THIS WEEK'S OVC HIGHLIGHTS/STORYLINES

With a non-conference win (40-14 over Southwest Baptist) and a loss by Jacksonville State, the Southeast Missouri State Redhawks clinched at least a share of its first OVC Championship since joining the league in 1991 and first conference title of any kind since sharing the Division II MIAA crown in 1987...Southeast can win the title outright with a victory over Jacksonville State this Saturday...That matchup will feature the No. 6 Gamecocks and No. 7 Redhawks, marking the first time since the 1995 season that two Top 10 OVC teams have squared off against each other...The Redhawks have won nine games in a row (tied for the longest streak in FCS football) and the nine overall wins this season ties the school record for wins in a season (also done in 1937 and 1955)...In the NCAA record book, Southeast's 7.5 game improvement over last year currently ranks as the 7th-biggest in FCS history (since 1978)...Jacksonville State saw its undefeated season, nation's longest winning streak of 12 games and the chance to be the No. 1 team in the country come to an end with a 49-37 loss at Eastern Kentucky...The loss was the first for JSU since falling 28-20 to Eastern Illinois on Oct. 24, 2009...Jacksonville State can grab a share of the OVC crown (and league's automatic bid into the FCS playoffs) with wins in its final two OVC games (Southeast Missouri on Saturday and at Tennessee Tech)...In knocking off Jacksonville State, Eastern Kentucky beat a Top 5 ranked team for the first time since the 1990 season (when the then No. 2-ranked Colonels beat No. 1-ranked Middle Tennessee 10-7)...In that game, EKU WR Tyrone Goard's second quarter touchdown catch was the No. 1 Play of the Day on *SportsCenter*...UT Martin clinched at least a share of the Sgt. York Trophy with a 28-12 win at Austin Peay on Saturday; the Skyhawks can win the title outright with a win over Tennessee State next week...Tennessee State lost to Eastern Illinois in overtime on Saturday while Murray State beat Tennessee Tech 44-13...With the win over TSU, Bob Spoo recorded his 67th Conference victory while at EIU, moving into fourth place on the OVC career list.

THIS WEEK'S OVC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

CO-OFFENSIVE

Chris Wright, WR • So., 6-1, 180 • Skokie, Ill. • Eastern Illinois

Wright proved to be the difference as Eastern Illinois overcame a 28-7 halftime deficit to win 31-28 in overtime at Tennessee State. The sophomore hauled in three second half touchdown receptions and finished the game with five catches for 217 yards. Wright caught a 15-yard touchdown pass in the third quarter and added touchdowns of 65 and 81 yards in the fourth quarter, the last coming with 6:46 to play as EIU tied the game at 28. The 217 yards was the third-highest single-game total in Panther history and he became just the fourth player in EIU history with 200 or more receiving yards in a game. It was the fourth-highest receiving yard output of the season by a player in the FCS. Over the past two weeks Wright has caught seven passes from freshman quarterback Jimmy Garoppolo for 308 yards and five touchdowns.

CO-OFFENSIVE

Orlandus Harris, WR • So., 6-0, 185 • Chattanooga, Tenn. • Eastern Kentucky

Harris caught four passes for 205 yards and two touchdowns as Eastern Kentucky topped No. 2 Jacksonville State 49-37 on Saturday night. Harris caught a 44-yard touchdown pass from T.J. Pryor in the second quarter to put his team on top for good (14-10), and added a 76-yarder three minutes later to give EKV a 21-10 advantage. Both touchdowns came on third and long plays. Harris became the first Eastern Kentucky wide receiver to have 200 or more receiving yards in seven seasons as the Colonels beat its first Top 5 opponent since the 1990 season (No. 1 Middle Tennessee). Harris ranks 23rd nationally in receiving yards/game (78.0).

DEFENSIVE

Tyson Patrick, LB • Jr., 6-1, 228 • Dayton, Ohio • Eastern Kentucky

Patrick had career-highs in both tackles (9, including 7 solo) and sacks (2.5) as Eastern Kentucky topped No. 2 Jacksonville State 49-37 on Saturday night, ending the longest winning streak in the FCS (12 games). Patrick also forced a key fumble in the third quarter that was returned 34 yards by teammate Robert Knowles to put EKV ahead by 18 points (35-17). The junior was part of a defensive unit that held the Gamecocks to a season-low 31 yards rushing on 28 attempts (1.1 yards/rush). The win was the first for the program over a top five opponent since the 1990 season (when EKV beat No. 1 Middle Tennessee).

SPECIALIST

Jeremy Caldwell, KR/DB • Jr., 5-10, 183 • Chattanooga, Tenn. • Eastern Kentucky

After No. 2 Jacksonville State had scored to cut the third quarter deficit to just 11 points (35-24), Caldwell took the ensuing kickoff and returned it 86 yards for a touchdown to put the Colonels on top 42-24. Eastern Kentucky would go on to win 49-37, upsetting the No. 2-ranked Gamecocks, the first win for the program over a Top 5 ranked team since 1990 (No. 1 Middle Tennessee). It was the second kickoff return for a touchdown of the season for Caldwell, who ranks first nationally in kickoff returns (33.54 yards/return). As a defensive back the junior added four tackles and picked off a pass (the second of the season for the Buck Buchanan Award candidate) with three minutes going that sealed the victory.

NEWCOMER

Mike Harris, RB • Jr., 5-11, 200 • Broken Arrow, Okla. • Murray State

Harris earned his third OVC Newcomer of the Week honor of the season after rushing for a career-high 242 yards and a touchdown in Murray State's 44-13 victory over Tennessee Tech. The junior transfer had 198 yards in the first half, including a 94-yard rush right before halftime that led to a Racer field goal (and 22-7 halftime advantage). Overall he averaged 10.5 yards/carry on his 23 attempts. His first quarter touchdown run that started the scoring marked the sixth-straight game in which he had rushed a touchdown. It was the second 200-yard rushing game of the season for Harris, making him only the second Murray State player to ever accomplish that feat. The 242 yards marked the seventh-best rushing game for a FCS player this season. Harris currently ranks 10th nationally in rushing (125.71 yards/game) and sixth nationally in scoring (9.43 points/game).

NOTES FROM AROUND THE GRIDIRON

Southeast Missouri Clinches At Least a Share of Its First OVC Championship: Southeast Missouri State has clinched at least a share of its first Ohio Valley Conference football championship since joining the Conference and the Division I ranks in 1991. The Redhawks are currently 7-0 in OVC play and finish the season at Jacksonville State (5-1) on Saturday. The Redhawks can win the title outright with a win over the Gamecocks or with a JSU loss to Tennessee Tech in the final week of the regular season (Nov. 20 -- Southeast has a bye that week). Southeast Missouri won 14 MIAA Conference championships as a member of that Division II conference, with the last (a co-championship) coming in 1987. If Southeast Missouri was to reach the playoffs this season, it would mark the first time in the program's history the team would have advanced to the playoffs (they did not appear in any Division II playoff fields, which began in 1973).

