## THIS WEEK'S OVC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

### PLAYER

#### Isaiah Canaan, G • So., 6-0, 175 • Biloxi, Miss. • Murray State

Canaan averaged 17.0 points, 2.5 rebounds, 1.5 steals and 1.0 assists/game last week as Murray State won two games to increase its home court winning streak to 23 games, the fourth-longest streak nationally. The sophomore also hit 73.3 percent (11-of-15) of his field goal attempts and 70 percent (7-of-10) of his 3-point attempts in the two wins. Canaan scored a game-high 19 points in the team's victory over Western Kentucky on Saturday, including hitting four-straight 3-pointers at one stretch when the game was in the balance in the second half. The Racers went on to top their in-state rival 69-60. To open the week Canaan scored 15 points, grabbed four rebounds, had two assists and three steals in a 94-52 victory over Bethel. Canaan is the first Murray State player to be named OVC Player of the Week since Ivan Aska won the award the first week of the 2009-10 season (Nov. 16).

### NEWCOMER

#### Kenny Moore, F • Jr., 6-7, 220 • Philadelphia, Pa. • Tennessee State

In his only game last week, a 70-64 overtime victory over Morehead State, Moore recorded his second-straight double-double by scoring 19 points and pulling down 11 rebounds for Tennessee State. The junior transfer from Midland College hit 6-of-9 (66.7%) field goals, 5-of-6 (83.3%) free throws and 2-of-3 (66.7%) 3-pointers. Moore also had two steals and an assist as Tennessee State won for its fourth-straight game. Moore now ranks fifth in the OVC in scoring (15.1 points/game) and second in rebounding (8.3 rebounds/game).

### FRESHMAN

#### Lucas Nutt, G • R-Fr., 6-1, 180 • Jonesboro, Ark. • Southeast Missouri

Nutt recorded his second career double-double by scoring 16 points and dishing out 10 assists (tied for the most by a player in the OVC this season) as Southeast Missouri won 76-67 at Jacksonville State on Sunday. The win snapped a 15-game road losing streak for the Redhawks dating back over a year. Nutt made three field goals and was a perfect 9-of-9 at the free throw line as Southeast hit 22-of-26 charity stripe attempts as a team in the second half. Nutt also pulled down four rebounds and had a steal in the victory.

## NOTES FROM AROUND THE LEAGUE

**OVC Overview/This Week's Highlights:** The second set of Conference games prior to the new year started this weekend with one OVC game this past Saturday and three more on Sunday...All 10 OVC teams will be back in action this Tuesday and the teams play another OVC opponent...Following that set of games the teams will not play another OVC game until January 3rd and 6th...Entering this week Austin Peay (3-0) and Tennessee Tech (2-0) are the only OVC teams left undefeated in league play, as Morehead State dropped its first game on Sunday in overtime at Tennessee State...Also on Sunday Southeast Missouri State went on the road and topped Jacksonville State, ending a 15-game road losing streak that dated back to a win over Tennessee State on Dec. 5, 2009; just a week earlier the Redhawks had snapped a 18-game overall losing streak, a mark that dated back to the last eight games of the 2009-10 season...Southeast Missouri has now won back-to-back games for the first time since Jan. 2 and Jan. 5, 2008, a span of 87 games between back-to-back victories; however, those victories were later forfeited due to NCAA violations, meaning you have to go back to Feb. 3 and Feb. 8 of the 2006-07 season to find the last time Southeast won back-to-back games that stayed on their all-time record...This week's action includes just the Tuesday set of Conference games and two games for SIU Edwardsville in the Las Vegas Classic...In NBA news, former UT Martin All-American Lester Hudson, who was cut by the Washington Wizards earlier this season, was re-signed by the team on Monday, Dec. 20.

