THIS WEEK'S OVC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

Justin Stommes, G • Jr., 6-7, 200 • Cold Spring, Minn. • Eastern Kentucky Stommes was named the MVP of the O'Reilly Auto Parts CBE Richmond Sub-Regional after leading Eastern Kentucky to a 3-0 record in the event. In four total games last week (all EKU wins), the junior averaged 14.5 points, 4.5 rebounds and 4.2 assists per game while shooting 48.8 percent (21-of-43) from the field and 90.9 percent (10-of-11) from the free throw line. Stommes hit the game-winning 3-pointer with 9.7 seconds left to lift EKU to a 74-72 victory over UTSA. In that contest he scored 17 points and dished out a career-high seven assists in 37 minutes of action. He added 21 points, six rebounds, three assists and three steals in a 10-point victory over UC Irvine and 15 points, five rebounds and six assists in a win over FIU. He was named the MVP of the O'Reilly Auto Parts CBE Sub-Regional.

NEWCOMER

Josh Sain, F • Jr., 6-5, 200 • Jackson, Tenn. • Tennessee State

Sain averaged 15.3 points, 2.7 rebounds, 1.3 assists and 2.0 steals/game in three contests last week as Tennessee State competed in the Chicago Invitational and picked up its first victory of the season. Sain's best performance came in a victory over Kennesaw State in Chicago, as he scored 23 points, grabbed six boards and had four steals in 27 minutes as the Tigers won 73-67 for the first-time under firstyear head coach John Cooper. He led the team in scoring (12) at Iowa State to begin the week, and added 11 points in the week's finale against Liberty in Chicago. For the week Sain shot 47.2 percent (17-of-36) from the field and 87.5 percent (7-of-8) from the free throw line.

FRESHMAN

Isaiah Canaan, G • Fr., 6-0, 175 • Biloxi, Miss. • Murray State

Canaan averaged 10.5 points, 3.5 rebounds, 1.5 assists and 2.0 steals per game last week as Murray State won at FIU and topped Tennessee Wesleyan at home. The freshman guard hit 63.6 percent (7-of-11) of his field goal attempts and was perfect from 3-point range (3-of-3) and the free throw line (4-of-4) as the Racers improved to 5-1 on the season. Canaan scored 12 points, grabbed four rebounds, dished out three assists and had two steals in Murray State's 108-49 victory over Tennessee Wesleyan on Saturday. He had nine points, three rebounds and two steals in the road victory over FIU to begin the week.

NOTES FROM AROUND THE LEAGUE

OVC Overview/This Week's Highlights: The first set of OVC games will be played this Thursday/Saturday...Thursday's highlights include a nationally televised game between Murray State and Eastern Kentucky on Thursday (ESPNU, 6 p.m. CT). Both teams have started the season 5-1 with some impressive wins under their belts...Murray State's lone loss was by five points at nationally-ranked California while EKU's lone loss was by 11 points at Pittsburgh...Eastern Kentucky is coming off a Sub-Regional victory at the O'Reilly Auto Part CBE Classic they hosted at McBrayer Arena last week while Murray State is coming of a victory at the Miami Sub-Regional of the 2K Sports Classic Benefitting Coaches vs. Cancer...EKU junior Justin Stommes, this week's OVC Player of the Week, was named MVP of that event, while Murray State's Ivan Aska was named MVP in Miami...Murray State was picked as the OVC preseason co-favorite, along with Morehead State; those two teams will meet on Saturday in Murray.

Murray State Enters CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major Poll: After its quick start Murray State entered CollegeInsider.com's Mid-Major Poll at No. 23 on Nov. 23. This week's poll had not been released at press time. Now in its 11th season, the Mid-Major poll is made up of team's from the following conferences: America East, Atlantic Sun, Big Sky, Big South, Big West, Colonial, Great West, Horizon, Independents, Ivy, Metro Atlantic, Mid-American, Mid-Eastern, Missouri Valley, Northeast, Ohio Valley, Patriot, Southern, Southland, Southwestern, Summit, Sun Belt, West Coast. It is voted upon by coaches from those conferences, with one coach per conference casting a vote (Murray State's Billy Kennedy is the OVC rep). Eastern Kentucky, who is also 5-1 to start the season, should have a good shot of breaking into the Top 25 when this week's poll is released.

