THIS WEEK'S OVC HIGHLIGHTS/STORYLINES

Jacksonville State went on the road to top Austin Peay 44-14 on Saturday and now finds itself on top of the OVC standings by itself after Tennessee Tech lost at home to rival Tennessee State...The Gamecocks moved up to No. 8 in the FCS Coaches poll (its highest rank of the season) and are No. 10 in the Sports Network/Fathead.com poll...TTU, ranked No. 19 last week, suffered its first loss of the season to a FCS team and is now No. 23 in the FCS Coaches poll and unranked in the Sports Network poll...Tech and Eastern Kentucky, who topped Southeast Missouri at home, are one game behind Jax State in the loss column...After going over a year without an OVC victory, Tennessee State made it two in a row by topping Tennessee Tech on Saturday night; it marked the first win over a nationally-ranked opponent for the Tigers since the end of the 2009 season (Eastern Illinois)...Southeast Missouri State quarterback Matt Scheible rushed for 75 yards and passed for 174 yards in his team's loss at EKU; by hitting those totals Scheible become the first player in OVC history to pass for 4,000 and rush for 2,000 yards in a career...Scheible also set the Southeast all-time total offense record and is closing in on the OVC's career top 10 in that category...Murray State won its second-straight OVC game and improved to 2-2 in the league; the Racers are tied for fourth in the standings with Austin Peay, Tennessee State and UT Martin...Murray State quarterback Casey Brockman, who is on the Walter Payton Award Watch List, was named Homecoming King prior to the win over Eastern Illinois...This week features three OVC matchups and one non-conference tilt...Austin Peay will travel to Southeast Missouri, UT Martin is at Eastern Illinois and Tennessee State will play at Eastern Kentucky...In non-conference action Jacksonville State will play at FBS Kentucky in a game that can be seen on ESPNU...Murray State and Tennessee Tech have byes this week.

OFFENSIVE

Mike Harris, RB • Sr., 5-11, 200 • Tulsa, Okla. • Murray State

Harris rushed for 133 yards and a school record four touchdowns as Murray State came from behind to top Eastern Illinois 36-27 on Saturday. The senior scored on runs of 1 and 22 yards in the first half and 2 and 24 yards in the second half. His touchdown run early in the fourth quarter pulled the Racers to within three points of the Panthers and his 24-yard scamper with one second remaining put the game out of reach. Harris carried the ball 30 times on the afternoon, tying the career-high he set a year ago. The senior also completed a 31-yard pass on the opening possession of the game. It marked his second 100-yard rushing performance of the year and the second time this season he has been named Offensive Player of the Week.

DEFENSIVE

Antonio Harper, DB • R-So., 6-1, 211 • Memphis, Tenn. • Tennessee State

Harper had a team-high nine tackles to go along with 4.0 tackles-for-loss and 2.5 sacks and a forced fumble in Tennessee State's 42-40 upset of No. 19 Tennessee Tech on Saturday. Harper's biggest play of the game came in the fourth quarter with TTU in makeable field goal range, as he sacked the Golden Eagle quarterback for a loss of six yards and on the next play Tech missed a 42-yard field goal (and ultimately led TSU to a two-point victory). The sophomore also picked up a sack on the final drive of the game. The 4.0 tackles-for-loss and 2.5 sacks were both individual single-game highs in the OVC this season.

Zach Sharp, K • Fr., 6-2, 190 • Maryville, Tenn. • Tennessee Tech

Sharp made four field goals and four extra point attempts to account for 16 points in Tennessee Tech's 42-40 loss to Tennessee State on Saturday. The freshman connected from 34, 49, 31 and 26 yards in the game, accounting for the second-most field goals in TTU single-game history. His 49-yard field goal came two seconds before halftime and marked his career-long and matched the longest field goal in the OVC this season. His 16 points scored by kicking was also the second-most in Golden Eagle history. Sharp currently ranks 18th nationally in field goals/game (1.33).

NEWCOMER

Michael German, QB • R-Fr., 6-3, 220 • Pompano Beach, Fla. • Tennessee State

For the third week in a row Tennessee State redshirt freshman quarterback Michael German earned OVC Newcomer of Week honors after leading the Tigers to their second OVC victory in as many weeks with a 42-40 upset of No. 19 Tennessee Tech. German completed 19-of-29 passes for 232 yards and two touchdowns and carried the ball four times for 15 yards and an additional score. Overall it marked the third consecutive 200-plus yard passing game for German who has not thrown an interception in 131 attempts this season. He is the first OVC player to win the Newcomer of the Week award in three-straight weeks since the 2001 season (EKU's C.J. Hudson).

NOTES FROM AROUND THE GRIDIRON

Scheible Becomes First OVC Player to Pass for 4,000 and Rush for 2,000 Yards in a Career: In the Oct. 15 game at Eastern Kentucky, Southeast Missouri State senior quarterback **Matt Scheible** became the first player in OVC history to throw for 4,000 yards and rush for 2,000 yards in a career. Scheible currently has 4,101 passing yards and 2,054 rushing yards in his four-year career. His 6,155 yards of total offense for his career is just 322 yards away from the OVC career top 10 and currently ranks ninth nationally among active FCS players.