**Faried Nets 20/20 Game:** Morehead State's **Kenneth Faried** had a monster game at SIU Edwardsville on Nov. 28, scoring 25 points and pulling down 20 rebounds in a win. That is one of just two 20/20 games at the Division I level this season. Faried also had a 20/20 game last season (23 points, 21 rebounds at Tennessee State); that was one of just nine 20/20 efforts nationally during the 2009-10 season. That game is one of nine double-doubles for Faried this season (in 11 total games), which ranks first nationally. For his career Faried has 65 career double-doubles, which is the most nationally among active players.

**Austin Peay Knows Overtime:** So far this season Austin Peay has played four overtime games, the most of any Division I team. Princeton and Wofford have each played three overtime games this season while there are 29 other teams who have played two overtime periods.

**Home Court Overall Winning Streaks:** Entering this week Murray State has the longest home court winning streak among OVC teams at 23 games. That streak currently ranks fourth nationally. Morehead State's 19-game home court winning streak is currently seventh nationally. Kansas has the nation's longest home court winning streak (65).

**Home Court Conference Winning Streaks:** Entering this week Morehead State has a 20-game home court winning streak in Conference games, a streak that dates back to the last game of the 2007-08 season (which was a loss). MSU was undefeated at home in 2008-09 and 2009-10 and is 2-0 in OVC play this season. Xavier (32 games) currently has the longest home court conference winning streak.

**The OVC Among NCAA Statistical Leaders:** In the latest NCAA statistical leaders release (Dec. 20), Tennessee Tech ranks ninth in steals (10.2/game), Morehead State ranks 10th in rebounding margin (+9.3) and Tennessee State is 11th in free throw percentage (77.8%). Individually Morehead State's **Kenneth Faried** is first nationally in rebounding (14.0/game) and double-doubles (9), fourth in field goal percentage (64.5%), 16th in steals (2.5/game), 53rd in points (18.6 points/game) and 54th in blocks (2.0 blocks/game). Murray State's **B.J. Jenkins** is fifth in free throw percentage (94.5%).

**Morehead State 20th, Murray State 21st in CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major Poll:** After finishing last season with an OVC-record 31 wins, Murray State finished the 2009-10 season ranked sixth in the CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major poll. This season the Racers began the year fifth in that poll while Morehead State appeared in the poll for the first time this season on Dec. 6, entering at No. 19. In the Dec. 13 poll Morehead State was 20th and Murray State 21st (the Dec. 20 poll was not yet available at release time). Now in its 12th season, the Mid-Major poll is made up of team's from the following conferences: America East, Atlantic Sun, Big Sky, Big South, Big West, Colonial, Great West, Horizon, Independents, Ivy, Metro Atlantic, Mid-American, Mid-Eastern, Missouri Valley, Northeast, Ohio Valley, Patriot, Southern, Southland, Southwestern, Summit,

## 2011 OVC TOURNAMENT

The 2011 Ohio Valley Conference Men's & Women's Tournaments will be held March 2-5 at Municipal Auditorium in Nashville, Tenn. For the first time since 1996, the entire tournament will be held at one site (instead of first round games being played on campus sites). The tournament has also switched to a merit-based format with the No. 1 and 2 seeds getting double byes into the semifinals and the No. 3 and 4 seeds getting a bye into the quarterfinals.

The first round and quarterfinal games (which start at 12 and 2 p.m. for the women, and 6 and 8 p.m. for the men) can be seen on OVCsports.TV. The men's semifinals will be held on Friday, March 4 at 7 and 9 p.m. and televised on ESPN2 with the championship game on Saturday, March 5 at 7 p.m. and televised live on ESPN2. The women's semifinals are set for 12 and 2 p.m. on March 4 (televised on OVCsports.TV) and the women's championship game is set for March 5 at 3:00 p.m. (TV TBD).

This marks the 17th time in 18 years that the tournament has been held in Nashville.

**CREDENTIALS.** For the second year in a row, credentials will be requested through an online system. That information will be available in January. **The deadline to request credentials is MONDAY, FEB. 28 at Noon.** No credentials will be mailed; they can be picked up at Media Will-Call, located at the back entrance of the arena (at the intersection of 5th Ave. North and Gay Street).





