THIS WEEK'S OVC HIGHLIGHTS/STORYLINES

Southeast Missouri won for the eighth-straight week, topping UT Martin 24-17 to improve to 7-0 in the OVC...The eight-game winning streak is the longest for the team since the 1955 season (prior to joining the Division I ranks)...The Redhawks are ranked No. 9 in this week's Sports Network/Fathead.com poll, its highest-ranking ever; With JSU being ranked No. 2, it marks the first time since the 1996 season that the OVC has had two teams ranked in the FCS Top 10 at the same time (it was Eastern Illinois and Murray State then)...Jacksonville State (8-0, 5-0 OVC) is the only other OVC team who is undefeated in league play; the Gamecocks had an open week this past week...JSU has won 12-straight games dating back to last season, which is the longest streak in the FCS and second-longest in all of Division I (behind only Boise State)...The 12 wins in a row is the fifth-longest streak in OVC history (and longest since the 1991 season)...Jax State is one of only three teams who are undefeated at the FCS level (along with Appalachian State and Bethune-Cookman)...JSU and Southeast Missouri are two of just six teams nationally without a loss to a FCS opponent this season...In other action Eastern Illinois broke through with its first win of the season, beating Austin Peay 28-10 while Eastern Kentucky topped Murray State 28-21 in what was the 70th all-time meeting between the two schools from the Bluegrass State...This week's games feature four OVC games as Jacksonville State plays at Eastern Kentucky, Eastern Illinois travels to Tennessee State (EIU head coach Bob Spoo is just one win away from fourth on the all-time OVC wins list), Tennessee Tech is at Murray State and UT Martin is at Austin Peay...The UTM/APSU game is part of the Sgt. York Trophy series and with a win UT Martin would be one victory away from capturing its first Sgt. York Championship; a loss would give defending champion Tennessee Tech at least a share of the title (and a right to keep the trophy for another year)...In non-conference action Southeast Missouri entertains Southwest Baptist.

THIS WEEK'S OVC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

OFFENSIVE

T.J. Pryor, QB • So., 6-2, 194 • Louisville, Ky. • Eastern Kentucky

Pryor accounted for three of Eastern Kentucky's four touchdowns as the Colonels topped Murray State 28-21 to end a two-game losing streak. With EKU facing 4th and 1 with the game tied at 21 late in the fourth quarter, Pryor rushed for a 29-yard touchdown that proved to be the game-winner. The sophomore also rushed for a touchdown in the first quarter, the first points of the game for EKU. Those runs were two of his 14 total carries on the day, which netted Pryor a season-high 79 yards. Pryor also completed 10-of-17 passes for 140 yards and a 49-yard score to Orlandus Harris just before halftime (putting EKU up 21-10 at the break).

DEFENSIVE

Joshua Jackson, LB • Sr., 6-1, 220 • Baytown, Texas • Southeast Missouri

Jackson had seven tackles, a sack, tackle-for-loss and forced a fumble (that ended a drive at midfield) as No. 11 Southeast Missouri beat UT Martin for its eighth-victory in a row. The eight wins in a row are the most for the Redhawks since the 1955 season and the eight wins overall is tied for the most in the program's Division I history. Jackson also deflected a pass the landed in the hands of teammate Josh Gipson and eventually led to three points for the Redhawks. The Southeast defense limited UT Martin to just 58 total yards and zero points in the first half. Jackson is the third different Redhawk player to earn OVC Defensive Player of the Week honors this season.

SPECIALIST

Joe Hook, P • Jr., 6-1, 180 • Cincinnati, Ohio • UT Martin

Hook punted five times for an average of 45.8 yards/punt in UT Martin's 24-17 loss at No. 11 Southeast Missouri. Hook had a long punt of 50 yards and saw three of his punts downed inside the Redhawks 20-yard line.

NEWCOMER

Jimmy Garoppolo, QB • Fr., 6-3, 208 • Rolling Meadows, Ill. • Eastern Illinois

Garoppolo had his second-straight solid start for Eastern Illinois, completing 12-of-22 passes for 219 yards and three touchdowns as the Panthers won for the first time this season, topping Austin Peay 28-10. The true freshman was on fire in the second quarter when he completed 5-of-6 passes for 129 yards and hit sophomore Chris Wright for two touchdown passes as EIU built a 21-3 halftime advantage. It marked the second-straight week that Garoppolo earned the OVC Newcomer of the Week honor. Over that two-week stretch he has completed 38-of-57 for 560 yards and seven touchdowns and just one interception.

NOTES FROM AROUND THE GRIDIRON

Jacksonville State and Southeast Missouri 2 of Just 6 FCS Teams With 8 or More Wins (and 2 of Only 3 With Eight or More Division I Wins): Entering this week Jacksonville State and Southeast Missouri are two of just six Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) teams with eight or more victories this season (JSU is 8-0 and SEMO is 8-1). To take it one step further, the teams are two of just three FCS teams with eight or more victories against Division I competition (Appalachian State is the other). Jacksonville State and Southeast Missouri are also just two of six FCS teams without a loss to a fellow FCS team this season (the others are Appalachian State, Bethune-Cookman, Grambling State and Wofford).

JSU One of Three Undefeated Teams in FCS Football: Entering week No. 10 of the 2010 season there are only three undefeated teams left in the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) and Jacksonville State (8-0) is among those squads. The two other undefeated teams are Appalachian State (8-0) and Bethune-Cookman (8-0).

OVC Has Two Teams Ranked in Top 10 For First Time Since 1996: When Southeast Missouri improved to 8-1 and moved up to No. 9 in the Sports Network poll (No. 10 in the FCS Coaches poll) on Nov. 1, it put two OVC teams in the Top 10 together for the first time since the 1996 season. The last time it had happened was on Oct. 7, 1996 when Eastern Illinois was ranked No. 7 and Murray State was ranked No. 9. Jacksonville State has been near the top of the polls since its season-opening win over Ole Miss, when it leaped from No. 17 to No. 5. The No. 5 ranking was the highest for an OVC team since Western Kentucky was ranked fifth in the final poll of the 2000 season. After a win over Chattanooga in week No. 2, the Gamecocks moved up to No. 4 in both major FCS polls, a ranking they have maintained for three weeks until moving up one spot to No. 3 on Oct. 4, a spot they stayed for three weeks until moving to No. 2 on Oct. 25 (a ranking they hold once again this week). The No. 2 ranking is the highest an OVC team has been since Tennessee State was No. 1 in the final regular season poll of the 1999 season. JSU has now been ranked for 24-straight weeks (its longest stretch since joining the Division I ranks). The No. 2 ranking is the highest at the Division I level for the Gamecocks and tied for the highest-ranking in school history (JSU was No. 2 numerous times at the Division II level). After losing its first two games of the season, Eastern Illinois dropped out of the Top 25, leaving only one OVC team ranked in the national polls for the first time since Sept. 8, 2008 (a span of 28 polls). That number became two ranked teams once again on Oct. 4 when Southeast Missouri State jumped to No. 25 in the Sports Network poll. It marked the first time since the first two polls of the 2003 season that the Redhawks had been ranked nationally. Southeast has continued moving up the polls until cracking the Top 10 this week; the ranking is the highest in the history of the Redhawks program.

