## THIS WEEK'S adidas® OVC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK



### PLAYER

#### Wil Peters, G • Jr., 6-1, 180 • Nashville, Tenn. • Tennessee State

Peters scored 16 points, including the game-winning shot in overtime, in a 76-74 victory over rival Austin Peay in front of a national television audience on Saturday. The former walk-on hit 6-of-9 shots, grabbed seven rebounds, dished out nine assists and had a steal in the victory. After the Tigers overcame a seven-point deficit with 1:18 to play in regulation, Peters started the extra period by assisting on the first basket as TSU would not trail again. Peters then hit his only 3-pointer of the game to put his team up six. With the score tied at 72, Peters hit a jumper in the lane to put his team up two points with 43 seconds to go. After the Govs tied the game on the next possession, Peters made the same play with another one-on-one move, this time with two seconds left to seal the victory. Overall in the extra period Peters accounted for nine of Tennessee State's 11 points.

### CO-NEWCOMER

#### TyShwan Edmondson, G • Jr., 6-4, 175 • Hopkinsville, Ky. • Austin Peay

Edmondson averaged 22.5 points, 3.5 rebounds, 2.0 assists and 2.0 steals/game last week as Austin Peay split a pair of games. He opened the week by scoring 12 points and adding four rebounds, two assists, a block and steal as the Governors overcame a halftime deficit to win at UT Martin. The junior ended the week by matching his season-high with 33 points in an overtime loss at Tennessee State. Edmondson scored 21 of his points after halftime and finished the game 7-of-14 from 3-point range. The seven trifectas were the most by an APSU player since Todd Babington hit seven in Feb. 2008. Edmondson finished that game with three rebounds, two assists and three steals. For the week the transfer from Midland College hit 42.5 percent (17-of-40) from the field and 44.4 percent (8-of-18) from 3-point range. This marks his fifth OVC Newcomer of the Week award of the year.

### CO-NEWCOMER

#### Kenny Moore, F • Jr., 6-7, 220 • Philadelphia, Pa. • Tennessee State

Moore helped Tennessee State to an overtime victory over first-place Austin Peay on Saturday, as he netted his fourth double-double of the year by scoring 20 points and grabbing 10 rebounds in the nationally-televvised game. The junior transfer from Midland College also had two assists and two steals. Moore scored 16 of his points in the first half as TSU built a 16-point lead. At the end of regulation Moore had the tip-in off his own miss that tied the score with 16 seconds left and forced the extra period.

### FRESHMAN

#### Troy King, F • Fr., 6-6, 215 • Gaithersburg, Md. • UT Martin

In three games last week King averaged 17.7 points and 5.0 rebounds/game while hitting 47.1 percent (16-of-34) from the field and 50 percent (9-of-18) from 3-point range. Against league-leading Austin Peay, the freshman scored 21 points on 7-of-14 shooting, including 4-of-8 from 3-point range. In a triple overtime thriller at Tennessee Tech on Thursday, King once again led the team in scoring, pouring in 22 points and pulling down a career-high nine rebounds. King ended the week with 10 points as the Skyhawks won an OVC game for the first time this season, topping Jacksonville State on the road. The award is the second of the season for King; overall UT Martin players have been named Freshman of the Week five of the 10 weeks so far this season.

## NOTES FROM AROUND THE LEAGUE

**OVC Overview/This Week's Highlights:** Despite it being just the middle of January, following this week's set of games the OVC will be halfway through its 18-game Conference schedule... Last week saw the last remaining undefeated team in the OVC lose, as Austin Peay fell to 6-1 in the league after an overtime loss at Tennessee State... Austin Peay has now played in six overtime games this season, the most among all Division I teams (Sacramento State is second with four overtime contests)... Overall it was a week that the road teams dominated as seven of the 10 games during last week were won by the road team (and two of the three home teams that won needed overtime to do so)... During the week two OVC players had 30-plus point scoring games (Austin Peay's TyShwan Edmondson and Tennessee Tech's Kevin Murphy) but both came in losing efforts... Murphy went over 30 points in a loss to Murray State and in doing so eclipsed the 1,000-point plateau for his career; Murphy is one of seven active players in the league with 1,000 or more career points... Murray State's Billy Kennedy won its 200th career game on Saturday at Tennessee Tech; 96 of those wins have come in his five seasons at Murray State... Morehead State's Kenneth Faried was held without a double-double in two games last week after recording 15 in his first 17 games of the season; Faried needs just 15 more double-doubles to tie the all-time NCAA record currently held by Tim Duncan... This week features a pair of ESPN games for the league, as Austin Peay hosts Tennessee Tech on Thursday night and Morehead State hosts rival Eastern Kentucky on Saturday afternoon... Morehead State brings a 24-game home court winning streak into that contest (the fourth-longest streak nationally).