Sun Belt, West Coast. It is voted upon by coaches from those conferences, with one coach per conference casting a vote (Murray State's Billy Kennedy is the OVC representative).

**OVC Tournament Makes Moves to Municipal Auditorium with More Teams, New Format:** Beginning this season the OVC Basketball Tournament will move to Municipal Auditorium in Nashville as its new annual home. This year's event will mark the 17th time in the last 18 years the league's marquee event has been held in Music City, USA (2002 was the lone year the event was not held in Nashville). It marks the sixth time the combined men's and women's tournament has been held in Municipal, following the 1994, 1995, 1996, 2004 and 2008 events (a men's only event was also held there in 1989). New this season is the fact that all eight men's and all eight women's teams that qualify for the tournament field will gather at a single site for the entire tournament (previously first round games were played on campus sites with the semifinals and finals being held in Nashville). That marks the first time since 1996 that the entire tournament has been held at one site. The bracket also shifts from a traditional 1 vs. 8, 2 vs. 7, etc. format to a merit-based format that rewards the top teams during the regular season with byes into the quarterfinals and semifinals (the No. 1 and 2 seeds will receive double byes into the semifinals while the No. 3 and 4 seeds will receive a bye into the quarterfinals). The 2011 OVC Men's and Women's Basketball Championship dates are March 2-5.

**Loos is All-Time Winningest Coach in OVC History:** With a 68-66 victory at Ohio on Dec. 9 of last season, Austin Peay head coach **Dave Loos** recorded his 320th career victory while in the OVC, a mark that ranks first all-time. Loos passed Cal Luther (319 wins at Murray State and UT Martin) for the all-time mark. Loos, the Dean of OVC coaches, is now in his 21st year at Austin Peay where he also serves as the Athletics Director, making him the only Division I head men's basketball coach to hold that distinction. Loos is one of just 14 active Division I coaches to have coached at the same school for 20 or more years. Loos now has 338 victories in his tenure at Austin Peay and 420 for his career.

**More on Municipal Auditorium:** As part of the deal to host the tournament at Municipal Auditorium, the Nashville City Council and Municipal Auditorium committed \$200,000 to improvements at the venue, which opened in 1962. Among the major improvements that will be completed prior to this year's championship are upgrades to the dressing rooms, two new scoreboards and the new OVC-branded playing surface. The floor, which was unveiled at the league's Media Day event in October, was built by Horner Sports Flooring (<http://www.hornerflooring.com>), whose corporate headquarters are in Dollar Bay, Mich. The company has made floors for many collegiate and National Basketball Association (NBA) teams, including building the floor for the 2010 NBA All-Star Game which was held at Texas Stadium. The Horner Pro King portable floor at Municipal Auditorium was purchased for a cost of \$71,960; the court will be used for the OVC Tournament, various high school games/tournaments and special events such as the Harlem Globetrotters.

**Faried Named to Naismith Award Watch List:** Morehead State senior **Kenneth Faried** is one of 50 players named to the 2010-11 Naismith Award preseason watch list as announced by the Atlanta Tipoff Club. The Naismith Trophy is the most prestigious national award presented annually to college basketball's player of the year. Faried is the reigning OVC Player and Defensive Player of the Year, and was named this year's OVC Preseason Player of the Year. Last year, he averaged 16.9 points and 13.0 rebounds per game, leading the nation with 456 total rebounds. He also led the conference with 67 blocked shots and collected 56 steals on his way to honorable mention All-American honors. This year's diverse list includes the top men's college basketball players from 44 schools around the country. The watch list was compiled by the Atlanta Tipoff Club's Board of Selectors, which based its criteria on player performances from the previous year and expectations for the 2010-11 college basketball season. The Naismith Trophy presented by AT&T will be awarded at the 2011 NCAA Men's Final Four in Houston.

