Patrick Miller, G • Fr., 6-0, 185 • Chicago, Ill. • Tennessee State

In a pair of Tennessee State victories last week, Miller averaged 15.5 points, 3.0 rebounds, and 1.0 assists/game while hitting 47.1 percent (8-of-17) from the field and 15-of-22 (68.2%) from the free throw line. The freshman posted a season-high with 22 points in Saturday's come-from-behind win over Tennessee Tech. He hit 5-of-10 shots from the field and converted 12-of-19 charity stripe attempts in that game as the Tigers overcame a seven-point deficit with 10:41 to play. Miller also had a career-high with six rebounds in that game. He added nine points in a win over Jacksonville State to begin the week. The award marks the third time this season Miller has been named Freshman of the Week.

NOTES FROM AROUND THE LEAGUE

OVC Overview/This Week's Highlights: Halfway through the Conference season, just three games separate the two teams tied for first place in the standings and the team that is currently in seventh place...Austin Peay suffered its second OVC loss of the season last week and is now in a tie for first place along with Tennessee State, who has won four OVC games in a row...Those two teams have a one game lead over Murray State (who suffered a home loss to Eastern Illinois) and a two-game lead over Eastern Kentucky, Morehead State and Tennessee Tech who are in a three-way tie for fourth place...UT Martin has also been hot lately, having won three OVC games in a row after having snapped a 12-game OVC losing streak (dating back to last season) the previous week...Morehead State had its 24-game home court winning streak come to an end on Saturday thanks to Eastern Kentucky; the winning streak had been the fifth-longest nationally at the time...After losing its first five road games of the season, Eastern Kentucky has now won its last five road contests...Morehead State's Kenneth Faried pulled down a season-high 21 rebounds on Saturday; he is now sixth in NCAA history (since 1973) with 1,439 career rebounds...This week's games feature road trips for first-place Austin Peay and Tennessee State, as the teams will travel to "Death Valley" for games with Eastern Kentucky and Morehead State this weekend.

Faried Nets 20/20 Game: Morehead State's **Kenneth Faried** had a monster game at SIU Edwardsville on Nov. 28, scoring 25 points and pulling down 20 rebounds in a win. That is one of just three 20/20 games at the Division I level this season. Faried also had a 20/20 game last season (23 points, 21 rebounds at Tennessee State - that was one of just nine 20/20 efforts nationally during the 2009-10 season) and a 20/20 game in 2008-09 (27 points, 24 rebounds against Florida A&M). Faried has 15 double-doubles this season (in 20 total games), which ranks second nationally. For his career Faried has 72 career double-doubles, which is the most nationally among active players. The NCAA career record for double-doubles is 87 by Wake Forest's Tim Duncan.

Faried Sixth in NCAA Career Rebounding Since 1973: For players who have began their careers since 1973 (when freshmen were allowed to play NCAA basketball), only five players have grabbed more career rebounds than Morehead State's **Kenneth Faried** has. Entering this week Faried has 1,439 rebounds; Tim Duncan holds the record with 1,570. Faried is only 131 rebounds behind Duncan and has at least 12 games left in his season (11 regular season games, at least one tournament game) and would need to average only 10.9 rebounds in those games to claim the record. When Faried gets to 1,505 rebounds, he will be in the Top 25 in NCAA history for rebounds (all-time).

Home Court Winning Streaks Come to an End: OVC teams has had two long home court winning streaks come to an end this season. Murray State had a 25-game home court winning streak snapped by Austin Peay on Jan. 8, a streak that dated back to Feb. 21, 2009. Morehead State saw its 24-game home court streak come to an end on Jan. 22 against Eastern Kentucky, the first home loss since Nov. 29, 2009 (Kent State).

Murray State Spreads the Wealth and is Only Division I Team Without a 20-Point Scorer This Season: For the second year in a row Murray State has a very balanced attack, as no player averages more than 11.3 points/game and the team has nine players who average between 11.3 and 5.1 points/game. To take it one step further, the Racers are the only Division I team (out of 345 total squads) this season who have not had a 20-point scorer in a game.

