### Leon Powell, F • Jr., 6-7, 215 • St. Louis, Mo. • Southeast Missouri

Powell averaged 26.5 points and 6.5 rebounds/game while hitting 18-of-20 (90%) shots from the floor as Southeast Missouri State won two OVC contests last week to increase its Conference winning streak to four games (the first time since 2004-05 the team has had that long of a Conference winning streak). The junior began the week by scoring 36 points, the most by an OVC player in a single game this season, in an 82-75 victory over UT Martin. He hit 11-of-13 (84.6%) shots, 14-of-20 free throws, pulled down eight rebounds and blocked four shots in the win. The filt 17-01-13 (04-07/8) shots, 14-01-20 free throws, pulled down eight rebounds and blocked four shots in the win. The St. Louis native ended the week by hitting 7-of-7 shots from the field, scoring 17 points and pulling down five rebounds as Southeast Missouri overcame a 17-point second half deficit to top Eastern Illinois 78-75. He scored 15 of his 17 points in the second half and it was his free throw with 6:20 to play that gave the Redhawks its first lead of the dame and the team never trailed after that point. His only negative was 16 missed free throws during the week; had he converted those Powell would have averaged 34.5 points/game. Powell has played a huge part in the Redhawks winning five of its last six games after starting the season 0-10. ### Leon Powell, F • Jr., 6-7, 215 • St. Louis, Mo. • Southeast Missouri

### Lucas Nutt, G • R-Fr., 6-1, 180 • Jonesboro, Ark. • Southeast Missouri

Nutt averaged 18.5 points, 7.5 assists and 2.5 rebounds/game last week in helping Southeast Missouri to a pair of wins as the Redhawks extended its OVC winning streak to four games, the longest for the team since the 2004-05 season. Nutt began the week by scoring a season-high 22 points, dishing out four assists and pulling down four rebounds in a win over UT Martin. The redshirt freshman added 15 points and nine assists in a win over Eastern Illinois to conclude the week as the Redhawks overcame a 17-point second half deficit to pull out a three-point victory. Nutt hit 45.5 percent (10-of-22) of his shots and 81.3 percent (13-of-16) of his free throw attempts in the two games.

### NOTES FROM AROUND THE LEAGUE

**OVC Overview/This Week's Highlights:** In the biggest game of last week, Austin Peay topped rival Murray State, ending the Racers 25-game home court winning streak, and putting the Governors on top of the OVC standings with a perfect 5-0 record...It is the first time since the 2007-08 season that APSU has started 5-0 in OVC play (the Govs would go on to be 16-4 and win the OVC Championship that season)...A trio of teams (Morehead State, Tennessee State and Southeast Missouri) are in second place, two losses behind Austin Peay in the loss column; two of those teams will meet on Thursday when Morehead State travels to Southeast Missouri... Southeast Missouri has now won four OVC games in a row, the first time they have accomplished that feat since the 2004-05 campaign...Southeast Missouri State swept this week's OVC Player of the Week awards (Player, Newcomer, Freshman), the first time since Feb. 18, 2008 that a school has won all three awards in a week (that week it was UT Martin who had Gerald Robinson, Lester Hudson and Marquis Weddle win the awards)...Morehead State's Kenneth Faried continues to lead Division I in rebounding (13.6/game) and double-doubles (15); with 72 career double-doubles, Faried is only 15 behind Tim Duncan's all-time NCAA record.

Faried Nets 20/20 Game: Morehead State's Kenneth Faried had a monster game at SIU Edwardsville on Nov. 28, scoring 25 points and pulling down 20 rebounds in a win. That is one of just three 20/20 games at the Division I level this season. Faried also had a 20/20 game last season (23 points, 21 rebounds at Tennessee State - that was one of just nine 20/20 efforts nationally during the 2009-10 season) and a 20/20 game in 2008-09 (27 points, 24 rebounds against Florida A&M). Faried has 15 double-doubles this season (in 17 total games), which ranks first nationally. For his career Faried has 72 career double-doubles, which is the most nationally among active players. The NCAA career record for double-doubles is 87 by Wake Forest's Tim Duncan.