Jax State Has Longest Overall and Longest Road Winning Streak in FCS: Jacksonville State enters this week with the nation's longest winning streak (12 games) among Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) teams. Jacksonville State has not lost since falling 28-20 at No. 24 Eastern Illinois on Oct. 24, 2009. Among all Division I teams (FBS & FCS), the 12-game winning streak is second-best (behind Boise State's 21-game streak). The Gamecocks also lay claim to the longest road winning streak among FCS teams, which is at nine (9) games dating back to last season. The Gamecocks have not lost a road game since losing at FBS opponent Florida State on Sept. 12 of last season. The team's last road loss to a FCS team was at UT Martin (31-30) on Oct. 23, 2008. Among all Division I teams (FBS & FCS) Jacksonville State's nine-game road winning streak is second (behind Boise State's 16-game streak) and tied with TCU.

OVC Winning Streaks: Jacksonville State's 12-game winning streak is one of 19 in OVC history to reach 10 or more games, and is currently tied for the fifth-longest in league history. It is the longest winning streak by an OVC team since the 1991 season (12-straight by Eastern Kentucky). Below is a list of each streak that has reached 10 games.

Southeast Missouri Turnaround: After winning just two games last season, Southeast Missouri State has turned around its fortunes this season. The Redhawks were 2-9 overall and 1-7 in the OVC and entering this week are 8-1 overall and 7-0 in the OVC. Using the NCAA formula for biggest single-season turnaround in FCS history (add the difference in victories between the two seasons to the difference in losses then divide by two, ties not counted), the Redhawks 7-game improvement currently ranks among the best in FCS history (since 1978). The all-time best single-season improvement is 9.5 games by the 1984 Montana State squad (that went from 1-10 to 12-2).

Spoos Now Fifth All-Time in OVC Wins, One Away from Fourth Place: With a victory over Austin Peay on Oct. 30, Eastern Illinois head coach **Bob Spoo** moved within just one win of fourth place on the OVC all-time career Conference victory list. Spoo has now won 66 OVC games in his tenure at EIU, which has spanned the school's entire time in the OVC (1996 through the present, although he was not on the sidelines for the 2006 season). Spoo trails only Roy Kidd (207 OVC wins at EKU), Boots Donnelly (102 wins at Austin Peay and Middle Tennessee), Charles Murphy (73 wins at Middle Tennessee) and Jimmy Feix (67 wins at Western Kentucky) on the all-time list.

NCAA Stats Leaders: In the latest set of NCAA rushing leaders, Southeast Missouri State senior running back **Henry Harris** remains first nationally in all-purpose yards (211.00/game), fourth in rushing (133.33/game) and ninth in scoring (9.33 points/game). Austin Peay's **Terrence Holt**, who led the nation in all-purpose yards last season, is back in the top 10 in that category this year, ranking ninth (172.88). Murray State's **Dontrell Johnson** is first nationally in punt return yards (28.45/return) while his teammate **Marcus Harris** is first in receptions (9.00/game). Harris also ranks fifth in receiving yards/game (109.33) while MSU running back **Mike Harris** is fifth in scoring (10.0 points/game). Murray State quarterback **Casey Brockman** ranks eighth in completions/game (22.67). Eastern Kentucky's **Jeremy Caldwell** is eighth in kickoff returns (29.82/return). Eastern Kentucky punter **Jordan Berry** is fourth in punting (43.98) while Eastern Illinois' **Kevin Cook** is eighth (42.98). Tennessee Tech's **Marcus Edwards** is third in sacks (1.07/game), while Jacksonville State's **Keginald Harris** is eighth in interceptions (0.63/game). Team-wise Southeast Missouri is first nationally in least interceptions thrown (1), second in third down conversion percentage (51.20%), third in passes intercepted (15), third in least yards penalized per game (30.67), sixth in fewest penalties/game (4.33), fifth in sacks allowed (0.56/game), fourth in rushing offense (260.11 yards/game) and sixth in turnover margin (+1.22/game). Jacksonville State ranks first in sacks allowed (0.50/game), eighth in scoring offense (35.25 points/game), ninth in kickoff returns (24.21 yards/return) and 10th in passing efficiency (148.08). Murray State is first nationally in punt returns (23.21 yards/return), fifth nationally in passing yards (306.00/game) and second nationally in tackles for loss (9.00/game). Eastern Kentucky is first in net punting (40.48), second in sacks (3.25/game) and sixth in tackles for loss (8.50/game). Eastern Illinois is third in fumbles recovered (14) while Tennessee Tech is eighth in red zone offense (90%).

Large Crowds: OVC teams have played in front of some big crowds this season, especially when playing against a Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponent (including 99,123 who saw UT Martin play at Tennessee in what was the second-biggest crowd to ever see an OVC team play). In games involving just FCS teams this season, Tennessee State has played in front of the second and third largest crowds, including 54,202 at the Georgia Dome against Florida A&M (Sept. 25) and 44,688 at the Liberty Bowl against Jackson State (Sept. 11). Jacksonville State is currently averaging 17,981 fans at its four home games this year, ranking the Gamecocks eighth among all FCS teams. In its most recent game, Southeast Missouri drew 11,126 fans for its Homecoming game (a win over UT Martin), the largest home crowd in the history of the program.

Jacksonville State/Tennessee Tech Nov. 20 Game Time Changed: The game time for the Nov. 20 OVC Game of the Week TV contest (Wazoo Sports, ESPN3.com, WUXP, WQWQ, WEIU) between Jacksonville State and Tennessee Tech has been moved from 6:00 p.m. CT to 4:00 p.m. CT. This was done at the request by the Division I Football Championship Selection Committee, which asked for a game to be considered in any playoff discussion that it start no later than 4:00 p.m. CT (5 p.m. ET). This is done so the bracket can be completed and announced in a 30-minute special on ESPNU at 10 a.m. ET the following day (an earlier announcement than in previous years).