**Faried Named Candidate for Lowe's Senior CLASS Award:** Morehead State senior center **Kenneth Faried** is one of 30 candidates for the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award in men's basketball. To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence - community, classroom, character and competition. An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School®, the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities. The candidate class will be narrowed to 10 men's finalists midway through the regular season, and those names will be placed on the official ballot. Ballots will be distributed through a nationwide voting system to media, coaches and fans, who will select one finalist who best exemplifies excellence in the four Cs of community, classroom, character and competition.

**The 2010-11 Season:** The 2010-11 season marks the 63rd of competition in the OVC. Over the previous 62 years, 12 different teams have claimed an OVC regular season championship, including three different schools in the past three years.

**OVC Has Postseason Success:** After several years of not having much postseason success, OVC teams have turned it around the past two years. Each of the last two years the league has sent three teams to the postseason, including Murray State to the NCAA Tournament and Eastern Kentucky and Morehead State to the College Basketball Invitational (CBI) last season. The biggest splash came from No. 13 seed Murray State who knocked off No. 4 seed Vanderbilt 66-65 in the NCAA Tournament when Danero Thomas hit a jumper at the buzzer. It was the

first time an OVC team had won a First Round NCAA Tournament game since 1989 (when MTSU beat Florida State) and marked the second year in a row the league had won a NCAA Tournament game (Morehead State beat Alabama State in the Opening Round game in 2009). Murray State would lose to eventual national runner-up Butler in the Second Round, falling 54-52. Morehead State would win its first game in the CBI, marking the first time since 1988 that two different OVC teams had won postseason games in the same season.

**OVC Teams to Once Again Compete in ESPN BracketBusters Series:** For the sixth-straight season every OVC team will compete in the ESPN BracketBusters series in 2010-11. Now it its ninth year, ESPN BracketBusters is an ESPN television property that was tremendously successful with its first eight events. The event has allowed Division I conferences to participate in a cutting-edge format that involves "wild card" pairings from the pool of participating teams, with half of the ESPN BracketBusters teams pre-designated as "home" and the remaining half as "road" teams. This year there are 114 teams from 15 conferences in the pool of teams who will be selected for one of 11 nationally-televised games. Teams not selected for a television game will be paired up with other teams in the pool for games that will be played on Saturday, Feb. 19. The matchups will be announced on January 31. OVC schools are 19-37 all-time in the BracketBusters event.

**OVC Players in the NBA:** Entering the season there was just one former OVC player on a NBA roster. Former UT Martin All-American **Lester Hudson** began the year on the roster of the Washington Wizards but was waived on Nov. 22. Hudson, however, was re-signed by the Wizards on Dec. 20. Hudson was a two-time OVC Player of the Year at UT Martin before being selected No. 58 overall by the Boston Celtics in the 2009 NBA Draft. Hudson spent half of his rookie season with the Celtics before finishing the year with the Memphis Grizzlies and in the NBA Development League. There are also three former OVC players playing in the NBA Development League as former Tennessee Tech standout **Willie Jenkins** is with the Idaho Stampede and Jacksonville State's **Walker Russell** (Fort Wayne Mad Ants) and **Amadou Mbodji** (Utah Flash) are also in the league.

**Murray State Picked as Preseason Co-Favorites:** In a vote of Ohio Valley Conference head men's basketball coaches and sports information directors, Murray State received 18 first-place votes and was picked as the favorite for the 2010-11 season. Last season Murray State won an OVC-record 31 games on its way to the OVC regular season and tournament championship as well as a NCAA Tournament first round victory over No. 4 seed Vanderbilt. It marks the 14th time in the last 22 years that Murray State has been picked the preseason favorite and third in a row (they were tabbed co-favorites with Morehead State last season). Murray State received 162 total points and was followed next by Morehead State (2 first-place votes, 146 points), who was a consensus No. 2 pick. Eastern Illinois was picked third (123) and was followed by Austin Peay (107), Eastern Kentucky (92), Tennessee Tech (85), Tennessee State (81), Jacksonville State (51), Southeast Missouri (41) and UT Martin (20).

