THIS WEEK'S OVC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

PLAYER

Robert Covington, F • So., 6-9, 210 • Bellwood, Ill. • Tennessee State

Covington scored 15 of his 22 points in the first half as Tennessee State jumped out to a 26-point lead in its 62-49 victory over Eastern Kentucky last week. The win was the fifth-straight for the Tigers, the longest streak under second-year head coach John Cooper. Covington finished the game with 12 rebounds, netting his second double-double of the season. Covington connected on 9-of-13 shots (69.2%) and 3-of-4 3-point attempts while also adding an assist. Covington is the first TSU player to be named OVC Player of the week since Dec. 15, 2008 (Jerrell Houston).

NEWCOMER

Melvin Baker, F • Jr., 6-7, 215 • Amarillo, Texas • Austin Peay

Baker recorded his second double-double of the season in Austin Peay's 86-85 overtime victory over Morehead State in the team's only game last week. Baker hit 7-of-14 field points and added five free throws in scoring 19 points and pulling down 10 rebounds. The junior transfer from Odessa College also dished out a season-best five assists to go along with two steals and two dunks. One of those dunks came on a key rebound and put-back in overtime, breaking an 82-all tie and giving the Gobs a two-point lead with one minute to play. Over his last three games Baker is averaging 16.7 points and 9.6 rebounds/game. Baker is the third different APSU player to earn OVC Newcomer of the Week honors this season, joining TyShwan Edmondson and Josh Terry.

FRESHMAN

Terence Smith, G • Fr., 6-3, 175 • Russellville, Ala. • UT Martin

Smith scored a season-best 20 points, grabbed five rebounds and dished out four assists in UT Martin's loss to Murray State last week. Smith was the only Skyhawk in double figures and almost single-handedly kept UTM in the game. His scoring helped the team to a nine-point lead in the second half before the Racers came back and won 66-54. Smith hit 5-of-9 (55.6%) shots and was 10-of-11 (90.9%) at the free throw line. The only free throw he missed, he went and got the offensive rebound, was fouled and made two more free throw attempts. Smith is the third different Skyhawk player to earn OVC Freshman of the Week honors this season.

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NOTES FROM AROUND THE LEAGUE

OVC Overview/This Week's Highlights: As the new year approaches, OVC teams have already played two sets of Conference games, wrapping up their second set this past week... The three or four games each team has played are part of the 18-game schedule this season, which will resume after January 1 (next season with the addition of SIUE the Conference slate switches to a 16-game schedule)...Between now and then the team's will have another week of non-conference play, the last major non-conference action for the teams until they participate in the ESPN BracketBusters series in February...This week's games include two against nationally-ranked teams (Ohio State, Memphis) and five that came be seen on national television...Murray State and Morehead State will both put long home-court winning streaks on the line this week as the Racers (23 games, fifth-longest nationally) host SIU Edwardsville and Morehead State (19 games, eighth-longest nationally) hosts Kent State and Binghamton

Fariied Nets 20/20 Game: Morehead State's **Kenneth Fariied** had a monster game at SIU Edwardsville on Nov. 28, scoring 25 points and pulling down 20 rebounds in a win. That is one of just two 20/20 games at the Division I level this season. Fariied also had a 20/20 game last season (23 points, 21 rebounds at Tennessee State - that was one of just nine 20/20 efforts nationally during the 2009-10 season) and a 20/20 game in 2008-09 (27 points, 24 rebounds against Florida A&M). Fariied has 10 double-doubles this season (in 12 total games), which ranks first nationally. For his career Fariied has 67 career double-doubles, which is the most nationally among active players.

40 Minutes Just Not Enough for Austin Peay: So far this season Austin Peay has played five overtime games, the most of any Division I team. Princeton and Wofford have each played three overtime games this season.

Home Court Overall Winning Streaks: Entering this week Murray State has the longest home court winning streak among OVC teams at 23 games. That streak currently ranks fifth nationally. Morehead State's 19-game home court winning streak is currently eighth nationally. Kansas has the nation's longest home court winning streak (65).

Home Court Conference Winning Streaks: Entering this week Morehead State has a 20-game home court winning streak in Conference games, a streak that dates back to the last game of the 2007-08 season (which was a loss). MSU was undefeated at home in 2008-09 and 2009-10 and is 2-0 in OVC play this season. Xavier (32 games) currently has the longest home court conference winning streak.

