THIS WEEK'S OVC HIGHLIGHTS/STORYLINES

With wins on Saturday Southeast Missouri (3-0) and Jacksonville State (2-0) remained undefeated in league play; Austin Peay, who was idle, is also undefeated in OVC action this year (1-0)...Eastern Kentucky picked up its first win of the season in its home opener, topping Kentucky State 58-7...Tennessee State topped North Carolina A&T 37-7 at the Circle City Classic in Lucas Oil Stadium in Indianapolis...With that win the OVC is now 6-6 against FCS non-conference opponents in 2010...Jacksonville State has now won nine-straight games dating back to last season, the longest streak in the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS); JSU has also won eight-straight road games dating back to last year, also the longest FCS streak nationally...JSU is one of just four teams at the FCS level to be undefeated entering this week (Appalachian State, Bethune-Cookman, Delaware) and is now No. 3 in the national polls...Southeast Missouri State finally cracked the Top 25 and is No. 25 in the Sports Network/Fathead.com poll; it marks the first time since the beginning of the 2003 season that the Redhawks have been ranked nationally...Southeast is one of just 12 FCS teams nationally with four or more wins this season...EIU punter Kevin Cook was named National Specialist of the Week by Sports Network/Fathead.com after averaging 50.4 yards/punt against Southeast Missouri including nailing an 86-yard punt; it marks the second-straight week the OVC has had the National Specialist of the Week...TSU safety Eugene Clifford has been added to the 20-person Buck Buchanan Award Watch List (given to the top FCS defensive player nationally); Clifford joins ECU cornerback Jeremy Caldwell, a preseason selection, on the list...There are four OVC games on the slate this week including No. 4 Jacksonville State at UT Martin, Tennessee Tech at Austin Peay in a Sgt. York Trophy series matchup, Tennessee State at Southeast Missouri (in a game that features the top two rushing offenses and top two defenses in the OVC) and Eastern Illinois and Eastern Kentucky in what will be the OVC Game of the Week.

THIS WEEK'S OVC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

OFFENSIVE

Henry Harris, RB • Sr., 5-8, 185 • Memphis, Tenn. • Southeast Missouri

Harris reached the 100-yard rushing plateau for the fourth time in five games this season in leading Southeast Missouri to a 28-13 road victory at Eastern Illinois. It marked the first time the Redhawks had won in Charleston since joining the OVC and is the team's first four-game winning streak (and three-game road winning streak) since the 1994 season. Harris rushed for 179 yards and two touchdowns on 27 carries (6.6 yards/carry) and finished the game with a career-high 286 all-purpose yards (including 100 yards on kickoff returns and seven receiving yards), marking the third-straight game the senior has had 200 or more all-purpose yards. Ten of his rushes were for 10 or more yards in the victory. Harris currently ranks second nationally in all-purpose yards (213.20/game) and fourth nationally in rushing (136.0 yards/game). Harris' play has helped Southeast Missouri to its first ever 3-0 start in OVC play. He is the first OVC player to be named Offensive Player of the Week three weeks in a row since early in the 2009 season (Ryan Perrilloux).

DEFENSIVE

Darrick Borum, LB • So., 6-2, 210 • Marion, Ill. • Southeast Missouri

Borum had a career-high 10 tackles, two sacks, three tackles-for-loss, a fumble recovery, interception and pass break-up in Southeast Missouri's 28-13 road win over Eastern Illinois. It marked the first time the Redhawks had won in Charleston since joining the OVC and is the team's first four-game winning streak (and three-game road winning streak) since the 1994 season. His interception ended EIU's first drive of the day and led to seven points for Southeast who took an early lead. Borum was part of a Redhawk defense that forced a season-high five turnovers against the Panthers. The sophomore is currently Southeast's team leader in sacks, tackles-for-loss, forced fumbles and fumble recoveries on the season.

SPECIALIST

Kevin Cook, P • Sr., 6-2, 219 • Libertyville, Ill. • Eastern Illinois

Cook earned his third career OVC Specialist of the Week honor after averaging 50.2 yards on four punts against Southeast Missouri. On Cook's first attempt of the day he sailed a punt 86 yards from his own end zone to pin the Redhawks at their own five-yard line. The 86-yard punt was the longest in EIU's NCAA Division I history and seven yards away from the longest punt in NCAA history. For the day the senior would see three of his four punts downed inside the 20-yard line with the fourth nearly downed at the one-yard line before being knocked into the end zone for a touchback. Cook is now ranked second nationally in punting average (45.07 yards/punt).

CO-NEWCOMER

Coty Blanchard, P/QB • Fr., 6-2, 175 • Leesburg, Ala. • Jacksonville State

Blanchard was 3-for-4 for 68 yards and a touchdown passing, rushed for 28 yards and four carries and averaged 39.4 yard on seven total punts in Jacksonville State's win over Murray State. With JSU trailing 14-0, the true freshman got the fourth-ranked Gamecocks on the board on a 65-yard touchdown strike to Jeffrey Cameron with 35 seconds left in the first quarter. With Jax State clinging to a 40-34 lead with 58 second remaining, Blanchard connected on his longest punt of the night, sailing the ball 50 yards to pin Murray State at its own 4-yard line and help JSU win its ninth-straight game (the longest winning streak among Football Championship Subdivision teams).