Morehead State's Faried Enters Season as Nation's Leading Returning Rebounder: Morehead State junior Kenneth Faried enters the 2009-10 season as Division I's leading returning rebounder. Although the first official NCAA statistics will not be released until Dec. 1, Faried is unofficially fifth nationally in rebounding (12.3 rebounds/game). He has three double-doubles in four total games this season. Last season Faried, the OVC Defensive Player of the Year and OVC Tournament MVP, ranked third nationally in rebounds per game, pulling down 13.0 a contest (that number increased to 13.5 boards per game in OVC games). That trailed only National Player of the Year Blake Griffin (14.4 rebounds/game) and Santa Clara's John Bryant (14.2/game) in the national standings and both of those players have left the college game. Faried had a career-high 24 rebounds in a game against Florida A&M, which was the third most rebounds in a game in Division I last season. Faried also had a 21-rebound game, a 20-rebound game, a 19-rebound game, an 18-rebound outing, five 17-rebound performances and two 16-rebound games in 2008-09.

Loos Nears All-Time OVC Coaching Victories Mark: Austin Peay head coach Dave Loos has 316 career victories while in the OVC, a mark that ranks second in league history. He is just three (3) wins shy of Cal Luther (319 wins at Murray State and UT Martin) for the all-time mark. Loos, the Dean of OVC coaches, is in his 20th year at Austin Peay where he also serves as the Athletics Director, making him the only Division I head men's basketball coach to hold that distinction.

The 2009-10 Season: The 2009-10 season marks the 62nd of competition in the OVC. Over the previous 61 years, 12 different teams have claimed an OVC regular season championship, including four different schools in the past five years. UT Martin won its first OVC Regular Season Championship in 2008-09.

New Faces: The OVC welcomes three new head coaches to the league this season, the most new faces since the 1991-92 season (that season the new coaches were David Farrar at Middle Tennessee, Dick Fick at Morehead State, Scott Edgar at Murray State and Frankie Allen and Tennessee State). Former Arkansas State head coach **Dickey Nutt** takes over at Southeast Missouri State, **John Cooper**, lastly the associate head coach at Auburn, is the new man in charge at Tennessee State and **Jason James** is UT Martin's new head coach after previously serving as an assistant coach at the school. James (32) is the second youngest coach at the Division I level, trailing only IPFW's Dane Fife (30 years old).

OVC Tournament to Be Held at Sommet Center for 11th Time and in Nashville For 16th Time in 17 Years: The 2010 OVC Basketball Tournament will be held at the Sommet Center in downtown Nashville for the 11th time this season. The event was first held there in 1997 (marking the first basketball event in the venue) and has been held there every year since with the exceptions of 2002, 2004 and 2008. Last year the men's final went two overtimes with Morehead State finally topping Austin Peay when Steve Peterson hit his only bucket of the game with 1.4 seconds left in the second overtime. Overall this year will mark the 16th time in the last 17 years the tournament has been held in Nashville (with 2002 being the only year in that stretch the event was not in Music City).

COACHES TELECONFERENCE

During the regular season a bi-weekly teleconference featuring the league's 10 head coaches will be held on Tuesday mornings at 10 a.m. Central Time. The initial teleconference will take place on Wednesday, Dec. 2. Following a break for the holidays, the schedule resumes and goes bi-weekly beginning Tuesday, Jan. 26 and going through the regular season. Men's call dates are: Dec. 2, Jan. 26, Feb. 9, Feb. 23 and Monday, March 1 (prior to the OVC Tournament). Note: OVC Women's Head Coaches will appear on the Tuesday's that the men do not have a teleconference. A schedule of what times coaches will appear is below. 2010 OVC TOURNAMENT

The 2010 Ohio Valley Conference Men's & Women's Tournaments will be held March 2, 5-6. The first round games will be held at campus sites (top four seeds on each side) on Tuesday, March 2. Those games can be seen live on OVCSports.TV.

The winners of those games will shift to the Sommet Center in downtown Nashville, Tenn. for the semifinals and finals. The men's semifinals will be held on Friday, March 5 at 6 and 8 p.m. and televised on ESPNU with the championship game on Saturday, March 6 at 7 p.m. and televised live on ESPN2. The women's semifinals are set for 12 and 2 p.m. on March 5 (televised on OVCSports.TV) and the women's championship game is set for March 6 at a time to be announced.

This marks the 16th time in 17 years that the tournament has been held in Nashville and 11th time the event has been held at the Sommet Center.

Westwood One to Broadcast OVC Championship Game: For the first time this season, the 2010 Men's Basketball Championship game will be broadcast by the Westwood One radio network, the largest provider of audio content in America. Westwood One is home of the most prestigious sports broadcasts on radio. Westwood One's lineup includes regular season NFL football, the Playoffs and the Super Bowl; NCAA Football and Basketball including the Final Four; College World Series; Frozen Four; the Olympics; the Masters and more. Through its Metro Traffic division, Westwood One provides traffic reporting and local news, sports and weather to approximately 2,300 radio and TV stations. Westwood One also provides digital and other cross-platform delivery of its network and Metro content.

