THIS WEEK'S OVC HIGHLIGHTS/STORYLINES

No OVC team remained undefeated on the season as week No. 2 of the season saw Eastern Illinois, Jacksonville State and Tennessee State suffer its first losses of the year...Three OVC teams did win during the week as Tennessee Tech blew out Maryville College, Eastern Kentucky opened at home with a 28-24 victory over Missouri State and Murray State went on the road to shutout Mississippi Valley State 39-0...That was the first shutout for Murray State since the 2004 season and first shutout on the road since the 1996 campaign (a year the Racers won the OVC Championship)...Eastern Kentucky's Ichiro Vance recorded 19 tackles in his team's win, the second-highest output in the FCS this season (and third highest output in all of Division I when you factor in FBS schools)...Due to its loss Jacksonville State slipped to No. 16/17 in the FCS Top 25 polls this week; the Gamecocks have been ranked in the Top 25 for 33 consecutive weeks...Eastern Kentucky, Murray State, Eastern Illinois and UT Martin are the other schools receiving votes in the Top 25 polls...After three OVC teams had byes last week, all nine teams will be involved in games during week three...Included in that are two OVC matchups as Tennessee State will travel to Murray State and Tennessee Tech will play at Eastern Illinois...The week begins on Thursday when UT Martin plays its second Thursday night game of the year as they host Union College...Two OVC teams will play FBS squads as Austin Peay is at Memphis and Southeast Missouri is at Purdue...The other non-conference action includes Eastern Kentucky hosting nationally-ranked Chattanooga and Jacksonville State hosting Georgia State.

OFFENSIVE

Mike Harris, RB • Sr., 5-11, 200 • Tulsa, Okla. • Murray State

Harris rushed for 104 yards and two touchdowns as Murray State went on the road to top Mississippi Valley State 39-0 on Saturday. The effort marked his second 100-plus yard rushing game of the season and sixth in his 11-game career at Murray State. The senior scored on a 15-yard run in the first quarter to put his team up 9-0 and later added a 13-yard score in the third quarter which made the score 32-0. On the day Harris carried the ball 19 times and averaged 5.5 yards/carry. Harris currently ranks 14th nationally with a 110.0 rushing yards/game average.

DEFENSIVE

Ichiro Vance, LB • So., 6-1, 234 • LaGrange, Ky. • Eastern Kentucky

Vance had a career-high 19 tackles, two tackles-for-loss and forced a fumble in Eastern Kentucky's 28-24 home-opening victory over Missouri State on Saturday. The 19 tackles (9 of which were solo) are the second-highest output in the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) this season and third-highest output in all of Division I (FBS and FCS combined). They were the most tackles for an EKVU player in a game since Bob Head had 21 against Eastern Illinois during the 1996 season. In the second quarter the sophomore forced a fumble at mid-field that led to the Colonels second touchdown of the game just four plays later (putting the team up 14-0). Vance currently ranks fifth nationally in tackles/game (13.00).

CO-SPECIALIST

Jeremy Caldwell, KR • Sr., 5-10, 180 • Chattanooga, Tenn. • Eastern Kentucky

After Missouri State had cut Eastern Kentucky's advantage from 14-0 to 14-10 in the fourth quarter, Caldwell took the ensuing kickoff and raced 88 yards for a touchdown. It marked Caldwell's third kickoff for a touchdown in his collegiate career. Overall Caldwell averaged 32.0 yards/kickoff on three attempts during the game and had 101 all-purpose yards on the night. On the season he ranks 18th nationally in kickoff returns (29.0 yards/return). The Buck Buchanan Award nominee also had a tackle and recovered a fumble that he returned 23 yards to set up an EKVU score.

CO-SPECIALIST

Travis James, KR/WR • Jr., 5-11, 175 • Ft. Lauderdale, Fla. • Tennessee State

James returned four kickoffs for 111 yards (27.75 yards/return) with a long of 66 in Tennessee State's 35-29 loss to Jackson State in the Liberty Bowl on Saturday. James also caught three passes for 116 yards and a touchdown (a 54-yarder in the first quarter) to account for his 227 all-purpose yards on just seven total touches. The 227 all-purpose yards is the fifth-most in a FCS game this season.

NEWCOMER

Jeremiah Williams, RB • Jr., 5-11, 199 • Dallas, Texas • Eastern Kentucky

Williams, a transfer from Trinity Valley Community College, ran for 119 yards and two touchdowns as Eastern Kentucky topped Missouri State 28-24 in its home opener on Saturday. Williams had 24 carries and averaged 5.0 yards/carry and also caught a pass for nine yards. The junior scored on a seven-yard run in the second quarter to extend the Colonels' advantage to 14-0 and added his second touchdown on a 12-yard run with 3:55 to play in the game to solidify the victory.

