THIS WEEK'S OVC HIGHLIGHTS/STORYLINES

In what was arguably the league's biggest win since Eastern Kentucky claimed the 1982 I-AA National Championship, Jacksonville State went on the road and topped SEC foe Ole Miss 49-48 in double overtime on Saturday...The win was the first for an OVC team over an SEC squad since the OVC was formed in 1948; prior to that OVC teams had been 0-22 against SEC teams (prior to the OVC being formed Southeast Missouri topped Ole Miss in 1907 and Tennessee Tech tied Vanderbilt in 1939)...The win was also the first for an OVC team over a Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponent since 2004 (when Eastern Illinois beat Eastern Michigan) and snapped a 50-game losing streak to FBS opponents by OVC schools...Jacksonville State had entered the week ranked No. 17 in the FCS Top 25 polls and vaulted to No. 5 in the Sports Network poll (No. 6 in FCS Coaches) on Monday, the highest ranking for an OVC team since Western Kentucky ended the 2000 season at No. 5...JSU will host Chattanooga this Saturday in a game that will open the new expansion at Burgess-Snow Field at JSU Stadium; Chattanooga is coming off a near upset of Appalachian State last Saturday...This week will include three more games against FBS foes as Eastern Kentucky plays at Louisville, Austin Peay is at Middle Tennessee and Tennessee Tech plays at No. 6 TCU...It also marks the start of Conference play at Southeast Missouri State travels to Murray State for an OVC game.

THIS WEEK'S OVC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

CO-OFFENSIVE

Marques Ivory, QB • Jr., 6-1, 235 • Warner Robins, Ga. • Jacksonville State
Coty Blanchard, QB/P • Fr., 6-0, 180 • Leesburg, Ala. • Jacksonville State

The quarterback duo of Ivory and Blanchard led Jacksonville State to a 49-48 double-overtime win at Ole Miss, the first win for an OVC team over a SEC school since the OVC was formed in 1948. The starter Ivory was 13-for-23 for 126 and two touchdowns while true freshman Blanchard was 9-for-13 for 126 yards and two touchdowns. The duo led the Gamecocks to five straight touchdowns to end the game, as JSU trailed 31-13 entering the fourth quarter. Jax State outscored the Rebels 21-3 in the final quarter behind the two-quarterback attack. Blanchard had a four-yard touchdown with 6:17 left to cut the lead to 31-26 and Ivory had a 19-yard score to Alan Bonner with 18 seconds left to make the score 34-32. Ivory then completed a 2-point conversion pass to La'Ray Williams to force overtime. Each quarterback scored a touchdown in overtime, as Ivory connected for a 7-yard score in the first overtime, and Blanchard completed a 30-yard pass on 4th and 15 in the second overtime. Blanchard then completed a two-point conversion pass to Calvin Middleton to win the game (and earn No. 2 play of the day honors on SportsCenter. The Gamecocks duo did not throw an interception in the game.

DEFENSIVE

Rodney Garrott, LB • Jr., 6-1, 255 • Huntsville, Ala. • Jacksonville State

Garrott played every snap in Jacksonville State's double overtime victory over Ole Miss. The junior tallied 13 total tackles (8 solo), 2.5 tackles-for-loss and forced a fumble. The forced fumble in the first quarter was recovered by a teammate and returned for a touchdown (the Gamecocks first score). He was part of the defensive unit that held the Rebels to just a field goal in the second half as Jax State rallied from a 21-point deficit to tie the game at 34 at the end of regulation. Ole Miss tallied just 54 yards in the third quarter and 52 yards of offense in the fourth quarter.

Rayshawn Weatherspoon, KR • R-Fr., 6-1, 177 • S. Pittsburgh, Tenn. • Tennessee State

The redshirt freshman returned the opening kickoff 89 yards for a touchdown to spark Tennessee State in its 27-14 victory over Alabama A&M in the John Merritt Classic. The return put the Tigers up 6-0 just 14 seconds into the game and helped TSU build a 27-0 halftime lead on its way to the victory. The kickoff return was the longest-ever in the 12-year history of the John Merritt Classic. The defensive back also had a tackle and four pass break-ups in the contest.

NEWCOMER

Coty Blanchard, QB/P • Fr., 6-0, 180 • Leesburg, Ala. • Jacksonville State

Blanchard was instrumental in leading Jacksonville State to a 49-48 double-overtime victory over Ole Miss on Saturday. Splitting time at quarterback, the true freshman was 9-for-13 for 126 ayards and a pair of touchdowns. Blanchard made back-to-back big plays in the second overtime, completing a 30-yard touchdown pass to Kevyn Cooper in the back of the end zone on 4th and 15 to pull the Gamecocks to within one then completing a two-point conversion pass to win the game; the plays earned him the No. 2 play of the day on SportsCenter. As a punter, Blanchard punted four times for an average of 45.5 yards, including a long of 49 yards and another punt that was downed at the Rebel 3-yard line. The win for JSU was the first for an OVC opponent over a SEC foe since the OVC was formed in 1948.

