B.J. Jenkins, G • Sr., 6-0, 180 • Virginia Beach, Va. • Murray State

Jenkins averaged 21.5 points, 6.5 rebounds, 3.0 assists and 2.5 steals/game last week while hitting 64.7 percent (11-of-17) from the field, 60 percent (6-of-10) from 3-point range and 83.3 percent (15-of-18) from the free throw stripe as Murray State won a pair of games to lock up the outright OVC Championship, the 22nd in Racer program history. In the win against Morehead State (a team they were tied for first place with entering the night) Jenkins scored a career-high 25 points (20 in the second half) on 6-of-10 shooting including 4-of-6 from 3-point range. He also tied his career-high by pulling down seven rebounds and had three steals and two assists. With his team leading by just six points at halftime, Jenkins scored 20 points in the second half, hitting 3-of-4 3-pointers and 9-of-10 at the free throw line to secure the 70-62 victory. He also pulled down all seven of his rebounds after halftime and was a perfect 8-of-8 at the free throw line over the last 2:45 of the game. In the win over Eastern Kentucky on Saturday, Jenkins once again was big in the second half, scoring 13 of his 18 points in the second half while also adding six rebounds, four assists and two steals. For the game he was 5-of-7 from the field, 2-of-4 from 3-point range and 6-of-7 from the free throw line. Twice in the second half with the margin just six points in MSU's favor, Jenkins hit 3-pointers to push the advantage back to nine. For the week he had only two turnovers in 65 minutes of action.

NEWCOMER

Zac Swansey, G • R-Jr., 6-1, 180 • Dunwoody, Ga. • Tennessee Tech

Swansey averaged 13.0 points, 8.0 assists, 3.5 rebounds and 3.0 steals/game in a pair of Tennessee Tech victories last week while also hitting 75 percent (9-of-12) from the field, 75 percent from 3-point range (3-of-4) and 83.3 percent (5-of-6) from the free throw line. The transfer from Georgia had 13 points, 10 assists, six steals and four rebounds in Tennessee Tech's non-conference victory over SIUE to begin the week. He hit 4-of-5 shots and 4-of-4 at the free throw line in the game. To close out the week, Swansey had 13 points, six assists and three rebounds in a victory over Jacksonville State. Swansey was 5-of-7 from the field and 2-of-3 from 3-point range in that contest. With 37 seconds left in the Jax State game and TTU trailing by one point, Swansey hit a 3-pointer that sparked the Golden Eagles, who never trailed again after the shot. It is the second time this season Swansey has won the honor.

FRESHMAN

Mike Liabo, G • Fr., 6-6, 195 • Naples, Fla. • UT Martin

Liabo earned his third OVC Freshman of the Week honor of the season (and eighth honor for the UT Martin team in 16 total weeks this season) after averaging 17.5 points, 3.0 assists, 2.0 rebounds and 1.0 steals/game and hitting 44.4 percent (12-of-27) from the field and 50 percent (8-of-16) from 3-point range. Liabo, who is the Skyhawks leading scorer in OVC play this season, tied a career-high with 21 points in helping UTM erase a 16-point deficit and defeat Eastern Kentucky on Thursday night; the win clinched a spot in the OVC Tournament field for the Skyhawks. In Saturday's loss to Morehead State, Liabo poured in 14 points and dished out a career-high five assists (with zero turnovers).

Tournament History

For the 17th time in 18 years, the Ohio Valley Conference invades downtown Nashville to crown its men's basketball champion. The OVC Basketball Tournament is the league's showcase event, and the 2011 edition of "Music City Madness" will include a variety of exciting action both on and off the court.

This year the tournament returns to Municipal Auditorium, the new home of the Championship, with a new merit-based format in 2011. The combined men's and women's championship has been held at Municipal Auditorium five previous times: 1994, 1995, 1996, 2004 and 2008. The men also held its championship at the venue in 1989.

Starting with the 2011 Championships, all eight men's and all eight women's teams that qualify for the tournament field will gather at a single site for the entire tournament. Previously first round games were played on campus sites with the semifinals and finals being held in Nashville.

The bracket also shifts from a traditional 1 vs. 8, 2 vs. 7, etc. format to a merit-based format that rewards the top teams during the regular season with byes into the quarterfinals and semifinals. Starting in 2011, the first round of each the men's and women's tournament will feature the No. 5 seed against the No. 8 seed and the No. 6 seed against the No. 7 seed. The winners of those games will advance to the quarterfinals to face the No. 3 and No. 4 seeds (who received a bye). The winners of those quarterfinal matchups will advance to the semifinals to face the No. 1 and No. 2 seeds (who received a pair of byes).

