PLAYER

Kenneth Faried, C • Sr., 6-8, 228 • Newark, N.J. • Morehead State

Faried had another big week in setting the NCAA Modern Era Career Rebounding mark in an ESPN Sears BracketBusters victory over Indiana State on Saturday. Faried pulled down his 1,571st rebound in the second half of that game to pass Wake Forest's Tim Duncan for the modern record (in games since 1973 when freshmen were allowed to play again). Entering this week Faried has 1,576 rebounds (which is now second in OVC history and 15th all-time in college basketball history). For the week Faried averaged 20.0 points, 13.5 rebounds and 2.5 blocks/game while hitting 69.6 percent (16-of-23) from the field. The senior started the week with 23 points, 15 rebounds and five blocks in an overtime victory over Eastern Kentucky, as the Eagles moved into a tie for first place in the OVC standings (with Murray State). Faried hit 10-of-15 shots in that game as the Eagles avenged a loss to the Colonels from earlier this season. In the BracketBusters victory, he had 17 points and 12 rebounds. The pair of double-doubles moved Faried's career total to 80, which is now tied for fifth all-time in NCAA history (with Drexel's Malik Rose). Faried has 23 double-doubles this season, which leads all of Division I, as does his 14.2 rebounds/game. This marks the fourth week in a row, eighth time this season (a new OVC record) and 15th time in his career (adding to his already established OVC record) that Faried has been named OVC Player of the Week.

NEWCOMER

Leon Powell, F • R-Jr., 6-7, 215 • St. Louis, Mo. • Southeast Missouri

Powell earned his fifth OVC Newcomer of the Week honor of the season and third in a row after averaging 17.0 points, 8.5 rebounds and 2.5 blocks/game in two Southeast Missouri State victories. In doing so he became the first OVC player to be named Newcomer of the Week three weeks in a row since 2004-05. To start the week Powell netted his team-leading sixth double-double of the year as the Redhawks topped league-leading Murray State 64-57, the first home win over the Racers since 2003. Powell hit 7-of-12 shots in scoring 19 points and pulled down 10 rebounds (five offensive) while also dishing out two assists, blocking a shot and netting a steal. Three days later in the team's ESPN Sears BracketBusters victory over Sacramento State (the team's first in six games in the event), Powell had 15 points, seven rebounds and four blocks. For the week the redshirt junior hit 63.6 percent (14-of-22) from the field and continues to lead Division I in field goal percentage (63.8%).

FRESHMAN

Troy King, F • Fr., 6-6, 215 • Gaithersburg, Md. • UT Martin

King averaged 16.5 points and 5.0 rebounds/game while hitting 52.4 percent (11-of-21) from the field and 58.3 percent (7-of-12) from 3-point range in two games last week. The freshman started the week with 13 points and seven rebounds in a key OVC victory at Eastern Illinois, as the Sky-hawks got a step closer to locking up a berth in the OVC Tournament field. He finished the week by pouring in a game-high 20 points in UTM's BracketBusters loss to Bradley. King hit a career-best six 3-pointers (in 10 attempts) in the game. This marks the third time this season King has been named OVC Freshman of the Week and the seventh time a UT Martin player has been bestowed the award this season.

