## THIS WEEK'S adidas® OVC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK



### PLAYER

#### Kenneth Faried, C • Sr., 6-8, 228 • Newark, N.J. • Morehead State

After being named USBWA Oscar Robertson National Player of the Week last week, Faried followed that up by leading Morehead State to two more victories (the team has won five games in a row now) and putting the Eagles just half a game out of first place in the OVC. The senior averaged 16.0 points, 13.5 rebounds, 2.0 blocks, 2.0 steals and 1.0 assists/game while hitting 63.6 percent (14-of-22) from the field. It marks the second week in a row, sixth time this season and 13th time in his career Faried has been named OVC Player of the Week. Faried started the week with his third 20/20 game of the season, scoring 21 points and pulling down 20 rebounds in a win at Jacksonville State. Faried has three of just five total 20/20 games nationally this season (and now five for his career); he also has five 20-plus rebound games this season (out of just 15 nationally). He hit 9-of-13 shots in that game and also had three blocks, two assists and a steal. Faried ended the week with an 11-point, 7-rebound, 3-steal performance in a win at Tennessee Tech. In that win he increased his career rebounding total to 1,520, which passed Drexel's Malik Rose for third place on the NCAA career rebounding list since 1973; only Tim Duncan and Derrick Coleman are now ahead of him on that list. Faried continues to lead the nation in rebounding (14.2/game), a number that jumps to 15.2 caroms/game in OVC contests.

### NEWCOMER

#### Leon Powell, F • R-Jr., 6-7, 215 • St. Louis, Mo. • Southeast Missouri

In his lone game last week, Powell scored 28 points to lift Southeast Missouri State to a 70-64 win at Eastern Illinois. The victory snapped a six-game losing streak for the Redhawks and was the first road victory for the team since Dec. 21. Powell, who ranks first nationally in field goal percentage (63.8%), hit 9-of-10 shots and 10-of-12 free throws (despite entering the game hitting just 51% from the line on the season) to register a game-high 28 points in 34 minutes of action. Powell also pulled down seven rebounds, blocked three shots and dished out two assists. It marks the third time this season Powell has been named OVC Newcomer of the Week.

### FRESHMAN

#### Will Triggs, F • Fr., 6-5, 230 • Edwardsville, Ill. • Austin Peay

Triggs averaged 13.5 points (a team-high), 7.0 rebounds and 2.0 blocks/game and shot 92.3 percent (12-of-13) from the field in leading Austin Peay to a split last week, as the Governors topped UT Martin and lost to Murray State. Coming off the bench in both games, Triggs scored 12 points, had seven rebounds (tied for the team-high), two blocks and a steal in 19 minutes of action against the Skyhawks. He hit 6-of-7 shots in that game as the Govs won by 29 points. Two days later Triggs scored a season-high 15 points, added seven rebounds and two blocks in a career-high 27 minutes of play against Murray State. Triggs was a perfect 6-of-6 from the field in that game and hit 3-of-3 at the charity stripe.

## NOTES FROM AROUND THE LEAGUE

**OVC Overview/This Week's Highlights:** After last week's action, three teams (Murray State, Morehead State and Austin Peay) have locked themselves into the eight-team OVC Tournament field...Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech are on the verge of joining that trio and can be there with at least one victory this week...After losing its second OVC game of the season, preseason favorite Murray State did not sit atop the OVC standings until Saturday night (Feb. 5) when they topped rival Austin Peay climb back to first place, half a game ahead of the Governors and Morehead State Eagles...After starting the season 4-4 Murray State is 13-2 over its last 15 games; the Racers have one of the most balanced attacks in the country (nobody averages over 12.2 points/game) and despite being in first place in the OVC the team does not have one player in the Top 10 in the OVC scoring or rebounding leaders...Morehead State senior All-American Kenneth Faried continued to impress, recording his third 20/20 game of the season at Jacksonville State last week (21 points, 20 rebounds); there have been only five 20/20 games this season and Faried has three of them...Faried also passed Malik Rose on the NCAA career rebounding list (since 1973 when freshmen were once again allowed to play) and needs only 50 more rebounds to pass Tim Duncan for the top spot on that list...Faried leads all of Division I in rebounding (14.2/game) while Southeast Missouri State junior forward Leon Powell is tops in field goal percentage (63.8% - minimum of five made field goals/game)...Two OVC head coaches reached the 100 win milestone at their schools last week, as Murray State's Billy Kennedy and Eastern Kentucky's Jeff Neubauer both won games to reach that plateau...With the ESPN Sears BracketBusters games coming up on Feb. 19, this week is a busy week for most OVC teams, as six squads are playing a Monday game, meaning several teams will have played three games in five days and some will go on to play three games this week.