TSU's Clifford Joins ECU's Caldwell on Buck Buchanan Watch List: Tennessee State safety **Eugene Clifford** has been added to the Buck Buchanan Award watch list. The award, which is presented by The Sports Network and sponsored by Fathead.com, is handed out annually to the nation's top FCS defensive player. Also on 20-person list is Eastern Kentucky cornerback **Jeremy Caldwell** who was one of preseason selections to the team. The Buchanan Award watch list will undergo one final revision before the end of the season. Ballots will be sent to a panel of

approximately 200 sports information and media relations directors, broadcasters, writers and other dignitaries following the conclusion of the regular season on Nov. 22. The Buchanan Award will be presented to the FCS national defensive player of the year on Thursday, Jan. 6 in Frisco, Texas - the night before the national championship game. The Buck Buchanan award is named for Junious "Buck" Buchanan, the NAIA All-American and Pro Football Hall of Fame defensive lineman who played for Grambling State University from 1959 through 1962. As a freshman, Buchanan came to Grambling on an "if" scholarship, to receive financial help if he played well. After a season of playing both varsity basketball and football, Buchanan decided to concentrate solely on football. By the time he finished four years at Grambling, his coach, Eddie Robinson, asserted that Buchanan was "... the finest tackle I have ever seen." The Buck Buchanan Award has been handed out annually since 1995. Some of the past winners include Minnesota Vikings' Jared Allen (Idaho State - 2003), Jacksonville Jaguars' Rashean Mathis (Bethune-Cookman - 2002) and Dexter Coakley (Appalachian State - 1995, 1996), who played 10 seasons with the Dallas Cowboys and St. Louis Rams.

APSU's Holt Among All-Time Best in FCS in Kickoff Returns: Austin Peay senior **Terrence Holt** is among the best all-time at the FCS level in kickoff returns. Holt broke the FCS all-time kickoff return yardage record in 2009 and currently has 4,348 yards. He is the only player in FCS history to have three 1,000+ yard kickoff return seasons and will look to make that four-straight this year (he is currently 235 yards away from reaching that milestone). Holt also holds the FCS career record for total kick return yardage (kickoffs and punt returns) with 4,886 yards. In 2008 Holt broke the NCAA record for kickoff returns in a season (52) and total kick returns (kickoffs plus punts) with 66.

2010 Marks Fourth Season For Sgt. York Trophy: The 2010 season marks the fourth season for the Sgt. York Trophy, a challenge trophy which goes to the annual winner of the quadrangular season series between the four OVC institutions in the state of Tennessee (Austin Peay, Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech and UT Martin). In July 2007, the Nashville Sports Council and the Ohio Valley Conference announced the creation of the trophy, which is only the second traveling trophy involving more than two schools nationwide (the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy). It is named after Sgt. Alvin C. York, a native of Pall Mall, Tenn. and a Soldier who was one of the most honored of World War I. He received the Congressional Medal of Honor after the war and returned to his home state to dedicate his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee. The trophy goes to the team with the best record against the other schools, and in case of a tie there will be co-champions and the actual trophy will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy. In 2007, Tennessee State and Austin Peay finished in a tie for the trophy with identical 2-1 records; both shared the award but Tennessee State went home with the hardware due to a 1-point win in the head-to-head meeting during the season. Tennessee State went 3-0 in Sgt. York play in 2008 to claim its second trophy. Last year Tennessee Tech claimed the trophy after going undefeated in Sgt. York games.

League Announces "OVC Game of the Week" Television Package With Wazoo Sports: In July 2010 the Ohio Valley Conference announced its a partnership with Wazoo Sports to produce and distribute an "OVC Game of Week" football package for 2010. The 10-game package will begin with Austin Peay at Tennessee State and feature a different game every week through the end of the regular season (Nov. 20). Seven of the 10 games will have a 6 p.m. CT kickoff. Each of the nine OVC football schools will appear on the broadcast at least twice during the season. For a full schedule and affiliate information check out links at OVCsports.com. The games will also appear online through ESPN3.com and OVCSports.TV Wazoo Sports, Inc. is a Regional Sports Network that delivers coverage of NCAA, NAIA high school, and youth sports live and on-demand on television and over the Internet. Wazoo Sports has produced over 360 LIVE games and is currently in over 650,000 households in Kentucky. Wazoo Sports is headquartered in London, Ky.

Brockman Sets OVC Passing Records, Harris Sets Receiving Touchdowns Mark in Win over Missouri State: Murray State sophomore quarterback **Casey Brockman** put his name in the OVC record book in the Racers 72-59 win over Missouri State on Oct. 9. Brockman threw for 570 yards, which broke the OVC record of 553 yards set by Murray State's Justin Fuente in the 1999 season (against Southern Illinois). The sophomore also passed for seven touchdowns, which tied the OVC mark of seven also held by Morehead State's Chris Swartz (1990, set against Murray State). At the time of the game, the 570 yards passing was (and still is) the most in any NCAA classification (FBS, FCS, Division II, Division III) in 2010. Five of Brockman's touchdowns were to senior wide receiver **Marcus Harris**, who set the OVC record in that category. Harris' five scores broke the record of four touchdowns previously held by four individuals (most recently Murray State's Terrence Tillman against UT Martin in 1999). The 30 points scored by Harris was the most by any FCS player in 2010. During the game the two teams combined to set FCS records for total yards (1,423) and extra point kicked (17).

Murray State Makes FCS History With 500-Yard Passer, 200-Yard Receiver and 200-Yard Rusher in the Same Game: In its win over Missouri State on Oct. 9, Murray State made Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) history by having a 500-yard passer (570, **Casey Brockman**), a 200-yard receiver (213, **Marcus Harris**) and a 200-yard rusher (212, **Mike Harris**) in the same game. It marked the first time in NCAA history that had occurred in the same game.

TSU's Brown Out for the Season: Tennessee State's **Preston Brown**, who ranked third nationally in rushing after five games (152.0 yards/game), injured his knee (ACL) against N.C. A&T on Oct. 2 and will miss the rest of the 2010 season.

Jacksonville State Tops Ole Miss, Ends 50-Game OVC Losing Streak to FBS Schools: Jacksonville State's 49-48 double overtime victory over Ole Miss on Sept. 4 helped the OVC end a 50-game losing streak to Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponents that extended back to the 2004 season when Eastern Illinois beat Eastern Michigan 31-28. Jacksonville State nearly ended the

streak a season ago, losing in the final minute at Florida State. It was the program's first win over a FBS team since a 31-28 victory at Arkansas State in 2001 (prior to joining the OVC). All-time the OVC is 18-138-1 against FBS schools.

