THIS WEEK'S OVC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

Kenneth Faried, C • Sr., 6-8, 228 • Newark, N.J. • Morehead State

Faried earned his fourth OVC Player of the Week honor of the season after averaging 22.3 points, 11.7 rebounds, 2.3 blocks and 2.0 steals/game in three Morehead State victories as the Eagles extended its home court winning streak to 22 games (the sixth-longest streak nationally). The senior, who leads the nation in rebounding (13.8/game), also hit 74.4 percent (29-of-39) from the field for the week. Faried had double-doubles in each game, increasing his season total to 13 in 15 games, which is tops nationally. Faried started the week with 24 points and 10 rebounds in a win over Kent State; the senior hit 10-of-11 shots in that game, blocked three shots and had two steals. Against Binghamton he scored 23 points and pulled down 12 rebounds, blocked two shots, had three steals and two assists. Faried concluded the week with a 20-point, 13-rebound performance against College of Charleston, where he also had two blocks, a steal and an assist while hitting 10-of-14 shots. The award marks the 11th Player of the Week award of Faried's four-year career, which ties the all-time OVC record also held by UT Martin's Lester Hudson.

Kenny Moore, F • Jr., 6-7, 220 • Philadelphia, Pa. • Tennessee State

Moore earned his second OVC Newcomer of the Week award in the last three weeks after averaging 12.5 points, 3.0 rebounds, 3.5 assists and 1.5 steals/game in two road contests. Moore hit 53.3 percent (8-of-15) from the field, 85.7 percent (6-of-7) from 3-point range and 75 percent (3-of-4) from the free throw stripe. Moore tied his career-high with 22 points in the Tigers 91-86 loss at No. 21 Memphis on Sunday. The junior transfer from Midland College hit 7-of-11 shots from the field, 5-of-6 3-point attempts and 3-of-4 from the free throw line while also pulling down four rebounds, dishing out three assists, blocking a shot and netting a steal as TSU nearly pulled the upset over the nationally-ranked Tigers. Nineteen (19) of his 22 points came in the second half as Tennessee State was tied with three minutes to play.

FRESHMAN

Jeff Johnson, F • Fr., 6-8, 240 • Champaign, III. • Eastern Kentucky

Coming off the bench, Johnson averaged 14.0 points and 2.5 rebounds/game last week as Eastern Kentucky split a pair of games on its Peach State road trip. Johnson hit 64.3 percent (9-of-14) from the field, 57.1 percent (4-of-7) from 3-point range and was a perfect 6-of-6 at the free throw line in the two contests. Johnson started the week with a career-high 18 points in a loss at Georgia. The freshman hit 7-of-11 shots, including 4-of-7 from 3-point range, while also pulling down two rebounds in 25 minutes of action. At Georgia Southern, Johnson hit all six of his free throw attempts, all of which came in the second half, as EKU held on to top GSU by six points and win its first road game of the season.

NOTES FROM AROUND THE LEAGUE

OVC Overview/This Week's Highlights: After a light week of games prior to the Christmas holiday, OVC teams got back into action with multiple games last week...The highlights of the week included a 69-49 victory by Morehead State over College of Charleston, the highest ranked RPI team an OVC team has topped this season; that victory came two days after Charleston had beaten Tennessee by 13 points in Knoxville...Morehead State was among the others receiving votes in last week's CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major Top 25 poll, but should make an appearance in this week's poll after topping both Kent State (No. 11 in the poll last week) and Charleston (No. 15 in last week's poll)...Overall Morehead State won three home games last week to extend its home court winning streak to 22 games, the sixth-longest streak nationally; MSU will have a chance to extend that streak this week when the team hosts Tennessee Tech and Jacksonville State...Murray State is the only OVC team with a longer home court winning streak, as the Racers have won 24 in a row at home, the fourth-longest streak nationally; Murray State hosts the No. 1 (Austin Peay) and No. 2 (Tennessee State) teams in the OVC standings this week... Saturday's game with rival Austin Peay came be seen nationally on ESPNU...Morehead State senior Kenneth Faried moved up the ladder in several OVC career stat categories last week as he now ranks fourth in rebounding (1,372), fifth in blocks (188) and 10th in steals (196)... Faried currently ranks first nationally in rebounding (13.8) and double-doubles (13)...Jacksonville State's Jeremy Bynum joined the 1,000-Point Club last week, making him one of sixth active OVC players in that group.