Red Zone Offense: In the latest NCAA statistical rankings, three of the nine OVC teams currently rank in the Top 10 nationally in red zone offense. UT Martin is first having scored 97% of the time the team has reached the red zone. Tennessee State ranks fifth (93%) while Jacksonville State is 10th (91%).

OVC Teams Strong in Kick/Punt Returns: So far this season five of the nine OVC teams (Eastern Illinois, Eastern Kentucky, Murray State, Tennessee State and UT Martin) have returned a kickoff for a touchdown. In the national rankings UT Martin's Kevin Barfield ranks seventh in kickoff returns (29.88 yards/return). In punt returns, two teams rank in the Top 10 nationally, as Tennessee State is second (20.29 yards/return) and UT Martin is fourth (18.0 yards/return). Individually in punt returns, UT Martin's **CJ Estelle** ranks second nationally (22.08 yards/return) while Murray State's **Dontrell Johnson** is third (16.2 yards/return). Tennessee State and UT Martin each returned punts for touchdowns during week No. 6 of the season. Tennessee State's **Weldon Garlington** has returned each a kickoff and a punt for a touchdown this season, going 100 yards for the kickoff return and 91 yards for the punt return.

OVC Teams in Top 25: Jacksonville State, who has now been ranked in the Top 25 for 38 consecutive weeks, is No. 8 in this week's FCS Coaches Poll and No. 10 in the Sports Network/Fathead.com poll. It marks the highest the Gamecocks have been ranked this season (JSU was No. 9 in the preseason poll and No. 10 after the first week of the season). Tennessee Tech garnered its first national ranking since the 2002 preseason poll by jumping into the polls on Oct. 3. Currently the Golden Eagles are No. 23 in the FCS Coaches poll and now unranked in the Sports Network/Fathead.com poll. Earlier this season Murray State gained its first national ranking since the 2002 season when it was No. 24 in the Sports Network poll, but the Racers dropped out after a loss the following week.

NCAA Stats Leaders: In the latest set of NCAA statistical leaders, Murray State quarterback **Casey Brockman** ranks sixth nationally in total offense (315.29 yards/game), third in total passing yards (2,175), fourth in completions (28.29/game and fourth in passing yards/game (310.71) and ninth in points responsible for (16.29/game). Tennessee Tech senior **Tim Benford** ranks seventh in receiving yards/game (102.33), 10th in receptions/game (7.0) and 11th in total receiving yards (614) while teammate **Dontey Gay** is 11th in rushing yards (110.5/game). UT Martin's **Cody Sandlin** is sixth in scoring (9.67 points/game) while his teammate **CJ Estelle** is second in punt returns (22.08 yards/return) and the Skyhawks **Kevin Barfield** is seventh in kickoff returns (29.88 yards/return). Murray State's **Dontrell Johnson** is third nationally in punt returns (16.2 yards/return). Tennessee State's **Jamin Godfrey** is eighth in field goals (1.57 made/game). Southeast Missouri's **Blake Peiffer** is sixth in tackles/game (12.33), UT Martin's **Ben Johnson** is fourth in forced fumbles (0.60/game), Tennessee Tech's Dwight Evans is seventh in forced fumbles (0.50/game) and Eastern Kentucky's Myer Nolan is third in fumbles recovered/game (0.50/game). In the team rankings UT Martin is second in scoring offense (42.67 points/game), fourth in total offense (480.5 yards/game), fourth in punt returns (18.0 yards/return), second in fewest fumbles lost (2), fourth in third down conversion defense (25.3%) fifth in tackles-for-loss (8.67/game) and first in fewest sacks/game (0.33/game) and red zone offense (97%). Murray State ranks fifth in passing offense (323.29 yards/game), ninth in total offense (447.86 yards/game) and seventh in third down conversion percentage (48.25%). Jacksonville State ranks eighth in fewest interceptions thrown (2), 10th in passes intercepted (10), eighth in fourth down conversion percentage (75%), first in fourth down conversion defense (0%) and 10th in red zone offense (91%). Tennessee State ranks second in punt returns (20.29 yards/return), third in fumbles recovered (11), fourth in fourth down conversion percentage (83.33%) and fifth in red zone offense (93%). Eastern Kentucky ranks second in fewest fumbles lost (2) and fourth in fourth down conversion percentage (83.33%). Tennessee Tech ranks ninth in net punting (38.61 yards/punt) while Eastern Illinois is 10th in kickoff returns (24.26 yards/return).

Attendance Numbers: In the latest FCS attendance numbers, Jacksonville State ranks 14th nationally (an average of 16,783 fans in three home games). Tennessee State has played in front of the second largest crowd to see a FCS vs. FCS game this season, when 43,532 witnessed the Tigers game with Jackson State at the Liberty Bowl on Sept. 10.