More FCS Over FBS: Jacksonville State's win over Ole Miss was the first for an FCS team over an FBS team this season (North Dakota State beat Kansas later on Sept. 4 to mark the second win for FCS teams). It marked the 19th time since 2004 that an FCS squad had bested an FBS school (20th including NDSU). In week two of the season, four more FCS teams topped FBS squads.

OVC Finally Tops the SEC: Jacksonville State's victory over Ole Miss also marked the first time since the OVC was formed in 1948 that an OVC team had topped a squad from the Southeastern Conference. Prior to Jax State's victory, the OVC had been 0-22 against SEC teams since the league was formed. Prior to the OVC being formed Southeast Missouri State had topped Ole Miss in 1907 and Tennessee Tech had tied Vanderbilt in 1939 in the only game with positive outcomes for current OVC teams.

Gamecock Play Chosen as Capital One Cup Impact Performance for Week 1: Jacksonville State's 30-yard touchdown on fourth down in overtime and ensuing two-point conversion pass (both by freshman Coty Blanchard) in a win at Ole Miss was chosen as the Capital One Cup Impact Performance of the Week in a vote at ESPN.com. The two plays received 78 percent of the national fan vote.

Two OVC Student-Athletes Named Semifinalists for Campbell Trophy: Two Ohio Valley Conference football student-athletes - Austin Peay's **Brad Williams** and Eastern Kentucky's **Logan O'Connor** - have been named semifinalist for the 2010 William V. Campbell Trophy (formerly known as the Draddy Trophy), endowed by HealthSouth. The semifinalists were announced by the National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame (NFF). The award honors the best and brightest from the college gridiron and is often called the "Academic Heisman." Overall there are 121 semifinalists for the award but Williams and O'Connor are two of only 28 selected from the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS). Williams owns a 3.565 grade-point average as a business finance major with a minor in real estate. The Clarksville native also is a re-founding father of Alpha Tau Omega and is a member of the Omicron Delta Kappa National Leadership and Phi Kappa Phi National Honor Societies. O'Connor is an art teacher education major currently has a 3.84 GPA and is expecting to graduate this May. Nominated by their schools, which are limited to one nominee each, semifinalists must be a senior or graduate student in their final year of eligibility, have a GPA of at least 3.2 on a 4.0 scale, have outstanding football ability as a first team player or significant contributor, and have demonstrated strong leadership and citizenship. The trophy was renamed last fall in honor of Bill Campbell, the chairman of Intuit, former player and head coach at Columbia University and the 2004 recipient of the NFF's Gold Medal.

Williams Earns Honor From College Football Performance Awards for Week No. 9 of the Season: UT Martin return specialist **AJ Williams** was honored by the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) on Oct. 31 for his performance in week No. 9. He was named the FCS Punt Return Performer of the Week.

Cox Earns Honor From College Football Performance Awards for Week No. 8 of the Season: UT Martin defensive end **Tim Cox** was honored by the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) on Oct. 24 for his performance in week No. 8. He was named the FCS Defensive Lineman Performer of the Week.

Tennessee Tech's Mitchell and Edwards Named Co-National Players of the Week by Sports Network (Oct. 18): The Tennessee Tech defensive duo of sophomore defensive back **Caleb Mitchell** and sophomore linebacker **Marcus Edwards** were named National Defensive Players of the Week by the Sports Network/Fathead.com on Oct. 18. The duo combined for 14 tackles, 5.5 sacks and two interceptions as Tennessee Tech topped Eastern Illinois 34-20. Mitchell forced three turnovers by himself, forcing a fumble and picking off two EIU passes. Early in the second quarter Mitchell picked off a pass and went 36 yards for a touchdown to get the Golden Eagles on the board. His second interception came in the end zone, ending a drive where Eastern Illinois was looking to cut the margin to one score. Mitchell also had seven tackles (six solo) and a sack. Edwards ended up with 4.5 sacks for 31 yards worth of lost yards as TTU held EIU to just 39 net rushing yards. The sophomore added seven tackles (four solo). The 4.5 sacks were part of eight by the Golden Eagle team which tied the school record.

EKU's Berry Named National Freshman of the Week by Sports Network (Oct. 18): Eastern Kentucky punter **Jordan Berry** was named National Freshman of the Week by Sports Network/Fathead.com on Oct. 18. Berry averaged 52.3 yards on six punts in Eastern Kentucky's loss at UT Martin on Saturday. Berry put four of those punts inside the Skyhawk 20-yard line and had a 75-yard punt, which was just three yards short of the EKU all-time record. The punt rolled to the UTM 3-yard line in the third quarter. Berry also showed off his running skills by rushing for a first down on a 4th and 11 play in the third quarter.

Four OVC Players Earn Honors From College Football Performance Awards for Week No. 7 of the Season: Four OVC players were honored by the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) on Oct. 17 for their performances in week No. 7. Eastern Illinois specialist **Rashad Haynes** was named FCS Punt Returner Performer of the Week, Eastern Kentucky's **Jordan Berry** was named FCS Punter Performer of the Week, Southeast Missouri's **Drew Geldbach** was named FCS Place Kicker Performer of the Week and UT Martin's **Josh Bey** was named FCS Linebacker Performer of the Week.

News (Oct. 11): Murray State sophomore quarterback Casey Brockman was named National Player of the Week by each the Sports Network/Fathead.com and College Sporting News on Oct. 11 after a record-breaking performance against Missouri State. Brockman put his name in both the OVC and Murray State record books as he completed 32-of-41 passes for 570 yards and seven touchdowns and rushed for another score in the 72-59 Homecoming victory. The 570 passing yards was both an OVC and Murray State record while the seven passing scores established the Racer mark and tied the all-time OVC mark (also held by Morehead State's Chris Swartz). The passing yards were the most by a NCAA player this season at any classification (FBS, FCS, Division II, Division III) and the touchdowns tied the most in any NCAA division this year. The sophomore passed for 238 yards and five touchdowns in the second half alone as Murray State overcame a 52-38 deficit with 2:22 to play in the third quarter.

Two OVC Players Earn Honors From College Football Performance Awards for Week No. 6 of the Season: Two OVC players were honored by the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) on Oct. 11 for their performances in week No. 6. Murray State quarterback **Casey Brockman** was named FCS National Player of the Week and FCS Quarterback Performer of the Week while his teammate **Marcus Harris** was named FCS Wide Receiver Performer of the Week.