Faried Nets 20/20 Game: Morehead State's Kenneth Faried had a monster game at SIU Edwardsville on Nov. 28, scoring 25 points and pulling down 20 rebounds in a win. That is one of just two 20/20 games at the Division I level this season. Faried also had a 20/20 game last season (23 points, 21 rebounds at Tennessee State - that was one of just nine 20/20 efforts nationally during the 2009-10 season) and a 20/20 game in 2008-09 (27 points, 24 rebounds against Florida A&M). Faried has 13 double-doubles this season (in 15 total games), which ranks first nationally. For his career Faried has 70 career double-doubles, which is the most nationally among active players.

40 Minutes Just Not Enough for Austin Peay: So far this season Austin Peay has played five overtime games, the most of any Division I team. Princeton and Wofford have each played three overtime games this season.

Home Court Overall Winning Streaks: Entering this week Murray State has the longest home court winning streak among OVC teams at 24 games (the team last lost at home to Louisiana Tech on Feb. 21, 2009). That streak currently ranks fourth nationally. Morehead State's 22-game home court winning streak is currently sixth nationally (the Eagles have not lost at home since falling to Kent State on Nov. 29, 2009). Kansas has the nation's longest home court winning streak (67).

Home Court Conference Winning Streaks: Entering this week Morehead State has a 20-game home court winning streak in Conference games, a streak that dates back to the last game of the 2007-08 season (which was a loss). MSU was undefeated at home in 2008-09 and 2009-10 and is 2-0 in OVC play at home this season. Xavier (32 games) currently has the longest home court conference winning streak.

The OVC Among NCAA Statistical Leaders: In the latest NCAA statistical leaders release (Jan. 3) Tennessee Tech ranks fourth in steals (10.8/game), Tennessee State is sixth in free throw percentage (78.1%) and Morehead State is 13th in rebounding margin (+9.4). Individually Morehead State's Kenneth Faried is first nationally in rebounding (13.8/game) and doubledoubles (13), third in field goal percentage (64.2%), 23rd in steals (2.3/game), 43rd in points (19.1 points/game) and 64th in blocks (1.9 blocks/game). Murray State's B.J. Jenkins is seventh (92.9%) and Eastern Illinois' Jeremy Granger 12th in free throw percentage while Tennessee Tech's **Zac Swansey** is 10th in assists (6.6/game).

Murray State 23rd in CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major Poll: After finishing last season with an OVC-record 31 wins, Murray State finished the 2009-10 season ranked sixth in the CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major poll. This season the Racers began the year fifth in that poll and are currently 23rd this week (Dec. 27 poll - the Jan. 3 poll was not available at release time). Morehead State, who was in the poll for two weeks, is currently among the others receiving votes.

COACHES TELECONFERENCE

2011 OVC TOURNAMENT

The 2011 Ohio Valley Conference Men's & Women's Tournaments will be held March 2-5 at Municipal Auditorium in Nashville, Tenn. For the first time since 1996, the entire tournament will be held at one site (instead of first round games being played on campus sites). The tournament has also switched to a merit-based format with the No. 1 and 2 seeds getting double byes into the semifinals and the No. 3 and 4 seeds getting a bye into the quarterfinals.

The first round and quarterfinal games (which start at 12 and 2 p.m. for the women, and 6 and 8 p.m. for the men) can be seen on OVCSports.TV. The men's semifinals will be held on Friday, March 4 at 7 and 9 p.m. and televised on ESPNU with the championship game on Saturday, March 5 at 7 p.m. and televised live on ESPN2. The women's semifinals are set for 12 and 2 p.m. on March 4 (televised on OVCSports.TV) and the women's championship game is set for March 5 at 3:00 p.m. (TV TBD).

This marks the 17th time in 18 years that the tournament has been held in Nashville.

CREDENTIALS. For the second year in a row, credentials will be requested through an online system. That information will be available in January. The deadline to request credentials is MONDAY, FEB. 28 at Noon. No credentials will be mailed; they can be picked up at Media Will-Call, located at teh back entrance of the arena (at the intersection of 5th Ave. North and Gay Street).