**Faried Nets 20/20 Game:** Morehead State's **Kenneth Faried** had a monster game at SIU Edwardsville on Nov. 28, scoring 25 points and pulling down 20 rebounds in a win. That is one of just three 20/20 games at the Division I level this season. Faried also had a 20/20 game last season (23 points, 21 rebounds at Tennessee State - that was one of just nine 20/20 efforts nationally during the 2009-10 season) and a 20/20 game in 2008-09 (27 points, 24 rebounds against Florida A&M). Faried has 15 double-doubles this season (in 19 total games), which ranks first nationally. For his career Faried has 72 career double-doubles, which is the most nationally among active players. The NCAA career record for double-doubles is 87 by Wake Forest's Tim Duncan.

**Home Court Overall Winning Streaks:** Entering this week Morehead State's 24-game home court winning streak is the longest in the OVC and tied for fourth longest nationally. The Eagles have not lost at home since falling to Kent State on Nov. 29, 2009. Murray State had a 25-game home court winning streak snapped by Austin Peay on Jan. 8, a streak that dated back to Feb. 21, 2009. Kansas currently has the nation's longest home court winning streak (69).

**Home Court Conference Winning Streaks:** Entering this week Morehead State has a 22-game home court winning streak in Conference games, a streak that dates back to the last game of the 2007-08 season (which was a loss). That streak is currently the sixth-longest nationally. MSU was undefeated at home in 2008-09 and 2009-10 and is 4-0 in OVC play at home this season. Xavier (34 games) currently has the longest home court conference winning streak.

**Murray State Spreads the Wealth; One of Two Division I Teams Without a 20-Point Scorer This Season:** For the second year in a row Murray State has a very balanced attack, as no player averages more than 11.6 points/game and the team has seven players who average between 11.6 and 5.5 points/game. To take it one step further, the Racers are one of just two Division I teams (out of 345 total squads) this season who have not had a 20-point scorer in a game. The other team is Jacksonville University.

**40 Minutes Just Not Enough for Austin Peay:** So far this season Austin Peay has played in six overtime games, the most of any Division I team (APSU is 2-4 in those games). The next closest team is Sacramento State who has played in four overtime games.

**The OVC Among NCAA Statistical Leaders:** In the latest NCAA statistical leaders release (Jan. 17) Tennessee Tech ranks eighth in steals (9.9/game), Tennessee State is 11th in free throw percentage (76.8%) and Morehead State is 11th in rebounding margin (+8.5). Individually Morehead State's **Kenneth Faried** is first nationally in rebounding (13.3/game) and double-doubles (15), fifth in field goal percentage (63.5%), 24th in steals (2.3/game), 49th in blocks (2.0/game) and 70th in scoring (17.6/game). Southeast Missouri's **Leon Powell** is third in field goal percentage (64.3%), Murray State's **B.J. Jenkins** is fifth (93.5%) and Eastern Illinois' **Jeremy Granger** is 10th (91.4%) in free throw percentage while Tennessee Tech's **Zac Swansey** is fifth in assists (7.1/game).

## COACHES TELECONFERENCE

## 2011 OVC TOURNAMENT

The 2011 Ohio Valley Conference Men's & Women's Tournaments will be held March 2-5 at Municipal Auditorium in Nashville, Tenn. For the first time since 1996, the entire tournament will be held at one site (instead of first round games being played on campus sites). The tournament has also switched to a merit-based format with the No. 1 and 2 seeds getting double byes into the semifinals and the No. 3 and 4 seeds getting a bye into the quarterfinals.

The first round and quarterfinal games (which start at 12 and 2 p.m. for the women, and 6 and 8 p.m. for the men) can be seen on OVCSports.TV. The men's semifinals will be held on Friday, March 4 at 7 and 9 p.m. and televised on ESPN2 with the championship game on Saturday, March 5 at 7 p.m. and televised live on ESPN2. The women's semifinals are set for 12 and 2 p.m. on March 4 (televised on OVCSports.TV) and the women's championship game is set for March 5 at 3:00 p.m. (TV TBD).

This marks the 17th time in 18 years that the tournament has been held in Nashville.

**CREDENTIALS.** For the second year in a row, credentials will be requested through an online system. That information will be available in January. **The deadline to request credentials is MONDAY, FEB. 28 at Noon.** No credentials will be mailed; they can be picked up at Media Will-Call, located at the back entrance of the arena (at the intersection of 5th Ave. North and Gay Street).