Southeast Missouri One of Just Four FCS Teams With 9 or More Wins (and 1 of Only 7 With Eight or More Division I Wins): Entering this week Southeast Missouri (9-1) is one of just four Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) teams with nine or more victories this season (the other teams are Bethune-Cookman, Dayton and Jacksonville). Overall Southeast Missouri and fellow OVC foe Jacksonville State are two of just seven FCS teams with eight or more victories against Division I competition. Southeast Missouri is also one of just four FCS teams without a loss to a fellow FCS team this season (the others are Bethune-Cookman, Grambling State and Wofford).

Southeast Missouri Turnaround One of Best in FCS History: After winning just two games last season, Southeast Missouri State has turned around its fortunes this season. The Redhawks were 2-9 overall and 1-7 in the OVC and entering this week are 9-1 overall and 7-0 in the OVC. Using the NCAA formula for biggest single-season turnaround in FCS history (add the difference in victories between the two seasons to the difference in losses then divide by two, ties not counted), the Redhawks 7.5-game improvement currently ranks tied for seventh best in FCS history (since 1978). The all-time best single-season improvement is 9.5 games by the 1984 Montana State squad (that went from 1-10 to 12-2).

More on Turnarounds: Looking at all-time OVC turnarounds (including years prior to the FCS being formed), the Southeast Missouri has equaled the biggest single-season turnaround as far as wins. After only two victories a season ago the Redhawks have nine wins this year, a +7 margin. That ties the all-time mark also held by the 1964 Austin Peay team (from 1-9 to 8-1-1) and the 1978 Western Kentucky team (from 1-8-1 to 8-2).

Two Top 10 Ranked OVC Foes to Square Off For First Time Since 1995: Last week marked the first time two OVC teams had been in the Top 10 together since the 1996 season (Oct. 7, 1996 when EIU was No. 7 and Murray State was No. 9). Both Jacksonville State (No. 6 Sports Network/Fathead.com & FCS Coaches polls) and Southeast Missouri (No. 7 Sports Network/Fathead.com and No. 8 FCS Coaches polls) remain in the Top 10 this week, bringing another milestone as those two teams will face off on Saturday in Jacksonville. It will mark the first time since Nov. 4, 1995 that two Top 10 OVC teams have squared off against each other. The last time it happened No. 8 Murray State topped No. 5 Eastern Kentucky 17-7, ending ECU's 26-game OVC winning streak. Jacksonville State had climbed to as high as No. 2 in the FCS polls (the highest ranking in school history), which was the highest an OVC team had been ranked since Tennessee State was No. 1 in the final poll of the 1999 regular season, before losing to Eastern Kentucky on Nov. 6. Despite the loss JSU remains ranked for the 27th-straight week (its longest stretch since joining the Division I ranks). Southeast Missouri moved to No. 7 this week, which marks its highest-ranking in school history. Southeast entered the Top 25 (at No. 25) on Oct. 4 and have steadily moved up.

The OVC Rushing Attack: OVC running backs have had some dominant performances in 2010 including the No. 1 single-game rushing performance in FCS football this season and three of the top 10 outputs overall. The OVC is the only FCS conference with three individuals in the Top 10 single-game rushing outputs on the season. Southeast Missouri State's **Henry Harris**, who ranks second overall in rushing (149.3 yards/game) has the top spot, with a 293-yard outing against Southwest Baptist on Nov. 6. Murray State's **Mike Harris**, who is 10th nationally in rushing (125.71 yards/game) has the seventh-best single-game output this year, rushing for 242 yards against Tennessee Tech on Nov. 6. Tennessee State's **Preston Brown**, who was leading FCS in rushing when he suffered a season-ending injury, has the ninth-best single-season game this year, a 233-yard effort against Florida A&M.

Jax State Sees Longest Overall and Longest Road Winning Streak in FCS Come to an End: With a loss to Eastern Kentucky on Nov. 6 Jacksonville State saw the nation's longest winning streak (12 games) among Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) teams come to an end. Jacksonville State had not lost since falling 28-20 at No. 24 Eastern Illinois on Oct. 24, 2009. The Gamecocks also a FCS-best nine-game road winning streak come to an end; it was the first road loss for the Gamecocks since losing at FBS opponent Florida State on Sept. 12, 2009. It was also the team's first loss to an FCS opponent since falling to UT Martin (31-30) on Oct. 23, 2008.

Southeast Missouri Now With Longest FCS Winning Streak: After Jacksonville State lost on Saturday, the longest winning streak (9 games) in the Football Championship Subdivision is now shared by Southeast Missouri State and Bethune-Cookman. The Redhawks have not lost since falling at FBS foe Ball State on Sept. 2.

OVC Winning Streaks: Jacksonville State had a 12-game overall win streak stretching from Oct. 24, 2009 to Nov. 6, 2010 come to an end this season. That 12-game winning streak was one of 19

Spoos Now Tied for Fourth All-Time in OVC Win: With a victory over Tennessee State on Nov. 6, Eastern Illinois head coach **Bob Spoo** moved into a tie for fourth place on the OVC all-time career Conference victory list. Spoo has now won 67 OVC games in his tenure at EIU, which has spanned the school's entire time in the OVC (1996 through the present, although he was not on the sidelines for the 2006 season). Spoo trails only Roy Kidd (207 OVC wins at EKU), Boots Donnelly (102 wins at Austin Peay and Middle Tennessee) and Charles Murphy (73 wins at Middle Tennessee) on the all-time list and he is currently tied with Jimmy Feix (67 wins at Western Kentucky).

NCAA Stats Leaders: In the latest set of NCAA rushing leaders, Southeast Missouri State senior running back **Henry Harris** remains first nationally in all-purpose yards (219.20/game), second in rushing (149.30/game) and fifth in scoring (10.20 points/game). Murray State running back **Mike Harris** is 10th in rushing (125.71 yards/game) and sixth in scoring (9.43 points/game). Austin Peay's **Terrence Holt**, who led the nation in all-purpose yards last season, is back in the top 10 in that category this year, ranking ninth (174.67). Murray State's **Marcus Harris** is second in receptions (8.86/game) and fourth in receiving yards/game (111.71). Murray State quarterback **Casey Brockman** ranks ninth in completions/game (21.86). The OVC dominates all returns as Murray State's **Dontrell Johnson** is first nationally in punt return yards (28.45/return) while Eastern Kentucky's **Jeremy Caldwell** is first nationally in kick returns (33.54/return). Eastern Kentucky punter **Jordan Berry** is sixth in punting (43.10) while Eastern Illinois' **Kevin Cook** is seventh (43.02). Tennessee Tech's **Marcus Edwards** is seventh in sacks (0.94/game), while Jacksonville State's **Rodney Garrott** is eighth in forced fumbles (0.33/game). Team-wise Southeast Missouri is first nationally in least interceptions thrown (1), first in most passes intercepted (18), second in third down conversion percentage (50.0%), second in fewest penalties (4.10/game), second in least yards penalized per game (30.60), second in sacks allowed (0.50/game), second in rushing offense (278.60 yards/game), fourth in turnover margin (+1.30/game), seventh in fourth down conversion percentage (73.33%), eighth in time of possession (33:12), eighth in pass efficiency defense (99.56) and ninth in turnovers gained (24). Jacksonville State ranks seventh in scoring offense (35.44 points/game), seventh in red zone offense (90%) and ninth in passing efficiency (149.22). Murray State is first nationally in punt returns (23.21 yards/return), fifth nationally in passing yards (294.67/game) and second nationally in tackles for loss (9.00/game). Eastern Kentucky is second in net punting (39.54), fourth in sacks (3.33/game), fifth in tackles for loss (8.33/game) ninth in kickoff returns (24.29 yards/return) and 10th in fourth down conversion percentage (68.75%). Eastern Illinois is second in fumbles recovered (16).

