Murray State topped Vanderbilt 66-65 in the First Round of the NCAA Tournament it marked the OVC's first win over an SEC school since Tennessee Tech topped South Carolina 73-67 at the beginning of the 2000-01 season. Between the two wins OVC teams had lost 71-straight games to SEC opponents.

Murray State Wins Record 14th OVC Tournament Championship: Murray State won its 14th OVC Tournament and first since 2006, with a 62-51 victory over defending champion Morehead State on March 6. The 14 titles are the most of any OVC team. The Racers also claimed OVC Tournament titles in 1951, 1964, 1988, 1990, 1991, 1992, 1995, 1997, 1998, 1999, 2002, 2004 and 2006. This year marks the 14th NCAA Tournament appearance for the Racers who have a great history in the NCAA Tournament. As a No. 14 seed in 1988 Murray State topped No. 3 seed N.C. State before falling 61-58 to eventual national champion Kansas in the second round. In 1990 the Racers took No. 1 seed Michigan State to overtime, becoming the first and only 16 seed to take a No. 1 seed to overtime. In its last NCAA Tournament appearance (2006), the No. 14 seed Racers lost 69-65 to North Carolina in the first round.

Canaan Named OVC Tournament MVP; Becomes First Freshman Since 1993 to Win Award: Murray State freshman Isaiah Canaan was named MVP of the 2010 OVC Tournament after averaging 11.3 points, 2.7 rebounds and 1.3 assists/game and hitting 52.2 percent from the field and 53.8 percent from 3-point range in the three-game event. Canaan had 16 points and five rebounds in the OVC Championship game, hitting 3-of-5 from 3-point range as Murray State broke open the game late in the second half. Canaan is the first freshman to win the award since Tennessee State's Monty Wilson won the award in 1993. A block Canaan made during the championship game was the No. 2 Play of the Day on SportsCenter. Earlier in the season Canaan hit a half court shot from his knees, an honor that earned SportsCenter's Top Play of the Day.

Murray State Claims 2010 OVC Regular Season Championship: Murray State claimed the 2010 OVC Regular Season Championship this year, its 21st OVC title and first since the 2006 season. MSU has also won OVC Regular Season titles in 1951, 1954, 1968, 1969, 1980, 1982, 1983, 1988, 1989, 1990, 1991, 1992, 1994, 1995, 1996, 1997, 1988, 1999, 2000 and 2006. The 21 titles are the most in OVC history; former member Western Kentucky has the second-most titles (19), while Morehead State's nine titles are the next most among active members.

Faried Named Honorable Mention AP All-American/Lou Henson Mid-Major All-American: Morehead State junior men's basketball center Kenneth Faried was named an honorable mention Associated Press All-American as well as being named to the Lou Hensen Mid-Major All-American Team sponsored by CollegeInsider.com. Faried had an extraordinary year, averaging 16.9 points a game, while hauling in 13.0 boards per contest to lead the OVC and rank second in the nation. He also ranked second nationally in double-doubles, recording 25 double-dips in 35 total games. That included 10 games with 20 or more points. He was named OVC Player of the Week five times during the 2009-10 season. Faried helped lead the Eagles to their second best record in school history at 24-11 and the best OVC mark at 15-3. MSU earned a bid to the College Basketball Invitational losing in the second round in overtime at Boston University. It was the Eagles second consecutive postseason appearance.

Faried Named to CollegeInsider.com Lefty DrieseII Defensive All-American Team: Morehead State junior center Kenneth Faried was named to the CollegeInsider.com Lefty DrieseII Defensive All-America Team. Faried is one of just 20 selections nationally at the Division I level. Faried had an extraordinary year, averaging 16.9 points a game, while hauling in 13.0 boards per contest to lead the OVC and rank second in the nation. His 1.9 blocks per game was the second-most in the OVC. Faried also ranked second nationally in double-doubles, recording 25 double-dips in 35 total games. That included 10 games with 20 or more points. He was named OVC Player of the Week five times during the 2009-10 season.