The 2011 Championship marks the 48th time the men's event has been held, making it the fourth oldest Division I championship in the country (behind only the Southern, ACC and SEC).

Future OVC Basketball Tournament dates include Feb. 29-March 3, 2012, March 6-9, 2013 and March 5-8, 2014.



NOTES FROM AROUND THE LEAGUE

OVC Overview/This Week's Highlights: Murray State topped Eastern Kentucky on Saturday night to win the OVC Championship outright (and avoid a complicated tiebreaker that would have involved a coin flip); the title is the 22nd all-time for the Racers, the most among All OVC teams...The 2011 OVC Tournament will get underway on Wednesday at Municipal Auditorium in Nashville; this year marks a change in format to the Championship, bringing all eight teams to one site (instead of having first round games on campus sites) and switching to a merit-based format...The format now gives a double bye to the No. 1 (Murray State) and No. 2 (Morehead State) seeds, a single bye to the No. 3 (Austin Peay) and No. 4 (Tennessee Tech) seeds while the first round will match-up the No. 5 (Tennessee State) and No. 8 (UT Martin) seeds and the No. 6 (Eastern Kentucky) and No. 7 (Southeast Missouri) seeds...If Murray State would win the OVC Tournament title, they would become the fourth No. 1 seed to win the OVC Championship in the last six years (joining Murray State in 2006 and 2010 and Austin Peay in 2008)...In each of the last 24 OVC Tournaments one thing has held consistent, the fact that Austin Peay or Murray State (or both - which has happened five times) have played in the OVC Tournament Championship game; the last time neither Austin Peay or Murray State played in the title game was in 1986 when Akron battled Middle Tennessee State...This week marks the 48th OVC Men's Basketball Tournament; the OVC Tournament is currently the fourth oldest Division I Tournament Championship (behind only the Southern Conference, ACC and SEC).

2011 All-OVC Teams Announced on Tuesday: The announcement of the 2011 All-OVC Basketball Teams along with the Player of the Year, Defensive Player of the Year, Freshman of the Year and Coach of the Year awards will be announced on Tuesday, March 1. The announcement will come first via Twitter (@OVCSports), between Noon and 1 p.m. CT. A formal press release and posting on OVCSports.com will come after 1 p.m.

Murray State Claims 2011 OVC Regular Season Championship: Murray State claimed the 2011 OVC Regular Season Championship this year, its 22nd OVC title and second in as many years. MSU has also won OVC Regular Season titles in 1951, 1954, 1968, 1969, 1980, 1982, 1983, 1988, 1989, 1990, 1991, 1992, 1994, 1995, 1996, 1997, 1988, 1999, 2000, 2006 and 2010. The 22 titles are the most in OVC history; former member Western Kentucky has the second-most titles (19), while Morehead State's nine titles are the next most among active members.

OVC Tournament Makes Move to Municipal Auditorium with More Teams, New Format: Beginning this season the OVC Basketball Tournament will move to Municipal Auditorium in Nashville as its new annual home. This year's event will mark the 17th time in the last 18 years the league's marquee event has been held in Music City, USA (2002 was the lone year the event was not held in Nashville). It marks the sixth time the combined men's and women's tournament has been held in Municipal, following the 1994, 1995, 1996, 2004 and 2008 events (a men's only event was also held there in 1989). New this season is the fact that all eight men's and all eight women's teams that qualify for the tournament field will gather at a single site for the entire tournament (previously first round games were played on campus sites with the semifinals and finals being held in Nashville). That marks the first time since 1996 that the entire tournament has been held at one site. The bracket also shifts from a traditional 1 vs. 8, 2 vs. 7, etc. format to a merit-based format that rewards the top teams during the regular season with byes into the quarterfinals and semifinals (the No. 1 and 2 seeds will receive double byes into the semifinals while the No. 3 and 4 seeds will receive a bye into the quarterfinals). The 2011 OVC Men's and Women's Basketball Championship dates are March 2-5.

More on Municipal Auditorium: As part of the deal to host the tournament at Municipal Auditorium, the Nashville City Council and Municipal Auditorium committed \$200,000 to improvements at the venue, which opened in 1962. Among the major improvements that will be completed prior to this year's championship are upgrades to the dressing rooms, two new scoreboards and the new OVC-branded playing surface. The floor, which was unveiled at the league's Media Day event in October, was built by Horner Sports Flooring, whose corporate headquarters are in Dollar Bay, Mich. The company has made floors for many collegiate and National Basketball Association (NBA) teams, including building the floor for the 2010 NBA All-Star Game which was held at Texas Stadium. The Horner Pro King portable floor at Municipal Auditorium was purchased for a cost of \$71,960; the court will be used for the OVC Tournament, various high school games/tournaments and special events such as the Harlem Globetrotters.