**Home Court Overall Winning Streaks:** Entering this week Morehead State's 24-game home court winning streak is the longest in the OVC and tied for fourth longest nationally. The Eagles have not lost at home since falling to Kent State on Nov. 29, 2009. Murray State had a 25-game home court winning streak snapped by Austin Peay on Jan. 8, a streak that dated back to Feb. 21, 2009. Kansas has the nation's longest home court winning streak (68).

**Home Court Conference Winning Streaks:** Entering this week Morehead State has a 22-game home court winning streak in Conference games, a streak that dates back to the last game of the 2007-08 season (which was a loss). That streak is currently the sixth-longest nationally. MSU was undefeated at home in 2008-09 and 2009-10 and is 4-0 in OVC play at home this season. Xavier (32 games) currently has the longest home court conference winning streak.

Murray State Spreads the Wealth; One of Two Division I Teams With Winning Records Without a 20-Point Scorer This Season: For the second year in a row Murray State has a very balanced attack, as no player averages more than 11.5 points/game and the team has seven players who average between 11.5 and 5.5 points/game. To take it one step further, the Racers (10-5 overall) are one of just two Division I teams (out of 345 total squads) with winning records this season who have not had a 20-point scorer in a game. The other team is Jacksonville (10-3). There are two other Division I teams who have not had a 20-point scorer this year (Toledo and USC Upstate) but each of those teams have losing overall records.

**40 Minutes Just Not Enough for Austin Peay:** So far this season Austin Peay has played five overtime games, the most of any Division I team. Princeton, SIU Edwardsville and Wofford have each played three overtime games this season.

The OVC Among NCAA Statistical Leaders: In the latest NCAA statistical leaders release (Jan. 10) Tennessee Tech ranks seventh in steals (10.1/game), Tennessee State is fifth in free throw percentage (78.3%) and Morehead State is 10th in rebounding margin (+9.2). Individually Morehead State's Kenneth Faried is first nationally in rebounding (13.6/game) and double-doubles (15), sixth in field goal percentage (64.1%), 23rd in steals (2.4/game), 46th in blocks (2.1/game) and 47th in points (18.8/game). Southeast Missouri's Leon Powell is fifth in field goal percentage (64.7%), Murray State's B.J. Jenkins is eighth (92.9%) and Eastern Illinois' Jeremy Granger ninth (92.3%) in free throw percentage while Tennessee Tech's Zac Swansey is sixth in assists (6.8/game).

Murray State 22nd in CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major Poll: After finishing last season with an OVC-record 31 wins, Murray State finished the 2009-10 season ranked sixth in the CollegeInsider. com Mid-Major poll. This season the Racers began the year fifth in that poll and are currently

### **2011 OVC TOURNAMENT**

The 2011 Ohio Valley Conference Men's & Women's Tournaments will be held March 2-5 at Municipal Auditorium in Nashville, Tenn. For the first time since 1996, the entire tournament will be held at one site (instead of first round games being played on campus sites). The tournament has also switched to a merit-based format with the No. 1 and 2 seeds getting double byes into the semifinals and the No. 3 and 4 seeds getting a bye into the quarterfinals.

The first round and quarterfinal games (which start at 12 and 2 p.m. for the women, and 6 and 8 p.m. for the men) can be seen on OVCSports.TV. The men's semifinals will be held on Friday, March 4 at 7 and 9 p.m. and televised on ESPNU with the championship game on Saturday, March 5 at 7 p.m. and televised live on ESPN2. The women's semifinals are set for 12 and 2 p.m. on March 4 (televised on OVCSports.TV) and the women's championship game is set for March 5 at 3:00 p.m. (TV TBD).

This marks the 17th time in 18 years that the tournament has been held in Nashville.

CREDENTIALS. For the second year in a row, credentials will be requested through an online system. That information will be available in January. The deadline to request credentials is MONDAY, FEB. 28 at Noon. No credentials will be mailed; they can be picked up at Media Will-Call, located at teh back entrance of the arena (at the intersection of 5th Ave. North and Gay Street).



22nd in the Jan. 3 poll (the Jan. 10 poll had not been released at press time). Morehead State, who was in the poll for two weeks, is currently among the others receiving votes. Now in its 12th season, the Mid-Major poll is made up of team's from the following conferences: America East, Atlantic Sun, Big Sky, Big South, Big West, Colonial, Great West, Horizon, Independents, Ivy, Metro Atlantic, Mid-American, Mid-Eastern, Missouri Valley, Northeast, Ohio Valley, Patriot, Southern, Southland, Southwestern, Summit, Sun Belt, West Coast. It is voted upon by coaches from those conferences, with one coach per conference casting a vote (Murray State's Billy Kennedy is the OVC representative).