40 Minutes Just Not Enough for Austin Peay: So far this season Austin Peay has played in six overtime games, the most of any Division I team (APSU is 2-4 in those games). The next closest team is Sacramento State who has played in four overtime games.

The OVC Among NCAA Statistical Leaders: In the latest NCAA statistical leaders release (Jan. 23) Tennessee State is 12th in free throw percentage (76.1%), Morehead State is seventh in rebounding margin (+9.2) and Austin Peay is 12th in turnover margin (+4.5). Individually Morehead State's **Kenneth Faried** is first nationally in rebounding (13.7/game), second in double-doubles (15), seventh in field goal percentage (61.2%), 25th in steals (2.3/game), 52nd in blocks (2.3/game) and 92nd in scoring (17.1/game). Southeast Missouri's **Leon Powell** is second in field goal percentage (62.6%), Eastern Illinois' **Jeremy Granger** is seventh (92.2%) in free throw percentage while Tennessee Tech's **Zac Swansey** is sixth in assists (6.8/game).

OVC Tournament Makes Moves to Municipal Auditorium with More Teams, New Format: Beginning this season the OVC Basketball Tournament will move to Municipal Auditorium in Nashville as its new annual home. This year's event will mark the 17th time in the last 18 years the league's marquee event has been held in Music City, USA (2002 was the lone year the event was not held in Nashville). It marks the sixth time the combined men's and women's tournament has been held in Municipal, following the 1994, 1995, 1996, 2004 and 2008 events (a men's only event was also held there in 1989). New this season is the fact that all eight men's and all eight women's teams that qualify for the tournament field will gather at a single site for the entire

2011 OVC TOURNAMENT

The 2011 Ohio Valley Conference Men's & Women's Tournaments will be held March 2-5 at Municipal Auditorium in Nashville, Tenn. For the first time since 1996, the entire tournament will be held at one site (instead of first round games being played on campus sites). The tournament has also switched to a merit-based format with the No. 1 and 2 seeds getting double byes into the semifinals and the No. 3 and 4 seeds getting a bye into the quarterfinals.

The first round and quarterfinal games (which start at 12 and 2 p.m. for the women, and 6 and 8 p.m. for the men) can be seen on OVCSports.TV. The men's semifinals will be held on Friday, March 4 at 7 and 9 p.m. and televised on ESPNU with the championship game on Saturday, March 5 at 7 p.m. and televised live on ESPN2. The women's semifinals are set for 12 and 2 p.m. on March 4 (televised on OVCSports.TV) and the women's championship game is set for March 5 at 3:00 p.m. (Wazoo Sports and other TBA outlets).

This marks the 17th time in 18 years that the tournament has been held in Nashville.

CREDENTIALS. For the second year in a row, credentials will be requested through an online system. That information will be available in January. **The deadline to request credentials is MONDAY, FEB. 28 at Noon.** No credentials will be mailed; they can be picked up at Media Will-Call, located at the back entrance of the arena (at the intersection of 5th Ave. North and Gay Street).



tournament (previously first round games were played on campus sites with the semifinals and finals being held in Nashville). That marks the first time since 1996 that the entire tournament has been held at one site. The bracket also shifts from a traditional 1 vs. 8, 2 vs. 7, etc. format to a merit-based format that rewards the top teams during the regular season with byes into the quarterfinals and semifinals (the No. 1 and 2 seeds will receive double byes into the semifinals while the No. 3 and 4 seeds will receive a bye into the quarterfinals). The 2011 OVC Men's and Women's Basketball Championship dates are March 2-5.