Sgt. York Trophy to Be Decided on Saturday: The 2010 season marks the fourth season for the Sgt. York Trophy, a challenge trophy which goes to the annual winner of the quadrangular season series between the four OVC institutions in the state of Tennessee (Austin Peay, Tennessee State

and Tennessee Tech and UT Martin). In July 2007, the Nashville Sports Council and the Ohio Valley Conference announced the creation of the trophy, which is only the second traveling trophy involving more than two schools nationwide (the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy). It is named after Sgt. Alvin C. York, a native of Pall Mall, Tenn. and a Soldier who was one of the most honored of World War I. He received the Congressional Medal of Honor after the war and returned to his home state to dedicate his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee. The trophy goes to the team with the best record against the other schools, and in case of a tie there will be co-champions and the actual trophy will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy. In 2007 Tennessee State and Austin Peay finished in a tie for the trophy with identical 2-1 records; both shared the award but Tennessee State went home with the hardware due to a 1-point win in the head-to-head meeting during the season. Tennessee State went 3-0 in Sgt. York play in 2008 to claim its second trophy. Last year Tennessee Tech claimed the trophy after going undefeated in Sgt. York games. If UT Martin beats Tennessee State this weekend they will be 3-0 in Sgt. York games this year and win the title outright. If UT Martin loses, they will share the title with Tennessee Tech (2-1), although TTU will retain the trophy per the rules since they held it last season.

Three OVC Players Named to CoSIDA/ESPN Academic All-District Team: Three OVC football student-athletes have been named to the ESPN Academic All-District teams as voted on by the members of CoSIDA. The selections included one student-athlete out of District IV and two student-athletes out of District VII. The selections were Eastern Kentucky's **Emory Attig** and Southeast Missouri State's **Matt Scheible** and **J.J. Sanchez**. For making the first-team each of the three players will have his name appear on the national ballot for consideration for Academic All-American later this month. The ESPN Academic All-America football team will be announced on Tuesday, Nov. 23.

Large Crowds: OVC teams have played in front of some big crowds this season, especially when playing against a Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponent (including 99,123 who saw UT Martin play at Tennessee in what was the second-biggest crowd to ever see an OVC team play). In games involving just FCS teams this season, Tennessee State has played in front of the second and third largest crowds, including 54,202 at the Georgia Dome against Florida A&M (Sept. 25) and 44,688 at the Liberty Bowl against Jackson State (Sept. 11). Jacksonville State is currently averaging 17,981 fans at its four home games this year, ranking the Gamecocks eighth among all FCS teams. In its most recent game, Southeast Missouri drew 11,126 fans for its Homecoming game (a win over UT Martin), the largest home crowd in the history of the program.

APSU's Holt Among All-Time Best in FCS in Kickoff Returns: Austin Peay senior **Terrence Holt** is among the best all-time at the FCS level in kickoff returns. Holt broke the FCS all-time kickoff return yardage record in 2009 and currently has 4,445 yards. He is the only player in FCS history to have three 1,000+ yard kickoff return seasons and is looking to make that four-straight this year (he is currently 138 yards away from reaching that milestone). Holt also holds the FCS career record for total kick return yardage (kickoffs and punt returns) with 4,983 yards. In 2008 Holt broke the NCAA record for kickoff returns in a season (52) and total kick returns (kickoffs plus punts) with 66.

TSU's Clifford Joins ECU's Caldwell on Buck Buchanan Watch List: Tennessee State safety **Eugene Clifford** has been added to the Buck Buchanan Award watch list. The award, which is presented by The Sports Network and sponsored by Fathead.com, is handed out annually to the nation's top FCS defensive player. Also on 20-person list is Eastern Kentucky cornerback **Jeremy Caldwell** who was one of preseason selections to the team. The Buchanan Award watch list will undergo one final revision before the end of the season. Ballots will be sent to a panel of approximately 200 sports information and media relations directors, broadcasters, writers and other dignitaries following the conclusion of the regular season on Nov. 22. The Buchanan Award will be presented to the FCS national defensive player of the year on Thursday, Jan. 6 in Frisco, Texas - the night before the national championship game. The Buck Buchanan award is named for Junious "Buck" Buchanan, the NAIA All-American and Pro Football Hall of Fame defensive lineman who played for Grambling State University from 1959 through 1962. As a freshman, Buchanan came to Grambling on an "if" scholarship, to receive financial help if he played well. After a season of playing both varsity basketball and football, Buchanan decided to concentrate solely on football. By the time he finished four years at Grambling, his coach, Eddie Robinson, asserted that Buchanan was "... the finest tackle I have ever seen." The Buck Buchanan Award has been handed out annually since 1995. Some of the past winners include Minnesota Vikings' Jared Allen (Idaho State - 2003), Jacksonville Jaguars' Rashean Mathis (Bethune-Cookman - 2002) and Dexter Coakley (Appalachian State - 1995, 1996), who played 10 seasons with the Dallas Cowboys and St. Louis Rams.

Brockman Sets OVC Passing Records, Harris Sets Receiving Touchdowns Mark in Win over Missouri State: Murray State sophomore quarterback **Casey Brockman** put his name in the OVC record book in the Racers 72-59 win over Missouri State on Oct. 9. Brockman threw for 570 yards, which broke the OVC record of 553 yards set by Murray State's Justin Fuente in the 1999 season (against Southern Illinois). The sophomore also passed for seven touchdowns, which tied the OVC mark of seven also held by Morehead State's Chris Swartz (1990, set against Murray State). At the time of the game, the 570 yards passing was (and still is) the most in any NCAA classification (FBS, FCS, Division II, Division III) in 2010. Five of Brockman's touchdowns were to senior wide receiver **Marcus Harris**, who set the OVC record in that category. Harris' five scores broke the record of four touchdowns previously held by four individuals (most recently Murray State's Terrence Tillman against UT Martin in 1999). The 30 points scored by Harris was the most by any FCS player in 2010. During the game the two teams combined to set FCS records for total yards (1,423) and extra point kicked (17).