NOTES FROM AROUND THE GRIDIRON

OVC Teams Versus FBS Foes: In the first two weeks of the season five OVC schools have squared off in games against teams from the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS); overall OVC schools will play 10 games against FBS teams during the 2011 season. Despite going 0-5 in those games, the closest game involved Eastern Kentucky losing 10-7 at Kansas State as the Wildcats scored the go-ahead touchdown with 1:39 to play. OVC schools are 18-144-1 all-time against FBS foes. Last year the league snapped a 50-game losing streak to FBS opponents when Jacksonville State topped Ole Miss 49-48 in double overtime to begin the season. That victory was one of seven for Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) foes over FBS teams in 2010; so far two FCS teams have topped FBS teams in 2011 (Richmond beat Duke and Sacramento State beat Oregon State).

Caldwell Earns Honors From College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) For Week No. 2: Eastern Kentucky kick returner **Jeremy Caldwell** was named the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) National Kick Returner of the Week for Week 2 after his performance against Missouri State. Caldwell returned a kickoff 88 yards for a touchdown to give ECU an 11-point lead. In addition to Caldwell five other OVC players earned honorable mention honors for the week. The goal of CFPA is to provide the most scientifically rigorous conferments in college football. Recipients are selected exclusively based upon objective scientific rankings of the extent to which individual players increase the overall effectiveness of their teams.

NCAA Stats Leaders: In the latest set of NCAA statistical leaders, Eastern Illinois senior **Lawrence Ricks** is fourth nationally in all-purpose yards (198.5/game) while Southeast Missouri State's **Spencer Davis** is fifth (188.0/game). Tennessee Tech senior running back **Dontey Gay** ranks fourth in rushing yards (131.5 yards/game) while UT Martin quarterback **Derek Carr** is fifth in total offense (325.0 yards/game) and seventh in passing yards (325). UT Martin kicker **Cody Sandlin** ranks fifth nationally in field goals (3.00/game) while his teammate **Taino Perez** is first nationally in fumbles recovered (1.00/game). EIU senior defensive back **Nick Martinez** is second in interceptions (1.0/game), Eastern Kentucky sophomore **Ichiro Vance** is fifth nationally in tackles (13.0/game) and Tennessee State senior linebacker **Rico Council** is eighth in sacks (1.5/game) and third in tackles-for-loss (2.5/game). In the team rankings Tennessee Tech is eighth nationally in rushing (241.0 yards/game) while UT Martin is eighth in total offense (475.0 yards/game) and ninth in passing offense (325.0 yards/game). Murray State ranks fifth in scoring defense (10.5 points/game), Eastern Kentucky is fifth in net punting (41.14 yards/game) and Tennessee State is fourth in turnover margin (+2.50/game).

OVC Teams in Top 25: Currently only one OVC team is ranked in the two major FCS polls, as Jacksonville State comes in at No. 16 in the FCS Coaches poll and No. 17 in the Sports Network/Fathead.com poll. Four of the eight other OVC schools received votes in the polls, including Eastern Kentucky, Murray State, Eastern Illinois and UT Martin. Jacksonville State has now been ranked in the Top 25 for 33 consecutive weeks.

Spoo Tied for Fourth All-Time in OVC Wins; Will Retire After 2011 Season: With a victory over Tennessee State on Nov. 6 of last season, Eastern Illinois head coach **Bob Spoo** moved into a tie for fourth place on the OVC all-time career Conference victory list. Spoo has now won 67 OVC games in his tenure at EIU, which has spanned the school's entire time in the OVC (1996 through the present, although he was not on the sidelines for the 2006 season). Spoo trails only Roy Kidd (207 OVC wins at ECU), Boots Donnelly (102 wins at Austin Peay and Middle Tennessee) and Charles Murphy (73 wins at Middle Tennessee) on the all-time list and he is currently tied with Jimmy Feix (67 wins at Western Kentucky). In all games as head coach since Eastern Illinois joined the OVC in 1996, Spoo has registered 91 victories, fifth-most in league history. Following the end of the 2010 season, Spoo announced he would retire at the conclusion of the 2011 season, which will be his 25th as the Panthers head coach.

Murray State's Brockman on Walter Payton Award Watch List: Murray State junior quarterback **Casey Brockman** is one of 20 candidates on the 2011 Walter Payton Award Preseason Watch list, released by The Sports Network and sponsored by Fathead.com. Brockman is one of 12 quarterbacks on the initial list honoring the top offensive player in the FCS. The Walter Payton Award was established in 1987, will celebrate its 25th anniversary this season and is presented annually to the most outstanding college football player on the FCS level. When the award was established, it was the only such award to be presented to an individual player in FCS football. It has since been joined by the Buck

The OVC has had one player previously win the Walter Payton Award, when Eastern Illinois quarterback Tony Romo took home the award in 2002 after passing for 2,950 yards and 33 touchdowns while leading the Panthers to a playoff berth. The Payton Award Watch List will undergo revision during the 2011 season. Ballots will be sent to a panel of about 200 sports information and media relations directors, broadcasters, writers and other dignitaries after the regular season on Nov. 21. Three finalists will be announced on Dec. 1 and invited to The Sports Network/Fathead FCS Awards Presentation.