NOTES FROM AROUND THE LEAGUE

OVC Overview/This Week's Highlights: Currently seven teams (Austin Peay, Eastern Kentucky, Morehead State, Murray State, Southeast Missouri, Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech) have clinched a spot in the eight-team OVC Tournament field while Eastern Illinois and UT Martin are fighting for the last spot (Jacksonville State has been eliminated from contention)...Eastern Illinois will need to win both of its road games next week and hope for UT Martin to lose both of its home games to clinch the final spot; any other combination gives UT Martin the berth...Southeast Missouri was the latest team to secure a berth, upsetting Murray State last Wednesday to claim its first OVC Tournament spot since the 2006-07 season...Murray State and Morehead State are now tied for first place in the OVC standings (12-4) with two games to play; those two teams will square off next Thursday night in Murray in a game on ESPN2 (Morehead State won the meeting earlier this season in Morehead)...The winner of the game will clinch at least a share of the OVC Regular Season Championship; Murray State has won the most OVC regular season championships (21), including last year's crown, while Morehead State has won nine regular season titles with the last coming in 2003 (that is the team's only crown over the last 27 seasons)...Morehead State's Kenneth Faried became the NCAA Modern Era (since 1973) Rebounding Leader on Saturday, grabbing his 1,571st rebound at Indiana State to pass NBA All-Star Tim Duncan; Faried also netted two double-doubles last week and has 80 for his career, which is tied for fifth in NCAA history (with Drexel's Malik Rose, who played 13 seasons in the NBA)...Faried earned his 15th career OVC Player of the Week award on Monday (he had established the career record earlier this season); the honor was his fourth in as many weeks and the eighth time this year he has been honored, which set a new OVC single-season mark for Player of the Week awards...Following the conclusion of the regular season this week, the OVC will announce its All-OVC honors next Tuesday (March 1).

Faried Has Three of the Eight 20/20 Games Nationally This Season: Morehead State's **Kenneth Faried** had a monster game at SIU Edwardsville on Nov. 28, scoring 25 points and pulling down 20 rebounds in a win. On Jan. 27 against Tennessee State Faried did even better, scoring 23 points and recording 23 rebounds in a victory (the 23 rebounds are tied for the most by a Division I player in a game this season). The next game out Faried hit the 20/20 mark again, scoring 21 points and grabbing 20 rebounds in a win at Jacksonville State (Feb. 3). Those are three of just eight 20/20 games at the Division I level this season. Faried also had a 20/20 game last season (23 points, 21 rebounds at Tennessee State - that was one of just nine 20/20 efforts nationally during the 2009-10 season) and a 20/20 game in 2008-09 (27 points, 24 rebounds against Florida A&M).

Faried Establishes NCAA Modern Career Rebounding Record (Since 1973): For players who have began their careers since 1973 (when freshmen were once again allowed to play NCAA basketball), no NCAA Division I player has grabbed more rebounds than Morehead State's **Kenneth Faried**. Faried currently has 1,576 rebounds and passed Tim Duncan for first place on the list on Feb. 19 (Duncan's record was 1,570). In all-time NCAA records his 1,576 rebounds ranks 15th. He is just 99 rebounds away from that Top 10 list; that 10th spot is occupied by Morehead State's Steve Hamilton, who is the OVC's all-time leading rebounder. Faried Fifth in NCAA History in Double-Doubles: Morehead State's **Kenneth Faried** has 23 double-doubles this season (in 29 total games), which ranks first nationally (one ahead of Siena's Ryan Rossiter). For his career Faried has 80 career double-doubles, which is the most nationally among active players. Currently his 80 career double-doubles ranks fifth in NCAA history (tied with Drexel's Malik Rose). The NCAA career record for double-doubles is 87 by Wake Forest's Tim Duncan.

Faried Joins Rare OVC Company: In the long history of the Ohio Valley Conference, Morehead State's **Kenneth Faried** is one of just two players to have 1,900 or more career points and 1,500 or more career rebounds.

Murray State Spreads the Wealth; Was Last Division I Team Without a 20-Point Scorer This Season: For the second year in a row Murray State has a very balanced attack, as no player averages more than 12.2 points/game and the team has eight players who average between 12.2 and 5.0 points/game. The Racers did not have a 20-point scorer in a game this year until their 21st game on January 29 when Isaiah Canaan scored 24 points. That made them the final Division I team (out of 345 total squads) without a 20-point scorer until that game. In addition, despite being in first place in the OVC, Murray State does not have one player who ranks in the Top 10 in both scoring and the Top 9 in rebounding in the OVC.

2011 OVC TOURNAMENT

The 2011 Ohio Valley Conference Men's & Women's Tournaments will be held March 2-5 at Municipal Auditorium in Nashville, Tenn. For the first time since 1996, the entire tournament will be held at one site (instead of first round games being played on campus sites). The tournament has also switched to a merit-based format with the No. 1 and 2 seeds getting double byes into the semifinals and the No. 3 and 4 seeds getting a bye into the quarterfinals.