Canaan and Covington Named to CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major Freshman All-American Team: Two Ohio Valley Conference men's basketball players have been named to the CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major Freshman All-American Team. Murray State's Isaiah Canaan and Tennessee State's Robert Covington were two of the 20 total players selected to the squad, which involved Division I coaches and NBA scouts as part of the

selection process, with the final decision resting with the CollegeInsider.com staff. Canaan was named MVP of the 2010 OVC Tournament, the first freshman to win the honor since the 1993 season, as he helped Murray State to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since the 2006 season. In the team's 66-65 first round victory over No. 4 seed Vanderbilt, Canaan had eight points including a pair of key 3-pointers. He added a team-best 14 points (4-of-4 3-point shooting) in the Racers two-point second round loss to No. 5 Butler, a team that would go on advance to the Final Four. Canaan was also named OVC Freshman of the Year for his performance during the regular season. The Biloxi, Miss. native came off the bench in all 36 Racer games and averaged 10.4 points, 2.3 rebounds and 1.6 assists/game. He also knocked down 54 3-pointers and hit an OVC-best 48.2 percent from long range. Covington, a 6-8 forward from Bellwood, Ill., finished the 2009-10 season as the Tigers' second leading scorer (10.9 ppg) and top rebounder (6.3 rpg). He was named to the Ohio Valley Conference All-Newcomer Team at the end of the season and was named OVC Freshman of the Week twice during year. He turned in two double-double performances with his best production coming against Southeast Missouri State (Feb. 25). He notched career highs with 27 points and 16 rebounds to help TSU secure a spot in the 2010 OVC Tournament.

Kennedy Named NABC District-19 Coach of the Year: The National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) named Murray State's **Billy Kennedy** its District-19 Coach of the Year in a vote by his peers. Kennedy led the Racers to an Ohio Valley Conference record 30-win season as MSU won its 21st league regular season title and advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the 14th time when they won the OVC Tournament. It marks the third time Kennedy has been named a coach of the year by the NABC and he becomes a candidate for NABC National Coach of the Year along with the other district winners and any coach who gets his team to the NCAA Sweet 16 this season. Kennedy won two association awards at Southeastern Louisiana (District-8) in 2004 and 2005. The NABC's District-19 is comprised of the 10 teams in the OVC.

Kennedy a Finalist for Skip Prosser Award: Murray State men's basketball coach Billy Kennedy was one of 15 finalists for the 2010 Skip Prosser Award sponsored by Collegelnsider.com. The award was established to honor the late Skip Prosser who died in 2007 and was a leader in the game of college basketball having the respect and admiration of his peers after coaching 14 seasons at Wake Forest. Kennedy has the Racers in the NCAA Tournament for the 14th time, plus MSU has recorded a record-breaking 30-win season by winning both the regular-season and tournament championships in the Ohio Valley Conference. Kennedy was also a finalist for the Hugh Durham Coach of the Year Award.

OVC Tournament Held at Bridgestone Arena (formerly the Sommet Center) for 11th Time and in Nashville For 16th Time in 17 Years: The 2010 OVC Basketball Tournament was held at Bridgestone Arena (formerly the Sommet Center) in downtown Nashville for the 11th (and final) time this season. The event was first held there in 1997 (marking the first basketball event in the venue) and has been held there every year since with the exceptions of 2002, 2004 and 2008. Starting in 2011 the event will move to Nashville Municipal Auditorium on an annual basis (when it switches to a four-day event). Overall this year marked the 16th time in the last 17 years the tournament has been held in Nashville (with 2002 being the only year in that stretch the event was not in Music City).

OVC Announces Changes to Future OVC Basketball Tournaments: Ohio Valley Conference Commissioner Beth DeBauche has announced a change in format and a new venue for its men's and women's basketball championships beginning in 2011. Starting next season all eight men's and all eight women's teams that qualify for the tournament field will gather at a single site for the entire tournament. Previously first round games were played on campus sites with the semifinals and finals being held in Nashville. The bracket will also shift from a traditional 1 vs. 8, 2 vs. 7, etc. format to a merit-based format that rewards the top teams during the regular season with byes into the quarterfinals and semifinals. Starting in 2011, the first round of each the men's and women's tournament will feature the No. 5 seed against the No. 8 seed and the No. 6 seed against the No. 7 seed. The winners of those games will advance to the quarterfinals to face the No. 3 and No. 4 seeds (who received a bye). The winners of those quarterfinal matchups will advance to the semifinals to face the No. 1 and No. 2 seeds (who received a pair of byes). Along with the change in format, comes a relocation of the tournament to historic Nashville Municipal Auditorium in downtown Nashville, Tenn. The venue will host the championship, which will now be a four-day event. Municipal Auditorium has been the site of the OVC Basketball Championship in 1989 (men only), 1994, 1995, 1996, 2004 and most recently in 2008. The move to Municipal Auditorium will keep the championships in Nashville, a place where they have been held 16 times in the last 17 years (including this year's championship which will be held March 5-6 at the Sommet Center). The only year the tournaments have not been held in Nashville during that stretch was 2002. The 2011 OVC Men's and Women's Basketball Championship dates are March