EKU's Caldwell on Buck Buchanan Award Watch List: Eastern Kentucky senior cornerback **Jeremy Caldwell** is one of 20 candidates on the 2011 Buck Buchanan Award Preseason Watch List released by The Sports Network and sponsored by Fathead.com. Caldwell is one of six senior defensive backs named to the list (five of which are cornerbacks). The Buchanan Award is in its 17th season and will be presented to the FCS' outstanding defensive player at the national awards banquet Thursday night, Jan. 5 in Frisco, Texas. The OVC has never had a player win the Buchanan Award. The Buchanan Award Watch List will undergo revision during the 2011 season. Ballots will be sent to a panel of about 200 sports information and media relations directors, broadcasters, writers and other dignitaries after the regular season on Nov. 21. The Buck Buchanan award is named for Junious "Buck" Buchanan, the NAIA All-American and Pro Football Hall of Fame defensive lineman who played for Grambling State University from 1959 through 1962. As a freshman, Buchanan came to Grambling on an "if" scholarship, to receive financial help if he played well. After a season of playing both varsity basketball and football, Buchanan decided to concentrate solely on football. By the time he finished four years at Grambling, his coach, Eddie Robinson, asserted that Buchanan was "... the finest tackle I have ever seen."

Sgt. York Trophy Enters Fifth Season in 2011: The Sgt. York Trophy is a challenge trophy which goes to the annual winner of the quadrangular season series between the four OVC institutions in the state of Tennessee (Austin Peay, Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech and UT Martin). In July 2007, the Nashville Sports Council and the Ohio Valley Conference announced the creation of the trophy, which is only the second traveling trophy involving more than two schools nationwide (the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy). It is named after Sgt. Alvin C. York, a native of Pall Mall, Tenn. and a Soldier who was one of the most honored of World War I. He received the Congressional Medal of Honor after the war and returned to his home state to dedicate his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee. The trophy goes to the team with the best record against the other schools, and in case of a tie there will be co-champions and the actual trophy will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy. In 2007 Tennessee State and Austin Peay finished in a tie for the trophy with identical 2-1 records; both shared the award but Tennessee State went home with the hardware due to a 1-point win in the head-to-head meeting during the season. Tennessee State went 3-0 in Sgt. York play in 2008 to claim its second trophy. In 2009 Tennessee Tech claimed the trophy after going undefeated in Sgt. York games and a year ago UT Martin became the third-straight OVC team to go 3-0 and win the trophy in claiming its first title.

EKU's McClellan Earns National All-Star Honor from College Sporting News (Sept. 5): Eastern Kentucky senior **Patrick McClellan** earned National Defensive All-Star (National Player of the Week) honors from the College Sporting News on Sept. 5 for his performance

in EKU's near upset of FBS foe Kansas State. He was part of a defensive unit that forced five Kansas State turnovers and held them to their lowest point total in more than a year as EKU lost 10-7 in the final two minutes of the game. The senior forced two fumbles and recovered one in the third quarter that he returned 18 yards to the 1-yard line which set up EKU's lone touchdown of the night (and the first score of the game by either team). McClellan also had seven tackles (six solo) and 1.5 tackles-for-loss.

Sandlin Earns Honors From College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) For Week No. 1: UT Martin kicker **Cody Sandlin** was named the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) National Placekicker of the Week for Week 1 after his performance against nationally-ranked Jacksonville State. Sandlin connected on field goals of 43, 25 and 45 yards in the Skyhawks 24-23 at No. 9 JSU. Sandlin was also a perfect 2-for-2 on extra points and accounted for 11 total points. In addition to Sandlin seven other OVC players earned honorable mention honors for the week. The goal of CFPA is to provide the most scientifically rigorous conferments in college football. Recipients are selected exclusively based upon objective scientific rankings of the extent to which individual players increase the overall effectiveness of their teams.

A Look at the Coaches: All nine head coaches from last season return to their schools in the Ohio Valley Conference this season. The Dean of OVC Coaches is Eastern Illinois coach **Bob Spoo** who is in his 25th and final season with the Panthers in 2011. Jacksonville State's **Jack Crowe** is the second longest tenured coach in the league (in his 12th season at JSU) while Murray State's **Chris Hatcher** and Tennessee State's **Rod Reed** have been at their schools the fewest years, as each are in their second seasons.

FCS Playoff Information: For the first second time this season the NCAA Division I playoff field features 20 teams (the field was upped from 16 prior to the 2010 season, which was the first expansion since the field grew from 12 to 16 teams in 1997). The field will include 10 automatic bid teams and 10 at-large selections. The eight lowest-rated teams will play in the first round, while the 12-highest rated teams will receive a bye into the second round. For the second-straight year the championship game will be played in Frisco, Texas at Pizza Hut Park, a 23,500-seat multi-purpose stadium. The Southland Conference will serve as the host of the championship, which will be held on Saturday, Jan. 7.