More on Municipal Auditorium: As part of the deal to host the tournament at Municipal Auditorium, the Nashville City Council and Municipal Auditorium committed \$200,000 to improvements at the venue, which opened in 1962. Among the major improvements that will be completed prior to this year's championship are upgrades to the dressing rooms, two new scoreboards and the new OVC-branded playing surface. The floor, which was unveiled at the league's Media Day event in October, was built by Horner Sports Flooring, whose corporate headquarters are in Dollar Bay, Mich. The company has made floors for many collegiate and National Basketball Association (NBA) teams, including building the floor for the 2010 NBA All-Star Game which was held at Texas Stadium. The Horner Pro King portable floor at Municipal Auditorium was purchased for a cost of \$71,960; the court will be used for the OVC Tournament, various high school games/tournaments and special events such as the Harlem Globetrotters.

Loos is All-Time Winningest Coach in OVC History: With a 68-66 victory at Ohio on Dec. 9 of last season, Austin Peay head coach **Dave Loos** recorded his 320th career victory while in the OVC, a mark that ranks first all-time. Loos passed Cal Luther (319 wins at Murray State and UT Martin) for the all-time mark. Loos, the Dean of OVC coaches, is now in his 21st year at Austin Peay where he also serves as the Athletics Director, making him the only Division I head men's basketball coach to hold that distinction. Loos is one of just 14 active Division I coaches to have coached at the same school for 20 or more years. Loos now has 344 victories in his tenure at Austin Peay and 426 for his career.

Basketball fans are encouraged to also wear sneakers to games that weekend to show their support. Coaches vs. Cancer is a collaborative initiative of the American Cancer Society and the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) that empowers coaches, their teams and local communities to make a difference in the fight against cancer. By lacing up sneakers with their suits on the event's seventh annual awareness weekend, college and high school basketball coaches across the country will spotlight the fact that while cancer remains a major health concern, everyone can take daily steps to reduce their risk of the disease. For those who do not smoke, weight control, exercise and a healthy diet are the best ways to improve health and reduce cancer risk. In the U.S., overweight and obesity contribute to 14-to-20 percent of all cancer-related deaths. Increasing evidence also points to being overweight as raising the risk for cancer recurrence and decreasing the likelihood of survival for many cancers. The prevalence of obesity in the United States more than doubled between 1976-80 and 2003-04, and although rates appear to have stabilized by 2005-06, more than one third of U.S. adults – more than 72 million people – are obese. Overweight and obesity are of particular concern in minority populations, with higher rates of both reported for Hispanic men and women and for African American women, than for non-Hispanic white adults. Thanks to the dedicated efforts of college and high school coaches and fans throughout the nation, Coaches vs. Cancer participants have raised more than \$60 million since 1993 to help the American Cancer Society fund groundbreaking cancer research, provide up-to-date cancer information and education, advocate for public health policies that benefit communities, and deliver services that improve the quality of life for patients and their families. The Naismith Trophy is the most prestigious national award presented annually to college basketball's player of the year. Fariad is the reigning OVC Player and Defensive Player of the Year, and was named this year's OVC Preseason Player of the Year. Last year, he averaged 16.9 points and 13.0 rebounds per game, leading the nation with 456 total rebounds. He also led the conference with 67 blocked shots and collected 56 steals on his way to honorable mention All-American honors. This year's diverse list includes the top men's college basketball players from 44 schools around the country. The watch list was compiled by the Atlanta Tipoff Club's Board of Selectors, which based its criteria on player performances from the previous year and expectations for the 2010-11 college basketball season. The Naismith Trophy presented by AT&T will be awarded at the 2011 NCAA Men's Final Four in Houston.

Fariad Also on Wooden Award Midseason Top 30 Watch List: Morehead State University senior center **Kenneth Fariad** was one of the players on the John R. Wooden Award Midseason Top 30 released by The Los Angeles Athletic Club in early January. Selected by the Wooden Award National Advisory Board, the list is made up of 30 student-athletes who, based on their performances in November and December, are the early frontrunners for college basketball's most prestigious honor. Transfers, freshmen and medical redshirts are eligible for this midseason list but did not appear on the preseason Top 50. All players nationally who excel throughout the season will be evaluated and considered for the official voting ballot released in March. The National Ballot consists of approximately 20 top players who have proven to their universities that they are also making progress toward graduation and maintaining at least a cumulative 2.0 GPA. The Wooden Award All-American Team will be announced the week of the "Elite Eight" round during the NCAA Tournament, making it unique among college postseason awards. The

35th annual Wooden Award ceremony, which will include the announcement of the Men's and Women's Wooden Award winners, a special tribute to Coach Wooden and Wooden Award founder Duke Llewellyn, and the presentation of the Wooden Award All American Teams and the Legends of Coaching Award, will take place the weekend of April 8-10, 2011.