NOTES FROM AROUND THE GRIDIRON

Jacksonville State Tops Ole Miss, Ends 50-Game OVC Losing Streak to FBS

Schools: Jacksonville State's 49-48 double overtime victory over Ole Miss on Sept. 4 helped the OVC end a 50-game losing streak to Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponents that extended back to the 2004 season when Eastern Illinois beat Eastern Michigan 31-28. Jacksonville State nearly ended the streak a season ago, losing in the final minute at Florida State. It was the program's first win over a FBS team since a 31-28 victory at Arkansas State in 2001 (prior to joining the OVC). All-time the OVC is 18-135-1 against FBS schools.

More FCS Over FBS: Jacksonville State's win over Ole Miss was the first for an FCS team over an FBS team this season (North Dakota State beat Kansas later on Sept. 4 to mark the second win for FCS teams). It marked the 19th time since 2004 that an FCS squad had bested an FBS school (20th including NDSU). With two FCS teams beating FBS teams on Sept. 4, it marked the fifth time that had occurred on the same day in the last five years (and first since the 2007 season when it happened three different times).

OVC Finally Tops the SEC: Jacksonville State's victory over Ole Miss also marked the first time since the OVC was formed in 1948 that an OVC team had topped a squad from the Southeastern Conference. Prior to Jax State's victory, the OVC had been 0-22 against SEC teams since the league was formed. Prior to the OVC being formed Southeast Missouri State had topped Ole Miss in 1907 and Tennessee Tech had tied Vanderbilt in 1939 in the only game with positive outcomes for current OVC teams.

Jacksonville State Cracks Top 5 of Sports Network FCS Poll: With its win over Ole Miss, Jacksonville State leaped from 17th to No. 5 in the Sports Network FCS Top 25 poll (the Gamecocks went from 17th to 6th in the FCS Coaches Top 25 poll). The No. 5 ranking is the highest for an OVC team since Western Kentucky was ranked fifth in the final poll of the 2000 season. The last time an OVC team was higher was in 1999 when Tennessee State was No. 1 in the final regular season poll of that season. JSU has now been ranked for 16-straight weeks (its longest stretch since joining the Division I ranks); the No. 5 ranking is the highest for the Gamecocks at the Division I level, besting a No. 12 ranking earned last season.

Tennessee Tech Starts Season With Back-to-Back Top 25 FBS Opponents: Tennessee Tech has the tough task of being one of just four Division I teams (FBS or FCS) to start the 2010 season with two nationally-ranked Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponents. The Golden Eagles lost at No. 17 Arkansas last week and will play at No. 6 TCU this weekend. The other three teams to start the season against two nationally-ranked FBS teams are Marshall (Ohio State and West Virginia), San Jose State (Alabama and Wisconsin) and UNLV (Wisconsin and Utah).

Jacksonville State/Chattanooga Selected for FCS Game of the Week Radio Broadcast:

When Jacksonville State hosts Chattanooga on Sept. 11 at the newly renovated Burgess-Snow Field at JSU Stadium, the game will be broadcast as part of the FCS Game of the Week radio package. This marks the fifth year for the FCS Game of the Week series. The games are brought to the public by Clear Channel Communications, Gino Communications and Broadcaster Marketing Services and heard on WCKY AM 1530 out of Cincinnati. Frank Santore returns for his fifth year as play-by-play voice.

League Announces "OVC Game of the Week" Television Package With Wazoo Sports:

In July 2010 the Ohio Valley Conference announced its a partnership with Wazoo Sports to produce and distribute an "OVC Game of Week" football package for 2010. The 10-game package will begin with Austin Peay at Tennessee State and feature a different game every week through the end of the regular season (Nov. 20). Eight of the 10 games will have a 6 p.m. CT kickoff. Each of the nine OVC football schools will appear on the broadcast at least twice during the season. APSU's Holt Among All-Time Best in FCS in Kickoff Returns: Austin Peay senior **Terrence Holt** is among the best all-time at the FCS level in kickoff returns. Holt broke the FCS all-time kickoff return yardage record in 2009 and currently has 3,636 yards. He is the only player in FCS history to have three 1,000+ yard kickoff return seasons and will look to make that four-straight this year. Holt also holds the FCS career record for total kick return yardage (kickoffs and punt returns) with 4,105 yards. In 2008 Holt broke the NCAA record for kickoff returns in a season (52) and total kick returns (kickoffs plus punts) with 66.