## OVC Tournament Makes Moves to Municipal Auditorium with More Teams, New Format:

Beginning this season the OVC Basketball Tournament will move to Municipal Auditorium in Nashville as its new annual home. This year's event will mark the 17th time in the last 18 years the league's marquee event has been held in Music City, USA (2002 was the lone year the event was not held in Nashville). It marks the sixth time the combined men's and women's tournament has been held in Municipal, following the 1994, 1995, 1996, 2004 and 2008 events (a men's only event was also held there in 1989). New this season is the fact that all eight men's and all eight women's teams that qualify for the tournament field will gather at a single site for the entire tournament (previously first round games were played on campus sites with the semifinals and finals being held in Nashville). That marks the first time since 1996 that the entire tournament has been held at one site. The bracket also shifts from a traditional 1 vs. 8, 2 vs. 7, etc. format to a merit-based format that rewards the top teams during the regular season with byes into the quarterfinals and semifinals (the No. 1 and 2 seeds will receive double byes into the semifinals while the No. 3 and 4 seeds will receive a bye into the quarterfinals). The 2011 OVC Men's and Women's Basketball Championship dates are March 2-5.

**More on Municipal Auditorium:** As part of the deal to host the tournament at Municipal Auditorium, the Nashville City Council and Municipal Auditorium committed \$200,000 to improvements at the venue, which opened in 1962. Among the major improvements that will be completed prior to this year's championship are upgrades to the dressing rooms, two new scoreboards and the new OVC-branded playing surface. The floor, which was unveiled at the league's Media Day event in October, was built by Horner Sports Flooring, whose corporate headquarters are in Dollar Bay, Mich. The company has made floors for many collegiate and National Basketball Association (NBA) teams, including building the floor for the 2010 NBA All-Star Game which was held at Texas Stadium. The Horner Pro King portable floor at Municipal Auditorium was purchased for a cost of \$71,960; the court will be used for the OVC Tournament, various high school games/tournaments and special events such as the Harlem Globetrotters.

**Loos is All-Time Winningest Coach in OVC History:** With a 68-66 victory at Ohio on Dec. 9 of last season, Austin Peay head coach **Dave Loos** recorded his 320th career victory while in the OVC, a mark that ranks first all-time. Loos passed Cal Luther (319 wins at Murray State and UT Martin) for the all-time mark. Loos, the Dean of OVC coaches, is now in his 21st year at Austin Peay where he also serves as the Athletics Director, making him the only Division I head men's basketball coach to hold that distinction. Loos is one of just 14 active Division I coaches to have coached at the same school for 20 or more years. Loos now has 343 victories in his tenure at Austin Peay and 425 for his career.

**Coaches vs. Cancer Suits and Sneakers Awareness Weekend Set for Jan. 28-30:** During Coaches vs. Cancer® Suits and Sneakers awareness weekend, Jan. 28-30, basketball coaches nationwide will wear sneakers with their suits to demonstrate their support for the American Cancer Society and its vision of a world with less cancer and more birthdays. Basketball fans are encouraged to also wear sneakers to games that weekend to show their support. Coaches vs. Cancer is a collaborative initiative of the American Cancer Society and the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) that empowers coaches, their teams and local communities to make a difference in the fight against cancer. By lacing up sneakers with their suits on the event's seventh annual awareness weekend, college and high school basketball coaches across the country will spotlight the fact that while cancer remains a major health concern, everyone can take daily steps to reduce their risk of the disease. For those who do not smoke, weight control, exercise and a healthy diet are the best ways to improve health and reduce cancer risk. In the U.S., overweight and obesity contribute to 14-to-20 percent of all cancer-related deaths. Increasing evidence also points to being overweight as raising the risk for cancer recurrence and decreasing the likelihood of survival for many cancers. The prevalence of obesity in the United States more than doubled between 1976-80 and 2003-04, and although rates appear to have stabilized by 2005-06, more than one third of U.S. adults – more than 72 million people – are obese. Overweight and obesity are of particular concern in minority populations, with higher rates of both reported for Hispanic men and women and for African American women, than for non-Hispanic white adults. Thanks to the dedicated efforts of college and high school coaches and fans throughout the nation, Coaches vs. Cancer participants have raised more than \$60 million since 1993 to help the American Cancer Society fund groundbreaking cancer research, provide up-to-date cancer information and education, advocate for public health policies that benefit communities, and deliver services that improve the quality of life for patients and their families. **Fariad Named to Naismith Award Watch List:** Morehead State senior **Kenneth Fariad** is one of 50 players named to the 2010-11 Naismith Award preseason watch list as announced by the Atlanta Tipoff Club. The Naismith Trophy is the most prestigious national award presented annually to college basketball's player of the year. Fariad is the reigning OVC Player and Defensive Player of the Year, and was named this year's OVC Preseason Player of the Year. Last year, he averaged 16.9 points and 13.0 rebounds per game, leading the nation with 456 total rebounds. He also led the conference with 67 blocked shots and collected 56 steals on his way to honorable mention All-American honors. This year's diverse list includes the top men's college basketball players from 44 schools around the country. The watch list was compiled by the Atlanta Tipoff Club's Board of Selectors, which based its criteria on player performances from the previous year and expectations for the 2010-11 college basketball season. The Naismith Trophy presented by AT&T will be awarded at the 2011 NCAA Men's Final Four in Houston.