Spoo Tied for Fourth All-Time in OVC Wins; Will Retire After 2011 Season: With a victory over Tennessee State on Nov. 6 of last season, Eastern Illinois head coach **Bob Spoo** moved into a tie for fourth place on the OVC all-time career Conference victory list. Spoo has now won 67 OVC games in his tenure at EIU, which has spanned the school's entire time in the OVC (1996 through the present, although he was not on the sidelines for the 2006 season). Spoo trails only Roy Kidd (207 OVC wins at EKU), Boots Donnelly (102 wins at Austin Peay and Middle Tennessee) and Charles Murphy (73 wins at Middle Tennessee) on the all-time list and he is currently tied with Jimmy Feix (67 wins at Western Kentucky). In all games as head coach since Eastern Illinois joined the OVC in 1996, Spoo has registered 91 victories, fifth-most in league history. Following the end of the 2010 season, Spoo announced he would retire at the conclusion of the 2011 season, which will be his 25th as the Panthers head coach.

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which goes to the annual winner of the quadrangular season series between the four OVC institutions in the state of Tennessee (Austin Peay, Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech and UT Martin). In July 2007, the Nashville Sports Council and the Ohio Valley Conference announced the creation of the trophy, which is only the second traveling trophy involving more than two schools nationwide (the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy). It is named after Sgt. Alvin C. York, a native of Pall Mall, Tenn. and a Soldier who was one of the most honored of World War I. He received the Congressional Medal of Honor after the war and returned to his home state to dedicate his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee. The trophy goes to the team with the best record against the other schools, and in case of a tie there will be co-champions and the actual trophy will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy. In 2007 Tennessee State and Austin Peay finished in a tie for the trophy with identical 2-1 records; both shared the award but Tennessee State went home with the hardware due to a 1-point win in the head-to-head meeting during the season. Tennessee State went 3-0 in Sgt. York play in 2008 to claim its second trophy. In 2009 Tennessee Tech claimed the trophy after going undefeated in Sgt. York games and a year ago UT Martin became the third-straight OVC team to go 3-0 and win the trophy in claiming its first title. At the halfway point of the season all four teams currently have 1-1 records. If defending champion UT Martin tops Tennessee State on Nov. 12, it can finish in no worse than a tie for the award and under the rules would retain the trophy.

OVC Teams Versus FBS Foes: So far this season OVC schools have squared off in games against eight teams from the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS); overall OVC schools will play 10 games against FBS teams during the 2011 season. Despite going 0-8 in those games, the closest game involved Eastern Kentucky losing 10-7 at Kansas State as the Wildcats scored the go-ahead touchdown with 1:39 to play. OVC schools are 18-146-1 all-time against FBS foes. Last year the league snapped a 50-game losing streak to FBS opponents when Jacksonville State topped Ole Miss 49-48 in double overtime to begin the season. That victory was one of seven for Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) foes over FBS teams in 2010; so far six FCS teams have topped FBS teams in 2011 (Richmond beat Duke, Sacramento State beat Oregon State, Indiana State topped Western Kentucky, North Dakota State beat Minnesota, Southern Utah beat UNLV and Sam Houston State beat New Mexico).

Murray State's Brockman on Walter Payton Award Watch List: Murray State junior quarterback **Casey Brockman** is one of 20 candidates on the 2011 Walter Payton Award Watch list, released by The Sports Network and sponsored by Fathead.com. Brockman was on the preseason list as well as the updated list released on Oct. 4 for the award honoring the top offensive player in the FCS. The Walter Payton Award was established in 1987, will celebrate its 25th anniversary this season and is presented annually to the most outstanding college football player on the FCS level. When the award was established, it was the only such award to be presented to an individual player in FCS football. It has since been joined by the Buck Buchanan Award, which was established in 1995 and honors the outstanding defensive player in the FCS. The OVC has had one player previously win the Walter Payton Award, when Eastern Illinois quarterback Tony Romo took home the award in 2002 after passing for 2,950 yards and 33 touchdowns while leading the Panthers to a playoff berth. The Payton Award Watch List will undergo revision during the 2011 season. Ballots will be sent to a panel of about 200 sports information and media relations directors, broadcasters, writers and other dignitaries after the regular season on Nov. 21. Three finalists will be announced on Dec. 1 and invited to The Sports Network/Fathead FCS Awards Presentation.

EKU's Caldwell on Buck Buchanan Award Watch List: Eastern Kentucky senior cornerback **Jeremy Caldwell** is one of 20 candidates on the 2011 Buck Buchanan Award Watch List released by The Sports Network and sponsored by Fathead.com. Caldwell was on the preseason list as well as the updated list released on Oct. 4. The Buchanan Award is in its 17th season and will be presented to the FCS' outstanding defensive player at the national awards banquet Thursday night, Jan. 5 in Frisco, Texas. The OVC has never had a player win the Buchanan Award. The Buchanan Award Watch List will undergo revision during the 2011 season. Ballots will be sent to a panel of about 200 sports information and media relations directors, broadcasters, writers and other dignitaries after the regular season on Nov. 21. The Buck Buchanan award is named for Junious "Buck" Buchanan, the NAIA All-American and Pro Football Hall of Fame defensive lineman who played for Grambling State University from 1959 through 1962. Garlington Records Ninth 100-Yard Kick Return in OVC History: Tennessee State freshman **Weldon Garlington** returned a kickoff 100 yards for a touchdown on Oct. 1 at Austin Peay. It marked the ninth time in OVC history that a player had recorded a 100-yard kickoff return and first since the 2006 season. Overall Garlington's return was the third time a TSU player has accomplished that feat while a member of the OVC, as Avion Black did it twice in 1999.