Faried Has Three of the Nine 20/20 Games Nationally This Season: Morehead State's **Kenneth Faried** had a monster game at SIU Edwardsville on Nov. 28, scoring 25 points and pulling down 20 rebounds in a win. On Jan. 27 against Tennessee State Faried did even better, scoring 23 points and recording 23 rebounds in a victory (the 23 rebounds are tied for the most by a Division I player in a game this season). The next game out Faried hit the 20/20 mark again, scoring 21 points and grabbing 20 rebounds in a win at Jacksonville State (Feb. 3). Those are three of just nine 20/20 games at the Division I level this season. Faried also had a 20/20 game last season (23 points, 21 rebounds at Tennessee State - that was one of just nine 20/20 efforts nationally during the 2009-10 season) and a 20/20 game in 2008-09 (27 points, 24 rebounds against Florida A&M).

2011 OVC TOURNAMENT

The 2011 Ohio Valley Conference Men's & Women's Tournaments will be held March 2-5 at Municipal Auditorium in Nashville, Tenn. For the first time since 1996, the entire tournament will be held at one site (instead of first round games being played on campus sites). The tournament has also switched to a merit-based format with the No. 1 and 2 seeds getting double byes into the semifinals and the No. 3 and 4 seeds getting a bye into the quarterfinals.

The first round and quarterfinal games (which start at 12 and 2 p.m. for the women, and 6 and 8 p.m. for the men) can be seen on OVCSports.TV. The men's semifinals will be held on Friday, March 4 at 7 and 9 p.m. and televised on ESPN2 with the championship game on Saturday, March 5 at 7 p.m. and televised live on ESPN2. The women's semifinals are set for 12 and 2 p.m. on March 4 (televised on OVCSports.TV) and the women's championship game is set for March 5 at 3:00 p.m. (Wazoo Sports and other TBA outlets).

This marks the 17th time in 18 years that the tournament has been held in Nashville.

CREDENTIALS. For the second year in a row, credentials will be requested through an online system. That information will be available in January. **The deadline to request credentials is MONDAY, FEB. 28 at Noon.** No credentials will be mailed; they can be picked up at Media Will-Call, located at the back entrance of the arena (at the intersection of 5th Ave. North and Gay Street).

Faried Fifth in NCAA History in Double-Doubles: Morehead State's **Kenneth Faried** has 25 double-doubles this season (in 31 total games), which ranks first nationally (one ahead of Siena's Ryan Rossiter). For his career Faried has 82 career double-doubles, which is the most nationally among active players. Currently his 82 career double-doubles ranks fifth in NCAA history. The NCAA career record for double-doubles is 87 by Wake Forest's Tim Duncan.

Faried Only Player in OVC History With 1,900 Points, 1,600 Rebounds: In the long history of the Ohio Valley Conference, Morehead State's **Kenneth Faried** is the only player to have 1,900 or more career points and 1,600 or more career rebounds. He currently has 1,926 points and 1,607 rebounds.

Murray State Spreads the Wealth; Was Last Division I Team Without a 20-Point Scorer This Season: For the second year in a row Murray State has a very balanced attack, as no player averages more than 12.0 points/game and the team has eight players who average between 12.0 and 4.9 points/game. The Racers did not have a 20-point scorer in a game this year until their 21st game on January 29 when Isaiah Canaan scored 24 points. That made them the final Division I team (out of 345 total squads) without a 20-point scorer until that game. In addition, despite being in first place in the OVC, Murray State does not have one player who ranks in the Top 10 in both scoring and the Top 9 in rebounding in the OVC.

Big Shot Zac: Tennessee Tech junior guard **Zac Swansey** has been clutch in his first season in a Golden Eagle uniform as he has hit four game-winning shots (a made basket on TTU's final possession) in Tech's 18 total victories. 40 Minutes Just Not Enough for Austin Peay; Leads Nation in Overtime Games: So far this season Austin Peay has played in six overtime games, tied for the most of any Division I team with Troy (APSU is 2-4 in those games). The next closest teams are Charlotte, Georgia State, Houston, North Carolina A&T, Penn, Stony Brook, Troy, UNC Wilmington and Valparaiso who have each played in five overtime games.