The OVC Among NCAA Statistical Leaders: In the latest NCAA statistical leaders release (Dec. 20 - the next set of NCAA leaders will not be released until Jan. 3 due to the NCAA office being closed this week), Tennessee Tech ranks ninth in steals (10.2/game), Morehead State ranks 10th in rebounding margin (+9.3) and Tennessee State is 11th in free throw percentage (77.8%). Individually Morehead State's **Kenneth Fariied** is first nationally in rebounding (14.0/game) and double-doubles (9), fourth in field goal percentage (64.5%), 16th in steals (2.5/game), 53rd in points (18.6 points/game) and 54th in blocks (2.0 blocks/game). Murray State's **B.J. Jenkins** is fifth in free throw percentage (94.5%).

Murray State 23rd in CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major Poll: After finishing last season with an OVC-record 31 wins, Murray State finished the 2009-10 season ranked sixth in the CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major poll. This season the Racers began the year fifth in that poll and are currently 23rd this week (Dec. 20 - the Dec. 27 poll was not available at release time). Morehead State, who was in the poll for two weeks, is currently among the others receiving votes. Now in its 12th season, the Mid-Major poll is made up of team's from the following conferences: America East, Atlantic Sun, Big Sky, Big South, Big West, Colonial, Great West, Horizon, Independents, Ivy, Metro Atlantic, Mid-American, Mid-Eastern, Missouri Valley, Northeast, Ohio Valley, Patriot, Southern, Southland, Southwestern, Summit, Sun Belt, West Coast. It is voted upon by coaches from those conferences, with one coach per conference casting a vote (Murray State's Billy Kennedy is the OVC representative).

COACHES TELECONFERENCE

2011 OVC TOURNAMENT

The 2011 Ohio Valley Conference Men's & Women's Tournaments will be held March 2-5 at Municipal Auditorium in Nashville, Tenn. For the first time since 1996, the entire tournament will be held at one site (instead of first round games being played on campus sites). The tournament has also switched to a merit-based format with the No. 1 and 2 seeds getting double byes into the semifinals and the No. 3 and 4 seeds getting a bye into the quarterfinals.

The first round and quarterfinal games (which start at 12 and 2 p.m. for the women, and 6 and 8 p.m. for the men) can be seen on OVCSports.TV. The men's semifinals will be held on Friday, March 4 at 7 and 9 p.m. and televised on ESPNU with the championship game on Saturday, March 5 at 7 p.m. and televised live on ESPN2. The women's semifinals are set for 12 and 2 p.m. on March 4 (televised on OVCSports.TV) and the women's championship game is set for March 5 at 3:00 p.m. (TV TBD).

This marks the 17th time in 18 years that the tournament has been held in Nashville.

CREDENTIALS. For the second year in a row, credentials will be requested through an online system. That information will be available in January. **The deadline to request credentials is MONDAY, FEB. 28 at Noon.** No credentials will be mailed; they can be picked up at Media Will-Call, located at the back entrance of the arena (at the intersection of 5th Ave. North and Gay Street).



OVC Tournament Makes Moves to Municipal Auditorium with More Teams, New Format:

Beginning this season the OVC Basketball Tournament will move to Municipal Auditorium in Nashville as its new annual home. This year's event will mark the 17th time in the last 18 years the league's marquee event has been held in Music City, USA (2002 was the lone year the event was not held in Nashville). It marks the sixth time the combined men's and women's tournament has been held in Municipal, following the 1994, 1995, 1996, 2004 and 2008 events (a men's only event was also held there in 1989). New this season is the fact that all eight men's and all eight women's teams that qualify for the tournament field will gather at a single site for the entire tournament (previously first round games were played on campus sites with the semifinals and finals being held in Nashville). That marks the first time since 1996 that the entire tournament has been held at one site. The bracket also shifts from a traditional 1 vs. 8, 2 vs. 7, etc. format to a merit-based format that rewards the top teams during the regular season with byes into the quarterfinals and semifinals (the No. 1 and 2 seeds will receive double byes into the semifinals while the No. 3 and 4 seeds will receive a bye into the quarterfinals). The 2011 OVC Men's and Women's Basketball Championship dates are March 2-5.