CO-NEWCOMER

Arthur Brackett, WR • Fr., 6-0, 180 • Madison, Ala. • Murray State

Brackett caught 13 passes for 96 yards in Murray State's 40-34 loss at No. 4 Jacksonville State. The game marked a return to his home state of Alabama for the freshman. The 13 receptions were the second-most in Murray State history, just three shy of the single-game record. Brackett currently ranks ninth nationally in receptions/game (7.60) and 35th nationally in total receiving yards (326).

NOTES FROM AROUND THE GRIDIRON

Jacksonville State Up to No. 3 in FCS Top 25 Polls, The Highest For OVC Team Since 1999; Southeast Missouri Enters Top 25 for First Time Since 2003: With its win over Ole Miss, Jacksonville State leaped from 17th to No. 5 in the Sports Network FCS Top 25 poll. The No. 5 ranking was the highest for an OVC team since Western Kentucky was ranked fifth in the final poll of the 2000 season. After a win over Chattanooga in week No. 2, the Gamecocks moved up to No. 4 in both major FCS polls, a ranking they have maintained for three weeks until moving up one spot to No. 3 on Oct. 4. The No. 3 ranking is the highest an OVC team has been since Tennessee State was No. 1 in the final regular season poll of the 1999 season. JSU has now been ranked for 20-straight weeks (its longest stretch since joining the Division I ranks). After losing its first two games of the season, Eastern Illinois dropped out of the Top 25, leaving only one OVC team ranked in the national polls for the first time since Sept. 8, 2008 (a span of 28 polls). That number became two ranked teams once again on Oct. 4 when Southeast Missouri State jumped to No. 25 in the Sports Network poll. It marked the first time since the first two polls of the 2003 season that the Redhawks had been ranked nationally.

JSU One of Four Undefeated Teams in FCS Football: Entering week No. 6 of the 2010 season there are only four undefeated teams left in the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) and Jacksonville State (5-0) is among those squads. Other undefeated teams include Appalachian State (4-0), Bethune-Cookman (4-0) and Delaware (5-0).

JSU and Southeast Missouri Two of Just 12 FCS Teams With 4 or More Wins (and 2 of Just 8 With Four or More Division I Wins): Entering this week Jacksonville State and Southeast Missouri are two of just 12 Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) teams with four or more victories this season (JSU is 5-0 and SEMO is 4-1). To take it one step further, the teams are two of just eight FCS teams with four or more victories against Division I competition and two of just six to have four or more wins come against Division I scholarship competition.

Jax State Has Longest Overall and Longest Road Winning Streak in FCS: Jacksonville State enters this week with the nation's longest winning streak (nine games) among Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) teams. Jacksonville State has not lost since falling 28-20 at No. 24 Eastern Illinois on Oct. 24, 2009. Among all Division I teams (FBS & FCS), the nine-game winning streak is fourth-best (behind Alabama's 19-game streak, Boise State's 18-game streak and Ohio State's 11-game streak). The Gamecocks also lay claim to the longest road winning streak among FCS teams, which is at eight games dating back to last season. The Gamecocks have not lost a road game since losing at FBS opponent Florida State on Sept. 12 of last season. The team's last road loss to a FCS team was at UT Martin (31-30) on Oct. 23, 2008. Among all Division I teams (FBS & FCS) Jacksonville State's eight-game road winning streak is third (behind Boise State's 15-game streak and Alabama's 11-game streak and tied with TCU).

Top Rushing Performances: The OVC has had some impressive rushing performance this season as Tennessee State's **Preston Brown** and Southeast Missouri State's **Henry Harris** rank third and fourth nationally in rushing. Brown has the third and sixth-highest single-game rushing totals (241 and 222 yards) while Harris has the 12th and 19th highest single-game totals in 2010 (201 and 186 yards).

Cook Named National Specialist of the Week (Oct. 4): Eastern Illinois punter Kevin Cook was named National Specialist of the Week by Sports Network/Fathead.com on Oct. 4 for his performance against Southeast Missouri. The senior averaged 50.2 yards on four punts against the Redhawks. On Cook's first attempt of the day he sailed a punt 86 yards from his own end zone to pin the Redhawks at their own five-yard line. The 86-yard punt was the longest in EIU's NCAA Division I history and seven yards away from the longest punt in NCAA FCS history. For the day Cook would see three of his four punts downed inside the 20-yard line with the fourth nearly downed at the one-yard line before being knocked into the end zone for a touchback.

TSU's Clifford Joins ECU's Caldwell on Buck Buchanan Watch List: Tennessee State safety **Eugene Clifford** has been added to the Buck Buchanan Award watch list. The award, which is presented by The Sports Network and sponsored by Fathead.com, is handed out annually to the nation's top FCS defensive player. Also on 20-person list is Eastern Kentucky cornerback **Jeremy Caldwell** who was one of preseason selections to the team. The Buchanan Award watch list will undergo another revision on Oct. 25 and before the end of the season. Ballots will be sent to a panel of approximately 200 sports information and media relations directors, broadcasters, writers and other dignitaries following the conclusion of the regular season on Nov. 22. The Buchanan Award will be presented to the FCS national defensive player of the year on Thursday, Jan. 6 in Frisco, Texas - the night before the national championship game. The Buck Buchanan award is named for Junious "Buck" Buchanan, the NAIA All-American and Pro Football Hall of Fame defensive lineman who played for Grambling State University from 1959 through 1962. As a freshman, Buchanan came to Grambling on an "if" scholarship, to receive financial help if he played well. After a season of playing both varsity basketball and football, Buchanan decided to concentrate solely on football. By the time he finished four years at Grambling, his coach, Eddie Robinson, asserted that Buchanan was "... the finest tackle I have ever seen." The Buck Buchanan Award has been handed out annually since 1995. Some of the past winners include Minnesota Vikings' Jared Allen (Idaho State - 2003), Jacksonville Jaguars' Rashean Mathis (Bethune-Cookman - 2002) and Dexter Coakley (Appalachian State - 1995, 1996), who played 10 seasons with the Dallas Cowboys and St. Louis Rams.