The OVC Among NCAA Statistical Leaders: In the latest NCAA statistical leaders release (Feb. 21) Morehead State is fourth in rebounding margin (+8.9) while Tennessee Tech is 10th in field goal percentage (48.4%). Individually Morehead State's **Kenneth Faried** is first nationally in rebounding (14.3/game) and double-doubles (25), second in field goal percentage (63.7%), 36th in steals (2.0/game), 43rd in blocks (2.1/game) and 73rd in scoring (17.6/game). Southeast Missouri's **Leon Powell** is first nationally in field goal percentage (64.0%), Eastern Illinois' **Jeremy Granger** is eighth (92.2%) and Murray State's **B.J. Jenkins** is ninth (90.2%) in free throw percentage and Tennessee Tech's **Zac Swansey** is eighth in assists (6.3/game).

OVC One More Victory Away From Three Teams with 20-Plus Victories for Third Year in a Row: Last season for the first time in the history of the Ohio Valley Conference, three OVC basketball teams won 20 or more games in the same year in back-to-back seasons. Two seasons UT Martin won 22 games while Eastern Kentucky and Morehead State each won 20 games. Last season Murray State had 31 victories, Morehead State had 24 and Eastern Kentucky 20. This season entering the OVC Tournament, Murray State has 23 victories and Morehead State has 22; if Austin Peay picks up a victory on Thursday in the OVC Quarterfinals (or Tennessee Tech wins two more wins), that will make three teams for the third year in a row.

OVC Teams Compile 6-4 Mark ESPN Sears BracketBusters Series: For the sixth-straight season every OVC team competed in the ESPN Sears BracketBusters series (on Feb. 19). After going 3-8 in BracketBusters games last season, the OVC redeemed itself this season with a 6-4 overall record, including two road victories. Eastern Illinois, Morehead State, Murray State, Southeast Missouri, Tennessee Tech and Tennessee State were the OVC teams who picked up wins. Austin Peay was the only OVC school to be in one of the 11 nationally-televised games and the Gobs lost at Fairfield; OVC teams are now 2-4 all-time in BracketBusters TV contests. Now it's ninth year, BracketBusters is an ESPN television property that was tremendously successful with its nine events. The event has allowed Division I conferences to participate in a cutting-edge format that involves "wild card" pairings from the pool of participating teams, with half of the ESPN BracketBusters teams pre-designated as "home" and the remaining half as "road" teams. This year there were 114 teams from 15 conferences in the pool of teams that were selected for one of 11 nationally-televised games. OVC schools are 25-41 all-time in the BracketBusters event.

Loos is All-Time Winningest Coach in OVC History; Sutton Joins OVC Top 10: With a 68-66 victory at Ohio on Dec. 9 of last season, Austin Peay head coach **Dave Loos** recorded his 320th career victory while in the OVC, a mark that ranks first all-time. Loos passed Cal Luther (319 wins at Murray State and UT Martin) for the all-time mark. Loos, the Dean of OVC coaches, is now in his 21st year at Austin Peay where he also serves as the Athletics Director, making him the only Division I head men's basketball coach to hold that distinction. Loos is one of just 14 active Division I coaches to have coached at the same school for 20 or more years. Loos now has 350 victories in his tenure at Austin Peay and 432 for his career. Tennessee Tech head coach **Mike Sutton** joined the OVC all-time Top 10 list with his 141st victory on Feb. 3, 2011 (a victory over Eastern Kentucky). Sutton currently has 147 victories in his nine-year tenure at TTU, a mark that ranks ninth in OVC history.

Faried Named Oscar Robertson National Player of the Week (Feb. 1): The U.S. Basketball Writers Association (USBWA) selected Morehead State center **Kenneth Faried** as its Oscar Robertson National Player of the Week for games ending the week of Sunday, Jan. 30. The USBWA's weekly honor is presented by Blue Ribbon College Basketball Yearbook and chosen by a representative of the USBWA board of directors from a list of Division I conference players of the week. During the week Faried averaged 17.7 points and 18.0 rebounds while leading the Eagles to three wins of then first-place teams, including two key conference victories. Faried posted a 23-point, 23-rebound effort in a 72-65 win over Tennessee State (at the time his second of the season). Faried began the week with a 13-point, 15-rebound, 2-block, 3-steal game at Mid American Conference-leading Ball State, as the Eagles won 50-48 and snapped BSU's seven-game home winning streak. He capped the week with 17 points and 16 rebounds in a 69-56 victory over OVC-leading Austin Peay, avenging an overtime loss to the Governors earlier this season.