Murray State Makes FCS History With 500-Yard Passer, 200-Yard Receiver and 200-Yard Rusher in the Same Game: In its win over Missouri State on Oct. 9, Murray State made Football

Championship Subdivision (FCS) history by having a 500-yard passer (570, **Casey Brockman**), a 200-yard receiver (213, **Marcus Harris**) and a 200-yard rusher (212, **Mike Harris**) in the same game. It marked the first time in NCAA history that had occurred in the same game.

TSU's Brown Out for the Season: Tennessee State's **Preston Brown**, who ranked third nationally in rushing after five games (152.0 yards/game), injured his knee (ACL) against N.C. A&T on Oct. 2 and will miss the rest of the 2010 season.

Jacksonville State Tops Ole Miss, Ends 50-Game OVC Losing Streak to FBS Schools: Jacksonville State's 49-48 double overtime victory over Ole Miss on Sept. 4 helped the OVC end a 50-game losing streak to Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponents that extended back to the 2004 season when Eastern Illinois beat Eastern Michigan 31-28. Jacksonville State nearly ended the streak a season ago, losing in the final minute at Florida State. It was the program's first win over a FBS team since a 31-28 victory at Arkansas State in 2001 (prior to joining the OVC). All-time the OVC is 18-138-1 against FBS schools.

More FCS Over FBS: Jacksonville State's win over Ole Miss was the first for an FCS team over an FBS team this season (North Dakota State beat Kansas later on Sept. 4 to mark the second win for FCS teams). It marked the 19th time since 2004 that an FCS squad had bested an FBS school (20th including NDSU). In week two of the season, four more FCS teams topped FBS squads.

OVC Finally Tops the SEC: Jacksonville State's victory over Ole Miss also marked the first time since the OVC was formed in 1948 that an OVC team had topped a squad from the Southeastern Conference. Prior to Jax State's victory, the OVC had been 0-22 against SEC teams since the league was formed. Prior to the OVC being formed Southeast Missouri State had topped Ole Miss in 1907 and Tennessee Tech had tied Vanderbilt in 1939 in the only game with positive outcomes for current OVC teams.

Gamecock Play Chosen as Capital One Cup Impact Performance for Week 1: Jacksonville State's 30-yard touchdown on fourth down in overtime and ensuing two-point conversion pass (both by freshman Coty Blanchard) in a win at Ole Miss was chosen as the Capital One Cup Impact Performance of the Week in a vote at ESPN.com. The two plays received 78 percent of the national fan vote.

Five OVC Players Honored by College Football Performance Awards for Week No. 10 of the Season: Five OVC players were honored by the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) on Nov. 7 for their performances in week No. 10. Eastern Illinois' Chris Wright and Eastern Kentucky's Orlando Harris shared FCS Wide Receiver Performer of the Week honors, Austin Peay's Terrence Holt and Eastern Kentucky's Jeremy Caldwell shared FCS Kick Returner Performer of the Week honors and UT Martin's CJ Estelle was tabbed the FCS Punt Returner Performer of the Week.

Williams Earns Honor From College Football Performance Awards for Week No. 9 of the Season: UT Martin return specialist **AJ Williams** was honored by the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) on Oct. 31 for his performance in week No. 9. He was named the FCS Punt Return Performer of the Week.

Cox Earns Honor From College Football Performance Awards for Week No. 8 of the Season: UT Martin defensive end **Tim Cox** was honored by the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) on Oct. 24 for his performance in week No. 8. He was named the FCS Defensive Lineman Performer of the Week.

Tennessee Tech's Mitchell and Edwards Named Co-National Players of the Week by Sports Network (Oct. 18): The Tennessee Tech defensive duo of sophomore defensive back **Caleb Mitchell** and sophomore linebacker **Marcus Edwards** were named National Defensive Players of the Week by the Sports Network/Fathead.com on Oct. 18. The duo combined for 14 tackles, 5.5 sacks and two interceptions as Tennessee Tech topped Eastern Illinois 34-20. Mitchell forced three turnovers by himself, forcing a fumble and picking off two EIU passes. Early in the second quarter Mitchell picked off a pass and went 36 yards for a touchdown to get the Golden Eagles on the board. His second interception came in the end zone, ending a drive where Eastern Illinois was looking to cut the margin to one score. Mitchell also had seven tackles (six solo) and a sack. Edwards ended up with 4.5 sacks for 31 yards worth of lost yards as TTU held EIU to just 39 net rushing yards. The sophomore added seven tackles (four solo). The 4.5 sacks were part of eight by the Golden Eagle team which tied the school record.

EKU's Berry Named National Freshman of the Week by Sports Network (Oct. 18): Eastern Kentucky punter **Jordan Berry** was named National Freshman of the Week by Sports Network/Fathead.com on Oct. 18. Berry averaged 52.3 yards on six punts in Eastern Kentucky's loss at UT Martin on Saturday. Berry put four of those punts inside the Skyhawk 20-yard line and had a 75-yard punt, which was just three yards short of the EKU all-time record. The punt rolled to the UTM 3-yard line in the third quarter. Berry also showed off his running skills by rushing for a first down on a 4th and 11 play in the third quarter.

Four OVC Players Earn Honors From College Football Performance Awards for Week No. 7 of the Season: Four OVC players were honored by the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) on Oct. 17 for their performances in week No. 7. Eastern Illinois specialist **Rashad Haynes** was named FCS Punt Returner Performer of the Week, Eastern Kentucky's **Jordan Berry** was named FCS Punter Performer of the Week, Southeast Missouri's **Drew Geldbach** was named FCS Place Kicker Performer of the Week and UT Martin's **Josh Bey** was named FCS Linebacker Performer of the Week.

Brockman Named National Player of the Week by Sports Network and College Sporting News (Oct. 11): Murray State sophomore quarterback Casey Brockman was named National Player of the Week by each the Sports Network/Fathead.com and College Sporting News on Oct. 11 after a record-breaking performance against Missouri State. Brockman put his name in both the OVC and Murray State record books as he completed 32-of-41 passes for 570 yards and seven touchdowns and rushed for another score in the 72-59 Homecoming victory. The 570 passing yards was both an OVC and Murray State record while the seven passing scores established the Racer mark and tied the all-time OVC mark (also held by Morehead State's Chris Swartz). The passing yards were the most by a NCAA player this season at any classification (FBS, FCS, Division II, Division III) and the touchdowns tied the most in any NCAA division this year. The sophomore passed for 238 yards and five touchdowns in the second half alone as Murray State overcame a 52-38 deficit with 2:22 to play in the third quarter.

Two OVC Players Earn Honors From College Football Performance Awards for Week No. 6 of the Season: Two OVC players were honored by the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) on Oct. 11 for their performances in week No. 6. Murray State quarterback **Casey Brockman** was named FCS National Player of the Week and FCS Quarterback Performer of the Week while his teammate **Marcus Harris** was named FCS Wide Receiver Performer of the Week.