EKU's Caldwell on Buck Buchanan Watch List: Eastern Kentucky University football player **Jeremy Caldwell** was one of 20 Division I Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) players named to the initial Buck Buchanan Award watch list. The award, which is presented by The Sports Network, is handed out annually to the nation's top FCS defensive player. Caldwell, a junior defensive back from Chattanooga, Tenn., led the Ohio Valley Conference and tied for fourth nationally in the FCS last year with seven interceptions. Besides posting seven interceptions, Caldwell also led the Colonels with six pass break-ups and finished sixth on the team with 48 tackles. Caldwell was the lone OVC player to make the initial watch list. The Buchanan Award watch list can undergo revision during the 2010 season, when updated lists are announced on Oct. 4 and 25. Ballots will be sent to a panel of approximately 200 sports information and media relations directors, broadcasters, writers and other dignitaries following the conclusion of the regular season on Nov. 22. The Buchanan Award will be presented to the FCS national defensive player of the year on Thursday, Jan. 6 in Frisco, Texas - the night before the national championship game. The Buck Buchanan award is named for Junious "Buck" Buchanan, the NAIA All-American and Pro Football Hall of Fame defensive lineman who played for Grambling State University from 1959 through 1962. As a freshman, Buchanan came to Grambling on an "if" scholarship, to receive financial help if he played well. After a season of playing both varsity basketball and football, Buchanan decided to concentrate solely on football. By the time he finished four years at Grambling, his coach, Eddie Robinson, asserted that Buchanan was "... the finest tackle I have ever seen." The Buck Buchanan Award has been handed out annually since 1995. Some of the past winners include Minnesota Vikings' Jared Allen (Idaho State - 2003), Jacksonville Jaguars' Rashean Mathis (Bethune-Cookman - 2002) and Dexter Coakley (Appalachian State - 1995, 1996), who played 10 seasons with the Dallas Cowboys and St. Louis Rams.

A Look at the Coaches: There are two new coaches and seven returnees among the head coaching ranks in the Ohio Valley Conference this season. **Chris Hatcher** takes over at Murray State after tenures at Valdosta State and Georgia Southern and **Rod Reed** is now in charge at Tennessee State (his alma mater) after serving on the staff as an assistant and defensive coordinator. is Eastern Illinois coach **Bob Spoo** who is in his 24th season with the Panthers in 2010. Spoo has 88 total wins while EIU has been a member of the OVC, a mark that ranks fifth in OVC history. Spoo also has 65 Conference victories, which is also fifth all-time. He is just two OVC wins away from passing WKU's Jimmy Feix (67 OVC wins) and moving into fourth place on the all-time list.

FCS Playoff Expansion: For the first time in 2010 the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) playoff field will include 20 teams, up from 16 a year ago. In April 2008 the NCAA Board of Directors approved the expansion. It marks the first expansion since the field grew from 12 to 16 teams in 1997. The field will be comprised of 10 automatic bids (up from 8) and 10 at-large berths. This season there will be four first round matchups (8 total teams), while 12 teams will receive a bye into the second round. For the first time in 2010, the championship game will be played in Frisco, Texas at Pizza Hut Park, a 23,500-seat multi-purpose stadium. The Southland Conference will serve as the host of the championship, which will be held on Friday, Jan. 7.

2010 Marks Fourth Season For Sgt. York Trophy: The 2010 season marks the fourth season for the Sgt. York Trophy, a challenge trophy which goes to the annual winner of the quadrangular season series between the four OVC institutions in the state of Tennessee (Austin Peay, Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech and UT Martin). In July 2007, the Nashville Sports Council and the Ohio Valley Conference announced the creation of the trophy, which is only the second traveling trophy involving more than two schools nationwide (the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy). It is named after Sgt. Alvin C. York, a native of Pall Mall, Tenn. and a Soldier who was one of the most honored of World War I. He received the Congressional Medal of Honor after the war and returned to his home state to dedicate his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee. The trophy goes to the team with the best record against the other schools, and in case of a tie there will be co-champions and the actual trophy will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy. In 2007, Tennessee State and Austin Peay finished in a tie for the trophy with identical 2-1 records; both shared the award but Tennessee State went home with the hardware due to a 1-point win in the head-to-head meeting during the season. Tennessee State went 3-0 in Sgt. York play in 2008 to claim its second trophy. Last year Tennessee Tech claimed the trophy after going undefeated in Sgt. York games.

Preseason Forecasts: For the second-straight season five different schools received at least one first-place vote in the preseason predicted order of finish balloting. Jacksonville State received the most (11 of 18) while Eastern Illinois (4), Eastern Kentucky (1), Tennessee Tech (1) and Tennessee State (1) were also in the mix. JSU was picked first for the third time in the past six seasons. Is being picked first in the preseason poll necessarily a good thing? In the past 31 years of preseason polls (all that were available), the preseason predicted champion has only gone on to win the OVC Championship 12 times (38.7%). Over the past seven years not once has the eventual champion been predicted in the preseason poll (it was last done correctly in 2002).