OVC Tournament Makes Moves to Municipal Auditorium with More Teams, New Format: Beginning this season the OVC Basketball Tournament will move to Municipal Auditorium in Nashville as its new annual home. This year's event will mark the 17th time in the last 18 years the league's marquee event has been held in Music City, USA (2002 was the lone year the event was not held in Nashville). It marks the sixth time the combined men's and women's tournament has been held in Municipal, following the 1994, 1995, 1996, 2004 and 2008 events (a men's only event was also held there in 1989). New this season is the fact that all eight men's and all eight women's teams that qualify for the tournament field will gather at a single site for the entire tournament (previously first round games were played on campus sites with the semifinals and finals being held in Nashville). That marks the first time since 1996 that the entire tournament has been held at one site. The bracket also shifts from a traditional 1 vs. 8, 2 vs. 7, etc. format to a merit-based format that rewards the top teams during the regular season with byes into the quarterfinals and semifinals (the No. 1 and 2 seeds will receive double byes into the semifinals while the No. 3 and 4 seeds will receive a bye into the quarterfinals). The 2011 OVC Men's and Women's Basketball Championship dates are March 2-5.

More on Municipal Auditorium: As part of the deal to host the tournament at Municipal Auditorium, the Nashville City Council and Municipal Auditorium committed \$200,000 to improvements at the venue, which opened in 1962. Among the major improvements that will be completed prior to this year's championship are upgrades to the dressing rooms, two new scoreboards and the new OVC-branded playing surface. The floor, which was unveiled at the league's Media Day event in October, was built by Horner Sports Flooring, whose corporate headquarters are in Dollar Bay, Mich. The company has made floors for many collegiate and National Basketball Association (NBA) teams, including building the floor for the 2010 NBA All-Star Game which was held at Texas Stadium. The Horner Pro King portable floor at Municipal Auditorium was purchased for a cost of \$71,960; the court will be used for the OVC Tournament, various high school games/tournaments and special events such as the Harlem Globetrotters.

Loos is All-Time Winningest Coach in OVC History: With a 68-66 victory at Ohio on Dec. 9 of last season, Austin Peay head coach Dave Loos recorded his 320th career victory while in the OVC, a mark that ranks first all-time. Loos passed Cal Luther (319 wins at Murray State and UT Martin) for the all-time mark. Loos, the Dean of OVC coaches, is now in his 21st year at Austin Peay where he also serves as the Athletics Director, making him the only Division I head men's basketball coach to hold that distinction. Loos is one of just 14 active Division I coaches to have coached at the same school for 20 or more years. Loos now has 342 victories in his tenure at Austin Peay and 424 for his career.

Faried Named to Naismith Award Watch List: Morehead State senior Kenneth Faried is one of 50 players named to the 2010-11 Naismith Award preseason watch list as announced by the Atlanta Tipoff Club. The Naismith Trophy is the most prestigious national award presented annually to college basketball's player of the year. Faried is the reigning OVC Player and Defensive Player of the Year, and was named this year's OVC Preseason Player of the Year. Last year, he averaged 16.9 points and 13.0 rebounds per game, leading the nation with 456 total rebounds. He also led the conference with 67 blocked shots and collected 56 steals on his way to honorable mention All-American honors. This year's diverse list includes the top men's college basketball players from 44 schools around the country. The watch list was compiled by the Atlanta Tipoff Club's Board of Selectors, which based its criteria on player performances from the previous year and expectations for the 2010-11 college basketball season. The Naismith Trophy presented by AT&T will be awarded at the 2011 NCAA Men's Final Four in Houston.