Preseason Forecasts: For the third time in the past four seasons Jacksonville State University was picked the favorite in the Ohio Valley Conference football race. The Gamecocks picked up 13 of the 18 first-place votes in the 2011 poll which is a vote of league head coaches and sports information directors. Jacksonville State was one of three schools to receive at least one first-place vote in the poll and the Gamecocks received 123 total points, which was 17 points ahead of second-place Murray State. The Racers received four first-place votes and were tabbed second in the poll (106). Eastern Kentucky (93) was picked third and defending champion Southeast Missouri (81) was picked fourth and received the remaining first-place vote. The poll is rounded out by Tennessee Tech (73), UT Martin (64), Eastern Illinois (57), Tennessee State (33) and Austin Peay (18). Is being picked first in the preseason poll necessarily a good thing? In the past 33 years of preseason polls (all that were available), the preseason predicted champion has only gone on to win the OVC Championship 12 times (36.4%). Over the past eight years not once has the eventual champion been predicted in the preseason poll (it was last done correctly in 2002).

a vote on by the league's head football coaches and sports information directors. Eastern Kentucky led the way with seven selections on the preseason team while Jacksonville State and Murray State had five players apiece on the squad. Each of the league's nine teams had at least one player on the preseason squad. Returning players who were first-team All-OVC selections last season (nine in total) were automatic selections to the preseason team this year. The squad also included 10 players who were second-team selections in 2010. Of the 31 total selections, 21 were seniors, seven were juniors and three were sophomores.

NFL Connections: As of the start of the 2011 season, 13 former Ohio Valley Conference players are on NFL rosters (11 active players, 2 practice squad members). Those players include former Eastern Illinois standout Tony Romo, a three-time Pro Bowl pick, Cortland Finnegan (Samford), who has been a Pro Bowl defensive back selection with the Tennessee Titans and Tennessee State's Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie, who was a starter for the Arizona Cardinals in Super Bowl XLIII, has been a Pro Bowl selection and is now in his first season with the Philadelphia Eagles. Seven of the nine current OVC football schools have at least one player in the NFL with Eastern Kentucky leading the way with three active players. Several NFL coaches also have connections to OVC schools, including two who went to Eastern Illinois, the "Cradle of NFL Head Coaches." Those coaches include Super Bowl champion Sean Payton (New Orleans) and Mike Shanahan (Washington). UT Martin graduate and former assistant coach Jerry Reese made waves in 2007 when he led the New York Giants to Super Bowl XLII in his first season as General Manager with the franchise.

I-AA No More: Although some people may accidentally still refer to it as I-AA football, the term that represents the level of Division I football in which the Ohio Valley Conference competes has been retired. Beginning with the 2006 National Championship game, the term Football Championship Subdivision (or FCS) is to be used. FCS is the only Division I football rank to host a NCAA-sponsored national championship (one of 89 championships the NCAA sponsors). The division formerly known as I-A was changed to Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and those teams compete for the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) national championship. Teams who play at the FCS level can offer a maximum of 63 scholarships (FBS teams can offer 85) and compete in a 20-team playoff at the end of the season to determine the national champion.

OVCsports.TV: For the sixth consecutive year, fans can watch every Conference matchup and all non-conference home contests at OVCsports.TV. The venture with NeuLion (formerly JumpTV Sports) allows fans to access live and on-demand streaming video and audio of all conference matchups on their home computer. The premium Web site was launched in July 2006 and streamed over a thousand events in its first five seasons, including all Conference matchups in football and men's and women's basketball as well as select baseball, soccer, softball and volleyball games and OVC Championship events. Packages are available on a yearly, seasonally, monthly or per-event basis.

SGT. YORK TROPHY

The 2011 season marks the fifth of competition for the Sergeant York Trophy, an award created by the Nashville Sports Council and the Ohio Valley Conference. The trophy is contested between the four OVC schools in the state of Tennessee - Austin Peay, Tennessee State, Tennessee Tech and UT Martin - and go to the team with the best combined record versus those schools in a given year.

In the event of a tie, the award will be shared; however, the previous winner will retain the trophy if they are part of the tie. If the tie is between two other institutions, the trophy will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy.

The award is only the second traveling trophy that involves more than two teams in college sports; the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy which has been contested between Air Force, Army and Navy annually since 1972. The award is named in honor of Alvin C. York, the most noted Soldier of World War I. Upon his return to the United States in 1919, he was bestowed the Congressional Medal of Honor. Following the war York returned his home in Pall Mall, Tenn. where he dedicated his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee.

The award will be presented annually at the Nashville Sports Council's Celebration of Champions (held in March of each year).

Tennessee State and Austin Peay shared the inaugural award after compiling 2-1 records in round robin play in 2007. Tennessee State took home the trophy, however, by winning the individual matchup with Austin Peay by one point in overtime. Tennessee State claimed the 2008 trophy after going 3-0 in Sgt. York games while Tennessee Tech won all three of its Sgt. York games to claim the 2009 trophy.