Faried Named Candidate for Lowe's Senior CLASS Award: Morehead State senior center **Kenneth Faried** is one of 30 candidates for the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award in men's basketball. To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence - community, classroom, character and competition. An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School®, the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities. The candidate class will be narrowed to 10 men's finalists midway through the regular season, and those names will be placed on the official ballot. Ballots will be distributed through a nationwide voting system to media, coaches and fans, who will select one finalist who best exemplifies excellence in the four Cs of community, classroom, character and competition.

The 2010-11 Season: The 2010-11 season marks the 63rd of competition in the OVC. Over the previous 62 years, 12 different teams have claimed an OVC regular season championship, including three different schools in the past three years.

OVC Has Postseason Success: After several years of not having much postseason success, OVC teams have turned it around the past two years. Each of the last two years the league has sent three teams to the postseason, including Murray State to the NCAA Tournament and Eastern Kentucky and Morehead State to the College Basketball Invitational (CBI) last season. The biggest splash came from No. 13 seed Murray State who knocked off No. 4 seed Vanderbilt 66-65 in the NCAA Tournament when Danero Thomas hit a jumper at the buzzer. It was the first time an OVC team had won a First Round NCAA Tournament game since 1989 (when MTSU beat Florida State) and marked the second year in a row the league had won a NCAA Tournament game (Morehead State beat Alabama State in the Opening Round game in 2009). Murray State would lose to eventual national runner-up Butler in the Second Round, falling 54-52. Morehead State would win its first game in the CBI, marking the first time since 1988 that two different OVC teams had won postseason games in the same season.

OVC Teams to Once Again Compete in ESPN BracketBusters Series: For the sixth-straight season every OVC team will compete in the ESPN BracketBusters series in 2010-11. Now it its ninth year, ESPN BracketBusters is an ESPN television property that was tremendously successful with its first eight events. The event has allowed Division I conferences to participate in a cutting-edge format that involves "wild card" pairings from the pool of participating teams, with half of the ESPN BracketBusters teams pre-designated as "home" and the remaining half as "road" teams. This year there are 114 teams from 15 conferences in the pool of teams who will be selected for one of 11 nationally-televised games. Teams not selected for a television game will be paired up with other teams in the pool for games that will be played on Saturday, Feb. 19. The matchups will be announced on January 31. OVC schools are 19-37 all-time in the BracketBusters event.

OVC Players in the NBA: Entering the season there was just one former OVC player on a NBA roster. Former UT Martin All-American **Lester Hudson** began the year on the roster of the Washington Wizards but was waived on Nov. 22. Hudson was re-signed by the Wizards on Dec. 20 but waived once again on Jan. 5. Hudson was a two-time OVC Player of the Year at UT Martin before being selected No. 58 overall by the Boston Celtics in the 2009 NBA Draft. Hudson spent half of his rookie season with the Celtics before finishing the year with the Memphis Grizzlies and in the NBA Development League. There are also three former OVC players playing in the NBA Development League as former Tennessee Tech standout **Willie Jenkins** is with the Idaho Stampede and Jacksonville State's **Walker Russell** (Fort Wayne Mad Ants) and **Amadou Mbodji** (Utah Flash) are also in the league.