The first round and quarterfinal games (which start at 12 and 2 p.m. for the women, and 6 and 8 p.m. for the men) can be seen on OVCsports.TV. The men's semifinals will be held on Friday, March 4 at 7 and 9 p.m. and televised on ESPN2 with the championship game on Saturday, March 5 at 7 p.m. and televised live on ESPN2. The women's semifinals are set for 12 and 2 p.m. on March 4 (televised on OVCsports.TV) and the women's championship game is set for March 5 at 3:00 p.m. (Wazoo Sports and other TBA outlets).

This marks the 17th time in 18 years that the tournament has been held in Nashville.

CREDENTIALS. For the second year in a row, credentials will be requested through an online system. That information will be available in January. **The deadline to request credentials is MONDAY, FEB. 28 at Noon.** No credentials will be mailed; they can be picked up at Media Will-Call, located at the back entrance of the arena (at the intersection of 5th Ave. North and Gay Street).

40 Minutes Just Not Enough for Austin Peay; Leads Nation in Overtime Games: So far this season Austin Peay has played in six overtime games, the most of any Division I team (APSU is 2-4 in those games). The next closest teams are Charlotte, Georgia State, Houston, North Carolina A&T, Penn, Troy and UNC Wilmington who have each played in five overtime games.

The OVC Among NCAA Statistical Leaders: In the latest NCAA statistical leaders release (Feb. 21) Morehead State is seventh in rebounding margin (+8.6). Individually Morehead State's **Kenneth Faried** is first nationally in rebounding (14.2/game) and double-doubles (23), second in field goal percentage (63.5%), 35th in steals (2.1/game), 51st in blocks (2.0/game) and 73rd in scoring (17.5/game). Southeast Missouri's **Leon Powell** is first nationally in field goal percentage (63.8%), Eastern Illinois' Jeremy Granger is fifth (92.2%) free throw percentage and Tennessee Tech's **Zac Swansey** is seventh in assists (6.2/game).

OVC Teams Compile 6-4 Mark ESPN Sears BracketBusters Series: For the sixth-straight season every OVC team competed in the ESPN Sears BracketBusters series (on Feb. 19). After going 3-8 in BracketBusters games last season, the OVC redeemed itself this season with a 6-4 overall record, including two road victories. Eastern Illinois, Morehead State, Murray State, Southeast Missouri, Tennessee Tech and Tennessee State were the OVC teams who picked up wins. Austin Peay was the only OVC school to be in one of the 11 nationally-televised games and the Govs lost at Fairfield; OVC teams are now 2-4 all-time in BracketBusters TV contests. Now it's ninth year, BracketBusters is an ESPN television property that was tremendously successful with its nine events. The event has allowed Division I conferences to participate in a cutting-edge format that involves "wild card" pairings from the pool of participating teams, with half of the ESPN BracketBusters teams pre-designated as "home" and the remaining half as "road" teams. This year there were 114 teams from 15 conferences in the pool of teams that were selected for one of 11 nationally-televised games. OVC schools are 25-41 all-time in the BracketBusters event.

Loos is All-Time Winningest Coach in OVC History; Sutton Joins OVC Top 10: With a 68-66 victory at Ohio on Dec. 9 of last season, Austin Peay head coach **Dave Loos** recorded his 320th career victory while in the OVC, a mark that ranks first all-time. Loos passed Cal Luther (319 wins at Murray State and UT Martin) for the all-time mark. Loos, the Dean of OVC coaches, is now in his 21st year at Austin Peay where he also serves as the Athletics Director, making him the only Division I head men's basketball coach to hold that distinction. Loos is one of just 14 active Division I coaches to have coached at the same school for 20 or more years. Loos now has 348 victories in his tenure at Austin Peay and 430 for his career. Tennessee Tech head coach **Mike Sutton** joined the OVC all-time Top 10 list with his 141st victory on Feb. 3, 2011 (a victory over Eastern Kentucky). Sutton currently has 145 victories in his nine-year tenure at TTU.