Faried Also on Wooden Award Midseason Top 30 Watch List: Morehead State University senior center Kenneth Faried was one of the players on the John R. Wooden Award Midseason Top 30 released by The Los Angeles Athletic Club in early January. Selected by the Wooden Award National Advisory Board, the list is made up of 30 student-athletes who, based on their performances in November and December, are the early frontrunners for college basketball's most prestigious honor. Transfers, freshmen and medical redshirts are eligible for this midseason list but did not appear on the preseason Top 50. All players nationally who excel throughout the season will be evaluated and considered for the official voting ballot released in March. The National Ballot consists of approximately 20 top players who have proven to their universities that they are also making progress toward graduation and maintaining at least a cumulative 2.0 GPA. The Wooden Award All-American Team will be announced the week of the "Elite Eight" round during the NCAA Tournament, making it unique among college postseason awards. The 35th annual Wooden Award ceremony, which will include the announcement of the Men's and Women's Wooden Award winners, a special tribute to Coach Wooden and Wooden Award founder Duke Llewellyn, and the presentation of the Wooden Award All American Teams and the Legends of Coaching Award, will take place the weekend of April 8-10, 2011.

Faried Named Candidate for Lowe's Senior CLASS Award: Morehead State senior center Kenneth Faried is one of 30 candidates for the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award in men's basketball. To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence - community, classroom, character

An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School®, the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities. The candidate class will be narrowed to 10 men's finalists midway through the regular season, and those names will be placed on the official ballot. Ballots will be distributed through a nationwide voting system to media, coaches and fans, who will select one finalist who best exemplifies excellence in the four Cs of community, classroom, character and competition.

Swansey a Candidate for Bob Cousy Award: Tennessee Tech junior Zac Swansey is one of 66 NCAA basketball players in contention for the 2011 Bob Cousy award and the title of the nation's top point guard, as announced by the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame. The annual award, named for Hall of Famer and former Boston Celtic Bob Cousy, recognizes college basketball's top point guard. Nominations were solicited from all schools across the country. The original list of candidates will be narrowed down to a final 20 by January 3rd, final 10 by February 3rd, and final five by March 3rd. A Hall of Fame appointed screening committee will be narrowing down the candidates from 20 to 10 to 5 prior to a Blue Ribbon Selection Committee evaluating the final five candidates and ultimately choosing the winner. Both of the Hall of Fame committee's are made up of top college basketball personnel including media members, head coaches, Sports Information Directors and Hall of Famers. The winner of the 2011 Bob Cousy Award will be presented at the Hall of Fame's Class Announcement on Monday April 4th in Houston as part of NCAA Final Four weekend.

The 2010-11 Season: The 2010-11 season marks the 63rd of competition in the OVC. Over the previous 62 years, 12 different teams have claimed an OVC regular season championship, including three different schools in the past three years.

OVC Has Postseason Success: After several years of not having much postseason success, OVC teams have turned it around the past two years. Each of the last two years the league has sent three teams to the postseason, including Murray State to the NCAA Tournament and Eastern Kentucky and Morehead State to the College Basketball Invitational (CBI) last season. The biggest splash came from No. 13 seed Murray State who knocked off No. 4 seed Vanderbilt 66-65 in the NCAA Tournament when Danero Thomas hit a jumper at the buzzer. It was the first time an OVC team had won a First Round NCAA Tournament game since 1989 (when MTSU beat Florida State) and marked the second year in a row the league had won a NCAA Tournament game (Morehead State beat Alabama State in the Opening Round game in 2009). Murray State would lose to eventual national runner-up Butler in the Second Round, falling 54-52. Morehead State would win its first game in the CBI, marking the first time since 1988 that two different OVC teams had won postseason games in the same season.

OVC Teams to Once Again Compete in ESPN BracketBusters Series: For the sixth-straight season every OVC team will compete in the ESPN BracketBusters series in 2010-11. Now it its ninth year, ESPN BracketBusters is an ESPN television property that was tremendously successful with its first eight events. The event has allowed Division I conferences to participate in a cutting-edge format that involves "wild card" pairings from the pool of participating teams, with half of the ESPN BracketBusters teams pre-designated as "home" and the remaining half as "road" teams. This year there are 114 teams from 15 conferences in the pool of teams who will be selected for one of 11 nationally-televised games. Teams not selected for a television game will be paired up with other teams in the pool for games that will be played on Saturday, Feb. 19. The matchups will be announced on January 31. OVC schools are 19-37 all-time in the BracketBusters event.