Loos is All-Time Winningest Coach in OVC History: With a 68-66 victory at Ohio on Dec. 9 of last season, Austin Peay head coach **Dave Loos** recorded his 320th career victory while in the OVC, a mark that ranks first all-time. Loos passed Cal Luther (319 wins at Murray State and UT Martin) for the all-time mark. Loos, the Dean of OVC coaches, is now in his 21st year at Austin Peay where he also serves as the Athletics Director, making him the only Division I head men's basketball coach to hold that distinction. Loos is one of just 14 active Division I coaches to have coached at the same school for 20 or more years. Loos now has 339 victories in his tenure at Austin Peay and 421 for his career.

More on Municipal Auditorium: As part of the deal to host the tournament at Municipal Auditorium, the Nashville City Council and Municipal Auditorium committed \$200,000 to improvements at the venue, which opened in 1962. Among the major improvements that will be completed prior to this year's championship are upgrades to the dressing rooms, two new scoreboards and the new OVC-branded playing surface. The floor, which was unveiled at the league's Media Day event in October, was built by Horner Sports Flooring, whose corporate headquarters are in Dollar Bay, Mich. The company has made floors for many collegiate and National Basketball Association (NBA) teams, including building the floor for the 2010 NBA All-Star Game which was held at Texas Stadium. The Horner Pro King portable floor at Municipal Auditorium was purchased for a cost of \$71,960; the court will be used for the OVC Tournament, various high school games/tournaments and special events such as the Harlem Globetrotters.

Faried Named to Naismith Award Watch List: Morehead State senior **Kenneth Faried** is one of 50 players named to the 2010-11 Naismith Award preseason watch list as announced by the Atlanta Tipoff Club. The Naismith Trophy is the most prestigious national award presented annually to college basketball's player of the year. Faried is the reigning OVC Player and Defensive Player of the Year, and was named this year's OVC Preseason Player of the Year. Last year, he averaged 16.9 points and 13.0 rebounds per game, leading the nation with 456 total rebounds. He also led the conference with 67 blocked shots and collected 56 steals on his way to honorable mention All-American honors. This year's diverse list includes the top men's college basketball players from 44 schools around the country. The watch list was compiled by the Atlanta Tipoff Club's Board of Selectors, which based its criteria on player performances from the previous year and expectations for the 2010-11 college basketball season. The Naismith Trophy presented by AT&T will be awarded at the 2011 NCAA Men's Final Four in Houston.

Faried Named Candidate for Lowe's Senior CLASS Award: Morehead State senior center **Kenneth Faried** is one of 30 candidates for the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award in men's basketball. To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence - community, classroom, character and competition. An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School®, the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities. The candidate class will be narrowed to 10 men's finalists midway through the regular season, and those names will be placed on the official ballot. Ballots will be distributed through a nationwide voting system to media, coaches and fans, who will select one finalist who best exemplifies excellence in the four Cs of community, classroom, character and competition.

Swansey a Candidate for Bob Cousy Award: Tennessee Tech junior **Zac Swansey** is one of 66 NCAA basketball players in contention for the 2011 Bob Cousy award and the title of the nation's top point guard, as announced by the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame. The annual award, named for Hall of Famer and former Boston Celtic Bob Cousy, recognizes college basketball's top point guard. Nominations were solicited from all schools across the country. The original list of candidates will be narrowed down to a final 20 by January 3rd, final 10 by February 3rd, and final five by March 3rd. A Hall of Fame appointed screening committee will be narrowing down the candidates from 20 to 10 to 5 prior to a Blue Ribbon Selection Committee evaluating the final five candidates and ultimately choosing the winner. Both of the Hall of Fame committee's are made up of top college basketball personnel including media members, head coaches, Sports Information Directors and Hall of Famers. The winner of the 2011 Bob Cousy Award will be presented at the Hall of Fame's Class Announcement on Monday April 4th in Houston as part of NCAA Final Four weekend.

The 2010-11 Season: The 2010-11 season marks the 63rd of competition in the OVC. Over the previous 62 years, 12 different teams have claimed an OVC regular season championship, including three different schools in the past three years.