Brockman Sets NCAA Record for Passing Yards and Total Yards in a Half: Murray State junior quarterback **Casey Brockman** had 422 passing yards in the first half of the Racers 58-27 victory over Tennessee State on Sept. 17. The 422 yards was the most in one half in Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) history, breaking the previous record of 383 passing yards held by Marshall's Michael Payton (done in the first half against VMI on Nov. 16, 1991) and 404 total yards held by Stephen F. Austin's Todd Hammel (done in the first half against Louisiana-Monroe on Nov. 11, 1989).

Brockman Etches Name in OVC Record Book: Murray State junior quarterback **Casey Brockman** continues to put his name all over the OVC record book. After setting two records a season ago, Brockman set two and tied another record against Tennessee State on Sept. 17. Brockman completed 45-of-67 passes for 600 yards and seven touchdowns in the victory. The 45 completions broke the previous record of 44 held by UT Martin's Brady Wahlberg (set against Jacksonville State in the 2003 season). The 600 yards broke the previous mark of 570 that Brockman set against Missouri State during the 2010 season. The seven passing touchdowns (five of which came in the first half) tied the OVC single-game record that Brockman set last year and that he shares with Morehead State's Chris Swartz (established in the 1990 season).

Murray State Sets Six OVC Single-Game Team Records: In Murray State's 58-27 victory over Tennessee State on Sept. 17, Murray State set OVC team single-game records for passing yards (630), touchdown passes (8), passes completed (48), passes attempted (73), first downs (37) and first downs by passing (30).

Three OVC Student-Athletes Named Semifinalist for William V. Campbell Trophy: Three Ohio Valley Conference football student-athletes - Austin Peay's **Nick Newsome**, Eastern Illinois' **Cory Leman** and Eastern Kentucky's **Emory Attig** - have been named semifinalist for the 2011 William V. Campbell Trophy (formerly known as the Draddy Trophy), endowed by HealthSouth. The semifinalists were announced by the National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame (NFF) and are part of the 2011 NFF National Scholar-Athlete Awards, presented by Fidelity Investments®, a leading provider of not-for-profit workplace retirement savings plans in higher education. The award honors the best and brightest from the college gridiron and is often called the "Academic Heisman." Overall there are 127 semifinalists for the award but Newsome, Leman and Attig are three of only 33 selected from the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS). Nominated by their schools, which are limited to one nominee each, candidates for the awards must be a senior or graduate student in their final year of eligibility, have a GPA of at least 3.2 on a 4.0 scale, have outstanding football ability as a first team player or significant contributor, and have demonstrated strong leadership and citizenship. The class is selected each year by the NFF Awards Committee, which is comprised of a nationally recognized group of media, College Football Hall of Famers and athletics administrators. The NFF Awards Committee will select up to 16 recipients, and the results will be announced via a national press release on Wednesday, October 26. Each recipient will receive an \$18,000 postgraduate scholarship, and they will vie as finalists for the 2011 William V. Campbell Trophy. Each member of the 2011 National Scholar-Athlete Class will also travel to New York City be honored December 6 during the 54th NFF Annual Awards Dinner at the Waldorf-Astoria where their accomplishments will be highlighted in front of one of the most powerful audiences in all of sports. One member of the class will also be announced live at the event as the winner of the Campbell Trophy.

Carr Named National Offensive Player of the Week (Oct. 10): UT Martin junior quarterback **Derek Carr** was named the National Co-Offensive Player of the Week by the Sports Network/Fathead.com as well as a National All-Star by the College Sporting News on Oct. 10 after completing 24-of-36 passing for 387 yards and a school record six touchdowns in a 61-23 victory over Austin Peay. Carr had touchdown passes of 51, 13, 16, 15, 10 and 9 yards to tie the record of six passing touchdowns set twice prior in Skyhawk history.

Jackson Named National Defensive Player of the Week (Oct. 3): Jacksonville State sophomore linebacker **Clarence Jackson** was named the National All-Star Defensive Player of the Week by the College Sporting News on Oct. 3 after his play in a road win over Murray State. Jackson had seven tackles, 2.0 tackles-for-loss, a sack for a loss to 12 yards, forced and recovered a fumble, three pass breakups and blocked a field goal in the win. Jackson was part of the Gamecock defense that held the Racers to just 11 rushing yards on 27 carries, the fewest yards allowed by the team to an OVC opponent since 2008.

Brockman Named National Player of the Week (Sept. 19): For the third time in his career Murray State junior quarterback **Casey Brockman** has been named National Player of the Week, doing so on Sept. 19 by both the Sports Network and the College Sporting News. The honors came after Brockman completed 45-of-67 passes for 600 yards and seven touchdowns and also caught a 15-yard touchdown pass in Murray State's 58-27 win over Tennessee State. The 45 completions and 600 yards were both OVC records and the seven passing touchdowns tied the OVC mark (already held by Brockman). The 600 passing yards was the fifth-most in Football

Vance Earns National All-Star Honor from College Sporting News (Sept. 12): Eastern Kentucky sophomore linebacker **Ichiro Vance** was named a National All-Star (National Defensive Player of the Week) by College Sporting News on Sept. 12 following his performance against Missouri State. Vance had a career-high 19 tackles, two tackles-for-loss and forced a fumble in the win. The 19 stops were the most tackles for an EKU player in a game since Bob Head had 21 against Eastern Illinois during the 1996 season. In the second quarter the sophomore forced a fumble at mid-field that led to the Colonels second touchdown of the game just four plays later (putting the team up 14-0).