Players of the Year in a vote on by the league's head football coaches and sports information directors. Eastern Illinois, Jacksonville State and Tennessee Tech each had four selections apiece on the preseason team to lead the league. Eastern Kentucky had the next-most selections with three. Each of the league's nine teams had at least one player on the preseason squad. Returning players who were first-team All-OVC picks last season (12 in total) were automatic selections to the preseason team this year. The squad also included seven players who were second-team selections in 2009. Of the 25 total selections, 13 were seniors, 11 were juniors and there was one sophomore pick.

Let's Get It Started: The 63rd season of Ohio Valley Conference football will get underway on Thursday, Sept. 2 when four OVC squads take to the gridiron; the remaining five schools will play on Saturday, Sept. 4. The OVC is made up of nine football-playing schools in 2010. Since its beginning, 14 of the 18 total schools that have played football in the league have claimed at least one championship.

I-AA No More: Although some people may accidentally still refer to it as I-AA football, the term that represents the level of Division I football in which the Ohio Valley Conference competes has been retired. Beginning with the 2006 National Championship game, the term Football Championship Subdivision (or FCS) is to be used. FCS is the only Division I football rank to host a NCAA-sponsored national championship (one of 88 championships the NCAA sponsors). The division formerly known as I-A was changed to Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and those teams compete for the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) national championship. Teams who play at the FCS level can offer a maximum of 63 scholarships (FBS teams can offer 85) and compete in a 16-team playoff at the end of the season to determine the national champion.

NFL Connections: As of September 1, 18 former Ohio Valley Conference players are on NFL rosters for the 2010 season (14 active players, 4 practice squad members). Those players include former Eastern Illinois standout Tony Romo, a three-time Pro Bowl pick, Cortland Finnegan (Samford), who has been a Pro Bowl defensive back selection with the Tennessee Titans and Tennessee State's Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie, who was a starter for the Arizona Cardinals in Super Bowl XLIII and was a Pro Bowl selection last season. There are three players on NFL rosters who played in the OVC last season including Eastern Illinois offensive linemen Chris Campbell (Green Bay Packers - practice squad) and Otis Hudson (Cincinnati Bengals - practice squad) and Murray State defensive lineman Austen Lane (Jacksonville Jaguars). Six of the nine current OVC football schools have at least one player in the NFL with Tennessee State leading the way with four active players (and one practice squad member). Several NFL coaches also have connections to OVC schools, including three who went to Eastern Illinois, the "Cradle of NFL Head Coaches." Those coaches include Brad Childress (Minnesota), Super Bowl champion Sean Payton (New Orleans) and Mike Shanahan (Washington). UT Martin graduate and former assistant coach Jerry Reese made waves in 2007 when he led the New York Giants to Super Bowl XLII in his first season as General Manager with the franchise.

OVCsports.TV: For the fifth consecutive year, fans can watch every Conference matchup and all non-conference home contests at OVCsports.TV. The venture with NeuLion (formerly JumpTV Sports) allows fans to access live and on-demand streaming video and audio of all conference matchups on their home computer. The premium Web site was launched in July 2006 and streamed over a thousand events in its first four seasons, including all Conference matchups in football and men's and women's basketball as well as select baseball, soccer, softball and volleyball games and OVC Championship events. Packages are available on a yearly, seasonally, monthly or per-event basis.

SGT. YORK TROPHY

The 2010 season marks the fourth of competition for the Sergeant York Trophy, an award created by the Nashville Sports Council and the Ohio Valley Conference. The trophy is contested between the four OVC schools in the state of Tennessee - Austin Peay, Tennessee State, Tennessee Tech and UT Martin - and go to the team with the best combined record versus those schools in a given year.

In the event of a tie, the award will be shared; however, the previous winner will retain the trophy if they are part of the tie. If the tie is between two other institutions, the trophy will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy.

The award is only the second traveling trophy that involves more than two teams in college sports; the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy which has been contested between Air Force, Army and Navy annually since 1972. The award is named in honor of Alvin C. York, the most noted Soldier of World War I. Upon his return to the United States in 1919, he was bestowed the Congressional Medal of Honor. Following the war York returned his home in Pall Mall, Tenn. where he dedicated his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee.

The award will be presented annually at the Nashville Sports Council's O'Charley's Dinner of Champions (held in March of each year).

Tennessee State and Austin Peay shared the inaugural award after compiling 2-1 records in round robin play last year. Tennessee State took home the trophy, however, by winning the individual matchup with Austin Peay by one point in overtime. Tennessee State claimed the 2008 trophy after going 3-0 in Sgt. York games. Last season Tennessee Tech won all three of its Sgt. York games to claim the 2009 trophy.

GAME NOTES: This will be the first-ever meeting between the two schools. It is the home opener for the Panthers who will retire the No. 18 of Sean Payton, the former EIU quarterback who is now the head coach of the NFL's New Orleans Saints.