Faried Named Oscar Robertson National Player of the Week (Feb. 1): The U.S. Basketball Writers Association (USBWA) selected Morehead State center **Kenneth Faried** as its Oscar Robertson National Player of the Week for games ending the week of Sunday, Jan. 30. The USBWA's weekly honor is presented by Blue Ribbon College Basketball Yearbook and chosen by a representative of the USBWA board of directors from a list of Division I conference players of the week. During the week Faried averaged 17.7 points and 18.0 rebounds while leading the Eagles to three wins of then first-place teams, including two key conference victories. Faried posted a 23-point, 23-rebound effort in a 72-65 win over Tennessee State (at the time his second of the season). Faried began the week with a 13-point, 15-rebound, 2-block, 3-steal game at Mid American Conference-leading Ball State, as the Eagles won 50-48 and snapped BSU's seven-game home winning streak. He capped the week with 17 points and 16 rebounds in a 69-56 victory over OVC-leading Austin Peay, avenging an overtime loss to the Governors earlier this season.

Morehead State's Proffitt Named Capital One Academic All-District as Selected by CoSIDA: Morehead State men's basketball junior **Ty Proffitt** has been named to the Capital One Academic All-District® First-Team as selected by CoSIDA for District IV. As a member of the All-District first-team, Proffitt is automatically placed on the national ballot for consideration for Academic All-America honors later this month. The award, which recognizes both academic and athletic prowess is selected by members of CoSIDA (College Sports Information Directors of America). Proffitt, a finance major, represents the men's basketball team on MSU's Student-Athlete Advisory Council, and he is a member of Beta Gamma Sigma business fraternity. Along with his teammates, Proffitt has participated in MS Walk, Heart Walk, has helped with local trash clean-up efforts, and volunteers his time for clothing and food shelters. To be eligible for nomination, a student-athlete must have reached sophomore academic standing and have at least a 3.30 cumulative grade point average. The Academic All-District® teams are divided into eight geographic districts across the United States and Canada. The University Division team includes NCAA Division I participants, while the College Division team combines NCAA Division II, NCAA Division III, NAIA, Canadian and two-year schools. District IV selections come from schools located within the states of Alabama, Kentucky, Michigan, Ohio and Tennessee.

OVC Tournament Makes Move to Municipal Auditorium with More Teams, New Format: Beginning this season the OVC Basketball Tournament will move to Municipal Auditorium in Nashville as its new annual home. This year's event will mark the 17th time in the last 18 years the league's marquee event has been held in Music City, USA (2002 was the lone year the event was not held in Nashville). It marks the sixth time the combined men's and women's tournament has been held in Municipal, following the 1994, 1995, 1996, 2004 and 2008 events (a men's only event was also held there in 1989). New this season is the fact that all eight men's and all eight women's teams that qualify for the tournament field will gather at a single site for the entire tournament (previously first round games were played on campus sites with the semifinals and finals being held in Nashville). That marks the first time since 1996 that the entire tournament has been held at one site. The bracket also shifts from a traditional 1 vs. 8, 2 vs. 7, etc. format to a merit-based format that rewards the top teams during the regular season with byes into the quarterfinals and semifinals (the No. 1 and 2 seeds

will receive double byes into the semifinals while the No. 3 and 4 seeds will receive a bye into the quarterfinals). The 2011 OVC Men's and Women's Basketball Championship dates are March 2-5.

More on Municipal Auditorium: As part of the deal to host the tournament at Municipal Auditorium, the Nashville City Council and Municipal Auditorium committed \$200,000 to improvements at the venue, which opened in 1962. Among the major improvements that will be completed prior to this year's championship are upgrades to the dressing rooms, two new scoreboards and the new OVC-branded playing surface. The floor, which was unveiled at the league's Media Day event in October, was built by Horner Sports Flooring, whose corporate headquarters are in Dollar Bay, Mich. The company has made floors for many collegiate and National Basketball Association (NBA) teams, including building the floor for the 2010 NBA All-Star Game which was held at Texas Stadium. The Horner Pro King portable floor at Municipal Auditorium was purchased for a cost of \$71,960; the court will be used for the OVC Tournament, various high school games/tournaments and special events such as the Harlem Globetrotters.