**Fariad Also on Wooden Award Midseason Top 30 Watch List:** Morehead State University senior center **Kenneth Fariad** was one of the players on the John R. Wooden Award Midseason Top 30 released by The Los Angeles Athletic Club in early January. Selected by the Wooden Award National Advisory Board, the list is made up of 30 student-athletes who, based on their

performances in November and December, are the early frontrunners for college basketball's most prestigious honor. Transfers, freshmen and medical redshirts are eligible for this midseason list but did not appear on the preseason Top 50. All players nationally who excel throughout the season will be evaluated and considered for the official voting ballot released in March. The National Ballot consists of approximately 20 top players who have proven to their universities that they are also making progress toward graduation and maintaining at least a cumulative 2.0 GPA. The Wooden Award All-American Team will be announced the week of the "Elite Eight" round during the NCAA Tournament, making it unique among college postseason awards. The 35th annual Wooden Award ceremony, which will include the announcement of the Men's and Women's Wooden Award winners, a special tribute to Coach Wooden and Wooden Award founder Duke Llewellyn, and the presentation of the Wooden Award All American Teams and the Legends of Coaching Award, will take place the weekend of April 8-10, 2011.

**Fariad Named Candidate for Lowe's Senior CLASS Award:** Morehead State senior center **Kenneth Fariad** is one of 30 candidates for the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award in men's basketball. To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence - community, classroom, character and competition. An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School®, the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities. The candidate class will be narrowed to 10 men's finalists midway through the regular season, and those names will be placed on the official ballot. Ballots will be distributed through a nationwide voting system to media, coaches and fans, who will select one finalist who best exemplifies excellence in the four Cs of community, classroom, character and competition.

**The 2010-11 Season:** The 2010-11 season marks the 63rd of competition in the OVC. Over the previous 62 years, 12 different teams have claimed an OVC regular season championship, including three different schools in the past three years.

**OVC Has Postseason Success:** After several years of not having much postseason success, OVC teams have turned it around the past two years. Each of the last two years the league has sent three teams to the postseason, including Murray State to the NCAA Tournament and Eastern Kentucky and Morehead State to the College Basketball Invitational (CBI) last season. The biggest splash came from No. 13 seed Murray State who knocked off No. 4 seed Vanderbilt 66-65 in the NCAA Tournament when Danero Thomas hit a jumper at the buzzer. It was the first time an OVC team had won a First Round NCAA Tournament game since 1989 (when MTSU beat Florida State) and marked the second year in a row the league had won a NCAA Tournament game (Morehead State beat Alabama State in the Opening Round game in 2009). Murray State would lose to eventual national runner-up Butler in the Second Round, falling 54-52. Morehead State would win its first game in the CBI, marking the first time since 1988 that two different OVC teams had won postseason games in the same season.

**OVC Teams to Once Again Compete in ESPN BracketBusters Series:** For the sixth-straight season every OVC team will compete in the ESPN BracketBusters series in 2010-11. Now in its ninth year, ESPN BracketBusters is an ESPN television property that was tremendously successful with its first eight events. The event has allowed Division I conferences to participate in a cutting-edge format that involves "wild card" pairings from the pool of participating teams, with half of the ESPN BracketBusters teams pre-designated as "home" and the remaining half as "road" teams. This year there are 114 teams from 15 conferences in the pool of teams who will be selected for one of 11 nationally-televised games. Teams not selected for a television game will be paired up with other teams in the pool for games that will be played on Saturday, Feb. 19. The matchups will be announced on January 31. OVC schools are 19-37 all-time in the BracketBusters event.

**OVC Players in the NBA:** Entering the season there was just one former OVC player on a NBA roster. Former UT Martin All-American **Lester Hudson** began the year on the roster of the Washington Wizards but was waived on Nov. 22. Hudson was re-signed by the Wizards on Dec. 20 but waived once again on Jan. 5. Hudson was a two-time OVC Player of the Year at UT Martin before being selected No. 58 overall by the Boston Celtics in the 2009 NBA Draft. Hudson spent half of his rookie season with the Celtics before finishing the year with the Memphis Grizzlies and in the NBA Development League. There are also three former OVC players playing in the NBA Development League as former Tennessee Tech standout **Willie Jenkins** is with the Idaho Stampede and Jacksonville State's **Walker Russell** (Fort Wayne Mad Ants) and **Amadou Mbodji** (Utah Flash) are also in the league.