Southeast's Borum and EIU's Cook Named National Players of the Week (Oct. 4): Southeast Missouri State linebacker **Darrick Borum** was named National Defensive Player of the Week by College Sporting News while Eastern Illinois punter Kevin Cook was named National Specialist of the Week by Sports Network/Fathead.com on Oct. 4. Borum had a career-high 10 tackles, two sacks, three tackles-for-loss, a fumble recovery, interception and pass break-up in Southeast Missouri's 28-13 road win over Eastern Illinois. His interception ended EIU's first drive of the day and led to seven points for Southeast who took an early lead. Borum was part of a Redhawk defense that forced a season-high five turnovers against the Panthers. Cook averaged 50.2 yards on four punts in the same game against Southeast Missouri. On Cook's first attempt of the day he sailed a punt 86 yards from his own end zone to pin the Redhawks at their own five-yard line. The 86-yard punt was the longest in EIU's NCAA Division I history and seven yards away from the longest punt in NCAA FCS history. For the day Cook would see three of his four punts downed inside the 20-yard line with the fourth nearly downed at the one-yard line before being knocked into the end zone for a touchback.

Tennessee State's Brown, Murray State's Johnson Named National Players of the Week (Sept. 27): For their performances in week No. 4, Tennessee State running back **Preston Brown** and Murray State return specialist **Dontrell Johnson** earned National Player of the Week honors. Brown was named a National All-Star by College Sporting News after rushing for 233 yards and a touchdown in TSU's 29-18 win over Florida A&M at the Atlanta Football Classic. On the second play of the game Brown took a handoff and raced for a 71-yard touchdown. The game was his second 200-plus yard effort in three weeks. Johnson was named National Specialist of the Week by the Sports Network/Fathead.com after returning a punt 91 yards for a touchdown in the Racers 52-16 victory over UT Martin. Johnson had 148 total punt return yards in what was only his second game ever returning punts. Johnson also earned the FCS Punt Return Performer of the Week award from the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA).

Tennessee State's **Preston Brown** was named the FCS Running Back Performer of the Week, Southeast Missouri State kicker **Drew Geldbach** was named FCS Placekicker Performer of the Week and Austin Peay safety **Jeremy Ross** was named FCS Defensive Back Co-Performer of the Week.

Ivory and Blanchard Share National All-Star Honors From College Sporting News (Sept. 6): The Jacksonville State quarterback tandem of **Marques Ivory** and **Coty Blanchard** earned National All-Star (Player of the Week) honors from the College Sporting News on Sept. 6 for their parts in the Gamecocks double overtime win at Ole Miss. The duo shared the Offensive Award with Appalachian State quarterback DeAndre Presley. The starter Ivory was 13-for-23 for 126 and two touchdowns while true freshman Blanchard was 9-for-13 for 126 yards and two touchdowns. The duo led the Gamecocks to five straight touchdowns to end the game, as JSU trailed 31-13 entering the fourth quarter. Blanchard had a four-yard touchdown with 6:17 left to cut the lead to 31-26 and Ivory had a 19-yard score to Alan Bonner with 18 seconds left to make the score 34-32. Ivory then completed a 2-point conversion pass to La'Ray Williams to force overtime. Each quarterback scored a touchdown in overtime, as Ivory connected for a 7-yard score in the first overtime, and Blanchard completed a 30-yard pass on 4th and 15 in the second overtime. Blanchard then completed a two-point conversion pass to Calvin Middleton to win the game (and earn No. 2 play of the day honors on SportsCenter. The Gamecocks duo did not throw an interception in the game.

by the National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame (NFF). The award honors the best and brightest from the college gridiron and is often called the "Academic Heisman." Overall there are 121 semifinalists for the award but Williams and O'Connor are two of only 28 selected from the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS). Williams owns a 3.565 grade-point average as a business finance major with a minor in real estate. The Clarksville native also is a re-founding father of Alpha Tau Omega and is a member of the Omicron Delta Kappa National Leadership and Phi Kappa Phi National Honor Societies. O'Connor is an art teacher education major currently has a 3.84 GPA and is expecting to graduate this May. Nominated by their schools, which are limited to one nominee each, semifinalists must be a senior or graduate student in their final year of eligibility, have a GPA of at least 3.2 on a 4.0 scale, have outstanding football ability as a first team player or significant contributor, and have demonstrated strong leadership and citizenship. The trophy was renamed last fall in honor of Bill Campbell, the chairman of Intuit, former player and head coach at Columbia University and the 2004 recipient of the NFF's Gold Medal.

Tennessee Tech Game With Lane College Called in Second Quarter: On Sept. 16 Tennessee Tech led Lane College 43-0 with 5:01 to play in the second quarter when lightning and heavy rains forced play to be suspended. After a long delay the game was unable to be continued. One of the conditions of Rule 3-3-3-c of the NCAA rulebook allows the teams to "terminate the game with a determined final score" if both the directions of athletics at the participating institutions in consultation with the coaches agree. Both teams agreed the game would end with TTU winning 43-0 and improving its record to 1-2 on the season. However, under NCAA statistics guidelines the game did not reach a "reasonable point of conclusion" (deemed three quarters for a football game) due to the weather conditions. So the statistics from the game will not count in the NCAA national statistical leaders or the OVC leaders. It was determined, however, that the Golden Eagle players would be able to count the stats in their individual career totals.

Tennessee Tech Starts Season With Back-to-Back Top 25 FBS Opponents: Tennessee Tech had the tough task of being one of just four Division I teams (FBS or FCS) to start the 2010 season with two nationally-ranked Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponents. The Golden Eagles lost at No. 17 Arkansas in week one and at No. 4 TCU in week two. The other three teams to start the season against two nationally-ranked FBS teams were Marshall (Ohio State and West Virginia), San Jose State (Alabama and Wisconsin) and UNLV (Wisconsin and Utah).

League Announces "OVC Game of the Week" Television Package With Wazoo Sports: In July 2010 the Ohio Valley Conference announced its a partnership with Wazoo Sports to produce and distribute an "OVC Game of the Week" football package for 2010. The 10-game package will begin with Austin Peay at Tennessee State and feature a different game every week through the end of the regular season (Nov. 20). Seven of the 10 games will have a 6 p.m. CT kickoff. Each of the nine OVC football schools will appear on the broadcast at least twice during the season. For a full schedule and affiliate information check out links at OVCsports.com. The games will also appear online through ESPN3.com and OVCsports.TV Wazoo Sports, Inc. is a Regional Sports Network that delivers coverage of NCAA, NAIA high school, and youth sports live and on-demand on television and over the Internet. Wazoo Sports has produced over 360 LIVE games and is currently in over 650,000 households in Kentucky. Wazoo Sports is headquartered in London, Ky.

A Look at the Coaches: There are two new coaches and seven returnees among the head coaching ranks in the Ohio Valley Conference this season. **Chris Hatcher** takes over at Murray State after tenures at Valdosta State and Georgia Southern and **Rod Reed** is now in charge at Tennessee State (his alma mater) after serving on the staff as an assistant and defensive coordinator. The Dean of OVC Coaches is Eastern Illinois coach **Bob Spoo** who is in his 24th season with the Panthers in 2010. Spoo has 88 total wins while EIU has been a member of the OVC, a mark that ranks fifth in OVC history. Spoo also has 65 Conference victories, which is also fifth all-time. He is just two OVC wins away from passing WKU's Jimmy Feix (67 OVC wins) and moving into fourth place on the all-time list.