Southeast's Borum and EIU's Cook Named National Players of the Week (Oct. 4): Southeast Missouri State linebacker **Darrick Borum** was named National Defensive Player of the Week by College Sporting News while Eastern Illinois punter Kevin Cook was named National Specialist of the Week by Sports Network/Fathead.com on Oct. 4. Borum had a career-high 10 tackles, two sacks, three tackles-for-loss, a fumble recovery, interception and pass break-up in Southeast Missouri's 28-13 road win over Eastern Illinois. His interception ended EIU's first drive of the day and led to seven points for Southeast who took an early lead. Borum was part of a Redhawk defense that forced a season-high five turnovers against the Panthers. Cook averaged 50.2 yards on four punts in the same game against Southeast Missouri. On Cook's first attempt of the day he sailed a punt 86 yards from his own end zone to pin the Redhawks at their own five-yard line. The 86-yard punt was the longest in EIU's NCAA Division I history and seven yards away from the longest punt in NCAA FCS history. For the day Cook would see three of his four punts downed inside the 20-yard line with the fourth nearly downed at the one-yard line before being knocked into the end zone for a touchback.

Tennessee State's Brown, Murray State's Johnson Named National Players of the Week (Sept. 27): For their performances in week No. 4, Tennessee State running back **Preston Brown** and Murray State return specialist **Dontrell Johnson** earned National Player of the Week honors. Brown was named a National All-Star by College Sporting News after rushing for 233 yards and a touchdown in TSU's 29-18 win over Florida A&M at the Atlanta Football Classic. On the second play of the game Brown took a handoff and raced for a 71-yard touchdown. The game was his second 200-plus yard effort in three weeks. Johnson was named National Specialist of the Week by the Sports Network/Fathead.com after returning a punt 91 yards for a touchdown in the Racers 52-16 victory over UT Martin. Johnson had 148 total punt return yards in what was only his second game ever returning punts. Johnson also earned the FCS Punt Return Performer of the Week award from the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA).

Two OVC Players Earn Honors From College Football Performance Awards for Week No. 3 of the Season: Two OVC players were honored by the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) on Sept. 20 for their performances in week No. 3. Austin Peay's **Stephen Stansell** was named FCS Placekicker Performer of the Week while UT Martin's **Darrin Nalls** was named Defensive Lineman Performer of the Week.

Three OVC Players Earn Honors From College Football Performance Awards for Week No. 2 of the Season: Three OVC players were honored by the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) on Sept. 13 for their performances in week No. 2. Tennessee State's **Preston Brown** was named the FCS Running Back Performer of the Week, Southeast Missouri State kicker **Drew Geldbach** was named FCS Placekicker Performer of the Week and Austin Peay safety **Jeremy Ross** was named FCS Defensive Back Co-Performer of the Week.

Ivory and Blanchard Share National All-Star Honors From College Sporting News (Sept. 6): The Jacksonville State quarterback tandem of **Marques Ivory** and **Coty Blanchard** earned National All-Star (Player of the Week) honors from the College Sporting News on Sept. 6 for their parts in the Gamecocks double overtime win at Ole Miss. The duo shared the Offensive Award with Appalachian State quarterback DeAndre Presley. The starter Ivory was 13-for-23 for 126 and two touchdowns while true freshman Blanchard was 9-for-13 for 126 yards and two touchdowns. The duo led the Gamecocks to five straight touchdowns to end the game, as JSU trailed 31-13 entering the fourth quarter. Jax State outscored the Rebels 21-3 in the final quarter behind the two-quarterback attack. Blanchard had a four-yard touchdown with 6:17 left to cut the lead to 31-26 and Ivory had a 19-yard score to Alan Bonner with 18 seconds left to make the score 34-32. Ivory then completed a 2-point conversion pass to La'Ray Williams to force overtime. Each quarterback scored a touchdown in overtime, as Ivory connected for a 7-yard score in the first overtime, and Blanchard completed a 30-yard pass on 4th and 15 in the second overtime. Blanchard then completed a two-point conversion pass to Calvin Middleton to win the game (and earn No. 2 play of the day honors on SportsCenter. The Gamecocks duo did not throw an interception in the game.

Tennessee Tech Game With Lane College Called in Second Quarter: On Sept. 16 Tennessee Tech led Lane College 43-0 with 5:01 to play in the second quarter when lightning and heavy rains forced play to be suspended. After a long delay the game was unable to be continued. One of the conditions of Rule 3-3-3-c of the NCAA rulebook allows the teams to "terminate the game with a determined final score" if both the directions of athletics at the participating institutions in

consultation with the coaches agree. Both teams agreed the game would end with TTU winning 43-0 and improving its record to 1-2 on the season. However, under NCAA statistics guidelines the game did not reach a "reasonable point of conclusion" (deemed three quarters for a football game) due to the weather conditions. So the statistics from the game will not count in the NCAA national statistical leaders or the OVC leaders. It was determined, however, that the Golden Eagle players would be able to count the stats in their individual career totals.

Tennessee Tech Starts Season With Back-to-Back Top 25 FBS Opponents: Tennessee Tech had the tough task of being one of just four Division I teams (FBS or FCS) to start the 2010 season with two nationally-ranked Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponents. The Golden Eagles lost at No. 17 Arkansas in week one and at No. 4 TCU in week two. The other three teams to start the season against two nationally-ranked FBS teams were Marshall (Ohio State and West Virginia), San Jose State (Alabama and Wisconsin) and UNLV (Wisconsin and Utah).

A Look at the Coaches: There are two new coaches and seven returnees among the head coaching ranks in the Ohio Valley Conference this season. **Chris Hatcher** takes over at Murray State after tenures at Valdosta State and Georgia Southern and **Rod Reed** is now in charge at Tennessee State (his alma mater) after serving on the staff as an assistant and defensive coordinator. The Dean of OVC Coaches is Eastern Illinois coach **Bob Spoo** who is in his 24th season with the Panthers in 2010. Spoo has 88 total wins while EIU has been a member of the OVC, a mark that ranks fifth in OVC history. Spoo also has 65 Conference victories, which is also fifth all-time. He is just two OVC wins away from passing WKU's Jimmy Feix (67 OVC wins) and moving into fourth place on the all-time list.

FCS Playoff Expansion: For the first time in 2010 the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) playoff field will include 20 teams, up from 16 a year ago. In April 2008 the NCAA Board of Directors approved the expansion. It marks the first expansion since the field grew from 12 to 16 teams in 1997. The field will be comprised of 10 automatic bids (up from 8) and 10 at-large berths. This season there will be four first round matchups (8 total teams), while 12 teams will receive a bye into the second round. For the first time in 2010, the championship game will be played in Frisco, Texas at Pizza Hut Park, a 23,500-seat multi-purpose stadium. The Southland Conference will serve as the host of the championship, which will be held on Friday, Jan. 7.