UT Martin made it three straight years with the winning team going 3-0, completing the perfect season in 2010 to win its first title. UTM's 8-4 record in Sgt. York games is the best of any team.

GAME NOTES: Coming off a bye week UT Martin will open the home portion of its schedule on Thursday night when Union (Ky.) College comes to Graham Stadium. It marks the second game in a row the Skyhawks have played on a Thursday night; UTM will also play on Thursday night next week (Sept. 22) as well. It will be the first-ever meeting between the two teams.

SCOUTING UNION COLLEGE: Union College is a NAIA school located in Barbourville, Ky. The Bulldogs opened their home season on Saturday by shutting out Kentucky Christian 27-0. That victory followed a 30-14 loss to Campbellsville to open the season. In the win over KCU junior running back Rob Brown rushed for 117 yards and two touchdowns on just 15 total carries. In the process Brown moved to 10th place on the school's career rushing list (1,145 yards). While Brown was putting up good numbers on offense, the Bulldogs defense limited Kentucky Christian to 158 yards of total offense, most of which came in the final quarter of play (after three quarters KCU had just 44 yards of offense). Union quarterback Ryan Moses passed for 119 yards and a touchdown, as Demetrius Hicks caught three of those passes for 73 yards and a score.

SCOUTING UT MARTIN: UT Martin opened the season two weeks ago against OVC foe Jacksonville State (ranked No. 9 at the time). The Skyhawks got off to a quick start in leading 10-0 early in the second quarter. UTM would eventually lead 23-10 with 14:11 to play in the game, only to see Jacksonville State score 14 unanswered points (the last coming with 38 seconds to go) to pull off the 24-23 victory. The Skyhawks had one last shot to win the game, but the clock ran out on a pass play before the team could attempt a potential game-winning field goal. Junior quarterback Derek Carr completed 23-of-36 passes for 325 yards and a touchdown in the loss. On the ground Jason McNair ran for 85 yards including a long run of 60 yards in the first half. Kicker Cody Sandlin connected on field goals of 25, 43 and 45 yards and making both of his extra point attempts. For his efforts Sandlin was named FCS National Placekicker of the Week by the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA). Georgia Tech transfer Quentin Sims pulled in three passes for 60 yards in his UT Martin debut. The JSU defense limited JSU to 10 yards of total offense in the first quarter of the game. Junior Julius McNair had five tackles and a sack to lead the defense. UT Martin has two players who lead statistical categories among all FCS players as Sandlin is first in field goals made/game (3.0) and Taino Perez is first in fumbles recovered/game (1.0).

GAME NOTES: After its bye week, Southeast Missouri State will travel to Purdue for its first-ever matchup with Purdue and first game with a Big Ten opponent. Southeast Missouri is 1-15 all-time against Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponents (since the division split in 1978); the team's lone win came against Middle Tennessee State in the 2002 season. Southeast Missouri is 1-3 in games following its bye week under head coach Tony Samuel. Purdue is coming off a 24-22 loss at Rice. Southeast Missouri head coach Tony Samuel spent the 2005 season as defensive ends coach at Purdue prior to accepting the Redhawks head coaching job. Purdue head coach Danny Hope was the head coach at Eastern Kentucky for five years, compiling an OVC mark of 32-8; he was 4-1 in games against Southeast Missouri during his tenure in the OVC.

SCOUTING SOUTHEAST MISSOURI: Southeast Missouri opened the 2011 season against No. 17 Southern Illinois in a game played in front of a sellout crowd (10,136 fans) at Houck Stadium. The Redhawks lost that game 38-10 and were idle this past week. In the loss to SIU, senior quarterback Matt Scheible rushed for a game-high 91 yards and passed for 144 yards and a touchdown. Scheible is now just 281 yards away from reaching 2,000 rushing yards for his career which would make him one of only seven players in Southeast history to achieve that feat. The senior also needs just 474 passing yards to reach 4,000 for his career. Scheible tossed his 25th career touchdown in the Southern Illinois game, moving him into sixth place on the school's career list. Junior linebacker Blake Peiffer recorded a career-high 12 tackles in the loss to SIU; he also added a forced fumble in the loss. Senior linebacker Philip Klaproth inched closer to the 200 career tackles mark in the opening game of the season and is now just 13 tackles away.

SCOUTING PURDUE: Purdue opened its season with a 27-24 victory over Middle Tennessee before losing 24-22 at Rice this past weekend. After blocking a field goal in the season-opener to secure the victory over MTSU, they Boilermakers were on the other end of the block this past Saturday as Rice blocked a 31-yard field goal attempt as time expired to snap its 10-year losing streak to teams from Bowl Championship Subdivision (BCS) conferences. Purdue had taken a 17-10 lead late in the second quarter only to see Rice tie the game as time expired in the first half; Rice would then score early in the third quarter and would not trail again. Purdue rushed for 183 yards in the game as Akeem Sanders had 69 yards on 11 carries while quarterback Caleb TerBush ran for 68 yards and a score in addition to his 183 passing yards and a score. For the season TerBush has completed 57.8 percent of his passes for 403 yards and three touchdowns and rushed for 111 yards. Defensively senior linebacker Joe Holland has 24 tackles through two games.