OVC Has Postseason Success: After several years of not having much postseason success, OVC teams have turned it around the past two years. Each of the last two years the league has sent three teams to the postseason, including Murray State to the NCAA Tournament and Eastern Kentucky and Morehead State to the College Basketball Invitational (CBI) last season. The biggest splash came from No. 13 seed Murray State who knocked off No. 4 seed Vanderbilt 66-65 in the NCAA Tournament when Danero Thomas hit a jumper at the buzzer. It was the first time an OVC team had won a First Round NCAA Tournament game since 1989 (when MTSU beat Florida State) and marked the second year in a row the league had won a NCAA Tournament game (Morehead State beat Alabama State in the Opening Round game in 2009). Murray State would lose to eventual national runner-up Butler in the Second Round, falling 54-52. Morehead State would win its first game in the CBI, marking the first time since 1988 that two different OVC teams had won postseason games in the same season.

OVC Teams to Once Again Compete in ESPN BracketBusters Series: For the sixth-straight season every OVC team will compete in the ESPN BracketBusters series in 2010-11. Now it its ninth year, ESPN BracketBusters is an ESPN television property that was tremendously successful with its first eight events. The event has allowed Division I conferences to participate in a cutting-edge format that involves "wild card" pairings from the pool of participating teams, with half of the ESPN BracketBusters teams pre-designated as "home" and the remaining half as "road" teams. This year there are 114 teams from 15 conferences in the pool of teams who will be selected for one of 11 nationally-televised games. Teams not selected for a television game will be paired up with other teams in the pool for games that will be played on Saturday, Feb. 19. The matchups will be announced on January 31. OVC schools are 19-37 all-time in the BracketBusters event.

OVC Players in the NBA: Entering the season there was just one former OVC player on a NBA roster. Former UT Martin All-American **Lester Hudson** began the year on the roster of the Washington Wizards but was waived on Nov. 22. Hudson, however, was re-signed by the Wizards on Dec. 20. Hudson was a two-time OVC Player of the Year at UT Martin before being selected No. 58 overall by the Boston Celtics in the 2009 NBA Draft. Hudson spent half of his rookie season with the Celtics before finishing the year with the Memphis Grizzlies and in the NBA Development League. There are also three former OVC players playing in the NBA Development League as former Tennessee Tech standout **Willie Jenkins** is with the Idaho Stampede and Jacksonville State's **Walker Russell** (Fort Wayne Mad Ants) and **Amadou Mbodji** (Utah Flash) are also in the league.

Murray State Picked as Preseason Co-Favorites: In a vote of Ohio Valley Conference head men's basketball coaches and sports information directors, Murray State received 18 first-place votes and was picked as the favorite for the 2010-11 season. Last season Murray State won an OVC-record 31 games on its way to the OVC regular season and tournament championship as well as a NCAA Tournament first round victory over No. 4 seed Vanderbilt. It marks the 14th time in the last 22 years that Murray State has been picked the preseason favorite and third in a row (they were tabbed co-favorites with Morehead State last season). Murray State received 162 total points and was followed next by Morehead State (2 first-place votes, 146 points), who was a consensus No. 2 pick. Eastern Illinois was picked third (123) and was followed by Austin Peay (107), Eastern Kentucky (92), Tennessee Tech (85), Tennessee State (81), Jacksonville State (51), Southeast Missouri (41) and UT Martin (20).

Preseason Predictions: Is being picked the preseason favorite, always a good thing? Over the past 31 years of preseason polls that were available, the league's head coaches and sports information directors correctly pick the eventual OVC regular season champion 61 percent of the time, picking the correct winner 20 times over the last 32 years. Over the past 10 years, the preseason poll has correctly picked the winner every other year.

Morehead State's Faried Tabbed as Preseason Player of the Year: The 2010-11 All-OVC Preseason Men's Basketball team was headlined by Morehead State senior center **Kenneth Faried**, marking the second year in a row he has been bestowed that honor. Faried was named both the OVC Player of the Year and Defensive Player of the Year in 2009-10. Overall seven different schools were represented on the team with Murray State's four selections leading

the way. Morehead State had two selections while Austin Peay, Eastern Illinois, Eastern Kentucky, Jacksonville State and Tennessee Tech had one player apiece on the squad. The team features four players who were All-OVC first-team selections last season. The team also has one player who was a second-team selection and two players who were on the All-Newcomer squad. In addition to Faried, Murray State's **B.J. Jenkins** and **Isacc Miles** and Eastern Illinois' **Tyler Laser** were each first-team All-OVC picks last season and are each on the preseason team this year. Austin Peay's **Anthony Campbell** was the lone second-team selection from last season who returned to the OVC this year, while Murray State's **Isaiah Canaan**, along with Jenkins, were the All-Newcomer selections from last year who were on this year's preseason team. The Preseason All-OVC team was rounded out by Murray State's **Ivan Aska**, Morehead State's **Demonte Harper**, Tennessee Tech's **Kevin Murphy**, Jacksonville State's **Nick Murphy** and Eastern Kentucky's **Justin Stommes**.