Preseason Forecasts: For the second-straight season five different schools received at least one first-place vote in the preseason predicted order of finish balloting. Jacksonville State received the most (11 of 18) while Eastern Illinois (4), Eastern Kentucky (1), Tennessee Tech (1) and Tennessee State (1) were also in the mix. JSU was picked first for the third time in the past six seasons. Is being picked first in the preseason poll necessarily a good thing? In the past 31 years of preseason polls (all that were available), the preseason predicted champion has only gone on to win the OVC Championship 12 times (38.7%). Over the past seven years not once has the eventual champion been predicted in the preseason poll (it was last done correctly in 2002).

Holt and Bey Headline Preseason All-OVC Team: Austin Peay senior running back/kick returner **Terrence Holt** and UT Martin senior linebacker **Josh Bey** have been tabbed the 2010 Ohio Valley Conference Preseason Offensive and Defensive Players of the Year in a vote on by the league's head football coaches and sports information directors. Eastern Illinois, Jacksonville State and Tennessee Tech each had four selections apiece on the preseason team to lead the league. Eastern Kentucky had the next-most selections with three. Each of the league's nine teams had at least one player on the preseason squad. Returning players who were first-team All-OVC picks last season (12 in total) were automatic selections to the preseason team this year. The squad also included seven players who were second-team selections in 2009. Of the 25 total selections, 13 were seniors, 11 were juniors and there was one sophomore pick.

Let's Get It Started: The 63rd season of Ohio Valley Conference football will get underway on Thursday, Sept. 2 when four OVC squads take to the gridiron; the remaining five schools will play on Saturday, Sept. 4. The OVC is made up of nine football-playing schools in 2010. Since its beginning, 14 of the 18 total schools that have played football in the league have claimed at least one championship.

I-AA No More: Although some people may accidentally still refer to it as I-AA football, the term that represents the level of Division I football in which the Ohio Valley Conference competes has been retired. Beginning with the 2006 National Championship game, the term Football Championship Subdivision (or FCS) is to be used. FCS is the only Division I football rank to host a NCAA-sponsored national championship (one of 88 championships the NCAA sponsors). The division formerly known as I-A was changed to Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and those teams compete for the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) national championship. Teams who play at the FCS level can offer a maximum of 63 scholarships (FBS teams can offer 85) and compete in a 16-team playoff at the end of the season to determine the national champion.

NFL Connections: As of October 1, 19 former Ohio Valley Conference players are on NFL rosters for the 2010 season (13 active players, 6 practice squad members). Those players include former Eastern Illinois standout Tony Romo, a three-time Pro Bowl pick, Cortland Finnegan (Samford), who has been a Pro Bowl defensive back selection with the Tennessee Titans and Tennessee State's Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie, who was a starter for the Arizona Cardinals in Super Bowl XLIII and was a Pro Bowl selection last season. There are five players on NFL rosters who played in the OVC last season including Eastern Illinois offensive linemen Chris Campbell (Green Bay Packers - practice squad) and Otis Hudson (Cincinnati Bengals - practice squad), Murray State defensive lineman Austen Lane (Jacksonville Jaguars) and wide receiver Derrick Townsel (Houston Texans - practice squad) and Tennessee State defensive back Anthony Levine (Green Bay Packers). Six of the nine current OVC football schools have at least one player in the NFL with Tennessee State leading the way with four active players (and one practice squad member). Several NFL coaches also have connections to OVC schools, including three who went to Eastern Illinois, the "Cradle of NFL Head Coaches." Those coaches include Brad Childress (Minnesota), Super Bowl champion Sean Payton (New Orleans) and Mike Shanahan (Washington). UT Martin graduate and former assistant coach Jerry Reese made waves in 2007 when he led the New York Giants to Super Bowl XLII in his first season as General Manager with the franchise.

OVCsports.TV: For the fifth consecutive year, fans can watch every Conference matchup and all non-conference home contests at OVCsports.TV. The venture with NeuLion (formerly JumpTV Sports) allows fans to access live and on-demand streaming video and audio of all conference matchups on their home computer. The premium Web site was launched in July 2006 and streamed over a thousand events in its first four seasons, including all Conference matchups in football and men's and women's basketball as well as select baseball, soccer, softball and volleyball games and OVC Championship events. Packages are available on a yearly, seasonally, monthly or per-event basis.

SGT. YORK TROPHY

The 2010 season marks the fourth of competition for the Sergeant York Trophy, an award created by the Nashville Sports Council and the Ohio Valley Conference. The trophy is contested between the four OVC schools in the state of Tennessee - Austin Peay, Tennessee State, Tennessee Tech and UT Martin - and go to the team with the best combined record versus those schools in a given year.

In the event of a tie, the award will be shared; however, the previous winner will retain the trophy if they are part of the tie. If the tie is between two other institutions, the trophy will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy.

The award is only the second traveling trophy that involves more than two teams in college sports; the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy which has been contested between Air Force, Army and Navy annually since 1972. The award is named in honor of Alvin C. York, the most noted Soldier of World War I. Upon his return to the United States in 1919, he was bestowed the Congressional Medal of Honor. Following the war York returned his home in Pall Mall, Tenn. where he dedicated his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee.

The award will be presented annually at the Nashville Sports Council's O'Charley's Dinner of Champions (held in March of each year).

Tennessee State and Austin Peay shared the inaugural award after compiling 2-1 records in round robin play last year. Tennessee State took home the trophy, however, by winning the individual matchup with Austin Peay by one point in overtime. Tennessee State claimed the 2008 trophy after going 3-0 in Sgt. York games. Last season Tennessee Tech won all three of its Sgt. York games to claim the 2009 trophy.

GAME NOTES: Southeast Missouri State is playing its 10th-straight game of the season on Saturday and stepping outside of Conference play for the third time this year. The Redhawks opened the year with a close loss to FBS foe Ball State and then topped Southern Illinois on the road. This is the final non-conference game of the year for the team, until a possible trip to the FCS playoffs. It will be the seventh all-time meeting between the schools and first since the 2008 season opener when the Redhawks needed overtime to win 35-28. In that game Houston Lillard completed 27-of-39 passes for 387 yards and three touchdowns while Miles Edwards caught 10 passes for 204 yards and two scores. The combo hooked up for the game-winning score in overtime, a 23-yard touchdown strike before the Redhawks defense stopped SBU on fourth downs.