**Murray State Picked as Preseason Co-Favorites:** In a vote of Ohio Valley Conference head men's basketball coaches and sports information directors, Murray State received 18 first-place votes and was picked as the favorite for the 2010-11 season. Last season Murray State won an OVC-record 31 games on its way to the OVC regular season and tournament championship as well as a NCAA Tournament first round victory over No. 4 seed Vanderbilt. It marks the 14th time in the last 22 years that Murray State has been picked the preseason favorite and third in a row (they were tabbed co-favorites with Morehead State last season). Murray State received 162 total points and was followed next by Morehead State (2 first-place votes, 146 points), who was a consensus No. 2 pick. Eastern Illinois was picked third (123) and was followed by Austin Peay (107), Eastern Kentucky (92), Tennessee Tech (85), Tennessee State (81), Jacksonville State (51), Southeast Missouri (41) and UT Martin (20).

**Preseason Predictions:** Is being picked the preseason favorite, always a good thing? Over the past 31 years of preseason polls that were available, the league's head coaches and sports information directors correctly pick the eventual OVC regular season champion 61 percent of

**Morehead State's Faried Tabbed as Preseason Player of the Year:** The 2010-11 All-OVC Preseason Men's Basketball team was headlined by Morehead State senior center **Kenneth Faried**, marking the second year in a row he has been bestowed that honor. Faried was named both the OVC Player of the Year and Defensive Player of the Year in 2009-10. Overall seven different schools were represented on the team with Murray State's four selections leading the way. Morehead State had two selections while Austin Peay, Eastern Illinois, Eastern Kentucky, Jacksonville State and Tennessee Tech had one player apiece on the squad. The team features four players who were All-OVC first-team selections last season. The team also has one player who was a second-team selection and two players who were on the All-Newcomer squad. In addition to Faried, Murray State's **B.J. Jenkins** and **Isacc Miles** and Eastern Illinois' **Tyler Laser** were each first-team All-OVC picks last season and are each on the preseason team this year. Austin Peay's **Anthony Campbell** was the lone second-team selection from last season who returned to the OVC this year, while Murray State's **Isaiah Canaan**, along with Jenkins, were the All-Newcomer selections from last year who were on this year's preseason team. The Preseason All-OVC team was rounded out by Murray State's **Ivan Aska**, Morehead State's **Demonte Harper**, Tennessee Tech's **Kevin Murphy**, Jacksonville State's **Nick Murphy** and Eastern Kentucky's **Justin Stommes**.

**All League Head Coaches Return:** For the second-time in four years, every OVC head coach returns from the previous season. This last happened in the 2007-08 season. Overall it is the seventh time there has been no turnover in coaches between seasons since the 1978-79 season (the other years were 1978-79, 1993-94, 1994-95, 2001-02, 2004-05 and 2007-08).

**Replay Systems for OVC Basketball Venues Enter Year Four:** On Dec. 21, 2007, the Ohio Valley Conference mandated the use of courtside replay systems at all OVC basketball venues. The systems were put into place in January 2008 and have been used since. The systems are used in situations that are outlined by NCAA rules.

**SIU Edwardsville Continues Reclassification Process to Division I:** On July 1, 2008 Southern Illinois University Edwardsville became the 11th member of the Ohio Valley Conference. SIU Edwardsville, who is in the reclassification process to Division I, will begin regular season competition in the OVC during the 2011-12 academic year and will be eligible for postseason competition in 2012-13. The exception is the SIUE softball program, which will be eligible for both regular season and tournament competition this year; the softball program was the department's women's sport designee to be fast-tracked to Division I, making it eligible to compete at Division I prior to other SIUE sports. SIUE is located in Edwardsville, Ill., which is just northeast of St. Louis (the 18th largest media market in the United States).

**OVCsports.TV:** For the fifth consecutive year, fans can watch nearly every Conference matchup and all non-conference home contests this season at OVCsports.TV. The venture with NeuLion (formerly JumpTV Sports) allows fans to access live and on-demand streaming video and audio of conference matchups (excluding only national television games which are not available) on their home computer. The premium Web site was launched in July 2006 and has streamed over 1,000 events in its first four years, including all Conference matchups in football and men's and women's basketball as well as select baseball, soccer, softball and volleyball events and OVC Championship events. Packages are available on a yearly, seasonal, monthly or per-event basis.

## OVC TELEVISION PACKAGE

This season the OVC is sponsoring a 21-game television package for basketball. In addition to this Conference-sponsored package, there are approximately 62 additional games that will air either locally, regionally or nationally involving OVC institutions during the season. That brings the total number of television games involving OVC schools this season to 83.