SCOUTING CENTRAL ARKANSAS: Central Arkansas is in its first season of Division I postseason eligibility after completing the reclassification process from Division II. The Bears have been a member of the 'Southland Conference since 2007, playing a full league schedule since that season. In the team's easy win over Elizabeth City State University to start the season, junior quarterback Nathan Dick completed 26-of-35 passes for 351 yards and three touchdowns in his first start at UCA (he is a transfer from Arkansas). Senior wideout Kenneth Robey catches nine of those passes for 151 yards and three scores. The Bears racked up 585 yards of total offense, including 407 of those yards in the first half as they jumped out to a 27-14 advantage.

SCOUTING EASTERN ILLINOIS: Eastern Illinois opened the season against the 9th ranked team from the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS), the Iowa Hawkeyes. The No. 9-ranked FBS opponent was the highest that any Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) team played last week and the Panthers played them tough, losing 37-7. It was the highest-ranked opponent the EIU program had ever faced. Despite the loss to the highly-regarded Hawkeyes, the Panthers dropped several spots in both FCS Top 25 polls. EIU fell five spots from 18th to 23rd in the Sports Network/FatHead.com poll and six spots from 16th to No. 22 in the FCS Coaches Poll. In his Division I debut, redshirt sophomore quarterback Brandon Large completed 13-of-20 passes for 92 yards and a touchdown. He was sacked only twice behind a young Panther offensive line that was facing one of the top defensive lines in the country. Kenny Whittaker was his favorite target, pulling in four passes. Playing without its leading rusher Mon Williams, who is injured, Cody Bruns and Jimmy Potempa ran for 36 and 21 yards respectively as the team managed 65 yards on the ground. Nick Martinez led the way with nine tackles and a forced fumble on defense. Despite having one attempt blocked, senior punter Kevin Cook did average 45.1 yards per punt (7 attempts) with a long of 58 yards.

GAME NOTES: For the 11th-straight season and 20th time overall Eastern Kentucky is facing a team from the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS). ECU is 4-15 in those contests since 1978 with its last win over a FBS team coming in 1985, a 45-21 victory over Louisville. The in-state foes have played 25 times over the years, but not since the 1991 season. The series dates all the way back to a 1927 meeting which UofL won 21-13 in Richmond.

SCOUTING EASTERN KENTUCKY: Eastern Kentucky is looking to rebound from its season-opening loss at Missouri State, a game which was delayed a day due to bad weather. ECU was set to open the season Thursday night before a line of thunderstorms that contained lightning postponed the game until 1 p.m. on Friday. Despite losing the game sophomore quarterback T.J. Pryor, a Louisville native, passed for a career-high 315 yards in the loss. It was the first time since the 2007 season (Allan Holland) that the Colonels had a quarterback break the 300-yard mark. During the game the ECU defense blocked a Missouri State punt; a season ago the Colonels led the OVC with 10 blocked kicks (punt, field goal or PAT) while recording at least one in seven of the 11 games of the 2009 season. One of the team's key defensive players, cornerback Jeremy Caldwell (who is on the Buck Buchanan Award Watch List) was limited to just a few plays in the fourth quarter; the junior is recovering from a hernia. Senior kicker Logan O'Connor did make 3-of-4 field goals in the game, including a 47-yarder into the wind to end the first half. The loss to Missouri State did extend the team's losing streak in road non-conference games to 17 games; ECU has not won a road non-conference tilt since beating Liberty on Nov. 2, 2002.

SCOUTING LOUISVILLE: Louisville opened up its first season under new head coach Charlie Strong a week ago with rival Kentucky, falling to the Wildcats 23-16 at the newly expanded Papa John's Cardinal Stadium. The game was played in front of a PJCS record 55,327 fans. UofL fell behind early but trimmed the advantage in the second half to make it a seven-point contest. Senior running back Bilal Powell rushed for a career-high 153 yards, including an 80-yard touchdown scamper in the third quarter. The Cards were strong on special teams, as junior kicker Chris Philpott hit 3-of-3 field goal attempts, including a long of 44 yards. Senior quarterback Adam Froman completed 14 passes for 129 yards. The Cardinals coach came to Louisville after spending seven seasons as the defensive coordinator for the Florida Gators, including winning two national championships.

GAME NOTES: Both Jacksonville State and Chattanooga are coming off games against big-time opponents last week as the Gamecocks topped Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) foe Ole Miss on the road while Chattanooga nearly pulled the upset against third-ranked Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) foe Appalachian State at home. Both games were decided by one point and came down to two-point conversion attempts (one that JSU converted and one that UTC did not). The all-time series dates back to a 5-0 game in the 1904 season and the two teams have squared off 34 times overall. The teams played every year from 2004-08 but did not play a season ago. Two years ago Jacksonville State won 31-3, its third-straight win (and 4th in the last five game) in the series since it was renewed after a 21-year break. Jax State is the first of two OVC opponents for the Mocs this season; UTC will host Eastern Kentucky next week at Finley Stadium. The game features the debut of the newly expanded JSU Stadium, which can now seat 24,000 fans.