Morehead State figures to potentially jump into the poll after beating the No. 11 (Kent State) and No. 15 (College of Charleston) ranked teams in last week's poll. Now in its 12th season, the Mid-Major poll is made up of team's from the following conferences: America East, Atlantic Sun, Big Sky, Big South, Big West, Colonial, Great West, Horizon, Independents, Ivy, Metro Atlantic, Mid-American, Mid-Eastern, Missouri Valley, Northeast, Ohio Valley, Patriot, Southern, Southland, Southwestern, Summit, Sun Belt, West Coast. It is voted upon by coaches from those conferences, with one coach per conference casting a vote (Murray State's Billy Kennedy is the OVC representative).

OVC Tournament Makes Moves to Municipal Auditorium with More Teams, New Format: Beginning this season the OVC Basketball Tournament will move to Municipal Auditorium in Nashville as its new annual home. This year's event will mark the 17th time in the last 18 years the league's marquee event has been held in Music City, USA (2002 was the lone year the event was not held in Nashville). It marks the sixth time the combined men's and women's tournament has been held in Municipal, following the 1994, 1995, 1996, 2004 and 2008 events (a men's only event was also held there in 1989). New this season is the fact that all eight men's and all eight women's teams that qualify for the tournament field will gather at a single site for the entire tournament (previously first round games were played on campus sites with the semifinals and finals being held in Nashville). That marks the first time since 1996 that the entire tournament has been held at one site. The bracket also shifts from a traditional 1 vs. 8, 2 vs. 7, etc. format to a merit-based format that rewards the top teams during the regular season with byes into the quarterfinals and semifinals (the No. 1 and 2 seeds will receive double byes into the semifinals while the No. 3 and 4 seeds will receive a bye into the quarterfinals). The 2011 OVC Men's and Women's Basketball Championship dates are March 2-5.

More on Municipal Auditorium: As part of the deal to host the tournament at Municipal Auditorium, the Nashville City Council and Municipal Auditorium committed \$200,000 to improvements at the venue, which opened in 1962. Among the major improvements that will be completed prior to this year's championship are upgrades to the dressing rooms, two new scoreboards and the new OVC-branded playing surface. The floor, which was unveiled at the league's Media Day event in October, was built by Horner Sports Flooring, whose corporate headquarters are in Dollar Bay, Mich. The company has made floors for many collegiate and National Basketball Association (NBA) teams, including building the floor for the 2010 NBA All-Star Game which was held at Texas Stadium. The Horner Pro King portable floor at Municipal Auditorium was purchased for a cost of \$71,960; the court will be used for the OVC Tournament, various high school games/tournaments and special events such as the Harlem Globetrotters.

Loos is All-Time Winningest Coach in OVC History: With a 68-66 victory at Ohio on Dec. 9 of last season, Austin Peay head coach Dave Loos recorded his 320th career victory while in the OVC, a mark that ranks first all-time. Loos passed Cal Luther (319 wins at Murray State and UT Martin) for the all-time mark. Loos, the Dean of OVC coaches, is now in his 21st year at Austin Peay where he also serves as the Athletics Director, making him the only Division I head men's basketball coach to hold that distinction. Loos is one of just 14 active Division I coaches to have coached at the same school for 20 or more years. Loos now has 340 victories in his tenure at Austin Peay and 422 for his career.

Faried Named to Naismith Award Watch List: Morehead State senior Kenneth Faried is one of 50 players named to the 2010-11 Naismith Award preseason watch list as announced by the Atlanta Tipoff Club. The Naismith Trophy is the most prestigious national award presented annually to college basketball's player of the year. Faried is the reigning OVC Player and Defensive Player of the Year, and was named this year's OVC Preseason Player of the Year. Last year, he averaged 16.9 points and 13.0 rebounds per game, leading the nation with 456 total rebounds. He also led the conference with 67 blocked shots and collected 56 steals on his way to honorable mention All-American honors. This year's diverse list includes the top men's college basketball players from 44 schools around the country. The watch list was compiled by the Atlanta Tipoff Club's Board of Selectors, which based its criteria on player performances from the previous year and expectations for the 2010-11 college basketball season. The Naismith Trophy presented by AT&T will be awarded at the 2011 NCAA Men's Final Four in Houston.