The goal of CFPA is to provide the most scientifically rigorous conferments in college football. Recipients are selected exclusively based upon objective scientific rankings of the extent to which individual players increase the overall effectiveness of their teams.

Sandlin Earns Honors From College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) For Week No. 1: UT Martin kicker **Cody Sandlin** was named the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) National Placekicker of the Week for Week 1 after his performance against nationally-ranked Jacksonville State. Sandlin connected on field goals of 43, 25 and 45 yards in the Skyhawks 24-23 at No. 9 JSU. Sandlin was also a perfect 2-for-2 on extra points and accounted for 11 total points. In addition to Sandlin seven other OVC players earned honorable mention honors for the week. The goal of CFPA is to provide the most scientifically rigorous conferments in college football. Recipients are selected exclusively based upon objective scientific rankings of the extent to which individual players increase the overall effectiveness of their teams.

A Look at the Coaches: All nine head coaches from last season return to their schools in the Ohio Valley Conference this season. The Dean of OVC Coaches is Eastern Illinois coach **Bob Spoo** who is in his 25th and final season with the Panthers in 2011. Jacksonville State's **Jack Crowe** is the second longest tenured coach in the league (in his 12th season at JSU) while Murray State's **Chris Hatcher** and Tennessee State's **Rod Reed** have been at their schools the fewest years, as each are in their second seasons.

FCS Playoff Information: For the second time this season the NCAA Division I playoff field features 20 teams (the field was upped from 16 prior to the 2010 season, which was the first expansion since the field grew from 12 to 16 teams in 1997). The field will include 10 automatic bid teams and 10 at-large selections. The eight lowest-rated teams will play in the first round, while the 12-highest rated teams will receive a bye into the second round. For the second-straight year the championship game will be played in Frisco, Texas at Pizza Hut Park, a 23,500-seat multi-purpose stadium. The Southland Conference will serve as the host of the championship, which will be held on Saturday, Jan. 7.

Preseason Forecasts: For the third time in the past four seasons Jacksonville State University was picked the favorite in the Ohio Valley Conference football race. The Gamecocks picked up 13 of the 18 first-place votes in the 2011 poll which is a vote of league head coaches and sports information directors. Jacksonville State was one of three schools to receive at least one first-place vote in the poll and the Gamecocks received 123 total points, which was 17 points ahead of second-place Murray State. The Racers received four first-place votes and were tabbed second in the poll (106). Eastern Kentucky (93) was picked third and defending champion Southeast Missouri (81) was picked fourth and received the remaining first-place vote. The poll is rounded out by Tennessee Tech (73), UT Martin (64), Eastern Illinois (57), Tennessee State (33) and Austin Peay (18). Is being picked first in the preseason poll necessarily a good thing? In the past 33 years of preseason polls (all that were available), the preseason predicted champion has only gone on to win the OVC Championship 12 times (36.4%). Over the past eight years not once has the eventual champion been predicted in the preseason poll (it was last done correctly in 2002).

Murray State's Brockman, Jacksonville State's Lewis and Tennessee State's Council Headline Preseason All-OVC Team: Murray State junior quarterback **Casey Brockman** was named 2011 Ohio Valley Conference Preseason Offensive Player of the Year while Jacksonville State senior defensive lineman **Monte Lewis** and Tennessee State senior linebacker **Rico Council** were tabbed OVC Preseason Co-Defensive Players of the Year in a vote on by the league's head football coaches and sports information directors. Eastern Kentucky led the way with seven selections on the preseason team while Jacksonville State and Murray State had five players apiece on the squad. Each of the league's nine teams had at least one player on the preseason squad. Returning players who were first-team All-OVC selections last season (nine in total) were automatic selections to the preseason team this year. The squad also included 10 players who were second-team selections in 2010. Of the 31 total selections, 21 were seniors, seven were juniors and three were sophomores.

NFL Connections: As of the start of the 2011 season, 13 former Ohio Valley Conference players are on NFL rosters (11 active players, 2 practice squad members). Those players include former Eastern Illinois standout Tony Romo, a three-time Pro Bowl pick, Cortland Finnegan (Samford), who has been a Pro Bowl defensive back selection with the Tennessee Titans and Tennessee State's Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie, who was a starter for the Arizona Cardinals in Super Bowl XLIII, has been a Pro Bowl selection and is now in his first season with the Philadelphia Eagles. Seven of the nine current OVC football schools have at least one player in the NFL with Eastern Kentucky leading the way with three active players. Several NFL coaches also have connections to OVC schools, including two who went to Eastern Illinois, the "Cradle of NFL Head Coaches." Those coaches include Super Bowl champion Sean Payton (New Orleans) and Mike Shanahan (Washington). UT Martin graduate and former assistant coach Jerry Reese made waves in 2007 when he led the New York Giants to Super Bowl XLII in his first season as General Manager with the franchise.