SCOUTING CHATTANOOGA: Despite coming up with the loss on Saturday, Chattanooga played well against one of the top FCS teams in the country. The Mocs led by 21 points (35-14) early in the fourth quarter only to see App State storm back to pull off the one-point victory. After trailing 42-35 Chattanooga scored a touchdown with one minute left and decided to go for the two-point conversion after the team had missed three extra point attempts earlier in the game; the pass attempt, however, was incomplete. Mocs quarterback B.J. Coleman completed 23 passes for 340 yards and three touchdowns without being picked off. Chattanooga is coached by former Moc defensive back Russ Huesman, who won six games last season, the same total the program had won the previous three years combined. He was named 2009 Southern Conference Coach of the Year for his efforts.

SCOUTING JACKSONVILLE STATE: Jacksonville State made the biggest splash the first weekend of college football, topping SEC foe Ole Miss in double overtime (49-48) on Saturday. The win was the first for an OVC squad over an SEC team (since the league was formed in 1948) and snapped a 50-game losing streak by OVC teams to FBS squads (dating back to 2004). Things were not looking good for the Gamecocks when they trailed 31-10 at halftime and then 31-13 entering the fourth quarter. But following an early fourth quarter rushing score, the Gamecocks got a 4-yard touchdown from freshman Coty Blanchard to James Shaw with 6:17 to play to trim the lead to 31-26. After Ole Miss added a field goal starter Marques Ivory found Alan Bonner for a 19-yard score with 18 seconds left to pull JSU to within two. Ivory then converted a pass to La'Ray Williams for the two-point conversion to force overtime. After both teams scored in overtime, Ole Miss once again scored to start the second overtime. Facing a 4th and 15 from the 30-yard line Blanchard hit Kevyn Cooper for a touchdown in the back of the end zone to pull JSU to within a point. Head coach Jack Crowe decided to roll the dice and go for the two-points, as Blanchard found Calvin Middleton on a scoop pass to pull the upset victory. Ivory and Blanchard combined for 252 yards (126 apiece) and four touchdowns, as the duo split OVC Offensive Player of the Week honors. After netting 13 tackles, Rodney Garrott was named OVC Defensive Player of the Week.

GAME NOTES: OVC play starts early for Southeast Missouri State and Murray State who begin play a week ahead of four other teams and two weeks ahead of the rest of the league. The regional rivals are meeting for the 45th time overall, with Murray State holding a large advantage in the series (36-7-1). Southeast Missouri, however, got the most of the Racers a season ago, winning 49-13 at Houck Stadium. Running back Henry Harris and Mike Jones each had two touchdowns as the Redhawks racked up 302 yards of rushing for the first time since the 2006 season. Overall Southeast had 200 more yards of total offense (493-293) than Murray State did. Southeast quarterback Matt Scheible completed six passes for 188 yards and two scores. Last week both teams started the 2010 season with road games against teams from the Mid-American Conference (MAC).

SCOUTING SOUTHEAST MISSOURI: In its first game of the season Southeast Missouri traveled to Ball State, losing 27-10 in front of 10,753 fans. The game was tight early, as the teams were deadlocked at 7-7 at halftime, prior to BSU scoring two touchdowns in a span of 4:32 early in the second half. Early in the game senior Mike Jones scored on an 11-yard run, marking the program's first touchdown against a Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) team since 2006 at Arkansas (the team was held without touchdowns in its last three FBS games). Sophomore kicker Drew Gelbach would later add a 53-yard field goal on his first career attempt; it marked the second-straight season the team had converted a field goal of longer than 50 yards (Doug Spada also made a 53-yard last season). The Redhawks had three defenders finish with 10 or more tackles, including linebackers Justin Woodlief and Joshua Jackson who had 13 apiece. Preseason All-OVC pick J.J. Sanchez added 10 stops. Fifth-year senior tailback Henry Harris racked up 13 all-purpose yards on the night, including a career-high eight receptions for 82 yards.

SCOUTING MURRAY STATE: The debut of Chris Hatcher as Murray State's coach came last Thursday at Kent State. The Racers were within a touchdown late in the second quarter before KSU converted on a 49-yard touchdown pass to bring the halftime margin to 24-10. The Golden Flash then ran back the second half kickoff to put the game out of reach at 31-10. Senior quarterback Jeff Ehrhardt completed 30 passes for 258 yards and a score. The 30 completions were the seventh-most in Murray State single-game history. Eleven of those completions were to senior Marcus Harris who had 181 all-purpose yards on the night (79 receiving, 98 kickoff return, 8 punt return). Freshman wideout Arthur Brackett caught five passes for 78 yards including a 42-yard touchdown on a fourth down play in his collegiate debut. The team did struggle running the ball, rushing for just 21 total yards and netting -65. Junior Kienan Cullen averaged 42.2 yards on 10 total punts, including two that were over 50 yards in length. He also nailed a 42-yard field goal in his only attempt of the night.