Faried Named Candidate for Lowe's Senior CLASS Award: Morehead State senior center Kenneth Faried is one of 30 candidates for the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award in men's basketball. To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence - community, classroom, character and competition. An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School®, the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities. The candidate class will be narrowed to 10 men's finalists midway through the regular season, and those names will be placed on the official ballot. Ballots will be distributed through a nationwide voting system to media, coaches and fans, who will select one finalist who best exemplifies excellence in the four Cs of community, classroom, character and competition.

Swansey a Candidate for Bob Cousy Award: Tennessee Tech junior Zac Swansey is one of 66 NCAA basketball players in contention for the 2011 Bob Cousy award and the title of the nation's top point guard, as announced by the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame. The annual award, named for Hall of Famer and former Boston Celtic Bob Cousy, recognizes college basketball's top point guard. Nominations were solicited from all schools across the country.

The original list of candidates will be narrowed down to a final 20 by January 3rd, final 10 by February 3rd, and final five by March 3rd. A Hall of Fame appointed screening committee will be narrowing down the candidates from 20 to 10 to 5 prior to a Blue Ribbon Selection Committee evaluating the final five candidates and ultimately choosing the winner. Both of the Hall of Fame committee's are made up of top college basketball personnel including media members, head coaches, Sports Information Directors and Hall of Famers. The winner of the 2011 Bob Cousy Award will be presented at the Hall of Fame's Class Announcement on Monday April 4th in Houston as part of NCAA Final Four weekend.

The 2010-11 Season: The 2010-11 season marks the 63rd of competition in the OVC. Over the previous 62 years, 12 different teams have claimed an OVC regular season championship, including three different schools in the past three years.

OVC Has Postseason Success: After several years of not having much postseason success, OVC teams have turned it around the past two years. Each of the last two years the league has sent three teams to the postseason, including Murray State to the NCAA Tournament and Eastern Kentucky and Morehead State to the College Basketball Invitational (CBI) last season. The biggest splash came from No. 13 seed Murray State who knocked off No. 4 seed Vanderbilt 66-65 in the NCAA Tournament when Danero Thomas hit a jumper at the buzzer. It was the first time an OVC team had won a First Round NCAA Tournament game since 1989 (when MTSU beat Florida State) and marked the second year in a row the league had won a NCAA Tournament game (Morehead State beat Alabama State in the Opening Round game in 2009). Murray State would lose to eventual national runner-up Butler in the Second Round, falling 54-52. Morehead State would win its first game in the CBI, marking the first time since 1988 that two different OVC teams had won postseason games in the same season.

OVC Teams to Once Again Compete in ESPN BracketBusters Series: For the sixth-straight season every OVC team will compete in the ESPN BracketBusters series in 2010-11. Now it its ninth year, ESPN BracketBusters is an ESPN television property that was tremendously successful with its first eight events. The event has allowed Division I conferences to participate in a cutting-edge format that involves "wild card" pairings from the pool of participating teams, with half of the ESPN BracketBusters teams pre-designated as "home" and the remaining half as "road" teams. This year there are 114 teams from 15 conferences in the pool of teams who will be selected for one of 11 nationally-televised games. Teams not selected for a television game will be paired up with other teams in the pool for games that will be played on Saturday, Feb. 19. The matchups will be announced on January 31. OVC schools are 19-37 all-time in the BracketBusters event.

OVC Players in the NBA: Entering the season there was just one former OVC player on a NBA roster. Former UT Martin All-American Lester Hudson began the year on the roster of the Washington Wizards but was waived on Nov. 22. Hudson, however, was re-signed by the Wizards on Dec. 20. Hudson was a two-time OVC Player of the Year at UT Martin before being selected No. 58 overall by the Boston Celtics in the 2009 NBA Draft. Hudson spent half of his rookie season with the Celtics before finishing the year with the Memphis Grizzlies and in the NBA Development League. There are also three former OVC players playing in the NBA Development League as former Tennessee Tech standout Willie Jenkins is with the Idaho Stampede and Jacksonville State's Walker Russell (Fort Wayne Mad Ants) and Amadou Mbodji (Utah Flash) are also in the league.