I-AA No More: Although some people may accidentally still refer to it as I-AA football, the term that represents the level of Division I football in which the Ohio Valley Conference competes has been retired. Beginning with the 2006 National Championship game, the term Football Championship Subdivision (or FCS) is to be used. FCS is the only Division I football rank to host a NCAA-sponsored national championship (one of 89 championships the NCAA sponsors). The division formerly known as I-A was changed to Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and those teams compete for the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) national championship. Teams who play at the FCS level can offer a maximum of 63 scholarships (FBS teams can offer 85) and compete in a 20-team playoff at the end of the season to determine the national champion.

OVCsports.TV: For the sixth consecutive year, fans can watch every Conference matchup and all non-conference home contests at OVCsports.TV. The venture with NeuLion (formerly JumpTV Sports) allows fans to access live and on-demand streaming video and audio of all conference matchups on their home computer. The premium Web site was launched in July 2006 and streamed over a thousand events in its first five seasons, including all Conference matchups in football and men's and women's basketball as well as select baseball, soccer, softball and volleyball games and OVC Championship events. Packages are available on a yearly, seasonally, monthly or per-event basis.

SGT. YORK TROPHY

The 2011 season marks the fifth of competition for the Sergeant York Trophy, an award created by the Nashville Sports Council and the Ohio Valley Conference. The trophy is contested between the four OVC schools in the state of Tennessee - Austin Peay, Tennessee State, Tennessee Tech and UT Martin - and go to the team with the best combined record versus those schools in a given year.

In the event of a tie, the award will be shared; however, the previous winner will retain the trophy if they are part of the tie. If the tie is between two other institutions, the trophy will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy.

The award is only the second traveling trophy that involves more than two teams in college sports; the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy which has been contested between Air Force, Army and Navy annually since 1972. The award is named in honor of Alvin C. York, the most noted Soldier of World War I. Upon his return to the United States in 1919, he was bestowed the Congressional Medal of Honor. Following the war York returned his home in Pall Mall, Tenn. where he dedicated his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee.

The award will be presented annually at the Nashville Sports Council's Celebration of Champions (held in March of each year).

Tennessee State and Austin Peay shared the inaugural award after compiling 2-1 records in round robin play in 2007. Tennessee State took home the trophy, however, by winning the individual matchup with Austin Peay by one point in overtime. Tennessee State claimed the 2008 trophy after going 3-0 in Sgt. York games while Tennessee Tech won all three of its Sgt. York games to claim the 2009 trophy.

UT Martin made it three straight years with the winning team going 3-0, completing the perfect season in 2010 to win its first title. UTM's 9-5 record in Sgt. York games is the best of any team.

GAME NOTES: Saturday will mark the first game in the all-time series between Jacksonville State and Kentucky. It marks the 18th game all-time for Jax State against a Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponent. Last year the Gamecocks topped a SEC foe in their FBS matchup, beating Ole Miss 49-48 in double overtime. JSU is 1-2 all-time against teams from the SEC. Kentucky is 5-0 all-time against teams from the current alignment. The game marks the annual Homecoming contest for Kentucky.

SCOUTING JACKSONVILLE STATE: Jacksonville State won its fourth-straight game by going on the road to top Austin Peay 44-14 on Saturday. The win improved the Gamecocks to 4-0 in the OVC and the team is currently on top of the standings by themselves (after Tennessee Tech suffered a defeat on Saturday night). Junior running back Washaun Ealey had his third consecutive 100-plus yard rushing game as he ran for 124 yards and a touchdown on 18 carries. A year ago Ealey was playing at Georgia and ran for 157 yards and five touchdowns in a 44-31 victory over Kentucky on his way to CFP National Running Back of the Week honors. While Ealey led the offensive attack, it was the JSU defense that made the biggest difference, as the Gamecocks intercepted the Governors five times and help APSU to just 94 rushing yards. Jacksonville State returned those five interceptions a total of 119 yards, helping the team win the field position battle all night. The team's final two touchdowns of the game came on interceptions returns, as Ben Endress returned one with 3:37 to play in the game and Jamaal Johnson returned one 45 yards with 2:25 to go. Brooks Robinson picked up a fumble and returned it 31 yards for a score in the second quarter. In total Jax State scored 28 points in that second quarter, the most points by the team in a quarter since the 2004 season. Overall Jacksonville State is 49-7 when scoring 30 or more points under Jack Crowe. More importantly the team snapped a three-game losing streak coming off of bye weeks. Jacksonville State currently ranks 10th nationally in red zone offense (91%) and eighth nationally in fewest interceptions thrown (2). Jacksonville State is now ranked No. 8 in the FCS Coaches poll and No. 10 in the Sports Network/Fathead.com poll. The No. 8 ranking is the highest of the season for the Gamecocks (who were No. 9 in the preseason poll).