GAME NOTES: Jacksonville State and Georgia State are playing for the second-straight season in 2011. The Panthers had their inaugural season of football a year ago and are under the direction of legendary head coach Bill Curry. Last year's meeting at the Georgia Dome was full of excitement and had to go into overtime before JSU came away with a 34-27 victory. The game was back-and-forth the entire way as no team led by more than seven points any time during the contest. After falling behind 7-3, Jacksonville State scored early in the second quarter and would not trail again, although the game would be tied three more times. Georgia State was able to force overtime after scoring with 3:57 to play in the game. In overtime Jax State needed just four rushing plays to score, as Marques Ivory ran it in from four yards out. On defense the Gamecocks forced a 4th-and-goal from the two-yard line and GSU's final pass was ruled out-of-bounds, giving JSU the win. Ivory finished the game 24-of-32 for 283 yards and a touchdown to go along with 21 rushing yards and his game-winning score. Drew Little passed for 227 yards for the Panthers in that loss.

SCOUTING GEORGIA STATE: Georgia State is playing its last season as a FCS Independent before joining the CAA in 2012. The Panthers topped Clark Atlanta 41-7 in the home opener before falling to future CAA rival Old Dominion 40-17 on Saturday. Travis Evans had 62 rushing yards and a touchdown for GSU while Bo Schlechter completed 9-of-27 passes for 147 yards in split time with Little (6-of-17, 59 yards) at quarterback. Schlechter shares some of his team's punting duties as does Jacksonville State starting quarterback Coty Blanchard. Dexter Moody led the way with 12 total tackles.

SCOUTING JACKSONVILLE STATE: Jacksonville State entered last week ranked No. 10 nationally but lost 38-17 at No. 23 Chattanooga in its first road game of the season. The Gamecocks fell behind 7-0 in the game before responding with 14-straight points as Washaun Ealey and Calvin Middleton (who now has eight rushing scores in his last eight games) had touchdown runs in the first quarter. With the game tied at 17 with just under five minutes to play in the second quarter, Chattanooga marched down the field, needing only four plays to go 73 yards and score to push its advantage to 23-17 at halftime. That marked the first of three unanswered scores for the Mocs who would score 14 points in the second half on its way to the victory, its first for JSU in its last five attempts. Jacksonville State's offense was stymied in the second half as the Gamecocks managed just 17 total yards and one first down after halftime and finished the game with 224 total yards, its lowest output since playing Mississippi State in the 2006 season. At the same time the JSU defense allowed UTC to rack up 508 yards of total offense, the most allowed by the Gamecocks since Furman had 521 yards in a game in Nov. 2004. Ealey had 49 rushing yards and nine receiving yards for JSU. Sophomore quarterback Coty Blanchard finished the game with 164 yards passing, completing 13-of-23 passes. Rashad Smith had eight solo tackles to lead the Gamecocks for the second-straight week; Smith is currently averaging 8.5 tackles/game which is 10th in the OVC. After the loss JSU slipped from No. 10 in both FCS polls and are now No. 16 in the FCS Coaches poll and No. 17 in the Sports Network/Fathead.com poll.

GAME NOTES: Eastern Kentucky will entertain Chattanooga on Saturday night in Richmond. It marks the second-straight season the two teams have played and the sixth time overall. It marks the first meeting in Richmond since the 1986 season (a 23-3 ECU victory). Through five meetings the series is all square at 2-2-1, although UTC has won two in a row including 42-24 a year ago in Chattanooga. In that game the Mocs led 28-9 at halftime on its way to the 18-point victory. ECU was limited to just 58 net yards of rushing on the night but did gain 236 yards through the air as quarterback T.J. Pryor completed 27 passes and tossed two touchdowns. UTC quarterback B.J. Coleman completed 24-of-32 passes for 375 yards and four touchdowns and Errol Wynn rushed for 122 yards and a score as the Mocs high-octane offense out-gained the Colonels 548-294. Saturday marks the second-straight week the Mocs have played a team from the OVC. Eastern Kentucky has a seven-game winning streak dating back to the 2009 season (the team's last home loss was 24-7 to Western Carolina on Nov. 14).