**Faried Has Three of the Five 20/20 Games Nationally This Season:** Morehead State's **Kenneth Faried** had a monster game at SIU Edwardsville on Nov. 28, scoring 25 points and pulling down 20 rebounds in a win. On Jan. 27 against Tennessee State Faried did even better, scoring 23 points and recording 23 rebounds in a victory (the 23 rebounds were the most by a Division I player in a game this season). The next game out Faried hit the 20/20 mark again, scoring 21 points and grabbing 20 rebounds in a win at Jacksonville State (Feb. 3). Those are three of just five 20/20 games at the Division I level this season. Faried also had a 20/20 game last season (23 points, 21 rebounds at Tennessee State - that was one of just nine 20/20 efforts nationally during the 2009-10 season) and a 20/20 game in 2008-09 (27 points, 24 rebounds against Florida A&M). **Faried Third in NCAA Career Rebounding Since 1973:** For players who have began their careers since 1973 (when freshmen were once again allowed to play NCAA basketball), only two players have grabbed more career rebounds than Morehead State's **Kenneth Faried**. Faried currently has 1,520 rebounds; Tim Duncan holds the record with 1,570. Faried is only 50 rebounds behind Duncan and has at least seven games left in his season (6 regular season games, at least one tournament game) and would need to average only 7.1 rebounds in those games to claim the record. In all-time NCAA records his 1,520 rebounds is 22nd. He is just 155 rebounds away from that Top 10 list; that 10th spot is occupied by Morehead State's Steve Hamilton, who is the OVC's all-time leading rebounder. **Faried 10th in NCAA History in Double-Doubles:** Morehead State's **Kenneth Faried** has 19 double-doubles this season (in 25 total games), which ranks second nationally. For his career Faried has 76 career double-doubles, which is the most nationally among active players. Currently his 76 career double-doubles ranks 10th in NCAA history (he just passed Navy's David Robinson and Memphis' Keith Lee). The NCAA career record for double-doubles is 87 by Wake Forest's Tim Duncan.

**Faried Joins Rare OVC Company:** In the long history of the Ohio Valley Conference, Morehead State's **Kenneth Faried** is one of just three players to have 1,800 or more career points and 1,500 or more career rebounds.

**Murray State Spreads the Wealth; Was Last Division I Team Without a 20-Point Scorer This Season:** For the second year in a row Murray State has a very balanced attack, as no player averages more than 12.2 points/game and the team has eight players who average between 12.2 and 5.3 points/game. The Racers did not have a 20-point scorer in a game this year until their 21st game on January 29 when Isaiah Canaan scored 24 points. That made them the final Division I team (out of 345 total squads) without a 20-point scorer until that game. In addition, despite being in first place in the OVC, Murray State does not have one player who ranks in the Top 10 in both scoring and rebounding in the OVC.

## 2011 OVC TOURNAMENT

The 2011 Ohio Valley Conference Men's & Women's Tournaments will be held March 2-5 at Municipal Auditorium in Nashville, Tenn. For the first time since 1996, the entire tournament will be held at one site (instead of first round games being played on campus sites). The tournament has also switched to a merit-based format with the No. 1 and 2 seeds getting double byes into the semifinals and the No. 3 and 4 seeds getting a bye into the quarterfinals.

The first round and quarterfinal games (which start at 12 and 2 p.m. for the women, and 6 and 8 p.m. for the men) can be seen on OVCsports.TV. The men's semifinals will be held on Friday, March 4 at 7 and 9 p.m. and televised on ESPN2 with the championship game on Saturday, March 5 at 7 p.m. and televised live on ESPN2. The women's semifinals are set for 12 and 2 p.m. on March 4 (televised on OVCsports.TV) and the women's championship game is set for March 5 at 3:00 p.m. (Wazoo Sports and other TBA outlets).

This marks the 17th time in 18 years that the tournament has been held in Nashville.