Morehead State and Murray State Picked as Preseason Co-Favorites: In a vote of Ohio Valley Conference head men's basketball coaches and sports information directors, Morehead State and Murray State each received 10 first-place votes and were picked as co-favorites for the 2009-10 season. Morehead State finished last season 12-6 in league play (4th place) and went on to win the OVC Tournament Championship. Murray State was tied for second overall last season with a 13-5 record and lost in the OVC Tournament semifinals. It marks the 13th time in the last 21 years that Murray State has been picked the preseason favorite and second year in a row. Morehead State is tabbed first for the first time since the 1983-84 season (when they went 25-6 and won the OVC regular season and tournament championships). It marks just the third time since 1980-81 (when preseason polls were first available) that co-favorites have been picked in the preseason poll (it also happened in 1991-92 and 1994-95). Morehead State and Murray State each received 154 points and were followed next by Austin Peay who had 114 total points. Eastern Illinois was picked fourth (105 points) and followed by Eastern Kentucky (93), Jacksonville State (86), Tennessee Tech (76), UT Martin (55), Tennessee State (44) and Southeast Missouri State (19).

Preseason Predictions: Is being picked the preseason favorite, always a good thing? Over the past 30 years of preseason polls that were available, the league's head coaches and sports information directors correctly pick the eventual OVC regular season champion 60 percent of the time, picking the correct winner 18 times over the last 30 years. Over the past 10 years, the preseason poll has correctly picked the winner every other year. Last season the poll tabbed Murray State the favorite, although the Racers finished second to UT Martin, who won its first-ever OVC Championship a year ago.

Morehead State's Faried Tabbed as Preseason Player of the Year: The 2009-10 All-OVC Preseason Men's Basketball team was headlined by Morehead State junior center Kenneth Faried. Faried is coming off a season where he was named OVC Defensive Player of the Year and OVC Tournament MVP. Overall six different schools were represented on the team with Murray State's three selections leading the way. Eastern Illinois and Morehead State each had two selections while Austin Peay, Eastern Kentucky and Tennessee State had one player apiece on the squad. The team features just one player (Faried) who was a first-team All-OVC selection last season. The team does have three second-team All-OVC picks from 2008-09 and two players who were on last season's All-Newcomer Team. Faried made a splash last season being named the Conference's first OVC Defensive Player of the Year after ranking third nationally in rebounding (13.0/game), 52nd nationally in blocked shots (1.9/game) and 69th nationally in steals (1.9/game). Faried also added 13.9 points per game and connected on 55.6 percent of his field goal attempts (36th nationally). The 6-8 native of Newark, N.J. also tallied 25 double-doubles, which was the second most

nationally, trailing only National Player of the Year Blake Griffin (29). Austin Peay's Wesley Channels, Eastern Illinois' Romain Martin and Murray State's Danero Thomas were each second-team All-OVC picks last season and are each on the preseason team this year. Murray State's Ivan Aska and Isacc Miles were two of the five All-OVC Newcomer selections in 2008-09 who are also on this year's All-OVC preseason squad. The Preseason All-OVC team is rounded out by Tennessee State's Darius Cox, Eastern Illinois' Tyler Laser, Morehead State's Maze Stallworth and Eastern Kentucky's Justin Stommes.

OVC Scores First NCAA Tournament Win in 20 Years: Places Three Teams in Postseason in 2008-09: With its 58-43 win over Alabama State in the NCAA Tournament Opening Round game in Dayton last March, Morehead State snapped a 19-year losing streak in the NCAA Tournament for teams from the Ohio Valley Conference. It marked the first NCAA Tournament victory since Middle Tennessee State beat Florida State 97-83 in Nashville in 1989. The Eagles were then defeated by No. 1 overall seed Louisville in the first round. The year also marked the first time since 1987 (when Austin Peay and Middle Tennessee were in the NCAA Tournament and Akron was in the NIT) that three OVC schools had participated in the postseason in the same year. In addition to Morehead State playing in the NCAA Tournament, UT Martin was in the NIT and Austin Peay played in the inaugural CollegeInsider.com Tournament.