SCOUTING CHATTANOOGA: Through two weeks of the 2011 season the Mocs have played two nationally-ranked teams, opening the season at Nebraska (No. 10 in the FBS) and last week playing Jacksonville State (No. 10 in the FCS). After losing 40-7 at Nebraska, Chattanooga rolled up 508 yards of offense against the Gamecocks (the first team in six years to have that many yards against JSU) in a 38-17 victory. The Mocs defense was extra tough in the second half, limiting Jacksonville State to just 17 yards and one first down after halftime. B.J. Coleman completed 23-of-33 passes for 296 yards and two touchdowns and Joe Bradford caught 15 of those passes, racking up 162 yards and a score on his way to Southern Conference Offensive Player of the Week honors. Sophomore linebacker Wes Dothard was named Southern Conference Defensive Player of the Week after netting five tackles, a forced fumble, a pass break-up and intercepting a pass in the fourth quarter that he returned 30 yards for a touchdown. After the win UTC jumped from No. 23 to No. 14 in the Sports Network Top 25 poll.

SCOUTING EASTERN KENTUCKY: After taking FBS foe Kansas State to the limit in week one, Eastern Kentucky returned home this past weekend and topped Missouri State 28-24. The Colonels got off to a hot start and led 14-0 at halftime. After the Bears had cut the lead to 14-10 in the third quarter, senior Jeremy Caldwell took the ensuing kickoff 88 yards for a touchdown. That output earned Caldwell OVC Co-Specialist of the Week honors. Offensively Jeremiah Williams led the team with 119 rushing yards and two touchdowns on his way to OVC Newcomer of the Week honors. Williams scored in the second quarter and then added a score with 3:55 to play in the game to secure the victory. After missing the first game of the season due to injury, quarterback T.J. Pryor saw his first action of the season and completed 14-of-22 passes for 146 yards and a score and rushing for 69 yards. On defense sophomore Ichiro Vance had his best day as a Colonel, netting 19 tackles (9 solo) and forcing a fumble at mid-field that led to an ECU touchdown four plays later. The 19 stops are the second-most by a FCS player this season and the third-most among all Division I players (FBS and FCS combined). They were the most tackles by an ECU player since Bob Head had 21 against Eastern Illinois in 1996. Vance earned OVC Defensive Player of the Week honors for his outstanding performance. ECU won despite being out-gained 411 to 391 by Missouri State.

GAME NOTES: Murray State and Tennessee State will play for the 23rd time on Saturday evening. The team's first started playing in the 1988 season when the Tigers joined the OVC. The all-time series is currently tied at 11. Murray State has won three in a row, and four of the last six, against Tennessee State. Last season the two teams played the final game of the season in Murray, and the Racers came away with a 28-23 victory. Murray State quarterback Casey Brockman completed 22-of-33 passes for 300 yards and a touchdown and carried the ball 13 times for 112 yards and two additional scores on his way to OVC Offensive Player of the Week honors. TSU signal caller Jeremy Perry completed 23-of-41 passes for 289 yards and three scores and Terrance Wright rushed for 133 yards. Tennessee State is looking to break a seven-game losing streak in OVC action; the Tigers were winless in the OVC last season and last won an OVC game in the last week of the 2009 season when they went on the road to top nationally-ranked Eastern Illinois.

SCOUTING TENNESSEE STATE: Tennessee State suffered its first loss of the season on Saturday, falling 35-29 against Jackson State in a game played in front of 43,532 fans at the Liberty Bowl in Memphis. Tennessee State had a 24-21 lead at halftime but managed just a safety and a field goal in the second half as JSU scored a pair of touchdowns. After rushing for 342 yards and compiling 512 total yards of offense the opening weekend, TSU was limited to just 78 rushing yards and 304 yards of total offense against Jackson State. Quarterback Jeremy Perry had 226 passing yards for two touchdowns, as three of his passes went to Travis James who had 115 yards receiving and a score. James also had 111 yards in kickoff returns to account for 226 all-purpose yards on the night, the fifth-highest output in the FCS on the season. For his efforts James was named OVC Co-Specialist of the Week. Senior linebacker Rico Council had 11 tackles (7 solo), 2.0 tackles-for-loss, a sack and forced a fumble. Council is averaging 10.0 tackles/game this season, which ranks fourth in the league. As a team TSU is fourth nationally in turnover margin (+2.5/game).

SCOUTING MURRAY STATE: Murray State went on the road last week and toppled Mississippi Valley State, winning 39-0 to record its first shutout since the 2004 season (38-0 vs. UT Martin). Overall it was the first road shutout for the team since the 1996 season (when the Racers won the OVC Championship) when they beat rival Southeast Missouri 16-0. Senior running back Mike Harris was named OVC Offensive Player of the Week after rushing for 104 yards and two touchdowns in the win. Harris reached the 100-yard plateau for the second-straight week and for the sixth time in 11 career games at Murray State. Harris currently ranks 14th nationally with a 110.0 rushing yards/game average. Overall the Racers rushed for 189 yards as Duane Brady had five carries for 50 yards and Tyler Lavea rushed three times for 34 yards. After struggling to open the season at Louisville, Brockman completed 21-of-33 passes for 238 yards and a score. Sophomore defensive back Brandon Wicks had six tackles, intercepted a pass and blocked a punt that was recovered by a teammate for a touchdown. Junior newcomer Sam Small had 10 tackles, three tackles-for-loss and a sack for MSU. That Murray State defensive unit limited the Delta Devils to just 59 yards rushing and 3-of-13 on third downs.