Home Court Winning Streaks Come to an End: OVC teams has had two long home court winning streaks come to an end this season. Murray State had a 25-game home court winning streak snapped by Austin Peay on Jan. 8, a streak that dated back to Feb. 21, 2009. Morehead State saw its 24-game home court streak come to an end on Jan. 22 against Eastern Kentucky, the first home loss since Nov. 29, 2009 (Kent State).

Faried Named to Naismith Award Midseason Top 30 Watch List: Morehead State senior **Kenneth Faried** is one of 30 players named to the 2010-11 Naismith Award midseason watch list as announced by the Atlanta Tipoff Club. The Naismith Trophy is the most prestigious national award presented annually to college basketball's player of the year. Faried is the reigning OVC Player and Defensive Player of the Year, and was named this year's OVC Preseason Player of the Year. Last year, he averaged 16.9 points and 13.0 rebounds per game, leading the nation with 456 total rebounds. He also led the conference with 67 blocked shots and collected 56 steals on his way to honorable mention All-American honors. The watch list is compiled by the Atlanta Tipoff Club's Board of Selectors, which based its criteria on player performances from the previous year and expectations for the 2010-11 college basketball season. The Naismith Trophy presented by AT&T will be awarded at the 2011 NCAA Men's Final Four in Houston.

Faried Also on Wooden Award Midseason Top 30 Watch List: Morehead State University senior center **Kenneth Faried** was one of the players on the John R. Wooden Award Midseason Top 30 released by The Los Angeles Athletic Club in early January. Selected by the Wooden Award National Advisory Board, the list is made up of 30 student-athletes who, based on their performances in November and December, are the early frontrunners for college basketball's most prestigious honor. Transfers, freshmen and medical redshirts are eligible for this midseason list but did not appear on the preseason Top 50. All players nationally who excel throughout the season will be evaluated and considered for the official voting ballot released in March. The National Ballot consists of approximately 20 top players who have proven to their universities that they are also making progress toward graduation and maintaining at least a cumulative 2.0 GPA. The Wooden Award All-American Team will be announced the week of the "Elite Eight" round during the NCAA Tournament, making it unique among college postseason awards. The 35th annual Wooden Award ceremony, which will include the announcement of the Men's and Women's Wooden Award winners, a special tribute to Coach Wooden and Wooden Award founder Duke Llewellyn, and the presentation of the Wooden Award All American Teams and the Legends of Coaching Award, will take place the weekend of April 8-10, 2011.

Faried Named Candidate for Lowe's Senior CLASS Award: Morehead State senior center **Kenneth Faried** was one of 30 candidates for the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award in men's basketball. To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence - community, classroom, character and competition. An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School®, the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities. The candidate class was narrowed to 10 men's finalists in January but Faried was not on that list.

The 2010-11 Season: The 2010-11 season marks the 63rd of competition in the OVC. Over the previous 62 years, 12 different teams have claimed an OVC regular season championship, including three different schools in the past three years.

OVC Has Postseason Success: After several years of not having much postseason success, OVC teams have turned it around the past two years. Each of the last two years the league has sent three teams to the postseason, including Murray State to the NCAA Tournament and Eastern Kentucky and Morehead State to the College Basketball Invitational (CBI) last season. The biggest splash came from No. 13 seed Murray State who knocked off No. 4 seed Vanderbilt 66-65 in the NCAA Tournament when Danero Thomas hit a jumper at the buzzer. It was the first time an OVC team had won a First Round NCAA Tournament game since 1989 (when MTSU beat Florida State) and marked the second year in a row the league had won a NCAA Tournament game (Morehead State beat Alabama State in the Opening Round game in 2009). Murray State would lose to eventual national runner-up Butler in the Second Round, falling 54-52. Morehead State would win its first game in the CBI, marking the first time since 1988 that two different OVC teams had won postseason games in the same season.