**CREDENTIALS.** For the second year in a row, credentials will be requested through an online system. That information will be available in January. **The deadline to request credentials is MONDAY, FEB. 28 at Noon.** No credentials will be mailed; they can be picked up at Media Will-Call, located at the back entrance of the arena (at the intersection of 5th Ave. North and Gay Street).



**40 Minutes Just Not Enough for Austin Peay; Leads Nation in Overtime Games:** So far this season Austin Peay has played in six overtime games, the most of any Division I team (APSU is 2-4 in those games). The next closest teams are Houston and North Carolina A&T who have each played in five overtime games.

**The OVC Among NCAA Statistical Leaders:** In the latest NCAA statistical leaders release (Jan. 30) Morehead State is fourth in rebounding margin (+9.0). Individually Morehead State's **Kenneth Faried** is first nationally in rebounding (14.2/game), second in double-doubles (19), fourth in field goal percentage (62.5%), 31st in steals (2.2/game), 52nd in blocks (2.0/game) and 96th in scoring (17.0/game). Southeast Missouri's **Leon Powell** is first nationally in field goal percentage (63.8%), Murray State's **B.J. Jenkins** is sixth (92.1%) while Eastern Illinois' Jeremy Granger is seventh (91.9%) free throw percentage and while Tennessee Tech's **Zac Swansey** is eighth in assists (6.5/game).

**OVC Teams to Once Again Compete in ESPN Sears BracketBusters Series:** For the sixth-straight season every OVC team will compete in the ESPN Sears BracketBusters series in 2010-11 (games to be played on Feb. 19). The selections were announced on Jan. 31 and Austin Peay received one of the 11 nationally-televised games, as the Governors will travel to Fairfield (ESPNU, 12 p.m. CT). It marks the third time in APSU's eight BracketBusters appearances they will be on TV. Austin Peay lost at Wichita State in 2004 (ESPN+) and at Akron in 2007 (ESPNU). OVC teams are 2-3 all-time in BracketBusters TV games. The 2011 non-television matchups are Eastern Illinois at Toledo, Eastern Kentucky at Western Carolina, Jacksonville State at Eastern Michigan, Morehead State at Indiana State, Evansville at Murray State, Sacramento State at Southeast Missouri, Delaware State at Tennessee State, Gardner-Webb at Tennessee Tech and Bradley at UT Martin. Now it its ninth year, BracketBusters is an ESPN television property that was tremendously successful with its first eight events. The event has allowed Division I conferences to participate in a cutting-edge format that involves "wild card" pairings from the pool of participating teams, with half of the ESPN BracketBusters teams pre-designated as "home" and the remaining half as "road" teams. This year there are 114 teams from 15 conferences in the pool of teams that were selected for one of 11 nationally-televised games. Teams that were not selected for a television game were paired up with other teams in the pool for game. OVC schools are 19-37 all-time in the BracketBusters event.

**Loos is All-Time Winningest Coach in OVC History; Sutton Joins OVC Top 10:** With a 68-66 victory at Ohio on Dec. 9 of last season, Austin Peay head coach **Dave Loos** recorded his 320th career victory while in the OVC, a mark that ranks first all-time. Loos passed Cal Luther (319 wins at Murray State and UT Martin) for the all-time mark. Loos, the Dean of OVC coaches, is now in his 21st year at Austin Peay where he also serves as the Athletics Director, making him the only Division I head men's basketball coach to hold that distinction. Loos is one of just 14 active Division I coaches to have coached at the same school for 20 or more years. Loos now has 346 victories in his tenure at Austin Peay and 428 for his career. Tennessee Tech head coach **Mike Sutton** joined the OVC all-time Top 10 list with his 141st victory on Feb. 3, 2011 (a victory over Eastern Kentucky). Sutton currently has 141 victories in his nine-year tenure at TTU.

**Faried Named Oscar Robertson National Player of the Week (Feb. 1):** The U.S. Basketball Writers Association (USBWA) selected Morehead State center **Kenneth Faried** as its Oscar Robertson National Player of the Week for games ending the week of Sunday, Jan. 30. The USBWA's weekly honor is presented by Blue Ribbon College Basketball Yearbook and chosen by a representative of the USBWA board of directors from a list of Division I conference players of the week. During the week Faried averaged 17.7 points and 18.0 rebounds while leading the Eagles to three wins of then first-place teams, including two key conference victories. Faried posted a 23-point, 23-rebound effort in a 72-65 win over Tennessee State (at the time his second of the season). Faried began the week with a 13-point, 15-rebound, 2-block, 3-steal game at Mid American Conference-leading Ball State, as the Eagles won 50-48 and snapped BSU's seven-game home winning streak. He capped the week with 17 points and 16 rebounds in a 69-56 victory over OVC-leading Austin Peay, avenging an overtime loss to the Governors earlier this season.