Three OVC Teams Reach 20+ Wins for Second Straight Season (First Time in League History): For the first time in the 62-year history of the Ohio Valley Conference, three OVC basketball teams won 20 or more games in the same year in back-to-back seasons. Last season UT Martin won 22 games while Eastern Kentucky and Morehead State each won 20 games. This season Murray State had 31 wins while Morehead State won 24 and Eastern Kentucky ended the year at 20. Another team - Eastern Illinois - ended its season with 19 wins.

Murray State Wins 23-Straight OVC Games, Second Longest Streak in OVC History: From Feb. 7, 2009 through Feb. 25, 2010, Murray State won 23-straight OVC games, which is the second-longest streak in OVC history. After losing to Austin Peay 83-80 on Feb. 7 of last season, the Racers ran off 23-straight OVC regular season wins until losing at Morehead State on Feb. 25, 2010. Only Western Kentucky (who won 25-straight games) has ever had a longer winning

Easley Finishes Career Second in OVC History for Career Field Goal Percentage: Murray State center Tony Easley completed his outstanding career by hitting 65.2 percent (373of-572) of his field goal attempts. That ranks his second in OVC history behind only Middle Tennessee's Warren Kidd (.664 from 1991-93). Easley is 32 percentage points ahead of third place (.620).

Murray State Wins OVC Team Sportsmanship Award: The Ohio Valley Conference has announced that Murray State University is the recipient of the 2009-10 Team Sportsmanship Award for men's basketball. Voted on by the student-athletes and coaches of the respective sports, the team awards are bestowed upon the Conference squads deemed to have best exhibited the standards of sportsmanship and ethical behavior as outlined by the OVC and NCAA. Included in the areas for evaluation are the conduct of student-athletes, coaches, staff and administrators and fans. The 2009-10 school year marks the fifth year the team sportsmanship honors have been awarded. This marks the first award for the Murray State men's basketball program.

NCAA Stats Leaders: In the final set of NCAA statistical leaders for 2009-10, Murray State ranked third nationally in scoring margin (+16.1), third in field goal percentage (49.9%), fifth in steals (9.7/game) and 10th in field goal percentage defense (38.7%). Morehead State ranked sixth in rebounding margin (+7.8) while Eastern Kentucky ranked second in 3-pointers made per game (9.9), third in fewest turnovers (9.7/game) and third in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.61). Individually Morehead State's Kenneth Faried was second in both rebounding (13.0/game) and double-doubles (25), while Tennessee Tech's Frank Davis was fourth in 3-point percentage (44.4%).

Morehead State's Faried Ranks Second Nationally in Rebounding: Morehead State junior Kenneth Faried entered the 2009-10 season as Division I's leading returning rebounder. Despite leading the nation in rebounding most of the year, he ended up second at the end of the season, averaging 13.0 rebounds/contest. That was second behind only Radford's Artsiom Parakhouski who was at 13.4 rebounds/game. Faried also has 25 double-doubles in 35 total games this season (which ranks second nationally behind Parakhouski who has 26). Faried had a seasonhigh 21 rebounds in a road win over Tennessee State on Jan. 28. He has also had two 19rebound games, an 18-rebound game, a 17-rebound game, five 16-rebound games and four 15rebound games in 2009-10. He is also one of nine Division I players to have a 20/20 game this season (23 points, 21 rebounds against Tennessee State). This year he earned both OVC Player and Defensive Player of the Year honors. Last season Faried, the OVC Defensive Player of the Year and OVC Tournament MVP, ranked third nationally in rebounds per game, pulling down 13.0 a contest (that number increased to 13.5 boards per game in OVC games). That trailed only National Player of the Year Blake Griffin (14.4 rebounds/game) and Santa Clara's John Bryant (14.2/game) in the national standings and both of those players have left the college game. Faried had a career-high 24 rebounds in a game against Florida A&M, which was the third most rebounds in a game in Division I last season.