GAME NOTES: Two long-term rivals get together on Saturday night in the 21st annual Southern Heritage Classic at the Liberty Bowl in Memphis. This marks the 17th year in a row (and 19th overall) that the teams have squared off in this Classic which began in 1990 (the two other games were between TSU and Mississippi Valley State and Grambling). Tennessee State has won seven straight in the series including a 14-7 victory a season ago. Four of the last five meetings have been determined by a combined 18 points (including two of those that went into overtime). Tennessee State is 11-9 all-time in the event while Jackson State is 7-11. The all-time series between the two schools is at 24-18-2 in favor of Tennessee State.

SCOUTING TENNESSEE STATE: Tennessee State kickoff off the Rod Reed Era with a victory on Saturday night, topping rival 27-14 Alabama A&M in the 12th annual John Merritt Classic. A crowd of more than 22,000 showed up at LP Field to see the victory which started off with a bang. Redshirt freshman defensive back Rayshawn Weatherspoon took the opening kickoff 89 yards for a touchdown to put TSU up 6-0 just 14 seconds into the game. That marked the first kickoff return for a touchdown in JMC history and earned Weatherspoon OVC Specialist of the Week honors. Tennessee State would add three more touchdowns in the second quarter to take a 27-0 lead into halftime. The score would remain that way until the fourth quarter when A&M scored two touchdowns. Jeremy Perry, making his first start at quarterback for the Tigers was named Offensive MVP of the Classic after completing 11-of-21 passes for 127 yards and two touchdowns. Both of his scores went to Joseph Hills who had five catches for 67 yards overall. Senior defensive back Eugene Clifford was named Defensive MVP after registered eight tackles and an interception that led to a TSU touchdown. Overall the TSU defense had seven sacks against the Bulldogs, a team they had lost three-straight games to.

SCOUTING JACKSON STATE: Jackson State opened the season with a 32-17 victory at home over Delta State on Saturday in the third annual W.C. Gordon Classic. The JSU defense, which was ranked near the top in the FCS in defense, saw junior defensive back Tim Dandridge pick off two passes and return one of those for a 30-yard touchdown that tied the game at seven in the first quarter. The Tigers junior transfer quarterback Casey Therriault completed 27-of-47 for 404 yards and three touchdowns. His favorite target was Marcell Wilder who grabbed seven passes for 88 yards and a score.

GAME NOTES: For the second week in a row Tennessee Tech is traveling to a nationally-ranked team from the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS). Last week the Golden Eagles lost at No. 17 Arkansas; this week they play at No. 6 TCU. TTU is one of just four teams at the Division I level to start the season with back-to-back games against nationally-ranked FBS foes. This is the first-ever meeting between the two teams. This season marks the last at Amon G. Carter Stadium before a \$105 million dollar renovation starts following the last home game on Nov. 13. TCU head coach Gary Patterson, who guided the team to a 12-1 record and BCS berth last season on his way to nine national Coach of the Year honors, earned his master's degree from Tennessee Tech. Patterson was the linebackers coach at TTU from 1983-84 along with Dick Bumpas, who is now TCU's defensive coordinator.

SCOUTING TENNESSEE TECH: Tennessee Tech opened the season at Southeastern Conference foe Arkansas, leading 3-0 after the first quarter thanks to a 27-yard field goal by Matthew Barker. The Razorbacks, however, would score 23 unanswered points in the second quarter behind Heisman hopeful quarterback Ryan Mallett and not look back. Senior Dustin Dillehay did pick off Mallett in the first quarter and later forced a fumble. The interception was the fourth of Dillehay's career. In his first career start sophomore quarterback Tre Lamb completed 6-of-13 passes for 99 yards. The Golden Eagles also rushed for a net of 79 yards with Cass Barnes gaining 31 on eight carries. Marty Jones had 10 tackles and a forced fumble for the TTU defense.

SCOUTING TCU: After an opening weekend victory over No. 24 Oregon State, TCU is 27-3 in its last 30 games overall. Seven of the team's last eight victories have been by at least 27 points, and TCU has a 14-game home winning streak. In the win over Oregon State, in a game played at Cowboy Stadiums in Arlington, Andy Dalton ran for two touchdowns and threw for another to lead the offense. It marked the 30th victory under center for Dalton, who became TCU's winningest all-time quarterback (passing "Slingin'" Sammy Baugh). TCU gained 453 yards of total offense while holding the Beavers to just 255 yards on the day. The team improved to 46-2 under Patterson when they rush for at least 200 yards on the ground.