SCOUTING KENTUCKY: After playing three consecutive Top 25 opponents, Kentucky had a bye last week and now begins a three-game home stand. The Wildcats have struggled offensively this season, ranking 118th out of 120 FBS teams in total offense and scoring offense and 119th in pass efficiency. During the bye week the team learned that true freshman tailback Josh Clemons will miss the rest of the year with an injury; Clemons was leading the team in rushing (279 yards) when injured. The team's top rusher now is junior quarterback Morgan Newton. Defensively Danny Trevathan (72) and Winston Guy (67) rank first and second in the SEC in tackles. This season Trevathan became only the 18th player in Wildcat history to have 300 or more career tackles. UK does rank second nationally in fewest yards penalized (26.67 yards/game) and sixth in net punting (41.43 yards/punt). Punter Ryan Tydlacka ranks 17th nationally in punting.

GAME NOTES: Austin Peay will travel to Cape Girardeau for the 16th time on Saturday afternoon. Southeast Missouri leads the series by a 9-6 margin, although the series is been back-and-forth since the Governors re-joined the OVC prior to the 2007 season. Since then a different team has won every other year, with Southeast Missouri coming out of top last season 41-24. In that game Southeast found itself down 21-13 early in the third quarter, but scored 28 total second half points on its way to the win (and eventual OVC Championship). All-American running back Henry Harris ran for 152 yards and three touchdowns on his way to OVC Offensive Player of the Week honors. Quarterback Matt Scheible added 116 rushing yards and a touchdown to go with 80 passing yards. Austin Peay was led by Terrence Holt (81 yards, 1 TD) and Ryan White (79 yards, 1 TD) on the ground. Antwaun Majors had 17 tackles for APSU. Both teams enter this weekend's game with two-game losing streaks. It will be Homecoming at Southeast Missouri on Saturday.

SCOUTING AUSTIN PEAY: Austin Peay dropped a 44-14 decision to No. 10 Jacksonville State on Saturday night. APSU scored first and the game was tied early in the second quarter before JSU exploded for 28 points in the second quarter. The Govs did not help their own cause by throwing five interceptions (the most by a team in a game since 1999), two of which were returned for touchdowns, and fumbling on a ball that was scooped up and returned for a touchdown. Despite turning the ball over, Austin Peay also did a good job of taking the ball away, recovering three fumbles, the most in a game this season for the team. APSU had entered the game with just six turnovers gained for the entire season. Antwaun Majors and Amius Smith shared team-high tackle honors with 10 apiece. Devin Stark hauled in a 15-yard touchdown in the first quarter, marking his fifth touchdown of the season; that is the most since Lanis Frederick had seven in the 2006 season. Running back Ryan White had 68 rushing yards in the game and is now just 24 yards short of third place on the APSU career list.

SCOUTING SOUTHEAST MISSOURI: Southeast Missouri fell behind 20-0 at Eastern Kentucky and committed a season-high six turnovers and eventually lost 41-17. Despite the loss senior quarterback Matt Scheible had a great game, rushing for 75 yards and two touchdowns and passing for 174 yards. In doing so Scheible became the first player in OVC history to throw for 4,000 and rush for 2,000 yards in a career. Scheible now has 2,054 rushing yards and 4,101 passing yards for his career and is just 322 yards of total offense away from moving into the OVC career Top 10. Scheible did become Southeast's all-time leader in total offense in the contest. Redshirt freshman Spencer Davis accounted for 230 all-purpose yards on the night, making three catches for 116 yards, rushing for 21 yards and netting 93 yards on returns. Davis had an 82-yard reception in the game, marking the third-longest reception in school history. Davis currently leads the OVC and ranks 22nd nationally in all-purpose yards (144.2 yards/game). Junior Blake Peiffer had a game-high 16 tackles, marking his fifth double-digit tackles outing in six games this season. Peiffer currently ranks sixth nationally in tackles/game (12.33).

GAME NOTES: It will be Homecoming in Charleston, Ill. on Saturday as Eastern Illinois hosts UT Martin. The Panthers are searching for its first OVC victory of the season; overall the team has lost six-straight games since winning its season-opener against Illinois State. EIU leads the all-time series 12-4, but that series is tied 4-4 over the last eight years, with no team winning back-to-back games over that period. A season ago UT Martin won 20-10 at home in what was the OVC opener for both teams. UTM led 14-10 at halftime but the second half was a defensive battle as the only scores came from the foot of Cody Sandlin who connected on field goals from 31 and 26 yards to solidify the victory. The Skyhawks outgained the Panthers 402-222 in total offense and EIU was just 1-of-14 on third down during the game. Jason McNair ran for 130 yards and a touchdown while Tevin Barksdale ran for 75 yards and a score. Brandon Large passed for 138 yards and Erik Lora had 11 catches for 102 yards for the Panthers.