**Morehead State's Proffitt Named Capital One Academic All-District as Selected by CoSIDA:** Morehead State men's basketball junior **Ty Proffitt** has been named to the Capital One Academic All-District® First-Team as selected by CoSIDA for District IV. As a member of the All-District first-team, Proffitt is automatically placed on the national ballot for consideration for Academic All-America honors later this month. The award, which recognizes both academic and athletic prowess is selected by members of CoSIDA (College Sports Information Directors of America). Proffitt, a finance major, represents the men's basketball team on MSU's Student-Athlete Advisory Council, and he is a member of Beta Gamma Sigma business fraternity. Along with his teammates, Proffitt has participated in MS Walk, Heart Walk, has helped with local trash clean-up efforts, and volunteers his time for clothing and food shelters. To be eligible for nomination, a student-athlete must have reached sophomore academic standing and have at least a 3.30 cumulative grade point average. The Academic All-District® teams are divided into eight geographic districts across the United States and Canada. The University Division team includes NCAA Division I participants, while the College Division team combines NCAA Division II, NCAA Division III, NAIA, Canadian and two-year schools. District IV selections come from schools located within the states of Alabama, Kentucky, Michigan, Ohio and Tennessee.

**OVC Tournament Makes Move to Municipal Auditorium with More Teams, New Format:** Beginning this season the OVC Basketball Tournament will move to Municipal Auditorium in Nashville as its new annual home. This year's event will mark the 17th time in the last 18 years the league's marquee event has been held in Music City, USA (2002 was the lone year the event was not held in Nashville). It marks the sixth time the combined men's and women's tournament has been held in Municipal, following the 1994, 1995, 1996, 2004 and 2008 events (a men's only event was also held there in 1989). New this season is the fact that all eight men's and all eight women's teams that qualify for the tournament field will gather at a single site for the entire tournament (previously first round games were played on campus sites with the semifinals and finals being held in Nashville). That marks the first time since 1996 that the entire tournament

has been held at one site. The bracket also shifts from a traditional 1 vs. 8, 2 vs. 7, etc. format to a merit-based format that rewards the top teams during the regular season with byes into the quarterfinals and semifinals (the No. 1 and 2 seeds will receive double byes into the semifinals while the No. 3 and 4 seeds will receive a bye into the quarterfinals). The 2011 OVC Men's and Women's Basketball Championship dates are March 2-5.

**More on Municipal Auditorium:** As part of the deal to host the tournament at Municipal Auditorium, the Nashville City Council and Municipal Auditorium committed \$200,000 to improvements at the venue, which opened in 1962. Among the major improvements that will be completed prior to this year's championship are upgrades to the dressing rooms, two new scoreboards and the new OVC-branded playing surface. The floor, which was unveiled at the league's Media Day event in October, was built by Horner Sports Flooring, whose corporate headquarters are in Dollar Bay, Mich. The company has made floors for many collegiate and National Basketball Association (NBA) teams, including building the floor for the 2010 NBA All-Star Game which was held at Texas Stadium. The Horner Pro King portable floor at Municipal Auditorium was purchased for a cost of \$71,960; the court will be used for the OVC Tournament, various high school games/tournaments and special events such as the Harlem Globetrotters.

**Home Court Winning Streaks Come to an End:** OVC teams has had two long home court winning streaks come to an end this season. Murray State had a 25-game home court winning streak snapped by Austin Peay on Jan. 8, a streak that dated back to Feb. 21, 2009. Morehead State saw its 24-game home court streak come to an end on Jan. 22 against Eastern Kentucky, the first home loss since Nov. 29, 2009 (Kent State).