OVC Players in the NBA: Entering the season there was just one former OVC player on a NBA roster. Former UT Martin All-American **Lester Hudson** began the year on the roster of the Washington Wizards but was waived on Nov. 22. Hudson was re-signed by the Wizards on Dec. 20 but waived once again on Jan. 5. Hudson was a two-time OVC Player of the Year at UT Martin before being selected No. 58 overall by the Boston Celtics in the 2009 NBA Draft. Hudson spent half of his rookie season with the Celtics before finishing the year with the Memphis Grizzlies and in the NBA Development League. There are also two former OVC players playing in the NBA Development League as former Tennessee Tech standout **Willie Jenkins** is with the Idaho Stampede and Jacksonville State's **Walker Russell** is with the Fort Wayne Mad Ants and was named to the D-League All-Star Game this season for the second time in three years.

Murray State Picked as Preseason Co-Favorites: In a vote of Ohio Valley Conference head men's basketball coaches and sports information directors, Murray State received 18 first-place votes and was picked as the favorite for the 2010-11 season. Last season Murray State won an OVC-record 31 games on its way to the OVC regular season and tournament championship as well as a NCAA Tournament first round victory over No. 4 seed Vanderbilt. It marks the 14th time in the last 22 years that Murray State has been picked the preseason favorite and third in a row (they were tabbed co-favorites with Morehead State last season). Murray State received 162 total points and was followed next by Morehead State (2 first-place votes, 146 points), who was a consensus No. 2 pick. Eastern Illinois was picked third (123) and was followed by Austin Peay (107), Eastern Kentucky (92), Tennessee Tech (85), Tennessee State (81), Jacksonville State (51), Southeast Missouri (41) and UT Martin (20).

Preseason Predictions: Is being picked the preseason favorite, always a good thing? Over the past 31 years of preseason polls that were available, the league's head coaches and sports information directors correctly pick the eventual OVC regular season champion 61 percent of the time, picking the correct winner 20 times over the last 32 years. Over the past 10 years, the preseason poll has correctly picked the winner every other year.

Morehead State's Faried Tabbed as Preseason Player of the Year: The 2010-11 All-OVC Pre-season Men's Basketball team was headlined by Morehead State senior center **Kenneth Faried**, marking the second year in a row he has been bestowed that honor. Faried was named both the OVC Player of the Year and Defensive Player of the Year in 2009-10. Overall seven different schools were represented on the team with Murray State's four selections leading the way. Morehead State had two selections while Austin Peay, Eastern Illinois, Eastern Kentucky, Jacksonville State and Tennessee Tech had one player apiece on the squad. The team features four players who were All-OVC first-team selections last season. The team also has one player who was a second-team selection and two players who were on the All-Newcomer squad. In addition to Faried, Murray State's **B.J. Jenkins** and **Isacc Miles** and Eastern Illinois' **Tyler Laser** were each first-team All-OVC picks last season and are each on the preseason team this year. Austin Peay's **Anthony Campbell** was the lone second-team selection from last season who returned to the OVC this year, while Murray State's **Isaiah Canaan**, along with Jenkins, were the All-Newcomer selections from last year who were on this year's preseason team. The Preseason All-OVC team was rounded out by Murray State's **Ivan Aska**, Morehead State's **Demonte Harper**, Tennessee Tech's **Kevin Murphy**, Jacksonville State's **Nick Murphy** and Eastern Kentucky's **Justin Stommes**.

All League Head Coaches Return: For the second-time in four years, every OVC head coach returns from the previous season. This last happened in the 2007-08 season. Overall it is the seventh time there has been no turnover in coaches between seasons since the 1978-79 season (the other years were 1978-79, 1993-94, 1994-95, 2001-02, 2004-05 and 2007-08).