Murray State Picked as Preseason Co-Favorites: In a vote of Ohio Valley Conference head men's basketball coaches and sports information directors, Murray State received 18 first-place votes and was picked as the favorite for the 2010-11 season. Last season Murray State won an OVC-record 31 games on its way to the OVC regular season and tournament championship as well as a NCAA Tournament first round victory over No. 4 seed Vanderbilt. It marks the 14th time in the last 22 years that Murray State has been picked the preseason favorite and third in a row (they were tabbed co-favorites with Morehead State last season). Murray State received 162 total points and was followed next by Morehead State (2 first-place votes, 146 points), who was a consensus No. 2 pick. Eastern Illinois was picked third (123) and was followed by Austin Peay (107), Eastern Kentucky (92), Tennessee Tech (85), Tennessee State (81), Jacksonville State (51), Southeast Missouri (41) and UT Martin (20).

Preseason Predictions: Is being picked the preseason favorite, always a good thing? Over the past 31 years of preseason polls that were available, the league's head coaches and sports information directors correctly pick the eventual OVC regular season champion 61 percent of the time, picking the correct winner 20 times over the last 32 years. Over the past 10 years, the preseason poll has correctly picked the winner every other year.

Morehead State's Faried Tabbed as Preseason Player of the Year: The 2010-11 All-OVC Preseason Men's Basketball team was headlined by Morehead State senior center **Kenneth Faried**, marking the second year in a row he has been bestowed that honor. Faried was named both the OVC Player of the Year and Defensive Player of the Year in 2009-10. Overall seven different schools were represented on the team with Murray State's four selections leading the way. Morehead State had two selections while Austin Peay, Eastern Illinois, Eastern Kentucky, Jacksonville State and Tennessee Tech had one player apiece on the squad. The team features four players who were All-OVC first-team selections last season. The team also has one player who was a second-team selection and two players who were on the All-Newcomer squad. In addition to Faried, Murray State's **B.J. Jenkins** and **Isacc Miles** and Eastern Illinois' **Tyler Laser** were each first-team All-OVC picks last season and are each on the preseason team this year. Austin Peay's **Anthony Campbell** was the lone second-team selection from last season who returned to the OVC this year, while Murray State's **Isaiah Canaan**, along with Jenkins, were the All-Newcomer selections from last year who were on this year's preseason team. The Preseason All-OVC team was rounded out by Murray State's **Ivan Aska**, Morehead State's **Demonte Harper**, Tennessee Tech's **Kevin Murphy**, Jacksonville State's **Nick Murphy** and Eastern Kentucky's **Justin Stommes**.

All League Head Coaches Return: For the second-time in four years, every OVC head coach returns from the previous season. This last happened in the 2007-08 season. Overall it is the seventh time there has been no turnover in coaches between seasons since the 1978-79 season (the other years were 1978-79, 1993-94, 1994-95, 2001-02, 2004-05 and 2007-08).

Replay Systems for OVC Basketball Venues Enter Year Four: On Dec. 21, 2007, the Ohio Valley Conference mandated the use of courtside replay systems at all OVC basketball venues. The systems were put into place in January 2008 and have been used since. The systems are used in situations that are outlined by NCAA rules.

SIU Edwardsville Continues Reclassification Process to Division I: On July 1, 2008 Southern Illinois University Edwardsville became the 11th member of the Ohio Valley Conference. SIU Edwardsville, who is in the reclassification process to Division I, will begin regular season competition in the OVC during the 2011-12 academic year and will be eligible for postseason competition in 2012-13. The exception is the SIUE softball program, which will be eligible for both regular season and tournament competition this year; the softball program was the department's women's sport designee to be fast-tracked to Division I, making it eligible to compete at Division I prior to other SIUE sports. SIUE is located in Edwardsville, Ill., which is just northeast of St. Louis (the 18th largest media market in the United States).

OVCsports.TV: For the fifth consecutive year, fans can watch nearly every Conference matchup and all non-conference home contests this season at OVCsports.TV. The venture with NeuLion (formerly JumpTV Sports) allows fans to access live and on-demand streaming video and audio of conference matchups (excluding only national television games which are not available) on their home computer. The premium Web site was launched in July 2006 and has streamed over 1,000 events in its first four years, including all Conference matchups in football and men's and women's basketball as well as select baseball, soccer, softball and volleyball events and OVC Championship events. Packages are available on a yearly, seasonal, monthly or per-event basis.