Large Crowds: OVC teams have played in front of some big crowds this season, especially when playing against a Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponent (including 99,123 who saw UT Martin play at Tennessee in what was the second-biggest crowd to ever see an OVC team play).

Two OVC Student-Athletes Named Semifinalists for Campbell Trophy: Two Ohio Valley Conference football student-athletes - Austin Peay's **Brad Williams** and Eastern Kentucky's **Logan O'Connor** - have been named semifinalist for the 2010 William V. Campbell Trophy (formerly known as the Draddy Trophy), endowed by HealthSouth. The semifinalists were announced by the National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame (NFF). The award honors the best and brightest from the college gridiron and is often called the "Academic Heisman." Overall there are 121 semifinalists for the award but Williams and O'Connor are two of only 28 selected from the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS). Williams owns a 3.565 grade-point average as a business finance major with a minor in real estate. The Clarksville native also is a re-founding father of Alpha Tau Omega and is a member of the Omicron Delta Kappa National Leadership and Phi Kappa Phi National Honor Societies. O'Connor is an art teacher education major currently has a 3.84 GPA and is expecting to graduate this May. Nominated by their schools, which are limited to one nominee each, semifinalists must be a senior or graduate student in their final year of eligibility, have a GPA of at least 3.2 on a 4.0 scale, have outstanding football ability as a first team player or significant contributor, and have demonstrated strong leadership and citizenship. The trophy was renamed last fall in honor of Bill Campbell, the chairman of Intuit, former player and head coach at Columbia University and the 2004 recipient of the NFF's Gold Medal. The NFF Awards Committee will select up to 15 finalists and announce the results via national press release on Thursday, Oct. 28. Each finalist will be recognized as part of the 2010 NFF National Scholar-Athlete Class, receiving an \$18,000 post-graduate scholarship. The Campbell Trophy winner, who will have his scholarship increased to \$25,000 and receive a 25-pound bronze trophy, will be announced live at the NFF's Annual Awards Dinner on Dec. 7 at the prestigious Waldorf-Astoria in New York City.

NCAA Stats Leaders: In the latest set of NCAA rushing leaders, Tennessee State running back **Preston Brown** is third nationally in rushing (152.00 yards/game) and ninth in all-purpose yards (169.80/game). Southeast Missouri State senior running back **Henry Harris** is second nationally in all-purpose yards (213.20/game) and fourth in rushing (136.0/game). Murray State quarterback **Jeff Ehrhardt** is fifth nationally in completions/game (26.40) while his receiver Arthur Brackett is ninth in receptions (7.6/game) and fellow teammate **Dontrell Johnson** is first nationally in punt return yards (30.78/return). Jacksonville State return specialist **Alan Bonner** is fifth in kickoff returns (32.83 yards/return) while Austin Peay kicker **Stephen Stansell** is sixth in field goals made (2.00/game). Eastern Illinois kicker **Kevin Cook** is second in punting (45.07) while Austin Peay punter **Ryan Key** is seventh (43.15). Eastern Illinois linebacker Nick Nasti is second in tackles (13.0/game), teammate Nick Martinez is fourth in forced fumbles (0.60/game), Austin Peay defensive back **Jeremy Ross** is first nationally in fumbles recovered (0.75/game) while Tennessee State defensive back **Eugene Clifford** is sixth in passes defended (1.80/game). Team-wise Southeast Missouri is first nationally in third down conversion percentage (54.41%), first in least interceptions thrown (0), second in sacks allowed (0.40/game), third in fewest yards penalized (31.20/game) and sixth in rushing offense (254.8 yards/game). Jacksonville State ranks sixth in sacks allowed (0.60/game), fifth in third down conversion percentage (48.65%) and eighth in scoring offense (34.40 points/game). Murray State is first nationally in tackles for loss (8.80/game) and second in punt returns (24.08 yards/return). Tennessee State is second nationally in sacks (4.20/game) while Eastern Kentucky is fourth in net punting (37.95 yards/punt) and sixth in tackles-for-loss (8.25/game).

League Announces "OVC Game of the Week" Television Package With Wazoo Sports: In July 2010 the Ohio Valley Conference announced its a partnership with Wazoo Sports to produce and distribute an "OVC Game of the Week" football package for 2010. Eight of the 10 games will have a 6 p.m. CT kickoff. Each of the nine OVC football schools will appear on the broadcast at least twice during the season. The games will also appear online through ESPN3.com and OVCSports.TV Wazoo Sports, Inc. is a Regional Sports Network that delivers coverage of NCAA, NAIA high school, and youth sports live and on-demand on television and over the Internet. Jacksonville State Tops Ole Miss, Ends 50-Game OVC Losing Streak to FBS Schools: Jacksonville State's 49-48 double overtime victory over Ole Miss on Sept. 4 helped the OVC end a 50-game losing streak to Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponents that extended back to the 2004 season when Eastern Illinois beat Eastern Michigan 31-28. Jacksonville State nearly ended the streak a season ago, losing in the final minute at Florida State. It was the program's first win over a FBS team since a 31-28 victory at Arkansas State in 2001 (prior to joining the OVC). All-time the OVC is 18-138-1 against FBS schools.