Morehead State's Proffitt Named Capital One Academic All-District as Selected by CoSIDA: Morehead State men's basketball junior **Ty Proffitt** has been named to the Capital One Academic All-District® First-Team as selected by CoSIDA for District IV. The award, which recognizes both academic and athletic prowess is selected by members of CoSIDA (College Sports Information Directors of America). Proffitt, a finance major, represents the men's basketball team on MSU's Student-Athlete Advisory Council, and he is a member of Beta Gamma Sigma business fraternity. Along with his teammates, Proffitt has participated in MS Walk, Heart Walk, has helped with local trash clean-up efforts, and volunteers his time for clothing and food shelters. To be eligible for nomination, a student-athlete must have reached sophomore academic standing and have at least a 3.30 cumulative grade point average. The Academic All-District® teams are divided into eight geographic districts across the United States and Canada. The University Division team includes NCAA Division I participants, while the College Division team combines NCAA Division II, NCAA Division III, NAIA, Canadian and two-year schools. District IV selections come from schools located within the states of Alabama, Kentucky, Michigan, Ohio and Tennessee.

Home Court Winning Streaks Come to an End: OVC teams has had two long home court winning streaks come to an end this season. Murray State had a 25-game home court winning streak snapped by Austin Peay on Jan. 8, a streak that dated back to Feb. 21, 2009. Morehead State saw its 24-game home court streak come to an end on Jan. 22 against Eastern Kentucky, the first home loss since Nov. 29, 2009 (Kent State).

Faried Named to Naismith Award Midseason Top 30 Watch List: Morehead State senior **Kenneth Faried** is one of 30 players named to the 2010-11 Naismith Award midseason watch list as announced by the Atlanta Tipoff Club. The Naismith Trophy is the most prestigious national award presented annually to college basketball's player of the year. Faried is the reigning OVC Player and Defensive Player of the Year, and was named this year's OVC Preseason Player of the Year. Last year, he averaged 16.9 points and 13.0 rebounds per game, leading the nation with 456 total rebounds. He also led the conference with 67 blocked shots and collected 56 steals on his way to honorable mention All-American honors. The watch list is compiled by the Atlanta Tipoff Club's Board of Selectors, which based its criteria on player performances from the previous year and expectations for the 2010-11 college basketball season. The Naismith Trophy presented by AT&T will be awarded at the 2011 NCAA Men's Final Four in Houston.

Faried Also on Wooden Award Midseason Top 30 Watch List: Morehead State University senior center **Kenneth Faried** was one of the players on the John R. Wooden Award Midseason Top 30 released by The Los Angeles Athletic Club in early January. Selected by the Wooden Award National Advisory Board, the list is made up of 30 student-athletes who, based on their performances in November and December, are the early frontrunners for college basketball's most prestigious honor. Transfers, freshmen and medical redshirts are eligible for this midseason list but did not appear on the preseason Top 50. All players nationally who excel throughout the season will be evaluated and considered for the official voting ballot released in March. The National Ballot consists of approximately 20 top players who have proven to their universities that they are also making progress toward graduation and maintaining at least a cumulative 2.0 GPA. The Wooden Award All-American Team will be announced the week of the "Elite Eight" round during the NCAA Tournament, making it unique among college postseason awards. The 35th annual Wooden Award ceremony, which will include the announcement of the Men's and Women's Wooden Award winners, a special tribute to Coach Wooden and Wooden Award founder Duke Llewellyn, and the presentation of the Wooden Award All American Teams and the Legends of Coaching Award, will take place the weekend of April 8-10, 2011.

Faried Named Candidate for Lowe's Senior CLASS Award: Morehead State senior center **Kenneth Faried** was one of 30 candidates for the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award in men's basketball. To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence - community, classroom, character and competition. An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School®, the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities. The candidate class was narrowed to 10 men's finalists in January but Faried was not on that list.

The 2010-11 Season: The 2010-11 season marks the 63rd of competition in the OVC. Over the previous 62 years, 12 different teams have claimed an OVC regular season championship, including three different schools in the past three years.