OVC TELEVISION PACKAGE

This season the OVC is sponsoring a 21-game television package for basketball. In addition to this Conference-sponsored package, there are approximately 62 additional games that will air either locally, regionally or nationally involving OVC institutions during the season. That brings the total number of television games involving OVC schools this season to 83.

The sponsored OVC games are produced and aired by ESPNU/ESPN2 (9 games) and the Wazoo Sports network (12 games). Wazoo Sports is a Regional Sports Network located in London, Ky. Wazoo Sports (<http://www.wazoosports.com>) launched online in December of 2007 and expanded to a 24/7 sports television network on September 25, 2009. During the 2010 football season Wazoo produced and aired a 10-game OVC Football Game of the Week package.

The games that do not air on ESPNU can be seen on the Wazoo Sports Network in addition to CSS (Comcast/Charter Sports Southeast), ESPN3.com and ESPN Full Court. Four of the five women's games will air on Wazoo, ESPN3.com and ESPN Full Court, while the fifth will be exclusive to Wazoo. In addition, WEIU, an affiliate located in Charleston, Ill., will pick up all nine of the games. CSS, which was launched in 1999, can be found only on cable and serves over six million customers in 13 states. ESPN3.com, the network's live 24/7 broadband channel, was launched as ESPN360 in 2001 and renamed ESPN3.com in April, it is available at no additional cost to fans with a high-speed Internet connection from an affiliated provider. ESPN Full Court is an out-of-market pay-per-view sports package. The package is available on most major cable and satellite television providers.

Austin Peay opened the season week with a 71-68 home loss to Tennessee Tech, as the Golden Eagles buried a 3-pointer at the buzzer to win the game... It snapped a five-game home court winning streak and was the second loss in a row for APSU, who lost in the final seconds of overtime the previous Saturday... But the team was able to snap the mini losing streak with a 80-66 win over Jacksonville State on Saturday; with the victory the team improved to 7-2 in OVC play, which puts them in a tie for first place with Tennessee State and a game ahead of Murray State...Austin Peay has been out-rebounded by its last seven Division I opponents, including by JSU on Saturday; despite being out-rebounded the Gobs won the game and are now 15-1 all-time against the Gamecocks...Junior TyShwan Edmondson averaged 24.0 points, 5.5 rebounds, 2.0 assists and 2.0 steals/game while hitting 48.7 percent (19-of-39) from the field and 7-of-15 (46.7 percent) from 3-point range...Edmondson hit the 20-point plateau for the 11th and 12th times this season by going for 25 points against Tennessee Tech and 23 against Jax State...Edmondson was named both OVC Player (for the second time this season) and Newcomer (for the sixth time) of the Week...Freshman Will Triggs was the team's leading rebounder during the week, averaging 6.0 in the two games...He played a career-high 24 minutes in coming off the bench against TTU, and scored eight points to go along with his five boards; Triggs had nine points and seven rebounds in 20 minutes of action against JSU...In the loss to Tech, Austin Peay shot just 35.6 percent from the field, a low during OVC play this season...On a different note, the Gobs have turned up their defense and have forced its last three opponents into 20 or more turnovers...Austin Peay will go on the road for a tough test this week when they play at Eastern Kentucky