**Faried Named to Naismith Award Watch List:** Morehead State senior **Kenneth Faried** is one of 50 players named to the 2010-11 Naismith Award preseason watch list as announced by the Atlanta Tipoff Club. The Naismith Trophy is the most prestigious national award presented annually to college basketball's player of the year. Faried is the reigning OVC Player and Defensive Player of the Year, and was named this year's OVC Preseason Player of the Year. Last year, he averaged 16.9 points and 13.0 rebounds per game, leading the nation with 456 total rebounds. He also led the conference with 67 blocked shots and collected 56 steals on his way to honorable mention All-American honors. This year's diverse list includes the top men's college basketball players from 44 schools around the country. The watch list was compiled by the Atlanta Tipoff Club's Board of Selectors, which based its criteria on player performances from the previous year and expectations for the 2010-11 college basketball season. The Naismith Trophy presented by AT&T will be awarded at the 2011 NCAA Men's Final Four in Houston.

**Faried Also on Wooden Award Midseason Top 30 Watch List:** Morehead State University senior center **Kenneth Faried** was one of the players on the John R. Wooden Award Midseason Top 30 released by The Los Angeles Athletic Club in early January. Selected by the Wooden Award National Advisory Board, the list is made up of 30 student-athletes who, based on their performances in November and December, are the early frontrunners for college basketball's most prestigious honor. Transfers, freshmen and medical redshirts are eligible for this midseason list but did not appear on the preseason Top 50. All players nationally who excel throughout the season will be evaluated and considered for the official voting ballot released in March. The National Ballot consists of approximately 20 top players who have proven to their universities that they are also making progress toward graduation and maintaining at least a cumulative 2.0 GPA. The Wooden Award All-American Team will be announced the week of the "Elite Eight" round during the NCAA Tournament, making it unique among college postseason awards. The 35th annual Wooden Award ceremony, which will include the announcement of the Men's and Women's Wooden Award winners, a special tribute to Coach Wooden and Wooden Award founder Duke Llewellyn, and the presentation of the Wooden Award All American Teams and the Legends of Coaching Award, will take place the weekend of April 8-10, 2011.

**Faried Named Candidate for Lowe's Senior CLASS Award:** Morehead State senior center **Kenneth Faried** was one of 30 candidates for the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award in men's basketball. To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence - community, classroom, character and competition. An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School®, the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities. The candidate class was narrowed to 10 men's finalists in January but Faried was not on that list.

**The 2010-11 Season:** The 2010-11 season marks the 63rd of competition in the OVC. Over the previous 62 years, 12 different teams have claimed an OVC regular season championship, including three different schools in the past three years.

**OVC Has Postseason Success:** After several years of not having much postseason success, OVC teams have turned it around the past two years. Each of the last two years the league has sent three teams to the postseason, including Murray State to the NCAA Tournament and Eastern Kentucky and Morehead State to the College Basketball Invitational (CBI) last season. The biggest splash came from No. 13 seed Murray State who knocked off No. 4 seed Vanderbilt 66-65 in the NCAA Tournament when Danero Thomas hit a jumper at the buzzer. It was the first time an OVC team had won a First Round NCAA Tournament game since 1989 (when MTSU beat Florida State) and marked the second year in a row the league had won a NCAA Tournament game (Morehead State beat Alabama State in the Opening Round game in 2009). Murray State would lose to eventual national runner-up Butler in the Second Round, falling 54-52. Morehead State would win its first game in the CBI, marking the first time since 1988 that two different OVC teams had won postseason games in the same season.

**OVC Players in the NBA:** Entering the season there was just one former OVC player on a NBA roster. Former UT Martin All-American **Lester Hudson** began the year on the roster of the Washington Wizards but was waived on Nov. 22. Hudson was re-signed by the Wizards on Dec. 20 but waived once again on Jan. 5. Hudson was a two-time OVC Player of the Year at UT Martin

before being selected No. 58 overall by the Boston Celtics in the 2009 NBA Draft. Hudson spent half of his rookie season with the Celtics before finishing the year with the Memphis Grizzlies and in the NBA Development League. There are also three former OVC players playing in the NBA Development League as former Tennessee Tech standout **Willie Jenkins** is with the Idaho Stampede and Jacksonville State's **Walker Russell** (Fort Wayne Mad Ants) and **Amadou Mbodji** (Utah Flash) are also in the league.