More FCS Over FBS: Jacksonville State's win over Ole Miss was the first for an FCS team over an FBS team this season (North Dakota State beat Kansas later on Sept. 4 to mark the second win for FCS teams). It marked the 19th time since 2004 that an FCS squad had bested an FBS school (20th including NDSU). In week two of the season, four more FCS teams topped FBS squads.

OVC Finally Tops the SEC: Jacksonville State's victory over Ole Miss also marked the first time since the OVC was formed in 1948 that an OVC team had topped a squad from the Southeastern Conference. Prior to Jax State's victory, the OVC had been 0-22 against SEC teams since the league was formed. Prior to the OVC being formed Southeast Missouri State had topped Ole Miss in 1907 and Tennessee Tech had tied Vanderbilt in 1939 in the only game with positive outcomes for current OVC teams.

Gamecock Play Chosen as Capital One Cup Impact Performance for Week 1: Jacksonville State's 30-yard touchdown on fourth down in overtime and ensuing two-point conversion pass (both by freshman Coty Blanchard) in a win at Ole Miss was chosen as the Capitol One Cup Impact Performance of the Week in a vote at ESPN.com. The two plays received 78 percent of the national fan vote.

APSU's Holt Among All-Time Best in FCS in Kickoff Returns: Austin Peay senior **Terrence Holt** is among the best all-time at the FCS level in kickoff returns. Holt broke the FCS all-time kickoff return yardage record in 2009 and currently has 4,000 yards. He is the only player in FCS history to have three 1,000+ yard kickoff return seasons and will look to make that four-straight this year. Holt also holds the FCS career record for total kick return yardage (kickoffs and punt returns) with 4,492 yards. In 2008 Holt broke the NCAA record for kickoff returns in a season (52) and total kick returns (kickoffs plus punts) with 66.

2010 Marks Fourth Season For Sgt. York Trophy: The 2010 season marks the fourth season for the Sgt. York Trophy, a challenge trophy which goes to the annual winner of the quadrangular season series between the four OVC institutions in the state of Tennessee (Austin Peay, Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech and UT Martin). In July 2007, the Nashville Sports Council and the Ohio Valley Conference announced the creation of the trophy, which is only the second traveling trophy involving more than two schools nationwide (the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy). It is named after Sgt. Alvin C. York, a native of Pall Mall, Tenn. and a Soldier who was one of the most honored of World War I. He received the Congressional Medal of Honor after the war and returned to his home state to dedicate his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee. The trophy goes to the team with the best record against the other schools, and in case of a tie there will be co-champions and the actual trophy will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy. In 2007, Tennessee State and Austin Peay finished in a tie for the trophy with identical 2-1 records; both shared the award but Tennessee State went home with the hardware due to a 1-point win in the head-to-head meeting during the season. Tennessee State went 3-0 in Sgt. York play in 2008 to claim its second trophy. Last year Tennessee Tech claimed the trophy after going undefeated in Sgt. York games.

Tennessee State's Brown, Murray State's Johnson Named National Players of the Week (Sept. 27): For their performances in week No. 4, Tennessee State running back **Preston Brown** and Murray State return specialist **Dontrell Johnson** earned National Player of the Week honors. Brown was named a National All-Star by College Sporting News after rushing for 233 yards and a touchdown in TSU's 29-18 win over Florida A&M at the Atlanta Football Classic. On the second play of the game Brown took a handoff and raced for a 71-yard touchdown. The game was his second 200-plus yard effort in three weeks. Johnson was named National Specialist of the Week by the Sports Network/Fathead.com after returning a punt 91 yards for a touchdown in the Racers 52-16 victory over UT Martin. Johnson had 148 total punt return yards in what was only his second game ever returning punts. Johnson also earned the FCS Punt Return Performer of the Week award from the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA).

Two OVC Players Earn Honors From College Football Performance Awards for Week No. 3 of the Season: Two OVC players were honored by the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) on Sept. 20 for their performances in week No. 3. Austin Peay's **Stephen Stansell** was named FCS Placekicker Performer of the Week while UT Martin's **Darrin Nalls** was named Defensive Lineman Performer of the Week.

Three OVC Players Earn Honors From College Football Performance Awards for Week No. 2 of the Season: Three OVC players were honored by the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) on Sept. 13 for their performances in week No. 2. Tennessee State's **Preston Brown** was named the FCS Running Back Performer of the Week, Southeast Missouri State kicker **Drew Geldbach** was named FCS Placekicker Performer of the Week and Austin Peay safety **Jeremy Ross** was named FCS Defensive Back Co-Performer of the Week.

Ivory and Blanchard Share National All-Star Honors From College Sporting News (Sept. 6): The Jacksonville State quarterback tandem of **Marques Ivory** and **Coty Blanchard** earned

National All-Star (Player of the Week) honors from the College Sporting News on Sept. 6 for their parts in the Gamecocks double overtime win at Ole Miss. The duo shared the Offensive Award with Appalachian State quarterback DeAndre Presley. The starter Ivory was 13-for-23 for 126 and two touchdowns while true freshman Blanchard was 9-for-13 for 126 yards and two touchdowns. The duo led the Gamecocks to five straight touchdowns to end the game, as JSU trailed 31-13 entering the fourth quarter. Jax State outscored the Rebels 21-3 in the final quarter behind the two-quarterback attack. Blanchard had a four-yard touchdown with 6:17 left to cut the lead to 31-26 and Ivory had a 19-yard score to Alan Bonner with 18 seconds left to make the score 34-32. Ivory then completed a 2-point conversion pass to La'Ray Williams to force overtime. Each quarterback scored a touchdown in overtime, as Ivory connected for a 7-yard score in the first overtime, and Blanchard completed a 30-yard pass on 4th and 15 in the second overtime. Blanchard then completed a two-point conversion pass to Calvin Middleton to win the game (and earn No. 2 play of the day honors on SportsCenter. The Gamecocks duo did not throw an interception in the game.