FCS Playoff Expansion: For the first time in 2010 the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) playoff field will include 20 teams, up from 16 a year ago. In April 2008 the NCAA Board of Directors approved the expansion. It marks the first expansion since the field grew from 12 to 16 teams in 1997. The field will be comprised of 10 automatic bids (up from 8) and 10 at-large berths. This season there will be four first round matchups (8 total teams), while 12 teams will receive a bye into the second round. For the first time in 2010, the championship game will be played in Frisco, Texas at Pizza Hut Park, a 23,500-seat multi-purpose stadium. The Southland Conference will serve as the host of the championship, which will be held on Friday, Jan. 7.

Preseason Forecasts: For the second-straight season five different schools received at least one first-place vote in the preseason predicted order of finish balloting. Jacksonville State received the most (11 of 18) while Eastern Illinois (4), Eastern Kentucky (1), Tennessee Tech (1) and Tennessee State (1) were also in the mix. JSU was picked first for the third time in the past six seasons. Is being picked first in the preseason poll necessarily a good thing? In the past 31 years of preseason polls (all that were available), the preseason predicted champion has only gone on to win the OVC Championship 12 times (38.7%). Over the past seven years not once has the eventual champion been predicted in the preseason poll (it was last done correctly in 2002).

Holt and Bey Headline Preseason All-OVC Team: Austin Peay senior running back/kick returner **Terrence Holt** and UT Martin senior linebacker **Josh Bey** have been tabbed the 2010 Ohio Valley Conference Preseason Offensive and Defensive Players of the Year in a vote on by the league's head football coaches and sports information directors. Eastern Illinois, Jacksonville State and Tennessee Tech each had four selections apiece on the preseason team to lead the league. Eastern Kentucky had the next-most selections with three. Each of the league's nine teams had at least one player on the preseason squad. Returning players who were first-team All-OVC picks last season (12 in total) were automatic selections to the preseason team this year. The squad also included seven players who were second-team selections in 2009. Of the 25 total selections, 13 were seniors, 11 were juniors and there was one sophomore pick.

Let's Get It Started: The 63rd season of Ohio Valley Conference football will get underway on Thursday, Sept. 2 when four OVC squads take to the gridiron; the remaining five schools will play on Saturday, Sept. 4. The OVC is made up of nine football-playing schools in 2010. Since its beginning, 14 of the 18 total schools that have played football in the league have claimed at least one championship.

I-AA No More: Although some people may accidentally still refer to it as I-AA football, the term that represents the level of Division I football in which the Ohio Valley Conference competes has been retired. Beginning with the 2006 National Championship game, the term Football Championship Subdivision (or FCS) is to be used. FCS is the only Division I football rank to host a NCAA-sponsored national championship (one of 88 championships the NCAA sponsors). The division formerly known as I-A was changed to Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and those teams compete for the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) national championship. Teams who play at the FCS level can offer a maximum of 63 scholarships (FBS teams can offer 85) and compete in a 16-team playoff at the end of the season to determine the national champion.

NFL Connections: As of October 1, 19 former Ohio Valley Conference players are on NFL rosters for the 2010 season (13 active players, 6 practice squad members). Those players include former Eastern Illinois standout Tony Romo, a three-time Pro Bowl pick, Cortland Finnegan (Samford), who has been a Pro Bowl defensive back selection with the Tennessee Titans and Tennessee State's Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie, who was a starter for the Arizona Cardinals in Super Bowl XLIII and was a Pro Bowl selection last season. There are five players on NFL rosters who played in the OVC last season including Eastern Illinois offensive linemen Chris Campbell (Green Bay Packers - practice squad) and Otis Hudson (Cincinnati Bengals - practice squad), Murray State defensive lineman Austen Lane (Jacksonville Jaguars) and wide receiver Derrick Townsel (Houston Texans - practice squad) and Tennessee State defensive back Anthony Levine (Green Bay Packers). Six of the nine current OVC football schools have at least one player in the NFL with Tennessee State leading the way with four active players (and one practice squad member). Several NFL coaches also have connections to OVC schools, including three who went to Eastern Illinois, the "Cradle of NFL Head Coaches." Those coaches include Brad Childress (Minnesota), Super Bowl champion Sean Payton (New Orleans) and Mike Shanahan (Washington). UT Martin graduate and former assistant coach Jerry Reese made waves in 2007 when he led the New York Giants to Super Bowl XLII in his first season as General Manager with the franchise.

OVCsports.TV: For the fifth consecutive year, fans can watch every Conference matchup and all non-conference home contests at OVCsports.TV. The venture with NeuLion (formerly JumpTV Sports) allows fans to access live and on-demand streaming video and audio of all conference matchups on their home computer. The premium Web site was launched in July 2006 and streamed over a thousand events in its first four seasons, including all Conference matchups in football and men's and women's basketball as well as select baseball, soccer, softball and volleyball games and OVC Championship events. Packages are available on a yearly, seasonally, monthly or per-event basis.

SGT. YORK TROPHY

The 2010 season marks the fourth of competition for the Sergeant York Trophy, an award created by the Nashville Sports Council and the Ohio Valley Conference. The trophy is contested between the four OVC schools in the state of Tennessee - Austin Peay, Tennessee State, Tennessee Tech and UT Martin - and go to the team with the best combined record versus those schools in a given year.

In the event of a tie, the award will be shared; however, the previous winner will retain the trophy if they are part of the tie. If the tie is between two other institutions, the trophy will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy.

The award is only the second traveling trophy that involves more than two teams in college sports; the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy which has been contested between Air Force, Army and Navy annually since 1972. The award is named in honor of Alvin C. York, the most noted Soldier of World War I. Upon his return to the United States in 1919, he was bestowed the Congressional Medal of Honor. Following the war York returned his home in Pall Mall, Tenn. where he dedicated his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee.

The award will be presented annually at the Nashville Sports Council's O'Charley's Dinner of Champions (held in March of each year).

Tennessee State and Austin Peay shared the inaugural award after compiling 2-1 records in round robin play last year. Tennessee State took home the trophy, however, by winning the individual matchup with Austin Peay by one point in overtime. Tennessee State claimed the 2008 trophy after going 3-0 in Sgt. York games. Last season Tennessee Tech won all three of its Sgt. York games to claim the 2009 trophy.

GAME NOTES: Murray State travels to Austin Peay on Saturday for the 44th meeting between the two rivals. Murray State has won the last two games in the series and nine of the last 10 meetings overall. A year ago Austin Peay got off to an early 10-0 lead before Murray State stormed back to score 27 unanswered points before APSU's Terrence Holt ended the scoring with a 99-yard kickoff return. Holt finished the game with 241 all-purpose yards, including 77 rushing yards (and a touchdown), 26 receiving yards, 120 kickoff return yards and 18 punt return yards. APSU quarterback Jake Ryan completed 14-of-25 passes for 192 yards while Casey Brockman completed 18-of-33 passes for 216 yards and a score for Murray State.