**Murray State Picked as Preseason Co-Favorites:** In a vote of Ohio Valley Conference head men's basketball coaches and sports information directors, Murray State received 18 first-place votes and was picked as the favorite for the 2010-11 season. Last season Murray State won an OVC-record 31 games on its way to the OVC regular season and tournament championship as well as a NCAA Tournament first round victory over No. 4 seed Vanderbilt. It marks the 14th time in the last 22 years that Murray State has been picked the preseason favorite and third in a row (they were tabbed co-favorites with Morehead State last season). Murray State received 162 total points and was followed next by Morehead State (2 first-place votes, 146 points), who was a consensus No. 2 pick. Eastern Illinois was picked third (123) and was followed by Austin Peay (107), Eastern Kentucky (92), Tennessee Tech (85), Tennessee State (81), Jacksonville State (51), Southeast Missouri (41) and UT Martin (20).

**Preseason Predictions:** Is being picked the preseason favorite, always a good thing? Over the past 31 years of preseason polls that were available, the league's head coaches and sports information directors correctly pick the eventual OVC regular season champion 61 percent of the time, picking the correct winner 20 times over the last 32 years. Over the past 10 years, the preseason poll has correctly picked the winner every other year.

**Morehead State's Faried Tabbed as Preseason Player of the Year:** The 2010-11 All-OVC Preseason Men's Basketball team was headlined by Morehead State senior center **Kenneth Faried**, marking the second year in a row he has been bestowed that honor. Faried was named both the OVC Player of the Year and Defensive Player of the Year in 2009-10. Overall seven different schools were represented on the team with Murray State's four selections leading the way. Morehead State had two selections while Austin Peay, Eastern Illinois, Eastern Kentucky, Jacksonville State and Tennessee Tech had one player apiece on the squad. The team features four players who were All-OVC first-team selections last season. The team also has one player who was a second-team selection and two players who were on the All-Newcomer squad. In addition to Faried, Murray State's **B.J. Jenkins** and **Isacc Miles** and Eastern Illinois' **Tyler Laser** were each first-team All-OVC picks last season and are each on the preseason team this year. Austin Peay's **Anthony Campbell** was the lone second-team selection from last season who returned to the OVC this year, while Murray State's **Isaiah Canaan**, along with Jenkins, were the All-Newcomer selections from last year who were on this year's preseason team. The Preseason All-OVC team was rounded out by Murray State's **Ivan Aska**, Morehead State's **Demonte Harper**, Tennessee Tech's **Kevin Murphy**, Jacksonville State's **Nick Murphy** and Eastern Kentucky's **Justin Stommes**.

**All League Head Coaches Return:** For the second-time in four years, every OVC head coach returns from the previous season. This last happened in the 2007-08 season. Overall it is the seventh time there has been no turnover in coaches between seasons since the 1978-79 season (the other years were 1978-79, 1993-94, 1994-95, 2001-02, 2004-05 and 2007-08).

**Replay Systems for OVC Basketball Venues Enter Year Four:** On Dec. 21, 2007, the Ohio Valley Conference mandated the use of courtside replay systems at all OVC basketball venues. The systems were put into place in January 2008 and have been used since. The systems are used in situations that are outlined by NCAA rules.

**SIU Edwardsville Continues Reclassification Process to Division I:** On July 1, 2008 Southern Illinois University Edwardsville became the 11th member of the Ohio Valley Conference. SIU Edwardsville, who is in the reclassification process to Division I, will begin regular season competition in the OVC during the 2011-12 academic year and will be eligible for postseason competition in 2012-13. The exception is the SIUE softball program, which will be eligible for both regular season and tournament competition this year; the softball program was the department's women's sport designee to be fast-tracked to Division I, making it eligible to compete at Division I prior to other SIUE sports. SIUE is located in Edwardsville, Ill., which is just northeast of St. Louis (the 18th largest media market in the United States).

**OVCsports.TV:** For the fifth consecutive year, fans can watch nearly every Conference matchup and all non-conference home contests this season at OVCsports.TV. The venture with NeuLion (formerly JumpTV Sports) allows fans to access live and on-demand streaming video and audio of conference matchups (excluding only national television games which are not available) on their home computer. The premium Web site was launched in July 2006 and has streamed over 1,000 events in its first four years, including all Conference matchups in football and men's and women's basketball as well as select baseball, soccer, softball and volleyball events and OVC Championship events. Packages are available on a yearly, seasonal, monthly or per-event basis.

## OVC TELEVISION PACKAGE

This season the OVC is sponsoring a 21-game television package for basketball. In addition to this Conference-sponsored package, there are approximately 62 additional games that will air either locally, regionally or nationally involving OVC institutions during the season. That brings the total number of television games involving OVC schools this season to 83.