Tennessee Tech Game With Lane College Called in Second Quarter: On Sept. 16 Tennessee Tech led Lane College 43-0 with 5:01 to play in the second quarter when lightning and heavy rains forced play to be suspended. After a long delay the game was unable to be continued. One of the conditions of Rule 3-3-3-c of the NCAA rulebook allows the teams to "terminate the game with a determined final score" if both the directions of athletics at the participating institutions in consultation with the coaches agree. Both teams agreed the game would end with TTU winning 43-0 and improving its record to 1-2 on the season. However, under NCAA statistics guidelines the game did not reach a "reasonable point of conclusion" (deemed three quarters for a football game) due to the weather conditions. So the statistics from the game will not count in the NCAA national statistical leaders or the OVC leaders. It was determined, however, that the Golden Eagle players would be able to count the stats in their individual career totals.

Tennessee Tech Starts Season With Back-to-Back Top 25 FBS Opponents: Tennessee Tech had the tough task of being one of just four Division I teams (FBS or FCS) to start the 2010 season with two nationally-ranked Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponents. The Golden Eagles lost at No. 17 Arkansas in week one and at No. 4 TCU in week two. The other three teams to start the season against two nationally-ranked FBS teams were Marshall (Ohio State and West Virginia), San Jose State (Alabama and Wisconsin) and UNLV (Wisconsin and Utah).

A Look at the Coaches: There are two new coaches and seven returnees among the head coaching ranks in the Ohio Valley Conference this season. **Chris Hatcher** takes over at Murray State after tenures at Valdosta State and Georgia Southern and **Rod Reed** is now in charge at Tennessee State (his alma mater) after serving on the staff as an assistant and defensive coordinator. The Dean of OVC Coaches is Eastern Illinois coach **Bob Spoo** who is in his 24th season with the Panthers in 2010. Spoo has 88 total wins while EIU has been a member of the OVC, a mark that ranks fifth in OVC history. Spoo also has 65 Conference victories, which is also fifth all-time. He is just two OVC wins away from passing WKU's Jimmy Feix (67 OVC wins) and moving into fourth place on the all-time list.

FCS Playoff Expansion: For the first time in 2010 the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) playoff field will include 20 teams, up from 16 a year ago. In April 2008 the NCAA Board of Directors approved the expansion. It marks the first expansion since the field grew from 12 to 16 teams in 1997. The field will be comprised of 10 automatic bids (up from 8) and 10 at-large berths. This season there will be four first round matchups (8 total teams), while 12 teams will receive a bye into the second round. For the first time in 2010, the championship game will be played in Frisco, Texas at Pizza Hut Park, a 23,500-seat multi-purpose stadium. The Southland Conference will serve as the host of the championship, which will be held on Friday, Jan. 7.

Preseason Forecasts: For the second-straight season five different schools received at least one first-place vote in the preseason predicted order of finish balloting. Jacksonville State received the most (11 of 18) while Eastern Illinois (4), Eastern Kentucky (1), Tennessee Tech (1) and Tennessee State (1) were also in the mix. JSU was picked first for the third time in the past six seasons. Is being picked first in the preseason poll necessarily a good thing? In the past 31 years of preseason polls (all that were available), the preseason predicted champion has only gone on to win the OVC Championship 12 times (38.7%). Over the past seven years not once has the eventual champion been predicted in the preseason poll (it was last done correctly in 2002).

seven players who were second-team selections in 2009. Of the 25 total selections, 13 were seniors, 11 were juniors and there was one sophomore pick.

Let's Get It Started: The 63rd season of Ohio Valley Conference football will get underway on Thursday, Sept. 2 when four OVC squads take to the gridiron; the remaining five schools will play on Saturday, Sept. 4. The OVC is made up of nine football-playing schools in 2010. Since its beginning, 14 of the 18 total schools that have played football in the league have claimed at least one championship.

I-AA No More: Although some people may accidentally still refer to it as I-AA football, the term that represents the level of Division I football in which the Ohio Valley Conference competes has been retired. Beginning with the 2006 National Championship game, the term Football Championship Subdivision (or FCS) is to be used. FCS is the only Division I football rank to host a NCAA-sponsored national championship (one of 88 championships the NCAA sponsors). The division formerly known as I-A was changed to Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and those teams compete for the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) national championship. Teams who play at the FCS level can offer a maximum of 63 scholarships (FBS teams can offer 85) and compete in a 16-team playoff at the end of the season to determine the national champion.