**Preseason Predictions:** Is being picked the preseason favorite, always a good thing? Over the past 31 years of preseason polls that were available, the league's head coaches and sports information directors correctly pick the eventual OVC regular season champion 61 percent of the time, picking the correct winner 20 times over the last 32 years. Over the past 10 years, the preseason poll has correctly picked the winner every other year.

**Morehead State's Faried Tabbed as Preseason Player of the Year:** The 2010-11 All-OVC Preseason Men's Basketball team was headlined by Morehead State senior center **Kenneth Faried**, marking the second year in a row he has been bestowed that honor. Faried was named both the OVC Player of the Year and Defensive Player of the Year in 2009-10. Overall seven different schools were represented on the team with Murray State's four selections leading the way. Morehead State had two selections while Austin Peay, Eastern Illinois, Eastern Kentucky, Jacksonville State and Tennessee Tech had one player apiece on the squad. The team features four players who were All-OVC first-team selections last season. The team also has one player who was a second-team selection and two players who were on the All-Newcomer squad. In addition to Faried, Murray State's **B.J. Jenkins** and **Isacc Miles** and Eastern Illinois' **Tyler Laser** were each first-team All-OVC picks last season and are each on the preseason team this year. Austin Peay's **Anthony Campbell** was the lone second-team selection from last season who returned to the OVC this year, while Murray State's **Isaiah Canaan**, along with Jenkins, were the All-Newcomer selections from last year who were on this year's preseason team. **All League Head Coaches Return:** For the second-time in four years, every OVC head coach returns from the previous season. This last happened in the 2007-08 season. Overall it is the seventh time there has been no turnover in coaches between seasons since the 1978-79 season (the other years were 1978-79, 1993-94, 1994-95, 2001-02, 2004-05 and 2007-08).

**Replay Systems for OVC Basketball Venues Enter Year Four:** On Dec. 21, 2007, the Ohio Valley Conference mandated the use of courtside replay systems at all OVC basketball venues. The systems were put into place in January 2008 and have been used since. The systems are used in situations that are outlined by NCAA rules.

**SIU Edwardsville Continues Reclassification Process to Division I:** On July 1, 2008 Southern Illinois University Edwardsville became the 11th member of the Ohio Valley Conference. SIU Edwardsville, who is in the reclassification process to Division I, will begin regular season competition in the OVC during the 2011-12 academic year and will be eligible for postseason competition in 2012-13. The exception is the SIUE softball program, which will be eligible for both regular season and tournament competition this year; the softball program was the department's women's sport designee to be fast-tracked to Division I, making it eligible to compete at Division I prior to other SIUE sports. SIUE is located in Edwardsville, Ill., which is just northeast of St. Louis (the 18th largest media market in the United States).

**OVCsports.TV:** For the fifth consecutive year, fans can watch nearly every Conference matchup and all non-conference home contests this season at OVCsports.TV. The venture with NeuLion (formerly JumpTV Sports) allows fans to access live and on-demand streaming video and audio of conference matchups (excluding only national television games which are not available) on their home computer. The premium Web site was launched in July 2006 and has streamed over 1,000 events in its first four years, including all Conference matchups in football and men's and women's basketball as well as select baseball, soccer, softball and volleyball events and OVC Championship events. Packages are available on a yearly, seasonal, monthly or per-event basis.

## OVC TELEVISION PACKAGE

This season the OVC is sponsoring a 21-game television package for basketball. In addition to this Conference-sponsored package, there are approximately 62 additional games that will air either locally, regionally or nationally involving OVC institutions during the season. That brings the total number of television games involving OVC schools this season to 83.