The loss was the first at home this season and snapped a 24-game home court winning streak that had dated back to Nov. 2009 (Kent State)...At the time it ended the streak was the fifth-longest nationally...With the loss the Eagles have now lost two in a row and are 5-4 in Conference play, which puts them in a three-way tie for fourth place...The end of the winning streak came a year after Morehead State had ended ECU's 19-game home court winning streak...For most of the game it was tough defense that limited both teams, as MSU shot 29.6 percent from the field and ECU managed just 33.3 percent for the game...But after shooting just 25 percent in the first half, ECU turned that around to 40.7 percent in the second half, including hitting seven second half 3-pointers...MSU, who ranks seventh nationally in rebounding margin (+9.2) dominated the board, pulling down 50 boards, including a season-high 21 by All-American Kenneth Faried...But Faried was limited to just 2-of-11 from the field and scored only six points, more than 11 points under his season average...Newcomer Drew Kelly hit 3-of-4 shots and scored 10 points to go along with six rebounds and an assists in just 15 minutes of playing time...Demonte Harper led the way with 13 points, but the senior hit just 4-of-18 from the floor...MSU does not have much time to rest as they are in action on Monday night at Ball State...The team returns home to host the two teams tied for first place in the OVC standings, playing Tennessee State on Thursday night and Austin Peay on Saturday night.

Just over a week ago UT Martin snapped a 12-game OVC losing streak dating back to last season with a road victory over Jacksonville State; since that victory the Skyhawks returned home and won two more OVC games, topping Southeast Missouri 79-69 and Eastern Illinois 63-62...In the victory over Southeast Missouri State, every player who attempted a shot scored, as seven players reached double figures, the first time that has happened for the program since Nov. 2003 (a span of 223 games)...Andres Irarrazabal collected his first career double-double in the game, scoring a team-high 15 points and pulling down 11 rebounds...On Saturday it was senior Benzor Simmons who came up big, nailing a 3-pointer with 27 seconds left to lift the Skyhawks to the 1-point victory over EIU...Coming off the bench Simmons had a season-high 21 points as he connected on 9-of-13 field goal attempts...Simmons also added four rebounds and an assist in 26 minutes of action...For the week Simmons averaged 16.0 points and hit 60 percent (12-of-20) from the field...Freshman Mike Liabo averaged 13.0 points, 5.0 rebounds and 4.0 assists/game last week in the two victories...He scored 11 points and hit 4-of-4 at the free throw line in the game's final 1:27 to seal the victory; to end the week he had 15 points and handed out four assists...UT Martin will step out of Conference play on Monday with a game against future OVC opponent SIU Edwardsville...On Saturday the team will go to Murray State to battle the Racers, a team they lost to 66-54 on Dec. 21.

OVC Tournament Tiebreaker System

Regular season standings will be the determining factor in setting first-round pairings for the tournament. All ties will be broken starting at the top of the conference standings and working down. The tiebreaking system will utilize the following factors, in order, until all ties are broken.

TWO-WAY TIES

1. Records in head-to-head competition are compared, with the higher seed going to the team that has won the most games against the other.
2. In the event step 1 does not resolve the tie (i.e. if the two teams split their games during the season), then the records of the tying teams against the No. 1 seed shall be compared. The team with the better record against the No. 1 seed shall gain the higher seed.
3. If the potential No. 1 seed is among tied teams, the process in step 2 will begin at the highest point in the standings which does not involve a tied team.
4. The process continues, through the No. 11 team in the standings, if necessary.
5. In the event the tie cannot be broken, seeds will be determined by a coin flip.

MULTIPLE TIES

1. Composite records between the tying teams will be evaluated to determine whether one team has won more games against the other tying institutions (in which case that team would receive the higher seed) and/or one team has won the least number of games among the tied teams (in which case the team will receive the lowest seed, and/or two teams have the same composite record (in which case the two-team tiebreaker scenario shall be utilized).
2. In the event step 1 does not solve the multiple ties, or reduce the multiple ties to one tie, then a comparison of records of the tying institutions against the No. 1 seed will occur. The team among the tying institutions with the better record against the No. 1 seed will receive the higher seed.
3. If the potential No. 1 seed is among tied teams, the process in step 2 will begin at the highest point in the standings which does not involve a tied team.
4. The process continues, through the No. 11 team in the standings, if necessary.
5. In the event this process does not resolve the ties, seeding will be determined by a coin flip.

Note: If a multiple tie is reduced to a tie between two teams, the two-team tiebreaker formula will then be utilized. Ties involving teams higher in the standings are always broken before ties involving teams lower in the standings.