NFL Connections: As of September 7, 19 former Ohio Valley Conference players are on NFL rosters for the 2010 season (14 active players, 5 practice squad members). Those players include former Eastern Illinois standout Tony Romo, a three-time Pro Bowl pick, Cortland Finnegan (Samford), who has been a Pro Bowl defensive back selection with the Tennessee Titans and Tennessee State's Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie, who was a starter for the Arizona Cardinals in Super Bowl XLIII and was a Pro Bowl selection last season. There are five players on NFL rosters who played in the OVC last season including Eastern Illinois offensive linemen Chris Campbell (Green Bay Packers - practice squad) and Otis Hudson (Cincinnati Bengals - practice squad), Murray State defensive lineman Austen Lane (Jacksonville Jaguars) and wide receiver Derrick Townsel (Houston Texans - practice squad) and Tennessee State defensive back Anthony Levine (Green Bay Packers). Six of the nine current OVC football schools have at least one player in the NFL with Tennessee State leading the way with four active players (and one practice squad member). Several NFL coaches also have connections to OVC schools, including three who went to Eastern Illinois, the "Cradle of NFL Head Coaches." Those coaches include Brad Childress (Minnesota), Super Bowl champion Sean Payton (New Orleans) and Mike Shanahan (Washington). UT Martin graduate and former assistant coach Jerry Reese made waves in 2007 when he led the New York Giants to Super Bowl XLII in his first season as General Manager with the franchise.

OVCsports.TV: For the fifth consecutive year, fans can watch every Conference matchup and all non-conference home contests at OVCsports.TV. The venture with NeuLion (formerly JumpTV Sports) allows fans to access live and on-demand streaming video and audio of all conference matchups on their home computer. The premium Web site was launched in July 2006 and streamed over a thousand events in its first four seasons, including all Conference matchups in football and men's and women's basketball as well as select baseball, soccer, softball and volleyball games and OVC Championship events. Packages are available on a yearly, seasonally, monthly or per-event basis.

OVC PLAYERS IN THE NFL

There are currently 19 former Ohio Valley Conference football players on NFL rosters for the 2010 season (14 active, 4 practice squad). That includes former EIU standout Tony Romo, who is the starting signal caller for the Dallas Cowboys, All-Pro Cortland Finnegan, a defensive back with the Tennessee Titans, and Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie, a 2008 First Round Draft pick and Super Bowl XLIII out of Tennessee State.

SGT. YORK TROPHY

The 2010 season marks the fourth of competition for the Sergeant York Trophy, an award created by the Nashville Sports Council and the Ohio Valley Conference. The trophy is contested between the four OVC schools in the state of Tennessee - Austin Peay, Tennessee State, Tennessee Tech and UT Martin - and go to the team with the best combined record versus those schools in a given year.

In the event of a tie, the award will be shared; however, the previous winner will retain the trophy if they are part of the tie. If the tie is between two other institutions, the trophy will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy.

The award is only the second traveling trophy that involves more than two teams in college sports; the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy which has been contested between Air Force, Army and Navy annually since 1972. The award is named in honor of Alvin C. York, the most noted Soldier of World War I. Upon his return to the United States in 1919, he was bestowed the Congressional Medal of Honor. Following the war York returned his home in Pall Mall, Tenn. where he dedicated his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee.

The award will be presented annually at the Nashville Sports Council's O'Charley's Dinner of Champions (held in March of each year).

Tennessee State and Austin Peay shared the inaugural award after compiling 2-1 records in round robin play last year. Tennessee State took home the trophy, however, by winning the individual matchup with Austin Peay by one point in overtime. Tennessee State claimed the 2008 trophy after going 3-0 in Sgt. York games. Last season Tennessee Tech won all three of its Sgt. York games to claim the 2009 trophy.

GAME NOTES: Jacksonville State and UT Martin will meet for the 32nd time on Saturday. The teams played regularly when both schools were Division II members and have now played each of the last seven years after JSU joined the OVC. Since the rivalry was renewed in 2003, Jax State has won five of the seven matchups, including a 52-7 decision a year ago. In that game All-American T.J. Heath returned two touchdowns for interceptions in the first 6:05 of the game as JSU led 31-0 at the half and eventually 38-0 before the Skyhawks put points on the board. UT Martin head coach Jason Simpson was an assistant coach (quarterbacks/wide receivers) for three seasons at JSU (1997-99).

SCOUTING JACKSONVILLE STATE: Jacksonville State continues to win, topping Murray State 40-34 on Saturday to improve to 5-0 for the first time since the 2004 season (that year the Gamecocks won the OVC Championship). All of the Gamecocks games have been close, as the team has a margin of victory of just 4.8 points a game. After the win over Murray State on Saturday the team is one of just four undefeated teams in the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS). The team has won nine-straight games overall (dating back to last season), which is the longest streak among FCS teams. JSU is now ranked No. 3 in the FCS Top 25 polls. Freshman punter/quarterback Coty Blanchard was named OVC Co-Newcomer of the Week after completing 3-of-4 passes for 68 yards and a touchdown, rushing for 28 yards on four carries and averaging 39.4 yards/punt on seven attempts. With the Gamecocks trailing 14-0, he tossed a 65-yard touchdown to Jeffrey Cameron to cut the advantage in half. With his team leading 40-34 he nailed a 50-yard punt to pin the Racers at their own 4-yard line and seal the win. Cameron caught just two passes on the game, but both went for touchdowns, as he scored on the 65-yard strike and a 60-yard score later in the game. Sophomore Alan Bonner returned a kickoff 92 yards for a touchdown late in the game (taking the JSU lead from six to 13 points) and finished the game with 176 all-purpose yards.