SCOUTING SOUTHWEST BAPTIST: Southwest Baptist enters this week's contest on a roll, having won seven-straight games after starting the season 0-2. The seven-straight wins is a school record for the Bearcats. The seventh win in a row came at home against Saint Joseph's College. Southwest Baptist jumped out to a 16-0 lead but needed a late game interception to preserve the 51-43 victory over the Pumas. It was the final home game of the season for the NCAA Division II Independent squad. In his final home game senior quarterback Steven Gachette threw for 360 yards and four touchdowns. Shaquille Shedd led the defensive unit with 15 tackles while the team as a whole had six sacks. With the win on Saturday head coach Keith Allen moved to second on SBU's all-time wins list.

SCOUTING SOUTHEAST MISSOURI: Since its season-opening loss at Ball State all Southeast Missouri, now ranked a program-best ninth nationally, has done this year is win, as the Redhawks won its eighth game in a row on Saturday, topping UT Martin 24-17. The eight-game winning streak is the longest for the program at the Division I level (since 1991) and the longest for the program since the 1955 season (when the team was 9-0 and MIAA Champions). After finishing 2-9 last year the team has already recorded the greatest turnaround in program history and among the top in FCS history (since 1978). The eight wins are the most for the program since the 2002 season (8-4 under Tim Billings), when the team finished the season ranked No. 24. If the team reaches nine wins, it'll tie the most in program history (equaling the mark set by the 1937 and 1955 squads). With just two games left this season (the team's open week is the final week of the season), the Redhawks have positioned themselves for the first playoff appearance in program history. In the win over UT Martin on Saturday, a record crowd of 11,126 attending the annual Homecoming game, marking the largest crowd in the history of Houck Stadium (breaking the mark of 11,100 against SIU in 2003). The Redhawks are averaging 9,049 fans per game this year compared to just 5,835 a season ago. On Saturday Joshua Jackson had seven tackles, a sack, forced a fumble and tipped a pass that led to an interception. That performance earned him OVC Defensive Player of the Week honors, the third different Redhawk player to win the award this season. Senior running back Henry Harris did see his 100-yard rushing streak end at seven games, but Harris still leads the nation in all-purpose yards (211.00) and is fourth in rushing (133.33).

GAME NOTES: Austin Peay and UT Martin meet for the 59th time on Saturday in what will be a key Sgt. York Trophy series game. The trophy, contested among the four OVC schools from the state of Tennessee, is currently in the possession of Tennessee Tech who finished 2-1 in Sgt. York games this season. If Austin Peay wins on Saturday they will finish at 2-1 and if UT Martin tops Tennessee State next week, there could be a three-way tie for the trophy. If UT Martin wins on Saturday, they will be 2-0 in Sgt. York games this season and with a win over TSU would finish 3-0 and win the trophy outright. UT Martin has held the advantage in the last two games and in six of the last seven overall. Last season the Skyhawks won 48-38 at home in the season finale for both teams. UTM led 24-0 early in the second quarter and 48-17 early in the fourth quarter before three-straight APSU touchdowns trimmed the final margin to 10. Miguel Barnes had 108 yards and two touchdowns on the ground for the Skyhawks while Cade Thompson passes for 378 yards and four scores. Austin Peay was led by Ryan White who had 58 yards and two scores. Josh Bey had 16 tackles to lead UTM.

SCOUTING UT MARTIN: After trailing 10-0 at No. 11 Southeast Missouri on Saturday, the Skyhawks came back and made the game close, falling 24-17. The defense held Southeast scoreless in both the first and third quarter and shutdown running back Henry Harris (the nation's No. 4 rusher), who saw his streak of seven-straight games with 100 or more rushing yards end after gaining just 71 yards. Josh Bey ended the game with a team-high 10 tackles, including two for loss. junior running back/return specialist AJ Williams netted a career-high 212 all-purpose yards and scored two touchdowns in the game. He rushed for 55 yards on seven carries and scored a touchdown, caught a pass for eight yards and returned a kickoff 91 yards for another touchdown. Junior punter Joe Hook was named OVC Specialist of the Week after averaging 45.8 yards/punt on five punts, including a long of 50 yards.

SCOUTING AUSTIN PEAY: Austin Peay lost its fifth game in a row at Eastern Illinois on Saturday, falling 28-10. With just three games remaining its assured the team of its third-straight losing season overall. The Governors did find a running game that had been lacking in recent games as Terrence Holt (132) and Ryan White (107) each rushed for over 100 yards, the second time this season the duo has rushed for 100 or more yards in the same game. It was the ninth 100-yard game of White's career, the most among active OVC players. It marked only the fifth time in 18 career games under head coach Rick Christophel that the team had lost after having at least one 100-yard rusher. Holt finished the game with 235 all-purpose yards and moved to ninth in the nation in that category (172.88/game). Holt did score the team's lone touchdown, the 25th of his four-year career at Austin Peay. Stephen Stansell also added a 35-yard field goal. Sophomore linebacker Darrick Dillard finished the game with a team-best 11 tackles (8 solo).

GAME NOTES: Tennessee Tech and Murray State will play for the 76th time on Saturday. The contest is the first home contest for the Racers since Oct. 9 when they scored 72 points in a victory over Missouri State for Homecoming. Since then the team has had an off week and split a pair of games. Tennessee Tech, who is coming off a bye week, is playing its second-straight road game and third in its last four games overall. Tennessee Tech leads the all-time series 41-33-1, including a 45-14 win in Cookeville a season ago. In that game, the season-ender for both teams, the score was tied 7-7 before Tech reeled off 38 consecutive points, including 17 points in the third quarter. Lee Sweeney passed for two touchdowns for Tech while the Golden Eagle rushing attack netted 288 yards, including 102 by Dontey Gay. Charlie Jordan rushed for 90 yards for Murray State and Casey Brockman passed for 122 yards and a score to Marcus Harris. In his last collegiate game, now NFL pro Austen Lane had 10 tackles and a fumble recovery for the Racers. The Golden Eagles have won four of the last five games overall in the series.

SCOUTING TENNESSEE TECH: After starting the season 1-3, the Golden Eagles reeled off three-straight wins prior to its open week. Coming off that bye Tech will close out the season with this week's road game and two home contests (against Eastern Kentucky and Jacksonville State). Right now the team finds itself in third place in the OVC standings with a 3-2 record. In its 21-10 win over Tennessee State two weeks ago, TTU used field position to win despite being out-gained 361-200 in total offense. Junior Nick Campbell was named OVC Co-Specialist of the Week after averaging 45.5 yards on six punts, including a long of 60 yards and a 58-yarder that was downed at the TSU 9-yard line. Overall four of Campbell's six punts were downed inside the TSU 20-yard line. After TSU led 10-7 with 1:03 to play in the first half, TTU marched down the field in seven plays and scored on a Tre Lamb to Zack Ziegler touchdown with five seconds to play before the half to lead for good. The final touchdown of the night game from Lamb to Tim Benford, the duo's second scoring strike of the game. Benford now has seven touchdowns this season (on only 25 total receptions), including five in his last four games.