Murray State Picked as Preseason Co-Favorites: In a vote of Ohio Valley Conference head men's basketball coaches and sports information directors, Murray State received 18 first-place votes and was picked as the favorite for the 2010-11 season. Last season Murray State won an OVC-record 31 games on its way to the OVC regular season and tournament championship as well as a NCAA Tournament first round victory over No. 4 seed Vanderbilt. It marks the 14th time in the last 22 years that Murray State has been picked the preseason favorite and third in a row (they were tabbed co-favorites with Morehead State last season). Murray State received 162 total points and was followed next by Morehead State (2 first-place votes, 146 points), who was a consensus No. 2 pick. Eastern Illinois was picked third (123) and was followed by Austin Peay (107), Eastern Kentucky (92), Tennessee Tech (85), Tennessee State (81), Jacksonville State (51), Southeast Missouri (41) and UT Martin (20).

Preseason Predictions: Is being picked the preseason favorite, always a good thing? Over the past 31 years of preseason polls that were available, the league's head coaches and sports information directors correctly pick the eventual OVC regular season champion 61 percent of the time, picking the correct winner 20 times over the last 32 years. Over the past 10 years, the preseason poll has correctly picked the winner every other year.

Morehead State's Faried Tabbed as Preseason Player of the Year: The 2010-11 All-OVC Preseason Men's Basketball team was headlined by Morehead State senior center Kenneth Faried, marking the second year in a row he has been bestowed that honor. Faried was named both the OVC Player of the Year and Defensive Player of the Year in 2009-10. Overall seven different schools were represented on the team with Murray State's four selections leading the way. Morehead State had two selections while Austin Peay, Eastern Illinois, Eastern Kentucky, Jacksonville State and Tennessee Tech had one player apiece on the squad. The team features four players who were All-OVC first-team selections last season. The team also has one player who was a second-team selection and two players who were on the All-Newcomer squad. In addition to Faried, Murray State's B.J. Jenkins and Isacc Miles and Eastern Illinois' Tyler Laser were each firstteam All-OVC picks last season and are each on the preseason team this year. Austin Peay's Anthony Campbell was the lone second-team selection from last season who returned to the OVC this year, while Murray State's Isaiah Canaan, along with Jenkins, were the All-Newcomer selections from last year who were on this year's preseason team. The Preseason All-OVC team was rounded out by Murray State's Ivan Aska, Morehead State's Demonte Harper, Tennessee Tech's Kevin Murphy, Jacksonville State's Nick Murphy and Eastern Kentucky's Justin Stommes.

All League Head Coaches Return: For the second-time in four years, every OVC head coach returns from the previous season. This last happened in the 2007-08 season. Overall it is the seventh time there has been no turnover in coaches between seasons since the 1978-79 season (the other years were 1978-79, 1993-94, 1994-95, 2001-02, 2004-05 and 2007-08).

Replay Systems for OVC Basketball Venues Enter Year Four: On Dec. 21, 2007, the Ohio Valley Conference mandated the use of courtside replay systems at all OVC basketball venues. The systems were put into place in January 2008 and have been used since. The systems are used in situations that are outlined by NCAA rules.

SIU Edwardsville Continues Reclassification Process to Division I: On July 1, 2008 Southern Illinois University Edwardsville became the 11th member of the Ohio Valley Conference. SIU Edwardsville, who is in the reclassification process to Division I, will begin regular season competition in the OVC during the 2011-12 academic year and will be eligible for postseason competition in 2012-13. The exception is the SIUE softball program, which will be eligible for both regular season and tournament competition this year; the softball program was the department's women's sport designee to be fast-tracked to Division I, making it eligible to compete at Division I prior to other SIUE sports. SIUE is located in Edwardsville, Ill., which is just northeast of St. Louis (the 18th largest media market in the United States.