OVC Has Postseason Success: After several years of not having much postseason success, OVC teams have turned it around the past two years. Each of the last two years the league has sent three teams to the postseason, including Murray State to the NCAA Tournament and Eastern Kentucky and Morehead State to the College Basketball Invitational (CBI) last season. The biggest splash came from No. 13 seed Murray State who knocked off No. 4 seed Vanderbilt 66-65 in the NCAA Tournament when Danero Thomas hit a jumper at the buzzer. It was the first time an OVC team had won a First Round NCAA Tournament game since 1989 (when MTSU beat Florida State) and marked the second year in a row the league had won a NCAA Tournament game (Morehead State beat Alabama State in the Opening Round game in 2009). Murray State would lose to eventual national runner-up Butler in the Second Round, falling 54-52. Morehead State would win its first game in the CBI, marking the first time since 1988 that two different OVC teams had won postseason games in the same season.

OVC Players in the NBA: Entering the season there was just one former OVC player on a NBA roster. Former UT Martin All-American **Lester Hudson** began the year on the roster of the Washington Wizards but was waived on Nov. 22. Hudson was re-signed by the Wizards on Dec. 20 but waived once again on Jan. 5. Hudson was a two-time OVC Player of the Year at UT Martin before being selected No. 58 overall by the Boston Celtics in the 2009 NBA Draft. Hudson spent half of his rookie season with the Celtics before finishing the year with the Memphis Grizzlies and in the NBA Development League. There are also two former OVC players playing in the NBA Development League as former Tennessee Tech standout **Willie Jenkins** is with the Idaho Stampede and Jacksonville State's **Walker Russell** is with the Fort Wayne Mad Ants and was named to the D-League All-Star Game this season for the second time in three years.

Murray State Picked as Preseason Co-Favorites: In a vote of Ohio Valley Conference head men's basketball coaches and sports information directors, Murray State received 18 first-place votes and was picked as the favorite for the 2010-11 season. Last season Murray State won an OVC-record 31 games on its way to the OVC regular season and tournament championship as well as a NCAA Tournament first round victory over No. 4 seed Vanderbilt. It marks the 14th time in the last 22 years that Murray State has been picked the preseason favorite and third in a row (they were tabbed co-favorites with Morehead State last season). Murray State received 162 total points and was followed next by Morehead State (2 first-place votes, 146 points), who was a consensus No. 2 pick. Eastern Illinois was picked third (123) and was followed by Austin Peay (107), Eastern Kentucky (92), Tennessee Tech (85), Tennessee State (81), Jacksonville State (51), Southeast Missouri (41) and UT Martin (20).

Preseason Predictions: Is being picked the preseason favorite, always a good thing? Over the past 31 years of preseason polls that were available, the league's head coaches and sports information directors correctly pick the eventual OVC regular season champion 61 percent of the time, picking the correct winner 20 times over the last 32 years. Prior to this year, over the past 10 years, the preseason poll has correctly picked the winner every other year. This year the streak was finally broken this season when the poll correctly picked Murray State to win the regular season title, the second year in a row the poll was accurate.

Morehead State's Faried Tabbed as Preseason Player of the Year: The 2010-11 All-OVC Preseason Men's Basketball team was headlined by Morehead State senior center **Kenneth Faried**, marking the second year in a row he has been bestowed that honor. Faried was named both the OVC Player of the Year and Defensive Player of the Year in 2009-10. Overall seven different schools were represented on the team with Murray State's four selections leading the way. Morehead State had two selections while Austin Peay, Eastern Illinois, Eastern Kentucky, Jacksonville State and Tennessee Tech had one player apiece on the squad. The team features four players who were All-OVC first-team selections last season. The team also has one player who was a second-team selection and two players who were on the All-Newcomer squad. In addition to Faried, Murray State's **B.J. Jenkins** and **Isacc Miles** and Eastern Illinois' **Tyler Laser** were each first-team All-OVC picks last season and are each on the preseason team this year. Austin Peay's **Anthony Campbell** was the lone second-team selection from last season who returned to the OVC this year, while Murray State's **Isaiah Canaan**, along with Jenkins, were the All-Newcomer selections from last year who were on this year's preseason team. The Preseason All-OVC team was rounded out by Murray State's **Ivan Aska**, Morehead State's **Demonte Harper**, Tennessee Tech's **Kevin Murphy**, Jacksonville State's **Nick Murphy** and Eastern Kentucky's **Justin Stommes**.

All League Head Coaches Return: For the second-time in four years, every OVC head coach returns from the previous season. This last happened in the 2007-08 season. Overall it is the seventh time there has been no turnover in coaches between seasons since the 1978-79 season (the other years were 1978-79, 1993-94, 1994-95, 2001-02, 2004-05 and 2007-08).