The sponsored OVC games are produced and aired by ESPN/ESPN2 (9 games) and the Wazoo Sports network (12 games). Wazoo Sports is a Regional Sports Network located in London, Ky. Wazoo Sports (<http://www.wazoosports.com>) launched online in December of 2007 and expanded to a 24/7 sports television network on September 25, 2009. During the 2010 football season Wazoo produced an aired a 10-game OVC Football Game of the Week package.

The games that do not air on ESPN can be seen on the Wazoo Sports Network in addition to CSS (Comcast/Charter Sports Southeast), ESPN3.com and ESPN Full Court. Four of the five women's games will air on Wazoo, ESPN3.com and ESPN Full Court, while the fifth will be exclusive to Wazoo. In addition, WEIU, an affiliate located in Charleston, Ill., will pick up all nine of the games. CSS, which was launched in 1999, can be found only on cable and serves over six million customers in 13 states. ESPN3.com, the network's live 24/7 broadband channel, was launched as ESPN360 in 2001 and renamed ESPN3.com in April, it is available at no additional cost to fans with a high-speed Internet connection from an affiliated provider. ESPN Full Court is an out-of-market pay-per-view sports package. The package is available on most major cable and satellite television providers.

### AUSTIN PEAY GOVERNORS (12-7, 6-1)

#### Team Notes

Coming off its biggest win of the season last week (when the team ended the 25-game home court winning streak of its biggest rival Murray State), Austin Peay had only one day to rest as the team was at UT Martin for a Monday OVC contest...UT Martin led the Governors by nine points at halftime but junior Josh Terry carried APSU in the second half, scoring 25 of his 27 points after the break to bring his team back for the 71-61 victory...Terry finished the game 9-of-15 from the field and 9-of-12 from the free throw line while also pulling down eight rebounds, dishing out three assists and claiming three steals...The week ended with Austin Peay seeing its six-game winning streak come to an end as the team suffered its first OVC loss of the season, 76-74, in overtime to rival Tennessee State...Austin Peay trailed by as many as 16 points in the first half before grabbing a second half lead...But the Govs blew a seven-point lead with 1:18 to go in regulation as TSU forced the overtime period and won in overtime...The game was the sixth overtime affair of the year for Austin Peay, the most among all Division I teams (Sacramento State is second with four overtime games)...Junior TyShwan Edmondson led the way with 33 points, hitting 12-of-26 from the field, 7-of-14 from 3-point range and adding two assists and three steals...APSU has now been out-rebounded in six of its seven losses this year...Despite the loss to Tennessee State the Governors are 6-1 in OVC play and have a one game lead over Murray State and TSU in the league standings...Austin Peay will return home to face Tennessee Tech on Thursday night in an ESPN3 televised game; it will be the third time in four games the Govs have appear on the network...The week will conclude on Saturday when the Govs host Jacksonville State.

#### Team Notes

Eastern Illinois started last week with a 63-49 home loss to Eastern Kentucky but rebounded just two days later to knock off Morehead State at Lantz Arena for the fourth year in a row, winning the low-scoring affair by a 47-40 margin... The ECU game was decided by the good outside shooting of the Colonels, as Eastern Kentucky hit 10-of-25 long range shots in the victory last Thursday... ECU jumped out to a 10-2 lead early and Eastern Illinois would not lead the rest of the way as the Colonels led by 12 points at halftime and as many as 22 points in the second half...Jeremy Granger was the only EIU player in double figures in that game, recording 15 points on 4-of-6 3-point shooting while playing the full 40 minutes of game action...Two days later the team would score two less points against Morehead State but come out on top as both teams struggled mightily from the floor...The Panthers shot just 31.6 percent from the field and 2-of-12 (16.7%) from 3-point range but they held the Eagles to 25.9 percent from the floor and 3-of-19 (15.8%) from 3-point range...Most importantly EIU held MSU All-American Kenneth Faried to a season-low five points and the Eagles to 40 points overall, the fewest for the team since the 2005-06 season...The 87 combined points for the team was the teams were the lowest ever in Lantz Arena (the building opened in 1966)...Granger once again was the only Panther in double figures as he pitched in 17 points...For the seventh game in a row the team was without senior guard Tyler Laser who has been sitting out with an injury; there is no time table for Laser's return...This week the Panthers head to the road for games at Murray State and UT Martin.