GAME NOTES: Austin Peay will travel to Memphis to battle the in-state Tigers for the first time since the 1957 season on Saturday. The two teams have met annually on the basketball court but have only played six times on the gridiron and not in 44 years. Dating back to last season Austin Peay is trying to snap a nine-game losing streak.

SCOUTING AUSTIN PEAY: Austin Peay is opening the season with games against two Football Championship Subdivision (FBS) teams. The Governors lost at Cincinnati the opening weekend and had a bye week last week before playing Memphis this weekend. The Govs are 2-12 all-time against FBS foes as a member of the OVC (2-14 all-time). In the team's 72-10 loss to Cincinnati to open the season, Ryan White and Wesley Kitts each ended up with 65 yards rushing while Kitts found the end zone for APSU's lone touchdown of the game. Quarterback Jake Ryan completed 16-of-23 passes for 149 yards but had a pair of interceptions after passes bounced off the hands of his receivers. Devin Stark led all APSU wideouts with four receptions for 61 yards. Defensively safety Amius Smith led the team with seven first half tackles and finished the game with nine total stops, including two for loss. Kicker Stephen Stansell had a 21-yard field goal in the game and also served as the team's punter, averaging 40.7 yards/punt.

SCOUTING MEMPHIS: Memphis is currently 0-2 after a season-opening loss to Mississippi State (59-14) and a 47-3 road loss to Arkansas State this past weekend. After coming into the game in relief the opening weekend, true freshman quarterback Taylor Reed had his first collegiate start in the ASU contest. He completed 13-of-29 passes for 87 yards and completed passes to five different receivers. Senior wideout Tannar Rehrer set a career-high with five catches on Saturday; four of his receptions came in the opening quarter of the game. Akeem Davis had a career-high 11 tackles against Arkansas State and leads Memphis with 18 total tackles on the season. True freshman defensive back Bakari Hollier had his first career interception on Saturday. Hollier also returned kickoffs and netted 99 total yards on five returns.

GAME NOTES: After a pair of games for each team, including one each against a Big Ten foe, Tennessee Tech will travel to Eastern Illinois to kick off the Conference season for both teams. It marks the 18th meeting between the two schools. Eastern Illinois has won 12 of the meetings and had won five in a row before the Golden Eagles came out on top 34-20 a year ago in Cookeville. In that meeting Tech used 21 unanswered points in the third and fourth quarters to break a 17-17 tie. The difference in the game was the running game as Tennessee Tech piled up 233 yards on the ground including 127 yards and two touchdowns from Jacques Crawford. Dontey Gay added 68 yards for the Golden Eagles. Eastern Illinois was limited to just 39 net rushing yards after being sacked eight times and losing 40 yards. Starter Brandon Large was sacked seven times and intercepted twice. Marcus Edwards earned National Defensive Player of the Week honors after netting seven tackles and 4.5 sacks.

SCOUTING TENNESSEE TECH: Tennessee Tech bounced back from a season-opening loss at FBS Iowa to defeat Division III Maryville College 56-7 last Thursday night. The Golden Eagles piled up 566 yards of total offense, the most in five seasons under head coach Watson Brown. Tech led 28-0 after one quarter and 42-0 at halftime. On the ground Dontey Gay netted his second consecutive 100-yard rushing game (one of two OVC players to do that in the first two weeks of the season this year), carrying the ball 19 times for a career-high 155 yards and a touchdown. Junior quarterback Tre Lamb completed 11-of-14 passes for 222 yards and four touchdown passes, a career-high and one shy of the school record. Senior wideout Tim Benford pulled in six passes for 131 yards and two touchdowns. Benford moved into ninth place in OVC history for catches (164) and is now just 105 yards away from moving into the OVC career receiving yards list. On defense both Travis Adkins and Corey Watson picked off passes and returned them for touchdowns. True freshman Tra'Darius Goff had a career-best eight tackles in the game.

SCOUTING EASTERN ILLINOIS: After a season-opening victory over Illinois State, the Panthers stayed in-state to play Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) foe Northwestern for the first time in school history. The Panthers fell behind 14-0 but cut the margin in half when sophomore Jimmy Garoppolo hooked up with Kenny Whittaker for a 72-yard touchdown pass in the second quarter. But the Wildcats would go on to score the next three touchdowns in putting the game out of reach. Garoppolo finished the game 14-of-25 for 209 yards and the score. Redshirt freshman Jimmy Lera had a team-high 78 yards on just three carries as he ripped off a 76-yard run late in the game. It was the longest run for a Panther since Vincent Webb had an 83-yard run in the 2005 season. Sophomore linebacker Antonio Taylor recorded a game-high 14 tackles in the game.