SCOUTING UT MARTIN: UT Martin bounced back after a 52-16 loss to Murray State by going on the road and topping Tennessee Tech 27-24 last Thursday. The Skyhawks trailed 17-6 at the break after managing just 119 yards of total offense. But the team was able to turn the tides in the second half, out-gaining the Golden Eagles 331-116 (and 450-290 for the game) and rushing for 279 yards for the game. Tevin Barksdale was a big part of that rushing attack, running for 134 yards and a touchdown in the victory. Junior punter Joe Hook also played a big part in the win including a fake punt on a 4th and 20, giving the Skyhawks a first down which led to a touchdown four plays later as UTM took the lead for good. Hook also averaged 39.5 yards/punt during the game. Quarterback Derek Carr completed 12-of-17 passes for 151 yards including a 55-yard score to Stephen Shiver, and rushed for another score in the game. Senior linebacker Josh Bey added a season-high 12 tackles and forced a fumble in the victory. The win on Thursday improved UTM's record in Thursday night games under head coach Jason Simpson to 8-3.

GAME NOTES: Murray State steps out of Conference play for its last non-conference matchup of the season on Saturday, hosting Missouri State in its annual Homecoming game. The game proceeds a bye week for the Racers who will finish the season with five-straight OVC contests. This game marks the second-straight season the Racers and Bears have battled, as the two squads played four-straight years from 1982-85 before a 24-year break in the series. Last season Missouri State won 35-10 in Springfield behind a balanced attack that saw quarterback Cody Kirby pass for 223 yards and three touchdowns. The Bears defense limited Murray State to just 11 yards rushing for the game.

SCOUTING MISSOURI STATE: Missouri State snapped a two-game losing streak with a 35-25 victory over nationally-ranked (No. 20) Youngstown State at home on Saturday. It was the first win over a Top 25 opponent for the team in its last 11 tries dating back to the 2007 season. After falling behind 17-0 the Bears scored 28-straight points to ignite the comeback as the Bears outgained YSU 410-333. Quarterback Cody Kirby was 24-for-39 for 298 yards and two touchdowns in the win. In the process he became MSU's all-time leader in pass completions and total offense. On the season Kirby has tossed six touchdowns against only two interceptions while Chris Douglas is the team's leading rusher (290 yards).

SCOUTING MURRAY STATE: Coming off its first win of the season, Murray State nearly made it two in a row with a near upset of fourth-ranked Jacksonville State. The Racers jumped out to a 14-point lead and then nearly erased a 19-point deficit (33-14) on before falling 40-34. Sophomore quarterback Casey Brockman completed 23-of-36 passes for 197 yards and carried the ball 17 times for 65 yards and two scores. Jeff Ehrhardt also had his time under center, completing 13-of-18 passes for 87 yards. Freshman Arthur Brackett hauled in 13 of those passes for 96 total yards. The 13 catches were the second-highest single-game total in Murray State history. For the second week in a row, junior Dontrell Johnson returned a punt for a touchdown. On Saturday Johnson went 70 yards with 8:44 left in the game to trim the margin to seven points. The junior is leading all FCS players with a 30.8 yards/kickoff return average. As a team Murray State still leads all FCS program in tackles-for-loss (8.80/game).

GAME NOTES: Saturday marks the third Sgt. York Trophy series game of the 2010 season. Austin Peay is 1-0 in those games this season (with a win over Tennessee State) while Tennessee Tech is 0-1 (following a loss to UT Martin). TTU is the defending Sgt. York champion while Austin Peay shared the award in 2007 (but did not take home the trophy after losing the head-to-head tiebreaker). The two teams have played 43 times since 1938, with Tech winning 31-23 in Cookeville last season. In that game TTU quarterback Lee Sweeney passed for 234 yards and three touchdowns while Antonio Robinson hauled in nine of those catches for 130 yards and two touchdowns. Austin Peay was led by Ryan White, who gained 100 yards on 22 carries.

SCOUTING TENNESSEE TECH: Tennessee Tech dropped a 27-24 decision to UT Martin on Thursday night, falling to 0-2 in OVC competition on the season. It marked the first home loss for the Golden Eagles since the 2008 season. TTU led 17-6 at halftime before allowing the UTM offense to gain 331 yards in the second half of the game. Tim Benford led the way for Tech with 122 receiving yards and two touchdowns on six receptions. It marked the second-straight game the junior wideout had a multi-touchdown game. Quarterback Tre Lamb passed for 207 yards and three touchdowns but did throw two interceptions. Dontey Gay led the rushing attack, gaining 61 yards on just eight carries (7.6 yards/carry). Senior linebacker Kelechi Ordu tallied 13 tackles to lead the Tech defensive attack.

SCOUTING AUSTIN PEAY: Austin Peay is fresh off a bye week following its 70-3 loss at No. 10 (FBS) Wisconsin two weeks ago. The Governors are 1-0 in OVC competition, having defeated Tennessee State back on Sept. 18. The loss to the Badgers marked the first time that Austin Peay had ever played an opponent from the Big Ten and was the second Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponent for the Govs this season. Senior Terrence Holt set the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) kickoff return record on the first return of the game, netting his 156th return; Holt now has 163 career kickoff returns. He also set the FCS record for most combined kick/punt returns, breaking the old mark of 199 (he now has 207 combined returns). Kicker Stephen Stansell connected on his second 50-plus yard field goal of the season against Wisconsin. Stansell hit from 51 yards in the second quarter. Senior Ryan Key punted nine times in the contest, averaging 42.7 yards/punt. Key now ranks seventh nationally in punting average (43.15 yards/punt).