ALL-TIME OVC COACHING WINS

Austin Peay head coach Dave Loos became the winningest coach in OVC history during the 2009-10 season. Loos passed the all-time mark previously held by Cal Luther and currently has 350 victories. Tennessee Tech head coach Mike Sutton entered the Top 10 with his 141st victory on Feb. 3, 2011 against Eastern Kentucky. Below is a list of where the 10 current head coaches rank in OVC history. Replay Systems for OVC Basketball Venues Enter Year Four: On Dec. 21, 2007, the Ohio Valley Conference mandated the use of courtside replay systems at all OVC basketball venues. The systems were put into place in January 2008 and have been used since. The systems are used in situations that are outlined by NCAA rules.

SIU Edwardsville Continues Reclassification Process to Division I: On July 1, 2008 Southern Illinois University Edwardsville became the 11th member of the Ohio Valley Conference. SIU Edwardsville, who is in the reclassification process to Division I, will begin regular season competition in the OVC during the 2011-12 academic year and will be eligible for postseason competition in 2012-13. The exception is the SIUE softball program, which will be eligible for both regular season and tournament competition this year; the softball program was the department's women's sport designee to be fast-tracked to Division I, making it eligible to compete at Division I prior to other SIUE sports. SIUE is located in Edwardsville, Ill., which is just northeast of St. Louis (the 18th largest media market in the United States).

OVCSports.TV: For the fifth consecutive year, fans can watch nearly every Conference matchup and all non-conference home contests this season at OVCSports.TV. The venture with NeuLion (formerly JumpTV Sports) allows fans to access live and on-demand streaming video and audio of conference matchups (excluding only national television games which are not available) on their home computer. The premium Web site was launched in July 2006 and has streamed over 1,000 events in its first four years, including all Conference matchups in football and men's and women's basketball as well as select baseball, soccer, softball and volleyball events and OVC Championship events. Packages are available on a yearly, seasonal, monthly or per-event basis.

OVC TELEVISION PACKAGE

This season the OVC is sponsoring a 21-game television package for basketball. In addition to this Conference-sponsored package, there are approximately 62 additional games that will air either locally, regionally or nationally involving OVC institutions during the season. That brings the total number of television games involving OVC schools this season to 83.

The sponsored OVC games are produced and aired by ESPNU/ESPN2 (9 games) and the Wazoo Sports network (12 games). Wazoo Sports is a Regional Sports Network located in London, Ky. Wazoo Sports (<http://www.wazoosports.com>) launched online in December of 2007 and expanded to a 24/7 sports television network on September 25, 2009. During the 2010 football season Wazoo produced an aired a 10-game OVC Football Game of the Week package.

The games that do not air on ESPNU can be seen on the Wazoo Sports Network in addition to CSS (Comcast/Charter Sports Southeast), ESPN3.com and ESPN Full Court. Four of the five women's games will air on Wazoo, ESPN3.com and ESPN Full Court, while the fifth will be exclusive to Wazoo. In addition, WEIU, an affiliate located in Charleston, Ill., will pick up all nine of the games. CSS, which was launched in 1999, can be found only on cable and serves over six million customers in 13 states. ESPN3.com, the network's live 24/7 broadband channel, was launched as ESPN360 in 2001 and renamed ESPN3.com in April, it is available at no additional cost to fans with a high-speed Internet connection from an affiliated provider. ESPN Full Court is an out-of-market pay-per-view sports package. The package is available on most major cable and satellite television providers.