20/20: Morehead State's Kenneth Faried was in rare company after a 23-point, 21-rebound performance at Tennessee State on Jan. 28. That was one of just nine 20/20 efforts in Division I basketball this season.

Murray State Has Sixth Biggest Win Improvement From 2008-09 to 2009-10: Murray State improved by 12 wins from the 2008-09 season to the 2009-10 season, going from 19 to 31 victories. That marked trailed only Coastal Carolina (+17), Loyola Marymount (+15), Detroit (+13), Kentucky (+13) and Missouri State (+13).

Murray State Ranked in CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major Poll: After its quick start Murray State entered CollegeInsider.com's Mid-Major Poll at No. 23 on Nov. 23. The Racers got to as high as No. 4 nationally (where they were for several weeks), but slipped to No. 6 in the final poll of the season. Morehead State ended the year among the other teams receiving votes in the poll. Now in its 11th season, the Mid-Major poll is made up of team's from the following conferences: America East, Atlantic Sun, Big Sky, Big South, Big West, Colonial, Great West, Horizon, Independents, Ivy, Metro Atlantic, Mid-American, Mid-Eastern, Missouri Valley, Northeast, Ohio Valley, Patriot, Southern, Southland, Southwestern, Summit, Sun Belt, West Coast. It is voted upon by coaches from those conferences, with one coach per conference casting a vote (Murray State's Billy Kennedy is the OVC representative).

streak among OVC teams at 19 games. That streak currently ranks fifth nationally. Morehead State's 14-game winning streak ended the season ranked 11th nationally. Earlier this season Eastern Kentucky saw its school-record 19-game home winning streak come to an end on Jan. 23 with a loss to Morehead State. It was the first at home for the Colonels since December 4, 2008 and was the sixth-longest nationally when it came to an end. Kansas has the nation's longest home court winning streak (59).

Loos Becomes All-Time Winningest Coach in OVC History: With a 68-66 victory at Ohio on Dec. 9, Austin Peay head coach Dave Loos recorded his 320th career victory while in the OVC, a mark that ranks first all-time. Loos passed Cal Luther (319 wins at Murray State and UT Martin) for the all-time mark. Loos, the Dean of OVC coaches, is in his 20th year at Austin Peay where he also serves as the Athletics Director, making him the only Division I head men's basketball coach to hold that distinction. Loos now has 331 victories in his tenure at Austin Peay and 413 for his career following the end of his 2009-10 season.

Faried Named Midseason Mid-Major All-American by Sporting News: Sporting News writer Mike DeCourcy named Morehead State's Kenneth Faried as one of his five mid-season mid-major All-Americans. DeCourcy called Faried the "nation's best rebounder" and that he "chases rebounds with an attitude." Faried was joined by Butler's Gordon Hayward, Saint Mary's Omar Samhan, Radford's Artsiom Parakhouski and Cornell's Ryan Wittman on the team.

OVC Teams Go 3-8 in 2010 ESPN BracketBusters Series: All 11 OVC schools participated in the ESPN BracketBusters series for the fifth straight season in 2009-10. The OVC compiled just a 3-8 record in the event this season. The highlight of the series was a Murray State victory over Morgan State in a game that was selected for television (ESPNU). It was the first OVC team selected for a BracketBusters TV games since the 2007 season. Now it its eighth year, ESPN BracketBusters is an ESPN television property that was tremendously successful with its first seven events. The event has allowed Division I conferences to participate in a cutting-edge format that involves "wild card" pairings from the pool of participating teams, with half of the ESPN BracketBusters teams pre-designated as "home" and the remaining half as "road" teams. OVC schools are 19-37 all-time in the event.

Hudson and Domercant Named to CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major All-Decade Team: Two Ohio Valley Conference players were among the 26 players selected to the CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major All-Decade Team. Former UT Martin guard Lester Hudson and former Eastern Illinois forward Henry Domercant were on the squad released on Jan. 3. Hudson (2007-09) was a two-time All-American and OVC Player of the Year at UT Martin and became the first Division I men's player to record a quadruple-double in a game. He was drafted by the Boston Celtics in the second round of the 2009 NBA Draft. Domercant's 2,602 career points are the most in OVC history (and No. 26 all-time in NCAA history) and he finished in the top five in the nation in scoring three times. Division I coaches and NBA scouts were part of the selection process but the final decision was made by the CollegeInsider.com staff.