All League Head Coaches Return: For the second-time in four years, every OVC head coach returns from the previous season. This last happened in the 2007-08 season. Overall it is the seventh time there has been no turnover in coaches between seasons since the 1978-79 season (the other years were 1978-79, 1993-94, 1994-95, 2001-02, 2004-05 and 2007-08).

Replay Systems for OVC Basketball Venues Enter Year Four: On Dec. 21, 2007, the Ohio Valley Conference mandated the use of courtside replay systems at all OVC basketball venues. The systems were put into place in January 2008 and have been used since. The systems are used in situations that are outlined by NCAA rules.

SIU Edwardsville Continues Reclassification Process to Division I: On July 1, 2008 Southern Illinois University Edwardsville became the 11th member of the Ohio Valley Conference. SIU Edwardsville, who is in the reclassification process to Division I, will begin regular season competition in the OVC during the 2011-12 academic year and will be eligible for postseason competition in 2012-13. The exception is the SIUE softball program, which will be eligible for both regular season and tournament competition this year; the softball program was the department's women's sport designee to be fast-tracked to Division I, making it eligible to compete at Division I prior to other SIUE sports. SIUE is located in Edwardsville, Ill., which is just northeast of St. Louis (the 18th largest media market in the United States).

OVCsports.TV: For the fifth consecutive year, fans can watch nearly every Conference matchup and all non-conference home contests this season at OVCsports.TV. The venture with NeuLion (formerly JumpTV Sports) allows fans to access live and on-demand streaming video and audio of conference matchups (excluding only national television games which are not available) on their home computer. The premium Web site was launched in July 2006 and has streamed over 1,000 events in its first four years, including all Conference matchups in football and men's and women's basketball as well as select baseball, soccer, softball and volleyball events and OVC Championship events. Packages are available on a yearly, seasonal, monthly or per-event basis.

OVC TELEVISION PACKAGE

This season the OVC is sponsoring a 21-game television package for basketball. In addition to this Conference-sponsored package, there are approximately 62 additional games that will air either locally, regionally or nationally involving OVC institutions during the season. That brings the total number of television games involving OVC schools this season to 83.

The sponsored OVC games are produced and aired by ESPNU/ESPN2 (9 games) and the Wazoo Sports network (12 games). Wazoo Sports is a Regional Sports Network located in London, Ky. Wazoo Sports (<http://www.wazoosports.com>) launched online in December of 2007 and expanded to a 24/7 sports television network on September 25, 2009. During the 2010 football season Wazoo produced and aired a 10-game OVC Football Game of the Week package.

The games that do not air on ESPNU can be seen on the Wazoo Sports Network in addition to CSS (Comcast/Charter Sports Southeast), ESPN3.com and ESPN Full Court. Four of the five women's games will air on Wazoo, ESPN3.com and ESPN Full Court, while the fifth will be exclusive to Wazoo. In addition, WEIU, an affiliate located in Charleston, Ill., will pick up all nine of the games. CSS, which was launched in 1999, can be found only on cable and serves over six million customers in 13 states. ESPN3.com, the network's live 24/7 broadband channel, was launched as ESPN360 in 2001 and renamed ESPN3.com in April, it is available at no additional cost to fans with a high-speed Internet connection from an affiliated provider. ESPN Full Court is an out-of-market pay-per-view sports package. The package is available on most major cable and satellite television providers.