The sponsored OVC games are produced and aired by ESPNU/ESPN2 (9 games) and the Wazoo Sports network (12 games). Wazoo Sports is a Regional Sports Network located in London, Ky. Wazoo Sports (<http://www.wazoosports.com>) launched online in December of 2007 and expanded to a 24/7 sports television network on September 25, 2009. During the 2010 football season Wazoo produced and aired a 10-game OVC Football Game of the Week package.

The games that do not air on ESPNU can be seen on the Wazoo Sports Network in addition to CSS (Comcast/Charter Sports Southeast), ESPN3.com and ESPN Full Court. Four of the five women's games will air on Wazoo, ESPN3.com and ESPN Full Court, while the fifth will be exclusive to Wazoo. In addition, WEIU, an affiliate located in Charleston, Ill., will pick up all nine of the games. CSS, which was launched in 1999, can be found only on cable and serves over six million customers in 13 states. ESPN3.com, the network's live 24/7 broadband channel, was launched as ESPN360 in 2001 and renamed ESPN3.com in April, it is available at no additional cost to fans with a high-speed Internet connection from an affiliated provider. ESPN Full Court is an out-of-market pay-per-view sports package. The package is available on most major cable and satellite television providers.

#### Team Notes

Austin Peay split a pair of games last week, taking No. 18 Memphis to overtime before falling by two points and then topping Eastern Kentucky at home to improve to a league-best 3-0 in OVC play...In the Memphis contest the Governors trailed by five at halftime (after shooting just 18% in the opening 20 minutes) before scoring the first 16 points of the second half (in what was overall a 21-0 run) to grab 43-28 lead with 13:35 to play...That overtime affair was the fourth of the season for the Govs, the most of any Division I team (APSU is 1-3 in those extra period games)...In that contest Austin Peay blocked eight shots (including a career-high five by John Fraley) and had a season-best 15 steals...Junior TyShwan Edmondson had 22 points and 10 rebounds in the loss to the Tigers while Melvin Baker added 17 points and 11 rebounds...In the two games last week Baker averaged 15.5 points, 9.5 rebounds and 2.0 steals/game, as he added 14 points and eight boards against ECU...Junior Josh Terry averaged 14.0 points, 4.5 rebounds and 4.0 steals/game last week in replacing the injury Anthony Campbell in the starting lineup; against ECU he had a season-best 22 points and held the Colonel's Justin Stommes to just six points...In the ECU win Austin Peay shot a season-best 52.6 percent from the field while holding Eastern to 36.5 percent, a low for one of its Division I opponents this year...The 3-0 start in OVC play is the first time since 2007-08 the team has started Conference play with that mark...Austin Peay will look to improve to 4-0 in OVC play when it hosts Morehead State on Tuesday night...The team will then be off a week (to Dec. 28) when it hosts Brescia.

#### Team Notes

After a road loss to Northern Iowa last Saturday, Morehead State lost its second-straight road game (and its fifth road game in six chances this season) in falling 70-64 in overtime at Tennessee State on Sunday...Despite opening the game with a 12-1 lead, the Eagles let turnovers get the best of them, committing 22 turnovers (including three in the first minute of overtime) and shooting just 6-of-15 from the free throw line...Tennessee State converted those 22 miscues into 26 points and won despite Morehead State out-rebounding them by 21 (46-25)...MSU shot just 36.9 percent from the field on the afternoon, its second-lowest output of the season (behind only a game at nationally-ranked Florida)...Leading by one late in regulation the Eagles got a big 3-pointer from Terrance Hill (one of his four trifectas in the game) to widen the margin to four with 1:27 to play...But TSU would convert on two free throws and a bucket with 52 ticks left to force overtime...The Tigers scored first in the extra period but MSU re-grouped and led by two (62-60) with 2:37 to play...But down the stretch it was all Tennessee State, as TSU scored eight of the final 10 points to hand the Eagles the loss...Senior Kenneth Faried led the way with 15 points and 17 rebounds, his ninth double-double in 11 total games this season...Demonte Harper led the way with 19 points, but did commit eight turnovers...Hill added 12 points, seven rebounds, three assists and three steals...The game marked the debut of sophomore Drew Kelly, a transfer from Miami (Ohio), who sat out the first semester due to transfer rules...Morehead State will play its fourth OVC game of the season on Tuesday night at Austin Peay, the team's last game until Dec. 28 (Kent State).