The 2009-10 Season: The 2009-10 season marks the 62nd of competition in the OVC. Over the previous 61 years, 12 different teams have claimed an OVC regular season championship, including four different schools in the past five years. UT Martin won its first OVC Regular Season Championship in 2008-09.

OVC Players in the Pros: There are three former OVC players on NBA rosters. Those three players are Austin Peay's **Trenton Hassell** (New Jersey Nets), Murray State's **James Singleton** (Washington Wizards) and UT Martin's **Lester Hudson** (Memphis Grizzlies). Hassel is in his ninth season in the NBA and third with the Nets. He also played with the Chicago Bulls (who drafted him 30th overall in the 2001 Draft and where he played two seasons), Minnesota Timberwolves (four seasons) and Dallas Mavericks (37 games in 2007-08). During his 592-game career he has averaged 5.9 points, 2.8 rebounds and 1.8 assists per game while hitting 44.7 percent of his field goal attempts. After being undrafted out of college (2003), Singleton played overseas before being signed by the Los Angeles Clippers before the 2005-06 season and played two seasons there before signing with Dallas in 2008-09; he was traded to the Wizards in February 2010. In his 174-game career, Singleton has averaged 3.5 points and 3.2 rebounds per game while hitting 49.3 percent of his shots. Hudson won the last two OVC Player of the Year awards before being drafted by the Boston Celtics in the second round (pick No. 58) of the 2009 NBA Draft. Hudson signed a one-year unguaranteed contact after his play in the NBA Summer League with the team. He appeared in 16 games with the Celtics until being waived in January; that same week he was signed by his hometown Memphis Grizzlies. Another UT Martin product, **Jared Newson**, is currently in the NBDL, playing for the Bakersfield Jam.

Morehead State and Murray State Picked as Preseason Co-Favorites: In a vote of Ohio Valley Conference head men's basketball coaches and sports information directors, Morehead State and Murray State each received 10 first-place votes and were picked as co-favorites for the 2009-10 season. Morehead State finished last season 12-6 in league play (4th place) and went on to win the OVC Tournament Championship. Murray State was tied for second overall last season with a 13-5 record and lost in the OVC Tournament semifinals. It marks the 13th time in the last 21 years that Murray State has been picked the preseason favorite and second year in a row. Morehead State is tabbed first for the first time since the 1983-84 season (when they went 25-6 and won the OVC regular season and tournament championships). It marks just the third time since 1980-81 (when preseason polls were first available) that co-favorites have been picked in the preseason poll (it also happened in 1991-92 and 1994-95). Morehead State and Murray State each received 154 points and were followed next by Austin Peay who had 114 total points. Eastern Illinois was picked fourth (105 points) and followed by Eastern Kentucky (93), Jacksonville State (86), Tennessee Tech (76), UT Martin (55), Tennessee State (44) and Southeast Missouri State (19).

Preseason Predictions: Is being picked the preseason favorite, always a good thing? Over the past 30 years of preseason polls that were available, the league's head coaches and sports information directors correctly pick the eventual OVC regular season champion just over 60 percent of the time, picking the correct winner 19 times over the last 31 years (including this year). Over the past 11 years, the preseason poll has correctly picked the winner every other year. Last season the poll tabbed Murray State the favorite, although the Racers finished second to UT Martin, who won its first-ever OVC Championship a year ago. This year the poll picked Murray State and Morehead State as co-favorites with Murray State claiming the title this season.

Morehead State's Faried Tabbed as Preseason Player of the Year: The 2009-10 All-OVC Preseason Men's Basketball team was headlined by Morehead State junior center Kenneth Faried. Faried is coming off a season where he was named OVC Defensive Player of the Year and OVC

Tournament MVP. Overall six different schools were represented on the team with Murray State's three selections leading the way. Eastern Illinois and Morehead State each had two selections while Austin Peay, Eastern Kentucky and Tennessee State had one player apiece on the squad. The team features just one player (Faried) who was a first-team All-OVC selection last season. The team does have three second-team All-OVC picks from 2008-09 and two players who were on last season's All-Newcomer Team. Faried made a splash last season being named the Conference's first OVC Defensive Player of the Year after ranking third nationally in rebounding (13.0/game), 52nd nationally in blocked shots (1.9/game) and 69th nationally in steals (1.9/game). Faried also added 13.9 points per game and connected on 55.6 percent of his field goal attempts (36th nationally). The 6-8 native of Newark, N.J. also tallied 25 double-doubles, which was the second most nationally, trailing only National Player of the Year Blake Griffin (29). Austin Peay's Wesley Channels, Eastern Illinois' Romain Martin and Murray State's Danero Thomas were each second-team All-OVC picks last season and are each on the preseason team this year. Murray State's Ivan Aska and Isacc Miles were two of the five All-OVC Newcomer selections in 2008-09 who are also on this year's All-OVC preseason squad. The Preseason All-OVC team is rounded out by Tennessee State's Darius Cox, Eastern Illinois' Tyler Laser, Morehead State's Maze Stallworth and Eastern Kentucky's Justin Stommes.