Team Notes

For the fifth time in 14 games this season Austin Peay went to overtime in a game, but for only the second time in those contest the Governors came out with the victory last Tuesday, topping Morehead State 86-85...The game was finally decided by junior Josh Terry who hit a reverse layup with 0.7 seconds left in overtime to secure the victory...It marked the second-straight season the Govs have topped the Eagles on a last-second shot (last year it was a 3-pointer with 10 seconds left by Justin Blake)...The game featured 12 ties and 25 lead changes, including 11 lead changes in the second half...APSU became the first team to score 70 or more points against the Eagles this season (MSU's schedule has included the likes of nationally-ranked Ohio State and Florida)...Junior Melvin Baker had 19 points, 10 rebounds, five assists, two steals and two blocks in netting his second double-double of the season...For his performance Baker earned OVC Newcomer of the Week honors, becoming the third different APSU player to win that award so far this season...Baker was one of four APSU players in double figures as TyShwan Edmondson led the way with 22 points, his seventh 20-plus point game of the season...Caleb Brown dished out eight assists, the fourth time this season he has had seven or more assists in a game...Austin Peay shot 55.9 percent from the field, its highest against a Division I opponent this season...The team also committed only nine turnovers, a season-low against DI teams...The only negative of the night was that APSU hit just 14-of-22 (63.6%) from the free throw line...After a break for Christmas, Austin Peay is back in action next Tuesday when the team hosts Brescia in the only game of the week for the Governors.

Team Notes

Tennessee State remained one of the hottest teams in the league by winning its fifth-straight game last week, topping Eastern Kentucky 62-49 on Tuesday night at the Gentry Center...The five-game winning streak is the longest for the Tigers under second-year head coach John Cooper and the most since winning six in a row at the end of the 2008-09 regular season...Just two days after playing an overtime game with Morehead State, TSU did not show signs of being tired, hitting 7-of-12 (58.3%) 3-pointers in the first half and 55.6 percent overall from the field in building a 41-17 margin at the break...Despite not shooting as well in the second half, EKV would get only as close as nine points the rest of the way as the Tigers eventually won by 13...The Tiger defense held Eastern Kentucky to just 30.6 percent shooting for the night...Sophomore Robert Covington posted his second double-double of the season, scoring 22 points and pulling down a game-high 12 rebounds...Covington hit 9-of-13 shots and 3-of-4 3-pointers on the night and was named OVC Player of the Week for his efforts...Three other players (Wil Peters, Kenny Moore and Jerret Towns) each added nine points on the night...Tennessee State will play twice this week, traveling just down I-24 to battle former OVC foe Middle Tennessee State on Wednesday and then heading West on I-40 to play nationally-ranked Memphis on Sunday (TV: SportsSouth).

OVC Tournament Tiebreaker System

Regular season standings will be the determining factor in setting first-round pairings for the tournament. All ties will be broken starting at the top of the conference standings and working down. The tiebreaking system will utilize the following factors, in order, until all ties are broken.

TWO-WAY TIES

1. Records in head-to-head competition are compared, with the higher seed going to the team that has won the most games against the other.
2. In the event step 1 does not resolve the tie (i.e. if the two teams split their games during the season), then the records of the tying teams against the No. 1 seed shall be compared. The team with the better record against the No. 1 seed shall gain the higher seed.
3. If the potential No. 1 seed is among tied teams, the process in step 2 will begin at the highest point in the standings which does not involve a tied team.
4. The process continues, through the No. 11 team in the standings, if necessary.
5. In the event the tie cannot be broken, seeds will be determined by a coin flip.

MULTIPLE TIES

1. Composite records between the tying teams will be evaluated to determine whether one team has won more games against the other tying institutions (in which case that team would receive the higher seed) and/or one team has won the least number of games among the tied teams (in which case the team will receive the lowest seed, and/or two teams have the same composite record (in which case the two-team tiebreaker scenario shall be utilized).
2. In the event step 1 does not solve the multiple ties, or reduce the multiple ties to one tie, then a comparison of records of the tying institutions against the No. 1 seed will occur. The team among the tying institutions with the better record against the No. 1 seed will receive the higher seed.
3. If the potential No. 1 seed is among tied teams, the process in step 2 will begin at the highest point in the standings which does not involve a tied team.
4. The process continues, through the No. 11 team in the standings, if necessary.
5. In the event this process does not resolve the ties, seeding will be determined by a coin flip.

Note: If a multiple tie is reduced to a tie between two teams, the two-team tiebreaker formula will then be utilized. Ties involving teams higher in the standings are always broken before ties involving teams lower in the standings.