OVC Players in the NBA: Entering the season there was just one former OVC player on a NBA roster. Former UT Martin All-American Lester Hudson began the year on the roster of the Washington Wizards but was waived on Nov. 22. Hudson was re-signed by the Wizards on Dec. 20 but waived once again on Jan. 5. Hudson was a two-time OVC Player of the Year at UT Martin before being selected No. 58 overall by the Boston Celtics in the 2009 NBA Draft. Hudson spent half of his rookie season with the Celtics before finishing the year with the Memphis Grizzlies and in the NBA Development League. There are also three former OVC players playing in the NBA Development League as former Tennessee Tech standout Willie Jenkins is with the Idaho Stampede and Jacksonville State's Walker Russell (Fort Wayne Mad Ants) and Amadou Mbodji (Utah Flash) are also in the league.

Murray State Picked as Preseason Co-Favorites: In a vote of Ohio Valley Conference head men's basketball coaches and sports information directors, Murray State received 18 first-place votes and was picked as the favorite for the 2010-11 season. Last season Murray State won an OVC-record 31 games on its way to the OVC regular season and tournament championship as well as a NCAA Tournament first round victory over No. 4 seed Vanderbilt. It marks the 14th time in the last 22 years that Murray State has been picked the preseason favorite and third in a row (they were tabbed co-favorites with Morehead State last season). Murray State received 162 total points and was followed next by Morehead State (2 first-place votes, 146 points), who was a consensus No. 2 pick. Eastern Illinois was picked third (123) and was followed by Austin Peay (107), Eastern Kentucky (92), Tennessee Tech (85), Tennessee State (81), Jacksonville State (51), Southeast Missouri (41) and UT Martin (20).

Preseason Predictions: Is being picked the preseason favorite, always a good thing? Over the past 31 years of preseason polls that were available, the league's head coaches and sports information directors correctly pick the eventual OVC regular season champion 61 percent of the time, picking the correct winner 20 times over the last 32 years. Over the past 10 years, the preseason poll has correctly picked the winner every other year.

Morehead State's Faried Tabbed as Preseason Player of the Year: The 2010-11 All-OVC Preseason Men's Basketball team was headlined by Morehead State senior center Kenneth Faried, marking the second year in a row he has been bestowed that honor. Faried was named both the OVC Player of the Year and Defensive Player of the Year in 2009-10. Overall seven different schools were represented on the team with Murray State's four selections leading the way. Morehead State had two selections while Austin Peay, Eastern Illinois, Eastern Kentucky, Jacksonville State and Tennessee Tech had one player apiece on the squad. The team features four players who were All-OVC first-team selections last season. The team also has one player who was a second-team selection and two players who were on the All-Newcomer squad. In addition to Faried, Murray State's B.J. Jenkins and Isacc Miles and Eastern Illinois' Tyler Laser were each firstteam All-OVC picks last season and are each on the preseason team this year. Austin Peay's Anthony Campbell was the lone second-team selection from last season who returned to the OVC this year, while Murray State's Isaiah Canaan, along with Jenkins, were the All-Newcomer selections from last year who were on this year's preseason team. The Preseason All-OVC team was rounded out by Murray State's Ivan Aska, Morehead State's **Demonte Harper**, Tennessee Tech's **Kevin Murphy**, Jacksonville State's **Nick** Murphy and Eastern Kentucky's Justin Stommes.

**All League Head Coaches Return:** For the second-time in four years, every OVC head coach returns from the previous season. This last happened in the 2007-08 season. Overall it is the seventh time there has been no turnover in coaches between seasons since the 1978-79 season (the other years were 1978-79, 1993-94, 1994-95, 2001-02, 2004-05 and 2007-08).

Replay Systems for OVC Basketball Venues Enter Year Four: On Dec. 21, 2007, the Ohio Valley Conference mandated the use of courtside replay systems at all OVC basketball venues. The systems were put into place in January 2008 and have been used since. The systems are used in situations that are outlined by NCAA rules.

**SIU Edwardsville Continues Reclassification Process to Division I:** On July 1, 2008 Southern Illinois University Edwardsville became the 11th member of the Ohio Valley Conference. SIU Edwardsville, who is in the reclassification process to Division I, will begin regular season competition in the OVC during the 2011-12 academic year and will be eligible for postseason competition in 2012-13. The exception is the SIUE softball program, which will be eligible for both regular season and tournament competition this year; the softball program was the department's women's sport designee to be fast-tracked to Division I, making it eligible to compete at Division I prior to other SIUE sports. SIUE is located in Edwardsville, Ill., which is just northeast of St. Louis (the 18th largest media market in the United States.