New Faces: The OVC welcomes three new head coaches to the league this season, the most new faces since the 1991-92 season (that season the new coaches were David Farrar at Middle Tennessee, Dick Fick at Morehead State, Scott Edgar at Murray State and Frankie Allen and Tennessee State). Former Arkansas State head coach **Dickey Nutt** takes over at Southeast Missouri State, **John Cooper**, lastly the associate head coach at Auburn, is the new man in charge at Tennessee State and **Jason James** is UT Martin's new head coach after previously serving as an assistant coach at the school. James (32) is the third youngest coach at the Division I level, trailing only IPFW's Dane Fife (30 years old) and Fordham interim coach Jared Grasso (29) who took over that program during the season (on Dec. 3).

OVC Scores First NCAA Tournament Win in 20 Years; Places Three Teams in Postseason in 2008-09: With its 58-43 win over Alabama State in the NCAA Tournament Opening Round game in Dayton last March, Morehead State snapped a 19-year losing streak in the NCAA Tournament for teams from the Ohio Valley Conference. It marked the first NCAA Tournament victory since Middle Tennessee State beat Florida State 97-83 in Nashville in 1989. The Eagles were then defeated by No. 1 overall seed Louisville in the first round. The year also marked the first time since 1987 (when Austin Peay and Middle Tennessee were in the NCAA Tournament and Akron was in the NIT) that three OVC schools had participated in the postseason in the same year. In addition to Morehead State playing in the NCAA Tournament, UT Martin was in the NIT and Austin Peay played in the inaugural CollegeInsider.com Tournament.

Replay Systems for OVC Basketball Venues Enter Year Three: On Dec. 21, 2007, the Ohio Valley Conference mandated the use of courtside replay systems at all OVC basketball venues. The systems were put into place in January 2008 and have been used since. The systems are used in situations that are outlined by NCAA rules.

SIU Edwardsville Continues Reclassification Process to Division I: On July 1, 2008 Southern Illinois University Edwardsville became the 11th member of the Ohio Valley Conference. SIU Edwardsville, who is in the reclassification process to Division I, will begin regular season competition in the OVC during the 2011-12 academic year and will be eligible for postseason competition in 2012-13. The exception is the SIUE softball program, which will be eligible for both regular season and tournament competition in 2010-11; the softball program was the department's women's sport designee to be fast-tracked to Division I, making it eligible to compete at Division I prior to other SIUE sports. SIUE is located in Edwardsville, Ill., which is just northeast of St. Louis (the 18th largest media market in the United States.

OVCSports.TV: For the fourth consecutive year, fans can watch nearly every Conference matchup and all non-conference home contests this season at OVCSports.TV. The venture with JumpTV Sports allows fans to access live and on-demand streaming video and audio of conference matchups (excluding only national television games which are not available) on their home computer. The premium Web site was launched in July 2006 and has streamed over 1,000 events in its first three years, including all Conference matchups in football and men's and women's basketball as well as select baseball, soccer, softball and volleyball events and OVC Championship events. Packages are available on a yearly, seasonal, monthly or perevent basis.

Eastern Kentucky split a pair of games during the final week of the season to finish tied for third place in the OVC standings...After the tiebreaker with Austin Peay and Eastern Illinois, the Colonels fell to fifth place and had to go on the road to play in the first round of the OVC Tournament...It marked the second-straight year EKU had been the No. 5 seed (a year ago they lost at eventual champion Morehead State in the first round)...EKU suffered a similar fate on Tuesday night, losing 68-61 to the Panthers on the road...The team's season was not over, however, as the team earned a birth in the College Basketball Invitational and hosted College of Charleston in the first round...Charleston topped EKU at home (only the third home loss in 18 games this season) 82-79 in the contest...Overall the team reached the 20win plateau for the third time in four years...Overall EKU finished the season with a 15-3 home record at McBrayer Arena; the 15 wins set a new single-season record for the EKU program...Senior Josh Taylor played in his 127 career games which set a new program record (previously held by Mike Rose); Taylor was named a second-team All-OVC selection.