GAME NOTES: UT Martin and Southeastern Louisiana will renew an old rivalry that dates back to the 1970s when both were at one time members of the Gulf South Conference. The teams last played in the 1981 season, when Southeastern won 13-10 in Hammond. The only win in the previous four meetings for the Skyhawks came in the only game played in Martin, which was during the 1975 season (23-7).

SCOUTING UT MARTIN: UT Martin had the unenviable task of traveling to Knoxville to face Tennessee in the first game of the Derek Dooley era. Playing in front of 99,123 fans (the largest crowd to ever see a UT Martin game and the second-largest crowd to ever see an OVC team play) at Neyland Stadium the Skyhawks were shutout 50-0 in the first-ever meeting between the two schools from the same University system. The shutout ended a streak of 57-straight games with points for UTM, dating back to a shutout loss against Murray State in 2004. One player who was busy on the day was junior punter Joe Hook, who punted 10 times for an average of 41.7 yards. Hook had a long of 53 yards (a career-best) and had two downed inside the UT 20-yard line. Junior strong safety Kendal Harper came up with two turnovers for the Skyhawks. Harper had a fumble recovery and also an interception during the game. Offensively UT Martin managed just three first downs and 142 yards of total offense (compared to UT's 537 yards).

SCOUTING SOUTHEASTERN LOUISIANA: In a week that saw two Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) teams knock off Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) foes, Southeastern Louisiana nearly made it three as the Lions pushed Tulane to the brink in a game played at the Louisiana Superdome last Thursday night. Southeastern had a 266-252 advantage in total yards and more first downs than the Green Wave (17 to 15), but committed four turnovers that ultimately led to the loss. The Lions defense held Tulane to just four first downs in the second half as they nearly came back to pull off the upset. Senior Tommy Connors was named Southland Defensive Player of the Week after totaling seven tackles, a sack and forcing a fumble in the game. Offensively Tyler Beatty completed 17-of-34 passes for 202 yards while sophomore running back Zeke Jones had 61 yards and 12 carries.

GAME NOTES: Austin Peay will renew and old rivalry with former Ohio Valley Conference foe Middle Tennessee State on Saturday when the two in-state rivals face off at Floyd Stadium. The two teams have played 52 times over the years but not since the 1997 season which was one year after Austin Peay left the OVC for a 10-year period to play non-scholarship football (APSU returned to the OVC in the 2007 season). Middle Tennessee would leave the OVC after the 1998 season to begin its move to the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS). The Blue Raiders won 11 OVC titles in its tenure with the league (1952-98), the second-most all-time behind only Eastern Kentucky.

SCOUTING AUSTIN PEAY: Austin Peay opened the season with a convincing 38-6 victory over a lower division Cumberland squad. It marked the second-straight season APSU had won its season-opener, the first time that has happened to the program since 1987 and 1988. Head coach Rick Christophel is now 3-1 in season openers at Austin Peay (losing only to North Dakota State in 2008). Austin Peay got a strong performance from Preseason OVC Offensive Player of the Year Terrence Holt, who rushed for 127 yards on 14 carries (9.0 ypc) and had 53 yards in kickoff returns. Holt led all FCS players in all-purpose yards/game in 2009. Holt's total pushed his career all-purpose yards total to 5,630 yards, which allowed him to pass Chris Fletcher for the Austin Peay all-time record in that category. Wesley Kitts added 109 rushing yards while Ryan White, who led the OVC in rushing a season ago, had 87 yards on 11 carries. Overall the team had 306 rushing yards and averaged 7.3 yards/carry. Delton Teeter came up with one of two interceptions for the Govs defense and returned his pick 66 yards for a touchdown, the first time the team had done that since the 2008 season. Stephen Stansell was a perfect 5-of-5 on extra point attempts and connected on a 41-yard field goal in the game.

SCOUTING MIDDLE TENNESSEE: Middle Tennessee, coming off an 10-3 season and win in the New Orleans Bowl in 2009, opened the 2010 season last Thursday night with a narrow 24-17 loss to Minnesota at home in front of the fourth-largest crowd at Floyd Stadium (25,908). The Blue Raiders led the Golden Gophers 17-14 in the third quarter before Minnesota tied the game on a 20-yard field goal with 14:11 to play. Minnesota would then take the lead for good with 3:09 to play. MTSU would fumble the ball on the ensuing kickoff as Minnesota held on to win. In his first games as the starting quarterback Logan Kilgore (in place of Dwight Dasher who is suspended while the NCAA looks into his eligibility) was 13-of-18 for 172 yards and a touchdown. On the ground Philip Tanner rushed for 75 yards and a score. Antwan Davis led the defense with 12 tackles and a half of a sack.