**OVCSports.TV:** For the fifth consecutive year, fans can watch nearly every Conference matchup and all non-conference home contests this season at OVCSports.TV. The venture with NeuLion (formerly JumpTV Sports) allows fans to access live and on-demand streaming video and audio of conference matchups (excluding only national television games which are not available) on their home computer. The premium Web site was launched in July 2006 and has streamed over 1,000 events in its first four years, including all Conference matchups in football and men's and women's basketball as well as select baseball, soccer, softball and volleyball events and OVC Championship events. Packages are available on a yearly, seasonal, monthly or per-event basis.

# **OVC TELEVISION PACKAGE**

This season the OVC is sponsoring a 21-game television package for basketball. In addition to this Conference-sponsored package, there are approximately 62 additional games that will air either locally, regionally or nationally involving OVC institutions during the season. That brings the total number of television games involving OVC schools this season to 83.

The sponsored OVC games are produced and aired by ESPNU/ESPN2 (9 agmes) and the Wazoo Sports network (12 games). Wazoo Sports is a Regional Sports Network located in London, Ky. Wazoo Sports (http://www.wazoosports.com) launched online in December of 2007 and expanded to a 24/7 sports television network on September 25, 2009. During the 2010 football season Wazoo produced an aired a 10-game OVC Football Game of the Week package.

The games that do not air on ESPNU can be seen on the Wazoo Sports Network in addition to CSS (Comcast/Charter Sports Southeast), ESPN3.com and ESPN Full Court. Four of the five women's games will air on Wazoo, ESPN3.com and ESPN Full Court, while the fifth will be exclusive to Wazoo. In addition, WEIU, an affiliate located in Charleston, Ill., will pick up all nine of the games. CSS, which was launched in 1999, can be found only on cable and serves over six million customers in 13 states. ESPN3.com, the network's live 24/7 broadband channel, was launched as ESPN360 in 2001 and renamed ESPN3.com in April, it is available at no additional cost to fans with a high-speed Internet connection from an affiliated provider. ESPN Full Court is an out-of-market pay-per-view sports package. The package is available on most major cable and satellite television providers.

### Team Notes

Austin Peay ran its overall winning streak to five games and also improved to 5-0 in OVC play for the first time since the 2007-08 season with a non-conference win over Chattanooga and a OVC victory over rival Murray State...Against UTC, the Govs held the Mocs to a season-low 23.7 percent and hit 50 percent from the field in winning 89-57...The 32-point margin of victory was the largest in the series history between the two teams...Junior TyShwan Edmondson led APSU in scoring with 23 points, his third-straight 20-point game...Senior point guard Caleb Brown dished out 10 assists, the first Austin Peay player to record double-digit assists since January 2008 (D.J. Wright)...Junior Josh Terry added 16 points on 7-of-9 shooting while John Fraley added 11 points and 11 rebounds to net his second double of the season...The win over Murray State ended the Racers 25-game home court winning streak, which had been the fourth-longest nationally at the time...APSU held MSU to 42.1 percent shooting, its lowest output since losing to Oklahoma State earlier this season...Sophomore Justin Blake came off the bench and hit 5-of-5 from 3-point range in scoring a game-high 15 points...His play sparked the Governors who led by 10 points at halftime and by 15 points with 9:36 to play...Murray State would eventually go on a 19-1 run and have a 3-point attempt at the buzzer to win the game, but came up just short...Edmondson saw his streak of 16-straight double-figure scoring games end as he was held to just six points after hitting his elbow in the game and having to come out of the game for awhile...Brown added seven assists to finish with 17 helpers for the week; he is currently second in the OVC in assists (5.4/game)...The Govs will have little time to rest as they are back in action on Monday at UT Martin and conclude the