OVCSports.TV: For the fifth consecutive year, fans can watch nearly every Conference matchup and all non-conference home contests this season at OVCSports.TV. The venture with NeuLion (formerly JumpTV Sports) allows fans to access live and on-demand streaming video and audio of conference matchups (excluding only national television games which are not available) on their home computer. The premium Web site was launched in July 2006 and has streamed over 1,000 events in its first four years, including all Conference matchups in football and men's and women's basketball as well as select baseball, soccer, softball and volleyball events and OVC Championship events. Packages are available on a yearly, seasonal, monthly or per-event basis.

OVC TELEVISION PACKAGE

This season the OVC is sponsoring a 21-game television package for basketball. In addition to this Conference-sponsored package, there are approximately 62 additional games that will air either locally, regionally or nationally involving OVC institutions during the season. That brings the total number of television games involving OVC schools this season to 83.

The sponsored OVC games are produced and aired by ESPNU/ESPN2 (9 agmes) and the Wazoo Sports network (12 games). Wazoo Sports is a Regional Sports Network located in London, Ky. Wazoo Sports (http://www.wazoosports.com) launched online in December of 2007 and expanded to a 24/7 sports television network on September 25, 2009. During the 2010 football season Wazoo produced an aired a 10-game OVC Football Game of the Week package.

The games that do not air on ESPNU can be seen on the Wazoo Sports Network in addition to CSS (Comcast/Charter Sports Southeast), ESPN3.com and ESPN Full Court. Four of the five women's games will air on Wazoo, ESPN3.com and ESPN Full Court, while the fifth will be exclusive to Wazoo. In addition, WEIU, an affiliate located in Charleston, Ill., will pick up all nine of the games. CSS, which was launched in 1999, can be found only on cable and serves over six million customers in 13 states. ESPN3.com, the network's live 24/7 broadband channel, was launched as ESPN360 in 2001 and renamed ESPN3.com in April, it is available at no additional cost to fans with a high-speed Internet connection from an affiliated provider. ESPN Full Court is an out-of-market pay-per-view sports package. The package is available on most major cable and satellite television providers.

AUSTIN PEAY GOVERNORS (9-6, 4-0)

Home: 4-1, Away: 4-4, Neutral: 1-1

Team Notes

Austin Peay returned from a week-long break with a home contest against Brescia last Wednesday...The Governors came out victorious, winning 101-46 to improve to 9-6 on the year and 4-1 at the Dunn Center...In the win the Governors recorded a season-high 30 assists, doing so on 39 made field goals; the 30 assists also set a Dunn Center record, breaking the old mark of 28 set against Eastern Kentucky in the 1976-77 season...It marked the third 100-point game of the season for the Govs; that is the most in a season since 1990-91, which was Dave Loos' first year as head coach...APSU connected on a season-best 57.4 percent (39-of-68) from the field against Brescia, and marked the third-straight game (and 7th time this season) the team has shot 50 percent or better from the field...Austin Peay pulled down 50 rebounds in the game, one off its season-high...Junior TyShwan Edmondson led the way with 23 points, marking the seventh time in his last nine games that he scored 20 or more points; his 23 points came in just 27 minutes as the junior hit 10-of-16 shots (62.5%)...Edmondson is the only Governor player to scored in double figures in all 15 games this season...Will Triggs came off the bench to grab a season-best nine rebounds, the most by a APSU freshman since Feb. 2009...Point guard Caleb Brown dished out seven assists and has netted four or more assists in each of his last 10 games...Austin Peay returns to action with a game on Monday night, when they conclude a four-game home stand by hosting Chattanooga...The week ends on Saturday when the team plays at rival Murray State; that game can be seen nationally on ESPNU.

Eastern Kentucky traveled to the Peach State for two games last week, as the team completed a five-game road swing dating back to Dec. 11...The week opened at SEC foe Georgia, where freshman Jeff Johnson kept the Colonels in the game early, scoring 15 of his 18 points in the first half, including hitting 3-of-4 3-pointers in the first half...EKU trailed by one (34-33) at halftime and led early in the second half after an old-fashioned 3-point play by senior Spencer Perrin...The game was tied with 7:17 to play before UGA pulled ahead and won 64-57...Johnson finished the a team-best 18 in 25 minutes of play off the bench while Perrin added 12 points and nine rebounds...Two days later the Colonels traveled to Georgia Southern and won on the road for the first time in six games this season, besting the Eagles 79-73...Johnson once again came off the bench and sparked the Colonels, scored 10 points including hitting 6-of-6 free throws in the second half...For his efforts Johnson was named OVC Freshman of the Week; for the week he averaged 14.0 points and 2.5 rebounds/game while hitting 64.3 percent (9-of-14) from the field...Senior Josh Daniel led the way for EKU, scored a career-high 24 points on 10-of-14 (71.4%) shooting...Perrin added the first double-double of the year by an EKU player, scoring 18 points and grabbing 10 rebounds...Freshman Jabs Newby tallied a season-high 10 assists...Overall the team shot 53.3 percent from the field, marking the first time in five games the Colonels had shot 50 percent or better from the field...EKU will host Jacksonville State and Tennessee Tech in OVC action this week.