SCOUTING UT MARTIN: UT Martin traveled to South Alabama (a team in its third year of football on its way to the Football Bowl Subdivision) and came out on the short end of a 33-30 decision despite scoring the final 17 points of the game. It marks the third loss of the season for UTM, which have come by a combined seven total points. The Skyhawks trailed at halftime (16-7) for the first time this season and were down 33-13 at the end of the third quarter. But the Skyhawks offense came alive in the final quarter, as Cody Sandlin kicked a 38-yard field goal, Quentin Sims caught a 2-yard touchdown pass and DJ McNeil rushed for a one yard touchdown to trim the margin to just three points with eight seconds remaining. Sims, the transfer from Georgia Tech, caught six passes for 78 yards and three touchdowns. Stephen Shiver added seven receptions for 96 yards and threw a touchdown pass to Sims in the first quarter. Shiver now has 102 receptions and 1,618 receiving yards in his career; the 102 receptions are eighth most in UTM history while the 1,618 yards are seventh most. Ben Johnson led the Skyhawks with 11 tackles and forced a fumble; Johnson now ranks fourth nationally in forced fumbles on the season (0.60/game).

SCOUTING EASTERN ILLINOIS: Eastern Illinois nearly picked up its first OVC win of the season at Murray State on Saturday, leading 27-17 at the end of the third quarter and by three points until MSU took the lead with 1:28 to play. The Panthers defense had held Walter Payton Watch List quarterback Casey Brockman in check until the last drive when he led the team 75 yards in six yards to take the lead. Eastern would take over at its own 28-yard line with 1:21 to play, but fumbled on the first play and four plays later Murray State ran for a 24-yard score to ice the game. The Panthers offense played well in the contest, out-gaining the Racers 392-to-386 on the day. Jake Walker had 88 rushing yards and two scores while quarterback Jimmy Garoppolo passed for 247 yards and two scores. Five of those passes and both touchdowns went to Chris Wright, who had 130 receiving yards on the day. Wright now had seven touchdown catches this season and 17 for his career (ninth on the school's career list). Punter Scott Weatherford averaged 38.9 yards per punt and as he helped EIU limit one of the nation's best punt returners to only 30 yards on the day.

GAME NOTES: Eastern Kentucky welcomes Tennessee State to Roy Kidd Stadium on Saturday for its annual Homecoming game. The teams have played 23 times since 1982, although the squads did not play last year due to TSU's unbalanced OVC schedule. After winning only twice in the first 21 meetings in the series, Tennessee State has won each of the last two, winning 34-20 in 2008 and 20-17 in 2009. EKU entered that game ranked No. 16 in the country but TSU got on the board first as Eugene Clifford returned an interception 66 yards for a touchdown. Eastern Kentucky battled back and led 17-13 with 5:48 to play after C.J. Walker ran the ball in from eight yards out. But Tennessee State had one final drive left as the team went 59 yards in 10 plays as Preston Brown capped the drive with a 2-yard touchdown run with 1:34 to go. EKU would have one final shot but could not convert on fourth down at the TSU 36-yard line. The Colonels out-gained the Tigers 311-to-283 but threw two interceptions in the game. Preston Brown had two rushing touchdowns for TSU while CJ Walker had 73 yards and a score for EKU.

SCOUTING TENNESSEE STATE: After snapping a streak of not winning an OVC game since the end of the 2009 season last week, Tennessee State made it two wins in a row on Saturday, upsetting No. 19 Tennessee Tech 42-40 in a shootout in Cookeville. Despite being out-gained 462-to-398, TSU forced four turnovers on its way to the victory. Leading 28-20 at halftime, Tennessee State opened the second half with back-to-back touchdowns just 59 seconds apart, as the lead ballooned to 42-20. But TTU would fight back and score four times the rest of the game, including a touchdown with 15 seconds to go, but failed to get the on-side kick at the end of the game. Sophomore DB Antonio Harper was named OVC Defensive Player of the Week after registering an OVC single-game best this season with 4.0 tackles-for-loss and 2.5 sacks. His most crucial sack came in the fourth quarter with TTU in field goal range and went for a loss of six yards; on the next play Tech missed a 42-yard field goal (which would have been the difference in the game had it been good). Redshirt freshman quarterback Michael German earned his third-straight OVC Newcomer of the Week honors after completing 19-of-29 passes for 232 yards and two touchdowns and also rushing for a touchdown.

SCOUTING EASTERN KENTUCKY: After losing three of its first four games (all by close margins), Eastern Kentucky has rebounded by winning its last two games and the team is now 2-1 in OVC play, just one loss behind Jacksonville State in the loss column for first place. Last week the Colonels topped Southeast Missouri 41-17 to improve to 12-1 in OVC home games under head coach Dean Hood; the team has won seven-straight OVC games at Roy Kidd Stadium. For the third time this season EKU did not turn the ball over and for the third time this year the team won (the Colonels have eight turnovers in their three losses this year). The Eastern offense rushed for 244 yards on the night and the defense forced Southeast Missouri into a season-high six turnovers on the night. Matt Denham has his second 100-yard rushing game, rushing for 142 yards and two scores on a season-high 23 carries. It marked the first time since 2007 that a EKU player had 100 or more yards in back-to-back games. Quarterback T.J. Pryor added 72 yards on the ground to go with 99 yards and a touchdown through the air. Patrick McClellan had a team-high nine tackles and intercepted a pass at his team's own 8-yard line that ended a Southeast threat as they looked to cut the margin (once 20-0) to potentially just three points. Brooklyn Fox also picked off a pass, as did Kevin Hamlin who returned it 39 yards for the final touchdown of the game.