The sponsored OVC games are produced and aired by ESPNU/ESPN2 (9 games) and the Wazoo Sports network (12 games). Wazoo Sports is a Regional Sports Network located in London, Ky. Wazoo Sports (<http://www.wazoosports.com>) launched online in December of 2007 and expanded to a 24/7 sports television network on September 25, 2009. During the 2010 football season Wazoo produced an aired a 10-game OVC Football Game of the Week package.

The games that do not air on ESPNU can be seen on the Wazoo Sports Network in addition to CSS (Comcast/Charter Sports Southeast), ESPN3.com and ESPN Full Court. Four of the five women's games will air on Wazoo, ESPN3.com and ESPN Full Court, while the fifth will be exclusive to Wazoo. In addition, WEIU, an affiliate located in Charleston, Ill., will pick up all nine of the games. CSS, which was launched in 1999, can be found only on cable and serves over six million customers in 13 states. ESPN3.com, the network's live 24/7 broadband channel, was launched as ESPN360 in 2001 and renamed ESPN3.com in April, it is available at no additional cost to fans with a high-speed Internet connection from an affiliated provider. ESPN Full Court is an out-of-market pay-per-view sports package. The package is available on most major cable and satellite television providers.

#### Team Notes

Eastern Kentucky began the week with a 63-54 loss at Tennessee Tech but rebounded with a 57-51 victory over Jacksonville State to close the week...That put the Colonels at 7-6 in OVC play, which places them in sixth place in the standings...EKU is now 6-6 in true road games this year after starting the year 0-5 on the road...The victory on Saturday was the 100th for head coach Jeff Neubauer in his six years at the helm of the ECU program...Eastern converted 17-straight free throws in the second half of the JSU game; the Colonels currently lead the OVC in free throw percentage (74.6%)...Despite scoring just 57 points, the team did pick up the win at Jax State; the Colonels have been held to under 60 points in four of its last five games and are just 2-8 this season when scoring under 60 (the other was a win at Morehead State when they scored 59)...Senior Spencer Perrin averaged 18.5 points, 6.5 rebounds/game and hit 63.2 percent (12-of-19) from the field and 90 percent (9-of-10) from the free throw line during the week...Perrin hauled in eight rebounds in the win over JSU and is hitting 63.6 percent (28-of-44) from the field over his last four games...Eastern Kentucky is now at home for three-straight games including games this week with Southeast Missouri and Eastern Illinois; the Colonels topped both of those teams on the road in mid-January.

#### Team Notes

Morehead State remained one of the hottest teams in the league, winning two games last week to push its OVC winning streak to four games and its overall win streak to five contests in a row...The Eagles enter the week tied with Austin Peay in the standings, just half a game behind first place Murray State (who plays on Monday night)...Last week MSU went on the road and topped Tennessee Tech and Jacksonville State to improve to 9-4 in OVC action...Senior Kenneth Faried had another monster week, one week removed from being the Oscar Robertson National Player of the Week...Faried averaged 16.0 points, 13.5 rebounds, 2.0 blocks and 2.0 steals/game in the two wins...In the victory over JSU the senior recorded his third 20/20 game of the season, scoring 21 points and pulling down 20 rebounds; there have been just five 20/20 games this season and Faried has three of them...On Saturday at Tech, Faried moved past Malik Rose and into third place on the NCAA career rebounding charts since 1973; only Tim Duncan and Derrick Coleman have more rebounds than him since 1973, a record Faried should hold outright later this month (he is just 50 rebounds away)...Faried has 19 double-doubles this year while MSU women's player Ashar Harris has 15; no school in the country has a male/female tandem with more double-doubles this season...Redshirt freshman Drew Kelly had the best game of his young career (he has been eligible since mid-December) when he scored 21 points in the victory over TTU; he also had seven rebounds and two steals in the game...Senior Demonte Harper scored 25 points and had three assists in the JSU victory...Morehead State will play its final home games of the season this week when Eastern Illinois (ESPN3.com) and Southeast Missouri come to town; MSU will play its final four games of the year on the road.