Team Notes

While some OVC squads played just once last week, Morehead State played three times, winning all three games at home to improve its winning streak at Johnson Arena to 22 games, the sixth-longest streak nationally...The wins came over Kent State, who was the last team to beat Morehead State at home (in Nov. 2009), Binghamton and College of Charleston (a team that had won at Tennessee by 13 points just two days earlier)...Senior Kenneth Faried was named OVC Player of the Week for the fourth time this year (and a record 11th time in his career) after netting double-doubles in each of the three games last week... Faried averaged 22.3 points, 11.7 rebounds, 2.3 blocks and 2.0 steals/game and hit 74.4 percent (29-of-39) from the field...Faried had 24 points and 10 rebounds against Kent State, 23 points and 12 boards versus Binghamton and 20 points and 13 rebounds against the College of Charleston...Had it not been for Faried, teammate Demonte Harper could easily have been named OVC Player of the Week as the senior averaged 22.7 points, 5.7 rebounds, 2.7 assists and 1.7 steals/game while hitting 60.5 percent (26-of-43) from the field and 69.2 percent (9-of-13) from 3-point range...Harper scored 28 points, grabbed 10 rebounds and had four steals in the win over College of Charleston; the 10 rebounds were a career-high for Harper...The 49 points scored by Charleston were the fewest by a MSU opponent this season...This week the Eagles continue a five-game home stand with OVC games against Tennessee Tech and Jacksonville State... The Eagles have won 20-straight OVC home games, which is the seventh-longest streak nationally entering this week.

OVC Tournament Tiebreaker System

Regular season standings will be the determining factor in setting first-round pairings for the tournament. All ties will be broken starting at the top of the conference standings and working down. The tiebreaking system will utilize the following factors, in order, until all ties are broken.

TWO-WAY TIES

- 1. Records in head-to-head competition are compared, with the higher seed going to the team that has won the most games against the other.
- 2. In the event step 1 does not resolve the tie (i.e. if the two teams split their games during the season), then the records of the tying teams against the No. 1 seed shall be compared. The team with the better record against the No. 1 seed shall gain the higher seed.
- 3. If the potential No. 1 seed is among tied teams, the process in step 2 will begin at the highest point in the standings which does not involve a tied team.
- 4. The process continues, through the No. 11 team in the standings, if necessary.
- 5. In the event the tie cannot be broken, seeds will be determined by a coin flip.

MULTIPLE TIES

- 1. Composite records between the tying teams will be evaluated to determine whether one team has won more games against the other tying institutions (in which case that team would receive the higher seed) and/or one team has won the least number of games among the tied teams (in which case the team will receive the lowest seed, and/or two teams have the same composite record (in which case the two-team tiebreaker scenario shall be utilized).
- 2. In the event step 1 does not solve the multiple ties, or reduce the multiple ties to one tie, then a comparison of records of the tying institutions against the No. 1 seed will occur. The team among the tying institutions with the better record against the No. 1 seed will receive the higher seed.
- 3. If the potential No. 1 seed is among tied teams, the process in step 2 will begin at the highest point in the standings which does not involve a tied team.
- 4. The process continues, through the No. 11 team in the standings, if necessary.
- 5. In the event this process does not resolve the ties, seeding will be determined by a coin flip.

Note: If a multiple tie is reduced to a tie between two teams, the two-team tiebreaker formula will then be utilized. Ties involving teams higher in the standings are always broken before ties involving teams lower in the standings.