JACKSONVILLE STATE GAMECOCKS (11-19, 7-11)

Team Notes

Jacksonville State finished the season on a six-game losing streak and having lost eight of its last nine games overall after a first round OVC Tournament loss at No. 2 seed Morehead State...That game followed a regular season finale loss to Tennessee Tech, a game that made TTU the No. 6 seed and JSU the No. 7 seed...The loss to Morehead State was the third of the year for JSU against the Eagles...Jax State finished the campaign with just a 1-12 record away from home...Despite losing in the first round, this year marked the first time Jacksonville State has qualified for the eight-team OVC Tournament field since 2006; that season the Gamecocks advanced to the OVC semifinals but since then have not returned to the event...This was the first postseason appearance for every member of the Jax State roster; senior center Amadou Mbodji was on the roster in 2006 but was sitting out as a redshirt...The team was led this season by junior Nick Murphy who averaged 14.4 points and a team-best 7.0 rebounds/ game this season...Murphy's seven double-doubles this year are tied for second most among OVC players...The team was without leading scorer Trenton Marshall for the final three games of the season; he was suspended for a violation of team rules and was averaging 17.7 points/game when suspended.

Team Notes

The No. 2 seed in the OVC Tournament, the defending champion Eagles came up just short of repeating, falling to Murray State in the OVC Championship game...That came after defeating Jacksonville State and Tennessee Tech to get to the championship game...Despite ending Murray State's 17-game winning streak the final week of the regular season, the balanced Racer attack proved to be too much...The Eagles did earn a spot in the College Basketball Invitational (CBI) where it topped Colorardo State in the first round at home before falling to Boston University on the road in the quarterfinals...The win over CSU extended the team's home court winning streak to 19 games...It also marked the second-straight season MSU had won a postseason game (the team won the NCAA Opening Round contest a year ago)...Morehead State reached the 20-win plateau for the second-straight season, marking the first time in school history the Eagles had back-to-back 20-plus win campaigns...The 15 OVC wins on the season was the most in program history...Morehead State junior center Kenneth Faried finished second nationally in rebounding (13.0/game) and had 25 double-doubles, also second-most nationally...Faried was named the 2010 OVC Player and Defensive Player of the Year...In his first three years as head coach MSU alum Donnie Tyndall has led the Eagles from not making the eight-team tournament field (2006) to a No. 7 seed (2007), to a No. 3 seed (2008) and Coach of the Year Award and to a No. 2 seed this year (after being a No. 4 seed last year).

Team Notes

Murray State came up just short of an undefeated OVC season (which would have been only the fifth in league history) when the Racers lost at Morehead State 70-65 during the last week of the regular season...The team was 17-1 in OVC play, only the 17th time in league history (in 62 years) the league champion finished with zero or one loss...But the Racers rebounded and won the program's 14th OVC Tournament Championship and earned a berth in the NCAA Tournament...Freshman Isaiah Canaan became the first freshman to be named MVP of the OVC Tournament since 1993...Murray State made the most of that opportunity, earning a No. 13 seed and topping No. 4 seed Vanderbilt in the first round...It marked the first time the Racers had won in the NCAA Tournament since 1988 (N.C. State)...MSU won the game on a buzzer-beating shot by senior Danero Thomas...The season would come to an end two days later, however, when the team lost 54-52 to No. 5 seed Butler (who went on to the national title game)...Murray State finished the year with 31 victories, the most ever by an OVC team...Murray State was one of the most balanced teams in the country, with six players averaging between 10.6 points and 9.7 points a contest...Overall the team has 10 players who average 10.9 or more minutes a game (with the most being 26.2 minutes/contest)...Billy Kennedy was named OVC Coach of the Year, becoming the ninth different Murray State coach to win the award.