#### Team Notes

After starting the OVC season 2-4 overall, Eastern Kentucky won two Conference road games last week to even its record at 4-4 in league play...EKU went on the road and topped Eastern Illinois (63-49) and Southeast Missouri (64-52) and has now won four of its last five games overall since the calendar switched to 2011... It was a pair of "Josh's" who led the Colonels last week as Josh Daniel averaged 16.5 points and Joshua Jones averaged 15.5 points in the two games...Daniel had the hot hand, hitting 50 percent (6-of-12) from 3-point range and 55 percent (11-of-20) from the field overall...Eastern started the week by using a decisive 17-2 run early in the second half to pull away from Eastern Illinois; it was Jones who led the team with 16 points in that contest...Daniels added 14 points by sinking four 3-pointers...As a team the Colonels hit 48 percent (24-of-50) from the field and connected on 10 3-pointers overall...The 49 points allowed by EKU was the fewest by an OVC opponent in nearly three years (Feb. 2008)...Daniel would add a game-high 19 points in the win over Southeast Missouri on Saturday night...EKU would lead the first 33 minutes of the game until Southeast took a one-point lead; however, Daniel would respond with nine-straight points out of a timeout as the team used a 11-1 spurt to put the game away...EKU shot 45.5 percent for the game (compared to 43.6 percent for SEMO) and improved to 8-1 this season when shooting a better percentage than its opponents...Eastern Kentucky will travel to future OVC foe SIU Edwardsville on Tuesday for a non-conference tilt; the two teams played in Richmond on Nov. 17 as Eastern won 81-65...The week concludes on Saturday in a game at rival Morehead State; the contest will be seen nationally on ESPNU.

### MOREHEAD STATE EAGLES (12-7, 5-3)

#### Team Notes

Morehead State opened last week by winning its sixth game in a row, a 76-63 victory at Southeast Missouri...That victory was just the second for the team on the road this season...After leading by four points at halftime the Eagles used a 6-0 spurt out of the break to grab a double-digit advantage that it would not relinquish...For the game MSU shot 50.9 percent from the field, despite knocking down just 4-of-15 (26.7%) from 3-point range...Sam Goodman led the way with 16 points while sophomore newcomer Drew Kelly had 11 points and six rebounds in 24 minutes of action...But Morehead State would see that winning streak come to an end as it lost for the fourth-straight season in Charleston, Ill., losing 47-40 at Eastern Illinois...The Eagles shot just 25.9 percent (14-of-54) from the field, 15.8 percent (3-of-19) from 3-point range and committed 18 turnovers in the loss...Morehead State also allowed EIU to convert 26 free throw attempts into 21 points while the Eagles shot just 9-of-13 at the line...Goodman was the only Eagle in double figures, scoring 12 points...Morehead State has struggled from 3-point range over its last six games, connecting on only 34.4 percent of its attempts, including just 7-of-34 (20.6%) in its two games last week...Kenneth Faried struggled in two games last week, failing to record a double-double in either game after having 15 in his first 17 games of the season; Faried did have 13 rebounds at Eastern Illinois, but added a season-low five points in the loss... This week MSU will put its 24-game home court winning streak (the fourth-longest streak nationally) on the line when it hosts rival Eastern Kentucky Saturday in a ESPNU game.

#### Team Notes

After the Racers saw its 25-game home court winning streak come to end at the hands of rival Austin Peay a week ago, Murray State rebounded by going on the road and winning two OVC games to improve to 5-2 in Conference play, just one game out of first place (currently held by APSU)...MSU topped Jacksonville State 71-62 and Tennessee Tech 92-85 on its road trip...Senior guard Isacc Miles had a good week, averaging 16.5 points, 6.0 assists, 2.0 rebounds and 1.5 steals/game while hitting 71.4 percent (10-of-14) from the field and 11-of-12 (91.7%) from the free throw line...Miles has had four-straight double-figure scoring games against OVC opponents...Murray State is the only team in the OVC to have three different players with 40 or more assists this season; that group includes B.J. Jenkins (63), Miles (58) and Isaiah Canaan (41)...On its win at TTU on Saturday, the Racers put 92 points on the board, a season-high against a Division I opponent; the team just missed out on breaking the 100-point plateau for the first time since the 2003 season...In that win five Racers scored in double figures with Canaan leading the way with 16 points and Miles, Jewuan Long and Ivan Aska recording 14 apiece...The win on Saturday was the 200th of the coaching career of Billy Kennedy, who now has 96 wins in five seasons at Murray State...Murray State continues to be one of the most balanced teams in the country, as MSU and Jacksonville University are the only two teams in Division I without a 20-point scorer in a game this season...Murray State will return home this week to host Eastern Illinois and Southeast Missouri to the CFSB Center.