### **Team Notes**

Murray State began the week with a 64-53 victory over Tennessee State to extend its home court winning streak to 25 games...Donte Poole came off the bench in that game to tie his career-high with 16 points on 4-of-4 3-point shooting and spark the Racers...The tough Murray State defense limited TSU to just nine field goals in the first half and 38 percent shooting from the game while the Racer offense hit on 50 percent of its shots...Isacc Miles added 12 points and four steals...Two days later, however, the team would see its winning streak come to an end a the hands of its arch rival, Austin Peay, by a 66-64 margin...It was only the third loss at the CFSB Center for the Racers in the team's past 51 games...Murray State fell behind by 10 points at halftime by 15 points (61-46) with 9:36 to play in the game before making its comeback with pressure defense; Multiple steals and bucket eventually led to a 19-1 run as the Racers pulled within three points with 2:30 left...The deficit was narrowed to two points with 22.1 left and after Austin Peay missed the front-end of a 1-and-1 free throw attempt, the Racers called a timeout to set up a final shot but B.J. Jenkins 3-point attempt that would have won the game came up short...Miles and Isaiah Canaan had 14 points apiece while Jewuan Long added 11...It was the first loss for the Racers at home since falling to Louisiana Tech on Feb. 21, 2009 (679 days between losses)...MSU is one of two Division I teams with a winning records (Jacksonville is the other) to not have a 20-point scorer in a game this season...Murray State head coach Billy Kennedy currently has 198 career wins at three stops, and could reach the 200-win plateau this week if the Racers win scheduled games at Jacksonville State and Tennessee Tech.

### **Team Notes**

UT Martin dropped a pair of OVC games last week, losing 82-75 at Southeast Missouri State before returning home and falling 67-64 to Tennessee State...The team has now lost five games in a row and is still searching for its first OVC victory of the season...Despite being on a losing streak, the Skyhawks have lost its last three games all by single digits... Senior Benzor Simmons averaged 15.0 points and 4.5 rebounds/game last week including scoring 21 points in 27 minutes of action off the bench against Southeast Missouri; Simmons added nine points in 15 minutes against Tennessee State...Freshman Terence Smith began the week with 14 points against Southeast Missouri; against TSU he tied his individual career-high with six assists in 37 minutes of action...Along with Simmons and Smith, senior Reuben Clayton (11.5 points/game) and freshman Mike Liabo (10.5 points/game) also averaged double-figures this week for the Skyhawks...Senior Andres Irarrazabal narrowly missed his first career double-double on Saturday against Tennessee State, finishing the game with 12 points and nine rebounds; the nine rebounds tie his career-best total, set on Nov. 13, 2007 - his third career game...UT Martin will host Austin Peay tonight before going on the road to play Tennessee Tech and Jacksonville State this week.

# **OVC Tournament Tiebreaker System**

Regular season standings will be the determining factor in setting first-round pairings for the tournament. All ties will be broken starting at the top of the conference standings and working down. The tiebreaking system will utilize the following factors, in order, until all ties are broken.

### **TWO-WAY TIES**

- 1. Records in head-to-head competition are compared, with the higher seed going to the team that has won the most games against the other.
- 2. In the event step 1 does not resolve the tie (i.e. if the two teams split their games during the season), then the records of the tying teams against the No. 1 seed shall be compared. The team with the better record against the No. 1 seed shall gain the higher seed.
- 3. If the potential No. 1 seed is among tied teams, the process in step 2 will begin at the highest point in the standings which does not involve a tied team.
- 4. The process continues, through the No. 11 team in the standings, if necessary.
- 5. In the event the tie cannot be broken, seeds will be determined by a coin flip.

## **MULTIPLE TIES**

- 1. Composite records between the tying teams will be evaluated to determine whether one team has won more games against the other tying institutions (in which case that team would receive the higher seed) and/or one team has won the least number of games among the tied teams (in which case the team will receive the lowest seed, and/or two teams have the same composite record (in which case the two-team tiebreaker scenario shall be utilized).
- 2. In the event step 1 does not solve the multiple ties, or reduce the multiple ties to one tie, then a comparison of records of the tying institutions against the No. 1 seed will occur. The team among the tying institutions with the better record against the No. 1 seed will receive the higher seed.
- 3. If the potential No. 1 seed is among tied teams, the process in step 2 will begin at the highest point in the standings which does not involve a tied team.
- 4. The process continues, through the No. 11 team in the standings, if necessary.
- 5. In the event this process does not resolve the ties, seeding will be determined by a coin flip.

Note: If a multiple tie is reduced to a tie between two teams, the two-team tiebreaker formula will then be utilized. Ties involving teams higher in the standings are always broken before ties involving teams lower in the standings.