SCOUTING MURRAY STATE: Murray State won for the third time in its last four games on Saturday, topping Tennessee Tech 44-13 at home. The Racers broke open a nine-point game in the third quarter by scoring 24 unanswered points to close out the game. Junior running back Mike Harris was huge, rushing for 242 yards (the seventh-highest total in FCS football this season) and a touchdown in the win. Harris scored a touchdown for the sixth-straight game and had 198 of his 242 yards in the first half, including a 94-yard run that setup a field goal right before halftime. Harris currently ranks 10th nationally in rushing (125.71 yards/game). Quarterback Casey Brockman passed for 202 yards and two touchdowns and Marcus Harris hauled in eight passes for 126 yards and a score. Harris now has 194 career receptions, which is tied for fourth all-time and just one catch out of third place. Harris currently has 62 catches on the season, just eight receptions out of the OVC single-season Top 10 list. Junior cornerback Dontrell Johnson had 10 tackles (7 solo), three pass breakups and two blocked kicks (extra point and field goal). Junior kicker Kienan Cullen was 4-of-4 on field goal attempts, hitting from 37, 20, 21 and 40 yards. He became the first Racer since Shane Andrus in 2002 to connect on four field goals in a game. The game ended when walk-on Jesurun Kelly got into the game for the first time in his career and on his first play intercepted a pass which he returned 77 yards for a touchdown.

SCOUTING AUSTIN PEAY: Austin Peay lost its sixth-straight game on Saturday, dropping a home contest to UT Martin 28-12. In the second quarter Terrence Holt returned a kickoff 95 yards for a touchdown, the fourth time in his career he had returned a kick for a score. That touchdown came after Jake Ryan hooked up with Robert Lemon for a 5-yard touchdown in the first quarter. Holt finished the day with 72 rushing yards while Ryan had 104 passing yards and a score. Holt ranks 10th nationally in all-purpose yards (174.67/game). Both Antwaun Majors and Darrick Dillard had 10 tackles to lead the Govs defensive attack. This will be the Governors final home game of the season, as the team looks for its first home victory since beating Cumberland in the opening week.

GAME NOTES: With a bye week scheduled for Nov. 20, Eastern Illinois will wrap-up its 2010 season this week when it steps out of Conference play to battle in-state rival Illinois State for the 99th time in the Prairie State Rivalry. The series began in 1901 and is the longest in the state of Illinois and the 14th-longest in FCS football. Last season Eastern Illinois won 31-6 in Charleston, its second-straight win in the overall series. In that game Mon Williams rushed for 87 yards and a touchdown while Jake Christensen tossed three touchdown passes as EIU got out to a 21-0 lead. Saturday's game also features a battle of two head coaches who both played quarterback at Purdue.

SCOUTING EASTERN ILLINOIS: Eastern Illinois closed out the OVC portion of its schedule with a thrilling 31-28 overtime victory over Tennessee State on Saturday. It was the first overtime win ever for the program and the first overtime game since losing to Tennessee Tech in the 2004 season. Early it looked like the team would not make it to overtime as Tennessee State scored the first 21 points of the game and led 28-7 at halftime. But in the second half freshman quarterback Jimmy Garoppolo got hot and found sophomore wideout Chris Wright for three touchdown passes as the team forced overtime. In overtime Cameron Berra hit a 37-yard field goal on the first possession and on TSU's shot, Carlos Reyna knocked a ball loose at the one-yard line, forcing a touchdown and ending the game. Wright ended the game with five receptions for 217 yards and the touchdowns of 15, 65 and 81 yards (the final two coming in the fourth quarter). It marked the third-highest single-game receiving total in EIU history. Over the past two weeks Wright has caught seven passes for 308 yards and five touchdowns. For his efforts Wright was named OVC Co-Offensive Player of the Week. Garoppolo finished the day 20-of-33 for 331 yards and four touchdowns. Over the last three weeks Garoppolo has completed 58-of-90 passes for 891 yards and 11 touchdowns against only one interception.

SCOUTING ILLINOIS STATE: Illinois State is under the direction of second-year head coach Brock Spack. Spack played quarterback at Purdue from 1980-83 and later went on to be on EIU's coaching staff under Bob Spoo (who also played quarterback at Purdue). Spack was the Panthers linebacker coach from 1987-90. After going 6-5 in his first season, Illinois State is 5-5 this season heading into its final game of the season (the Redbirds also have a bye next week). Illinois State has played five nationally ranked teams this season, going 2-3 in those contests. Last week the Redbirds won in thrilling fashion, topping Youngstown State on a 40-yard touchdown pass with one second remaining. That pass came from Matt Brown and was caught by Tyrone Walker. Walker finished the game with nine catches for 206 yards and three touchdowns while Brown was 29-of-37 for 390 yards and five scores.

GAME NOTES: Coming off its biggest win in several years, Eastern Kentucky goes on the road for the final time this season when it battles Tennessee Tech, who is beginning a two-game home stand. The two teams were picked third and fourth in the preseason OVC poll and both are currently .500 or better in Conference play with two games remaining. The two teams have played 66 previous times, with Eastern Kentucky coming out on top in 49 of those games, including each of the last three years and eight of the last nine years. Last season Tech led 7-3 at the half before a 54-yard interception return by Andre Evans late in the third quarter put EKU on top for good. H.B. Banjoman would add a rushing score a few minutes later to make the final score 17-7. T.J. Pryor passes for 163 yards and ran for 21 additional yards for EKU, who held the Golden Eagles to just 204 yards of total offense. Saturday's game is the annual Homecoming contest for Tennessee Tech.

SCOUTING EASTERN KENTUCKY: Eastern Kentucky topped No. 2 Jacksonville State 49-37 on Saturday, marking the program's first win over a Top 5 opponent since beating No. 1 Middle Tennessee 10-7 on Oct. 7, 1990. With the win EKU improved to 4-0 at Roy Kidd Stadium this season; the team is 0-5 in road games. Sophomore wide receiver Orlandus Harris was named OVC Co-Offensive Player of the Week after catching four passes for 205 yards and two touchdowns. He became the first EKU player to have 200 receiving yards in seven years and hauled in touchdown passes of 44 and 76 yards. Junior Jeremy Caldwell was named OVC Specialist of the Week after returning a third quarter kickoff 86 yards for a touchdown after JSU had cut the margin to 11 points and proved to be a huge momentum turner for the Colonels. Caldwell currently leads the nation in kickoff returns (33.54 yards/return). He also intercepted a pass that helped seal the game. Junior linebacker Tyson Patrick was named OVC Defensive Player of the Week after posting career-highs in each tackles (9) and sacks (2.5). He also forced a fumble in the third quarter that was returned 34 yards for a touchdown. Overall the defensive unit held JSU to rush 28 rushing yards, the Gamecocks lowest total since 2000.