After netting its first win of the season last Saturday (a victory that snapped an 18-game losing streak dating back to last season), Southeast Missouri made it two wins in a row on Sunday, going on the road to top Jacksonville State 76-67...The win snapped a 15-game road losing streak dating back to a victory at Tennessee State on Dec. 5, 2009...It was also just the second OVC road victory for the program over the last three seasons...Southeast Missouri has now won back-to-back games for the first time since Jan. 2 and Jan. 5, 2008, a span of 87 games between back-to-back victories...However, those games were later forfeited due to NCAA violations, meaning you have to go back to Feb. 3 and Feb. 8 of the 2006-07 season to find back-to-back wins that stayed on the Redhawks all-time record...In the game at Jacksonville State, the score was tied at 60 with 4:40 to play before the Redhawks used a 16-7 run to close the game; that run was keyed by Leon Powell who had an old-fashioned 3-point play to start the run...Southeast also came up big at the free throw line, converting 22-of-26 second half free throws (after making only 2-of-6 in the first half)...Three Southeast Missouri players had double-doubles in the game, including Powell (10 points, 15 rebounds), Cameron Butler (11 points, 12 rebounds) and Lucas Nutt (16 points, 10 assists)...Nutt's 10 assists equaled the most by an OVC player this season...Nutt was named OVC Freshman of the Week for his play...Marland Smith added a team-best 19 points, hitting 3-of-5 3-pointers in 29 minutes of action...Southeast Missouri will look to win its third-straight game on Tuesday when it plays at Tennessee Tech (who is one of just two OVC teams undefeated in league play this season)...The game will be followed by eight days between games when the team plays at SMU on Sept. 29.

### OVC Tournament Tiebreaker System

Regular season standings will be the determining factor in setting first-round pairings for the tournament. All ties will be broken starting at the top of the conference standings and working down. The tiebreaking system will utilize the following factors, in order, until all ties are broken.

#### TWO-WAY TIES

1. Records in head-to-head competition are compared, with the higher seed going to the team that has won the most games against the other.
2. In the event step 1 does not resolve the tie (i.e. if the two teams split their games during the season), then the records of the tying teams against the No. 1 seed shall be compared. The team with the better record against the No. 1 seed shall gain the higher seed.
3. If the potential No. 1 seed is among tied teams, the process in step 2 will begin at the highest point in the standings which does not involve a tied team.
4. The process continues, through the No. 11 team in the standings, if necessary.
5. In the event the tie cannot be broken, seeds will be determined by a coin flip.

#### MULTIPLE TIES

1. Composite records between the tying teams will be evaluated to determine whether one team has won more games against the other tying institutions (in which case that team would receive the higher seed) and/or one team has won the least number of games among the tied teams (in which case the team will receive the lowest seed, and/or two teams have the same composite record (in which case the two-team tiebreaker scenario shall be utilized).
2. In the event step 1 does not solve the multiple ties, or reduce the multiple ties to one tie, then a comparison of records of the tying institutions against the No. 1 seed will occur. The team among the tying institutions with the better record against the No. 1 seed will receive the higher seed.
3. If the potential No. 1 seed is among tied teams, the process in step 2 will begin at the highest point in the standings which does not involve a tied team.
4. The process continues, through the No. 11 team in the standings, if necessary.
5. In the event this process does not resolve the ties, seeding will be determined by a coin flip.

*Note: If a multiple tie is reduced to a tie between two teams, the two-team tiebreaker formula will then be utilized. Ties involving teams higher in the standings are always broken before ties involving teams lower in the standings.*