Team Notes

Austin Peay finished the regular season with two OVC victories to finish the year 13-5 in Conference play and in a tie with Morehead State for second place...After a tiebreaker the Governors finished as the No. 3 seed for this week's OVC Tournament and received a bye to the quarterfinal round where they will play the winner of Wednesday's game between Eastern Kentucky and Southeast Missouri... Austin Peay has won four OVC Tournament Championships (1987, 1996, 2003 and 2008), including the last time the tournament was at Municipal Auditorium... The Govs were in the OVC Championship game two years ago, losing in double overtime to Morehead State...With the victory over Southeast Missouri on Saturday night, head coach Dave Loos recorded his 350th victory while at Austin Peay... Eastern Illinois closed out the regular season with road losses to Austin Peay and Tennessee State to finish 4-14 in OVC play (ninth place) and miss out on making the eight-team OVC Tournament field...After beating the top two teams in the OVC (Morehead State and Murray State) in back-to-back games in mid-January, the Panthers would not win again in OVC play, dropping 10-straight Conference games...Overall the team lost 10 of its last 11, with its lone victory being an impressive 75-58 road BracketBusters victory over Toledo...After holding a 3-point halftime lead over Tennessee State in its season finale on Saturday, the Panthers could not hold on and dropped a 66-62 decision to the Tigers... Morehead State came up just short of winning the OVC Regular Season Championship, losing at Murray State on Thursday and despite beating UT Martin on Saturday, finished one game behind the Racers in a tie for second place with Austin Peay...But Morehead State won the tiebreaker with the Governors and earned the No. 2 seed for the OVC Tournament, which comes with a double bye to Friday's semifinals...The Eagles will either play No. 3 seed Austin Peay, No. 6 seed Eastern Kentucky or No. 7 seed Southeast Missouri on Friday...MSU finished the regular season with 22 victories, the third-straight season the team has won 20 or more games, the first-time that has ever happened in program history...Despite seeing its nine-game winning streak end at Murray State last week, MSU ended the season by winning 16 of its final 19 games...The Eagles won the OVC Tournament two years ago (2009), its first OVC Tournament crown since 1984; In 2009 MSU went on to win the NCAA Opening Round game before falling to No. 1 overall seed Louisville in the first round...Senior Kenneth Faried added two more double-doubles last week and now has 82 for his career, the fifth-most in NCAA history...Faried also moved into 12th place in NCAA history (all-time) in rebounding; Faried already has the Modern Era (since 1973) rebounding mark (passing Tim Duncan two weeks ago)...Faried averaged 19.5 points, 15.5 rebounds and 3.5 blocks/game last week and hit 66.7 percent (14-of-21) from the field...Faried had seven blocked shots last week, moving him to 225 for his career which ranks third in OVC history...Redshirt freshman Drew Kelly pulled down 13 total rebounds in MSU's two games last week.

Team Notes

Southeast Missouri dropped both of its final regular season games last week but still managed to make the OVC Tournament field, coming in as the No. 7 seed after a tiebreaker over UT Martin...The Redhawks will play No. 6 seed Eastern Kentucky in the first round of championship on Wednesday; ECU swept the season series from the Redhawks, winning the two games by a combined 25 points...This marks the first OVC Tournament appearance for Southeast Missouri since the 2006-07 season; it is the 10th all-time appearance for the Redhawks, who won the OVC Championship in 2000 and went on to give LSU all it could handle in the first round of the NCAA Tournament...The team has not won an OVC Tournament game since 2005 (a win over No. 3 seed Murray State) but dropped its last two games in the event...Redshirt freshman Lucas Nutt averaged 12.5 points, 3.0 assists and 2.0 rebounds/game last week while hitting 45.5 percent (5-of-11) from 3-point range...He scored 15 points and dished out five assists in a loss at Tennessee State last Thursday and had 10 points in Saturday's loss at Austin Peay...Nutt scored in double figures in each of his last five games of the regular season...Redshirt junior Leon Powell has been the key for Southeast this year, averaging 14.5 points and 7.8 rebounds/game and hitting 64 percent from the field (which ranks first nationally in NCAA leaders with enough attempts to qualify); Powell's numbers were even better in OVC games this year (15.4 points and 8.1 rebounds/game).

UT Martin took fate and tiebreakers out of the equation last week when the Skyhawks beat Eastern Kentucky on Thursday and locked up a spot in the eight-team OVC Tournament field...The Skyhawks ended the regular season with a loss to Morehead State on Saturday and will enter the OVC Tournament as the No. 8 seed and play No. 5 seed Tennessee State in the first round on Wednesday...TSU swept the season series from UTM, winning by three points in Martin and by nine points in Nashville...UT Martin is in the tournament for the seventh time overall and first time since 2009 (when Lester Hudson led the team to the regular season championship and berth in the semifinals)...In Wednesday's game, seniors Benzor Simmons, Andres Irarrazabal and Daron Hood will play in their fifth OVC Tournament games, the most ever by any Skyhawk player...In the team's win over ECU, UTM trailed by as many as 16 points, but two lengthy delays due to tornado warnings helped change the momentum, and a 17-2 run over 5:06 changed the score from 54-39 to 56-56 with 8:40 to play...During the week Simmons averaged 18.0 points and 2.5 rebounds/game including 18 points in a span of 11:50 in the win over ECU...Freshman Mike Liabo averaged 17.5 points, 3.0 assists and 2.0 rebounds/game while hitting 8-of-16 from 3-point range in the two games...Liabo, who is the team's leading scorer in OVC play, had a career-high 21 points in the ECU victory and had 14 points and a career-high five assists (against zero turnovers) in the Morehead State contest...After winning only three of its first 13 OVC games this season, the Skyhawks were 3-2 in its final five Conference games of the season.