SCOUTING TENNESSEE TECH: Tennessee Tech allowed Murray State to rack up 504 yards of total offense in a 44-13 loss in Murray on Saturday. After trailing 16-0, the Golden Eagles climbed back into the and trailed just 22-13 on a 13-yard touchdown run by Jockes Crawford with 11:46 to play in the third quarter. But that would be the last points TTU would score, as Murray State ended the game by scoring 24 consecutive points. Playing for an injured Tre Lamb, Cass Barnes made his first start since 2007 and was 21-of-35 for a career-high 203 yards and a touchdown. Eight of those passes went to junior Tim Benford, who now has 137 career catches (just 20 out of the OVC career Top 10 list). Dontey Gay led the rushing attack with 49 yards, but left in the third quarter with an injury. The defense was paced by Marty Jones, who had 12 tackles and an interception for the Golden Eagles while Richmond Tooley picked off two more passes for TTU. Tech's offense would lose three fumbles and be picked off once during the game.

GAME NOTES: It what will be one of the marquee games in the country on Saturday, No. 7 Southeast Missouri, who has clinched at least a share of the OVC Championship, travels to No. 6 Jacksonville State trying to win the title outright. JSU will need to win on Saturday and the following week to share the championship with the Redhawks. Both teams are ranked in the Top 10, marking the first time two Top 10 OVC foes have squared off since the 1995 season (when No. 8 Murray State beat No. 5 Eastern Kentucky). The two teams have played 14 times previously, including each of the last seven seasons since JSU joined the OVC. The Gamecocks have dominated the series, winning five of those six OVC contests, with Southeast's lone win coming in the 2007 season (32-25 at home). The Redhawks last win in Jacksonville came in the 1964 season (24-0).

SCOUTING SOUTHEAST MISSOURI: Southeast Missouri enters the game on a nine-game winning streak, tied for the longest among FCS teams; the nine overall wins for the Redhawks ties the most in school history. With the 40-14 win over Southwest Baptist on Saturday and JSU's loss to Eastern Kentucky, Southeast clinched at least a share of the OVC Championship, its first since joining the league (and the Division I ranks) in 1991. Overall the team has improved 7.5 games over last year's 2-9 season, marking the seventh-biggest single-season turnaround in FCS history (since the classification was formed in 1978). In its win on Saturday, senior Henry Harris dominated, rushing for 293 yards and three touchdowns on 35 carries (8.4 yards/carry); that performance is the top rushing output among all FCS players this season. Harris, who ranks second nationally in rushing (149.3 yards/game) and first in all-purpose yardage (219.20 yards/game), set the Southeast Missouri single-season rushing record (1,493) and all-purpose yardage (2,192) records in the process. Harris has eight 100-plus yard rushing outings in 10 games this season. The win also gave Southeast an undefeated record (5-0) at home, the first time that has happened since the team moved to Division I.

SCOUTING JACKSONVILLE STATE: With Appalachian State losing earlier in the day, Jacksonville State was poised to jump to No. 1 in the country for the first time in school history, but lost 49-37 at Eastern Kentucky on Saturday night. That loss snapped the nation's longest winning streak at 10 games, as well as the nation's longest road winning streak at nine games. Despite the loss the Gamecocks are still ranked sixth (the 27th-straight week the team has been ranked) and can share the OVC Championship (and win the league's automatic playoff bid) with wins in its final two games of the season. In the loss junior quarterback Marques Ivory passed for 444 yards, the fifth-highest total in the FCS this season. He set school records for yards, completions (30), attempts (49), offensive plays (56) and total offensive yards (451). Jeffrey Cameron pulled in 10 of those passes for 190 yards and a score. JSU was limited, however, to just 28 net rushing yards, the first time the team had been held below 50 rushing yards since losing at South Florida on Sept. 2, 2000. The 49 points allowed to EKU was the most Jax State has allowed to an OVC opponent since joining the OVC in 2003. Saturday's game marks the last regular season home game of the season for the Gamecocks, who are currently ranked eighth nationally in average attendance.

GAME NOTES: Tennessee State will travel to UT Martin for the OVC TV Game of the Week on Saturday night. The Sgt. York Trophy will be on the line as UT Martin can secure its first Sgt. York Championship outright with a victory over Tennessee State, who won the first two championships (2007, 2008). With a loss, UTM will share the Sgt. York title with defending champion Tennessee Tech (2-1 in Sgt. York games). Tennessee State holds advantage in the all-time series with UT Martin by a 13-6 advantage. UT Martin won last year's meeting 28-7 and has won three of the last four in the series after TSU had won nine in a row between 1996 and 2004. A season ago the Skyhawks led 14-0 at halftime and scored midway through the fourth quarter to increase that advantage to 21-0. TSU added its first score on a 73-yard pass from Calvin McNair to Julian Sample, but three minutes later UTM added another score to account for the final margin. Brandyn Young rushed for 129 yards and two scores in that game while Preston Brown had 43 on the ground for TSU.

SCOUTING TENNESSEE STATE: Tennessee State scored the first 21 points of Saturday's game with Eastern Illinois and led 28-7 at halftime and 28-14 at the start of the fourth quarter and appeared to be on its way to a victory. But the Tigers allowed Eastern Illinois to score three second half touchdowns to tie the game at 28 and force an extra period. The TSU defense held in overtime, forcing an EIU field goal attempt (which was good) and giving its offense a chance to win or extend the game. On a third down and nine play, quarterback Dominic Grooms hit Jeremy Pryor for a 23-yard reception. On that play Pryor dove and tried to stretch the ball across the goal line, only to fumble out of the end zone. The play was ruled a touchback and the victory went to Eastern Illinois. Despite the fumble, Pryor had a career night, grabbing six catches for 121 yards. Grooms, in his first start of the season, completed 15-of-29 passes for 270 yards and a touchdown. Senior safety Eugene Clifford had 11 tackles (6 solo), forced a fumble and had a pass break-up in the game.

SCOUTING UT MARTIN: UT Martin won for the third time in its last four games on Saturday, beating Austin Peay 28-12 on Saturday in Clarksville. With three of the team's top receivers not playing for various reasons, quarterback Derek Carr made the most of the situation and completed 18-of-28 passes for 346 yards and two touchdowns. The touchdowns included an 18-yarder to Daniel Chamberlain early in the second quarter and a 34-yarder to Corey Jordan later in that quarter, just before halftime. Overall Carr completed passes to 10 different receivers. Carr has 2,257 passing yards and 12 passing touchdowns on the season. The 2,257 yards is the sixth-most in UTM single-season history. The scoring came to an end when running back Jason McNair connected with Chamberlain for a 22-yard score. Chamberlain finished the game with a season-best 125 yards receiving. Senior linebacker Josh Bey recorded six tackles (4 solo), forced a fumble, had a pass breakup and a quarterback hurry. He was part of the Skyhawk defensive unit that limited APSU to just 247 yards of total offense.