SCOUTING MURRAY STATE: Murray State's potent offensive attack came up just short at Eastern Kentucky on Saturday, falling 28-21 when its last drive stalled in Colonel territory. It was just the team's second loss in its last five games after starting the season 0-3. Since taking over starting quarterback duties against Missouri State, Casey Brockman has led MSU to 131 points in just three games and the Racers now rank 14th nationally in scoring (33.0 points/game) after scoring just 47 total points the first three games of the season. Brockman ranks eighth nationally in completions/game (22.67) and 14th in points responsible for (14.00/game). Brockman completed 31-of-56 passes for 299 yards in the loss to ECU. Senior wide receiver Marcus Harris is first nationally in receptions (9.0/game) and fifth in receiving yards/game (109.33). After 12 catches against ECU, Harris now has 186 catches and is just 15 catches away from tying second place in the OVC career chart. If Harris averages nine catches a game over his final three games of the season he will end up with 213 catches for his career (the OVC career mark is 232). Junior Mike Harris scored two touchdowns against Eastern Kentucky and now ranks 45th nationally in points responsible for (10.0/game).

GAME NOTES: Eastern Illinois ended an eight-game losing streak on Saturday and will look to make that two in a row this week while Tennessee State, coming off a bye, is looking to end a three-game skid entering this week. The teams have played 13 times over the years with Eastern Illinois holding a 7-6 advantage in the all-time series. Tennessee State has won the last two games in the series including a 21-10 affair in Charleston a season ago. In that game the Tigers upset the No. 13-ranked Panthers in what was the last game under head coach James Webster. TSU picked off EIU starter Jake Christensen three times that day (two by Ty'Ron Johnson) as EIU managed just 149 passing and 96 rushing yards for the game. The Tigers' Calvin McNair had 135 yards passing and a touchdown and also rushed for 57 yards and a score.

SCOUTING EASTERN ILLINOIS: Eastern Illinois ended its losing streak with a convincing 28-10 win over Austin Peay on Saturday in the home finale for the Panthers. Trailing 3-0 after the first quarter, EIU exploded for three second quarter touchdowns to grab a 21-3 halftime advantage. After Mon Williams rushed for a 5-yard score, just his second score of the season, freshman Jimmy Garoppolo found Chris Wright for touchdown strikes of 52 and 39 yards. Garoppolo would later hit Keagan Robinson for a 5-yard touchdown to close the scoring. Garoppolo ended the day 12-of-22 for 219 yards and the three touchdowns, earning his second-straight OVC Newcomer of the Week honor. In his last two starts the true freshman is 38-of-57 for 560 yards and seven touchdowns against just one interception. EIU's defense stepped up by forcing four turnovers on the day, including three fumbles that ended Governors drives. Senior linebacker Nick Nasti (who is 14th nationally in tackles at 11.0/game) picked off a pass for the fourth turnover. Cory Leman and Gordy Kickels led the team with 11 and 10 tackles respectively.

SCOUTING TENNESSEE STATE: Fresh off its bye week, Tennessee State will look to win its first OVC game of the season. Currently the Tigers are the only team in the league without a Conference win. Two weeks ago TSU out-gained Tennessee Tech by a 361-200 margin but fell in defeat by a 21-10 margin thanks in part to a game of field position. TTU's punter put four of his six punts inside the Tennessee State 20-yard line, forcing the Tigers to take long drives. Quarterback Jeremy Perry was 20-of-31 for 203 yards and a touchdown to Calvin McNair. McNair had his biggest day as a wide receiver (after moving from quarterback), pulling in nine passes for 131 yards and that score, which went for 84 yards. Dante Thomas carried the ball 18 times for 75 yards to lead the TSU rushing attack. When the Tigers Preston Brown (who was near the top of the country in rushing) went out for the season with an injury, TSU was averaging 26.0 points per game; since his injury the team has scored just 27 points in three games. Brandon Bather had 11 tackles to lead TSU.

GAME NOTES: Since Jacksonville State joined the OVC in 2003, the Gamecocks have won 47 OVC games, the most in the league and one more than Eastern Kentucky (46). The teams have been nearly even in the all-time series, with Jax State winning four of the seven including 34-26 a year ago in Jacksonville. That game snapped a two-game winning streak for the Colonels in the series. In that game a year ago (the season finale for both squads), Jacksonville State's Ryan Perrilloux passed for 191 yards and a touchdown and rushed for 115 yards and two more scores. Calvin Middleton added 98 rushing yards and two touchdowns for the Gamecocks. EKU's T.J. Pryor threw for 252 yards and two scores in the losing effort.

SCOUTING JACKSONVILLE STATE: Jacksonville State is coming off a bye week after topping Austin Peay 56-3 two weeks ago in its annual Homecoming game. The Gamecocks racked up 539 yards of total offense and limited the Governors to just 157 yards. For the second-straight game Jacksonville State did not allow a touchdown, as they shutout TSU the week prior and held APSU to just a field goal. The quarterback duo of Marques Ivory and Coty Blanchard each threw two touchdown passes and Jamal Young rushed for 105 of JSU's 307 yards on the ground. Brannon Byrd was named OVC Defensive Player of the Week following that game, after posting seven tackles, two tackles-for-loss, and picking off a pass. The Gamecocks remain ranked No. 2 in both national FCS polls, the highest an OVC team has been ranked since the 1999 season and the highest Division I ranking in program history. The team's 12-game winning streak dating back to last season is currently the longest in FCS and second in all of Division I (behind only Boise State). Jacksonville State is currently one of three FCS teams undefeated on the season (Appalachian State and Bethune-Cookman being the others).

SCOUTING EASTERN KENTUCKY: Eastern Kentucky snapped a two-game losing streak on Saturday, topping in-state foe Murray State 28-21 in the 70th all-time meeting between the two schools. The win was the ninth in the last 10 games against the Racers for EKU. Eastern improved to 3-0 in home games this season but are 0-5 away from Roy Kidd Stadium this season. Sophomore quarterback T.J. Pryor was named OVC Offensive Player of the Week after accounting for three of EKU's four touchdowns. The biggest play of the game came on 4th and 1 with the score tied in the fourth quarter, as Pryor rushed 29 yards for what proved to be the game-winning score. Redshirt freshman defensive lineman Shawn Shupperd also had a big day, recording a career-high seven tackles, intercepting a pass (that led to an EKU score) and forcing a fumble deep in its own territory.