#### Team Notes

After losing in its second OVC game of the season, Murray State has come full-circle in re-gaining the top spot in the OVC and following a win at Austin Peay on Saturday the Racers now have a half a game lead over Austin Peay and Morehead State in the standings...After a loss at home to Eastern Illinois the Racers have ran off five victories in a row and have won seven of its last eight games overall and 13 of 15 since Dec. 11 going from an overall record of 4-4 to 17-6...The Racers continue to do it with a balanced attack that has eight players averaging between 12.2 and 5.3 points/game; the team also does not have a player in the Top 10 in the OVC rankings in scoring or rebounding, something that is rare for a team that is in first place in the league...MSU went the first 20 games of the season without a 20-point scorer (the longest streak in the nation) but has now had three games in a row with one, as Isaiah Canaan had 21 against UT Martin on Jan. 29 (the first by a Racer this season), Ed Daniel had 21 points (and six rebounds) in a ESPNU victory over Tennessee State and Canaan added 21 in the win over rival Austin Peay on Saturday...Murray State head coach Billy Kennedy won his 100th game at the school on Thursday night, the seventh coach in the long and storied history of Murray State basketball to reach that mark...The Racers begin the week trying to avenge another OVC loss when they travel to Eastern Illinois...The week also includes home games with Tennessee Tech and Jacksonville State...After tonight's road game, MSU plays five of its final six at home, including a big game with Morehead State (ESPNU) on Feb. 24.

#### Team Notes

In its only game of the week Southeast Missouri snapped a six-game losing streak by going on the road and besting Eastern Illinois 70-64...With the victory the Redhawks moved to 5-8 in OVC play and jumped from eighth place to seventh place in the OVC standings...The win over EIU completed a season sweep of the Panthers, the first time since the 2004-05 season the Redhawks have accomplished that...Junior Leon Powell was named OVC Newcomer of the Week for the third time this season after scoring 28 points, grabbing seven rebounds and blocking three shots in the win...Powell, who leads all of Division I with a 63.8 percent field goal percentage, hit 9-of-10 shots from the field and was an impressive 10-of-12 (83.3%) at the free throw line (Powell entered the game hitting just 51% from the charity stripe)...It marked the fourth 20-plus point game of the season for the junior who sat out last season with an injury...Freshman Lucas Nutt added 15 points on 3-of-5 3-point shooting while also toeing the free throw line to hit 4-of-4 attempts...Nutt made all four of those charity shots in the final 45 seconds to secure the team's first road victory since Dec. 21...Southeast is in the midst of a four-game road swing, a stretch that includes six of its final eight games on the road to wrap-up the regular season as the team looks to lock up an OVC Tournament berth (with a top eight finish) for the first time since 2007... ### OVC Tournament Tiebreaker System

Regular season standings will be the determining factor in setting first-round pairings for the tournament. All ties will be broken starting at the top of the conference standings and working down. The tiebreaking system will utilize the following factors, in order, until all ties are broken.

#### TWO-WAY TIES

1. Records in head-to-head competition are compared, with the higher seed going to the team that has won the most games against the other.
2. In the event step 1 does not resolve the tie (i.e. if the two teams split their games during the season), then the records of the tying teams against the No. 1 seed shall be compared. The team with the better record against the No. 1 seed shall gain the higher seed.
3. If the potential No. 1 seed is among tied teams, the process in step 2 will begin at the highest point in the standings which does not involve a tied team.
4. The process continues, through the No. 11 team in the standings, if necessary.
5. In the event the tie cannot be broken, seeds will be determined by a coin flip.

#### MULTIPLE TIES

1. Composite records between the tying teams will be evaluated to determine whether one team has won more games against the other tying institutions (in which case that team would receive the higher seed) and/or one team has won the least number of games among the tied teams (in which case the team will receive the lowest seed, and/or two teams have the same composite record (in which case the two-team tiebreaker scenario shall be utilized).
2. In the event step 1 does not solve the multiple ties, or reduce the multiple ties to one tie, then a comparison of records of the tying institutions against the No. 1 seed will occur. The team among the tying institutions with the better record against the No. 1 seed will receive the higher seed.
3. If the potential No. 1 seed is among tied teams, the process in step 2 will begin at the highest point in the standings which does not involve a tied team.
4. The process continues, through the No. 11 team in the standings, if necessary.
5. In the event this process does not resolve the ties, seeding will be determined by a coin flip.

*Note: If a multiple tie is reduced to a tie between two teams, the two-team tiebreaker formula will then be utilized. Ties involving teams higher in the standings are always broken before ties involving teams lower in the standings.*