Replay Systems for OVC Basketball Venues Enter Year Four: On Dec. 21, 2007, the Ohio Valley Conference mandated the use of courtside replay systems at all OVC basketball venues. The systems were put into place in January 2008 and have been used since. The systems are used in situations that are outlined by NCAA rules.

SIU Edwardsville Continues Reclassification Process to Division I: On July 1, 2008 Southern Illinois University Edwardsville became the 11th member of the Ohio Valley Conference. SIU Edwardsville, who is in the reclassification process to Division I, will begin regular season competition in the OVC during the 2011-12 academic year and will be eligible for postseason competition in 2012-13. The exception is the SIUE softball program, which will be eligible for both regular season and tournament competition this year; the softball program was the department's women's sport designee to be fast-tracked to Division I, making it eligible to compete at Division I prior to other SIUE sports. SIUE is located in Edwardsville, Ill., which is just northeast of St. Louis (the 18th largest media market in the United States).

OVCsports.TV: For the fifth consecutive year, fans can watch nearly every Conference matchup and all non-conference home contests this season at OVCsports.TV. The venture with NeuLion (formerly JumpTV Sports) allows fans to access live and on-demand streaming video and audio of conference matchups (excluding only national television games which are not available) on their home computer. The premium Web site was launched in July 2006 and has streamed over 1,000 events in its first four years, including all Conference matchups in football and men's and women's basketball as well as select baseball, soccer, softball and volleyball events and OVC Championship events. Packages are available on a yearly, seasonal, monthly or per-event basis.

OVC TELEVISION PACKAGE

This season the OVC is sponsoring a 21-game television package for basketball. In addition to this Conference-sponsored package, there are approximately 62 additional games that will air either locally, regionally or nationally involving OVC institutions during the season. That brings the total number of television games involving OVC schools this season to 83.

The sponsored OVC games are produced and aired by ESPNU/ESPN2 (9 games) and the Wazoo Sports network (12 games). Wazoo Sports is a Regional Sports Network located in London, Ky. Wazoo Sports (<http://www.wazoosports.com>) launched online in December of 2007 and expanded to a 24/7 sports television network on September 25, 2009. During the 2010 football season Wazoo produced an aired a 10-game OVC Football Game of the Week package.

The games that do not air on ESPNU can be seen on the Wazoo Sports Network in addition to CSS (Comcast/Charter Sports Southeast), ESPN3.com and ESPN Full Court. Four of the five women's games will air on Wazoo, ESPN3.com and ESPN Full Court, while the fifth will be exclusive to Wazoo. In addition, WEIU, an affiliate located in Charleston, Ill., will pick up all nine of the games. CSS, which was launched in 1999, can be found only on cable and serves over six million customers in 13 states. ESPN3.com, the network's live 24/7 broadband channel, was launched as ESPN360 in 2001 and renamed ESPN3.com in April, it is available at no additional cost to fans with a high-speed Internet connection from an affiliated provider. ESPN Full Court is an out-of-market pay-per-view sports package. The package is available on most major cable and satellite television providers.

Team Notes

Entering the final week of the season Austin Peay sits in third place in the OVC standings and has clinched at least a bye into the OVC Tournament quarterfinals but is looking to close strong and gain a share of the OVC Championship with some help from some other teams...Last week the Govs improved to 11-5 in OVC competition with a 73-70 victory at Jacksonville State...The week ended with a 76-69 BracketBusters series loss at Fairfield, the MAAC regular season champions...Junior newcomer TyShwan Edmondson averaged 21.5 points, 4.0 rebounds, 2.5 assists and 2.0 steals/game last week, breaking out of his prolonged scoring slump...Against Fairfield, who had the third-ranked scoring defense nationally, Edmondson hit 10-of-18 shots and scored 29 points, his 13th 20-plus point outing of the season...After a 21-point game against Tennessee State two weeks ago, center John Fraley did even better against Jacksonville State, scoring 25 points and grabbing 12 rebounds for his 10th career double-double (and third this season)...Caleb Brown added six steals in the JSU game, giving him 11 in a two-game stretch (including the TSU game the previous week)...In winning that game, APSU attempted a season-low five 3-pointers (all coming from Edmondson, who made three of them)...Freshman Will Triggs netted his first double-double of the year with 12 points and 10 rebounds at Fairfield on Saturday; it marked the sixth-straight game he has scored in double figures...The Govs did commit a season-high 25 turnovers in the Fairfield game, the most since Nov. 2006 for the team...Austin Peay will spend the last week of the regular season at home, hosting Eastern Illinois and Southeast Missouri.