GAME NOTES: When Eastern Illinois and Eastern Kentucky meet on Saturday, the game will feature the two teams who have combined to win each of the last five OVC Championships. EIU won the crown in 2005, 2006 and 2009 while ECU was back-to-back champions in 2007 and 2008. The two teams enter Saturday's game with just one win between them, and no wins over Division I squads. Last year the matchup was a classic, as Eastern Kentucky, then No. 18, went to Charleston and topped No. 23 Eastern Illinois 36-31. It was the third-straight win for ECU in the series. In that game ECU's T.J. Pryor completed 19-of-30 passes for 293 yards and two scores and also rushed for 45 yards and another touchdown. Cornerback Jeremy Caldwell was named National Defensive Player of the Week after registering seven tackles, forcing a fumble that ended the game and picking off two passes, one of which he returned for a touchdown.

SCOUTING EASTERN ILLINOIS: Eastern Illinois fell to 0-5 on the season with a 28-13 loss at home to Southeast Missouri State on Saturday. It marks the first time the team has started the season with five-straight losses since 1977 (when the team was 0-10 before winning its season finale). It is the first time the program has been 0-3 in conference play since 1993 when they were members of the Gateway Conference. After falling behind 7-0, quarterback Jimmy Garoppolo led the team on a 5-play, 66-yard drive that ended with him hitting Cody Bruns for a 13-yard touchdown strike. In the second quarter Cameron Berra added a 33-yard field goal and the team led 10-7 at the break. Southeast Missouri countered with a touchdown to open the second half and the momentum really switched when Tylor Brock picked off Garoppolo and returned it 48 yards for a touchdown to put the Redhawks up 21-10. Jimmy Potempa had his second-straight quality rushing game, picking up 99 yards on 19 carries and also catching three passes. Mon Williams added 41 yards for the Panthers. Defensively Nick Nasti had 14 tackles and now ranks second nationally in tackles/game (13.0). Senior punter Kevin Cook was named National Specialist of the Week after averaging 50.2 yards on four punts including an 86-yarder in the game. Cook now ranks second nationally in punt average (45.07).

SCOUTING EASTERN KENTUCKY: Coming off a bye week Eastern Kentucky picked up its first victory of the season on Saturday, topping Division II Kentucky State 58-7. It was the first time ECU scored 50 or more points since the 2006 season (51 vs. Murray State). With the win Eastern snapped a six-game losing streak dating back to last season; that was the longest losing streak for the program since 1963. The Colonels overwhelmed KSU with 286 yards on the ground, the most yards for the team since the 2008 season. Sophomore Matt Denham led the way with 149 yards on just five carries (29.8 yards/carry), including touchdown runs of 62 and 31 yards in the fourth quarter. The Colonels only had to throw the ball 10 total times in the game. Defensively Patrick Tyson picked off a pass and returned it 76 yards for a touchdown, the second interception for a touchdown the Colonel defense has produced this season.

GAME NOTES: Saturday's game between Tennessee State and Southeast Missouri will feature the top two rushing teams in the OVC (and two of the Top 12 rushing teams in the nation) as well as the top two defensive squads in the league. Southeast Missouri currently ranks sixth nationally in rushing (254.8 yards/game) while Tennessee State is 12th (235.2 yards/game). The two teams have played 18 times since the Redhawks joined the OVC and the series is knotted at nine apiece. Over the past six seasons the teams have split the series, with the home team winning each game, including a 23-17 TSU victory last year. In that win the Tigers out-rushed the Redhawks 259-88 as Calvin McNairl passed for 95 yards and a touchdown and rushed for 122 yards and two more scores. Matt Scheible passed for 173 yards and two scores for Southeast while also rushed for 61 yards.

SCOUTING TENNESSEE STATE: Tennessee State concluded its stretch of four Classic games for 2010 by topping North Carolina A&T 37-7 in the Circle City Classic at Lucas Oil Stadium in Indianapolis on Saturday. TSU finished the Classic portion of its schedule with a 3-1 record. The win over NCA&T snapped a four-game losing streak to the Aggies, a streak that included a loss to them in the first round of the 1999 NCAA playoffs (which ended TSU's 11-0 perfect season). Junior Dante' Thomas rushed for a career-high 186 yards on 24 carries and scored two touchdowns in the game. He had a long run of 51 on the night. Preston Brown, the nation's No. 3 leading rusher, also did his part, gaining 145 yards on 19 carries and also scoring a touchdown. TSU out-gained the Aggies 379-137 and held a 521-213 advantage in total offense. Safety Eugene Clifford, who was added to the Buck Buchanan Award Watch List on Monday, was named Classic MVP after registering nine tackles and netting an interception.

SCOUTING SOUTHEAST MISSOURI: After winning its fourth game of the season on Saturday, Southeast Missouri finally broke into the Sports Network/Fathead.com Top 25 poll at No. 25. It marks the first time since the 2003 season the Redhawks have been ranked. Southeast is currently one of just 12 FCS teams with four or more wins, and one of just eight to have those wins against all Division I teams. Southeast is ranked among the top teams in the country in several key team categories, including third down conversion (1st), fewest sacks allowed (2nd), fewest yards penalized (3rd) and rushing offense (6th). With the 28-13 road win over Eastern Illinois, the team improved to 3-0 in OVC play for the first time since joining the league in 1991. It also marked the team's first win in Charleston since joining the OVC, and first four-game winning streak (and three-game road win streak) since the 1994 season. Senior Henry Harris was named OVC Offensive Player of the Week for the third-straight week after rushing for 179 yards and two touchdowns and gaining a career-best 286 all-purpose yards (the fifth-highest total by an FCS player this season). Sophomore linebacker Darrick Borum was named OVC Defensive Player of the Week after registering a career-high 10 tackles to go along with two sacks, three tackles-for-loss, an interception, a fumble recovery and a pass break-up. Tylor Brock also did his part for the defense, picking off two passes in the victory.