Southeast Missouri State ended the regular season with eight straight losses to finish 7-23 overall and 3-15 (ninth place) in the OVC...The season was the first under head coach Dickey Nutt, who had previously spent 13 years as head coach at Arkansas State...With a young roster Nutt led the team to three OVC wins (after going winless in the league in 2008-09) and two road wins (after going winless on the road a year ago)...Freshman Marland Smith came on at the end of the season to finish as the team's leading scorer (10.8 points/game)...That included scoring 19, 28, 30 and 18 points over his final four games of the season...Smith led the Redhawks with 63 made 3-pointers on the season...Junior Anthony Allison was second on the team in scoring (10.1) while junior newcomer Cameron Butler was third (9.0)...Southeast Missouri ended the season by drawing a season-high 5,515 fans to the Show Me Center for the Senior Night against Austin Peay...SEMO said goodbye to four seniors on the night, including Lamont Russell, who led the team in rebounding (6.8/game), a mark that was fourth in the OVC.

SIU Edwardsville capped the season with a 76-66 victory over Hannibal-LaGrange at home, finishing its second season of Division I play with a 5-23 record...The Cougars won two of its final four games on the year, including winning on the road at North Dakota...The highlight of the year came in early December when SIUE went to Des Moines, Iowa and won the Drake Hy-Vee Tournament Challenge by topping host Drake and UT-Arlington in back-to-back days...Sophomore Mark Yelovich led the team in scoring and rebounding during the season, averaging 16.7 points and 5.9 rebounds/game in 26 games (25 starts)...That included scoring 34 points in a road win at North Dakota, 32 points in a BracketBusters loss at Cal State Fullerton and 28 points in the season finale win over Hannibal LaGrange...Although a member of the OVC, SIUE will still have one more season (2010-11) in which it will not play a full OVC schedule and the team will be eligible for OVC and NCAA postseason playing beginning in 2012-13.

Tennessee State finished the regular season with a 5-1 record in league games to go from 1-11 in OVC play to 6-12 overall, which put them in eighth place in the league standings...That finish earned the team the right to play at No. 1 seed Murray State in the OVC Tournament first round, as the Tigers lost 84-51 to the league champions...First-year head coach John Cooper played down the stretch short-handed, playing with nine players after dismissing a quartet of players in mid-February...The team was buoyed by the play of a pair of freshmen, Robert Covington and Jacquan Nobles, both of who were OVC All-Newcomer selections...Covington ended the season as the active leading scorer on the team, averaging 11.5 points/game...Covington had one of his best games of the season late in the year, setting career-highs of 27 points and 16 rebounds in a road win over Southeast Missouri... Tennessee Tech snapped a three-game losing streak on the final night of the regular season by topping Jacksonville State 77-62 at home...The win pushed Tech to the No. 6 seed (a loss would have made them the No. 7 seed) for the 2010 OVC Tournament...TTU went on the road and topped No. 3 seed Austin Peay in Tuesday's First Round...After APSU had tied the game, sophomore Kevin Murphy drove the length of the court and nailed a game-winning 3-pointer with just 1.7 seconds left...Tech was the only lower seed to win a first round OVC Tournament game this season...It marks the first time since the 2007 season that the Golden Eagles played in the OVC Tournament semifinals...The team's season did come to an end in the semifinals, falling to Morehead State 76-47...Tech has only won one OVC Tournament Championship, and that came in the 1967 season...Murphy finished the season as the team's leading scorer (15.2 points/game)...Senior sharpshooter finished his career by knocking down 88 3-pointers this year (44.4% from long range).

UT Martin ended the season with a two road losses during the last week of the regular season, and overall losing its final six games...The Skyhawks were 0-16 on the road under first-year head coach Jason James...James (32) was the nation's third youngest head coach at the Division I level, trailing only IPFW's Dane Fife and Fordham interim coach Jared Grasso...The Skyhawks were led in scoring by junior Marquis Weddle who averaged 15.7 points/game in 19 total contests; Weddle sat out the first semester but returned to lead UTM to three of its four wins in the second half of the year...Entering his final season as a Skyhawk, Weddle ranks fifth in OVC history for career 3-points attempted (704)...Weddle also needs just nine more 3-pointers made to enter the OVC career 3-pointers made list...Fellow junior Benzor Simmons had a breakout year in 2009-10, averaging 13.6 points and 5.2 rebounds/game during the season...That included a pair of 30-plus point games during the year, including a career-high 35 points in the team's game at Evansville...Simmons averaged just 6.5 points and 3.6 rebounds/game as a sophomore...Junior Reuben Clayton also saw his production climb dramatically from his previous year, jumping from 5.7 points and 1.7 rebounds/game in 2008-09 to 11.7 points and 3.5 rebounds/game this season.