Morehead State enters the final weekend of the regular season tied for first place in the standings with Murray State, the team it will play on Thursday in Murray in a game that can be seen on ESPNU...A win will clinch at least a share of the OVC Championship for the Eagles, the first regular season title for the team since 2002-03 (when it was shared with Austin Peay)...A loss would mean Eastern Kentucky would have to beat Murray State on Saturday (and Morehead would have to win at UT Martin) in order to be co-champions (but would most likely receive the No. 2 seed in the OVC Tournament)...Morehead State has won nine-straight games overall and 15 of its last 17 dating back to the end of December...Last week the Eagles avenged a home loss to Eastern Kentucky by going to Richmond and beating the Colonels 76-68 in overtime...Down two points with 10 seconds left, senior Demonte Harper drove the length of the floor, scored and was fouled; Harper missed the free throw but MSU hit 71.4 percent in the extra period on its way to the victory...On Saturday the team won in the ESPN Sears BracketBusters series for the first time in topping Indiana State 71-65 in Terre Haute...In that game senior Kenneth Faried became the NCAA's modern era (since 1973) career rebounding leader, passing Tim Duncan; Faried now has 1,576 career rebounds and 80 career double-doubles (a mark that is fifth in NCAA history)...For the week Faried averaged 20.0 points, 13.5 rebounds and 2.5 blocks/game while hitting 69.6 percent (16-of-23) from the field; he was named OVC Player of the Week for the fourth-straight week and record eighth time this year...The Eagles have reached the 20-win plateau for the third-straight season, the first-time in program history that has happened.

OVC Tournament Tiebreaker System

Regular season standings will be the determining factor in seeding for the tournament. All ties will be broken starting at the top of the conference standings and working down. The tiebreaking system will utilize the following factors, in order, until all ties are broken.

TWO-WAY TIES

1. Records in head-to-head competition are compared, with the higher seed going to the team that has won the most games against the other.
2. In the event step 1 does not resolve the tie (i.e. if the two teams split their games during the season), then the records of the tying teams against the No. 1 seed shall be compared. The team with the better record against the No. 1 seed shall gain the higher seed.
3. If the potential No. 1 seed is among tied teams, the process in step 2 will begin at the highest point in the standings which does not involve a tied team.
4. The process continues, through the No. 11 team in the standings, if necessary.
5. In the event the tie cannot be broken, seeds will be determined by a coin flip.

MULTIPLE TIES

1. Composite records between the tying teams will be evaluated to determine whether one team has won more games against the other tying institutions (in which case that team would receive the higher seed) and/or one team has won the least number of games among the tied teams (in which case the team will receive the lowest seed, and/or two teams have the same composite record (in which case the two-team tiebreaker scenario shall be utilized).
2. In the event step 1 does not solve the multiple ties, or reduce the multiple ties to one tie, then a comparison of records of the tying institutions against the No. 1 seed will occur. The team among the tying institutions with the better record against the No. 1 seed will receive the higher seed.
3. If the potential No. 1 seed is among tied teams, the process in step 2 will begin at the highest point in the standings which does not involve a tied team.
4. The process continues, through the No. 11 team in the standings, if necessary.
5. In the event this process does not resolve the ties, seeding will be determined by a coin flip.

Note: If a multiple tie is reduced to a tie between two teams, the two-team tiebreaker formula will then be utilized. Ties involving teams higher in the standings are always broken before ties involving teams lower in the standings.