OVC Players in the Pros: As of October 2009, there are three former OVC players on NBA rosters. Those three players are Austin Peay's Trenton Hassell (New Jersey Nets), Murray State's James Singleton (Dallas Mavericks) and UT Martin's Lester Hudson (Boston Celtics). Hassel is in his ninth season in the NBA and third with the Nets. He also played with the Chicago Bulls (who drafted him 30th overall in the 2001 Draft and where he played two seasons), Minnesota Timberwolves (four seasons) and Dallas Mavericks (37 games in 2007-08). During his 592-game career he has averaged 5.9 points, 2.8 rebounds and 1.8 assists per game while hitting 44.7 percent of his field goal attempts. After being undrafted out of college (2003), Singleton played overseas before being signed by the Los Angeles Clippers before the 2005-06 season and played two seasons there before signing with Dallas in 2008-09. In his 174game career, Singleton has averaged 3.5 points and 3.2 rebounds per game while hitting 49.3 percent of his shots. Hudson won the last two OVC Player of the Year awards before being drafted by the Boston Celtics in the second round (pick No. 58) of the 2009 NBA Draft. Hudson signed a one-year unguaranteed contact after his play in the NBA Summer League with the team.

All 11 OVC Teams to Participate in ESPN BracketBusters For Fifth Straight Year: All 11 OVC schools will participate in the ESPN BracketBusters series for the fifth straight season in 2009-10. Now it its eighth year, ESPN BracketBusters is an ESPN television property that was tremendously successful with its first seven events in February of 2003, 2004, 2005, 2006, 2007, 2008 and 2009. The event has allowed Division I conferences to participate in a cutting-edge format that involves "wild card" pairings from the pool of participating teams, with half of the ESPNU BracketBusters teams pre-designated as "home" and the remaining half as "road" teams. OVC schools are 16-29 all-time in the event, including a 3-7 mark a season ago. Austin Peay, Eastern Illinois, Eastern Kentucky, Jacksonville State and Murray State will all be home teams in the series this year while Morehead State, Southeast Missouri, SIU Edwardsville, Tennessee State, Tennessee Tech and UT Martin will all go on the road. The 2010 matchups will be announced on Feb. 1, 2010.

Replay Systems for OVC Basketball Venues Enter Year Three: On Dec. 21, 2007, the Ohio Valley Conference mandated the use of courtside replay systems at all OVC basketball venues. The systems were put into place in January 2008 and have been used since. The systems are used in situations that are outlined by NCAA rules.

SIU Edwardsville Continues Reclassification Process to Division I: On July 1, 2008 Southern Illinois University Edwardsville became the 11th member of the Ohio Valley Conference. SIU Edwardsville, who is in the reclassification process to Division I, will begin regular season competition in the OVC during the 2011-12 academic year and will be eligible for postseason competition in 2012-13. The exception is the SIUE softball program, which will be eligible for both regular season and tournament competition in 2010-11; the softball program was the department's women's sport designee to be fast-tracked to Division I, making it eligible to compete at Division I prior to other SIUE sports. SIUE is located in Edwardsville, Ill., which is just northeast of St. Louis (the 18th largest media market in the United States.

OVCSports.TV: For the fourth consecutive year, fans can watch nearly every Conference matchup and all non-conference home contests this season at OVCSports.TV. The venture with JumpTV Sports allows fans to access live and on-demand streaming video and audio of conference matchups (excluding only national television games which are not available) on their home computer. The premium Web site was launched in July 2006 and has streamed over 1,000 events in its first three years, including 2009-10 OVC Men's Basketball Weekly Release - Nov. 30 • 5 Conference matchups in football and men's and women's basketball as well as

Murray State, the preseason OVC co-favorites along with Morehead State, are off to a good start this season, winning five of its first six games...The Racers have actually won five in a row since a season-opening loss (by 5 points) to No. 12 California...Since that game the team has defeated a pair of non-Division I teams (UMSL and Tennessee Wesleyan) and won neutral site games (Miami, Fla.) with James Madison and North Carolina Central and won at FIU...Murray State has won those five games by an average of 32.2 points...Last week's games included the road win over FIU and the home game with Tennessee Wesleyan...Isaiah Canaan was named OVC Freshman of the Week for his performance in those games; Canaan averaged 10.5 points, 3.5 rebounds and 2.0 steals per game while hitting 63.6 percent (7-of-11) from the floor and 100 percent (4-of-4) from the free throw line...He had 12 points, three assists and two steals in only 23 minutes of playing time against Tennessee Wesleyan...Senior Tony Easley kept his record-setting field goal pace up by hitting on 9-of-11 (81.8%) of his shots last week; for the season he is 69.7 percent (23-of-33) from the field, which is first in the OVC (ahead of teammate Ivan Aska who is second) and his career average is at .658, which would rank second for a career in OVC history if the season ended today (the career record is .664)...Aska and Isacc Miles led the team with 13.5 point/game averages last week...Murray State will open OVC play this week with an ESPNU game with Eastern Kentucky, who is also 5-1 on the season...On Saturday Morehead State will come to the Regional Special Events Center, where MSU has won six straight and 40 of their last 50.