After missing his team's road trip to Eastern Kentucky/Morehead State last week due to illness, Tennessee Tech head coach Mike Sutton returned to the bench this week to see his Golden Eagles top UT Martin in triple overtime and fall by seven points to Murray State...Junior Kevin Murphy had a big week, averaging 28.0 points, 3.5 rebounds, 3.0 assists and 1.5 steals/game while hitting 59.4 percent (19-of-32) from the field, 71.4 percent (5-of-7) from 3-point range and knocking down 13-of-17 (76.5%) free throw attempts...In the process Murphy also went over 1,000 career points...Murphy had 25 points, six rebounds, five assists and two steals in the overtime victory over UT Martin; Murphy was one of six different Tech players to score in double figures in that game...Zac Swansey added 19 points and 11 assists for his second double-double of the season...In that contest the Golden Eagles led by as many as 15 in the second half before the Skyhawks used a 23-7 run over 6:10 to take a one-point lead with 1:49 to play in the game...Eventually the game went to overtime where two Chase Dunn free throws forced a second overtime and a layup by UTM's Reuben Clayton forced the final overtime...In the third extra period, Swansey hit a 3-pointer with 1:38 to play to give Tech the lead for good...Tennessee Tech led Murray State for the first 10 minutes of its game on Saturday until a 16-2 Racer lead put them up 12 points...Murphy finished the game with 31 points while Swansey dished out seven assists...Tennessee Tech now begins a four-game stretch away from the Eblen Center which starts on Thursday at Austin Peay in a game that will be seen on ESPN...Saturday then team plays at Tennessee State.

#### Team Notes

UT Martin had the busiest week of any OVC team last week, playing three Conference games in a stretch of six days...The Skyhawks opened the week with a 71-61 loss to Austin Peay (in a game they led by nine points at halftime), before pushing Tennessee Tech to triple overtime on Thursday before falling 109-105 in Cookeville...It was the team's first triple overtime affair since topping Samford in the first round of the 2008 OVC Tournament...But on Saturday UTM got its first OVC victory of the season and snapped a seven-game overall losing streak with a 63-60 victory at Jacksonville State...That win marked just the second for the Skyhawks in the last two seasons and snapped a 12-game losing streak in OVC games dating back to last year...It was the team's fifth victory of the season, surpassing its win total from all of last year (when the team was just 4-25 overall)...In that win senior Benzor Simmons came off the bench to score 16 points (including 10-of-11 at the free throw line) in 28 minutes of action; Simmons also pulled down five rebounds, had an assist and a steal...Freshman Terence Smith added 13 points and five assists while fellow freshman Troy King added 10 points on 2-of-3 3-point shooting...For the week King averaged 17.7 points and 5.0 rebounds/game while hitting 47.1 percent (16-of-34) from the field and 50 percent (9-of-18) from 3-point range; King dropped 21 points against Austin Peay and 22 points and a career-best nine boards at TTU...This week the Skyhawks will host Eastern Illinois on Thursday before going on the road to face future OVC foe SIU Edwardsville next Saturday.

### OVC Tournament Tiebreaker System

Regular season standings will be the determining factor in setting first-round pairings for the tournament. All ties will be broken starting at the top of the conference standings and working down. The tiebreaking system will utilize the following factors, in order, until all ties are broken.

#### TWO-WAY TIES

1. Records in head-to-head competition are compared, with the higher seed going to the team that has won the most games against the other.
2. In the event step 1 does not resolve the tie (i.e. if the two teams split their games during the season), then the records of the tying teams against the No. 1 seed shall be compared. The team with the better record against the No. 1 seed shall gain the higher seed.
3. If the potential No. 1 seed is among tied teams, the process in step 2 will begin at the highest point in the standings which does not involve a tied team.
4. The process continues, through the No. 11 team in the standings, if necessary.
5. In the event the tie cannot be broken, seeds will be determined by a coin flip.

#### MULTIPLE TIES

1. Composite records between the tying teams will be evaluated to determine whether one team has won more games against the other tying institutions (in which case that team would receive the higher seed) and/or one team has won the least number of games among the tied teams (in which case the team will receive the lowest seed, and/or two teams have the same composite record (in which case the two-team tiebreaker scenario shall be utilized).
2. In the event step 1 does not solve the multiple ties, or reduce the multiple ties to one tie, then a comparison of records of the tying institutions against the No. 1 seed will occur. The team among the tying institutions with the better record against the No. 1 seed will receive the higher seed.
3. If the potential No. 1 seed is among tied teams, the process in step 2 will begin at the highest point in the standings which does not involve a tied team.
4. The process continues, through the No. 11 team in the standings, if necessary.
5. In the event this process does not resolve the ties, seeding will be determined by a coin flip.

*Note: If a multiple tie is reduced to a tie between two teams, the two-team tiebreaker formula will then be utilized. Ties involving teams higher in the standings are always broken before ties involving teams lower in the standings.*
